

TAR HEELS AND GAMECOCKS

North Carolina and South Carolina will meet on the football field for the 59th time in the 2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl on Thursday, Dec. 30 in Charlotte, N.C.

- The first meeting dates back to 1908, however, this will only be the fifth head-to-head meeting since 1991.

- Once conference rivals in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the two schools met at least twice every decade from 1900-1980. While members of the ACC (South Carolina left in 1971), the two schools played every year from 1953-70 with the exception of 1965 and 1966. In those 16 meetings as ACC opponents, North Carolina won nine times.

- The rivalry will continue in 2023 in Charlotte on opening weekend from Bank of America Stadium.
- A home-and-home series is scheduled in Columbia in 2028 and in Chapel Hill in 2029.

CAROLINA BOWL HISTORY

- Carolina, who is making its 36th postseason bowl appearance, owns a 15-20 all-time record in bowl games.

- The Tar Heels are playing in a bowl game for the third year in a row. Last season, Carolina fell 41-27 to Texas A&M in the Orange Bowl.

- In 2019, UNC defeated Temple, 55-13, at the Military Bowl.

MACK BROWN'S BOWL HISTORY

- Mack Brown owns a 15-9 record in bowl games, including guiding the Tar Heels to six-straight appearances from 1992-97 and in 2019 and 2020.

- Brown is 4-3 in bowl games he coached at UNC, winning the 1993 Peach Bowl over Mississippi State, 21-17, the 1995 Carquest Bowl over Arkansas, 20-10, the 1997 Gator Bowl over West Virginia, 20-13 and the 2019 Military Bowl over Temple, 55-13. He left for Texas before the 1998 Gator Bowl.

BROWN VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

- Mack Brown is 2-3 against South Carolina with all five games coming as the head coach of the Tar Heels.

CAROLINA AT THE DUKE'S MAYO BOWL

Carolina is 1-3 in four previous bowl games played in Charlotte, N.C. UNC lost to Boston College, 37-24, in 2004, lost to West Virginia, 31-30, in 2008, lost to Pittsburgh, 19-17, in 2009 and defeated Cincinnati, 39-17, in 2013.

UP NEXT

- Carolina opens the 2022 season at home against FAMU on Aug. 27.

Outlets may access the highlights, along with any weekly head coach press conferences, through the ACC Media Portal. The use of ACC game highlights provided through the ACC Media Portal remain subject to those restrictions outlined in the ACC News Access Guidelines. Interested affiliates should email licensing@catapultsports.com to register for the ACC Media Portal and for additional information. Approved affiliates will receive a confirmation email along with credentials to access the ACC Media Portal.

ACC DIGITAL LICENSE: Per the ACC News Access Guidelines, game footage (station shot or broadcast) may not be distributed through digital platforms without a license. The ACC and Catapult Sports offer a turnkey digital highlight license specifically designed for local TV affiliates. This license will cover the use of ACC game footage across official station websites, apps, and social media platforms. Distribution of in-game highlights on any platform during the broadcast window is strictly prohibited, regardless of a digital license. • The Koman Game Plan for Success, which was created thanks to a generous gift from Jim and Jennifer Koman in honor of Jim's father Bill, follows the motto of the football program; attending Carolina is not a four-year decision, it's a 40-year decision. It provides training and support for football student-athletes throughout their time at Carolina and into their post-graduate lives. Programming centers on preparing student-athletes for their college career and beyond through academic assessment, study and learning skills preparation, leadership development, community involvement and career opportunities.

• To complement the personal development initiatives in the Koman Game Plan for Success, the football program has developed a unique branding initiative, Blueprint 919, which will combine both internal and external experts to develop and foster each individual's personal brand. The branding program contained in Blueprint 919 seeks to help football student-athletes determine who they are, define their key traits, develop their image, recognize their target audiences, and maximize their external presence.

CHRIS SMITH FIELD AT KENAN STADIUM

• The Eddie and Jo Allison Smith Foundation made a transformational gift in 2020 to support the Carolina football program with resources to build on its recent success and secure future excellence. The field at Kenan Stadium is now Chris Smith Field, recognizing the Smith Family and their son Chris, a 1987 graduate of Carolina.

• The family foundation is headed by longtime Carolina leader and benefactor Eddie Smith Jr. '65 of Greenville, North Carolina, and was cofounded with his late wife Jo Allison Smith. Their gift will support staffing needs, fund facility improvements and help build an endowment to cover future operating costs.

CAROLINA ALL-AMERICANS

• The Carolina football program has developed 73 student-athletes, who combined to earn 90 All-America honors. Of those 90 honors, 20 were earned under Mack Brown's guidance. Of note, current cornerbacks coach Dre Bly garnered three first-team honors, two of which came with Brown at the helm.

CAROLINA AND THE NFL DRAFT

• The Carolina football program has produced 253 NFL Draft picks. Of those selections, the Tar Heels have produced 24 first-round selections, which are the most of any school in the state of North Carolina, ahead of NC State (17), Duke (6) and Wake Forest (5).

FAMILY AFFAIR

• The UNC football lettermen have taken to calling themselves the Carolina Football Family, and nowhere is that more evident than this year's roster. The 2021 Tar Heels have one set of brothers and six players who are sons of former Tar Heels, who all played for Mack Brown. The Fox brothers, Tomon and Tomari, are a pair of defensive menaces from Lawrenceville, Ga. In addition, cornerbacks coach Dre Bly is the uncle of freshman wide receiver Josh Downs.

• As for the second generation Tar Heels, **Jefferson Boaz's** father Jay Boaz played for Coach Brown at UNC from 1991-94. **Christopher Holliday** is the son of Tar Heel great and current Associate Athletic Director for Football Corey Holliday (1990-93). **Caleb Hood** is the son of Errol Hood, who was recruited by Brown and played at UNC from 1998-2001. **Drake Maye** is the son of Mark Maye, who played for the Tar Heels from 1983-88, and the brother of Luke, a former Carolina basketball great from 2015-19. **Jeffrey Saturday** is the son of Jeff Saturday, who played at Carolina from 1994-97; and **Will Crowley** is the son of Pat Crowley, who spent his time at UNC from 1986-89.

• **Thomas Flynn** is the son of Keith Flynn, who played football at Carolina and is a 1983 grad.

• UNC currently has eight former players on staff that played for Coach Brown during his first stint in Chapel Hill. Six of the eight went on to play in the NFL. **Tommy Thigpen** (Co-DC/ILB) and **Dre Bly** (CB) serve as assistant coaches, while **Natrone Means** joined the staff this year as an offensive analyst. **Corey Holliday** serves as the Associate Athletic Director for Football, **Rick Steinbacher** is a Senior Associate A.D., who is the football sport administrator, and **Kevin Donnalley** was hired as the Director of High School Relations. In addition, **Dwight Hollier** is the department's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being and Program Outreach, while **Clint Gwaltney** is the Senior Associate A.D. for Event Management.

MACK FACTS

ACTIVE CAREER WINS LEADER

With 265 career victories, Mack Brown ranks second among active coaches. He trails Nick Saban at Alabama (267) and is followed by Brian Kelly at LSU (262), Kirk Ferentz at Iowa (190) and Willie Fritz at Tulane (185). Brown's 265 wins rank eighth on the NCAA all-time list for coaches with at least 10 years at an FBS institution. He has won 158 games at Texas, 90 at UNC, 11 at Tulane and six at Appalachian State.

ONE OF FIVE WITH A TITLE

Mack Brown is one of only four active head coaches who has won a National Championship. Brown, who won the title with Texas following the 2005 season, is accompanied by Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson).

BROWN BECOMES UNC'S WINS LEADER

Mack Brown took over as the Tar Heels' all-time wins leader after the 20-17 victory over Duke on Oct 26, 2019. Brown surpassed Dick Crum, who posted 72 victories from 1978-87.

10-WIN SEASONS

Mack Brown has led his teams to 12 seasons of 10 or more victories during his career. He led UNC to three 10-win campaigns in his first stint with the program before guiding Texas to nine consecutive seasons of 10 wins or more. Brown posted his first 10-win season in 1993 and the Tar Heels went on to post 10 wins in 1996 and '97.

BROWN IN THE POLLS

Mack Brown-led teams have finished ranked in the final Top 25 polls 17 times during his coaching career. He led Texas to 12 Top-25 finishes and UNC to five. Of the 17 occasions, Brown's teams have finished in the Top 10 nine times, including six Top-5 finishes.

BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

Mack Brown has produced 136 NFL Draft picks, including 26 first-round selections and 19 second-round picks. During his first stint at UNC, Brown guided 64 players who would go on to be drafted, including nine first rounders and 10 second rounders. Of note, Brown's 1996 Carolina roster saw 22 players go on to have their names called at the NFL Draft.

BARTON NAMED TO COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

• Carolina legend Harris Barton has been included on the 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class. Barton was a four-year starter for the Tar Heels, first at center and then at tackle as one of the best offensive linemen ever to play in college football. He was a first-team All-America in 1986.

• Barton becomes the seventh Carolina football player inducted into the hall of fame, joining Dre Bly, William Fuller, Charlie Justice, Don McCauley, Jim Tatum and Art Weiner.

• Carolina greets Ken Huff and Julius Peppers have been placed on the 2022 ballot for induction into the College Football Hall of Fame.

• Huff, a 1974 consensus first team All-America and recipient of the 1974 Jacob's Blocking Trophy as the ACC's best offensive lineman, captained the College All-Stars vs. Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers.

• Peppers was a unanimous first-team All-American in 2001, won the Chuck Bednarik Award for the nation's top defensive player and the Rotary Lombardi Award, which at the time was given to the nation's top interior lineman.

• An announcement is expected in early 2022.

SEASON TICKETS SOLD OUT

• North Carolina football season tickets have sold out for the second time in as many full-capacity seasons.

• Carolina was one of eight programs nationally to sell out its entire home schedule and the only team in the ACC to do so in 2019.

CLOSE CALLS

• Since the return of Mack Brown to take over the program in 2019, Carolina owns a 21-16 overall record.

• 11 of the 16 losses have been by seven points or less with three setbacks coming in overtime.

• The first two losses in 2020 came by a mere three points at FSU and at Virginia.

• Nine of Carolina's 13 games in 2019 were decided by seven points or fewer. That was the most by any team in the AP Poll era going back to 1936.

• UNC lost 43-41 in six overtimes at Virginia Tech in the longest game in ACC history.

• The Tar Heels also lost twice in overtime on the road at Pitt, 34-27 (2019) and 30-23 (2021).

• North Carolina, Alabama, Kentucky and Ohio State are the only four Power 5 programs to have a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in 2021.

• Josh Downs has a school record 1,273 receiving yards, while Ty Chandler has 1,063 rushing yards.

HOWELL'S BOWL GAME HISTORY

• Sam Howell owns a 1-1 record in two previous bowl game appearances, winning the Military Bowl, 55-13, over Temple in 2019, and falling to Texas A&M, 41-27, last year in the Orange Bowl.

• Howell is 43 of 65 for 528 passing yards and six passing touchdowns and one interception in his two-game bowl career. He has rushed for 78 yards on 15 carries and caught a 2-yard receiving TD against the Owls.

• Against Temple, Howell was 25 of 34 for 294 yards and three passing TDs and rushed three times for 53 yards.

• Against Texas A&M, Howell was 18 of 31 for 234 yards and three passing TDs and rushed 12 times for 25 yards.

OFFENSE CONTINUES TO SHINE

• Carolina has posted three of the top five total offense performances in program history since head coach Mack Brown, offensive coordinator Phil Longo and quarterback Sam Howell arrived in Chapel Hill in 2019.

• The Tar Heels set the school record last year with 556.6 yards per game behind an offense that featured Howell and current NFL players Dyami Brown, Michael Carter, Dazz Newsome and Javonte Williams.

DON'T BLINK

• North Carolina ranks third in the ACC with 479.6 yards of total offense per game. The Tar Heels exceeded 500 yards of offense five times this season and posted more than 600 yards in back-to-back games against Georgia State (607) and a season-high 699 yards against Virginia. The Tar Heels also produced 564 yards at #11 Notre Dame, a season high on the road in 2021.

• Carolina leads the ACC with 219.7 rushing yards per game. The Tar Heels last led the league in rushing back in 1994 behind the duo of Curtis Johnson and Leon Johnson.

• Carolina and Louisville are the only two ACC teams to average 200 or more yards through the air and on the ground.

• UNC's 118 points against Georgia State and Virginia were tied for the 2nd most points in consecutive games, tying the feat against Virginia Medical and Wake Forest in 1914, and trails only the 125 points scored against Duke and Miami in 2015.

• Since Mack Brown's return in 2019, Carolina has posted six of the top-20 single-game total yard figures in school history. That includes a record 778 yards at Miami in 2020.



UNC SCHEDULE NOTES

• The Tar Heels will open the season with a road conference game for the first time since 2005 at Georgia Tech.

• **Virginia Tech:** Carolina opens a season against the Hokies for the first time since 1946, a game played in Chapel Hill that ended in a 14-14 tie.

• **Georgia State:** First ever meeting between the two schools in football. The Tar Heels are scheduled to visit the Panthers in 2022.

• **Georgia Tech:** The two Coastal Division rivals did not play in 2020 after the schedule was revamped due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The two squads met every season between 1980-2019. This game will be played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

• **Florida State:** The Seminoles make their first visit to Chapel Hill since 2009. The three most recent meetings in 2010, 2016 and 2020 all were played in Tallahassee, Florida.

• **Notre Dame:** The Tar Heels and Fighting Irish are in the midst of playing head-to-head over the span of three-successive seasons. UNC hosted Notre Dame in 2020 and will do that again in 2022.

• **Wake Forest:** The 2021 matchup is the culmination of a home-and-home non-conference series between the two in-state ACC rivals. Carolina played in Winston-Salem in 2019. This season will also mark the first time the two have played in three-straight seasons since 2002-04.

• **Pitt:** Similar to Georgia Tech, the Coastal Division foes did not play last season, the first time since the Panthers joined the ACC for the 2013 campaign. This season marks the fourth-straight meeting in Pittsburgh that will be play on Thursday night.

• **Wofford:** First ever meeting between the two schools in football.

• **NC State:** The Carolina-State game returns to the final weekend of the regular season, a place it held in the schedule between 2014-2019. Since the return of Mack Brown to Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels have won both games over the Wolfpack by a combined score of 89-31.

• Sam Howell joined a group of only four FBS quarterbacks to ever have back-to-back games with 300 passing yards and 100 rushing yards.

• Howell and Marquise Williams are the only two UNC QBs to ever compile 300+ passing yards and 100+ rushing yards in a game. Williams did it against Notre Dame in 2014, while Howell has done it three times in 2021.

• Howell also joined Williams as the only QBs to pass for three and rush for two scores in a game (Williams vs. Baylor in 2015 Russell Athletic Bowl).

• Howell accumulated 456 total yards (sixth most at UNC) against Georgia State with 352 passing and a career-high 104 rushing yards.

• Howell added 412 total yards against Virginia the following week, a career-high 112 yards on the ground and 307 passing yards. He also tossed five TDs.

• Howell had 442 total yards at #11 Notre Dame, the eighth most in school history, with 342 passing yards and 101 yards on the ground.

HOWELL THE FIRST

• Sam Howell became the first Carolina QB to ever have back-to-back 100-yard rushing games and has five such games in 2021. He joined Marquise Williams as the only two to have at least three games in a season with 100 rushing yards. Williams did it six times in his career (once in 2013, twice in 2014, three times in 2015) and Gayle Bomar twice (once each in 1967 and 1968). Other QBs who did it once include Danny Talbott in 1965, Ricky Lanier 1969, Chuck Sharpe 1979, Jason Stanicek 1992, Ronald Curry 2000 and Darian Durant 2003.

(Note: Charlie Justice did it in consecutive games three times, once each in 1946, 1947 and 1948, and 12 times total; Hosea Rodgers 3 times in 1947-48; and Billy Hayes twice in 1949; but none were classified as a quarterback, no one was in those days, although they did much of the team's passing.)

DOWNS SETS RECEIVING RECORDS

• Sophomore Josh Downs has set UNC records with 98 receptions and 1,273 receiving yards this season.

• Downs is two catches shy of becoming the fourth player in ACC history to notch 100 receptions in a single season.

JOSH "TOUCH" DOWNS

• Sophomore wide receiver Josh Downs has been Sam Howell's favorite target this season.

• Downs leads the ACC (2nd nationally) with 98 receptions and ranks 2nd in the ACC with 1,273 receiving yards (10th nationally).

• Downs is 2nd nationally with 737 yards after catch and 13th nationally with 56 first downs.

• Downs is the first player to register at least eight catches and a TD in eight-straight games since Fresno State's Davante Adams in 2013 when he did it in nine-straight games.

• Downs enjoyed a stretch of catching a TD in eight straight games, a streak that tied for the third longest in ACC history. Clemson's DeAndre Hopkins set the record with 10 in a row in 2012 that broke the record of nine that was set by Virginia's Herman Moore in 1990. Wake Forest's Sage Surratt (2018-19) and NC State's Bryan Underwood (2012) also put together eight-game streaks in the last decade.

• He recorded a career-high 203 receiving yards against Virginia, the eighth most in program history, and had two receiving touchdowns from 59 and 37 yards in the first quarter.

GROUND GAME

• Grad transfer running back Ty Chandler earned All-ACC second-team honors in 2021 by rushing for a team-high 1,063 yards. He ranks third in the ACC with 88.6 rushing yards per game and 13 rushing touchdowns.

• Chandler is just the 20th UNC player to register 1,000 rushing yards in a single season.

• Chandler exploded for a career-high 213 rushing yards on 22 carries and four rushing TDs against Wake Forest.

• He is the first UNC player to have four rushing touchdowns in a game since Leon Johnson in 1993.

• Chandler is also just the third player with 200+ rushing yards and four or more rushing TDs against a CFP Top 10 opponent. The other two are Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (2015 vs. Oregon) and Ole Miss' John Rhys Plumlee (2019 vs. LSU).

• Chandler rushed for 198 yards and Carolina racked up 392 yards on the ground against Virginia on Sept. 18.

• Chandler's previous career high was 158 rushing yards at UT against UTEP in 2018.

- Howell was 40 of 62 with 640 yards and seven touchdowns in the fourth quarter in 2020, and was 62 of 93 with 947 yards and 12 TDs (0 INTs) in the fourth quarter during his 2019 Freshman All-America season. He ranked second nationally in TD passes and third in passing yards in the fourth quarter in 2019.

STARTING A NEW STREAK

- UNC snapped a four-game losing streak against Virginia with a resounding 59-39 win in Chapel Hill on Sept. 18
- The two teams combined for 98 points, the most in the series. The previous high was 85 last year in Virginia's 44-41 win at home.
- The Tar Heels' 59 points were the most against Virginia in an ACC game, the most since 1936 (59 in Charlottesville) and the most at home since 1935 (61).
- Carolina gained 699 total yards, its most ever against Virginia and the sixth most in any game in school history. It was the third most by the Tar Heels in a game coached by Mack Brown.

KIERNAN'S DUBLIN BEGINNINGS

- Sophomore punter Ben Kiernan played his high school football at Raleigh's Wakefield High School, but he didn't arrive in the U.S. until he was 15. Kiernan spent the first decade and a half of his life in Dublin, Ireland, where he played rugby and soccer. Seeking more opportunities and better colleges, Kiernan's parents decided to move to the Raleigh area. After moving just two weeks prior to the start of the 8th grade, Kiernan's father Mike had a chance encounter with the football coach at Food Lion and he told him to have Ben try out for football, where he would punt a football for the first time.
- Kiernan's twin older brothers, Tom and Jack, played rugby at NC State.
- Kiernan's 13-year-old sister Freya is in a lifetime battle with cerebral palsy. The Kiernan's adopted Freya, who was born in China, when she was nine months old.

2021 SIGNING CLASS

The University of North Carolina football program signed 17 newcomers, including eight early enrollees, on Wednesday as part of National Signing Day. Currently ranked as the No. 8 class in the country, Carolina's group includes two five stars, nine four stars and six three stars according to the 247Sports Composite. The 17-man class is the second-smallest of the Top 10 teams and its 91.70 per player average rating on the Composite ranks sixth nationally. The well-rounded class covers all position groups except tight end and is split evenly by sides of the ball with eight members playing offense and nine on defense. The group represents seven states including seven players from Virginia, four from North Carolina, two from Georgia and one each from Alabama, Illinois, Pennsylvania and South Carolina.

Behind Carolina's recruiting philosophy, which focuses on the region from Virginia to Atlanta, the Tar Heels signed 14 of its 17 players from that footprint. The Heels took advantage of a talented group of players in Virginia, signing five of the state's top eight players and seven of the top 18, including the state's top player in five star OL Zach Rice. Carolina also secured its four in-state targets, all ranked in the top eight in North Carolina, including the state's top player in five star DL Travis Shaw.

With the signings of Rice and Shaw, Carolina has landed five of the program's 10 highest-rated recruits all time over the last three classes. That pair joins five stars Desmond Evans, Tony Grimes and Keeshawn Silver.

In addition to Rice, Carolina went into Virginia and snagged four stars WR Andre Greene Jr., RB George Pettaway, WR Doc Chapman, and DB Tayon Holloway, and three stars OLB Bryson Jennings and OL Trevyon Green. Joining Shaw from North Carolina are four stars RB Omarion Hampton, OLB Malaki Hamrick, and OLB Beau Atkinson.

The Tar Heels remained in their recruiting footprint to bring in Georgia natives four-star DB Marcus Allen and three-star DB Will Hardy, and three-star LB Deuce Caldwell out of South Carolina. They stepped out of the footprint to secure the signatures of four-star LB Sebastian Cheeks from Illinois, three-star QB Conner Harrell from Alabama, and three-star OL Justin Kanyuk from Pennsylvania.

As a whole, the Carolina signing class includes five players invited to the Under Armour All-America game and two to the All-American Bowl. The group also includes three state Gatorade Players of the Year and 15 players who earned all-state honors.

SAM HOWELL JUNIOR SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell has thrown a touchdown pass in all 36 games as a Tar Heel, the longest active streak in the country.
- Howell has thrown multiple TD passes in 28 of 36 career games. He has tossed three or more touchdowns 17 times, four or more six times and five or more on three occasions.
- UNC record holder with 10,078 career passing yards and 11,084 yards of total offense.
- Has a program record 110 touchdowns accounted for with 91 passing, 17 rushing and two receiving TDs.
- Howell's 825 rushing yards are second most among quarterbacks in 2021. Louisville's Malik Cunningham has 968, while Liberty's Malik Willis is third with 820 rushing yards this season.
- Howell is one of four FBS quarterbacks to ever record back-to-back games with 300+ passing yards and 100+ rushing yards. Louisville's Lamar Jackson is the only other Power 5 QB to do so back in 2017.
- Howell is one of three QBs in the playoff era with five games with 300 passing yards and five games with 100 rushing yards in a season. The other two are Lamar Jackson (2x) and Deshaun Watson.
- Howell is the only UNC QB to ever rush for over 100 yards five times in a single season - had a career-high 112 against Virginia, 108 against Florida State, 104 vs. Georgia State, 101 at Notre Dame and 104 against Wake Forest.
- Howell is the third UNC QB to ever have back-to-back 400-yard total offense games, joining Marquise Williams (Notre Dame and Georgia Tech in 2014) and Mitch Trubisky (James Madison and Pitt in 2016). Howell's came against Georgia State and Virginia in 2021.
- Third in ACC history with 91 passing TDs.
- Had a career high 112 rushing yards against Virginia.
- Howell's performance against Georgia State – 352 passing yards and 104 rushing yards – marked just the second time a UNC QB has thrown for 300+ and rushed for 100+ in the same game. The first to do so was Marquise Williams, who had 303 passing yards and 132 rushing yards against Notre Dame in 2014.
- It was the second time a UNC quarterback passed for three and rushed for two scores in a game (Williams vs. Baylor in the 2015 Russell Athletic Bowl in Orlando).
- Howell's 62-yard touchdown scamper against Georgia State was a career long and the longest run by a UNC QB since Darian Durant's 63-yard score against Clemson on Oct. 25, 2003.
- His three first-quarter touchdown passes against Virginia were the most by a UNC quarterback vs. an FBS team in a quarter since Bryn Renner tossed three in the fourth quarter at Louisville in 2012.

SAM HOWELL SOPHOMORE SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell's 30 touchdown passes in 2020 led the ACC and ranked sixth nationally.
- Sam Howell set a UNC single-game records with 550 passing yards, seven total touchdowns and six passing touchdowns against Wake Forest on Nov. 14, 2020. Marquise Williams held the previous yardage record with 494 against Duke in 2015; six other Tar Heels had previously passed for five touchdowns in a game (Bryn Renner did that twice).
- Howell's seven total touchdowns against Wake Forest were the most in Kenan Stadium history.
- Howell's 550 passing yards were the third most in ACC history. Only Clemson's Deshaun Watson (580 vs. Pittsburgh in 2016) and Miami's Steven Morris (566 vs. NC State in 2012) passed for more yards in a game than Howell.
- Howell is just the third FBS player since 2000 to throw for 550 yards and six touchdowns and also score a rushing touchdown in a single game. Buffalo's Drew Anderson accomplished the feat against Western Michigan in 2017. Texas Tech's B.J. Symons did so vs. Ole Miss in 2003.
- Howell's six passing touchdowns vs. Wake Forest tied the ACC record set eight previous times, and most recently by Miami's Jarren Williams vs. Louisville in 2019.
- Howell's 68 career touchdown passes were the most in ACC history by a sophomore quarterback. Clemson's Trevor Lawrence tossed 66.
- Howell became the second Tar Heel ever to score touchdowns by pass, rush and catch in the same game at Miami. Marquise Williams accomplished that against Notre Dame in 2014.

SAM HOWELL FRESHMAN SUPERLATIVES

- Sam Howell's 38 passing touchdowns in 2019 were the most by a true freshman in FBS history. The previous record was 30 from Clemson's Trevor Lawrence in 2018.
- Howell's 38 touchdowns were the second most ever by an ACC freshman quarterback. Florida State's Jamies Winston threw 40 touchdown passes in 2013 as a redshirt freshman.
- Howell's 38 touchdowns were the third most in ACC history, trailing only Deshaun Watson's record 41 TD passes for Clemson in 2016 and Winston's 40 in 2013.
- Howell set the UNC single-season record with 38 touchdown passes, surpassing Mitch Trubisky's 30 in 2016.
- Howell ranked fourth nationally and led all ACC QBs with 38 passing TDs. His 3,641 passing yards led the ACC and ranked 14th nationally.
- Howell's 3,641 passing yards were the most ever by an ACC true freshman quarterback.
- Howell was second in the ACC in pass efficiency at 160.3 and third in total offense (277.4 ypg).
- Howell threw multiple touchdowns in all 13 games.
- Joined James Winston as the only ACC QBs in the last 15 years to throw 35+ TDs (38), throw 10 or fewer INTs (7), throw for 3,000 yards (3,641), average eight yards per attempt (8.6), and complete 60% of the passes (61.4).
- Howell had eight games in 2019 with three or more touchdown passes.
- Howell's touchdown-interception ratio of plus 31 (38-7) was the best in UNC history. Mitch Trubisky was plus 24 (30/6) in 2016. Howell's plus 31 was eight better than UCF's Dillon Gabriel (+22) and nine better than USC's Kedon Slovis (+21).
- Led or tied among ACC QBs in completions of 10+ yards (154), 30+ yards (30) and 40+ yards (17).
- Tied then UNC school record and set freshman record with 5 TD passes at Virginia Tech. Set UNC freshman records for completions (33) and attempts (51) at Georgia Tech and yards (401) at NC State.
- In leading Carolina to seven wins and a bowl victory in 2019, Howell won more games last season than the Tar Heels did in the two previous seasons combined (5).



HEAD COACH MACK BROWN



Mack Brown, whose charismatic style and disciplined approach propelled the University of North Carolina to the top five and the University of Texas to the 2005 BCS National Championship, began his second stint as head coach in Chapel Hill on Nov. 27, 2018 with the goal of leading another Carolina resurgence.

A 43-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Brown has served as a head coach for 32 seasons with stops at Texas (1998-2013), North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Tulane (1985-87), and Appalachian State (1983). Over his 32 seasons, Brown has posted a record of 259-132-1 (.662). Those 259 career victories rank seventh on the FBS all-time list and are the most among active coaches. The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year and the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Brown is one of a handful of coaches in college football history to lead two separate programs to top-five national finishes. Brown continued a remarkable turnaround in year two of his return to Carolina, leading the Tar Heels from two wins in 2018 to the Orange Bowl in 2020. Carolina, which went 8-4, spent much of the season ranked in the Top 25, finishing the regular season at No. 13 in the College Football Playoff rankings and ending the year ranked 18th in the AP Poll and 17th in the Coaches Poll. This marked just the second time since Brown's departure in 1997 that Carolina finished a season in the Top 25. Under his guidance, Carolina produced four All-Americans, 13 All-ACC selections, a Top-15 recruiting class and averaged a 3.0 GPA over the spring and fall semesters.

In his first season back at the helm at North Carolina in 2019, Brown led the Tar Heels to a winning season and a resounding victory in the Military Bowl. The seven wins were two more than UNC had won in its previous two seasons combined (5) and the Heels won a bowl game for the first time since 2013. Carolina played close games seemingly all season. Its nine games decided by seven points or less were the most since 1936 and the Tar Heels' six losses came by a total of just 26 points. Brown's '19 UNC squad produced two NFL Draft picks, five NFL free-agent signees, 11 All-ACC honors and freshman QB Sam Howell was named ACC Offensive Rookie and Rookie of the Year before earning Freshman All-America honors.

MACK BROWN AND THE NFL DRAFT

- Dating back to 1986 when he was the head coach at Tulane, Mack Brown had a player selected in 28 straight NFL Drafts prior to 2014. In fact, Brown has had a player selected in the NFL Draft in 30 of his 32 drafts as a head coach.
- Mack Brown has coached 20 players (16 Texas/four UNC) who have been drafted in the first round in his past 19 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached a first-round selection in 12 of his last 20 NFL Drafts.
- Mack Brown has coached 78 NFL Draft picks over his last 19 years.
- Of those 78 NFL Draft picks, 60 picks were chosen in the first four rounds.
- In 32 drafts as a head coach at North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Texas (1998-2013), Tulane (1985-87) and Appalachian State (1983), Mack Brown has seen 115 of his former players selected in the NFL Draft.

Prior to returning to Carolina, Brown served as both a college football studio analyst and color analyst for ESPN.

At the completion of his Texas tenure in 2013, Brown was one of just four active coaches to reach the 200-victory plateau. He was also one of only two coaches nationally to lead his teams to 21 bowls in 22 seasons, and the only one to have 23 winning seasons in the previous 24 years. His 225 wins from 1990 to 2013, which combined the last eight years of his first stint at UNC and his entire Texas tenure, were the most of any coach in the country.

As a result, Brown was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in December of 2018. He is the sixth Tar Heel to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame and the second coach, joining innovator Carl Grey Snavely, who was inducted in 1965. In addition to the College Football Hall of Fame, Brown is also a member of the Texas Sports Hall of Fame, the Longhorn Hall of Honor, the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame and the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame.

Brown has also succeeded in preparing his student-athletes for the next level. In the 31 NFL Drafts during Brown's time as a head coach, the NFL has picked 110 of his student-athletes, and at least one was selected in 28 straight drafts. He had 20 players selected in the first round of the draft from 1998 to 2013, and three members of his 1997 Carolina squad were picked in the first round of the 1998 NFL Draft, which tied for the most of any collegiate program.

With all of the success on the field, the primary emphasis has remained the same with Brown's squads -- maintaining a high level of achievement in the classroom and in the community. Eighty percent of his players at North Carolina received their degrees and he increased the pace at Texas, while more than a third of his players at UT regularly

earned 3.0 grade point averages and achieved spots on the Big 12 Commissioner's and Athletics Director's Honor Rolls.

Brown's first stint as head coach of the Tar Heels came from 1988-97. He led Carolina to a record of 69-46-1 (.599), which included three 10-win seasons, six consecutive bowl games, a Top-Five finish, a Top-10 finish and two Top-20 finishes.

At UNC, Brown recruited and coached several of the finest players in school history. From his 1997 squad alone, DE Greg Ellis (No. 8, Dallas Cowboys), LB Brian Simmons (No. 17, Cincinnati Bengals) and DT Vonnie Holliday (No. 19, Green Bay Packers) were selected among the first 19 picks in the 1998 NFL Draft.

Along with that trio of first-rounders, Brown also helped develop several other Tar Heel standouts. CB Dré Bly, who is currently Carolina's DBs coach, was a three-time All-American who recorded an ACC-record 20 interceptions during his career and played 11 seasons in the NFL. Corey Holliday, who currently serves as UNC's Associate A.D. for Football Administration, finished his career as the leading receiver in Carolina history, was a CFA/Hitachi Scholar-Athlete, and is a former member of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Dwight Hollier, who currently serves as UNC's Senior Associate A.D. for Student-Athlete Health, Well-Being & Program Outreach, made more than 500 tackles during his Carolina career and also

played in the NFL. RB Natrone Means, who rushed for more than 1,000 yards in his final two seasons at UNC, went on to lead the San Diego Chargers to Super Bowl XXIX and the Jacksonville Jaguars to the 1996 AFC title game.

QBs Jason Stanicek and Mike Thomas combined to rewrite Carolina's passing and total offense records. DT Marcus Jones, a consensus first-team All-American, earned ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1995. CB Thomas Smith came to UNC in 1989 as a walk-on from a small high school in North Carolina and departed as a first-round pick of the AFC Champion Buffalo Bills. RB Leon Johnson, one of the premier all-purpose offensive threats in ACC history, played eight seasons in the NFL. TE Freddie Jones, a second-round draft choice of the San Diego Chargers in 1997, was one of the NFL's top pass-catching tight ends and played eight seasons in the NFL.

During his first 10 seasons at Carolina, the Tar Heels featured a Lombardi Award finalist, a two-time Thorpe Award finalist, a Butkus Award finalist and semifinalist, 16 All-Americans, 34 first-team All-ACC selections, an ACC Defensive Player of the Year and an ACC Rookie of the Year. Brown also helped his players with professional aspirations as 38 of his Tar Heels heard their names called in the NFL Draft, including 16 in the first three rounds. In addition to the three first-rounders in 1998, Marcus Jones (Tampa Bay Buccaneers '96) and Thomas Smith (Buffalo Bills '93) were first-round selections; Freddie Jones (San Diego Chargers '97), Rick Terry (New York Jets '97), Bucky Brooks (Buffalo Bills '94) and Natrone Means (San Diego Chargers '93) were second-round picks; and James Hamilton (Jacksonville Jaguars '97), William Henderson (Green Bay Packers '95), Jimmy Hitchcock (New England Patriots '95), Rondell Jones (Denver Broncos '93), Brian Bollinger (San Francisco 49ers '92), Kevin Donnalley (Houston Texans '91) and Darrell Hamilton (Denver Broncos '89) were chosen in the third round.

BLACKSBURG, VA. (AP) —Braxton Burmeister ran for a touchdown and threw for another and Virginia Tech made Sam Howell look pedestrian in a 17-10 victory over No. 10 North Carolina on Friday night in the opener for both teams.

Burmeister scored on a 4-yard run and found James Mitchell for an 11-yard scoring strike as the Hokies built a 14-0 lead they took into halftime.

They struggled to put the game away in the second half until the final minute when they chased Howell from the pocket at the Virginia Tech 40 and he tried to find a teammate but instead threw an interception to seal the outcome.

"We couldn't put the game away but the defense continued to rise to the occasion," coach Justin Fuente said, calling it as impressive a performance as he's seen.

Howell, who'd thrown eight touchdown passes in two prior games against Virginia Tech, was sacked six times and harassed all night. His final pick came when he was in the grasp of Jordan Williams and found Chamarri Conner.

The play was reviewed, and when the officials announced that it was an interception, the sellout crowd at Lane Stadium erupted with relief. Many fans joined the team in celebration on the field after the game, which marked the first time since the 2019 season that fan attendance was not limited.

"Obviously, now the shine's off and the rating sure doesn't matter tonight," Tar Heels coach Mack Brown said. "We were overrated with the way we played."

Howell did become the Tar Heels' career touchdown pass leader with 69 when Josh Downs took a screen pass 37 yards for a score in the third quarter, but he was unable to find his usual magic late.

CHAPEL HILL (AP) - Sam Howell threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two more scores as No. 24 North Carolina shook off the disappointment a loss in its opener with a 59-17 win over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Howell played a role in five of the Tar Heels' first seven touchdowns. He completed 21 of 29 passes for 352 yards without an interception. He was picked off three times in a 17-10 setback at Virginia Tech a week earlier in the team's opener.

"(It can be) a reality check," Howell said. "Go back to work and that's what we did. ... We were able to come out there in the second half and play Carolina football."

Howell's touchdown runs came on a 22-yard scramble for the game's first points, and on the junior's career-long 62-yard run in the final seconds of the third quarter.

Georgia State (0-2) was held to 90 passing yards. Quarterback Cornelious Brown IV was 12 for 26 for 68 yards.

"This one got out of hand late," North Carolina coach Mack Brown said. "But it was still a game at halftime. We had to work."

North Carolina's lead was 24-10 midway through the third quarter before the Tar Heels (1-1) used a 28-point burst in about 9½ minutes.

Afterward, it seemed fitting to Georgia State coach Shawn Elliott when a technical glitch interrupted the opening seconds of his virtual postgame news conference.

"(The ipad) operates much like our team -- at times it's capable and at times it's not," Elliott said.

Tennessee transfer Ty Chandler scored his first TD for North Carolina on a 2-yard run in the third quarter.

Howell's touchdown throws in the first half came on a 57-yard connection with Antoine Green, and a 30-yard play to Emery Simmons. He threw for 5 yards to Josh Downs in the fourth quarter.

Georgia State's scoring drive in the second quarter lasted 17 plays and 7½ minutes, covering 75 yards capped by Brown's 4-yard run.

CHAPEL HILL—Sam Howell threw five touchdown passes and ran for a career-best 112 yards as No. 21 North Carolina took over after halftime to beat Virginia 59-39 on Saturday night.

The Tar Heels (2-1, 1-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) scored touchdowns on all five of their second-half drives, which helped turn a 28-24 halftime deficit into a 52-31 lead on Howell's short TD throw to Kamari Morales with 12:13 left.

And after a first-half shootout with Brennan Armstrong and the Cavaliers (2-1, 0-1), UNC gave up only a field goal in the third quarter while also coming up with Ja'Quarious Conley's interception.

That was more than enough help for the Tar Heels' offense, which kept ending drives with with end-zone celebrations to speed back out in front after squandering a 24-7 first-half lead.

And there were no shortage of offensive stars.

Tennessee graduate transfer Ty Chandler ran for a career-high 198 yards with two touchdowns, the last coming from 7 yards out with 2:57 left to seal it. And Josh Downs had eight catches for 203 yards and a pair of TDs. Perhaps more impressively, the Tar Heels showed a different dimension by leaning on their ground game instead of putting everything on Howell's arm.

The result? The Tar Heels ran 47 times for 392 yards compared to just 21 pass attempts for their star quarterback, and finished with 699 total yards. It was UNC's biggest scoring output against Virginia since 1936 in the long-running series and second-most ever.

Armstrong had a huge day of his own for the Cavaliers, throwing for a program-record 554 yards — the most ever by any UNC opponent — with four touchdowns. That included a career-best performance for Dontayvion Wicks (seven catches for 183 yards and a score) as the Cavaliers finished with 574 total yards.

ATLANTA— Jeff Sims came off the bench to run for three touchdowns and pass for another, Georgia Tech's defense stifled Sam Howell much of the game and the Yellow Jackets beat a ranked team for the first time in Geoff Collins' three seasons as coach, upsetting No. 21 North Carolina 45-22 Saturday night.

Playing for the first time since he was injured in a season-opening loss to Northern Illinois, Sims replaced Jordan Yates late in the second quarter and ran for TDs of 11 and 1 yards that put Georgia Tech in control — the latter set up by his 38-yard scamper.

Sims threw a 27-yard scoring pass to Malachi Carter early in the fourth quarter and finished off the game with a flourish, scoring on a 50-yard run with just over a minute remaining.

Sims ran for 128 yards on 10 carries and completed 10 of 13 passes for 112 yards for Georgia Tech (2-2, 1-1 Atlantic Coast Conference).

Sam Howell was sacked eight times and fumbled twice, leading to 10 points for the the Yellow Jackets in the first half. He also was stuffed on a fourth-down run in his own territory, setting up a short field for another Georgia Tech touchdown drive.

Howell completed 25 of 39 for 306 yards and two touchdowns. He also scored the game's first TD on a 23-yard run, but finished with just 8 yards rushing after back-to-back games with more than 100 yards.

His chief tormenter was Georgia Tech linebacker Charlie Thomas, who had 2.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles in the Tar Heels backfield.

Collins came into the night with a record of 7-18 since taking over as Georgia Tech coach in 2019, including an 0-6 mark against ranked teams.

Make it 1-6.

The Tar Heels didn't look anything like the team that blew away Virginia the week before, when they piled up 699 total yards and scored touchdowns on all five of their second-half possessions in a 59-39 victory.

Instead, they reverted to the shaky form of a 17-10 loss at Virginia Tech in the season opener, when Howell was sacked six times and threw three interceptions.

CHAPEL HILL—Sam Howell threw for 321 yards and three touchdowns and North Carolina topped Duke 38-7 on Saturday, keeping hold of the coveted Victory Bell for a third straight year.

The Tar Heels (3-2, 2-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) jumped ahead with a pair of explosive plays in the first half.

Howell connected with running back Ty Chandler down the sideline for a 75-yard score to open the scoring. Less than two minutes later, Kevin Hester hit Duke's Gunnar Holmberg as he was throwing, causing the ball to flutter out of his hand and Trey Morrison returned the fumble 63 yards for a touchdown.

Allowing the scoop-and-score epitomized a frustrating performance for Duke (3-2, 0-1 ACC). The Blue Devils punted nine times, turned the ball over twice and converted just 2 of 15 third downs.

Duke scored its lone points on an 80-yard catch-and-run by Jalon Calhoun in the third quarter. The loss snapped a three-game winning streak for the Blue Devils.

The Tar Heels can be successful on offense when their line protects Howell. UNC has allowed 22 sacks this season, the most in the ACC. But when Howell has the space to operate, he looks like the Heisman candidate he was hyped up as being in the preseason. Howell is now second in the ACC — and among the top 10 in the nation — in points-responsible for this season with 104.

CHAPEL HILL—Jordan Travis threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two more scores as Florida State upset North Carolina for the second year in row, winning 35-25 on Saturday.

The Seminoles (2-4, 2-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) have won back-to-back games for the first time since 2019.

Travis ran for 121 yards on 14 carries and completed 11 of 13 passes for 145 yards. Two of his touchdown throws went to Ontaria Wilson and another to Malik McClain.

The Tar Heels (3-3, 2-3), who began the season in the Top 10, lost for the first time in four home outings despite two touchdown passes and 108 yards rushing from quarterback Sam Howell.

Howell hit Kamari Morales in the end zone on a 21-yard play on North Carolina's first possession of the second half to close within 21-17.

Florida State responded with Travis' 1-yard sneak. The Seminoles scored again on Travis' 6-yard toss to Wilson.

North Carolina coach Mack Brown fell to 0-11 vs. his alma mater (including 0-8 while in charge of the Tar Heels).

Travis, who sparked an upset of a then-unbeaten North Carolina team last October, ran 53 yards for a second-quarter touchdown as the Seminoles took a 14-10 lead. He had 87 yards on the ground in the first half.

Travis threw 32 yards to Wilson for a touchdown on Florida State's next possession to stretch the lead with 53 seconds left in the half.

North Carolina's Josh Downs, who hauled in a 33-yard pass for the game's first touchdown, has caught at least one touchdown pass in every game this season.

North Carolina kicker Grayson Atkins booted a 51-yard field goal to conclude the game's opening possession, matching his longest as a Tar Heel since transferring from Furman.

CHAPEL HILL—Sam Howell threw of two touchdowns and ran for two more as North Carolina held off Miami, 45-42, sending the Hurricanes to their worst record at the midway mark of a season in more than two decades.

Miami was in position to tie or win when reaching the North Carolina 16-yard line in the final minute, but linebacker Cedric Gray intercepted a tipped pass with 6 seconds left.

Ty Chandler ran for two touchdowns for the Tar Heels (4-3, 3-3 Atlantic Coast Conference) in a matchup of two teams that began the season in the Top 15, but are trying to gain traction midway through the season.

The Hurricanes (2-4, 0-2) are 2-4 for the first time since 1997 when they were on NCAA probation and stuck with scholarship limitations.

Howell was 17 for 26 for 154 yards in the air with an interception while running for 98 yards on 17 carries. Chandler gained 104 yards on the ground on 18 attempts.

Howell's touchdown runs covered 30 and 11 yards, both times pinballing off Miami defenders.

"A couple of times he just ran through arms and twisted and went in to score," Brown said.

Miami nearly erased an 18-point deficit, pulling within 38-34 before stalling in North Carolina territory early in the fourth quarter. Then the Tar Heels drove 58 yards for a touchdown, aided by 30 yards on Miami penalties.

Freshman Jaylan Knight ran for two Miami touchdowns, including a 4-yard run to cap a 97-yard drive with 3:08 remaining that was followed by a successful two-point conversion pass play.

The Hurricanes, after using all their timeouts, regained possession at the 2:46 mark and picked up 56 yards before the last interception.

Miami used Tyler Van Dyke, who made his third career starter and first away from home, at quarterback just days after it was announced that D'Eriq King would be lost to season-ending shoulder surgery.

Van Dyke, who was 5 for 15 and picked off twice in the first half, finished 20 for 45 with 264 yards with a touchdown and three interceptions.

NOTRE DAME, IND.—Kyren Williams raced 91 yards for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter and No. 11 Notre Dame held off Sam Howell and upset-minded North Carolina 44-34 on Saturday night in a game that had over 1,000 yards in offense.

Williams ran for a career-high 199 yards on 22 carries to help the Fighting Irish improve to 7-1 with their third straight victory — and ruin the 400th collegiate game for North Carolina Hall of Fame coach Mack Brown.

The Irish won despite being outgained by the Tar Heels (4-4) in total yardage, 554-523. But the Irish out-rushed the Tar Heels 293-223.

Howell, who became the Tar Heels' first quarterback with over 10,000 passing yards, finished with 341 yards on 24-of-31 passing with one touchdown and one interception. He added another 101 yards on 18 carries, one a 31-yard touchdown run that kept the Tar Heels in it at 41-34 with 7:23 to play. It was the third time this season he has passed for over 300 yards and rushed for more than 100 in one game.

But after his touchdown run, Notre Dame responded with a 13-play, 73-yard drive that ate up 5:46 of the clock, leading to Jonathan Doerer's third field goal of the game from 21 yards that were the final points of the wild scoring night.

With Notre Dame, which led 17-13 at halftime, clinging to a 31-27 lead early in the fourth quarter, Williams, took a simple handoff from quarterback Jack Coan right and then reversed his field, breaking past defender Tomon Fox. The Irish running back got a block downfield from tight end Michael Mayer before outracing linebacker Jeremiah Gemmel to the end zone, tying the sixth longest touchdown run in Notre Dame history.

Coan finished with 213 passing yards on 16-of-24 passing with one touchdown — a 21-yarder to Kevin Austin — and added a 21-yard running touchdown in the third quarter. Freshman Tyler Buchner threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Avery Davis.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — For the second straight year, Wake Forest couldn't protect a big second-half lead at North Carolina. This time, though, it likely cost the 10th-ranked Demon Deacons any chance of playing their way deeper into the College Football Playoff race.

Ty Chandler ran for career highs of 213 yards and four touchdowns and North Carolina overcame an 18-point deficit to beat Wake Forest 58-55 on Saturday, handing the Demon Deacons their first loss in a non-conference matchup of Atlantic Coast Conference teams.

It ended with the unusual sight of Tar Heels fans storming the field to celebrate a win against their instate foe, though not one that will count toward the league standings.

"I've told them: every Saturday you build memories," Tar Heels coach Mack Brown said. "That's what you do. And this is a game that they will remember for the rest of their lives. And I'm really, really proud that my name is associated with them."

Chandler's big day included a 50-yard breakaway run with 1:12 left to make it 58-48. That was the final blow for the Tar Heels (5-4) in rallying from a huge third-quarter deficit to beat the Demon Deacons (8-1, No. 9 CFP) for the second straight year, following a 21-point comeback last year by erasing a 45-27 deficit with 7:38 left in the third.

"It just felt like a rerun of last year's game," Wake Forest coach Dave Clawson said.

"Pretty similar," quarterback Sam Hartman echoed.

The Tar Heels felt it too, even down big.

"What we were saying on the sidelines is: we've been here before," UNC quarterback Sam Howell said.

The loss doesn't impact the Demon Deacons' pursuit of their first ACC title since 2006 since it was part of a home-and-home nonconference series announced in 2015 with the schools not meeting as often amid the expanded ACC's scheduling model. But the goal Clawson mentioned after last week's rout of Duke — being in the playoff discussion — is likely gone.

"We just, we weren't sharp," Clawson said. "You say that and we scored 50-something points. But we weren't as sharp as we needed to be. We certainly played well on offense and scored a lot of points, but with as well as North Carolina played, we had to be a little bit better. And we weren't."

Hartman threw for 398 yards and five touchdowns and ran for 78 yards and two more scores for Wake Forest. A.T. Perry and Jaquarii Roberson each hauled in a pair of touchdown grabs to lead a 615-yard effort from the offense.

But that high-scoring unit, one of the best of the Bowl Subdivision, stalled at a critical time with three straight empty drives. And it came against a much-maligned defense that had struggled to show many tangible signs of improvement this season, a key piece of UNC's struggles in going from ranked No. 10 in preseason to unranked before October.

Howell threw for 216 yards and a touchdown and ran for 104 and two more scores in a matchup of high-profile quarterbacks. And the Tar Heels scored on their last five full drives, four for touchdowns.

"We were just breathing life into each other and encouraging each other and keeping it going," Chandler said, adding: "That's what it came down to: just being able to respond. And we did a great job of that."

Pitt 30, Carolina 23 (OT)

PITTSBURGH—Kenny Pickett hit Lucas Krull for an 11-yard touchdown pass in overtime and No. 25 Pittsburgh's defense did the rest as the Panthers held off North Carolina 30-23 in the rain Thursday night.

Pitt (8-2, 5-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) kept firm control on first place in the ACC's Coastal Division with two weeks to go after blowing a 16-point lead before collecting itself in overtime behind Pickett.

Pickett completed 25 of 43 passes for 346 yards with three touchdowns and an interception on a night he became the school's career leader in passing yards. His dart to Krull in the middle of a downpour gave the Panthers the lead during the opening possession of the first extra period.

North Carolina (5-5, 3-4) attempted to respond but went nowhere on four plays, the last a fourth-down desperation heave by quarterback Sam Howell that was picked off by M.J. Devonshire. Howell passed for 296 yards with two touchdowns.

Pitt can earn its second Coastal Division title and trip to the ACC title game in five years if it wins out. The Panthers could also clinch with a victory over Virginia on Nov. 20 and any conference loss by Miami.

The Tar Heels were looking to beat a ranked opponent for the second time in five days. Yet the magic they summoned while knocking off a then-unbeaten Wake Forest last Saturday vanished in overtime.

The expected shootout between two teams featuring NFL-ready quarterbacks averaging a combined 80 points a game never materialized. Pitt and North Carolina struggled to reach half that total as Howell and Pickett spent a significant portion of the night under heavy duress.

The Panthers raced to a 17-point lead before the Tar Heels had a first down. Each of North Carolina's first three drives ended in sacks and the Tar Heels allowed five in the first half as Pitt went up 23-7 behind Pickett.

The super senior threw for a pair of touchdowns and became the Panthers' career leader in yards passing when he broke Alex Van Pelt's mark of 11,267 with a 44-yard heave in the first quarter.

Yet Pitt also missed chances to blow it open. Sam Scarton missed an extra point, had a 54-yard field goal fall short in the tricky winds at Heinz Field and another field-goal attempt blocked.

The Tar Heels eventually made the Panthers pay. Howell found Antoine Green with a 23-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter to make it 23-13. Howell bulled his way over from 1-yard out on fourth down with 5:34 remaining to pull North Carolina within three.

Pickett's fourth interception of the season on Pitt's ensuing possession set up Grayson Atkins' tying 21-yard field goal with 57 seconds remaining to force overtime.

CHAPEL HILL—Playing without quarterback Sam Howell, North Carolina ran for 305 yards to beat Wofford 34-14 on Saturday, becoming bowl eligible in the process.

Howell, who was a game-time decision, missed the first game of his career due to an upper-body injury suffered against No. 20 Pittsburgh last week.

Jacoby Criswell started for the Tar Heels and threw for 125 yards, adding 66 yards and a touchdown on the ground. Freshman Drake Maye took over after halftime and finished with 89 yards.

The Tar Heels (6-5, 3-4 ACC) never trailed in a Senior Day win where they held the Terriers (1-10, 0-8 Southern Conference) to 242 total yards and rode a ground game that scored three times.

British Brooks led the Tar Heel rushing attack with 89 yards and two touchdowns, while Ty Chandler added 78 yards.

Saturday might have marked a home finale for Howell, a junior and top NFL prospect who participated in the team's Senior Day festivities.

Terrier quarterback Peyton Derrick finished with 37 passing yards and 69 rushing yards.

THE TAKEAWAY

UNC: Howell started North Carolina's 2019 season opener as a true freshman and, until Saturday, had played every game since. In that time he's set numerous UNC career records, including passing yardage and passing touchdowns.

Against Wofford, the Tar Heels got their first extended look at how next season might look without him. Both Criswell and Maye were efficient, combining to complete 18 of 28 passing attempts and each leading multiple touchdown drives.

With the win, UNC is now bowl eligible for the third straight year.

Wofford: The Terriers started the season with a 24-22 win over Elon and have dropped 10 straight games since.

RALEIGH—Devin Leary threw two touchdown passes in a 26-second span, with No. 24 North Carolina State recovering an onside kick in between, to stun North Carolina 34-30 on Friday night and remain alive in the ACC Atlantic Division title chase.

With N.C. State down 30-21, Leary found Emeka Emezie on a busted coverage for a 64-yard touchdown strike with 1:33 left. The Wolfpack recovered the onside kick, then Leary threw a 24-yard sideline pass to Emezie with 1:09 remaining.

N.C. State (9-3, 6-2) beat North Carolina (6-6, 3-5) for the first time since 2018 to remain in contention for a trip to the conference championship game. It also officially eliminated six-time reigning league champion Clemson from the Atlantic Division race.

The Wolfpack would reach the title game if No. 21 Wake Forest loses at Boston College on Saturday, creating a three-way tie atop the division that would favor N.C. State by virtue of its division record and head-to-head win over Clemson.

Leary finished with 247 passing yards and four touchdowns.

Sam Howell had three total touchdowns for North Carolina, and running back British Brooks ran for 124 yards for North Carolina.
