Sixth-year linebacker and special teams performer... former walk-on who was rewarded with a scholarship prior to the 2019 season... appeared in 41 games... highly-decorated for his off-field achievements... is the only Game-cock named to the 22-man Allstate AFCA Good Works Team... has earned both a bachelor's degree in public health and a Master's degree in health services policy and management.

2021 (Super Senior)

Appeared in all 13 games, working primarily on special teams... credited with four tackles... named to the SEC Community Service Team for a fifth time... shared the Community Service Award as selected by the coaches... was a Campbell Trophy semifinalist... was a co-winner of the Above All Else Award, as selected by his teammates... recognized as the SEC Brad Davis Community Service Award winner at the 2021 All-Sports Gala.

2020 (Redshirt Senior)

Appeared in the first four games of the season after coming back from a season-ending ACL injury in 2019... credited with a pair of tackles, both coming against Vanderbilt... suffered a season-ending ACL injury in the win over Auburn... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll... named the Male Gamecock Leadership Award winner at the 2020 all-sports gala.

2019 (Redshirt Junior)

Rewarded with a scholarship just prior to the start of the season... appeared in all 11 games, primarily on special teams, until suffering a torn ACL in the Texas A&M game... credited with six tackles including four solo stops... four of his tackles came in the Charleston Southern win... selected by his peers as the Unselfish Teammate for Special Teams and the Tenacity Award for Special Teams... presented with the Community Service Award by the coaches and was named to the SEC Community Service Team and the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll... shared the Harold White GPA Award for special teams, announced at the spring game.

2018 (Redshirt Sophomore)

Appeared in all 13 games, primarily on special teams... saw his most work at linebacker in the Belk Bowl versus Virginia... credited with all four of his tackles, including a tackle for loss, in that contest... also was used periodically during the year at fullback in short-yardage situations... named to the SEC Community Service team following the season and received the Community Service Award as presented by the Carolina coaching staff... a member of the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll... recognized as the Dr. Harris Pastides Outstanding Student-Athlete during the 2018 Garnet & Black Spring Game.

2017 (Redshirt Freshman)

Did not see any game action... garnered the Special Teams Scout Team Award and shared the Community Service Award with Ulric Jones... named to the SEC Community Service team and to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

2016 (Freshman)

True freshman walk-on linebacker who joined the Gamecock football program in the spring... redshirted.

HIGH SCHOOL



Sixth-year defensive lineman... took advantage of the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA to become a "Super Senior"... team leader on and off the field... named a permanent team captain for the 2021 seasons... played in 35 games in his Gamecock career over the past four seasons including 22 starts... owns 81 career tackles including 8.5 tackles for loss.

2021 (Super Senior)

Started all 13 games as a defensive tackle... selected by his teammates at one of five Rex Enright permanent team captains... recorded 41 tackles including 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks... credited with a pair of fumble recoveries, including a "scoop and score" in the win over Florida, and four quarterback hurries... notched a season-high six tackles in the win over Troy... served as a game captain for contests against Troy, Texas A&M and Clemson.

2020 (Redshirt Senior)

Fifth-year senior... played in all 10 games, making eight starts along the defensive line... started at defensive tackle in seven contests and at defensive end against Georgia... did not start against either LSU or Kentucky... credited with 27 tackles including 3.0 tackles for loss... 10 of his 27 tackles came at Ole Miss... previous high in a game was three tackles.

2019 (Redshirt Junior)

Appeared in eight games as a redshirt junior... credited with seven tackles including six solo stops... also had one pass breakup... started the season finale against Clemson, his first career start, and responded with a career-high four tackles... played more snaps in that contest (59) than in the other seven games combined (54)... also registered two tackles against Texas A&M.

2018 (Junior)

Redshirted in his first season at South Carolina... played in four contests, seeing action in the first two and the last two games of the season... credited with six tackles including 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack... four of his six stops, including his lone sack, came in the Belk Bowl vs. Virginia.

2017 (Sophomore)

Finished his sophomore season at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, Ga... credited with 22 tackles, including 9.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks... the Bulldogs posted an 8-2 record under head coach Bert Williams... considered the 13th best JUCO defensive tackle in the country and No. 47 overall... named to the *PrepStar* All-Atlantic Region team.

2016 (Freshman)

Logged 14 tackles including 4.0 TFL's and a sack for Georgia Military.

"JJ" is a two-time all-SEC performer... has shown a knack for getting to the quarterback... naturally instinctive and athletic with an excellent skill set... was a standout in the spring, has appeared in 44 games, making 21 starts... logged 24.0 career tackles for loss and 15.0 sacks with 19 quarterback hurries.

2021 (Senior)

Senior who was a first-team All-SEC and a third-team All-America selection by ProFootballFocus... earned second team All-SEC accolades from Phil Steele... a Chuck Bednarik Award semifinalist... selected by the Carolina coaches as one of three Nutrition Award winners... selected by his teammates at the co-Joe Morrison Award winner as the MVP on defense and the co-Steve Wadiak Award winner as the Team MVP... selected by his teammates at one of five Rex Enright permanent team captains for the 2021 season... recorded 44 tackles, including a team-high 7.0 tackles for loss and a team-best 4.5 sacks... registered 11 of the squad's 34 quarterback hurries on the season... credited with two pass breakups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery... served as a captain in contests versus Georgia, Texas A&M and Clemson... invited to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl and the NFL Combine... named the Rex Enright Defensive Player of the Spring as selected by the coaches.

2020 (Junior)

Named first-team All-SEC by the league's 14 coaches and by Phil Steele... earned second-team all-conference honors by the Associated Press... played and started eight games at the BUCK position... led the team with 6.0 sacks and with three forced fumbles... ranked second in the SEC in both sacks (0.75) and fumbles forced (0.38) per game... tied for 30th in the country in sacks per game and tied for 13th in fumbles forced per game... accounted for nearly half of the team's 14 sacks and 60 percent of the fumbles forced... logged 30 tackles overall, including a team-high 7.0 tackles for loss... also had a pair of quarterback hurries... got off to a fast start with, 2.5 tackles for loss, a pair of sacks and a forced fumble while recording a career-high nine tackles in the season opener against Tennessee... credited with a sack and a forced fumble at Vanderbilt... notched a sack and two QB hurries in the win over Auburn... had six tackles, a sack and a forced fumble at Ole Miss... also had a sack against Missouri... missed the final two games of the season due to injury... also missed the spring after having hip surgery in the off-season.

2019 (Sophomore)

Sophomore defensive lineman who played in all 12 games making one start...

credited with 27 tackles including 16 solo stops... logged 7.0 tackles for loss including 3.5 sacks... also notched three quarterback hurries... made his lone start in the win over Charleston Southern... best games came against Missouri and Clemson when he posted six tackles each... had four tackles, two quarterback hurries and a career-high 1.5 sacks at Texas A&M... also had sacks against Georgia and Clemson... one of three Nutrition Award winners as selected by the coaches following the season.

2018 (Freshman)

True freshman who had a solid first year playing on the defensive line... saw action in 12 games, collecting 20 tackles with 3.0 tackles for loss and a quarterback sack... credited with three quarterback hurries and a pair of pass breakups... made two tackles in his Gamecock debut, a win over Coastal Carolina... made his biggest impact in SEC play with three tackles, including his first-career tackle for loss, in the Tennessee win... logged two tackles, two pass breakups and a blocked PAT vs. Chattanooga... had his best game vs. Akron with a team-high six tackles, his first-career sack, two tackles for loss and three QB hurries.

HIGH SCHOOL

Named the Class AA Defensive Player of the Year and first-team all-state while prepping at Hapeville Charter Academy in Atlanta... graduated in December of 2017 and enrolled at South Carolina in January... guided the Hornets to a 14-1 record and a Georgia Class AA state championship as a senior... coached by Winston Gordon... ranked as the 10th-best strongside defensive end in the nation and the 29th-best player in the state of Georgia by 247's national composite rankings... Rivals ranked him as the 36th-best player in Georgia and the 24th-best strongside defensive end in the nation... named to the *PrepStar* All-Southeast Region team.

2021 (Super Senior)

Earned second-team All-America honors from Walter Camp and third-team accolades from Phil Steele.. named first-team All-SEC by the A.P., SEC Coaches, USA TODAY and Phil Steele... was a Sporting News Midseason first-team All-American and a Jim Thorpe Award Semifinalist... selected by the Carolina coaches as one of three Strength & Conditioning Award winners... selected by his teammates as the co-Outstanding Senior Award, the Most Inspirational Walk-On, the co-Joe Morrison Award winner as the MVP of the defense, the co-Steve Wadiak Award winner as the Team MVP... named as one of five Rex Enright permanent team captains... tied for fourth in the NCAA lead with a team-leading five interceptions, the most for a Gamecock since 2004... led the team with 96 tackles and ranked 13th in the SEC in tackles per game with 7.38... credited with 5.0 tackles for loss, a pair of sacks, three pass breakups two forced fumbles and a quarterback hurry... notched double figures in tackles in three games - Tennessee (13), Kentucky (12) and Troy (11)... served as a game captain against Eastern Illinois, Kentucky, Tennessee, Florida, Auburn and Clemson.

2022 SOUTH CAROLINA PRO TIMING DAY

2020 (Redshirt Senior)

Placed on scholarship during fall camp... played in all 10 games, making five starts at safety... ranked fourth on the team with 43 tackles, despite being used primarily on special teams in the first half of the season... had five stops in the win at Vanderbilt... started each of the season's final five games... made his first career start against Texas A&M and recorded seven tackles... had eight tackles against both Ole Miss and Missouri... credited with two tackles for loss against the Tigers... logged a career-high nine tackles against Georgia.

2019 (Redshirt Junior)

Reserve defensive back... worked his way up from being a scout team performer to seeing action in three games on special teams... did not record any statistics... recognized by the coaches as the Scout Team Award winner for special teams... was not with the team in the spring, but returned to the active roster for the fall of 2019.

2018 (Redshirt Sophomore)

Was eligible for the first time at Carolina... saw action in three games, collecting a pair of tackles... credited with a stop against both Chattanooga and Akron... also appeared in the bowl game vs. Virginia.

2017 (Sophomore)

Worked with the scout team while sitting out his transfer year.

2016 (Freshman)

Played cornerback as a true freshman at Gardner-Webb for head coach Carroll McCray... named the Big South Conference Freshman of the Year... registered 45 tackles including 2.5 tackles for loss... led the Runnin' Bulldogs with five pass interceptions and with nine pass breakups... also recovered a pair of fumbles... earned Big South Freshman of the Week honors twice and was named to the 2016 Jerry Rice Award Watch List, annually given to the FCS Freshman Player of the Year... his five interceptions set a Big South Conference freshman record... led the FCS with 185 defensive return yards, including 111 fumble return yards... scored on a 60-yard fumble return versus Benedict and on a 42-yard interception return at Liberty... also had a 51-yard fumble return against Coastal Carolina... posted a career-high 10 tackles and an interception at Ohio... sealed the win over No. 8 Charleston Southern with an interception in the end zone in the final seconds.

HIGH SCHOOL

Was a three-year starter for Byrnes (S.C.) High under head coach Brian Lane... graduated in 2016... standout all-around performer at defensive back, receiver and return specialist... helped the Rebels to a 12-2 mark in 2015 and to 48 wins over his four-year career... played in wins over nationally-ranked foes Apopka (Fla.) High, Concord (Calif.) De La Salle and Mallard Creek (N.C.) High... named Division I Class 4A All-State by the S.C. High School Sports Report and earned first-team All-Area and All-Region honors following senior season at defensive back... had nearly 1,400 all-purpose yards and scored 13 touchdowns as a senior... caught 28 passes for 471 yards and seven touchdowns, averaged 28.3 yards on 20 kickoff returns with a touchdown and 15.3 yards on 15 punt returns with two scores... also rushed for three TDs... recorded 49 tackles, three interceptions and broke up six passes... selected to play in the 2015 Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas... caught 16 passes for 311 yards and five touchdowns as a junior as part of a 12-2 finish for the Rebels in 2014... picked off five passes, broke up 10 passes and had two fumble recoveries in the secondary... started as a sophomore in the secondary for the Rebels in 2013... recorded 44 tackles and two interceptions... earned All-Area honors in basketball as a junior after averaging 12.4 points, 5.5 assists and 6.4 rebounds.

Three-year player who elected to forego his final year of eligibility to turn pro... finished his career with 1,976 rushing yards, 18th on the school's all-time list... also scored 23 career touchdowns, tying for seventh on the school's all-time list... appeared in 28 games over his career with 16 starts... logged eight 100-yard rushing games in his career, including a pair of 200-yard efforts... is one of only two Gamecocks, along with Mike Davis, to own two carries of 75 yards or longer... was an All-SEC running back in 2020 after leading the league in rushing... invited to the NFL Combine following the season.

2021 (Junior)

Plagued by injuries for much of the season... despite that, still led the team in rushing with 659 yards on 152 carries with four touchdowns... slowed in fall camp after undergoing a minor back procedure on his back over the summer and was not dressed for the opener due to illness... also hampered by a mid-season ankle injury... best game of the regular season came against Florida when he rushed 16 times for 128 yards, an average of 8.0 yards per carry... went out with a bang, rushing 31 times for 182 yards and a touchdown in the Duke's Mayo Bowl win over North Carolina.

2020 (Sophomore)

Became the first Gamecock to lead the SEC in rushing yards per game (113.8) while logging the fifth-best single-season rushing total in school history (1,138) despite playing in just 10 games, all starts... notched the 11th 1,000yard rushing season in school history and the first since Mike Davis in 2013... his 113.8-yard average ranks fifth in school history... was a first-team All-SEC selection by the Associated Press, a second-team performer according to the league's coaches and Phil Steele, and a third-team selection by ProFootball-Focus... recorded five 100-yard rushing games, including a pair of 200-yard games, and set a school record with five rushing touchdowns at Ole Miss... ranked seventh in the nation in rushing yards, 11th in rushing yards per game and 23rd in rushing yards per carry (6.15)... tied for fifth in the country with 15 rushing touchdowns and eighth with 16 TDs overall... scored 16 of the Gamecocks' 29 touchdowns... ranked fourth in the SEC and 13th in the nation in scoring at 9.6 points per game... his 96 points scored tied for sixth in school history, while his 15 rushing touchdowns and 16 TDs overall both tied for second in school annals... one of only four players to have multiple 200-yard rushing games, joining Jaret Patterson (Buffalo), Michael Carter (North Carolina) and Mohamed Ibrahim (Minnesota)... made his first career start against Tennessee... notched first career 100-yard game in SEC play with 22 carries for 100 yards and a TD at Florida... also caught a TD pass in that contest... rushed 21 times for 171 yards (8.1 ypc) at Vanderbilt along with two TD... included was a career-long, 88-yard TD run, the longest run by a Gamecock since Bobby Wallace in 2006, tied for the fourth-longest run in school history, and tied for the sixth-longest run from scrimmage in the FBS in 2020... led the team with 12 carries for 126 yards and two TDs at LSU... turned in the best game of his career at Ole Miss, setting the school record with five rushing TDs while matching his career high with 25 rushes for a career-best 243 yards, the fifth-highest single-game total in school history... tied the school record with 30 points scored in a game... averaged 9.7 yards per carry and had TD runs of 46 and 44 yards against the Rebels... finished the season with a 21-carry, 210-yard effort at Kentucky... joined George Rogers (3) and Marcus Lattimore (2) as only Gamecocks with multiple 200-yard games in a career, and the only player to have multiple 200-yard games in a single season.

2019 (Freshman)

True freshman who played in six games... carried 21 times for 179 yards, an 8.5-yard average, with four touchdowns... made his Gamecock debut a memorable one against Charleston Southern... rushed six times for 147 yards with three touchdowns... the three rushing TDs tied the school record and he became the first true freshman to score three rushing touchdowns since Marcus Lattimore in 2010... scored from 1-, 45- and 75-yards out... became the third true freshman to rush for 100 yards in his debut in the last 20 years, joining Derek Watson (118 vs. NC State in 1999) and Deshaun Fenwick (112 vs. Chattanooga in 2018)... was sidelined with a torn groin muscle for what was originally thought to be a season-ender, but has made a speedy recovery and returned to the active roster after missing five games... logged 10 carries for

20 yards and a touchdown against Vanderbilt... caught three passes on the season, all against Texas A&M, for 26 yards... named one of three Strength & Conditioning Award winners, as selected by the coaches following the season... enrolled at Carolina in January and went through spring drills... named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

HIGH SCHOOL

Prepped at Bradwell Institute in Hinesville, Ga... graduated in December 2018... coached by Ross Couch... finished his season with 1,696 all-purpose yards and 24 touchdowns... rushed for 1,556 yards and 22 TDs, including eight 100-yard games as a senior... was the region's leading rusher, the No. 2 rusher in the class and No. 6 in all classifications in 2018... named Georgia Region 2-AAAAAA Player of the Year... was a WJCL Big 22 All-Star... was the region's Offensive Player of the Year as a junior in 2017 when he ranked 16th in rush-

ing in Georgia with 1,680 yards and scored 16 touchdowns... logged 4,100 rushing yards in his career with 18 100-yard rushing games and 42 rushing TDs... considered the 68th-best player in the Peach State, the 45th-best running back in the country by 247Sports Composite.

NICK MUSE TE 6-5 252 S-SR 3L Belmont, N.C. (South Point/William & Mary)

Tight end who took advantage of the NCAA rule allowing him to return for a fifth season despite never taking a redshirt year... joined the Gamecocks at the start of fall camp in 2019 following a transfer from William & Mary... a willing blocker who has shown agility after the catch... set the tone in the tight end room... logged 67 receptions for 805 yards in three seasons at Carolina and 101 catches for 1,303 yards spanning a five-year career that included two seasons at William & Mary.

2021 (Super Senior)

Preseason All-SEC tight end candidate who started all 13 games... selected by his teammates as the co-Most Outstanding Senior Award winner... ranked fourth on the squad with 20 catches for 222 yards and a pair of TDs... best game was a four-catch, 38-yard performance against Florida... tallied 16 points on the season, scoring touchdowns against Eastern Illinois and Vanderbilt, and scoring on a two-point conversion against EIU and North Carolina... served as a game captain against Eastern Illinois, Troy, Florida and Clemson... selected to play in the East-West Shrine Bowl... shared Joe Morrison Offensive Player of the Spring honors with Dakereon Joyner.

2020 (Senior)

Earned a spot on the Fourth-Team All-SEC squad according to Phil Steele and was an honorable mention All-SEC performer, according to Pro Football Focus... named to the John Mackey Award Watch List... started all 10 games at tight end... caught 30 passes for 425 yards, second on the squad in both categories behind Shi Smith... averaged 14.2 yards per reception with one touchdown... had four catches for 50 yards in the season opener against Tennessee... led the team with five receptions for 85 yards at Vanderbilt... logged a team-best six receptions for 67 yards against Missouri... had the best game of his career against Georgia when he hauled in eight passes for 131 yards, both career highs, including a season-long 35-yard reception and his first career touchdown... it was the most catches for a Gamecock tight end since Hayden Hurst had eight receptions gainst Mississippi State in 2016, and the most yards for Gamecock tight end since Danny Smith had 134 yards on just five catches against Appalachian State in 1985... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

2019 (Junior)


