- ◆ The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1 SEC) return home for the first game of a three-game homestand when they host the nation's top-ranked team according to the Associated Press, and the defending national champion Georgia Bulldogs (2-0, 0-0 SEC) on Saturday, Sept. 17. Game time from Williams-Brice Stadium (77,577) is set for noon ET.
- ◆ For the second week in a row, the Gamecocks will have their game televised nationally on ESPN. Sean McDonough will handle the play-by-play with Todd Blackledge providing the color commentary and Molly McGrath on the sidelines for the mothership. ESPN Radio also covers the Gamecocks with a national broadcast for the second-straight week with Mike Couzens on the call and Max Starks serving as the analyst. Mike Peasley will again handle the sideline reports for the national radio broadcast.
- ◆ The Gamecocks come into the contest with a 1-1 mark, defeating Georgia State by a 35-14 count in the season and home opener on Sept. 3, then falling at No. 16/17 Arkansas last week by a 44-30 score in the SEC opener for both squads. Georgia, which takes over the No. 1 A.P. ranking this week, has yet to be tested this season, rolling to a 49-3 victory over nationally-ranked Oregon, then shutting out an overmatched Samford squad last week in Athens, 33-0.
- ◆ For the third-straight week, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer will be facing a former coaching colleague. Coach Beamer was on Kirby Smart's staff at Georgia in 2016 and 2017. The 2016 squad went 8-5 and defeated TCU in the Liberty Bowl. The 2017 Bulldogs defeated Oklahoma in the Rose Bowl, then lost to Alabama in the CFP Championship game by a 26-23 score to finish 13-2. Last week, Coach Beamer faced Arkansas head coach Sam Pittman. Pittman was also part of the 2016 and '17 staffs at Georgia. In the season opener, Coach Beamer went head-to-head with Georgia State head coach Shawn Elliott. Both Beamer and Elliott were on the 2010 South Carolina staff under head coach Steve Spurrier.

CAROLINA VS. GEORGIA: This is the 75th meeting between these two bordering flagship state universities. Georgia leads the all-time series by a 53-19-2 margin, including a 22-10-2 advantage in

Columbia and a 30-9 mark in Athens. Since becoming SEC Eastern Division rivals in 1992, the Bulldogs own a 20-10 lead in the series, including 10-5 mark in Columbia.

CLOSER OF LATE: While Georgia has won six of the last seven meetings between these two schools, the Dawgs hold just a 7-5 advantage in games played since 2010. Carolina won three-straight from 2010-12, its longest winning streak in the series, and won again in 2014 and 2019. Georgia countered with a win in 2013 and four-straight from 2015-18 before winning each of the last two contests.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: JT Daniels completed 21-of-31 passes for 303 yards and three touchdowns and Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD as the No. 2 Bulldogs ran away with a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Sept. 18, 2021 in Athens. Josh Vann logged a career-best 128 yards receiving for the Gamecocks, including a 36-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: The No. 13/10 Georgia Bulldogs put up 21 first-quarter points and never looked back in a 45-16 win over South Carolina on Nov. 28, 2020. Georgia did most of the damage on the ground, rushing for 332 yards on 46 carries, a 7.2-yard average. True freshman Luke Doty made his first career start and responded by connecting on 18-of-22 passes for 190 yards with a touchdown and an interception. With Shi Smith sidelined, tight end Nick Muse stepped up with the best game of his career, an eight-catch, 131-yard, one-touchdown performance.

THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN: In the high point of the 2019 season, the Gamecocks went into Athens on Oct. 12 and knocked off the No. 3/3 Bulldogs by a 20-17 mark in double-overtime. Israel Mukuamu was the star of the game, intercepting three Jake Fromm passes, including a 53-yard pick-six in the upset win. Parker White connected on a 24-yard field in the second overtime, before Rodrigo Blankenship missed from 42, providing the winning score. Georgia outgained Carolina 468-297 on the afternoon, but four turnovers proved costly for the Dawgs. The win matched the best road win for Carolina in school history and the Gamecocks were recognized as the National Team of the Week.

BEEN HERE, DONE THAT: Georgia enters this week's game ranked atop the Associated Press poll. Four of South Carolina's top eight wins in school history according to the A.P. have come against Georgia, with three of those coming in Williams-Brice Stadium.

BEAMER SEES RED: First-year South Carolina head coach **Shane Beamer** served on Kirby Smart's staff at Georgia as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator in 2016 and '17. This is the eighth time Coach Beamer has been on the sidelines for Carolina-Georgia. He has been on the winning sideline in four of the previous seven games.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND: Carolina running back **Lovasea Carroll** was a defensive back on the Georgia squad last season. Gamecock offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** served on the Georgia coaching staff from 1996-2000. DFO **George Wynn** started for three years at Georgia and served as a team captain as a senior, graduating in 1992.

OLD FRIEND ALERT: Will Muschamp returns to his old stomping grounds. He served as the Gamecocks' head coach from 2016-20, posting a 28-30 record. He now serves as UGA's co-defensive coordinator. **Bryan McClendon** and **Mike Bobo**, who both worked on Muschamp's staff at USC, now work at UGA, with McClendon serving as the passing game coordinator and Bobo in quality control. All three are UGA grads.

A South Carolina win over Georgia would...

- ◆ Match the best win in school history, according to the AP poll. South Carolina defeated No. 1 Alabama in the 2010 season, 35-21, en route to a spot in the SEC Championship game.
- ♦ Even the Gamecocks' SEC record at 1-1. They have not opened SEC play 1-1 since the 2018 season when they lost to Georgia before defeating Vanderbilt. They have dropped their first two conference games in each of the last three seasons.
- ◆ Snap a two-game losing streak to the Bulldogs and be the Gamecocks' sixth win over their Eastern Division rivals in the last 13 games.

THEY'RE NUMBER ONE: Georgia comes into Williams-Brice Stadium ranked No. 1 in the country in this week's Associated Press poll. It's the seventh time that Carolina will face the A.P.'s top-ranked team. They are 1-5 when playing the No. 1 team previously, with the lone win coming against Alabama in 2010. The last three have come at home:

BEATING A RANKED OPPONENT: South Carolina's last win over a ranked opponent came in the 2020 season when they knocked off 15th-ranked Auburn in Columbia by a 30-22 score. Carolina is just 1-9 in their last 10 games against a team ranked in the Associated Press Top-25. Shane Beamer is 0-3 as a head coach against Top-25 teams, falling at No. 2 Georgia and at No. 17 Texas A&M during the 2021 campaign before losing at 16th-ranked Arkansas last week in Fayetteville.

TOUGH SLEDDING: The Gamecocks dropped a 44-30 decision at No. 16 Arkansas last week. That contest started a stretch in which the Gamecoocks will be playing seven of 11 games against teams currently ranked in the nation's Top-25, including four in the Top-10. In addition to Georgia being ranked No. 1, this week's Associated Press Top-25 includes Clemson (5), Kentucky (9), Arkansas (10), Tennessee (15), Florida (18) and Texas A&M (24).

ABOUT LAST WEEK: The Gamecocks traveled to Arkansas last week for the first time since the 2013 season and suffered a 44-30 setback to the No. 16/17 Razorbacks, snapping a three-game winning streak over the Hogs. Arkansas used a punishing ground attack that totaled 295 rushing yards on 65 carries en route to the win. The Hogs scored touchdowns on each of their first three possessions to open up a 21-3 advantage. The Gamecocks clawed back into it to make it 21-16 after three quarters, but Arkansas put 23 fourthquarter points on the board to seal the win.

AGAINST THE ODDS: The Gamecock netted 416 yards of offense at Arkansas. It was their first loss under Shane Beamer when gaining 400 or more yards. They were 4-0 when gaining 400 or more yards in 2021. It also was the first time that Carolina had lost when scoring 30 or more points under Coach Beamer. They were 3-0 when scoring 30 or more points last season.

WELLS RUNS DEEP: Antwane Wells Jr. turned in the best game of his career at Arkansas. The junior transfer from James Madison caught eight passes on 10 targets for a career-high 189 yards and one touchdown. He had receptions of 64- and 62-yards in the contest.

BEST IN SHOW: Antwane Wells Jr.'s 189-yard receiving performance at Arkansas tied for the 10th-best single-game performance in school history and the most receiving yards in a game since Deebo Samuel went for 210 at Clemson in 2018.

SPENCER FOR HIRE: After going 7-for-13 for just 93 yards in the first half, Spencer Rattler got hot in the second half at Arkansas. He completed 17-of-26 passes for 283 yards in the second half, including 14-of-19 for 188 yards in the fourth quarter, to finish the day 24-of-39 for 376 yards and a TD. He fell just shy of his career-best performance, a 387-yard effort against Kansas State in 2020.

THE DANDY DOZEN: Spencer Rattler's 376 yards passing at Arkansas was the 12th-best single-game mark in school history and the most since Jake Bentley lit up Clemson for a school record 510 yards during the 2018 season. Here are the top-12 passing games in school history:

SINGLE-GAME PASSING YARDS

PLAYING SHORT-HANDED: The Gamecocks went into Fayetteville without the services of two key members of their secondary, safety **R.J. Roderick** and nickel **David Spaulding**, both of whom were injured against Georgia State and did not make the trip. During the Arkansas contest, Carolina lost the services of a defensive starter at all three levels - Edge rusher **Jordan Strachan** linebacker **Mohamed Kaba** and defensive back **Cam Smith**.

WHAT ABOUT THE OPENER?: Carolina opened the second year of the Shane Beamer Era with a 35-14 win over Georgia State on Sept. 3. A sold-out crowd of 78,297 was on hand to see Spencer Rattler in his Gamecock debut, but it was Pete Lembo and his special teams units that stole the show, it what arguably was the best single-game special teams performance in school history.

EVERYBODY LEMBO: Special teams coordinator **Pete Lembo** slept well after the season opening win over Georgia State, as his units produced two blocked punts for touchdowns, was successful on a pair of field goals beyond 50 yards, had seven punts that averaged over 49 yards with a long of 79 and no return yardage, a successful fake field goal that led to a touchdown, no kickoff return yardage allowed and 69 punt return yards gained.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Six players made their first start for the Gamecocks in the season opener versus Georgia State, but only two, MarShawn Lloyd and Alex Huntley, were making their first collegiate start overall. Spencer Rattler, Devonni Reed, Austin Stogner and Jordan Strachan made their first starts for Carolina, but had made starts at their previous stops. Safety Nick Emmanwori became the first true freshman from the 2022 signing class to earn a start when he was in on the first snap at safety at Arkansas.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2022 marks the 129th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 116th-consecutive year in which Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 622-602-44, a .508 winning percentage.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features nine scholarship transfers, six of whom enrolled at Carolina in January. The spring enrollees included RB Christian Beal-Smith (Wake Forest), RB Lovasea Carroll (Georgia), EDGE Terrell Dawkins (NC State), QB Spencer Rattler (Oklahoma), DB Devonni Reed (Central Michigan), and WR Antwane Wells Jr. (James Madison). TE Nate Adkins (East Tennessee State), WR Corey Rucker (Arkansas State) and TE Austin Stogner (Oklahoma) were added to the roster in the summer. Rattler, Reed and Stogner were in the opening day lineup.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list 10 players (not including transfers) whose eligibility would have expired at South Carolina had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super seniors" are WR Jalen Brooks, OL Eric Douglas, LB Sherrod Greene, LB Brad Johnson, DB R.J. Roderick, EDGE Jordan Strachan, WR Chad Terrell, WR Josh Vann, DL M.J. Webb and OL Dylan Wonnum.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA COVID rule allowing for an extra year, five Gamecocks - OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, WR **Josh Vann** and OL **Dylan Wonnum** - can become five-year letterwinners.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 21 players on the active roster who have their college degrees in hand. Twelve players who wore the SEC Graduate patch in the Duke's Mayo Bowl return for the 2022 season. That list includes Wyatt Campbell, Eric Douglas, Sherrod Greene, Brad Johnson. Tyreek Johnson. Dakereon Joyner. Hank Manos, Darius Rush, Jordan Strachan, Chad Terrell, M.J. Webb and Dylan Wonnum. Two players, Jovaughn Gwyn and Jaylen Nichols, graduated in May. **Traevon Kenion** and **R.J. Roderick** graduated in August. In addition, Nate Adkins (East Tennessee State), Christian Beal-Smith (Wake Forest), Dante Miller, (Columbia) Devonni Reed (Central Michigan and Austin Stogner (Oklahoma) have degrees from other institutions.

YOU'RE MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE: Wide receiver **Payton Mangrum** was awarded the Jake Panus scholarship prior to the start of the fall semester. Mangrum has been a regular on special teams and has also been on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. **Matthew Bailey** was the 2021 recipient.

NO BUENO: Sixth-year tight end **Chad Terrell** suffered an ACL injury during the Gamecocks' first scrimmage of preseason camp and will miss the entire 2022 season. It was the third ACL Terrell has suffered during his Gamecock career.

DOWN AND OUT: The Gamecocks lost a pair of defensive starters in the Arkansas contest. Both defensive end **Jordan Strachan** and linebacker **Mohamed Kaba** suffered ACL tears in the game and will miss the remainder of the season.

SEEING DOUBLE: Redshirt senior **Wyatt Campbell** is an offensive lineman by trade and wears No. 68, but has also been used at tight end where he dons No. 80.

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks step out of conference next week when they host the Charlotte 49ers at Williams-Brice Stadium. It will be the first time the two schools have gotten together on the gridiron.

Offense

SATT ATTACK: The Gamecock offense is in its second year under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. In his first season, Satt was able to cobble seven wins together with four different starting quarterbacks winning games. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

POSITIVE RESULTS SO FAR: The sample size is small, but so far, the Gamecock offense has been more productive than last season. Carolina is averaging 32.5 points and 361.0 yards of total offense after two games in 2022. Last season the Gamecocks averaged just 22.6 points and 336.8 yards of offense per game.

QB BOWL WINS: South Carolina is one of only two schools in the country, along with Utah State, that has two players on its 2022 roster that have won a bowl game as a starting quarterback. South Carolina features **Spencer Rattler** (2020 Cotton Bowl) and **Dakereon Joyner** (2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl).

QB1: Oklahoma transfer **Spencer Rattler** is the Gamecocks' number one signal-caller. Rattler, who joined the team in the spring and was the Joe Morrison Player of the Spring for the offense, is 47-for-76 (61.8 percent) for 603 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions this season. He ranks third in the SEC and 16th in the country in passing yards per game at 301.5. His 376 yards passing at Arkansas ranks as the 12th-best single game performance in school history. He has appeared in 25 games during his career, posting a 16-3 record as a starter. He has completed 69.6 percent of his career passes (408-for-591) for 5,198 yards with 42 touchdowns.

DOTY IN THE BULLPEN: Junior **Luke Doty** was the projected starter at quarterback during preseason camp a year ago, but foot injuries derailed his sea-

son. The Myrtle Beach, S.C. product is fully healthy and has improved his game since that time. He is without question the No. 2 QB entering the season. Doty has completed 60 percent of his passes in 13 career games. He is 2-4 as a starting QB.

OK-Oklahoma W-Wingate

THAT'LL DO 'ER, LLOYD: MarShawn Lloyd has ascended to the top of the depth chart at running back. A highly-touted recruit, Lloyd has regained the trust in his surgically-repaired knee that cost him the 2020 season. Through two games he leads Carolina in rushing with 18 carries for 53 yards and is second on the squad in receptions with eight for 103 yards. He leads the team with three TDs, two on the ground and one receiving.

JUJU ON THE BEACH: Juju McDowell was a Freshman All-SEC performer a year ago as an all-purpose back and return specialist and, despite his diminu-

tive size, is tough as nails and elusive in space. He has rushed 13 times for 49 yards and has five pass receptions for 43 yards through two games.

TUNE IN TO CBS: Christian Beal-Smith joined the running back corps as a grad transfer from Wake Forest. He rushed for 1,871 yards over four seasons with the Demon Deacons. CBS was hobbled in preseason camp and did not dress for the opener against Georgia State. He saw limited action last week at Arkansas.

THE JUICE IS LOOSE: Wide receiver Antwane "Juice" Wells Jr. is off to a great start as a Gamecock. The junior transfer from James Madison has quickly become a favorite target for quarterback Spencer Rattler, as Wells has been targeted 17 times in two games and has 15 receptions for 244 yards, a 16.3-yard average. His 15 receptions and 244 receiving yards both lead the SEC. He caught eight passes for 189 yards and a touchdown last week at Arkansas, including receptions of 64- and 62-yards, while posting the 10th-best single-game receiving yardage in school history. The 189 yards receiving is the third-highest single-game mark in Division I football so far in 2022. He was recognized by the East-West Shrine Bowl as the Breakout Offensive Player of the Week.

BROOKS WAS HERE: Senior wide receiver **Jalen Brooks** has returned to the lineup this season after missing the final half of the 2021 season. He has been targeted seven times so far and has responded with six catches for 117 yards, an average of 19.5-yards per reception.

QUIET IN THE VANN: Josh Vann is the Gamecocks' top returning receiver. He had a breakout season a year ago when he caught 43 passes and now ranks tied for 24th in school history with 91 career receptions. So far in 2022, he's been quiet with just one catch for nine yards, but he gave Georgia fits a year ago when he caught three passes for a careerhigh 128 yards and a touchdown.

YOU GOT MOSSED: Josh Vann was selected as the "You Got Mossed" winner as part of ESPN's NFL Countdown for his catch at Georgia last season.

GET THE BALL TO THE TIGHT END: Offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield wants to get the ball to the tight ends. Despite the loss of Chad Terrell, who suffered his third ACL injury in the preseason, **Jody Wright's** room is deep and talented. Jaheim Bell and Austin Stogner are both on the preseason Mackey Award Watch List.

IT TOLLS FOR THEE: Jaheim Bell is a do-it-all player who exploded in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Bell owns the top-two receiving games by a tight end in school history, a 136-yard effort against Vanderbilt and a 159-yard performance against North Carolina in the aforementioned bowl game. He can line up anywhere on the field, as he has four catches for 18 yards and 11 rushes for 44 yards in 2022.

NO LIMITS FOR AUSTIN: Graduate transfer **Austin Stogner** joined the squad this summer after graduating from Oklahoma, where he caught 47 passes over the past three seasons, most of them from Spencer Rattler. He was limited to just one catch in the opener, but recorded five catches for 43 yards at Arkansas.

SON OF A COACH: Nate Adkins, the son of offensive line coach Greg Adkins, joined the team after graduating from East Tennessee State. Regarded as a tough, hard-nosed blocker, Adkins has also shown good hands and has a great understanding of the game.

THE O-LINE IS O-KAY: Offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country with a combined 139 career starts.

- ◆ LT Jaylen Nichols started seven games a year ago and has 13 career starts under his belt. He was the co-Most Improved Player of the Spring on the offensive side of the ball.
- ◆ LG **Vershon Lee** is expected to take another step this year. He has started 12 games in his career, including nine last season.
- ◆ OC **Eric Douglas** makes the calls for the O-line. Douglas, a sixth-year player, has made 26 starts, including the last 25 in a row.
- ◆ RG **Jovaughn Gwyn** is the most experienced player on the squad with 36-consecutive starts. A player who leads by example, Gwyn was named a permanent team captain in 2021.
- ◆ RT **Dylan Wonnum** was not officially considered a returning starter as a back injury sidelined him for the final seven games of the 2021 season, but he is healthy and has 32 career starts under his belt. His brother, D.J., was a standout defensive end for Carolina and now plays for the Minnesota Vikings
- ♦ OT Jakai Moore (11 starts), OG/OT Tyshawn Wannamaker (7) and OC Hank Manos (2) all have gained valuable experience and are capable backups pushing for playing time. Wannamaker was listed as a returning starter at right tackle after making seven starts at that position in 2021.

Defense

CLAYTON'S CREW: Defensive coordinator Clayton White brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia and the results were impressive in his first season. A four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White's first foray in the SEC had Carolina allowing 24.0 points per game, down from 36.0 in 2020. The Gamecocks were especially strong in the secondary, ranking seventh in the country in pass defense while forcing 24 turnovers overall, including 15 picks.

AIR ATTACK GROUNDED: South Carolina has picked up right where they left off a season ago when they led the SEC and ranked seventh in the country in pass defense at 180.8 yards per game. Georgia State completed just 7-of-29 passes



for 111 yards with an interception in the season opener. The seven completions allowed was the fewest by a Carolina defense since Wofford, a triple-option team, completed 5-of-9 pass attempts late in the 2017 season. The 24.1 completion rate was the lowest against the Gamecocks since Kentucky completed just 15.4 percent on 4-of-26 passing in a 54-3 Carolina win in 2011. For the season, the Gamecocks rank second in the SEC and 15th in the country in passing yards allowed at just 136.5 per game.

THE RUN STOPS HERE: The interior of the defensive line is led by All-SEC candidate Zacch Pickens. Pickens was the 2022 Rex Enright co-Player of the Spring for the defense. The senior has appeared in all 37 games over the past four seasons, making 22 starts. He was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2019. After getting shut out in tackles in the season opener against Georgia State, Pickens responded with a career-high 12 stops at Arkansas.

BOOGIE OOGIE OOGIE: Another player who earned SEC All-Freshman honors is **Alex Huntley**, who was named to the 2021 unit by the league's coaches. Huntley is known by the nickname "Boogie." He made his first career start in the opener. He has six stops and a pass breakup in two games.

EDGE JORDAN: EDGE rusher **Jordan Burch**, who was a high school teammate of Gamecock defensive tackle Alex Huntley, was the second-highest

SACK ATTACK: The Gamecocks did not record a sack in the opener vs. Georgia State, but were credited with six hurries, as the Panthers' quarterback completed just 24 percent of his attempts. Both Jordan Burch and Jordan Strachan notched sacks last week at Arkansas. Last season, Carolina recorded 26 sacks, an average of 2.0 per game. Here are the sack number for the 2022 Gamecocks:

GILBER GETS IT: Gilber Edmond saw the most playing time of his career in the opener against Georgia State and took advantage of it. He was in on four tackles, including two of the team's six tackles for loss, and two of Carolina's six quarterback hurries recorded in the contest. He had four more stops at Arkansas.

GREENE IS GOOD: Senior Sherrod Greene returns to bolster the Carolina linebacking corps. Greene started 22 games for the Gamecocks in 2018 and 2019, and was the starter entering the 2020 season, but suffered a fracture in his hip in the opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season. He was the starter again in 2021, but suffered a right ankle injury in game three at Georgia and missed the remainder of the season. He has logged 146 career tackles including 10.5 tackles for loss and owns 28 career starts, but had just eight tackles in four games in the 2020 and '21 seasons combined. He was held out of the opener but played extensively at Arkansas, registering eight tackles.

BRAD'S BACK: Brad Johnson returns for his sixth year and his second at linebacker after transitioning from defensive end. Johnson was named a permanent team captain after the 2020 season. He has appeared in 49 contests with 18 starts. He was the Gamecocks' defensive player of the game against Georgia State after recording five solo tackles and a quarterback hurry.

SEEING LESS OF MO: Mohamed Kaba was named the 2022 Most Improved Player of the Spring for the defense. He was a member of the 2020 SEC Coaches' All-Freshman team. Unfortunately, he suffered an a torn ACL at Arkansas and will not be available for the remainder of the 2022 season.

ON SECOND THOUGHT: The defensive backfield lost a good one in All-American safety Jaylan Foster, but secondary coach Torrian Gray likes the first five he can put on the field. Depth is a concern, as the depth chart lists five true freshmen (Nick Emmanwori, Emory Floyd, Kennan Nelson Jr., DQ Smith and Kajuan Banks) on it, and all five reside in the secondary.

ALL-EVERYTHING: Redshirt junior **Cam Smith** saw his name appear on nearly every All-America and All-SEC preseason team and several watch lists. Smith has played both the nickel and corner positions. He has five career interceptions and broke up 11 passes a year ago while allowing multiple catches in just two of 11 games.

RUSH TO JUDGMENT: It's taken a little time, but **Darius Rush** has become the cornerback the coaches hoped he would be when he transitioned from wide receiver earlier in his career. At 6-2 and 200 pounds, Rush possesses the size and length that make him an intriguing prospect. He has a pair of pass breakups this season.

HE'S NUMBER ONE: Fifth-year Super Senior, four-year letterwinner and three-year starter **R.J. Roderick** returns at safety. Roderick has appeared in 44 games, making 34 starts. He was injured on the first drive of the season against Georgia State and has not returned to the field since.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: The Gamecocks added safety **Devonni Reed** from Central Michigan via the transfer portal. Reed fills the role vacated by the graduation of All-American Jaylan Foster. Reed was a second-team All-MAC performer a year ago after interception two passes with six breakup while recording 74 tackles for the Chippewas.

NICK AT NIGHT: True freshman **Nick Emmanwori** made his presence felt in the opener against Georgia State. The local product from Irmo was inserted into the safety position in the first series of the game following an injury to R.J. Roderick, and played virtually the remainder of the contest. He was credited with three solo tackles and a pass break up, including a stop on a fourth-andone situation from the Carolina 8-yard line in the game's first series, which set the tone. He earned his first career start last week at Arkansas, becoming the first member of the freshman class of 2022 to earn a starting assignment. He responded with 11 tackles, including seven solo stops, and a quarterback hurry.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted 15 passes in 13 games a year ago. **Marcellas Dial** had the team's first pick against Georgia State, the first of his career, and also had three pass breakups in the contest. Here are the interception numbers for the 2022 Gamecocks:

Phil Steele Second-Team All-SEC Outland Trophy Watch List scored from 10-yards out to seal the win. They were the first punt returns for a touchdown by the Gamecocks since the 2000 season when Carlos Spikes and Derek Watson both returned blocked punts for first quarter TDs in a 41-21 loss at Florida.

BLOCK THAT KICK: Since Shane Beamer and Pete Lembo took over at South Carolina, the Gamecocks have blocked six kicks in 15 games. The Gamecocks had six blocked kicks over the previous four years (2017-20) combined.

RESPECT FOR JETER: Mitch Jeter came into the season following in the huge footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer and five-year starter. Jeter responded with 53-and 51-yard field goals on his first two career attempts. He became the first player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. His first attempt, the 53-yarder, tied for the seventh-longest made field goal in school history. He added a field goal at Arkansas and is a perfect 3-for-3 in his career.

PRACTICE IS OVERRATED: Junior Kai Kroger missed most of preseason camp with a foot injury and was questionable heading into the season-opener against Georgia State, but responded with an impressive performance. He punted seven times for 344 yards, a 49.1-yard average with four inside the 20 and three of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 79-yarder, the longest for a Gamecock since Marty Simpson's 79-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992. The effort earned him the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week honors for the second time in his career.

KAI KROEGER CAN KICK: Junior Kai Kroeger returns to handle the punting chores for the Gamecocks this season. The third-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. He is averaging 43.3 yards per punt with a long of 79 yards in his career. Of his 108 career punts, 24 have traveled 50 or more yards with 35 inside the 20 and just five touchbacks. ATHENS, GA. (AP) — JT Daniels returned to the lineup with three touchdown passes, Georgia's fearsome defense nearly made it three-straight games without allowing a TD and the No. 2 Bulldogs romped to a 40-13 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Daniels completed 23-of-31 for 303 yards, including scoring throws of 43 yards to Jermaine Burton, 38 yards to freshman Adonai Mitchell and 4 yards to James Cook.

Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) finally gave up a touchdown while on defense when Luke Doty, getting the ball on the Bulldogs' side of the field after a fumble, connected with Josh Vann on a 36-yard touchdown pass with 10:55 remaining.

To that point, the only touchdown against Georgia this season had come on an interception return.

With Doty playing for the first time this season, South Carolina (2-1, 0-1) gave up three sacks and a safety, along with two turnovers that led to Georgia touchdowns.

Daniels sat out a 56-7 victory over UAB with an oblique injury, watching as backup Stetson Bennett tied a school record with five touchdown passes.

Daniels wasted no time re-establishing his hold on the No. 1 spot, completing a 21-yard pass to Brock Bowers on his very first snap and guiding the Bulldogs to the end zone on their first two possessions.

Bennett got a shot the third time the Bulldogs had the ball. He promptly threw an interception that was returned to the Georgia 12, setting up a field goal.

Daniels returned to the game and didn't leave until early in the fourth quarter with the outcome no longer in doubt.

After punting the ball away in the closing seconds of the first half and content to settle for a 21-6 lead, Georgia wound up scoring five more points.

Backed up on their own 1, the Gamecocks explicably attempted to throw out of the end zone. Doty was sacked by Jordan Davis and Nolan Smith for a safety.

Then, after receiving the free kick, Daniels completed three passes for 39 yards to set up Jack Podlesny's 36-yard field goal as time expired, sending Georgia to the locker room up 26-6.

Georgia put it away in opening minute of the second half, again sparked by a huge defensive play.

Doty's pass was picked off by Derion Kendrick, who returned it to the South Carolina 20. Zamir White ripped off a 15-yard run, then took it in from the 5 to pad the lead to 33-6.

Cook had two touchdowns, also scoring on a 23-yard run.

GAME CHANGER

Jaylan Foster picked off a JT Daniels pass at the Georgia 47 and returned it 35 yards to the Bulldog 12. Carolina was not able to punch it in the end zone, as Parker White's 27-yard field goal made it 14-6 Georgia with 1:34 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs responded with a second quarter touchdown drive, a safety and a field goal as the Gamecocks did not get any closer in their first loss of 2021.

KEY STAT

Shane Beamer, one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, begins his second season as the University of South Carolina's head coach in 2022. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and

three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to South Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in Gamecock Football history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12thbest in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. South Carolina 35 Georgia State 14

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's special teams led the way toward a season-opening 35-14 victory over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Special teams have always been an emphasis for Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer, who watched his father, Frank, win game after game with "Beamer Ball," and its big special teams play.

The approach worked as the Gamecocks pulled away from Georgia State with 23 unanswered points in the second half.

The Gamecocks returned two blocked punts for touchdowns, new placekicker Mitch Jeter debuted by knocking two field goals of 50-plus yards and long snapper Hunter Rogers carried a fake field goal 5 yards for a first down that led to the Gamecocks' only first-half touchdown.

New quarterback Spencer Rattler took in a key two-point conversion in the third quarter to restore South Carolina's lead and it was just enough to squeak past a determined Panthers' squad that held a brief third-quarter advantage, 14-12.

The back-breaker also came in the third, when Rashad Amos blocked a Georgia State punt and DQ Smith retrieved the carom and ran it in for a touchdown.

Rattler showed off his dynamic playmaking ability. He finished 23 of 37 passing for 226 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

Following a scoreless first quarter, South Carolina sent out Jeter to attempt a 25-yard field goal. But special teams coordinator Pete Lembo's gang took over.

Long snapper Rogers took the snap and ran for just enough room for the first down. The Gamecocks lined up versatile tight end Jaheim Bell as a fullback at the goal line, then pitched to MarShawn Lloyd on the endaround for a touchdown.

A Rattler interception on the second play of the third quarter set up the Panthers' second score, a Grainger 4-yard rush to take a 14-12 lead. The Gamecocks immediately responded as Rattler hit Marshawn Lloyd for a 16-yard scoring pass to take the lead for good, 20-14.

Just over two minutes later, Rashad Amos blocked the punt and DQ Smith ran it back 26 yards for a 28-14 lead.

Later, Gamecocks' Traevon Kenion blocked a fourth-quarter punt and Ahmarean Brown took it 10 yards for the final score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia State: The Panthers will cause a lot of trouble in the Sun Belt with their rushing attack. The Gamecocks' defense mostly held them in check, but GSU won't be playing the SEC anymore.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense had some creative play-calls and greatly benefited from having a talent like Rattler behind center. He escaped trouble with his legs to keep numerous plays alive. Yet its offensive line struggled to protect Rattler and the Gamecocks' runners finished with 79 yards.

THE RETURN

Lloyd was the Gamecocks' most hyped running back recruit in a decade but tore an ACL in the first week of preseason camp two years ago and missed the season. He played in 2021 but was still very much not back to full strength.

On Saturday, he rushed for 30 yards, caught two passes for 31 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CLOWNEY COMES HOME

South Carolina held a halftime ceremony to honor former All-American and No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowney. Clowney's jersey No. 7 was added alongside the Gamecocks' four retired numbers, although his number will continue to be worn as per a 2007 university policy.

FAYETTEVILLE, ARK. (AP) — Darren McFadden and Felix Jones make for some serious company. Rocket Sanders can now say he's there with those all-time Arkansas running backs.

The Razorbacks' sophomore running back ran for a career-high 156 yards and two touchdowns in helping the No. 16 Razorbacks beat South Carolina 44-30 on Saturday.

Sanders joined McFadden, twice a Heisman Trophy finalist, and Jones, the player with the sixth-most yards rushing in school history, as the only three Arkansas players to run for 150 yards and two scores against the Gamecocks.

Sanders ran for 578 yards and five touchdowns in his first season last year. With returning starter Dominique Johnson still sidelined recovering from a knee injury suffered in the Outback Bowl, Sanders has taken nearly all of the first-team reps. The result has been a 2-0 start for his team and him becoming the first Razorbacks player since 2019 with back-to-back 100-yard games.

Sanders scored the first two touchdowns of the game as Arkansas (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) found the end zone on each of its first three possessions against South Carolina and opened a 21-3 lead. The Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1) responded with two straight scores at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second to pull within 21-16.

Sanders wouldn't score again as KJ Jefferson was the keystone for a bulk of the Razorbacks' second-half touchdowns, but he ran for 95 of his 156 yards in the final 30 minutes.

Arkansas ran for 295 yards, and AJ Green and Rashod Dubinion also chipped in touchdowns.

"I was really proud of our offensive line. We asked them to kind of control the game and I felt like they did. I think the offensive line wore them down," Pittman said.

Jefferson led a 14-play, 59-yard drive capped with his own 2-yard rushing touchdown at the start of the fourth quarter to move Arkansas back ahead by two scores. South Carolina lost a fumble on its next possession and Jefferson added a touchdown pass to Warren Thompson in response, ultimately putting the Gamecocks too far behind to rally.

Spencer Rattler tried. The Oklahoma transfer threw for 371 yards and a touchdown on 23 of 38 passing with a touchdown for South Carolina, but was intercepted in the end zone midway through the fourth quarter by Dwight McGlothern. The Gamecocks had three turnovers.

Jefferson was 18 of 21 passing for 162 yards and a touchdown. He ran for another 67 yards and the score on 19 carries.

"I thought he played better today than he did last week. I thought he was more accurate," Pittman said. "I thought he was in total control. ... He pretty much can take over the game when he wants to."

Johnson is expected to return in Week 3 against Missouri State. He might find himself short on carries as Sanders' development has put the sophomore in high company.

"I think he's becoming an all-around back a little bit more," Pittman said. "I thought he played really, really well. Two 100-yard days back-to-back is pretty good. He's a better back than he was a year ago."

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks had moments, but consistency was lacking in coach Shane Beamer's second year.

Arkansas: The Razorbacks' defense held up well without two starters in the secondary, including former freshman All-American Jalen Catalon.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Arkansas' win over South Carolina was the Razorbacks' first since 2011. The teams had met only three times since before Saturday with the Gamecocks winning each.
