TAKING THE PITCH

- This is the 2nd meeting between the Gamecocks and Camels.
- The Gamecocks won the only meeting back in 1995, 4-0.
- No player for the Gamecocks had been born yet the last time the two side met on the pitch.
- Carolina head coach Tony Annan still had three years left of college in 1995.
- The 1995 squad went on to finish the season 16-4 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- They also finished the season ranked 3rd in the NSCAA final ranking.
- The Camels are the fourth Big South team the Gamecocks have faced this season (Gardner-Webb, USC Upstate, and Winthrop)

QUICK NOTES

- Adam Luckhurst became the first player since 2018 to record a goal and two assists in a match when he did so against Winthrop.
- Rocky Perez and Bryce Griffith were named to the Wolstein Classic All-Tournament Team.
- Freshman goalkeeper Ben Alexander was named to the Canadian U-20 team, where he started three matches during the 2022 Concacaf Men's U-20 Championship.
- The roster features 17 newcomers; five transfers and 12 true freshmen.
- The team returns 10 players from the 2021 squad, including All-Conference performers Peter Clement, Logan Frost, and Harrison Myring.

THE ANNAN FILE

RECORD: 7-12-3 (2nd Season) CAREER: Same

Tony Annan was named the head men's soccer coach at the University of South Carolina on April 22, 2021. He is the second head coach in the history of Gamecock men's soccer.

Annan (pronounced Ann-in) came to Columbia after a six-year stint at Atlanta United of Major League Soccer. He was hired as the fifth employee in 2015 in the club's young existence and built the

development academy from scratch. Most recently, he was appointed to interim head coach for Atlanta United 2, the reserve team of MLS's Atlanta United on July 27, 2020, and also serves as academy director.

As Atlanta United became the first MLS Academy to launch before its First Team, Annan oversaw one of the most successful seasons for any academy across the board during the 2016-17 United States Soccer Development Academy (USSDA) season. Serving as head coach of the U-17s, Annan won the club's first piece of hardware, claiming the national championship in 2016. In addition, the U-19s also won the Southeast Division and finished the season as the No. 1 overall national seed.

A true developer of talent and skills, six of his players have gone on to sign professional deals after college and more than 80 of Annan's former players have earned college scholarships. Ten of his players from Atlanta United have signed professional contracts during his tenure. 45 of his players have earned Youth National Team call ups with eight different countries represented.

Bringing 25 years of coaching experience with him to Stone Stadium, Annan is the only coach to complete the USSF Academy directors license and the FFF Elite formation license at the same time in 2017. In 2018, he became the youngest coach to be inducted into the Georgia Soccer Hall of Fame.

A native of Newcastle, England, Annan is joined in Columbia by his wife, Elizabeth, his son, Jax, and daughter, Ella. Annan started his playing career at West Bromwich Albion in 1991, a soccer club in England that currently competes in Premier League. He played his college soccer at Life University, where he earned his Bachelor of Science in nutrition and dietetics in 1998.

EUGENE E. STONE III STADIUM - ESTABLISHED IN 1996

Before Stone Stadium became part of the Gamecock Athletics' landscape, the South Carolina men's soccer team played on the same site, affectionately referred to as "The Graveyard" for the first 18 years of the site's existence.

Bleachers lined the east side of the field, with a seating capacity of 2,000 listed throughout its time. However, many times crowds well over that came to watch the Gamecocks play, including over 6,000 for the 1990 matchup against Clemson.

"The Graveyard" stood as the place where opponents dreams of a road win died, as South Carolina captured 84 percent of the contests played on the site (177-30-9) in 18 years. Twice, the homefield advantage launched a Mark Berson-led Gamecock team to the NCAA College Cup in 1988 and 1993.

Built in time for the fall of 1996, Eugene E. Stone III Stadium marked a new era in Gamecock Soccer history. Holding 5,000 fans, the concrete stands gave new amenities not previously seen at The Graveyard. The facility accommodates both the men and women during the season.

The stadium began with a \$1 million gift from Eugene E. Stone III and his family. Stone, a 1930 graduate of South Carolina, owned Stone Manufacturing Co., Inc., which was the parent company of Umbro International, the largest provider of soccer apparel in the 1990s in USA. The Stones also made the same gift to Furman, where the Paladins' stadium also bears Stone's name.

Improvements have continued over the years, including the addition of chairback seats from Sarge Frye Field and a scoreboard in 2008, modernizing part of the stadium. New sod brought about a new look to the facility in 2009, leveling the field and giving it a much better look. Graphics also sprung up under the stands and on the stadium facing during that renovation.

In 2016 the Gamecock Soccer Complex was completed. The 11,000-square-foot facility houses individual team locker rooms, lounges and study rooms, athletic training therapy tubs, a 3,000-square-foot weight room, a cleat room and a film room.

In 2022, Stone Stadium recieved several upgrades including a new video board, LED lights, and a new press box paint design. The 19×32 foot state-of-the-art Boling Family Video Board serves a dual purpose, also functioning as the stadium scoreboard. The new LED lighting system contains 114 Ephesus LumaSport 8 fixtures. The system allows for programmable lighting styles to provide fans with specific pre-game, in-game, and post-game light shows.
