♦ The Bonham Trophy is on the line during State Fair week in Columbia as the South Carolina Gamecocks (4-2, 1-2 SEC) open the second half of the 2022 season by hosting the Texas A&M Aggies (3-3, 1-2 SEC) on Saturday, Oct. 22. Game time from Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) is set for 7:39 pm and the contest will be televised by SEC Network. Tom Hart (play-by-play) and Jordan Rodgers (analyst) will be in the booth while Cole Cubelic works the sidelines for the network.

♦ South Carolina is coming off a bye week which, if history is any indication, is a good omen for the Gamecocks. Carolina is 8-10 since 2009 in the week leading up to the bye week, but an impressive 14-3 when coming off a bye week. Here are the results:

THE SERIES: This is the ninth gridiron meeting between South Carolina and Texas A&M. The Gamecocks are still looking for their first win over their "permanent" SEC Western Division rival from College Station. The two schools met for the first time in 2014 in Columbia, with A&M posting a 52-28 win in the season opener for both teams. The Aggies own a 4-0 record against the Gamecocks both in Columbia and in College Station. Three of the eight games have been decided by seven points or less.

SERIES FIRST: With South Carolina entering the game with a 4-2 mark and Texas A&M coming in at 3-3, this marks the first time in the series that the Gamecocks own the better record when the two teams have met:

THE BONHAM TROPHY: Amateur historian Richard Peterson, a USC Broadcasting Journalism graduate and previous resident of Alamo Heights in San Antonio, Texas, recommended "The Governor's Trophy" to be named after James Butler Bonham, Hero of the Alamo and himself an Alum of The University of South Carolina. Peterson and Katon Dawson took the idea to then Texas Gov. Rick Perry and Gov. Nikki Haley of South Carolina and a new tradition was born. "The Bonham Trophy" is exchanged between the Governors of South Carolina and Texas with the winner taking possession of the Bonham Trophy of "Western Artwork," created by renowned Texas sculptor Jeff Gottfried, and displayed at the victorious State Capital, University or any location the Governor may choose. Two weeks after the Game, The Bonham Trophy is returned for permanent display at The Alamo until the next South Carolina - Texas A&M football game.



DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS: Carolina is 3-12 all-time against teams from the Lone Star State, going 1-0 against Texas, 1-2 versus both Baylor and Houston, and 0-8 against Texas A&M. The Gamecocks have made four trips to College Station in the last eight years. Prior to the 2015 meeting, South Carolina had not ventured into the state of Texas since dropping an 18-17 decision to Baylor in Waco on Oct. 2, 1976.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Ainius Smith had a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown and Jalen Wydermyer added two TD catches as No. 17 Texas A&M built a huge first-half lead and coasted to a 44-14 win over South Carolina on Oct. 23, 2021 in College Station. The Aggies held a 31-0 lead at the intermission and 41-0 after three quarters. The Gamecocks scored two fourth quarter touchdowns, but gained just 185 yards on the night, compared to 477 for the Aggies. For more on that game, please turn to page 8 of these game notes.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN COLUMBIA: No. 7 Texas A&M rolled to a 48-3 win over South Carolina in Columbia on Nov. 7, 2020. The Aggies scored touchdowns on seven of 10 possessions, while holding a 530-150 advantage in yards and a 38:21-21:39 lead in time of possession. A South Carolina win over Texas A&M would...

- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' first win in nine tries against their "permanent" SEC Western Division opponent from College Station.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks' winning streak to four-straight games. That would mark their longest winning streak since winning the final six games of the 2013 season.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' five wins in their first seven games for the first time since the 2017 season.
- ◆ Improve the Gamecocks' record to 15-3 coming off a bye week since the start of the 2009 season.

THE LAST TIME OUT: South Carolina went into a sold-out Kroger Field in Lexington and handed the 13th-ranked Kentucky Wildcats a 24-14 setback on Oct. 8. **MarShawn Lloyd** rushed for 110 yards on 22 carries and **Spencer Rattler** completed 14-of-19 passes for 177 yards and a touchdown. The Gamecocks took the lead just 13 seconds into the contest and never trailed. The game was deadlocked at 7 at the intermission, but Carolina scored the next 17 points to earn the upset win. The Gamecock defense held UK to just 299 total yards.

THEY CALL IT A STREAK: The win at Kentucky marked the Gamecocks' third-straight win. It's their longest winning streak since posting three-consecutive victories over Arkansas, Tennessee and Vanderbilt in the middle of the 2017 season. They have not won four in a row since capping the 2013 season with six-consecutive victories.

NOTABLE WIN: The win at Kentucky marked the first win over a ranked opponent in the Shane Beamer Era at South Carolina. It was the Gamecocks' first win over a ranked opponent since defeating Auburn in 2020 and the first win over a ranked opponent on the road since handing third-ranked Georgia a 20-17 double-overtime defeat in 2019.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Following the upset win at No. 13 Kentucky, South Carolina head coach **Shane Beamer** was selected as the Dodd Trophy National Coach of the Week.

SEC P-O-W: Senior offensive lineman **Jovaughn Gwyn** was selected as the SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Kentucky. Gwyn graded out at 88 percent in the contest. It was the second time he has been honored by the SEC, as he was the co-Offensive Lineman of the Week after the Gamecocks' win over No. 15 Auburn in 2020.

LLOYD GOES FOR 100: For the second time in three games, running back **MarShawn Lloyd** eclipsed 100 yards rushing with a 22-carry, 110-yard, 1-touchdown performance at Kentucky. Included was a 45-yard burst which set up the final score of the game. Lloyd went for a career-high 169 yards against Charlotte earlier this season.

SACK THIS: The Gamecocks recorded a season-high six sacks in the win at Kentucky. **Jordan Burch** (1.5), **Tonka Hemingway** (1.5), **Gilber Edmond** (1.0), **Sherrod Greene** (1.0) and **Zacch Pickens** (1.0) all got in on the action. Carolina entered the contest with just four sacks through the first five games before the sack party at Kentucky.

BLOCK THAT KICK: Carolina recorded its fifth blocked punt of the season at Kentucky, with **King-Demenian Ford** notching his second of the year. The Gamecocks blocked two punts vs. Georgia State and South Carolina State and lead the country with a school-record five blocked punts.

MORE BLOCKAGE: The Gamecocks have five blocked kicks this season and nine blocked kicks in 19 games in the Shane Beamer and Pete Lembo Era. The five blocked punts in a season is a school record, while the five blocked kicks ties for the second-highest mark in school history, behind only the eight blocked kicks recorded in 1994.

FORCING TURNOVERS: In addition to the blocked punt, the Gamecocks recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass at Kentucky. After recording just one takeaway through the season's first three games while posting a 1-2 record, Carolina has recorded eight turnovers in its last three contests, all wins. The Gamecocks recorded back-to-back three-interception games against Charlotte and South Carolina State, marking the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks have recorded three INTs in back-to-back games.

HELLO MR. SPAULDING: Safety **David Spaulding** returned to action for the first time since the season opener and came up big against Kentucky, bookending the game with turnovers. On the first play from scrimmage, Spaulding forced a fumble that was returned by **Tonka Hemingway** to the 2-yard line, setting up Carolina's first score just 13 seconds into the contest. Spaulding then ended any Kentucky hopes with a pick on the Wildcats' final drive and the Gamecocks ran out the clock for the win.

HANGIN' HALF A HUNDRED: Carolina put 50 or more points on the scoreboard in back-to-back games against Charlotte (56-20) and South Carolina State (50-10). They were the first 50-point games since the Gamecocks scored 72 against Charleston Southern in 2019. It was the first time the Gamecocks have scored 50 or more points twice in a season since 2013 when they had 52 at Arkansas and 70 against Coastal Carolina. The last time South Carolina had posted back-to-back 50-point games came in 1995 when they scored 77 against Kent State, 65 at Mississippi State and 52 against Vanderbilt in consecutive games.

30 SOMETHING: The Gamecocks have tallied 30 or more points in four of six games this season. They scored 30 or more just three times in 13 games in 2021 and haven't scored 30 or more points more than four times in a season since 2018 when they accomplished the feat seven times.

DEFENSE TAKES A STAND: Since Charlotte scored on touchdown drives in its first two possessions, the Gamecock defense has tightened up. The 49ers final eight possessions resulted in four punts, three interceptions, and a touchdown. After allowing 171 yards on Charlotte's first two drives, Carolina surrendered just 121 the rest of the way. The Carolina defense then held South Carolina State to 10 points and 220 yards, including just 75 yards through the air on 7-of-18 passing with three interceptions, and limited Kentucky to just 14 points and 299 total yards.

PLAYING SHORT-HANDED: The Gamecocks were hit hard early in the season by the injury bug, especially on the defensive side of the ball. A pair of starters in edge rusher **Jordan Strachan** and line-backer **Mohamed Kaba** suffered season-ending ACL injuries at Arkansas. Safety **R.J. Roderick** was injured on the first series of the season and has missed all three conference games. Starting defensive tackle **Alex Huntley** has missed a pair of games with a knee injury, while defensive back **David Spaulding** missed three games with a lower leg injury. Cornerback **Darius Rush** suffered a hamstring injury against Georgia and missed two contests. Edge rusher **Terrell Dawkins** underwent knee surgery after the Georgia game and will be out for an extended period of time.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2022 marks the 129th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 116th-consecutive year in which Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 625-603-44, a .509 winning percentage.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features nine scholarship transfers, six of whom enrolled at Carolina in January. The spring enrollees included RB **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), RB **Lovasea Carroll** (Georgia), EDGE **Terrell Dawkins** (NC State), QB **Spencer Rattler** (Oklahoma), DB **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan), and WR **Antwane Wells Jr.** (James Madison). TE **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), WR **Corey Rucker** (Arkansas State) and TE **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) were added to the roster in the summer.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list 10 players (not including transfers) whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super seniors" are WR **Jalen Brooks**, OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Sherrod Greene**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, EDGE **Jordan Strachan**, WR **Chad Terrell**, WR **Josh Vann**, DL **M.J. Webb** and OL **Dylan Wonnum**.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA COVID rule allowing for an extra year, five Gamecocks - OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Brad Johnson**, DB **R.J. Roderick**, WR **Josh Vann** and OL **Dylan Wonnum** - can become five-year letterwinners.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 21 players who have their college degrees in hand. Twelve players who wore the SEC Graduate patch in the Duke's Mayo Bowl return for the 2022 season, including **Wyatt Campbell**, **Eric Douglas**, **Sherrod Greene**, **Brad Johnson**, **Tyreec Johnson**, **Dakereon Joyner**, **Hank Manos**, **Darius Rush**, **Jordan Strachan**, **Chad Terrell**, **M.J. Webb** and **Dylan Wonnum**. **Jovaughn Gwyn** and **Jaylen Nichols** graduated in May. **Traevon Kenion** and **R.J. Roderick** graduated in August. In addition, **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), **Dante Miller** (Columbia), **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan) and **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) have degrees from other institutions.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Gamecocks host the Missouri Tigers next week in the annual battle for the Mayor's Cup. Mizzou has won the last three head-to-head battles after Carolina had won three-straight from 2016-18. The Tigers lead the all-time series by a 7-5 count, but the Gamecocks hold a slim 3-2 advantage in Williams-Brice Stadium.

Offense

SATT ATTACK: The Gamecock offense is in its second year under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. In his first season, Satt was able to cobble seven wins together with four different starting quarterbacks winning games. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

TRENDING FAVORABLY: The Gamecocks are averaging 35.7 points per game this season. They are gaining 389.0 yards per game, 145.0 on the ground and 244.0 through the air. Last season, South Carolina averaged just 22.6 points and 336.8 yards per game, 135.6 on the ground and 201.2 passing.

SECOND HALF TEAM: The Gamecocks have been much more productive in the second half of their games this season. After scoring just 21 first quarter points and 70 points total in the first halves through six contests, Carolina has scored 69 third-quarter and 63 fourth-quarter points, outscoring its opponents by a 132-77 margin after halftime.

QB1: Oklahoma transfer **Spencer Rattler** is the Gamecocks' number one signal-caller. Rattler, who joined the team in the spring and was the Joe Morrison Player of the Spring for the offense, is 112-for-170 (65.9 percent) for 1,298 yards with five touchdowns and eight interceptions this season. He has been better of late, completing 52-of-69 passes (75.4 pct.) for 576 yards over the last three games. His 377 yards passing at Arkansas ranks as the 12th-best single game performance in school history. He has appeared in 29 games during his career, posting a 19-4 record as a starter, including a 4-2 mark at South Carolina. He has completed 69.1 percent of his career passes (473-for-685) for 5,893 yards with 45 touchdowns and 20 INTs.

THE DANDY DOZEN: **Spencer Rattler's** 377 yards passing at Arkansas was the 12th-best single-game mark in school history and the most since Jake Bentley lit up Clemson for a school record 510 yards during the 2018 season. Here are the top-12 passing games in school history:

DOTY IN THE BULLPEN: Junior **Luke Doty** was the projected starter at quarterback during preseason camp a year ago, but foot injuries derailed his season. The Myrtle Beach, S.C. product is fully healthy and has improved his game since that time. He is without question the No. 2 QB. He has appeared in four games this season, completing 10-of-14 passes for 146 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also has a rushing TD. Doty has completed 61.0 percent of his passes (139-for-228) with nine touchdowns and eight interceptions in 17 career games. He is 2-4 as a starting QB.

MARSHAWN HAS BEEN MARVELOUS: MarShawn Lloyd has regained the trust in his surgically-repaired knee that cost him the 2020 season. Through six games he has logged a team-high 75 carries for 434 yards, 5.8 per carry (fifth in the league), and is third on the squad in receptions with 15 for 149 yards. After carrying 27 times for 75 yards, 2.8 per carry, and two scores over the first three games, Lloyd has rushed 48 times for 359 yards, 7.5 per carry, with five rushing TDs over the last three contests. He is third in the SEC with nine TDs, including seven on the ground, which is tied for second in the SEC, and two receiving.

JUUJ ON THE FIELD: Juju McDowell was a Freshman All-SEC performer a year ago as an all-purpose back and return specialist and, despite his diminutive size, is tough as nails and elusive in space. He is second on the squad with 39 carries for 135 yards and has added 14 catches for 101 yards. In addition, he has three kickoff returns for 56 yards and is fourth on the team with 292 all-purpose yards.

TUNE IN TO CBS: Christian Beal-Smith joined the running back corps as a grad transfer from Wake Forest. He rushed for 1,871 yards over four seasons with the Demon Deacons. CBS was hobbled in preseason camp, did not dress for the opener against Georgia State and saw limited action at Arkansas. He recorded his first carries as a Gamecock against Georgia and had his best game as a Gamecock against Charlotte with nine carries for 55 yards and two touchdowns. He missed the Kentucky game after re-aggravating the injury during practice. For the season he has 20 carries for 76 yards with three scores.

THE JUICE IS LOOSE: Wide receiver Antwane "Juice" Wells Jr., a junior transfer from James Madison quickly become a favorite target for quarterback Spencer Rattler. He has been targeted 34 times and has 27 receptions for 375 yards, a 13.9-yard average with two scores. He is eighth in the SEC in receptions per game at 4.50 and seventh in the league in receiving yards per game at 62.50.

WELLS RUNS DEEP: Antwane Wells Jr.'s 189-yard receiving performance at Arkansas tied for the 10th-best single-game performance in school history and the most receiving yards in a game since Deebo Samuel went for 210 at Clemson in 2018. The 189 yards receiving remains the 16th-highest single-game mark in Division I football so far in 2022. He was recognized by the East-West Shrine Bowl as the Breakout Offensive Player of the Week.

BROOKS IS NOT DONE: Wide receiver Jalen Brooks has returned to the lineup this season after missing the final half of the 2021 season. The "Super Senior" has been targeted 25 times so far and has responded with 20 catches for 335 yards, an average of 16.8-yards per reception. He has led the team in receiving yards in four games.

VANN IN NEUTRAL: Josh Vann was Carolina's top receiver in 2021. He had a breakout season catching 43 passes and ranks 21st in school history with 95 career receptions. He's been quiet so far this season with just five catches for 29 yards. However, he has contributed on punt return with eight returns for 110 yards, a 13.8-yard average, with a long of 30.

IT TOLLS FOR THEE: Jaheim Bell is a do-it-all player who exploded in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. Bell owns the top-two receiving games by a tight end in school history, a 136-yard effort against Vanderbilt and a 159-yard performance against North Carolina in the aforementioned bowl game. He can line up anywhere on the field, as he has 11 catches for 137 yards, including a 46-yard reception against Georgia, and 17 carries for 60 yards with two touchdowns in 2022.

NO LIMITS FOR AUSTIN: Transfer Austin Stogner joined the squad this summer after graduating from Oklahoma, where he caught 47 passes over the past three seasons, most of them from Spencer Rattler. He recorded five catches for 43 yards at Arkansas and caught his first TD pass of the year against South Carolina State. For the season, he has 10 receptions for 94 yards with one TD.

SON OF A COACH: Nate Adkins, the son of offensive line coach Greg Adkins, joined the team after graduating from East Tennessee State. Regarded as a tough, hard-nosed blocker, Adkins has also shown good hands and has a great understanding of the game. He has earned a start in each of the last four games.

ADKINS STEPS AWAY: Citing minor health issues, offensive line coach Greg Adkins temporarily stepped away from the team. Lonnie Teasley, who has been serving as an offensive analyst, assumed the offensive line coaching duties on an interim basis in Adkins' absence.

THE O-LINE IS O-KAY: Carolina features an experienced offensive line with a combined 159 starts.

◆ LT Jaylen Nichols started has 13 career starts. He was the co-Most Improved Player of the Spring for the offense. The opening day starter, he missed the Georgia game with an injury and has played in, but has not started, the last three contests.

◆ LT Jakai Moore has started the last three games at left tackle and has 14 career starts.

◆ LG Vershon Lee has started 16 games in his career, nine last season and all six in 2022.

◆ OC Eric Douglas makes the calls for the O-line. A sixth-year player, he has made 30 starts, including the last 29 in a row. He has appeared in 50 games in his career.

◆ RG Jovaughn Gwyn is considered the top offensive lineman on the squad. He has made 40-consecutive starts, tying for fourth on the school's all-time list. He was named the SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance at Kentucky. Gwyn was named a team captain in 2021.

◆ RT Dylan Wonnum missed the second half of the season a year ago with a back injury. He started the first three games of 2022, two at right tackle and one at left tackle, but then missed the next two games with an injury before returning at right tackle against Kentucky. He has made 34 career starts. Brother, D.J., was a standout defensive end for Carolina and plays for the Minnesota Vikings.

◆ RT Tyshawn Wannamaker has started three games at right tackle in '22 and has 10 career starts.



Defense

CLAYTON'S CREW: Defensive coordinator **Clayton White** brought a 4-2-5 scheme to Columbia and the results were impressive in his first season. A four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach, White's first foray in the SEC had Carolina allowing 24.0 points per game in 2021, down from 36.0 in 2020. The Gamecocks were especially strong in the secondary, ranking seventh in the country in pass defense while forcing 24 turnovers, including 15 picks.

BETTER OF LATE: The Carolina defense has picked it up over the last three games. After allowing 35.3 points and 438.3 yards per game through the first three contests, the Gamecocks have surrendered just 14.7 points and 270.3 yards per contest over their last three games. After getting just one turnover through the first three games, Carolina has come up with eight TOs over the last three games.

26 starts. He was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2019. Pickens logged a career-high 12 stops at Arkansas and is tied for third on the team with 27 tackles.

EDGE JORDAN: EDGE rusher **Jordan Burch**, who was a high school teammate of Gamecock defensive tackle **Alex Huntley**, was the second-highest rated player to sign with Gamecocks, behind only Jadeveon Clowney. He notched a career-high 10 tackles at Arkansas and is tied for third on the team with 27 stops, including 5.0 tackles for loss, a tem-high 2.5 sack and five quarterback hurries.

EDMOND WRECKS 'EM: **Gilber Edmond** has been forced into more action with the injuries to **Jordan Strachan** and **Terrell Dawkins**. Edmond has responded with 25 tackles, including a team-high 7.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and six QB hurries.

GREENE IS GOOD: Senior **Sherrod Greene** is back to bolster the Carolina linebacking corps. Greene started 22 games for the Gamecocks in 2018 and 2019, and was the starter entering the 2020 season, but suffered a fracture in his hip in the opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season. He was the starter again in 2021, but suffered a right ankle injury in game three at Georgia and missed the remainder of the season. He has logged 170 career tackles including 12.5 tackles for loss and owns 32 career starts, but had just eight tackles in four games in the 2020 and '21 seasons combined. He was held out of the 2022 opener but has played extensively since, registering 32 tackles, second on the squad, including a dozen at Kentucky. He picked off his second career pass against South Carolina State.

BRAD'S BACK: **Brad Johnson** is in his sixth year and his second at linebacker after transitioning from defensive end. Johnson was named a permanent team captain after the 2020 season. He has appeared in 53 contests, tied for fourth all-time, with 22 starts. He was the Gamecocks' defensive player of the game against Georgia State after recording five solo tackles and a quarterback hurry. His interception against Charlotte was one of the key plays in the contest. He has 24 tackles.

ALL-EVERYTHING: Redshirt junior **Cam Smith** saw his name appear on nearly every All-America and All-SEC preseason team and several watch lists. Smith has played both the nickel and corner positions. He came out of the Arkansas game and did not play against Georgia due to injury. Though he rarely gets balls thrown in his direction, he picked off his first pass of the season against Charlotte and now has six in his career.

RUSH HOUR: It's taken a little time, but **Darius Rush** has become the cornerback the coaches

hoped he would be when he transitioned from wide receiver earlier in his career. At 6-2 and 200 pounds, Rush possesses the size and length that make him an intriguing prospect. He has three pass breakups this season despite coming out of the Georgia game with a hamstring injury and sitting out the next two contests.

DIAL THEM UP: **Marcellas Dial** leads the team with two interceptions, getting picks against both Georgia State and South Carolina State. He has a team-high five pass breakups and is second in the SEC with 1.17 passes defended per game.

NICK AT NIGHT: True freshman **Nick Emmanwori**, a local product from Irmo, S.C., was inserted into the safety position in the first series of the season following an injury to R.J. Roderick, and has played regularly since. He became the first member of the freshman class of 2022 to earn a starting assignment. He has been in double-figures in tackles twice, logging 11 stops at Arkansas and a game- and career-high 14 tackles versus Georgia, all solo stops. It was the most tackles by a Gamecock since Ernest Jones collected 18 tackles at Ole Miss in 2020. He leads the team with 37 tackles, an average of 6.2 per game. His 5.2 solo tackles per game ranks 28th in the country. The last freshman to lead the Gamecocks in tackles was **Skai Moore** in 2013. He was named to the On3 Midseason True Freshman All-America team.

SMITH IS QUALIFIED: True freshman **DQ Smith**, another Columbia area product who played at Spring Valley HS, has started each of the last four contests. A quarterback in high school, Smith has quickly adapted to the secondary and has responded with 19 tackles, including eight at Kentucky, an interception and two pass breakups.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: The Gamecocks added safety **Devonni Reed** from Central Michigan via the transfer portal. Reed was a second-team All-MAC performer a year ago after intercepting two passes with six breakup while recording 74 tackles for the Chippewas.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted three passes against both Charlotte and South Carolina State and have eight on the season.

RESPECT FOR JETER: Mitch Jeter came into the season following in the huge footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two career attempts. He became the first player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. His first attempt, the 53-yarder, tied for the seventh-longest made field goal in school history. He is a perfect 6-for-6 in field goal attempts, tops in the SEC.

KAI KROEGER CAN KICK: Junior Kai Kroeger handles the punting chores. The third-year punter was named to the SEC Coaches' all-Freshman team in 2020. He is averaging 43.4 yards per punt this season, and 43.2 yards per punt in his career. Of his 119 career punts, 26 have traveled 50 or more yards with 42 inside the 20 and just six touchbacks. Kroeger also handles the holder duties on placements. He ranks third on the school's all-time punting average list

PRACTICE IS OVERRATED: Kai Kroeger missed most of preseason camp with a foot injury and was questionable heading into the opener against Georgia State, but responded with an impressive performance. He punted seven times for 344 yards, a 49.1-yard average with four inside the 20 and three of 50 or more yards, including a career-long 79-yarder. The effort earned him the Ray Guy

Award National Punter of the Week honors for the second time in his career.

COBRA KAI: Gamecock punter Kai Kroeger had another excellent day against Georgia. The junior punter who was the Ray Guy National Punter of the Week in Week 1, punted five times for a 44.4-yard average against the Bulldogs, with a long of 54 yards. All five of his punts pinned Georgia inside its own 20-yard line. That performance earned him a spot on "Ray's 8" as selected by the Ray Guy Award. Kroeger also completed a 20-yard pass out of punt formation for a first down. He is now 3-for-3 passing in his career, with all three resulting in first downs, including one touchdown.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: Kai Kroeger owns the nation's longest punt this season, a career-long 79-yarder versus Georgia State. It was the longest punt for a Gamecock since Marty Simpson's 79-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992. Kroeger has three punts of 70-plus yards in his career. BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (AP) — Ainias Smith had a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown and Jalen Wydermyer added two TD catches as No. 17 Texas A&M built a huge first-half lead and coasted to a 44-14 rout of South Carolina Saturday night.

The star rushing duo of Isaiah Spiller and Devone Achane continued to do damage for the Aggies. They combined for 256 yards and two touchdowns a week after rushing for 292 yards and three touchdowns.

Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) raced to a 31-0 lead by halftime, and Achane's 35-yard touchdown run made it 41-0 late in the third. It was the third straight victory for Texas A&M, which knocked off top-ranked Alabama two weeks ago before beating Missouri last week.

Zach Calzada had 187 yards passing with two touchdowns for the Aggies.

South Carolina graduate assistant-turned-quarterback Zeb Noland had a tough night before he was benched for Jason Brown early in the fourth quarter. Noland managed just 30 yards passing and had a snap fly over his head that the Aggies recovered and turned into a touchdown in the second quarter.

Noland started the first three games but was hurt Sept. 18 against Georgia and didn't play again until leading a game-winning drive in the last minute against Vanderbilt last Saturday. Luke Doty was injured against the Commodores and is out for the season after having foot surgery this week.

Brown led the Gamecocks (4-4, 1-4) on two touchdown drives after replacing Noland, but also threw an interception in the end zone.

Smith gave A&M an early lead with his punt return TD in the first quarter. It was the longest punt return for a touchdown in the FBS this season and the longest for the Aggies since Dustin Harris had a 96-yard return for a TD in 2012 against South Carolina State.

Jaylan Foster grabbed his NCAA-leading fifth interception later in the first, but the Gamecocks couldn't move the ball after the turnover and had to punt.

The Aggies extended the lead to 14-0 when Wydermyer grabbed a 25-yard touchdown reception on their next possession.

Wydermyer made it 21-0 when he grabbed a short pass and barreled through several defenders for a 28-yard score with about 10 1/2 minutes left in the first half.

He had 75 yards receiving to give him 1,306 in his career, passing Martellus Bennett (1,246) for most by a tight end in school history.

It looked like Noland had his coaching hat back on three plays after Wydermyer's second TD when he was so preoccupied yelling and gesturing at his teammates to get set that he didn't realize the ball had been snapped and it sailed over his head.

The ball rolled all the way to the South Carolina 6 - a loss of 19 yards - before Aaron Hansford pounced on it to give A&M the ball. The Aggies cashed in on the mistake three plays later on a 1-yard TD run by Spiller that made it 28-0.

GAME CHANGER

Carolina fumbled on a bad snap to Texas A&M's six-yard line, where the Aggies recovered. Isaiah Spiller scored on a one-yard rushing touchdown as the Aggies took a 28-0 lead.

KEY STAT

268 – The Aggies outgained the Gamecocks 268-11 in the first half, scoring four touchdowns and a field goal to take a 31-0 halftime lead. Ainias Smith had a 95-yard punt return for a touchdown and Jalen Wydermyer caught touchdown passes of 25 and 28 yards.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Kellen Mond threw four touchdown passes to become the school's career leader, Isaiah Spiller ran for 131 yards and the Aggies routed South Carolina 48-3 on Saturday night.

"We're turning heads and doing a lot of things that people didn't think we were going to do," Aggies defensive tackle Bobby Brown III said. "We're going to keep turning heads, proving people wrong."

Just maybe all the way to a playoff berth. They certainly look the part against the Gamecocks.

"You always think you can be dominant," Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher said. "The experience has helped on each side of the ball. Learning to win each play and, in turn, the bigger picture is coming together."

Especially when Mond, Spiller and the Aggies defense play like this.

Mond set the school mark with the 68th touchdown pass of his career, a 52-yarder to Devon Achane in the third quarter with the game long decided.

Mond also ran for a score to help Texas A&M improve to 5-1 — all in the Southeastern Conference — for its best start since opening 6-0 in 2016. The Aggies are 7-0 against the Gamecocks.

Mond and Spiller helped the Aggies open a 21-0 halftime lead and cruise to their fourth consecutive victory since a loss at Alabama last month.

Spiller had two short pickups for first downs — one on a fourth-and-1 with Texas A&M in chip-shot field goal range — before Mond flipped a 4-yard TD pass to Ainius Smith.

Mond found tight end Jalen Wydermyer for two first-half scores. Wydermyer was left all alone and walked into the end zone on a 15-yard scoring grab. Right before half, Mond hit Wydermyer on a crossing route near the goal line to go up three scores.

South Carolina (2-4), coming off an off week, had no answer.

Quarterback Collin Hill was 8 of 21 for 66 yards and two interceptions before getting lifted in the fourth quarter for last year's starter and current backup, Ryan Hilinski.

Kevin Harris, the SEC's second-leading rusher coming in, was limited to 39 yards on 13 carries.

Mond had a 15-yard scoring run to start the third quarter before his long TD pass to Achane gave him his latest school record. Mond already holds career Aggies marks for completions, passing yards and total offense — probably with more on the way as his senior season continues.

He finished 16 of 26 for 224 yards.

Spiller also had two catches for 46 yards before limping off the field in the third quarter. The tailback went into the Aggies' medical tent and came out running on the sidelines. But with Texas A&M's big lead, he was not needed in the second half.

South Carolina has surrendered 1,071 yards and 100 points in losses to LSU and the Aggies its past two games.

The Gamecocks avoided their first shutout since 2018 on Parker White's 48-yard field goal with less than six minutes left.

GAME CHANGER

Texas A&M started the scoring with a 12-play, 52-yard drive, capped by a three-yard pass from Kellen Mond to Ainius Smith with 4:40 left in the first quarter. Jalen Wydermyer and Devon Achane each had a pair of touchdowns for the Aggies' offense.

Shane Beamer, one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, begins his second season as the University of South Carolina's head coach in 2022. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2005.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to South Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in Gamecock Football history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearingen (Houston).

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's special teams led the way toward a season-opening 35-14 victory over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Special teams have always been an emphasis for Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer, who watched his father, Frank, win game after game with "Beamer Ball," and its big special teams play.

The approach worked as the Gamecocks pulled away from Georgia State with 23 unanswered points in the second half.

The Gamecocks returned two blocked punts for touchdowns, new placekicker Mitch Jeter debuted by knocking two field goals of 50-plus yards and long snapper Hunter Rogers carried a fake field goal 5 yards for a first down that led to the Gamecocks' only first-half touchdown.

New quarterback Spencer Rattler took in a key two-point conversion in the third quarter to restore South Carolina's lead and it was just enough to squeak past a determined Panthers' squad that held a brief third-quarter advantage, 14-12.

The back-breaker also came in the third, when Rashad Amos blocked a Georgia State punt and DQ Smith retrieved the carom and ran it in for a touchdown.

Rattler showed off his dynamic playmaking ability. He finished 23 of 37 passing for 226 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

Following a scoreless first quarter, South Carolina sent out Jeter to attempt a 25-yard field goal. But special teams coordinator Pete Lembo's gang took over.

Long snapper Rogers took the snap and ran for just enough room for the first down. The Gamecocks lined up versatile tight end Jaheim Bell as a fullback at the goal line, then pitched to MarShawn Lloyd on the end-around for a touchdown.

A Rattler interception on the second play of the third quarter set up the Panthers' second score, a Grainger 4-yard rush to take a 14-12 lead. The Gamecocks immediately responded as Rattler hit Marshawn Lloyd for a 16-yard scoring pass to take the lead for good, 20-14.

Just over two minutes later, Rashad Amos blocked the punt and DQ Smith ran it back 26 yards for a 28-14 lead.

Later, Gamecocks' Traevon Kenion blocked a fourth-quarter punt and Ahmarean Brown took it 10 yards for the final score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia State: The Panthers will cause a lot of trouble in the Sun Belt with their rushing attack. The Gamecocks' defense mostly held them in check, but GSU won't be playing the SEC anymore.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense had some creative play-calls and greatly benefited from having a talent like Rattler behind center. He escaped trouble with his legs to keep numerous plays alive. Yet its offensive line struggled to protect Rattler and the Gamecocks' runners finished with 79 yards.

THE RETURN

Lloyd was the Gamecocks' most hyped running back recruit in a decade but tore an ACL in the first week of preseason camp two years ago and missed the season. He played in 2021 but was still very much not back to full strength.

On Saturday, he rushed for 30 yards, caught two passes for 31 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CLOWNEY COMES HOME

South Carolina held a halftime ceremony to honor former All-American and No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowney. Clowney's jersey No. 7 was added alongside the Gamecocks' four retired numbers, although his number will continue to be worn as per a 2007 university policy.

FAYETTEVILLE, ARK. (AP) — Darren McFadden and Felix Jones make for some serious company. Rocket Sanders can now say he's there with those all-time Arkansas running backs.

The Razorbacks' sophomore running back ran for a career-high 156 yards and two touchdowns in helping the No. 16 Razorbacks beat South Carolina 44-30 on Saturday.

Sanders joined McFadden, twice a Heisman Trophy finalist, and Jones, the player with the sixth-most yards rushing in school history, as the only three Arkansas players to run for 150 yards and two scores against the Gamecocks.

Sanders ran for 578 yards and five touchdowns in his first season last year. With returning starter Dominique Johnson still sidelined recovering from a knee injury suffered in the Outback Bowl, Sanders has taken nearly all of the first-team reps. The result has been a 2-0 start for his team and him becoming the first Razorbacks player since 2019 with back-to-back 100-yard games.

Sanders scored the first two touchdowns of the game as Arkansas (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) found the end zone on each of its first three possessions against South Carolina and opened a 21-3 lead. The Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1) responded with two straight scores at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second to pull within 21-16.

Sanders wouldn't score again as KJ Jefferson was the keystone for a bulk of the Razorbacks' second-half touchdowns, but he ran for 95 of his 156 yards in the final 30 minutes.

Arkansas ran for 295 yards, and AJ Green and Rashod Dubinion also chipped in touchdowns.

"I was really proud of our offensive line. We asked them to kind of control the game and I felt like they did. I think the offensive line wore them down," Pittman said.

Jefferson led a 14-play, 59-yard drive capped with his own 2-yard rushing touchdown at the start of the fourth quarter to move Arkansas back ahead by two scores. South Carolina lost a fumble on its next possession and Jefferson added a touchdown pass to Warren Thompson in response, ultimately putting the Gamecocks too far behind to rally.

Spencer Rattler tried. The Oklahoma transfer threw for 377 yards and a touchdown on 24 of 39 passing with a touchdown for South Carolina, but was intercepted in the end zone midway through the fourth quarter by Dwight McGlothern. The Gamecocks had three turnovers.

Jefferson was 18 of 21 passing for 162 yards and a touchdown. He ran for another 67 yards and the score on 19 carries.

"I thought he played better today than he did last week. I thought he was more accurate," Pittman said. "I thought he was in total control. ... He pretty much can take over the game when he wants to."

Johnson is expected to return in Week 3 against Missouri State. He might find himself short on carries as Sanders' development has put the sophomore in high company.

"I think he's becoming an all-around back a little bit more," Pittman said. "I thought he played really, really well. Two 100-yard days back-to-back is pretty good. He's a better back than he was a year ago."

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks had moments, but consistency was lacking in coach Shane Beamer's second year.

Arkansas: The Razorbacks' defense held up well without two starters in the secondary, including former freshman All-American Jalen Catalon.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Arkansas' win over South Carolina was the Razorbacks' first since 2011. The teams had met only three times since before Saturday with the Gamecocks winning each.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Stetson Bennett went 16 for 23 for 284 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another score as No. 1 Georgia beat South Carolina 48-7 on Saturday.

The Bulldogs (3-0) nearly had a second shutout of the season in their Southeastern Conference opener, but the backups allowed a touchdown pass with 53 seconds to go.

Georgia has allowed just 10 points this season and the garbage-time score was the first offensive touchdown it gave up in its past five regular-season games.

South Carolina (1-2) started 0-2 in the SEC for the fourth straight year.

The Georgia offense scored on eight of its first nine drives, gaining 551 yards and averaging nearly 10 yards a play before putting in the backups in the fourth quarter.

Tight end Brock Bowers had five catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for a score. Georgia let 10 players carry the ball, rushing for 212 yards. Bennett didn't play the final 23 minutes of the game.

The Bulldogs' defensive line overwhelmed by South Carolina's front. A defender was in quarterback Spencer Rattler's face almost every time he dropped back more than three steps. The Oklahoma transfer got off just three deep balls, with two of them intercepted. He didn't play in the fourth quarter and was 13 of 25 for 118 yards.

The 41-point victory was Georgia's biggest against the Gamecocks in their 75 meetings. It was South Carolina's worst loss since a 56-6 defeat to Florida in 2008.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia: Struggles against teams like South Carolina used to define the Bulldogs. At one point when Steve Spurrier was Gamecocks coach in the early 2010s, South Carolina won four of five in the series. But after Saturday's win, Georgia has won 15 of its last 16 over SEC East teams and hasn't lost to an unranked team since the Gamecocks beat them 20-17 in double overtime in 2019.

South Carolina: Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer appears to be breathing life into a program that had lost 13 of its last 16 when he took over in 2021, but there is still a big gap to the best. In his second season, Beamer is 0-4 against Top 25 teams, losing by an average of nearly 24 points.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Marshawn Lloyd ran for a career-high 169 yards and three touchdowns as South Carolina scored on its first eight possessions to put away Charlotte 56-20 on Saturday night.

The win ended a two-game losing streak for the Gamecocks (2-2) — and was a welcome performance for an offense stuck near the bottom of the Southeastern Conference this season.

Lloyd had scoring runs of 25, 14 and 7 yards, the first two that left fans' jaws dropped and Charlotte defenders in disbelief.

On the first, Lloyd cleanly hurdled safety Wayne Jones in the open field on the way to the end zone. On his second, Lloyd was stood up for what looked like a short gain before breaking free to put South Carolina ahead 28-14.

Lloyd had some help on the last, converting after Gamecocks linebacker Brad Johnson intercepted Charlotte's Chris Reynolds deep in 49ers territory. Lloyd calmly found the end zone a final time and finished with South Carolina's most rushing yards since Kevin Harris gained 182 against North Carolina in its 38-21 Duke's Mayo Bowl victory last New Year's Eve.

Charlotte (1-4) of Conference USA entered with the country's 30th best passing attack at 289 yards a game and the one of the worst rushing defenses (129 out of 131) in the NCAA at 243 yards allowed per game. Both were evident at South Carolina.

The Gamecocks picked up 161 yards on the ground to score on all four of their first-half possessions. But the 49ers were largely on target behind sixth-year quarterback Chris Reynolds, converting their first seven third downs and throwing for 132 yards to keep things close at the half, 20-14.

South Carolina finished with a season-best 545 yards of offense.

The Gamecocks' run of points each series ended when backup quarterback Luke Doty was intercepted by Jones — yes, the one who was hurdled by Lloyd — with 8:22 left in the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

Charlotte: The 49ers lost both Power Five games they've played this season, falling at Maryland, 56-21, before the South Carolina blowout. Charlotte has a face-paced attack behind Reynolds that had the Gamecocks defense on its heels in the first half. The school does leave with \$1.4 million in guarantees for playing at Williams-Brice Stadium.

South Carolina: There are still plenty of things to fix for the Gamecocks. This is certainly a start to gaining confidence and momentum once they return to SEC play in two weeks. The offense was efficient and powerful and the defense, after a sluggish first half, got three second-half interceptions that South Carolina turned into points.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler threw two touchdown passes and ran for a score in South Carolina's 50-10 victory over South Carolina State in a game moved from Saturday to Thursday night because of Hurricane Ian.

Rattler finished with 212 yards, completing 21 of 27 passes including a 5-yard scoring strike to tailback MarShawn Lloyd and an 11-yarder to tight end Austin Stogner, his teammate at Oklahoma, to help South Carolina (3-2) rout the FCS Bulldogs (1-3).

Administrators at both schools agreed to the change because of the hurricane's approach. Ian moved through Florida into the Atlantic and was expected to re-enter land in the Palmetto State as a Category 1 storm Friday.

Many parking areas were half-filled at best and the normal, Southeastern Conference-style tailgating setups were absent for this one. South Carolina said 61,551 were at Williams-Brice Stadium, which lists a capacity of 77,559. But the upper decks were largely empty and it wasn't a stretch to think only about the announced crowd came out.

The Gamecocks overcame a sluggish start, including two interceptions off Rattler's receivers' hands, to take control in the opening half.

The Gamecocks broke through on Rattler's first-quarter TD toss to Lloyd, which was followed by a funky, "swinging gate" formation on a successful two-point conversion by defensive lineman Tonka Hemingway.

South Carolina pulled out the wishbone on its next touchdown, a 1-yard handoff to versatile tight end Jaheim Bell. Rattler ran his way to a score from 6 yards out with 37 seconds left in the half to put Gamecocks up 22-0.

South Carolina State of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference had more penalty yards than offensive yards, 112 to 83, in the first 30 minutes. The Bulldogs got their only touchdown on Tyrece Nick's 1-yard touchdown run right after halftime, ending a drought where they had gone three straight quarters without points.

Nick accounted for 158 of the Bulldogs' 220 yards of offense.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs had lost their earlier FBS game, 56-10 at UCF to open the season. They certainly put up a better showing in their home state — the campuses are located about 40 miles apart — and leave with \$500,000 for playing at Williams-Brice.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks got their run game going a week ago in a 56-20 win over Charlotte when they rushed for 295 yards. This time, they got Rattler and the passing game on track. Both will be needed when they return to SEC play at No. 7 Kentucky next week.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — Spencer Rattler overcame two early turnovers and threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, Jalen Brooks ran for an insurance score midway through the fourth and South Carolina scored 17 unanswered points to beat No. 13 Kentucky 24-14 on Saturday night for its third consecutive victory.

Kentucky started freshman Kaiya Sheron at quarterback in place of injured senior Will Levis, who wore a protective on his left foot.

MarShawn Lloyd scored a 2-yard touchdown run on the Gamecocks' first snap, immediately after Kentucky's Chris Rodriguez Jr. fumbled on the opening play. That quickly seized momentum against the Wildcats (3-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference).

South Carolina (4-2, 1-2) moved ahead early in the third quarter, when Rattler (14 of 19, 177 yards) hit Antwane Wells Jr. in the flat and the junior darted past a defender for a 42-yard touchdown and 14-7 lead.

Mitch Jeter's 32-yard field goal later in the period provided a 10-point cushion that Brooks extended to 17 points with a 24-yard TD run with 7:02 remaining.

Sheron (15 of 27, 178 yards) tossed a 10-yard TD pass JuTahn McClain with 2:49 left, his second of the game, but the Wildcats fell for the second consecutive week in league play.

Mystery preceded this defeat as Levis entered Kroger Field with a boot on his left foot and did not participate in warmups with teammates. Earlier this week, Kentucky coach Mark Stoops referred to a finger injury Levis sustained in last week's 22-19 loss to No. 9 Mississippi, but didn't mention any foot injury and remained mum on the quarterback's status on Thursday.

Disaster quickly followed with Rodriguez's fumble, a blocked punt and Matt Ruffolo's missed 45-yard field goal that bounced off the left upright. Sheron regrouped to fake a toss to Rodriguez and hit wide-open Jordan Dingle for the tying touchdown in the second quarter, but Kentucky was held to its lowest output since losing 30-13 to top-ranked Georgia 30-13 last season.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Gifted with a turnover on the first snap, the Gamecocks converted but couldn't reach the end zone until the third quarter. Rattler fumbled on a sack and was intercepted, but found a groove with short passes that turned into big gains. The defense limited Sheron's passing options after the TD to earn a much-needed win.

Kentucky: Offensive falloff was to be expected without Levis, but the Wildcats quickly dug a hole with a first-play fumble and special teams failures. Other than Sheron, the offense stalled. More puzzling were the defensive breakdowns that allowed Rattler to pick them apart, which is not good with red-hot Mississippi State up next.
