GAMECOCKS IN THE PROS

The University of South Carolina soccer program continues to prepare its student-athletes for the total experience in college, and for making the next step to the professional soccer world. In 43 years of play the Gamecocks have had over 50 players that were drafted or played in the professional ranks.

With the emergence of Major League Soccer in 1996, Gamecock Rob Smith joined the Columbus Crew. Former Gamecock greats Clint Mathis (New York/New Jersey Metrostars) and Josh Wolff (Chicago Fire/Kansas City Wizards/DC United), soon joined the list of Gamecocks in the MLS. Wolff and Mathis finished second and third, respectively, in the voting for MLS Rookie of the Year in 1998. Henry Ring was the first goalkeeper drafted in the 2000 MLS Super Draft and spent three years with the Chicago Fire. Ring made the MLS All-Star team during a breakout 2004 season. Josh Wolff played for a short time overseas before returning to MLS in 2008.

Brad Guzan was the No. 2 pick, the highest ever for a goalkeeper, in the 2005 MLS SuperDraft. Guzan was a three-year starter for Chivas USA, however, in August of 2008 he made the move to the English Premier League, signing with Aston Villa.

The 2011 senior class saw three drafted in the MLS supplemental draft. Forward Blake Brettschneider, the 2010 C-USA Co-MVP, was drafted and signed to DC United, while goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer was selected by the New York Red Bulls and striker Sam Arthur was chosen by the Chicago Fire. Danny Deakin was the team's latest draft choice in 2017 when he was selected in the third round of the MLS SuperDraft by expansion team Orlando City SC.

Maurer (FC Dallas) and Guzan (Atlanta United) are the two Gamecocks currently still playing in the MLS. Guzan helped lead Atlanta to its first MLS Cup in 2018.





NATIONAL GOALKEEPER OF THE YEAR

One of the most prestigious awards on the national college soccer scene is "Goalkeeper of the Year," so named by adidas and the NSCAA. Within a four-year span, South Carolina brought home two of those awards — Warren Lipka winning in 1985 and Charles Arndt in 1988.

Arndt became one of USC's best players ever after a sparkling senior campaign that saw him engineer 13 shutouts for the Gamecocks en route to a semifinals appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Arndt broke Lipka's long-standing record for minutes played in a career and has the best career goals against average in school history - allowing a goal every one-and-a-half games for an 0.70 career mark. Arndt was also named All-South Region, All-America, Academic All-America and John M. Johnson Award winner after the 1988 season.


Lipka became the Gamecocks' first-ever "Goalkeeper of the Year" award winner in 1985, after South Carolina completed what is still the best record in school history (20-3-1) while advancing to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals. Lipka played 2,155 minutes in goal that season (still a school best) while being part of 15 shutouts in 24 matches that year for another school standard.





DOUG ALLISON - 1987 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Doug Allison, South Carolina's first ever first-team All-American is the school's all-time leading point (158) and goal scorer (63). He led Carolina in scoring all four of his years and went to the NCAA Tournament three straight years from 1985-87. A native of Barnstaple, England, Allison joined Marty Baltzegar as the school's first All-America award winners. He served as an assistant coach to Mark Berson at South Carolina from 1991-94 and is currently the head coach at cross-state rival Furman.



MARTY BALTZEGAR - 1987 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER

Marty Baltzegar was a second-team All-American after anchoring a stifling defense that allowed only 10 goals all year, two coming on penalty kicks. Baltzegar joined teammate Doug Allison as Carolina's first ever All-America honorees. Baltzegar scored 24 career points on six goals and 12 assists.




CHARLES ARNDT - 1988 ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER

A first-team All-America selection, Charles Arndt compiled 13 shutouts while leading the Gamecocks to their first semifinal appearance in the NCAA Tournament during his senior campaign. For his efforts, Arndt was named National Goalkeeper of the Year. He holds school records for career goals against average (0.70) and combined shutouts (29).


CLARK BRISSON - 1989 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Clark Brisson earned All-America honors after leading Carolina with a then-school record 50 points (21g, 8a). Brisson closed out his career in 1990 with 98 points (36g, 26a), good for fourth all-time in South Carolina history. In Brisson's four-year career, the Gamecocks compiled an amazing 61-14-11 (.773) mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times.



TOMMY LOEBER - 1990 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER


Tommy Loeber was a First-Team All-America selection by the NSCAA. He led a defense that only allowed 19 goals all year while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Loeber, an Arlington, Texas, native, started more games than anyone in Carolina history, notching 87 starts in 87 games. He finished his career with six points on two goals and two assists.




CHRIS FAKLARIS - 1993 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Chris Faklaris was a consensus Second-Team All-American by Soccer America, Soccer News and the NSCAA after leading the Gamecocks in points (44) and goals (20). Carolina's second all-time leading scorer with 124 points (55 goals, 14 assists), Faklaris led the Gamecocks to their only national championship game appearance in 1993.









ROB SMITH - 1994 ALL-AMERICAN - MIDFIELDER

Rob Smith, a third-team All-American, ended his career as Carolina's all-time leader with 40 assists. A starter in all 84 matches during his four-year career, Smith is tied for ninth all-time in scoring with 78 points (19 goals, 40 assists). Smith, who played for the MLS's Columbus Crew, completed his degree at South Carolina in 2001. He represented the United States at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga.



CLINT MATHIS - 1995, '97 ALL-AMERICAN - MIDFIELDER

Clint Mathis set Gamecock season records for most points (53), goals (25) and game-winning goals (10) on his way to becoming a consensus first-team All-America selection in 1995. A third-team selection in 1997, he finished his career as the third all-time leading scorer in Carolina history with 121 points (53g, 15a). He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy and the MAC (Missouri Athletic Club) Player of the Year award. In 2002, he represented the United States in the World Cup.




HENRY RING - 1998, '00 ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER

Henry Ring posted a goals against average of 0.72 and recorded 9.5 shutouts while allowing only 14 goals in 1,753 minutes in 1998. Ring was named to the first-ever All-Independent First Team. He became only the second Gamecock to earn All-America honors twice, joining Clint Mathis. Ring earned third-team honors after ending the 2000 campaign with an 0.93 GAA, allowing only 17 goals his senior season. He was drafted by the Chicago Fire in the 2001 MLS SuperDraft and was the starter in net for the Fire in 2004.









BRAD GUZAN - 2004 ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER

Brad Guzan earned Second-Team All-America honors from the NSCAA in his second and final season as a Gamecock in 2004. He was also a semifinalist for the MAC (Missouri Athletic Club) Hermann Trophy and one of Soccer America's 11 Collegiate MVPs. The Homer Glen, Ill., native played every minute in goal of his two seasons at Carolina before opting to turn pro. Guzan was the No. 2 pick in the MLS SuperDraft, making him the highest goalkeeper ever drafted (CD Chivas USA). Guzan was the starting goalkeeper for the U.S. in the 2008 Beijing Olympics, while he began his first season with Aston Villa of the Barclays Premier League in England in late 2008. He was most recently honored with his second World Cup roster spot on the 2014 U.S. Men's National Team that competed in the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil. He previously was a member of the 2010 US Men's National Team for the 2010 World Cup in South Africa..



GREG REECE - 2005 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER

Greg Reece earned Third-Team All-America honors from CollegeSoccerNews.com following his senior season in 2005. A native of Clemmons, N.C., Reece was selected Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year and helped the Gamecocks capture the C-USA Championship and an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament. Reece was a four-year starer on the backline for South Carolina.



UNITED SOCCER COACHES ALL-REGION

Since head coach Mark Berson started the Gamecock program in 1978, a total of 51 different student-athletes have collected 77 United Soccer Coaches (formerly the NSCAA) All-Region honors. Brian Winstead was the first Carolina player to make the team in 1978. Fourteen Carolina players made the All-South Region team more than once during their career. Rob Smith was selected All-South Region in all four of his seasons at South Carolina (1991-94). Doug Allison (1985-87), Chris Faklaris (1992-94) and Jimmy Maurer (2008-10) were three-time All-South Region selections. A part of the South Region until 2013, the Gamecocks moved to the Southeast Region in 2014.

At least one South Carolina player has made the All-South or All-Southeast Region team in every season since 1983, and two players have garnered the honor in 25 of those seasons. Three Gamecocks were honored in 2010 and 2015, and four were named to the squad in the 1986, 1987 and 1994 seasons.






H. BOYD MCWHORTER SEC MALE SCHOLAR-ATH-LETE OF THE YEAR

COLUMBIA, S.C. - It took a shootout to determine the team who would move on to the second round of the 2015 NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Tournament, and South Carolina came out on top 2-1 to advance over Furman on Thursday night at Stone

The two teams battled for 110 minutes. with neither team gaining a clear advantage. The Gamecocks broke through first in the 58th minute after junior Danny Deakin streaked down the right side and slotted the ball into the bottom right of the goal. That lead held until 18 seconds left in regulation, when Furman's Lewis Hawke poked one inside the far post to level things at 1-1. Brendan Richardson sent the ball over the top to Kyle McLagan, who pushed the cross into Hawke for the score.

Furman tried to end the match early in the first overtime period, but South Carolina swung the momentum back and ended up taking nine shots in the final 20 minutes compared to two for the Paladins.

In the shootout, both team's first shooters made their shots, but the goalkeepers came up big after that. Both had saves in the second round, and Paladin goalkeeper Sven Lissen stopped another shot in the third round, while Furman's shooter missed the goal. Gamecock junior Kurtis Turner knocked in his next shot, putting South Carolina ahead, and sophomore goalkeeper William Pyle saved the next Furman chance to give the Gamecocks a chance to end it. Lissen made another stop, giving his team the chance to tie it, but the next strike went high.

2016 FIRST Round Carolina 1, Mercer 0 Nov. 17 at Stone Stadium

COLUMBIA, S.C. — South Carolina defeated Mercer 1-0 on Thursday afternoon in the opening round of the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship at Stone Stadium. The win avenged a 3-2 double overtime loss to the Bears earlier this season on Aug. 30.

Mercer stuck to a very solid game plan, as they came out and controlled the ball for much of the first half offensively. The Bears tallied five shots in the first half, including two on goal.

Junior William Pyle, who was a rock all day in the net, made two spectacular saves in the opening period. In the 8th minute, he made a diving, full-extension save to his right on a shot by Mercer's Kobe Perez. In the 35th minute, SoCon Player of the Year Will Bagrou beat a Gamecock defender 1-on-1 in the box. He rifled a shot on goal that Pyle was able to punch over the net.

Carolina, who logged only two shots in period one, made the most of its opportunities. In the 39th minute, senior Kurtis Turner setup a free kick from the right side of the box. He played a beautiful ball into sophomore Andre Streete. Senior Kevin Walker slipped low to the net behind the defense and Streete headed the free kick from Turner to his wide open teammate. Walker finished the great dish from Streete for his fifth goal of the season. Turner and Streete were credited with a double-assist on the score.

The Gamecocks played one of their best halves of the season defensively in period two, limiting the Bears chances on offense. In the 72nd minute, Bagrou beat his defender from 10-yards out. Pyle steam rolled out of the net to block the ensuing shot by Bagrou, leaving the net empty. Senior Matt McManis slipped down from the backside and was able to step in front of the shot for the team save

South Carolina effectively controlled the tempo in half two, nearly adding to its lead twice on two transition chances. In the 86th minute, freshman Luca Mayr fed a perfect outlet pass down the middle of the field to freshman Inaki Aguirre. The Madrid,

2016 Second Round No. 3 Clemson 2, Carolina 1 (OT) Nov. 20 at Riggs Field

CLEMSON, S.C. — South Carolina (11-8-1) dropped a heart-breaking, 2-1, overtime match at No. 3 Clemson Sunday night in the Second Round of the 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Championship. The Tigers tied the score in the 86th minute and scored the game-winner in the 93rd minute.

Similar to the first game between the two schools, Carolina had the run-of-play for a majority of the match. Freshman Luca Mayr was outstanding in the first half for the Gamecocks. He led all players with three shots at the break. In the 14th minute, Mayr found a seam in the defense and rocketed a shot from just outside the 18-yard box. He missed wide.

Shortly after in the 16th minute, senior Koty Millard fired a shot from essentially the same spot on the field, but goalkeeper Ximo Miralles was able to scoop it up.

Clemson's best chance to score in the opening half came in the 22nd minute. Goalkeeper Wiliam Pyle left the net to make a play on the ball. Sophomore defender Andre Streete slid down to clear it off the line for the team save.The team's headed to the locker room scoreless at the break. The Gamecocks held a 7-6 advantage in shots, while the Tigers held a 7-6 edge in corners.

In the 71st minute, senior Ive Burnett played a beautiful high-arching ball from midfield into the six. A Clemson defender just barely got a foot on the ball to change its direction slightly and knock it on far post for the own goal, giving Carolina 1-0 lead with under 20 minutes to play.

The Tigers scored the equalizer with just four minutes left in the 86th minute. Iman Mafi slipped a pass that got through the Gamecock defense in front of the net to Alex Happi, who finished for the gametying goal.

It was Happi again who found the back of the net for Clemson in the 93rd minute. He was able to get off a shot in a scrum 10-yards from the net that snuck just passed the outstretched arms of Pyle.

MEMORABLE HOME MATCHES

Over the last 44 seasons, many great memories have been made at South Carolina home matches at The Gravevard, which became Stone Stadium with the addition of the permanent grandstand in 1996. These memorable matches range from NCAA Tournament wins to strong individual showings, to wins that marked a specific moment in Carolina soccer history.

- 11/17/85 Doug Allison and Scott Cook both add a goal and an assist, as SC wins its first NCAA home match, a 3-0 victory against the Duke Blue Devils. - 10/12/86 Carolina secured its first home win against archrival Clemson, a hard-fought 4-3 victory.

- 11/27/88 A lone first-half goal by Clark Brisson leads Gamecocks to first ever College Cup with a 1-0 victory over SMU.

- 11/4/89 A 3-2 win over UCLA became the first of two wins over the Bruins, helping SC go undefeated in 1989 Met Life Classic.

- 11/12/89 Scott Cook scored a miraculous goal from the near corner flag to defeat Duke, 2-1, in the NCAA Tournament.

- 10/28/90 A 2-1 win over powerhouse Indiana gave SC a second Met Life Classic title.

- 11/1/92 The Gamecocks score just 15 seconds into the game and have their captain ejected at 56 seconds, however, they still win a 2-0 thriller over

- 9/27/06 Cory Lewis scores twice as the Gamecocks defeat UAB, 2-0, and give coach Mark Berson his 400th career victory.

- 10/27/07 Gamecocks defeat Marshall, 3-1, securing Berson's 400th victory at South Carolina.

- 8/29/08 Then-record crowd of 6,102 watched the Gamecocks defeat archrival Clemson, 2-0.

- 11/21/10 South Carolina defeats Duke, 1-0, on a golden goal by Bradlee Baladez in the NCAA Tournament.

GAMECOCK VARSITY SOCCER FIELD AT THE GRAVEYARD HISTORY

Before Stone Stadium became part of the Gamecock Athletics' landscape, the South Carolina men's soccer team played on the same site, affectionately referred to as "The Graveyard" for the first 18 years of the site's existence.

Bleachers lined the east side of the field, with a seating capacity of 2,000 listed throughout its time. However, many times crowds well over that cap came to watch the Gamecocks play, including over 6,000 for the 1990 match-up against archrival Clemson.

"The Graveyard" stood as the place where opponents dreams of a road win died, as South Carolina captured 84 percent of the contests played on the site (177-30-9) in 18 years. Twice, the homefield advantage launched a Mark Berson-led Gamecock team to the NCAA College Cup in 1988 and 1993.

EUGENE E. STONE III STADIUM - ESTABLISHED IN 1996

Built in time for the fall of 1996, Eugene E. Stone III Stadium marked a new era in Gamecock Soccer history. Holding 5,000 fans, the concrete stands gave new amenities not previously seen at The Graveyard. The facility accommodates both the men and women during the season.

Improvements have continued over the years, including the addition of chairback seats from Sarge Frye Field and a scoreboard in 2008, modernizing part of the stadium. New sod brought about a new look to the facility in 2009, leveling the field and giving it a much better look. Graphics also sprung up under the stands and on the stadium facing during that renovation.

The site is set to grow again in the next offseason, as a new facility will give the Gamecock soccer teams new locker rooms, a weight room and a video room for the squads to share.

The Stones also made the same gift to Furman, where the Paladins' stadium also bears Stone's name.
