QUICKLY: The South Carolina Gamecocks (7-4, 4-4 SEC) wrap up their 2022 regular-season schedule when they travel to the Upstate on Saturday, Nov. 26, to face the No. 7/8 Clemson Tigers (10-1, 8-0 ACC) in the annual Palmetto Bowl. Game time has been set for high noon at Memorial Stadium (81,500).

PLAYING FOR A POINT: A win in the Palmetto Bowl gives one school another point in the Palmetto Series, sponsored by the South Carolina Education Lottery. Carolina has won the Palmetto Series trophy in each of the four years it's been contested. The Gamecocks currently lead his year's points chase 3-2, winning in both men's and women's basketball and in women's cross country, while the Tigers posted victories in men's soccer and volleyball.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: This week's contest will be televised nationally by ABC as part of the ACC television package. Sean McDonough (play-by-play) and Todd Blackledge (analyst) will be in the booth with Molly McGrath working the sidelines. The Gamecock Radio Network features Todd Ellis as the play-by-play voice with Tommy Suggs providing the color commentary. Jamar Nesbit patrols the sidelines for the Gamecock Radio Network.

GAMECOCK REWIND: The Gamecocks opened 2022 with a win over Georgia State, then dropped a pair of SEC contests to ranked opponents, first at No. 16 Arkansas, then at home to top-ranked Georgia. Carolina then put together a four-game winning streak, its longest since winning six in a row to end the 2013 season, including back-to-back wins at No. 13 Kentucky and at home versus preseason top-10 Texas A&M. After a disappointing home loss to Missouri, the Gamecocks bounced back with another road win at Vanderbilt, their fifth win in six games, becoming bowl-eligible for the second-straight season under head coach Shane Beamer. After another disappointing performance in The Swamp against Florida, the Gamecocks rebounded with their best offensive performance and their best win of the season in a 63-38 rout of No. 5 Tennessee last Saturday night on Senior Night in Columbia. With a 7-4 record, the Gamecocks have won seven regular-season games for the first time since 2018. Shane Beamer joined Steve Spurrier as the only coaches in SC history to win at least seven games in each of their first two seasons.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Gamecocks have won two road games in 2022, posting road wins at No. 13 Kentucky and at Vanderbilt, their high mark since 2018. They are looking for their third road win of the season, something they haven't done since the 2013 season. The Gamecocks last won in Clemson in 2012, a 27-17 victory. Head coach Steve Spurrier became the winningest coach in South Carolina history with 65 wins that night, as sophomore quarterback Dylan Thompson completed 23-for-41 passes for 310 yards with three touchdowns and sophomore defensive end Jadeveon Clowney tallied 4.5 sacks in the win.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2022 marks the 129th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 116th-consecutive year in which Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 628-605-44, a .509 winning percentage.

CAROLINA VS. CLEMSON: This is the 119th meeting between these two Palmetto State schools in a rivalry that dates back to 1896. The teams met every year from 1909 - 2019, making the Carolina-Clemson series the second-longest running consecutively-played series in college football behind only Minnesota - Wisconsin before the series was interrupted in 2020 due to COVID. The Tigers hold a 72-42-4 lead in the all-time series, including a 19-10-1 mark in Clemson and a 53-32-3 advantage in Columbia. Clemson has won the last seven meetings after Carolina had won the previous five.

BACK IN TIGER TOWN: South Carolina is making its first trip to Clemson since the 2018 season. The 2020 contest, which was scheduled to be played at Memorial Stadium, was cancelled due to COVID-19, as the Gamecocks played a 10-game schedule comprised entirely of SEC opponents that season. The back-to-back games played in Columbia in 2019 and 2021 was the first time that had occurred since 1958 and '59. Every game played from 1896-1959 was played in Columbia, most as part of the "Big Thursday" tradition with the game contested in late October in conjunction with the state fair.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Will Shipley ran for 128 yards and a touchdown, BT Potter booted three field goals, and the Clemson defense pitched a shutout in a 30-0 Tiger win in Columbia on Nov. 27, 2021. For more on that game, please turn to page 9 of these game notes.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: Trevor Lawrence threw for a career-high 393 yards, Adam Choice rushed for three TDs and No. 2 Clemson capped a perfect regular season with a 56-35 victory over South Carolina on Nov. 24, 2018 at Memorial Stadium in Clemson. **Jake Bentley** threw for career highs with 510 yards - the second most ever allowed by Clemson - and five TDs. **Deebo Samuel** had 10 catches for 210 yards and three scores while **Shi Smith** had nine grabs for 109 yards and a score. The Tigers had not surrendered that many points in 28 games since a 42-35 win over Virginia Tech in the 2016 ACC title game.

THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN: No. 10/9 South Carolina forced a half-dozen Clemson turnovers, turning three of them into touchdowns, as the Gamecocks won for the fifth-straight time over the No. 6/4 Tigers, 31-17 in Columbia on Nov. 30, 2013. The game was deadlocked at 17 heading into the final period, but **Mike Davis** scored on a two-yard run to cap a drive that took over six minutes off the clock, then **Brandon Wilds** scored on a 26-yard pass from **Pharoh Cooper** to seal the win. **Connor Shaw** posted 246 yards of total offense, including 94 on the ground, while All-American **Kelcy Quarles** led the defense with 2.5 sacks. **Skai Moore** had a fumble recovery and a pick in the contest.

THEY ONCE WORE ORANGE: Carolina wide receivers coach **Justin Stepp** served as a Clemson graduate assistant from 2009-11. Gamecocks' Director

A South Carolina win over Clemson would...

- ◆ Snap a seven-game losing streak to the Tigers in the series.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks an eighth regular-season win for the first time since 2017.
- ◆ Give South Carolina a 4-2 lead in the Palmetto Series, sponsored by the South Carolina Education Lottery. Carolina has won every Palmetto Series trophy since it began, holding a 4-0 advantage.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks wins in back-to-back games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2013 when they defeated No. 6 Clemson and No. 19 Wisconsin to wrap up the season.

THE LAST TIME OUT: Carolina put together arguably the best offensive game in school history in a 63-38 rout of No. 5 Tennessee in Columbia last Saturday night. The Gamecocks scored touchdowns on nine of 10 possessions with one punt. Two other possessions ended when the clock ran out in each half.

IT'S A MAJOR AWARD: South Carolina was selected as the Cheez-It Bowl National Team of the Week as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) after its win over Tennessee. It marked the fifth time since 2002 that the Gamecocks have been honored as the National Team of the Week. Previous recognitions came after wins over Tennessee (2005), Florida (2005), Alabama (2010) and Georgia (2019). **Shane Beamer** was recognized as the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the second time this season.

MAKING A POINT: The Gamecocks put up 63 points against Tennessee:

- ◆ It was the second-highest point total scored by Carolina in an SEC game behind only the 65 tallied against Mississippi State in 1995.
- ◆ It was the most points by a Carolina team against a top-5 opponent. The previous high was 35, done several times, most recently against No. 2 Clemson in 2018.
- ◆ It was the most points scored by an unranked team against an A.P. top-5 opponent in the poll era (since 1936).
- ◆ It was the most points by an unranked SEC team vs a ranked SEC team ever in regulation.
- ◆ It was the most points ever allowed by Tennessee in an SEC game.

STAY ON THE FIELD: One of the keys entering the Tennessee was for the Carolina offense to stay on the field, keeping the high-powered Vols offense on the sidelines. Mission accomplished. The Gamecocks were 8-of-11 on third-down conversions, and 2-of-2 on fourth-down attempts, leading to just one punt. They controlled the clock, holding the ball for 38:58 despite running two fewer plays than UT.

THAT'S ANOTHER CAROLINA FIRST DOWN: The Gamecocks logged 35 first downs in the win over Tennessee. That set a new school single-game record, surpassing the old mark of 34, set against Mississippi State in 1995 and matched against Vanderbilt in 2001. The Gamecocks had 12 first downs via the run, 19 through the air and four on penalties against the Vols. The Gamecocks had not recorded more than 17 first downs in any of the previous five games.

THE BEST EVER?: **Spencer Rattler** had maybe the best game by a quarterback in school history in the win over UT. Rattler completed 30-of-37 passes for 438 yards and a school-record six TDs with no pics. The 30 completions, 438 yards and six TDs were all career highs. The 438 yards was the fourth-highest single game mark in school history.

Rattler was selected as the Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week, the CFP National Performer of the Week and the co-SEC Offensive Player of the Week.

BRINGING THE JUICE: **Antwane "Juice" Wells Jr.** came up big in the win over the Vols. He was targeted 14 times and recorded 11 receptions for 177 yards. The 11 catches was the most for a Gamecock this season, while his 177 yards receiving was his second-highest mark of the year, topped only by the 189 he had at Arkansas on eight receptions.

KROEGER IS YOUR GUY: The Augusta Sports Council has named South Carolina junior punter **Kai Kroeger** one of 10 semifinalists for the 2022 Ray Guy Award, which recognizes the nation's top punter. Kroeger has been on the "Ray's 8" list six times this season, was the national Punter of the Week following the Georgia State game and was the co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week following the Vanderbilt game.

BEATING A RANKED OPPONENT: South Carolina has knocked off two ranked opponents this season, topping 13th-ranked Kentucky in Lexington by a 24-14 score and beating No. 5 Tennessee, 63-38 last week. **Shane Beamer** is 2-4 as a head coach against Top-25 teams, including a 2-2 mark this season. The Gamecocks fell at No. 2 Georgia and at No. 17 Texas A&M during the 2021 campaign. This year, they dropped decisions at 16th-ranked Arkansas and at home to top-ranked Georgia, before the wins at Kentucky and at home vs. Tennessee.

BACK-TO-BACK JACK: The Gamecocks are playing their second top-10 opponent in as many weeks. The last time Carolina played consecutive games against top-10 teams was in 2019 when they won at No. 3 Georgia before losing to No. 9 Florida at home. That season, the Gamecocks also played No. 2 Alabama, so they saw three top-10 teams in a five-week stretch.

IT WOULD BE MEMORABLE: Clemson enters this week's game ranked seventh in the Associated Press poll. The Gamecocks are looking to win back-to-back games against ranked opponents for the first time since 2013 when they defeated No. 6 Clemson and No. 19 Wisconsin to wrap up the season. Here are the top wins in school history based on the A.P. rankings:

NO NAIL BITING HERE: The Gamecocks have played just one game that was decided by a touchdown or less, a 34-28 win over Texas A&M, and the Aggies had to score with just 10 seconds left to make that a one-score game. The only other contest that was decided by 10 points or less was a 24-14 win over Kentucky. The average margin of victory in the 11 games played by the Gamecocks this season is 22.6 points.

NEVER LOOK BACK: The Gamecocks are 7-0 this season when scoring first and 12-1 when scoring first in the Shane Beamer Era. Oddly, in its eight SEC contests this season, Carolina was not involved in a game in which there was a lead change.

TURNOVERS WIN GAMES: After recording just one takeaway through the season's first three games while posting a 1-2 record, Carolina recorded 10 turnovers in its next four contests, all wins, including back-to-back three-interception games against Charlotte and South Carolina State, marking the first time since 2013 that they recorded three INTs in back-to-back games. The Gamecocks are 6-0 this season when winning or breaking even in the turnover battle and 1-4 when committing more turnovers.

THREE IN THE TOP 100: South Carolina has three players listed among the top 100 prospects for the 2023 NFL Draft, according to The 33rd Team. Junior cornerback **Cam Smith** checks in at No. 35, senior defensive tackle **Zacch Pickens** is listed at No. 73, and junior tight end **Jaheim Bell** is ranked at No. 100.

THE STATE OF OUR DEFENSE: South Carolina started nine players on defense against Tennessee last week who graduated from South Carolina high schools. The only outliers were linebacker Sherrod Greene (North Carolina) and EDGE Gilber Edmond (Florida).

WE'RE GOING BOWLING: With seven wins, the Gamecocks are bowl-eligible. Carolina is 10-14 in its 24 bowl games. They dropped their first eight bowl appearances, but are 10-6 since, including wins in six of their last eight bowl games. **Shane Beamer** is the third Gamecock head coach to take his team to a bowl game in each of his first two seasons, joining Steve Spurrier and Will Muschamp. Coach Beamer will have an opportunity to become the first Gamecock head coach to win a bowl game in each of his first two seasons at the helm.

FOR STARTERS: The Gamecocks have used 41 different starters on offense (20) and defense (21) this season, ranking in a tie for seventh in the FBS in number of players making starts this season.

EVERY TIME OUT: Six players have started every game this season, including WR **Jalen Brooks**, OC **Eric Douglas**, OG **Jovaughn Gwyn**, QB **Spencer Rattler**, EDGE **Jordan Burch** and DT **Zacch Pickens**.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features nine scholarship transfers, six of whom enrolled at Carolina in January. The spring enrollees included RB **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), RB **Lovasea Carroll** (Georgia), EDGE **Terrell Dawkins** (NC State), QB **Spencer Rattler** (Oklahoma), DB **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan), and WR **Antwane Wells Jr.** (James Madison). TE **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), WR **Corey Rucker** (Arkansas State) and TE **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) were added to the roster in the summer.

SENIOR SALUTE: Twenty-three players took part in Senior Day ceremonies last week including Nate Adkins, Matt Bailey, Christian Beal-Smith, Jalen Brooks, Wyatt Campbell, Jaylin Dickerson, Eric Douglas, Sherrod Greene, Jovaughn Gwyn, Brad Johnson, Dakereon Joyner, Hank Manos, Jaylen Nichols, Zacch Pickens, Devonni Reed, Darius Rush, Rick Sandidge, Austin Stogner, Jordan Strachan, Chad Terrell, Josh Vann, M.J. Webb and Dylan Wonnun.

SUPER SENIORS: The Gamecocks list nine players (not including transfers) whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 season to be a "free" year. Those "super seniors" are WR **Jalen Brooks**, OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Sherrod Greene**, LB **Brad Johnson**, EDGE **Jordan Strachan**, WR **Chad Terrell**, WR **Josh Vann**, DL **M.J. Webb** and OL **Dylan Wonnun**.

ONE FOR THE THUMB: With the NCAA COVID rule allowing for an extra year, four Gamecocks - OL **Eric Douglas**, LB **Brad Johnson**, WR **Josh Vann** and OL **Dylan Wonnun** - will become five-year letter-winners.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 20 players who have their college degrees in hand. Twelve players who wore the SEC Graduate patch in the Duke's Mayo Bowl returned for the 2022 season, including **Wyatt Campbell, Eric Douglas, Sherrod Greene, Brad Johnson, Tyreek Johnson, Dakereon Joyner, Hank Manos, Darius Rush, Jordan Strachan, Chad Terrell, M.J. Webb** and **Dylan Wonnum**. **Jovaughn Gwyn** and **Jaylen Nichols** graduated in May. **Traevon Kenion** graduated in August. In addition, **Nate Adkins** (East Tennessee State), **Christian Beal-Smith** (Wake Forest), **Dante Miller** (Columbia), **Devonni Reed** (Central Michigan) and **Austin Stogner** (Oklahoma) have degrees from other institutions.

THEY COME TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY: South Carolina sold out all six of its Saturday home games this season, generating crowds of 78,297 in the season opener against Georgia State, 78,212 against top-ranked Georgia, 77,982 versus Charlotte, 77,837 against Texas A&M, 77,578 versus Missouri and a season-high 79,041 last week versus No. 5 Tennessee. The only home game not sold out this season was the South Carolina State game, which was moved from Saturday to Thursday earlier that week due to Hurricane Ian. The Gamecocks rank 16th in the country in average attendance at 75,785.

LOOKING AHEAD: The Gamecocks will await the Dec. 4 announcement for the bowl game destination and opponent.

Offense

SATT ATTACK: The Gamecock pro-style offense is in its second year under the direction of **Marcus Satterfield**. In his first season, Satt was able to cobble seven wins together with four different starting quarterbacks winning games. Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Satterfield most recently was part of Matt Rhule's staff with the Carolina Panthers. He and Coach Beamer first met each other as graduate assistants at Tennessee.

30-SOMETHING: The Gamecocks have tallied 30 or more points in seven games this season. They scored 30 or more just three times in 13 games in 2021. The last time they scored 30 or more points seven times was in the 2018 season.

QB1: Oklahoma transfer **Spencer Rattler** is the Gamecocks' number one signal-caller. Rattler, who joined the team in the spring and was the Joe Morrison Player of the Spring for the offense, is 210-for-313 (67.1 percent) for 2,420 yards with 14 touchdowns and nine interceptions this season. He owns two of the top 13 single-game passing games in school history, with the fourth-highest mark against Tennessee at 438 and the 13th-highest total at Arkansas with 377. The six touchdown passes against the Vols is a school record. He has appeared in 34 games during his career, posting a 22-6 record as a starter, including a 7-4 mark at South Carolina. He has completed 68.9 percent of his career passes (571-for-829) for 7,000 yards with 54 touchdowns and 21 interceptions.

400 TIMES SEVEN: Gamecock quarterbacks have thrown for 400 yards in a game seven times. **Spencer Rattler's** 438-yard performance against Tennessee was the fourth-highest single game total in school history.

DOTY IN THE BULLPEN: Junior **Luke Doty** was the projected starter at quarterback during preseason camp a year ago, but foot injuries derailed his season. The Myrtle Beach, S.C. product is fully healthy and has improved his game since that time. He has appeared in four games this season, completing 10-of-14 passes for 146 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He also has a rushing TD. Doty has completed 61.0 percent of his passes (139-for-228) with nine touchdowns and eight interceptions in 17 career games. He is 2-4 as a starting QB.

JOYNER JOINS IN: The MVP of the Duke's Mayo Bowl, **Dakereon Joyner** continues to showcase his talents, as he has been inserted into the lineup more recently, taking direct snaps from center. He is 2-for-2 passing this season for 83 yards and a touchdown. Going back to the 2021 bowl win over North Carolina, Joyner has completed his last 11 passes for 243 yards and two touchdowns.

DOWN AND OUT: The Gamecocks have been playing short-handed in the backfield during this recent stretch, as their top two running backs, **MarShawn Lloyd** and **Christian Beal-Smith** have been sidelined with injuries. Lloyd has sat out each of the last three contests with a deep thigh bruise, while Beal-Smith has been limited all season and has not dressed for the past two games. Both are listed as questionable entering the Clemson week.

MARSHAWN HAS BEEN MARVELOUS: **MarShawn Lloyd** has regained the trust in his surgically-repaired knee that cost him the 2020 season. He has logged a team-high 100 carries for 556 yards, 5.6 per carry. After carrying 27 times for 75 yards, 2.8 per carry, and two scores in the first three games, Lloyd rushed 73 times for 481 yards, 6.6 per carry, with seven rushing TDs over the next five contests. However, he has not dressed for the last three games while nursing a thigh bruise. He is second in the SEC in scoring (TDs) at 8.25 points per game, with 11 total touchdowns in eight games.

MOVIN' ON UP: With his next rushing touchdown, **MarShawn Lloyd** will move into the school's top-10 single-season list in both rushing TDs and touchdowns scored:

TUNE IN TO CBS: **Christian Beal-Smith** joined the running back corps as a grad transfer from Wake Forest. He rushed for 1,871 yards over four seasons with the Demon Deacons. He has been limited to seven games due to injury but has had some success, carrying nine times for 55 yards and two scores against Charlotte and three times for a season-high 56 yards, including a season-best 52-yard TD run at Vanderbilt. For the season he has 34 carries for 146 yards with five rushing touchdowns.

BELL IN THE BACKFIELD: With **MarShawn Lloyd** and **Christian Beal-Smith** both sidelined, the versatile **Jaheim Bell** has become RB1. He has 45 carries for 168 yards in the last three games, rushing 16 times for 56 yards at Vanderbilt, carrying a dozen times for 30 yards at Florida and a career-high 17 totes for a career-high 82 yards against Tennessee. Prior to the game at Vandy he logged just 19 carries all season. He is second on the squad with 64 carries for 232 yards and two touchdowns.

IT TOLLS FOR THEE: **Jaheim Bell** is a do-it-all player who exploded in the 2021 Duke's Mayo Bowl. Bell owns the top-two receiving games by a tight end in school history, a 136-yard effort against Vanderbilt and a 159-yard performance against North Carolina in the bowl game. He can line up anywhere on the field, as he has 23 catches for 229 yards, including a 46-yard reception against Georgia, and 64 rushes for 232 yards with two scores this season, including 45 carries over the last three games with **MarShawn Lloyd** sidelined.

JUJU ON THE FIELD: **Juju McDowell** was a Freshman All-SEC performer a year ago as an all-purpose back and return specialist and, despite his diminutive size, is tough as nails and elusive in space. He is third on the squad with 56 carries for 191 yards and two touchdowns and has added 20 catches for 127 yards and score. In addition, he has five kickoff returns for 80 yards.

WELLS CAN GO FAR: Wide receiver **Antwane "Juice" Wells Jr.**, a junior transfer from James Madison, has become a favorite target for quarterback Spencer Rattler. He has been targeted 72 times and has a team-leading 54 receptions for 767 yards, a 14.2-yard average with four scores. He has more receptions (54) than the next two Gamecocks (53) have combined.

WELLS RUNS DEEP: **Antwane Wells Jr.**'s 189-yard receiving performance at Arkansas tied for the 10th-best single-game performance in school history and the most receiving yards in a game since Deebo Samuel went for 210 at Clemson in 2018. He was recognized by the East-West Shrine Bowl as the Breakout Offensive Player of the Week. He added a 110-yard effort at Vanderbilt, then came up with his third 100-yard performance against Tennessee, a season-best 11 catch, 177-yard effort. He is tied for third in the SEC in receptions per game (4.91) and in receiving yards per game (69.73). With 54 receptions and 767 receiving yards, he is closing in on the single-season top-10 in school history. To crack the top-10, he needs 62 receptions and 882 yards.

BROOKS IS NOT DONE: Wide receiver **Jalen Brooks** returned to the lineup this season after missing the final half of the 2021 season. The "Super Senior" has 30 catches for 471 yards, both second on the squad, for a team-best average of 15.7-yards per reception. He has led the team in receiving yards in four games and caught his first touchdown pass of the season last week against Tennessee.

VANN SHIFTS INTO GEAR: **Josh Vann** was Carolina's top receiver in 2021. He had a breakout season catching 43 passes and now ranks tied for 17th with Bruce Ellington with 106 career receptions. He's been relatively quiet this season with just 16 catches for 240 yards, but has three touchdowns, including his first two-touchdown game against Tennessee last week. He has also contributed on special teams with 10 punt returns for 151 yards, a 15.1-yard average, with a long of 37 at Florida. That average would tie for third in the NCAA ranking if he had enough returns to qualify.

NO LIMITS FOR AUSTIN: Transfer **Austin Stogner** joined the squad this summer after graduating from Oklahoma, where he caught 47 passes over the past three seasons, most of them from Spencer Rattler. He recorded a season-high five receptions at Arkansas, a season-high 63 receiving yards versus Missouri and caught his lone TD pass of the year against South Carolina State. For the season, he has 19 receptions for 205 yards with one TD.

SON OF A COACH: **Nate Adkins**, the son of offensive line coach Greg Adkins, joined the team after graduating from East Tennessee State. Regarded as a tough, hard-nosed blocker, Adkins has also shown good hands and has a great understanding of the game. He has earned a start in seven games and has four catches for 28 yards.

TEASLEY STEPS IN: Citing minor health issues, offensive line coach **Greg Adkins** has not been with the squad on game day for several weeks. **Lonnie Teasley**, who was working as an offensive analyst, has assumed the offensive line coaching duties on an interim basis in Adkins' absence.

LINE SHUFFLE: The Gamecocks have some depth along the offensive line, which, along with some minor injuries, has translated into several different starting lineups up front. Carolina has used seven different starting offensive lines this season. Center **Eric Douglas** and right guard **Jovaughn Gwyn** are the only offensive linemen who have started every game this season.

THE O-LINE IS O-KAY: Carolina features an experienced offensive line with a combined 179 starts.

◆ **LT Jaylen Nichols** was the opening day starting left tackle. He has 16 career starts, five this season including the first two and the last three. He was named the co-SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Tennessee.

◆ **LT Jakai Moore** has started six games this season, five at left tackle and one (Tennessee) at left guard, and has 17 career starts.

◆ **LG Vershon Lee** has started 17 games in his career, nine last season and the first seven in 2022.

◆ **LG Trai Jones** became a starter for the first time versus Missouri and made three-straight starts.

◆ **OC Eric Douglas** makes the calls for the O-line. He has made 35 starts, including the last 34 in a row. He has appeared in 55 games in his career, fourth on the school's all-time list.

◆ **RG Jovaughn Gwyn** is the Gamecocks' top offensive lineman. He has made 45-consecutive starts, third on the school's all-time list. A 2021 team captain, he was named the SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week after the Kentucky win.

◆ **RT Dylan Wonnum** missed the second half of the season a year ago with a back injury. He started the first three games of 2022, two at right tackle and one at left tackle, but then missed the next two games with an injury before returning as the starter at right tackle for the last six contests. He has made 39 career starts. Brother, D.J., was a standout defensive end for Carolina and plays for the Minnesota Vikings.

◆ **RT Tyshawn Wannamaker** has started three games at right tackle in '22 and has 10 career starts.

Defense

CLAYTON'S CREW: Defensive coordinator **Clayton White** is a four-time nominee for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach. White's first foray in the SEC had Carolina allowing 24.0 points per game in 2021, down from 36.0 in 2020. The Gamecocks were especially strong in the secondary, ranking seventh in the country in pass defense while forcing 24 turnovers, including 15 picks. This season, the Gamecocks are a tick up, allowing 27.3 points per game but are second in the SEC with 11 interceptions, 30th in the country.

MISSING YOU: The Gamecock defense has had to overcome some key injuries with two starters, edge rusher **Jordan Strachan** and linebacker **Mohamed Kaba**, suffering season-ending ACL tears at Arkansas in game 2. Defensive back **David Spaulding** is also out for the remainder of the season after undergoing foot surgery. Edge rusher **Terrell Dawkins** underwent knee surgery after the Georgia game and has not played since.

THE RUN STOPS HERE: The interior of the defensive line is led by All-SEC candidate **Zach Pickens**. Pickens was the 2022 Rex Enright co-Player of the Spring for the defense. The senior has appeared in all 46 games over the past four seasons, making 31 starts. He was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2019. Pickens logged a career-high 12 stops at Arkansas and has 39 tackles overall.

EDGE JORDAN: EDGE rusher **Jordan Burch**, who was a high school teammate of Gamecock defensive tackle **Alex Huntley**, was the second-highest rated player to sign with Gamecocks, behind only Jadeveon Clowney. He notched a career-high 10 tackles at Arkansas and is third on the team with 53 stops, including 7.5 tackles for loss. He is second on the team with 3.5 sacks and has nine QB hurries.

EDMOND WRECKS 'EM: **Gilber Edmond** has been forced into more action with the injuries to **Jordan Strachan** and **Terrell Dawkins**. Edmond has responded with 34 tackles, including a team-high 8.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and is tied for the team lead with nine quarterback hurries.

TONKA TOYS WITH 'EM: **Tonka Hemingway** has a knack for the ball. He has recovered a pair of fumbles, has scored on a two-point conversion and caught a 16-yard pass on a fake field goal. He has a team-high 4.0 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss among his 27 stops.

GETTING IN THE SACK: Carolina has 17 sacks this season by nine different players, including six sacks in the win over Kentucky.

GREENE IS GOOD: Senior **Sherrod Greene** started 22 games for the Gamecocks in 2018 and 2019, and was the starter entering the 2020 season, but suffered a fracture in his hip in the opener against Tennessee and missed the remainder of the season. He was the starter again in 2021, but suffered a right ankle injury in game three at Georgia and missed the remainder of the season. He has logged 198 career tackles including 13.0 tackles for loss and owns 37 career starts, but had just eight tackles in four games in the 2020 and '21 seasons combined. He has registered 60 tackles, second on the squad, including 12 at Kentucky.

BRAD'S BACK: **Brad Johnson** is in his sixth year and his second at linebacker after transitioning from defensive end. Johnson was named a permanent team captain for the 2020 season. He has appeared in 57 contests, tying for second all-time, along with 25 starts. He was the defensive player of the game against Georgia State after recording five solo tackles and a quarterback hurry. His interception against Charlotte was a key play in the contest.



ALL-EVERYTHING: Cam Smith saw his name appear on nearly every All-America and All-SEC pre-season team and several watch lists. Though he rarely gets balls thrown in his direction, Smith has one pick this season and six in his career. He owns five PBUs in 2022 and blocked a field goal attempt at Florida.

RUSH HOUR: At 6-2 and 200 pounds, Darius Rush possesses the size and length that make him an intriguing pro prospect. The former wide receiver had his best game against Texas A&M when he led the team with eight tackles, returned an interception 59 yards to set up a score and forced a fumble along with a pass breakup, earning SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors. He logged his second INT of the year against Vanderbilt and has 6 PBUs.

NICK AT NIGHT: True freshman Nick Emmanwori, a local product from Irmo, S.C., was inserted into the lineup in the first series of the season following an injury to R.J. Roderick, and has played nearly every snap since. He became the first member of the freshman class of 2022 to earn a starting assignment. He has been in double-figures in tackles twice, logging 11 at Arkansas and a game- and career-high 14 versus Georgia, all solo stops. It was the most tackles by a Gamecock since Ernest Jones collected 18 tackles at Ole Miss in 2020. He leads the team with 72 tackles, including an SEC-leading 54 solo stops, the most among freshmen in the FBS. The last freshman to lead the Gamecocks in tackles was Skai Moore in 2013. Emmanwori was named to Midseason True Freshman All-America first-team unit as selected by both On3 and CollegeFootballNews (CFN) and is one of 14 players named semifinalists for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

SMITH IS WELL QUALIFIED: True freshman DQ Smith, another Columbia area product, has become a regular in the starting lineup. A lightly recruited quarterback in high school, Smith has quickly adapted to the secondary and has responded with 47 tackles, including a career-high nine vs. Tennessee, an interception, a sack, a forced fumble, two QB hurries and five pass breakups.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted three passes against both Charlotte and South Carolina State and have 11 on the season.

Special Teams

BLOCK THAT KICK: The Gamecocks have blocked a school-record five punts and one field goal this season. The six blocked kicks is the second-highest mark in school history, behind only the eight recorded in 1994. The Gamecocks have blocked 10 kicks in the last 24 games after logging just eight blocked kicks over the previous five years (2016-20) combined.

LEGETTE LEGS IT OUT: Xavier Legette was the SEC's Special Teams Player of the Week after returning the opening kick 100 yards against Texas A&M, the first by a Gamecock since Deebo Samuel went 90 yards at Ole Miss in 2018. X is averaging 31.5-yards per return which would rank second in FBS, but he is a couple returns shy of qualifying.

RESPECT FOR JETER: Mitch Jeter came into 2022 following in the footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two attempts. He is the only player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. He is a perfect 9-for-9 in FG attempts.

KAI CAN KICK: Junior Kai Kroeger is averaging 45.8 yards per punt this season, 10th in the country, and 43.8 yards per punt in his career. Of his 143 career punts, 34 have traveled 50 or more yards

with 53 inside the 20 and just nine touchbacks. **CAREER PUNTING AVERAGE (Min. 75 Punts)**

COBRA KAI: Kai Kroeger, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, has been listed on the "Ray's 8" six times this season. He was the National Punter of the Week for his efforts against Georgia State. He also made "Ray's 8" for his performance against Georgia, Texas A&M, Missouri, Vanderbilt and Florida. He was the SEC's co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Vanderbilt.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: Kai Kroeger owns the nation's third-longest punt this season, a career-long 79-yarder versus Georgia State. It was the longest punt for a Gamecock since Marty Simpson's 79-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Will Shipley ran for 128 yards and a touchdown and Clemson's defense smothered South Carolina for its seventh-straight win in the Palmetto State rivalry 30-0 on Saturday night.

The Tigers (9-3; No. 23 CFP) won their fifth straight this season and matched the longest win streak in the series that they set from 1934-40.

Clemson's defense limited South Carolina (6-6) to 206 yards, its second lowest output this season. It was the Tigers' first rivalry shutout since a 45-0 win in 1989 and its first time holding an opponent scoreless since a 49-0 win over The Citadel in 2020.

The Tigers outrushed the Gamecocks 265 to 43. "There's nothing more demoralizing than to have the ball run on you," Clemson offensive coordinator Tony Elliott said.

The lone drama at the end was whether South Carolina could put points on the board. With five seconds left, quarterback Zeb Noland ran 12 yards to the Clemson 3 before getting tackled by Jeremiah Trotter Jr.

Clemson's bench jumped from the sidelines to celebrate the shutout and the landmark win in a game that's the most anticipated sporting event in South Carolina each year.

"I want to apologize to our fans for that performance," first-year South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said after the program was shutout for the first time since a 28-0 loss to Virginia in the Belk Bowl three seasons ago. "It starts with me as head coach."

Shipley went past 100 yards for a second straight game and third time this season, the most by a Tigers freshman since his position coach, C.J. Spiller, had five such games in 2006.

Clemson had seen its chance at a seventh straight appearance in the Atlantic Coast Conference title game end with No. 24 North Carolina State's win over North Carolina on Friday night. The Tigers made sure they wouldn't lose their grip on the state against the Gamecocks.

D.J. Uiagalelei ran for 22 yards on third down to keep the Tigers' first drive going before Shipley broke free for a 29-yard touchdown run.

In the second quarter up 10-0, Clemson again called on its revived rushing attack - the Tigers ran for a season-best 333 yards a week ago in a 48-27 win over No. 21 Wake Forest - to wear down South Carolina.

Kobe Pace shot through the line for a twisting, 34-yard run to the end zone to extend the lead.

Uiagalelei struggled passing against South Carolina's defense as he went 9 of 19 for 99 yards with an interception. It was Uiagalelei's lowest passing output this season.

Clemson's defense, as it had done much of the year, guaranteed the offensive output would hold up.

South Carolina, which had beaten Florida and Auburn earlier this month, managed just 75 yards in the opening half. Quarterback Jason Brown threw for only 53 yards and was intercepted twice, both by cornerback Andrew Booth Jr.

Brown finished 8-of-19 passing for 67 yards and was replaced by Noland, the grad assistant coach turned quarterback, in the fourth quarter.

GAME CHANGER

Kobe Pace gave Clemson a 17-0 lead with 12:10 left in the first half on a 34-yard touchdown run. It was a seven-play, 79-yard drive that lasted 3:08. Pace had 58 of Clemson's 265 rushing yards on the night.



Shane Beamer, one of the rising stars among coaches in college football, begins his second season as the University of South Carolina's head coach in 2022. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks, coaching the placekickers, punters, and long snappers, and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2005.

Before joining the staff at Tennessee, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to South Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was both the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in Gamecock Football history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award, which goes annually to the nation's top assistant coach. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks that season, tying for the SEC lead and tying for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).



COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's special teams led the way toward a season-opening 35-14 victory over Georgia State on Saturday night.

Special teams have always been an emphasis for Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer, who watched his father, Frank, win game after game with "Beamer Ball," and its big special teams play.

The approach worked as the Gamecocks pulled away from Georgia State with 23 unanswered points in the second half.

The Gamecocks returned two blocked punts for touchdowns, new placekicker Mitch Jeter debuted by knocking two field goals of 50-plus yards and long snapper Hunter Rogers carried a fake field goal 5 yards for a first down that led to the Gamecocks' only first-half touchdown.

New quarterback Spencer Rattler took in a key two-point conversion in the third quarter to restore South Carolina's lead and it was just enough to squeak past a determined Panthers' squad that held a brief third-quarter advantage, 14-12.

The back-breaker also came in the third, when Rashad Amos blocked a Georgia State punt and DQ Smith retrieved the carom and ran it in for a touchdown.

Rattler showed off his dynamic playmaking ability. He finished 23 of 37 passing for 226 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

Following a scoreless first quarter, South Carolina sent out Jeter to attempt a 25-yard field goal. But special teams coordinator Pete Lembo's gang took over.

Long snapper Rogers took the snap and ran for just enough room for the first down. The Gamecocks lined up versatile tight end Jaheim Bell as a fullback at the goal line, then pitched to MarShawn Lloyd on the end-around for a touchdown.

A Rattler interception on the second play of the third quarter set up the Panthers' second score, a Grainger 4-yard rush to take a 14-12 lead. The Gamecocks immediately responded as Rattler hit Marshawn Lloyd for a 16-yard scoring pass to take the lead for good, 20-14.

Just over two minutes later, Rashad Amos blocked the punt and DQ Smith ran it back 26 yards for a 28-14 lead.

Later, Gamecocks' Traevon Kenion blocked a fourth-quarter punt and Ahmarean Brown took it 10 yards for the final score.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia State: The Panthers will cause a lot of trouble in the Sun Belt with their rushing attack. The Gamecocks' defense mostly held them in check, but GSU won't be playing the SEC anymore.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense had some creative play-calls and greatly benefited from having a talent like Rattler behind center. He escaped trouble with his legs to keep numerous plays alive. Yet its offensive line struggled to protect Rattler and the Gamecocks' runners finished with 79 yards.

THE RETURN

Lloyd was the Gamecocks' most hyped running back recruit in a decade but tore an ACL in the first week of preseason camp two years ago and missed the season. He played in 2021 but was still very much not back to full strength.

On Saturday, he rushed for 30 yards, caught two passes for 31 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CLOWNEY COMES HOME

South Carolina held a halftime ceremony to honor former All-American and No. 1 overall NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowney. Clowney's jersey No. 7 was added alongside the Gamecocks' four retired numbers, although his number will continue to be worn as per a 2007 university policy.

FAYETTEVILLE, ARK. (AP) — Darren McFadden and Felix Jones make for some serious company. Rocket Sanders can now say he's there with those all-time Arkansas running backs.

The Razorbacks' sophomore running back ran for a career-high 156 yards and two touchdowns in helping the No. 16 Razorbacks beat South Carolina 44-30 on Saturday.

Sanders joined McFadden, twice a Heisman Trophy finalist, and Jones, the player with the sixth-most yards rushing in school history, as the only three Arkansas players to run for 150 yards and two scores against the Gamecocks.

Sanders ran for 578 yards and five touchdowns in his first season last year. With returning starter Dominique Johnson still sidelined recovering from a knee injury suffered in the Outback Bowl, Sanders has taken nearly all of the first-team reps. The result has been a 2-0 start for his team and him becoming the first Razorbacks player since 2019 with back-to-back 100-yard games.

Sanders scored the first two touchdowns of the game as Arkansas (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) found the end zone on each of its first three possessions against South Carolina and opened a 21-3 lead. The Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1) responded with two straight scores at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second to pull within 21-16.

Sanders wouldn't score again as KJ Jefferson was the keystone for a bulk of the Razorbacks' second-half touchdowns, but he ran for 95 of his 156 yards in the final 30 minutes.

Arkansas ran for 295 yards, and AJ Green and Rashod Dubinion also chipped in touchdowns.

"I was really proud of our offensive line. We asked them to kind of control the game and I felt like they did. I think the offensive line wore them down," Pittman said.

Jefferson led a 14-play, 59-yard drive capped with his own 2-yard rushing touchdown at the start of the fourth quarter to move Arkansas back ahead by two scores. South Carolina lost a fumble on its next possession and Jefferson added a touchdown pass to Warren Thompson in response, ultimately putting the Gamecocks too far behind to rally.

Spencer Rattler tried. The Oklahoma transfer threw for 377 yards and a touchdown on 24 of 39 passing with a touchdown for South Carolina, but was intercepted in the end zone midway through the fourth quarter by Dwight McGlothern. The Gamecocks had three turnovers.

Jefferson was 18 of 21 passing for 162 yards and a touchdown. He ran for another 67 yards and the score on 19 carries.

"I thought he played better today than he did last week. I thought he was more accurate," Pittman said. "I thought he was in total control. ... He pretty much can take over the game when he wants to."

Johnson is expected to return in Week 3 against Missouri State. He might find himself short on carries as Sanders' development has put the sophomore in high company.

"I think he's becoming an all-around back a little bit more," Pittman said. "I thought he played really, really well. Two 100-yard days back-to-back is pretty good. He's a better back than he was a year ago."

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks had moments, but consistency was lacking in coach Shane Beamer's second year.

Arkansas: The Razorbacks' defense held up well without two starters in the secondary, including former freshman All-American Jalen Catalon.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE

Arkansas' win over South Carolina was the Razorbacks' first since 2011. The teams had met only three times since before Saturday with the Gamecocks winning each.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Stetson Bennett went 16 for 23 for 284 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another score as No. 1 Georgia beat South Carolina 48-7 on Saturday.

The Bulldogs (3-0) nearly had a second shutout of the season in their Southeastern Conference opener, but the backups allowed a touchdown pass with 53 seconds to go.

Georgia has allowed just 10 points this season and the garbage-time score was the first offensive touchdown it gave up in its past five regular-season games.

South Carolina (1-2) started 0-2 in the SEC for the fourth straight year.

The Georgia offense scored on eight of its first nine drives, gaining 551 yards and averaging nearly 10 yards a play before putting in the backups in the fourth quarter.

Tight end Brock Bowers had five catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for a score. Georgia let 10 players carry the ball, rushing for 212 yards. Bennett didn't play the final 23 minutes of the game.

The Bulldogs' defensive line overwhelmed by South Carolina's front. A defender was in quarterback Spencer Rattler's face almost every time he dropped back more than three steps. The Oklahoma transfer got off just three deep balls, with two of them intercepted. He didn't play in the fourth quarter and was 13 of 25 for 118 yards.

The 41-point victory was Georgia's biggest against the Gamecocks in their 75 meetings. It was South Carolina's worst loss since a 56-6 defeat to Florida in 2008.

THE TAKEAWAY

Georgia: Struggles against teams like South Carolina used to define the Bulldogs. At one point when Steve Spurrier was Gamecocks coach in the early 2010s, South Carolina won four of five in the series. But after Saturday's win, Georgia has won 15 of its last 16 over SEC East teams and hasn't lost to an unranked team since the Gamecocks beat them 20-17 in double overtime in 2019.

South Carolina: Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer appears to be breathing life into a program that had lost 13 of its last 16 when he took over in 2021, but there is still a big gap to the best. In his second season, Beamer is 0-4 against Top 25 teams, losing by an average of nearly 24 points.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Marshawn Lloyd ran for a career-high 169 yards and three touchdowns as South Carolina scored on its first eight possessions to put away Charlotte 56-20 on Saturday night.

The win ended a two-game losing streak for the Gamecocks (2-2) — and was a welcome performance for an offense stuck near the bottom of the Southeastern Conference this season.

Lloyd had scoring runs of 25, 14 and 7 yards, the first two that left fans' jaws dropped and Charlotte defenders in disbelief.

On the first, Lloyd cleanly hurdled safety Wayne Jones in the open field on the way to the end zone. On his second, Lloyd was stood up for what looked like a short gain before breaking free to put South Carolina ahead 28-14.

Lloyd had some help on the last, converting after Gamecocks linebacker Brad Johnson intercepted Charlotte's Chris Reynolds deep in 49ers territory. Lloyd calmly found the end zone a final time and finished with South Carolina's most rushing yards since Kevin Harris gained 182 against North Carolina in its 38-21 Duke's Mayo Bowl victory last New Year's Eve.

Charlotte (1-4) of Conference USA entered with the country's 30th best passing attack at 289 yards a game and the one of the worst rushing defenses (129 out of 131) in the NCAA at 243 yards allowed per game. Both were evident at South Carolina.

The Gamecocks picked up 161 yards on the ground to score on all four of their first-half possessions. But the 49ers were largely on target behind sixth-year quarterback Chris Reynolds, converting their first seven third downs and throwing for 132 yards to keep things close at the half, 20-14.

South Carolina finished with a season-best 545 yards of offense.

The Gamecocks' run of points each series ended when backup quarterback Luke Doty was intercepted by Jones — yes, the one who was hurdled by Lloyd — with 8:22 left in the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

Charlotte: The 49ers lost both Power Five games they've played this season, falling at Maryland, 56-21, before the South Carolina blowout. Charlotte has a face-paced attack behind Reynolds that had the Gamecocks defense on its heels in the first half. The school does leave with \$1.4 million in guarantees for playing at Williams-Brice Stadium.

South Carolina: There are still plenty of things to fix for the Gamecocks. This is certainly a start to gaining confidence and momentum once they return to SEC play in two weeks. The offense was efficient and powerful and the defense, after a sluggish first half, got three second-half interceptions that South Carolina turned into points.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler threw two touchdown passes and ran for a score in South Carolina's 50-10 victory over South Carolina State in a game moved from Saturday to Thursday night because of Hurricane Ian.

Rattler finished with 212 yards, completing 21 of 27 passes including a 5-yard scoring strike to tailback MarShawn Lloyd and an 11-yarder to tight end Austin Stogner, his teammate at Oklahoma, to help South Carolina (3-2) rout the FCS Bulldogs (1-3).

Administrators at both schools agreed to the change because of the hurricane's approach. Ian moved through Florida into the Atlantic and was expected to re-enter land in the Palmetto State as a Category 1 storm Friday.

Many parking areas were half-filled at best and the normal, Southeastern Conference-style tailgating setups were absent for this one. South Carolina said 61,551 were at Williams-Brice Stadium, which lists a capacity of 77,559. But the upper decks were largely empty and it wasn't a stretch to think only about the announced crowd came out.

The Gamecocks overcame a sluggish start, including two interceptions off Rattler's receivers' hands, to take control in the opening half.

The Gamecocks broke through on Rattler's first-quarter TD toss to Lloyd, which was followed by a funky, "swinging gate" formation on a successful two-point conversion by defensive lineman Tonka Hemingway.

South Carolina pulled out the wishbone on its next touchdown, a 1-yard handoff to versatile tight end Jaheim Bell. Rattler ran his way to a score from 6 yards out with 37 seconds left in the half to put Gamecocks up 22-0.

South Carolina State of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference had more penalty yards than offensive yards, 112 to 83, in the first 30 minutes. The Bulldogs got their only touchdown on Tyrece Nick's 1-yard touchdown run right after halftime, ending a drought where they had gone three straight quarters without points.

Nick accounted for 158 of the Bulldogs' 220 yards of offense.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs had lost their earlier FBS game, 56-10 at UCF to open the season. They certainly put up a better showing in their home state — the campuses are located about 40 miles apart — and leave with \$500,000 for playing at Williams-Brice.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks got their run game going a week ago in a 56-20 win over Charlotte when they rushed for 295 yards. This time, they got Rattler and the passing game on track. Both will be needed when they return to SEC play at No. 7 Kentucky next week.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — Spencer Rattler overcame two early turnovers and threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, Jalen Brooks ran for an insurance score midway through the fourth and South Carolina scored 17 unanswered points to beat No. 13 Kentucky 24-14 on Saturday night for its third consecutive victory.

Kentucky started freshman Kaiya Sheron at quarterback in place of injured senior Will Levis, who wore a protective on his left foot.

MarShawn Lloyd scored a 2-yard touchdown run on the Gamecocks' first snap, immediately after Kentucky's Chris Rodriguez Jr. fumbled on the opening play. That quickly seized momentum against the Wildcats (3-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference).

South Carolina (4-2, 1-2) moved ahead early in the third quarter, when Rattler (14 of 19, 177 yards) hit Antwane Wells Jr. in the flat and the junior darted past a defender for a 42-yard touchdown and 14-7 lead.

Mitch Jeter's 32-yard field goal later in the period provided a 10-point cushion that Brooks extended to 17 points with a 24-yard TD run with 7:02 remaining.

Sheron (15 of 27, 178 yards) tossed a 10-yard TD pass JuTahn McClain with 2:49 left, his second of the game, but the Wildcats fell for the second consecutive week in league play.

Mystery preceded this defeat as Levis entered Kroger Field with a boot on his left foot and did not participate in warmups with teammates. Earlier this week, Kentucky coach Mark Stoops referred to a finger injury Levis sustained in last week's 22-19 loss to No. 9 Mississippi, but didn't mention any foot injury and remained mum on the quarterback's status on Thursday.

Disaster quickly followed with Rodriguez's fumble, a blocked punt and Matt Ruffolo's missed 45-yard field goal that bounced off the left upright. Sheron regrouped to fake a toss to Rodriguez and hit wide-open Jordan Dingle for the tying touchdown in the second quarter, but Kentucky was held to its lowest output since losing 30-13 to top-ranked Georgia 30-13 last season.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Gifted with a turnover on the first snap, the Gamecocks converted but couldn't reach the end zone until the third quarter. Rattler fumbled on a sack and was intercepted, but found a groove with short passes that turned into big gains. The defense limited Sheron's passing options after the TD to earn a much-needed win.

Kentucky: Offensive falloff was to be expected without Levis, but the Wildcats quickly dug a hole with a first-play fumble and special teams failures. Other than Sheron, the offense stalled. More puzzling were the defensive breakdowns that allowed Rattler to pick them apart, which is not good with red-hot Mississippi State up next.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina opened strong with 17 points in the first six minutes — sparked when Xavier Legette took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown — then held on to beat Texas A&M 30-24 on Saturday night.

The Gamecocks (5-2, 2-2 Southeastern Conference) returned the opening kickoff for a touchdown and turned a fumble and interception deep in Aggies territory into 10 more points and a 17-0 hole for Texas A&M (3-4, 1-3) just over five minutes in.

It's the first time the Gamecocks have beaten the Aggies since the SEC made them their Western Division rival in 2014 and the first time they've won four in a row since 2013, shaking off a 48-7 loss to No. 1 Georgia in the third game of the season.

"A month ago, I was asked if this team quit. That look like this team has quit?" South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said.

MarShawn Lloyd ran 18 times for 92 yards and had both of South Carolina's touchdowns in the second half to keep Texas A&M from climbing back in it.

Spencer Rattler was 12-of-25 passing for 168 yards for South Carolina. "We never quit. We keep fighting. That's what we are about," Rattler said.

Devon Achane ran 20 times for 99 yards for the Aggies. Hayes King was 17-of-32 passing for 178 yards, with a touchdown and an interception before leaving with an injury to his throwing shoulder in the fourth quarter. Coach Jimbo Fisher said he kept Hayes out of the rest of the game as a precaution.

Freshman Conner Weigman filled in and threw for 91 yards but neither of his two final Hail Mary tries made it to the end zone after Texas A&M recovered an onside kick at midfield with nine seconds left.

The loss puts even more pressure on Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher, whose team started the season ranked No. 6. The Aggies seem to play just under the level of their opponents, losing by six to South Carolina, four to No. 6 Alabama and three to Appalachian State.

"We have good players. We're right there, it's not like we're getting ran out of the stadium," Fisher said. "We've just got to find a way to make a play or two — all the sudden you will get over the hump. It's just the way it goes."

With a contract through 2031 paying him \$9 million a year, Fisher's job likely isn't in jeopardy. However, losing to South Carolina has been bad for several SEC coaches. Phillip Fulmer for Tennessee in 2008, Will Muschamp in 2014 and Dan Mullen in 2021 all lost their jobs shortly after losing to the Gamecocks.

THE TAKEAWAY

Texas A&M: Plenty of people expected the Aggies to challenge Alabama in the SEC West this season. Instead, it looks like a struggle to get to six wins and a bowl game. A win over UMass is probable. After that the Aggies need two wins out of four games — Ole Miss, Florida, at Auburn and at LSU.

South Carolina: Gamecocks fans chanted "Beamer Ball" during a late-game timeout in appreciation of second-year coach Shane Beamer. The Gamecocks only need to beat Missouri or Vanderbilt in the next two weeks to make a second straight bowl. And with the win, South Carolina has beaten every team in the current SEC.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Brady Cook ran for a touchdown and directed three long, first-half scoring drives as Missouri built a 17-0 lead on the way to its fourth straight win over No. 25 South Carolina, 23-10, on Saturday night.

Receiver Dominic Lovett had career highs with 10 catches for 148 yards while the Tigers' defense had 11 tackles behind the line of scrimmage and held the Gamecocks (5-3, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) to 203 total yards. The Tigers (4-4, 2-3) won their second straight after starting league play 0-3.

Missouri beat a ranked opponent for the first time since its 45-41 win over No. 17 LSU on Oct. 10, 2020.

It ended the Gamecocks four-game win streak — and also ended their stay in the national rankings after getting in this past week for the first time in four years.

Cook proved a steady hand against a South Carolina defense that was active and opportunistic in beating No. 19 Kentucky on Oct. 8 and Texas A&M last week.

Cook led a 15-play, 96-yard scoring drive that took up most of the first quarter and which he ended with his 3-yard burst to the end zone.

The Tigers went on another lengthy drive on their next possession, this one going 84 yards in 10 plays and finishing with Cody Schrader's 1-yard run.

Missouri looked to make it three-straight touchdown drives as it had a first-and-goal on the South Carolina 3. But the Gamecocks forced Cook into a couple of incompletes before settling for Harrison Mevis' 19-yard field goal and a 17-0 lead.

The Gamecocks could not dig themselves out of that hole and finished with its fewest points since losing to No. 1 Georgia 48-7 on Sept. 17.

Quarterback Spencer Rattler scored the team's lone touchdown on a 7-yard run right before halftime.

Rattler passed for just 146 yards with an interception and a fumble deep in Tigers' territory. Tailback MarShawn Lloyd, who ran for 451 yards and seven TDs as South Carolina won its past four, had just 30 yards on seven attempts.

Mevis added field goals of 50 and 32 yards for Missouri in the second half.

THE TAKEAWAY

Missouri: The Tigers moved the ball consistently on offense and were dominant on defense to totally take apart South Carolina. If Missouri can keep Cook protected and continue its defensive success on third downs (the Gamecocks converted just 5 of 13 chances), it will be in every game down the stretch.

South Carolina: All the good things the Gamecocks had gained on offense and defense during their four-game winning streak went up in smoke against Missouri. They'll have to get right in a hurry to reach a bowl game. After a trip to Vanderbilt, they finish with an Orange Crush of Florida, No. 3 Tennessee and No. 5 Clemson.

NASHVILLE, TENN. (AP) — Spencer Rattler threw three touchdown passes and South Carolina became bowl-eligible with its sixth win of the season, a 38-27 victory over Vanderbilt on Saturday night.

Rattler threw a 29-yard TD pass to Xavier Legette, a 19-yard TD to Josh Vann and a 17-yard TD to Antwane Wells.

The Gamecocks (6-3, 3-3 Southeastern Conference) won their 14th straight game over the Commodores (3-6, 0-5).

South Carolina built a commanding 31-14 halftime lead and handed Vanderbilt its fifth straight loss.

The Commodores suffered their 26th consecutive SEC defeat despite a career-high 167 rushing yards from senior running back Ray Davis, a Temple transfer.

South Carolina scored 10 points off turnovers in the first quarter.

Darius Rush intercepted an underthrown pass by AJ Swann at the Gamecocks 30-yard line, setting up the game's first touchdown.

Five plays later, Legette got behind the coverage in the middle of the end zone for a 29-yard scoring strike from Rattler to give South Carolina a 7-0 lead.

The teams traded long TD passes before Swann fumbled during a sack at the Commodores 17, setting up Mitch Jeter's 31-yard field goal which extended the Gamecocks' lead to 17-7 with 21 seconds left in the first quarter.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks' offense rambled for 492 yards and never trailed. South Carolina faces a difficult finish with games against Florida, No. 2 Tennessee and No. 5 Clemson.

Vanderbilt: Defense continues to be a problem for the Commodores, who have allowed 38 or more points in four of their last five games. Three tough games remain for Vanderbilt: Kentucky, Florida and Tennessee.

TEMPERS FLARE

Gamecocks cornerback Cam Smith and Commodores wide receiver Will Sheppard were flagged with personal fouls after getting into a shoving match with 37 seconds left in the first half. Players from both teams surrounded Smith and Sheppard during the scuffle.

GAINESVILLE, FLA. (AP) — Montrell Johnson Jr. ran for a career-high 161 yards and a touchdown, Anthony Richardson accounted for three scores in what might have been his final home game at Florida and the Gators steamrolled South Carolina 38-6 on Saturday.

Florida (6-4, 3-4 Southeastern Conference) avenged an ugly loss to the Gamecocks last season, won consecutive league games for the first time in nearly two years and became bowl eligible in coach Billy Napier's first season.

The Gators dominated from the start, scoring on their first four drives and leading 24-0 before South Carolina (6-4, 3-4) crossed midfield. Richardson opened the drubbing with a 3-yard run and doubled the lead with a 15-yard strike to Ricky Pearsall. Freshman Trevor Etienne had the play of the game: an 85-yard TD run that made it 21-0 late in the first quarter.

South Carolina's third quarter was somehow worse than its first. Coach Shane Beamer's team fumbled three times in its first four snaps out of the locker room, gift-wrapping three short fields for Florida that resulted in a missed field goal, a touchdown and a turnover on downs.

Florida's defense played its best game of the season, with the highlight coming when 415-pound defensive tackle Desmond Watson ripped the ball out of Jaheim Bell's arms and rambled 8 yards the other way. Watson was so tired that he barely celebrated when he reached teammates eagerly awaiting his arrival on the sideline.

Nonetheless, it was just the start of an hours-long party for the Gators, who finished with 374 yards rushing.

Richardson completed 11 of 23 passes for 112 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran for 96 yards and a score. Etienne finished with 100 yards on the ground.

At one point, Florida had three guys with at least 100 yards rushing — a feat last accomplished by the Gators in 1984. But Richardson lost 6 yards on a sack in the fourth before heading to the bench.

Little went right for South Carolina, which played without running back MarShawn Lloyd (thigh bruise).

FAKE PUNT

South Carolina's lone highlight was a fake punt late in the second quarter. Punter Kai Kroeger took the snap and connected with Dakereon Joyner for a 48-yard score. Joyner was all alone on the right side of the field and had one guy to beat, receiver Xzavier Henderson, for the touchdown.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler had the best day of his unpredictable career, throwing for 438 yards and six touchdowns as South Carolina beat No. 5 Tennessee 63-38 on Saturday night, all but eliminating the Volunteers from the playoffs.

Tennessee (9-2, 6-2 Southeastern, No. 5 CFP) may have also lost Heisman Trophy candidate Hendon Hooker, who left the game in the fourth quarter with a leg injury, falling and fumbling without being hit.

Even before the injury, the quarterback of the night was Rattler, who went from Heisman contender to the bench at Oklahoma in 2021.

The junior came into the night with nine interceptions and eight touchdowns and averaging 198 yards a game passing. There were questions about whether the Gamecocks (7-4, 4-4) might want to test out the backup.

But Rattler was patient in the pocket, dropping passes into the narrowest of windows. He completed 30 of 37 passes and ran when he had to with five carries for 16 yards. And he even caught a pass in the red zone from Dakeron Joyner, who South Carolina typically uses as a running threat under center.

"He was on. You talk about players and being in the zone," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said.

Rattler's best day before Saturday was 387 yards against Kansas State for Oklahoma in 2020 and five TDs for the Sooners against Western Carolina in 2021.

Antwane Wells Jr. caught 11 passes for 177 yards and Josh Vann and Jaheim Bell each caught two touchdowns for the Gamecocks. Joyner had two rushing scores.

"Our whole mindset going into this game was attack. You weren't going to win this game punting on fourth down," said Beamer, whose team converted both of its fourth down tries and were 8 of 11 on third down.

The Tennessee defense could do almost nothing to stop the 11th best offense in the SEC. The Gamecocks gained 606 yards after failing to get over 300 yards in three of their past four games.

The 63 points were the most the Vols have ever allowed in an SEC game, eclipsing the 62-37 loss to Steve Spurrier's Florida in 1995.

"This one needs to hurt," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said at his news conference under the stands as shouts of "Game!" "Cocks!" could be heard from students who rushed the field.

Hooker was 25 of 42 for 247 yards and three TDs before his injury. He didn't have his typical crisp game, overthrowing receivers and missing a few wide open throws. There was no immediate word on the severity of his hurt leg, but he did not return to the game.

SAND(STORM) THE FIELD

Beamer said before the game his youngest daughter Olivia texted him and said all she wanted for Christmas was to storm the field.

Sure enough, South Carolina fans rushed out of the stands after the win. It was so chaotic, Beamer couldn't find her. But he remembered.

"Santa will certainly bring you something, but Mom and I are certainly out of presents," Beamer said.

THE TAKEAWAY

Tennessee: A promising season for Tennessee imploded when the defense could not make a stop. South Carolina scored touchdowns on nine of 11 drives. One of the unsuccessful ones was a one-play drive that ended the first half.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks beat a Top 5 team for only the seventh time. It was their biggest win since knocking off No. 2 Georgia 20-17 in 2019 in double overtime. The 63 points were the most in an SEC game by the Gamecocks since they beat Mississippi State 65-39 in 1995.
