GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- Tonight marks the eighth-straight season the Gamecocks have played a top-20 opponent within their first three outings. South Carolina is 6-1 in the previous seven such games, just two of which were at home. Six of the eight seasons saw the game come in the first two games, like tonight, with the Gamecocks posting a 5-0 mark in those.
- Head coach Dawn Staley watched her team share the ball all summer, and the habit carried over to the season opener with 20 assists on 37 made field goals against ETSU.
- Reigning National Player of the Year Aliyah Boston picked up where she left off in 2022, posting an 11-point, 11-rebound double-double in just 20 minutes against ETSU.
- Two-time honorable mention All-American Zia Cooke started her senior season hot with 6-of-12 shooting for a team-high 17 points against ETSU.
- Spurred by her first appearance on the Naismith Trophy Watch List, Brea Beal launched into her senior season with a first quarter of four points, three rebounds and three blocks in just seven minutes.
- South Carolina's two true freshman traded in their McDonald's All-America high school senior seasons for a solid collegiate debut. Talaysia Cooper and Ashlyn Watkins combined for 16 points, 5 rebounds, two blocks, four assists and three steals against East Tennessee State (Nov. 7) with neither playing more than 20 minutes.
- Throughout the summer and preseason, Staley had just a handful of practices with all 13 Gamecocks fully available thanks to Aliyah Boston and Laeticia Amihere competing with their national teams around the FIBA World Cup and the injury recovery of graduate transfer Kierra Fletcher and redshirt-freshman Raven Johnson.

A Perennial Power

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 11 seasons, including five 30-win seasons in the last eight campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four four times in the last seven NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 and 2022 National Championships. They have been ranked in every AP Poll since Dec. 10, 2012, including a top-10 position every week since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Gamecocks have amassed 45 AP No. 1 rankings all-time, becoming just the sixth program with at least 40 top entries in that poll. Since the start of the 2019-20 season, South Carolina has been atop the poll 33 times – over three times more than any other team in that time.

Under head coach Dawn Staley's leadership, eight Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 17 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Nine Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last seven years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick Aja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020, 2022).

The Maryland Series

While this series began in the 1997-98 season, it became a regular matchup at the start of the 2017-18 campaign. The Gamecocks lead the overall series 3-2.

In the last four meetings, all of which have been top-15 matchups, South Carolina is 3-1, including a pair of wins in College Park – both by single digits. Tonight's game is the second time the two have met in the second game of the season. The first was the most recent meeting in College Park – Nov. 10, 2019, when then-No. 8 South Carolina upset then-No. 4 Maryland 63-54.

Seniors Aliyah Boston and Zia Cooke thrived in their previous two games against the Terps, averaging 15.0 points each with Boston adding 6.0 blocks per game as well. Senior Brea Beal grabbed 10 rebounds in each of her two games against Maryland, handing out 2.5 assists per game in the series as well.

Road Ready

The Gamecocks are 286-260 all-time in road games, including a 111-46 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. Her .707 winning percentage on the road is the best in program history.

Ranked Readings

Against ranked opponents, South Carolina is 99-66 (.600) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure.

Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 84-27 (.757) against ranked teams, including a 36-6 mark since the start of the 2019-20 season.

Senior Aliyah Boston has thrived in her 42 career games against ranked opponents, averaging 15.2 points, 12.3 rebounds and 3.0 blocks while shooting 53.0 percent. Senior Zia Cooke's offense is not far behind with her 13.7 points per game in those 42 outings.

Ranking Review

The Gamecocks opened this season atop both the AP and the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Polls for the third time in as many seasons.

In the AP Poll, the Gamecocks' 44 total weeks at No. 1 make them just the sixth program all-time to sit atop that

TEAM THEME: DNA

poll at least 40 times. South Carolina has appeared in each of the last 188 AP Polls, giving it the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, which dates back to Dec. 10, 2012. It has spent the last 57 of those weeks ranked in the top 10.

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll. It has been No. 1 in that poll 30 times in the last nine seasons.

The Staley File

In her 22nd season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .744 (539-185) winning percentage, which ranks 13th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience (sixth among Power 5 conference coaches). The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

In her 15th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (367) with a program-record 11 postseason appearances (10 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for all four of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022) and the first NCAA National Championship in program history (2017).

After claiming six SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 167 SEC games, the most among active league coaches and third all-time – trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her 11.9 SEC wins average is the best in league history among coaches with more than one year in the league, and her .752 SEC winning percentage (167-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history.

Oh Captain, My Captain

For the third time in as many seasons, senior Victoria Saxton and junior Aliyah Boston will serve as team captains. It is Saxton's fourth season in that position.

Senior SZN

Now in its senior season, South Carolina's first No. 1 signing class – Laeticia Amihere, Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Zia Cooke, Olivia Thompson – has shaped the program from the moment those five freshmen gathered on campus.

In careers affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, the group has reached the Final Four in both their NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning the 2022 National Championship, and has never been ranked outside the top 10. With a combined 94-8 record, they have won 92.2 percent of their games, including a 37-5 mark against nationally ranked opponents.

In SEC action, the class has lost a total of just three league games en route to two regular-season titles (2020, 2022). They have played in three SEC Tournament championship games, claiming the title in two of those (2020, 2021).

The 2022-23 Gamecocks

South Carolina returns four of its five starters among its 10 returning letterwinners from the 2022 National Championship team, and head coach Dawn Staley added a pair of top-20 signees in Ashlyn Watkins (No. 12) and Talaysia Cooper (No. 18) to this season's roster, along with Georgia Tech transfer Kierra Fletcher. The 2022-23 season is the senior campaign for Staley's first-ever No. 1 ranked signing class, headlined by 2022 National

Player of the Year Aliyah Boston and two-time All-SEC and honorable mention All-America guard Zia Cooke. Stalwart defender Brea Beal, versatile forward Laeticia Amihere and local favorite Olivia Thompson are also part of that Class of 2019 signing class.

Fifth-year senior Victoria Saxton returned for her extra season of eligibility to shore up the Gamecocks' dominant frontcourt, which also features a more dominant Kamilla Cardoso. Sophomores Sania Feagin (forward) and Bree Hall (guard) look to make their mark more regularly in their second season, and redshirt freshman Raven Johnson will battle Fletcher to take over the point guard position left vacant by WNBA draft pick Destanni Henderson.

The (Watch List) Watcher

The Gamecocks have been omnipresent on national award watch lists this preseason. Three are on the Naismith Trophy preseason list and four of the five positional award preseason watch lists include at least one Gamecock.

One of the three Naismith watch list entries, Zia Cooke is once again on the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award list. She was a finalist for the award that honors the nation's top shooting guard in 2021.

Brea Beal made her debut on the Naismith Watch List and was listed among those on the list for the best small forward in the nation, the Cheryl Miller Award.

Power forwards Victoria Saxton and Sania Feagin were selected to the watch list for the Katrina McClain Award.

Reigning National Player of the Year Aliyah Boston is on the Naismith watch list and is looking for a sweep of the Lisa Leslie Award as the top center in the country after winning the award each of her previous three seasons.

Preseason Predictions

As the reigning national champion, the Gamecocks are atop both preseason polls by a near unanimous decision. South Carolina claimed all 30 No. 1 votes in the Associated Press Poll. In the USA Today Coaches Poll, 30 of the 32 votes went to the Gamecocks.

South Carolina opened and closed the 2021-22 season atop both polls. The Gamecocks have been No. 1 in the AP poll 33 times since the start of the 2019-20 season, more than three times as many weeks as second place on the list, Stanford. South Carolina has been in the AP top five for a nation-leading 52 of the 57 polls in that same time period.

The Gamecocks were also selected to repeat as SEC Regular-Season Champions by both the media and league coaches in preseason voting.

Opponent Files

The Gamecocks' schedule includes six games against teams ranked in both the national preseason polls with four of those coming in non-conference action. The 2022-23 campaign also includes eight other opponents that received votes in one or both preseason polls.

Rebounding Roundup

South Carolina was among the top rebounding teams in the country in 2021-22 and doesn't look to drop off this season. The Gamecocks' +17.7 rebounding margin led the nation last season, and they were third in rebounding average with a school-record 47.9 per game.

The Gamecocks return 84.1 percent of that rebounding, including 88.7 percent of offensive boards.

Early this season, South Carolina's +29.0 rebounding margin is fifth in the nation, and their 56.0 rebounding average is 12th.

Dial Up the Defense

Head coach Dawn Staley has always put a premium on defense, but the Gamecocks have taken it to another level over the previous three seasons, during which opponents have scored just 54.7 points per game.

Last season's program-record low 50.7 points per game ranked third in the nation and helped the Gamecocks lead the nation in scoring margin (+20.2). South Carolina was second in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.332) and first in blocked shots per game (7.4).

No team reached its scoring average against the Gamecocks last season, including some of the SEC and the nation's most prolific offenses, and only three came within single digits of it – Missouri (Dec. 30), Mississippi State (Jan. 2), vs. Kentucky (Mar. 6).

Paint Production

South Carolina has long dominated the paint with both guards and post players taking advantage of the high percentage shots.

Over the previous three seasons, the Gamecocks scored 53.0 percent of their points in the paint. The 2019-20 team had the highest paint points average (42.4 ppg), but the 2020-21 teams posted the highest percentage of paint points (55.1%). Last season, South Carolina's 37.4 paint points per game accounted for 52.7 percent of its total offense.

So far this season, the Gamecocks netted 58 of their 101 points from the paint. Post players accounted for 38 of those interior points (.655).

For the Record

As a team, the Gamecocks set 11 program records in 2021-22, mostly in the rebounding category.

South Carolina's 1,771 total rebounds, 635 offensive rebounds and 1,136 defensive rebounds were all new program records, as was its 47.9 rebounds per game. The team's +17.7 rebounding margin overall and in SEC play were both program records, and its 48.9 rebounds per SEC game set a new record as well.

With defense as its calling card all season, South Carolina held opponents to a program-record low 50.7 points per game last season.

The Gamecocks' record also reset a few program records with 35 wins and 14 wins over ranked opponents topping the charts.

Individually, Aliyah Boston carved her name into the Gamecock record books 17 times last season, including her SEC-record 27 consecutive double-doubles.

On the glass, Boston set new South Carolina marks for offensive rebounds in a game (12 vs. North Carolina, 3/25/22); total rebounds (462), offensive rebounds (150) and defensive rebounds (312) in a season; and in total rebounds (212), rebounding average (13.3), offensive rebounds (59) and defensive rebounds (143) in SEC regular-season games.

Boston's program-record 30 double-doubles last season include a record 16 in SEC action. She moved into the program record for career double-doubles in SEC games (32) as well.

Her program-record 57 blocks in SEC play last season included the program's first double-digit blocks game in SEC action (10 vs. Georgia, 1/21/21).

Offensively, Boston posted the program's best perfect shooting game, going 13-for-13 against NC A&T on Nov. 29, 2021

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last eight seasons. With nearly 10,000 season tickets sold this season that streak looks to continue for another year.

The Gamecocks has had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for six straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season).

Excluding the COVID limited-attendance season of 2020-21, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans 97 consecutive regular-season games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.

Everybody's All-American

On the Gamecocks' 13-woman roster, nine were McDonald's All-Americans in high school – Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Kamilla Cardoso, Zia Cooke, Talaysia Cooper, Sania Feagin, Bree Hall, Raven Johnson and Ashlyn Watkins.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 20 McDonald's All-Americans, including 16 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen.

2023 Signing Class

South Carolina's 2023 signing class got off to a hot start on Wednesday with three top-40 players making their future with the Gamecocks official. The highest ranked of the three, #17 Chloe Kitts, will arrive earlier than the rest as she plans to enroll at the University for the Spring 2023 semester.

Kitts (Oviedo, Fla./DME Academy) is a 6-foot-2 forward ranked 17th in the class. The Max Preps Junior All-American helped DME Academy to a bid in the GEICO Nationals in 2022 with her 18.7 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. She also helped USA Basketball to gold in the 2022 FIBA U18 Americas Championship with 7.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game in just 16.2 minutes per game in the tournament.

Five-foot-10 guard Tessa Johnson clocks in at #25 in the 2023 class after her 23.4 points and 3.9 assists per game helped Saint Michael Albertville (Minn.) to a 2022 Class 4A state runner-up finish.

Sahnnya Jah played three seasons at Bishop McNamara in Forestville, Md., to rise to #40 in the class. The 6-foot-1 wing is long and versatile with range and the ability to impact the game on both sides of the ball."

In women's basketball, Colonial Life Arena has become one of the most feared places to play as enormous crowds fill the building with passion for the Gamecocks.

The state of South Carolina has rallied around head coach Dawn Staley's program in unprecedented numbers as the Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last seven seasons. The Gamecocks were one of a few programs to finish the 2019-20 season averaging over 10,000 fans and boast six sellouts (18,000) in the last six seasons of full capacity arenas.

Colonial Life Arena is more than just the home of South Carolina men's and women's basketball, though. It is also a thriving entertainment venue that the city of Columbia and its surrounding metropolitan area are able to enjoy throughout the year.

Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10th-largest on-campus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.

In Summer 2017, a 12-display center-hung video board and ribbon boards were added to the arena bowl at a cost of \$4.2 million. The center-hung board features four convex-curved main displays that measure approximately 12' x 20' and can show any combination of live video, instant replays, statistics and game information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Paul McCartney, country superstars Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift, WWE Wrestling, Kanye West and numerous other acts.

The largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet, the Arena has an intimate double-deck design that puts every seat close to the action. The cantilever of the upper deck over the lower deck extends further than any other arena of its size with great sight lines.

Two spacious locker rooms for Gamecock men's and women's basketball include team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and an athletic training room.

14th Season at South Carolina

Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have reached many firsts – National Championships, NCAA Final Fours, No. 1 rankings, SEC regular-season and tournament titles, SEC Players of the Year, National Players of the Year, WNBA No. 1 Draft pick and No. 1 recruiting classes – to name the most notable.

In her 15th season at the helm of the Gamecocks, Staley's South Carolina highlights include:

- Two National Championships (2017, 2022)
- Four NCAA Final Fours in the last seven tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022)
- Ranking in the AP Top 25 every week since Dec. 10, 2012, including 114 weeks in the top five
- 45 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, including two final No. 1 rankings (2019-20, 2021-22)
- 11 25-win seasons, including five 30-win campaigns led by a school-record 35 victories in 2021-22
- Six SEC regular-season championships (2014, 15, 16, 17, 20, 22) and Six SEC Tournament titles (2015, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21)
- Three top-two recruiting classes (#1 in 2021, #1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- Eight NCAA Attendance titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012.

In her 23rd season as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 12 25-win seasons, a total of 18 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 148 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 45 in the No. 1 spot – the sixth most times in the top spot of any program in the history of that poll. Her .744 winning percentage (538-185) ranks 12th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to 2018 FIBA World Cup gold to earn USAB National Coach of the Year honors that year, adding gold medals at the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, for which she again earned Coach of the Year honors. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals and served two stints as an assistant on the Senior National Team, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 14 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year three times (2014, 2020, 2022) with her 2020 unanimous selection making her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award. She is a five-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the Gamecocks' all-time winningest coach (367) with a program-record 11 postseason appearances and is the only black head coach in men's or women's basketball to win multiple national championships.

In the vaulted SEC, Staley's 167 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her .752 SEC winning percentage (167-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark in 2015-16 and 2019-20.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped eight Gamecocks collect 19 All-America selections, three to pick up six SEC Player of the Year honors, three to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of six times, one to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 17 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 34 times, including 18 first-team selections, and eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last five seasons, including 2018 No. 1 pick Aja Wilson, with two of those going on to win WNBA Rookie of the Year honors.
