In two games against ranked opponents this season, the bench has contributed 43.3 percent of the Gamecocks' scoring (34.0 ppg)

South Carolina is 14th in the nation in scoring defense, yielding just 47.3 points per game so far this season.

GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- South Carolina's depth was on full display at #2/2 Stanford with the bench accounting for 44.7 percent of the total offense - the highest number against a ranked opponent since the bench posted 54.4 percent of the team's 68 points in an NCAA Sweet 16 loss to Baylor on Mar. 30, 2019. The bench's 34 points at Stanford included all 20 points of the second quarter, during which the group's defensive effort also helped close the gap to just a four-point deficit at the half. Six of the seven players who came off the bench scored at least one field goal in the quarter.
- The bench production Sunday was not just about quantity but quality as the group made a series of big plays in overtime, Sophomore guard Bree Hall hit a pair of clutch 3s – to stop the Cardinal's opening 4-0 run and to give Gamecocks a four-point lead with 41 seconds to play. Senior Laeticia Amihere came up with a huge offensive rebound on a missed free throw with 27 seconds left.
- Reigning National Player of the Year Aliyah Boston continues to show why she is the best player in the country - this season despite defenses schemed to stymie her at every turn. The senior forward posted her 16th-straight double-double against a ranked opponent on Sunday (14 pts/13 rebs) with nearly all off that coming when it mattered most. Boston poured in eight points and nine rebounds in the final 15 minutes of the game, including the game-tying shot with two seconds left in regulation.
- Senior guard Zia Cooke has had her offense dialed in this season, leading the team with 15.8 points per game to rank ninth in the SEC. On Sunday, it was as much her defense and distribution skills that made the difference, holding Hannah Jump to just two points in the final 15 minutes of the game. Cooke handed out all four of her assists in that time as well.

A Perennial Power

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 11 seasons, including five 30-win seasons in the last eight campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four four times in the last seven NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 and 2022 National Championships. They have been ranked in every AP Poll since Dec. 10, 2012, including a top-10 position every week since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Gamecocks have amassed 47 AP No. 1 rankings all-time, becoming just the sixth program with a least 40 top entries in that poll. Since the start of the 2019-20 season, South Carolina has been atop the poll 35 times – over three times more than any other team in that time.

Under head coach Dawn Staley's leadership, eight Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 17 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Nine Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last seven years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020, 2022).

The Cal Poly Series

Tuesday marks the first ever meeting between the two programs.

Road Ready

The Gamecocks are 289-260 all-time in road games, including a 114-46 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. Her .713 winning percentage on the road is the best in program history.

Opponent Files

The Gamecocks' schedule includes six games against teams ranked in at least one the national polls this week with three of those coming in non-conference action.

The 2022-23 season also includes three other teams that received votes in one or both polls this week.

Ranked Readings

Against ranked teams, South Carolina is 101-66 (.605) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure.

Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 86-27 (.761) against ranked teams, including a 38-6 mark since the start of the 2019-20 season.

TEAM THEME: DNA

South Carolina's 2022-23 season theme "DNA" stands for Dreams, Nets, Assets – the elements routed in the DNA of the program.

Head coach Dawn Staley has described herself as a dream merchant as much as a coach throughout her career. Nets are the symbol of basketball success. Assets is a reminder of each team member's ability to positively impact the team's success as well as nod to the student-athlete's value in the name, image, likeness space.

Staley's program develops a different theme each season to amplify the team's goals and mindset for the season ahead.

Senior Aliyah Boston has thrived in her 44 career games against ranked opponents, averaging 15.2 points, 12.4 rebounds and 2.7 blocks while shooting 53.5 percent. Senior Zia Cooke's offense is not far behind with her 13.8 points per game in those 44 outings.

Ranking Review

The Gamecocks opened this season atop both the AP and the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Polls for the third time in as many seasons and remained there in the Week 2 AP Poll (coaches poll not yet released this week).

In the AP Poll, the Gamecocks' 47 total weeks at No. 1 make them just the sixth program all-time to sit atop that poll at least 40 times. South Carolina has appeared in each of the last 190 AP Polls, giving it the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, which dates back to Dec. 10, 2012.

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll. It has been No. 1 in that poll 31 times in the last nine seasons.

The Staley File

In her 22nd season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .746 (542-185) winning percentage, which ranks 11th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience. The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

In her 15th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (370) with a program-record 11 postseason appearances (10 NCAA/1

WNIT). She accounts for all four of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022) and the first NCAA National Championship in program history (2017).

After claiming six SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 167 SEC games, the most among active league coaches and third all-time - trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her 11.9 SEC wins average is the best in league history among coaches with more than one year in the league, and her .752 SEC winning percentage (167-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history.

Oh Captain, My Captain

For the third time in as many seasons, senior Victaria Saxton and junior Aliyah Boston will serve as team captains. It is Saxton's fourth season in that position

The 2022-23 Gamecocks

South Carolina returns four of its five starters among its 10 returning letterwinners from the 2022 National Championship team, and head coach Dawn Staley added a pair of top-20 signees in Ashlyn Watkins (No. 12) and Talaysia Cooper (No. 18) to this season's roster, along with Georgia Tech transfer Kierra Fletcher. The 2022-23 season is the senior campaign for Staley's first-ever No. 1 ranked signing class, headlined by 2022 National Player of the Year Aliyah Boston and two-time All-SEC and honorable mention All-America guard Zia Cooke. Stalwart defender Brea Beal, versatile forward Laeticia Amihere and local favorite Olivia Thompson are also part of that Class of 2019 signing class.

Fifth-vear senior Victaria Saxton returned for her extra season of eligibility to shore up the Gamecocks' dominant frontcourt, which also features a more dominant Kamilla Cardoso. Sophomores Sania Feagin (forward) and Bree Hall (guard) look to make their mark more regularly in their second season, and redshirt freshman Raven Johnson will battle Fletcher to take over the point guard position left vacant by WNBA draft pick Destanni Henderson.

Senior SZN

Now in its senior season, South Carolina's first No. 1 signing class - Laeticia Amihere, Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Zia Cooke, Olivia Thompson – has shaped the program from the moment those five freshmen gathered on campus.

In careers affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, the group has reached the Final Four in both their NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning the 2022 National Championship, and has never been ranked outside the top 10. With a combined 97-8 record, they have won 92.4 percent of their games, including a 39-5 mark against nationally ranked opponents.

In SEC action, the class has lost a total of just three league games en route to two regular-season titles (2020, 2022). They have played in three SEC Tournament championship games, claiming the title in two of those (2020, 2021).

Boston's Best

Forward Aliyah Boston opened her senior season with exactly what sealed her unanimous National Player of the Year junior campaign – double-doubles. With three in her first four games, she is sixth in the nation in that category while also ranking 24th in field goal percentage (.647).

From her college debut triple-double in November 2019 to her sweep of the national player of the year awards – including Naismith Defensive Player of the Year - the 6-foot-5 St. Thomas, U.S.V.I., native has been among the best in college women's basketball throughout her

Player of the Year. She added SEC Player of the Year honors in 2022 as well.

Averaging a double-double for her career (14.4 ppg/11.2 rpg), Boston leads all active NCAA players, all divisions, with 63 career double-doubles and 1,172 career rebounds. Her 261 career blocked shots are third among all active players.

In 44 career games against ranked opponents, her averages rise to 15.2 ppg and 12.4 rpg.

Cooke-ing Time

South Carolina's four-year starting shooting guard Zia Cooke has been mentioned among the best players in the country throughout her career, but the senior has been working toward a year that sees her physical talents meet the mental side of the game, and it appears 2022-23 is that season.

Cooke has been the Gamecocks' top scorer in three of their first four games. She has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field in two of those four outings, and is sixth in the SEC with 2.3 made 3s per game.

Even with her increased scoring, Cooke is tied for the team lead in assists with 2.8 per game.

It's Time to BRea-I

Often praised by head coach Dawn Staley for her steady development, consistent effort and commitment to the team, senior guard Brea Beal is finally catching some of the spotlight usually reserved for her stat-performing teammates. In her fourth season, Staley sees Beal's trust in the process paying off.

The powerful big guard's trademark defense has not diminished this season as Beal has held her primary guard to an average of 2.4 points per game fewer than her season average. Beal's poise and confidence built of understanding shot selection has lifted her offensive output to 6.8 points per game on 42.9 percent shooting (9-of-21), including 43.8 percent from 3-point range (7-of-16).

Beal leads the team in blocks (8 - 4th in the SEC), is third in assists (2.5 apg) and second in rebounding at 5.5 boards per game.

First Gamecock Takes Flight

Freshman Ashlyn Watkins became the first Gamecock in program history to dunk when she slammed one home following a steal with 3:30 to play in the fourth quarter at Clemson (Nov. 17). The Columbia, S.C., native was less hyped than her teammates after a high school career that frequently included that shot selection. Nevertheless, she entered the Gamecock history books fittingly against the program's in-state rival.

Rebounding Roundup

South Carolina was among the top rebounding teams in the country in 2021-22 and doesn't look to drop off this season.

So far this season, South Carolina's +16.0 rebounding margin is 17th in the nation and its 48.3 rebounding average is 14th.

Five Gamecocks average at least 4.0 rebounds, including senior guard Brea Beal who is second on the team at 5.5 per game.

Last season, the Gamecocks' +17.7 rebounding margin led the nation, and they were third in rebounding average with a school-record 47.9 per game. They brought back 84.1 percent of that rebounding, including 88.7 percent of offensive boards.

Dial Up the Defense

Head coach Dawn Staley has always put a premium on defense, but the Gamecocks have taken it to another level over the last four seasons (2019-20 to present), during which opponents have scored just 54.5 points per game.

This season, South Carolina is 14th in the nation

This year's Iron Gamecock winners were Zia Cooke and Ashlyn Watkins. The Iron Gamecock recipients exhibit exceptional performances in areas of speed, power, strength, and competitive challenges in the weight room.

in scoring defense (47.3) and ninth in scoring margin (+38.5). Opponents have shot just 28.9 percent (seventh in the nation), and the Gamecocks lead the nation with 9.0 blocks per game.

Last season's program-record low 50.7 points per game ranked third in the nation and helped the Gamecocks lead the nation in scoring margin (+20.2). South Carolina was second in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.332) and first in blocked shots per game (7.4).

No team reached its scoring average against the Gamecocks last season, including some of the SEC and the nation's most prolific offenses, and only three came within single digits of it – Missouri (Dec. 30), Mississippi State (Jan. 2), vs. Kentucky (Mar. 6).

Paint Production

South Carolina has long dominated the paint with both guards and post players taking advantage of the high percentage shots. Since the start of the 2019-20 season, the Gamecocks have scored 53.0 percent of their points in the paint.

So far this season, the Gamecocks have netted 45.0 points per game in the paint, accounting for 52.5 percent of their offense. Post players have scored for 71.1 percent of those paint points (32.0 ppg).

The 2019-20 team had the highest final paint points average (42.4 ppg), but the 2020-21 team posted the highest percentage of paint points (55.1%).

Last season, South Carolina's 37.4 paint points per game accounted for 52.6 percent of its offense.

Block Party

South Carolina annually ranks among the best shot blocking teams in the country and leads the way again this season at 9.7 blocks per game after finishing the 2021-22 season with an NCAA-best 7.4, including 7.3 in SEC play.

Early this season an unexpected shot blocker leads the way with guard Brea Beal ranking fourth in the SEC with 2.0 blocks per game. Senior Laeticia Amihere and freshman Ashlyn Watkins are next in line at 1.3 per contest – 10th in the SEC

Quarter Breakdown

South Carolina's defense has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter seven times through four games so far this season, including three fourth quarters and two second quarters as the Gamecocks' constant defensive pressure wears opponents down. The scoring differential is largest in the fourth quarter with South Carolina outscoring opponents by 12.3 points per first period.

Individually, three Gamecocks have scored double digits in a single quarter – Zia Cooke (1), Sania Feagin (1) and Ashlyn Watkins (1). Feagin's 11 points in the fourth quarter against ETSU (Nov. 7) is the best of the season.

The (Watch List) Watcher

The Gamecocks have been omnipresent on national award watch lists this preseason. Three are on the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award preseason lists and four of the five positional award preseason watch lists include at least one Gamecock.

One of the three Naismith watch list entries, Zia Cooke is once again on the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award list. She

was a finalist for the award that honors the nation's top shooting guard in 2021.

Brea Beal made her debut on the Naismith Watch List and was listed among those on the list for the best small forward in the nation, the Cheryl Miller Award.

Power forwards Victaria Saxton and Sania Feagin were selected to the watch list for the Katrina McClain Award.

Reigning National Player of the Year Aliyah Boston is on the Naismith watch list and is looking for a sweep of the Lisa Leslie Award as the top center in the country after winning the award each of her previous three seasons.

Preseason Predictions

As the reigning national champion, the Gamecocks are atop both preseason polls by a near unanimous decision. South Carolina claimed all 30 No. 1 votes in the Associated Press Poll. In the USA Today Coaches Poll, 30 of the 32 votes went to the Gamecocks.

South Carolina opened and closed the 2021-22 season atop both polls. The Gamecocks have been No. 1 in the AP poll 33 times since the start of the 2019-20 season, more than three times as many weeks as second place on the list, Stanford. South Carolina has been in the AP top five for a nation-leading 52 of the 57 polls in that same time period.

The Gamecocks were also selected to repeat as SEC Regular-Season Champions by both the media and league coaches in preseason voting.

For the Record

As a team, the Gamecocks set 11 program records in 2021-22, mostly in the rebounding category.

South Carolina's 1,771 total rebounds, 635 offensive rebounds and 1,136 defensive rebounds were all new program records, as was its 47.9 rebounds per game. The team's +17.7 rebounding margin overall and in SEC play

were both program records, and its 48.9 rebounds per SEC game set a new record as well.

With defense as its calling card all season, South Carolina held opponents to a program-record low 50.7 points per game last season.

The Gamecocks' record also reset a few program records with 35 wins and 14 wins over ranked opponents topping the charts.

Individually, Aliyah Boston carved her name into the Gamecock record books 17 times last season, including her SEC-record 27 consecutive double-doubles.

On the glass, Boston set new South Carolina marks for offensive rebounds in a game (12 vs. North Carolina, 3/25/22); total rebounds (462), offensive rebounds (150) and defensive rebounds (312) in a season; and in total rebounds (212), rebounding average (13.3), offensive rebounds (59) and defensive rebounds (143) in SEC regular-season games.

Boston's program-record 30 double-doubles last season include a record 16 in SEC action. She moved into the program record for career double-doubles in SEC games (32) as well.

Her program-record 57 blocks in SEC play last season included the program's first double-digit blocks game in SEC action (10 vs. Georgia, 1/21/21).

Offensively, Boston posted the program's best perfect shooting game, going 13-for-13 against NC A&T on Nov. 29, 2021

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last eight seasons. With nearly 10,000 season tickets sold this season that streak looks to continue for another year.

South Carolina's home opener of 12,779 fans is the top attendance game of the season so far and one of just four games with at least 10,000 fans.

The Gamecocks have had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for six straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season).

Excluding the COVID limited-attendance season of 2020-21, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans 97 consecutive regular-season games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.

Everybody's All-American

On the Gamecocks' 13-woman roster, nine were McDonald's All-Americans in high school – Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Kamilla Cardoso, Zia Cooke, Talaysia ooper, Sania Feagin, Bree Hall, Raven Johnson and Ashlyn Watkins

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 20 McDonald's All-Americans, including 16 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen.

2023 Signing Class

South Carolina's 2023 signing class was ranked second in the nation behind the addition of four top-40 players, including a pair of top-20 signings. Chloe Kitts, the #17 player in the class, will get a jump on the rest as she plans to enroll at the University for the Spring 2023 semester.

The highest ranked member of the class is local product Milaysia Fulwiley (Columbia, S.C./W.J. Keenan) coming in at #13. A member of her high school varsity team since late in her seventh-grade season, the 5-foot-6 guard has been part of four state championship teams, including winning the last three 3A titles. A three-time state player of the year, she has averaged over 20 points in each of her last three seasons to amass over 2,000 career points ahead of her senior season.

Kitts (Oviedo, Fla./DME Academy) is a 6-foot-2 forward ranked 17th in the class. The Max Preps Junior All-American helped DME Academy to a bid in the GEICO Nationals in 2022 with her 18.7 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. She also helped USA Basketball to gold in the 2022 FIBA U18 Americas Championship with 7.7 points and 5.8 rebounds per game in just 16.2 minutes per game in the tournament.

Five-foot-10 guard Tessa Johnson clocks in at #25 in the 2023 class after her 23.4 points and 3.9 assists per game helped Saint Michael Albertville (Minn.) to a 2022 Class 4A state runner-up finish.

Sahnya Jah played three seasons at Bishop McNamara in Forestville, Md., to rise to #40 in the class. The 6-foot-1 wing is long and versatile with range and the ability to impact the game on both sides of the ball.

15th Season at South Carolina

Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have reached many firsts – National Championships, NCAA Final Fours, No. 1 rankings, SEC regular-season and tournament titles, SEC Players of the Year, National Players of the Year, WNBA No. 1 Draft pick and No. 1 recruiting classes – to name the most notable.

In her 15th season at the helm of the Gamecocks, Staley's South Carolina highlights include:

- Two National Championships (2017, 2022)
- Four NCAA Final Fours in the last seven tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022)
- Ranking in the AP Top 25 every week since Dec. 10, 2012, including 116 weeks in the top five
- 47 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, including two final No. 1 rankings (2019-20, 2021-22)
- 11 25-win seasons, including five 30-win campaigns led by a school-record 35 victories in 2021-22
- Six SEC regular-season championships (2014, 15, 16, 17, 20, 22) and Six SEC Tournament titles (2015, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21)
- Three top-two recruiting classes (#1 in 2021, #1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- Eight NCAA Attendance titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012...

In her 23rd season as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 12 25-win seasons, a total of 18 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 150 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 47 in the No. 1 spot – the fourth most times in the top spot of any program in the history of that poll. Her .745 winning percentage (541-185) ranks 11th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to 2018 FIBA World Cup gold to earn USAB National Coach of the Year honors that year, adding gold medals at the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, for which she again earned Coach of the Year honors. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals and served two stints as an assistant on the Senior National Team, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 14 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year three times (2014, 2020, 2022) with her 2020 unanimous selection making her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award. She is a five-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the Gamecocks' all-time winningest coach (369) with a program-record 11 postseason appearances and is the only black head coach in men's or women's basketball to win multiple national championships.

In the vaunted SEC, Staley's 167 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her .752 SEC winning percentage (167-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark in 2015-16 and 2019-20.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped eight Gamecocks collect 19 All-America selections, three to pick up six SEC Player of the Year honors, three to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of six times, one to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 17 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 34 times, including 18 first-team selections, and eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last five seasons, including 2018 No. 1 pick A'ja Wilson, with two of those going on to win WNBA Rookie of the Year honors.
