South Carolina has seen its star rise again in the collegiate softball world, and head coach Beverly Smith has guided that process since arriving as head coach in July of 2010. She oversees all aspects of the program and works most closely on the field with the pitchers. As a head coach, Smith became only the second Gamecock softball coach with over 300 career wins.

The Gamecocks finished the 2022 season 26-30, defeating four nationally ranked opponents. Smith guided Carolina to a four-spot improving in its final RPI ranking.

In 2021, the Gamecocks finished the season 26-26, defeating Auburn in the first round of the SEC Tournament.

From 2013-19, Smith guided the Gamecocks to a program record seven-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Carolina was well on its way to its eighth-consecutive postseason trip in 2020 before the season was ended early due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Gamecocks have competed in the regional championship four-consecutive completed seasons (also a program record), while the 2018 team reached the program's second-ever super regional.

Carolina closed the 2020 season with a 17-6 record after the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In the shortened season, the Gamecocks recorded wins over Ohio State, Kansas, No. 8 Michigan, Iowa State and No. 13 Georgia, among others. Haley Simpson led the way with a .353 batting average while Kenzi Maguire posted a team-best 20 hits. Katie Prebble had a team-high six home runs and 25 RBI. In the circle, Karsen Ochs posted an SC-best five wins while Kelsey Oh led the pitching staff with 51 strikeouts in 32.2 innings of work.

South Carolina finished the 2019 season with a respectable 38-19 record and reached its fourth-straight regional final under Smith. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have now won 30 or more games each of the past seven years, the first time the program has done so since 2002 when it had 16-straight years of 30 or more-win seasons. South Carolina notably had a 15-game winning streak for the second-consecutive season, marking the first time since the 1996 and 1997 seasons the program won 10-straight games (or more) in back-to-back years. Smith earned her 300th career win as head coach at South Carolina in a 5-4 victory over Duke on March 20, 2019. The Gamecocks earned back-to-back series wins over Alabama and Auburn, becoming just the third team in the conference since 2005 to do so (11 chances). Carolina outscored the two rivals 30-20 over the two weekends with eight home runs. It was the first time since 2009 Carolina took the series over Alabama. Another notable streak continued in 2019 as the Gamecocks have had more than 30,000 fans come to Carolina Stadium for the past six-consecutive years. Carolina tied the program record for largest single-game crowd against Alabama with 2,250 which was previously set in 1997.

Many Gamecocks have broken out with their hard work under the watchful eye of Smith and her coaching staff. The 2018 leaders proved to be Mackenzie Boesel at the plate and Cayla Drotar in the circle. For the second-straight season, Boesel led the Gamecocks in nine different offensive categories (at bats, on-base percentage, hits, triples, batting average, runs, total bases, RBI and slugging percentage) while she paced the Gamecocks in two categories (doubles and walks) for the first time in her career. In the circle Drotar led the Gamecocks with 21 wins, becoming the first 20-game winner since 2015 and just the second in the past 16 years at Carolina. Drotar became the first pitcher not named Jessica Elliott or Nickie Blue to lead the team in innings pitched and wins since 2013. In league honors the Gamecocks had two players (Maguire and Tiara Duffy) named SEC Player of the Week while Johns became the first freshman in program history to be named SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

Prior to coming to South Carolina, Smith served as the top assistant at North Carolina, working mostly with the pitchers and catchers. The final three years, she was the associate head coach after nine as an assistant. Smith helped the Tar Heels to two Atlantic Coast Conference titles in 2001 and 2008 and eight of their nine NCAA Tournament appearances. She served as the lead recruiter for the Tar Heels during that time, helping to bring in five All-Americans into the UNC program. She also helped North Carolina achieve a top-25 ranking in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll at least once per season from 2006-10.

THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina softball has made 22 trips to the postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached two super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- Carolina rolls into the 2023 season with a 45-48 record all-time in postseason games and a 14-15 mark under Beverly Smith.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sundays in the postseason. Carolina had reached the regional final four-straight years (2016-19). The Gamecocks are 2-3 in those past five Sunday games.
- Since 1982, the Gamecocks are just 2-11 against host schools and 0-7 under Smith. On the flip side, South Carolina is 4-2 at home in the postseason under Smith having advanced to just the program's second super regional in 2018 with two win-or-go-home games against Liberty.

THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina comes into the season looking to rebound from a 2022 season that saw them miss the postseason for the second straight season.
- Carolina returns an experienced lineup this season, boasting 15 upperclassmen (seven juniors, four seniors, and four fifth-years).
- They'll also feature 11 underclassmen (six sophomores and five freshmen).
- The Gamecocks welcome five freshmen to the program (Brionna Condon, Hannah Hawley, Jori Heard, Reagan Marchant, and Kyee Ricks).
- Carolina will have seven left-handed batters available in the lineup. It had seven in 2022, nine in 2021, five in 2020, seven in 2019, eight in 2017 and six in 2016. Of the seven left-handed batters, four (Carlie Henderson, Haley Simpson, Kyee Ricks, and Aaliyah White) are listed as slap hitters.
- 14 Georgia natives help make up the Gamecock roster. It's the most from any single state. For comparison, Georgia has 13 on its roster.

THAT'S...INTERESTING!

- Brooke Blankenship hit an inside-the-park home run against Campbell on Feb. 11. It was the first inside-the-park home run since Alaynie Page on February 14, 2015, against the College of Charleston.
- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete from the state of California for the 27th-consecutive year dating back to 1994. Sophomores and California natives Marissa Gonzalez and Emma Sellers could continue the tradition on for three decades.
- Carlie Henderson won't be the first in her family to achieve at a high level in sports. Her grandpa, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech and went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills before being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University and has been the baseball head coach at Calhoun High School for 26 years. He's won more than 600 games with three state titles (and had eight players drafted into MLB).
- Brooke Blankenship and Giulia Desiderio have actually played for volunteer assistant coach Kevin Maguire before. Their travel ball team was coached by Maguire and was based out of Tampa, Fla.
- Sophomores Natalie Heath and Olivia Cook have been best friends since elementary school. Although they attended different high schools, the two joined the Gamecocks for the 2022 season.

COMING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- The Gamecocks hit the transfer portal in the offseason, bringing in five players that played the 2022 season at the Division I level.
- Aniyah Black spent the last two seasons at Georgia.
- Jen Cummings played two seasons at Washington.
- Brooke Blankenship spent the 2022 season at Florida State.
- Donnie Gobourne played two seasons at Florida Atlantic.
- Natalie Morgan played four seasons at Furman.
- The quintet combined to play 356 games and start 287 times.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

- For the third straight season, South Carolina is set for over 30 home games. Carolina will host 31 home contests, including the Gamecock Invitational and Carolina Classic. They will play just six non-conference road games for the second straight season and also play eight neutral site games. The schedule also includes 12 road SEC games

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- South Carolina is 220-110 (.667) at home during the Beverly Smith era, which includes a 4-1 record at home while hosting a regional at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- Carolina has finished .500 or better at home eight of Beverly Smith's 12 years.
- Prior to 2021, South Carolina had not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more six of the past seven seasons (2020 included).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 222-60 (.787) over the past eight years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra, Liberty, and UCF.
- Carolina had won 26-straight non-conference games (regular season) before a loss to Texas Tech in the second weekend of the 2020 season.

CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 35-5 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to weather.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs 12 times. On the flip side, nine games have ended as shutouts.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge, the Gamecocks are 59-6 in their past 65 home tournament games.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 150-364-1 (.292) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 72-124 (.367) at home, 36-167 (.177) on the road and 43-72-1 (.375) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2022, the Gamecocks went 4-22 against ranked opponents. Earning victories over #13 Kentucky, #15 Georgia, #19 Auburn, and #24 UCF.

STANDIN' IN THE HALL OF FAME

- South Carolina's all-time winningest coach Joyce Compton was inducted into the South Carolina athletics Hall of Fame this past October.
- It's the second honor for Compton as she had her jersey retired in a ceremony prior to Ole Miss game last season, on April 23, 2022.
- She becomes the seventh person from the softball program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, of which the previous six were all players under Compton. She is joined by: Trinity Johnson, Darlene Lowery, Megan Matthews, Tricia Popowski, Karen Sanchelli, and Tiffany Tootle.
- A legendary figure in the softball world, Joyce Compton retired following the 2010 season after 24 years at the University of South Carolina, while helping take the program to the Women's College World Series twice and to NCAA tournaments on 13 occasions. Three times her teams won an NCAA regional.
- Compton's jersey now hangs on the left field wall at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field. She became the second to have her jersey retired, joining her former student-athlete and Gamecock great Trinity Johnson who had her jersey retired in 2019.

HALEY SIMPSON: THE COMEBACK KID

Haley Simpson has been knocked down due to injuries several times in her career, but the fifth-year senior outfielder keeps coming back. Simpson missed the last two seasons with the Gamecocks after having hip surgery in December of 2020, forcing her to sit out that spring, and then she tore her left ACL a week before opening day last February. It was the second time she had ACL surgery after tearing the ligament in her right leg in high school.

"It was tough, but I definitely feel blessed because I had May Cordero, our athletic trainer, doing my rehabs, and she has been wonderful," said Simpson, who earned her degree in visual communications in December and is now working on a master's in Journalism and Mass Communications.

"The physical side of it wasn't as bad. I've been through an ACL rehab before, and I came back from hip surgery feeling great. It was more the mental side of it and having to deal with back-to-back injuries.

"With the ACL injury, I felt like the rug just got ripped out from under me. I feel like I have something to prove. I've been injured for two years now, and before that I got gypped on the COVID year. I feel like I have something to prove, and I want to get out there and show everyone how hard I've worked. I also have incredible teammates who have kept me going and haven't let me get my head down."

Simpson hit .264 as a freshman in 49 games with four stolen bases, and in her sophomore COVID-shortened campaign of 2020 she led the Gamecocks with a .353 average in 21 games with seven stolen bases and became the first Gamecock since 2007 to hit two triples in a game when she tallied a pair against Virginia Tech.

Getting over any season-ending injury is tough, not just physically, but mentally, and Simpson credits the mental health services offered through South Carolina Athletics for helping her get through it.

"I've been seeing Dr. (Rhea) Merck (a licensed clinical psychologist) from the Mental Health Performance Team weekly, and we talk about it a lot," Simpson said. "It has been the best thing for me. I can't even tell you how much she has helped me."

Simpson has been playing sports since she was four years old and lettered in softball, basketball, track, and swimming at North Forsyth High School in Georgia. Having missed two straight seasons at South Carolina, Simpson said there were times she struggled with the idea of making a comeback.

COMPETITION AND RIVALRIES CAN'T COME BETWEEN FRIENDSHIP

Olivia Cook and Natalie Heath have been best friends since kindergarten. They grew up in the small town of Sharpsburg, Georgia, which has a population of less than 400 and gained some notoriety as a location for the filming of several episodes of The Walking Dead television series. Despite playing against each other at rival high schools, their friendship is alive and well as the sophomore infielders are teammates on South Carolina's softball team.

"People on our team call us an old married couple," Cook said with a laugh. "We may bicker with each other, but we're always together. We show up to lift weights together. We run together. If one is invited somewhere, we're both invited."

"Yeah, you don't see one without the other," Heath said. "I think we've been through so much together, to the point that if we weren't always going to be friends, it would have already happened," Heath said. "I know it's cheesy, but I really think of us as sisters at this point because we have truly been through absolutely everything together. I got hurt last year (shoulder), and it really took a toll on me. I don't think I would still be here or doing my recovery process if it weren't for her."

Cook and Heath went to the same elementary school and started playing softball together when they were eight years old as Heath's father coached one of the local teams. They would later win two travel ball national championships together.

The two split at high school with Cook starring at East Coweta High School and Heath doing the same at Northgate High School in nearby Newnan, Ga., but the rivalry never got in the way of the friendship. The two had planned to commit to a different university early in the recruiting process, but they talked through it together and decided to put off that decision until much later in their careers.

"It was my junior year that I committed in October (to South Carolina), and she committed that following January," Heath said. "I had planned to commit to South Carolina for a while, and I was really pushing her to do the same. I kept telling her it was a really awesome school and that she should come.

"I was in Sam's Club when she called me and told me she was committing to South Carolina. I was screaming and cried my eyes out!"

"Me and my mom and dad were driving back (from South Carolina) and we stopped at her house to celebrate with them," Cook said.

NEW COACH IN THE DUGOUT

- Smith added a new face to the coaching staff for the season, Josh Bloomer.
- Bloomer was named the hitting coach after spending three years at Duke.
- With the Blue Devils, Bloomer helped them to a 111-27 record and was a part of two NFCA Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year (2021 and 2022).
- During the 2022 season, Bloomer's offense propelled the Blue Devils to a 44-11 record, the No. 12 seed in the NCAA Tournament, and their first Super Regional appearance in program history. Duke's offense ranked third in the nation in scoring, seventh in home runs and on-base percentage, and eighth in batting average.
- Bloomer came to Durham after seven seasons as the head coach at Louisville Male High School in Louisville, Kentucky, compiling a 458-147-4 mark. He ended his time at Male by guiding his squad to NFCA and Kentucky state titles in 2019. His final team put together a 39-0 record and became the first team from the state of Kentucky to finish a season ranked No. 1 nationally.

DAWN STALEY AND THE GAMECOCKS

- It's no secret at this point, legendary coach Dawn Staley is a fan of the softball program, having traveled to numerous road games over the years and making it to plenty of home games.
- Staley threw out the ceremonial first pitch during the 2022 season.
- Softball head coach Beverly Smith returns the love by doing the same, cause that's what friends do right? The two even used live down the street from each other, as well.
- And of course, Champ Staley (Coach Staley's dog) can be found at plenty of games supporting the softball program.
- Best friendship in sports? We won't argue with that.

CAROLINA RUNS THIS STATE

- Under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith, Carolina owns a 77-10 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal snapped the streak in 2017.
- South Carolina went 7-1 last season against in-state foes.

SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- **Trinity Johnson:** 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired on the Saturday of the Alabama series in 2019).
- **Tiffany Tootle:** Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- **Dr. Megan Matthews Buning:** 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award.
- **Darleen Lowery:** was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since athletics director Ray Tanner took over in 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted 164 All-Americans, 232 All-Conference selections, 30 different national honors, 10 national championships, 14 Conference Championships, eight conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 52 different times and reached the postseason 65 times (11 teams).
- The past six years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, six national championships, 13 conference championships, six conference tournament championships, finished ranked 42 times and reached the postseason 49 times.

WHAT WILL THEY WEAR TODAY?

- South Carolina has worn more than 20 different uniform combinations during the past four years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Talking just jersey, pants and socks/stirrups the Gamecocks have close to 40 different combinations they could use this season.
- When you add in visors and/or belts, Carolina has more than 100 different looks at its disposal. With those two accessories thrown into the equation, South Carolina could go more than two seasons without wearing the exact same look in a season.
- Uniform combinations are selected by the senior class.
- South Carolina will have four student-athletes wearing the SEC graduate patch this season: Haley Simpson, Rachel Vaughan, Jordan Fabian, and Bailey Betenbaugh,

THE BRAND

- Since 1892, the colors garnet and black have been associated with the University of South Carolina's athletics teams. Carolina has a pair of primary logos you'll see in use with the softball program (the Block C and SC Logo).
- South Carolina softball represents the brand with garnet, black and white options for jerseys, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Carolina or Gamecocks can be found across the front of each jersey with the SEC patch on the right and Under Armour logo on the left.
- Starting with the 2007 football season, Carolina partnered with Under Armour, Inc., as the official outfitter of the University's athletics department. South Carolina was previously with Russell Athletics.
- South Carolina and Auburn are the only SEC schools wearing Under Armour apparel.
