FOR STARTERS

The University of South Carolina baseball team hosts Presbyterian on Tuesday afternoon (March 14) at 4 p.m. at Founders Park.

Tuesday's game will be on SEC Network Plus. All games also will be broadcast on The Game 107.5 FM with Derek Scott and Tommy Moody on the call.

The Gamecocks are coming off a three-game sweep of Bethune-Cookman this past weekend, including winning a doubleheader on Saturday. Carolina had three grand slams amongst its eight home runs while Jack Mahoney struck out nine in six innings in Saturday's game two win. The Gamecocks are off to their best start to a season since 2014, when the Gamecocks also were 16-1 after 17 games.

SCOUTING PRESBYTERIAN

The Blue Hose dropped three games at Eastern Kentucky this past weekend. Brody Fahr leads Presbyterian with a .328 batting average while Jack Gorman, Joel Dragoo and Dalton Reeves have eight RBI apiece. Charlie McDaniel has a team-best 20 strikeouts on the mound while Tanner Smith and Luke Gibson have two saves apiece.

SCOUTING PRESBYTERIAN

Carolina leads the all-time series over Presbyterian, 48-21, but the Blue Hose won last year's contest, 9-6. Current Gamecock Chris Veach had a hit and walked twice in that game. For Carolina, Brandt Belk was 2-for-2 with a pair of runs scored.

AIN'T IT GRAND

The Gamecocks continue to put the baseball in seats this season, leading the nation with 45 home runs. During the Bethune-Cookman weekend, Carolina had three grand slams, coming off the bats of Dylan Brewer, Will McGillis and Caleb Denny. The two on Friday marked the first time Carolina had a pair of grand slams in a game since Feb. 27, 2016 against Penn State. Carolina has five grand slams this season, the most since the 2010 team had six grand slams on the season.

HICKS PUTS UP ZEROES AGAINST THE TIGERS

James Hicks threw five scoreless innings of relief in Carolina's 7-1 win over Clemson on March 5. Hicks allowed just two hits with six strikeouts and one walk to improve to 3-0 on the season. He has pitched 18 innings for the Gamecocks this year and has allowed just two runs. He is third in the SEC in earned-run average.

HORNUNG, MESSINA WITH BIG HITS IN SATURDAY WIN

Carson Hornung and Cole Messina had two big late inning home runs in Carolina's 11-9 win over Clemson on March 4 in Greenville. Hornung's three-run blast in the seventh gave the Gamecocks an 8-7 lead. It was his second home run of the season. Messina's two-run shot to left, his fifth of the year, gave Carolina the insurance it needed in a two-run victory.

LECROY EARNS MVP HONORS

Talmadge LeCroy was 5-for-10 with six RBI in the Clemson series, earning the Tom Price Award for the Most Valuable Player of the Clemson series. LeCroy belted his first career home run in Sunday's win while driving in a pair. He had a .500 on-base percentage and a .800 slugging percentage on the weekend.

HALL NAMED SEC CO PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Senior righthanded pitcher Noah Hall was named the Southeastern Conference's Co-Pitcher of the Week, the office announced Monday afternoon (Feb. 27).

Hall recorded a career high 12 strikeouts to no walks in eight innings of work as Carolina defeated Penn 1-0 on Saturday, improving his record to 2-0 on the season. Hall allowed just two runners to third base, ending those threats in the second and seventh innings with strikeouts. Hall allowed just three hits in an efficient 98 pitches across eight frames and picked up 1-2-3 innings in the third, fifth and eighth. Hall lowered his season ERA to 0.68 on the season with a .109 opponent's batting average. Hall also was named the Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week.

GAMECOCKS IN THE NCAA RANKINGS

The Gamecocks lead the nation with 45 home runs this season. Gavin Casas is sixth in the nation with nine home runs ... Carolina is sixth in the nation in drawing walks with 112 and second in the country with 50 hit by pitches ... The Gamecocks' .455 on-base percentage is sixth in the country ... On the mound, Carolina is eighth in earned-run average at 2.70 ... Braylen Wimmer leads the country with 31 runs scored ... Cole Messina is ninth in the country with 27 RBI ... Ethan Petry is third in the NCAA with four sacrifice flies.

RUNS APLENTY IN FIRST FIVE

The Gamecocks scored 80 runs in the first five games of the season, the most in school history after five games on the schedule. The 20 runs on Opening Day were the most scored in a season opener since the 2008 season, when Carolina put up 22 on East Carolina. The 37 runs in the first two games were the most since 2004 when Carolina put up 41 on Charles-

ton Southern and the 49 runs are the most in the first three games since the 1980 season, when Carolina scored 59 runs in its first three contests. Carolina scored in double figures in each of the first five games for the first time since 1987 and have done it in a five-game span for the first time since March 12-19, 1997.

GAMECOCKS GETTING ON BASE

Not only are the Gamecocks leading the nation in home runs, Carolina has been on base 162 times via the free pass (112 walks, 50 hit by pitches). That leads to a .455 team on-base percentage. Gavin Casas leads Carolina with 14 walks. Talmadge LeCroy has been hit eight times. Carolina is second in the nation in hit by pitches and sixth in the country in walks.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

Freshmen Ethan Petry and Eli Jerzembeck play a big role in Carolina's 19-3 win over Winthrop on Feb. 21. Jerzembeck earned his first career start, striking out four and allowing four hits and a run in four innings of work. Petry belted two home runs and drove in four in a 3-for-4 night. Petry has six home runs and has a .909 slugging percentage to go along with a .455 batting average. He also was named one of the Collegiate Baseball National Players of the Week on Feb. 27.

WIMMER OFF TO HOT START

Braylen Wimmer had a weekend to remember against UMass Lowell (Feb. 17-19), going 8-for-12 with six runs scored, a double, two home runs, eight RBI and a 1.250 slugging percentage. Wimmer had five hits on Opening Day, then had a grand slam in Saturday's win. Wimmer drove in the first run of Sunday's game with a single to center in the fifth inning. Wimmer is second on the team with a .410 batting average and has six home runs and 17 RBI while leading the nation with 31 runs scored.

MAHONEY MAKES RETURN TO THE MOUND

Junior Jack Mahoney struck out nine in 5.2 shutout innings of work to earn Sunday's win in his first outing since May of 2021. Mahoney retired the first six River Hawks and did not allow a walk to earn his fourth career win as a Gamecock. Mahoney was one of three Gamecocks to make his return on the mound after injury. Jackson Phipps struck out a pair in an inning of work while James Hicks struck out two in two innings.

UMASS LOWELL NUGGETS

Braylen Wimmer's five hits on Friday are the most by a Gamecock since Gene Cone against Missouri on April 24, 2016 ... Carson Hornung's five RBI on Friday are the most since Andrew Eyster had six in a win over Alabama on April 30, 2022 ... The 20 runs scored on Friday are the most by a Gamecock team since June 5, 2016 in a 23-2 win over Rhode Island in an NCAA Regional ... Dylan Brewer stole home in Sunday's win. It's the first steal of home for Carolina since Carlos Cortes at Vanderbilt on April 27, 2018 ... Wimmer tied a career high with five RBI on Saturday, which included a grand slam.

GAMECOCKS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

The University of South Carolina baseball team is ranked in five of the six major polls after the week of March 13. The Gamecocks are 14th in the USA Today Coaches' poll, the Collegiate Baseball poll and the NCBWA poll. Carolina is 16th in the D1Baseball.com poll and No. 19 in the Baseball America poll.

SANDERS NAMED TO GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

Junior righthanded pitcher Will Sanders has been named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List, USA Baseball announced Feb. 10. Sanders is one of 55 players on the list, kicking off the process of identifying the nation's top amateur baseball player for the 2023 season. Sanders, who was named Preseason All-America second team by three different organizations, was 7-3 with a 3.43 ERA and 91 strikeouts in 89.1 innings pitched as a sophomore in 2022. The righthander finished fifth in the SEC in innings pitched and 10th in both ERA and strikeouts. Sanders enters 2023 with 13 career wins, a 3.47 ERA and 145 career strikeouts.

GAMECOCK TRIO RETURNS TO SCHOOL AFTER DRAFT

Seniors Braylen Wimmer and Noah Hall and redshirt junior James Hicks all returned to Carolina after being picked in the 2022 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Hicks went first in the 16th round by the Baltimore Orioles. Wimmer was an 18th round pick by the Philadelphia Phillies and Hall was selected in the 20th round by the Milwaukee Brewers. There are five players on the team that have been drafted in their careers. Dylan Brewer was a 32nd round pick by the San Francisco Giants in 2019. Jonathan French was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the 30th round in 2019.

LEE RETURNS TO THE GAMECOCK COACHING STAFF

University of South Carolina baseball coach Mark Kingston has announced the hiring of Monte Lee as associate head coach/recruiting coordinator for the program.

Lee, who has had 19 winning seasons in his 20 years as a full-time NCAA coach, most recently was the head coach at Clemson University

for seven seasons (2016-22), garnering a 242-136 overall record and leading the Tigers to four NCAA Tournament berths.

Prior to his time at Clemson, Lee was the head coach of the College of Charleston from 2009-15, guiding the Cougars to a 276-145 overall record.

Lee is no stranger to Columbia, as he was an assistant coach with the Gamecocks under Ray Tanner from 2003-08. Lee helped the Gamecocks to the NCAA Regional all six years as an assistant, including College World Series appearances in 2003 and 2004 and Super Regional berths his four of his first five seasons. The 2004 team won 53 games, including the 2004 SEC Tournament, going a perfect 4-0 in Hoover. The Gamecocks won an SEC East Division championship in 2003, going 19-11 in league play. Lee also coached Justin Smoak, who set school records for home runs (62), RBI (207), walks (151) and total bases (485).

NEWCOMERS EARN TOP-20 RANKINGS

The Gamecocks' incoming transfer class was ranked as the ninth-best in the country by Baseball America and the 16th-best by D1Baseball.com. The latter also ranked fifth-year Will McGillis as the 36th best transfer in the nation while also ranking junior Gavin Casas, junior Caleb Denny, junior Jacob Compton and fifth-year Nick Proctor. The Gamecocks' full recruiting class was ranked in the top-25 by three different organizations, coming in as high as No. 18 in the country by D1Baseball.com. Eli Jerzembeck, Ethan Petry and Will Tippett were named Top Freshman in the nation by Perfect Game.

STOUT SCHEDULE FOR THE GAMECOCKS

Carolina will play six teams in the top 18 of D1Baseball.com's preseason poll, as well as eight teams that were in last year's NCAA Tournament. The Gamecocks have three contests against No. 1 LSU, No. 2 Tennessee, No. 5 Florida, No. 6 Vanderbilt and No. 7 Arkansas and have a single game in Charlotte against No.18 North Carolina. That does not include the three-game series with 2022 College World Series team Auburn and the annual three-game series against Clemson.

WIMMER BACK FOR YEAR FOUR

Senior Braylen Wimmer returns to the lineup and is the projected starter at shortstop. The Yukon, Okla., native is the Gamecocks' top returning hitter as he batted .312 with 13 doubles, seven home runs, 35 RBI and 13 stolen bases in 2022. In his Carolina career, Wimmer has 159 hits, 109 runs scored, 31 doubles, 24 home runs and 88 RBI.

AUSTIN BACK IN THE STOPPER ROLE

Redshirt sophomore Cade Austin is back after a Freshman All-America season with the Gamecocks in 2022. The Chapin native was 5-2 with a 3.17 ERA and a pair of saves in 27 appearances. Austin struck out 55 batters in 54 innings pitched and picked up big wins against Ole Miss, Alabama and Florida. Austin was named to the Stopper of the Year Watch list on Feb. 16.

#17 MARK KINGSTON HEAD COACH 6TH SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 14TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH NORTH CAROLINA (1995)

Mark Kingston was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball. Kingston's first team at Carolina (2018) advanced to the Super Regionals in Arkansas after going 3-0 in the Greenville Regional at East Carolina. The Gamecocks won each of their last five SEC series in 2018, as Carolina swept LSU and won series against Vanderbilt, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M on its way to a third place finish in the SEC East (17-13) and fifth-place overall conference finish. Carolina handed Ar-

kansas its only postseason loss until the College World Series championship series, defeating the Razorbacks 8-5 in game two of the super regional. The Carolina team finished seventh in the country in fielding percentage (.980) and 12th in home runs (79). Kingston coached 10 players that were picked in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and had 12 players selected to the Spring SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The 2019 team saw five players picked in the MLB First-Year Player Draft, including TJ Hopkins in the ninth round. The Gamecocks earned a Palmetto Point, winning 2-of-3 games against Clemson in early March. Success against the ACC continued with wins over N.C. State and North Carolina in Charlotte. South Carolina earned a trip to Hoover on the final day of the regular season, defeating College World Series participant Mississippi State in Starkville. Kingston coached Brett Kerry, who was named to the SEC All-Freshman team and was named a Freshman All-American by three different organizations.

The 2020 season was cut short after 16 games due to the coronavirus, but Kingston's squad was 12-4 that included a pair of week-end sweeps and a win over Clemson in Segra Park, had a pitching staff that had a 2.81 ERA and 184 strikeouts in 144 innings pitched and had Wes Clarke, who led the SEC with eight home runs. Kingston coached Carmen Mlodzinski, who was selected by the Plttsburgh Pirates with the 31st pick in the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Carolina also had a team grade-point-average of 3.399, the highest in program his-tory, in the spring and had 17 student-athletes on the SEC Spring Honor Roll.

In 2021, the Gamecocks hosted the NCAA Columbia Regional, winning 34 games, including a 16-14 record in SEC play. That includ-ed a sweep of Florida and series wins at Georgia and LSU. Kingston guided the Gamecocks to a series win against Clemson, winning back-to-back games on walk-off hits from Andrew Eyster. The Carolina pitching staff had a 3.80 ERA, fourth in the SEC, and struck out 624 batters in 507 innings pitched. The Gamecocks had eight players picked in the 2021 MLB Draft, which tied for third for the most players picked from a Division I school. Carolina also earned the Team Academic Award from the ACBA and had 23 players on either the SEC Honor Roll or the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

Series wins over No. 1 Texas, No. 4 Vanderbilt and national champion Ole Miss highlighted the 2022 season. The Gamecocks had five players picked in the First-Year Player Draft and had a pair of SEC honors as Brandt Belk was a Second Team selection and Michael Braswell an All-Freshman team honoree. Cade Austin was named a Freshman All-American on the mound and Will Sanders earned seven wins on the bump. The Gamecocks had 18 student-athletes make the SEC Spring Honor Roll.

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 427-290-1 in 13seasons as a head coach, including

five at Illinois State, with four NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 427-290-1 in 15seasons as a nead coach, including five at Illinois State, with four NCAA appearances in that nine-year span. Kingston has helped lead 13 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach -- with five of those teams appear-ing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an as-sistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate

coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue. Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kings-ton's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over

Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories. Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offen-sively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hit-ting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan

State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia). Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to The American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 winning percentage). Kingston was twice named a "Rising College Coach" by Kendall Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourthplace conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU's average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston's recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team's associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regularseason title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU's 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program's longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a schoolrecord 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston's recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff. Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit. 400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the

run to the 2001 national title, the 'Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average. Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne "Most Dedicated Player" Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs organizations.

Kingston attended Potomac High School (Virginia), where he developed into a Collegiate Baseball Top-50 Prospect and was drafted by the New York Yankees after leading his team to the 1988 state championship. In 2006, Kingston was inducted into the Potomac Hall of Fame.

In 2019, Kingston was named as an assistant coach to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, which played in tournaments in Taiwan and Japan.

Kingston and his wife, the former Letitia Kelly, have three children, Kailyn Grace, Cameron James and Kathryn Patricia. He also wrote and produced two instructional videos for Championship Productions, "Keys to Consistent Hitting" and "Catching Drills and Fundamentals." He also was the only assistant coach chosen to write a chapter in "The Baseball Drill Book" produced by the American Baseball Coaches Association.
