Jacksonville State Gamecocks (7-2, 5-1 Conference USA)



South Carolina Gamecocks (2-6, 1-5 SEC)

Saturday, Nov. 4, 2023 ♦ Noon ET Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) ♦ Columbia, S.C.

QUICKLY: After back-to-back road games, the South Carolina Gamecocks (2-6, 1-5 SEC) return to the friendly confines of Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) in Columbia, S.C. to host the Jacksonville State Gamecocks (7-2, 5-1 C-USA) out of Conference USA in a non-conference tilt on Saturday, Nov. 4. Game time has been set for noon ET and the contest will be televised nationally on ESPNU. South Carolina is looking to snap a four-game losing streak and keep its bowl hopes alive, while Jacksonville State enters the contest as winners of its last two and five of its last six contests.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's contest will be televised nationally on ESPNU. South Carolina has appeared on ESPNU just once since the 2015 season, posting a 56-20 win over Charlotte last season. Brian Custer will provide the play-by play while Rod Gilmore adds the color commentary. Lauren Sisler will handle the sideline duties. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Great quarterbacks in Todd Ellis (32nd season) and Tommy Suggs (51st season) in the booth. Chet Tucker is in his first season as the sideline reporter.

WELCOME BACK: Festivities around this week's game include a reunion of the 2010-2013 South Carolina football teams. That four-year period under head coach Steve Spurrier denotes the best stretch of football at the University, with the 2010 team representing the Eastern Division in the SEC Championship game, then the 2011-13 squads posting consecutive 11-win seasons and top-10 national finishes. The 2013 squad won its final five games to finish fourth in the final Associated Press poll, the best mark in school history.

GAMECOCK REWIND: The Gamecocks are 2-6 in 2023 including a 1-5 mark in SEC play. Four of their six losses have come to teams ranked in the AP Top-25 while five of the six losses have come away from Williams-Brice Stadium. The eight teams that Carolina has played have a combined 48-16 record. South Carolina opened the season with a 31-17 loss to No. 21 North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Classic in Charlotte, before posting a convincing 47-21 win over Furman, the sixth-ranked team in the FCS. The Gamecocks opened SEC play at two-time defending national champion Georgia in Week 3. South Carolina held a 14-3 lead at intermission, but the top-ranked Bulldogs rallied for a 24-14 win. Carolina rebounded with a 37-30 win over Mississippi State in Columbia to even its record at 2-2. The Gamecocks have lost their last four, falling at No. 21 Tennessee by a 41-20 count, surrendering a 10-point fourth quarter lead in a 41-39 home loss to Florida, then dropping a 34-12 decision at No. 20 Missouri before coming out on the short end of a 30-17 decision at Texas A&M last week. The Gamecocks have been led all season by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler has completed 185-of-266 passes for 2,117 yards with 12 touchdowns and five interceptions. He ranks 35th in the nation with 264.6 passing yards per game and is 15th with a 69.5 percent completion rate. Legette has caught 41 passes for 756 yards, averaging 18.4 yards per catch and 94.5 yards per game, with three touchdowns. He ranks 12th among all FBS players in receiving yards per game and is 24th in yards per reception.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2023 marks the 130th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 117th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 631-612-44, a .507 winning pct. Since the start of the 21st century, Carolina is 165-130, a .559 mark.

BATTLE OF THE GAMECOCKS: For the first time in history, two college institutions with the nickname "Gamecocks" will battle on the gridiron when South Carolina hosts Jacksonville State.

ABOUT JSU: The next era of Jacksonville State Athletics got underway on July 1, 2023, when the Gamecocks officially became members of Conference USA. Jax State accepted C-USA's invitation to join the league in November of 2021 and immediately got to work on its application for the league and specifically Football's Bowl Subdivision. The Gamecocks saw that work come to fruition on July 1, when they joined eight other programs to make up the new-look conference that has been a force in Division I athletics since 1995. C-USA is Jax State's third Division I conference home after spending 18 years in the Ohio Valley Conference and 10 total years in the ASUN, which was the Gamecocks' first Div. I conference home from 1995-03 and again from 2021-23.

BEEN HERE, DONE THAT: Jacksonville State will be playing its second game of the 2023 season in the Palmetto State. They went to Conway on Sept. 9 and suffered a 30-16 loss to the Chanticleers of Coastal Carolina in a non-conference game.

THEY COME TO SEE CAROLINA PLAY: The South Carolina Gamecocks have played in front of a sold-out stadium six times this season. South Carolina has sold out all three of its home games, drawing 78,281 in the home opener against Furman, 78,311 in the SEC home opener versus Mississippi State, and a season-high 79,247 against Florida in the annual Homecoming game. The Gamecocks rank 15th in the country in average home attendance at 78,613 and have announced a sellout in 10 of its last 11 home games. The Gamecocks also played in front of sold-out crowds of 92,746 at Georgia, 101,915 at Tennessee and 62,621 at Missouri this season. Last week's attendance of 95,297 at Texas A&M was not a sellout.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The South Carolina Gamecocks are 41-14 in their last 55 non-conference games, a .745 winning percentage, with seven of the 14 losses in that stretch coming against Clemson. The Gamecocks went 4-1 against non-conference foes in 2022, posting wins over Georgia State, Charlotte, South Carolina State and Clemson and losing to Notre Dame in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl. The Gamecocks are 1-1 in non-conference games this season, losing to North Carolina in the season opener in Charlotte, then defeating Furman at home the following week. South Carolina's fourth and final non-conference game of the 2023 season is set for Nov. 25 in the annual Palmetto Bowl with the Clemson Tigers. That contest is also slated for Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE: Carolina has won 37 of its last 43 home games against non-conference foes. The Gamecocks had put together a school-record 22-straight home game winning streak against non-conference teams before dropping the final two games of the 2015 regular season to The Citadel and Clemson. The Gamecocks were 3-0 in home non-conference games in 2022, posting wins over Georgia State, Charlotte, and South Carolina State. They are 1-0 this season with a win over Furman.

THE POWER OF FIVE: Since the turn of the century, the Gamecocks have a 53-4 mark (.930) against teams not currently in a Power-5 conference. The only four losses in that stretch came to UConn in the 2010 Papajohns.com Bowl, to The Citadel in 2015, to USF in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl and to Appalachian State in 2019. It should be noted that UConn was in the Big East, which was a BCS automatic qualifier during the 2009 season.

A South Carolina win over Jacksonville State would...

◆ Improve the Gamecocks to 42-14 in their last 56 non-conference games.

♦ Improve the Gamecocks to 38-6 in their last 44 games at home against non-conference foes.

◆ Improve the Gamecocks to 54-4 against teams not currently in a Power-5 conference since the turn of the century.

SCHEDULING QUIRK: South Carolina played its final road game of the regular season last week at Texas A&M. The Gamecocks' final four games will all be played at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia during the month of November. South Carolina is the only school in the FBS to have each of its final four games of the 2023 regular season at home. The Gamecocks will host Jacksonville State, Vanderbilt, Kentucky and Clemson in the month of November.

BATTLE TESTED: South Carolina and Notre Dame were the only schools that played four ranked opponents through the first eight weeks of the season. The Gamecocks opened the 2023 season with a loss to No. 21 North Carolina before falling at top-ranked Georgia two weeks later. The gauntlet continued with a loss at No. 21 Tennessee to close out September. They also lost at No. 20 Missouri. The eight opponents that Carolina has played are a combined 48-16. Removing games involving FCS teams, South Carolina's opponents played are 42-14, a .750 winning percentage, the top mark in the FBS. South Carolina is the only team in the country that has 11 of its 12 regular season opponents currently owning a record of .500 or better. Vanderbilt is the only opponent on the slate with a losing mark. Going back to last season, seven of South Carolina's last 11 opponents were ranked in the AP Top-25 at the time of the game.

THE LAST TIME OUT: A banged-up Carolina squad battled but fell short in a 30-17 setback at Texas A&M in College Station last Saturday afternoon. After spotting the Gamecocks an early 7-0 lead, the Aggies scored 21 second quarter points and never looked back. Carolina trimmed the deficit to 24-17 early in the fourth quarter but could get no closer. A&M held a 354-209 advantage in total yards and possessed the ball for 13 minutes more than Carolina.

EARLY SUCCESS: The Gamecocks have scored a first quarter touchdown in seven of eight games this season. They were able to tally a first quarter TD in just six of 13 games in 2022. The loss at Missouri is the only game in 2023 that Carolina has not held a lead. The Gamecocks have led in 10 of their last 11 contests.

ANY HARBOR IN A STORM: True freshman wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** continues to take on more of

a role as the season progresses. The uber-talented freshman is still learning the position, but was targeted a season-high eight times at Texas A&M, catching six passes for 59 yards.

YOU CAN'T RATTLE SPENCER: Despite being pressured a ton this season (the Gamecocks are 13th in the SEC and 125th in the country in sacks allowed with 34), **Spencer Rattler** continues to play at a high level. He ranks fifth in the SEC and 38th in the country in total offense per game (273.6), fifth in the SEC and 35th in the nation in passing yards per game (264.6), seventh in the SEC and 44th overall in passing efficiency (147.5) and fifth in the SEC and 15th in the country in completion pct. (69.5).

AWARD WORTHY: Senior wide receiver **Xavier Legette** was recently added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List and was named a Midseason Second-Team All-American by the AP. Despite being banged up the last two games, Legette ranks third in the SEC and 12th in the country in receiving yards per game at 94.5, with 38 receptions for 736 yards. He is 10th in the league and 53rd in the nation with 5.1 catches per game, fourth in the conference and 24th in the land in yards per catch at 18.4 and is fourth in the SEC and 39th in the country with 111.25 all-purpose yards per game.

REVOLVING DOOR: The Gamecocks have used a different starting five along the offensive line in every game this season. Carolina is the only team in the country to have eight different starting offensive lines this season, one more than Arizona State, Pitt and Stanford. **Nick Gargiulo** is the only offensive lineman to start every game. He has made five starts at left guard and the last three at center. The Gamecocks have used three starting left tackles, two left guards, two centers, two right guards and four right tackles this season. ON THE JOB TRAINING: The Gamecocks have started five true freshmen this season. Defensive back **Jalon Kilgore** was the first member of the 2023 recruiting class to earn a start when he moved into the starting lineup in Week 2. Left tackle **Tree Babalade** has made five starts, while right guard **Trovon Baugh** has made four-straight starts on the offensive line. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** and CB **Judge Collier** made their initial starts at Texas A&M.

THE FINAL COUNTDOWN: The Gamecocks list 10 players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 COVID-19 season to be a "free" year. Those "Super" seniors are WR Ahmarean Brown, OL Nick Gargiulo, DB DeAngelo Gibbs, WR Dakereon Joyner, TE Trey Knox, WR Xavier Legette, WR Eddie Lewis, OL Jaylen Nichols, EDGE Jordan Strachan and RB D.J. Twitty. Nichols, who has been sidelined all season with a knee injury, could return in 2024.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' 2023 roster features 11 new scholarship transfers, including nine who enrolled in January. The list includes RB Mario Anderson (Newberry), DT Elijah Davis (East Mississippi C.C.), TE Nick Elksnis (Florida), OL Sidney Fugar (Western Illinois), OL Nick Gargiulo (Yale), TE Trey Knox (Arkansas), WR Eddie Lewis (Memphis), TE Joshua Simon (Western Kentucky), and LB Jaron Willis (Ole Miss). Jatius Geer (Syracuse) joined the squad in the summer and Drew Tuazama (UAB) was added in August. In addition, DB DeAngelo Gibbs joined the team as a graduate transfer walk-on from Tennessee, OL Jaxon Hughes joined the squad as a walk-on from Charlotte and OL Ni Mansell came from Mercer.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: Twenty-two Gamecocks had their degrees in hand when the 2023 season began. Sixteen have earned a diploma from the University of South Carolina, including Ahmarean Brown, Terrell Dawkins, Marcellas Dial, B.J. Gibson, Alex Herrera, Tyreek Johnson, Trai Jones, Dakereon Joyner, Xavier Legette, Bam Martin-Scott, Jakai Moore, Jaylen Nichols, David Spaulding, Jordan Strachan, D.J. Twitty and Tyshawn Wannamaker. Nick Garguilo (Yale), DeAngelo Gibbs (Tennessee), Trey Knox (Arkansas), Eddie Lewis (Memphis), Joshua Simon (Western Kentucky) and Drew Tuazama (UAB) have degrees from other four-year institutions.

WE MAY NEVER PASS THIS WAY AGAIN: The 2023 season marks the final year that the Southeastern Conference will compete in the East and West divisional format with six intradivision games, one "permanent" cross over opponent and a rotating opponent from the opposite division. In 2024, Texas and Oklahoma will join the conference and the league will merge into one 16-team division. South Carolina will not face traditional rivals Georgia, Florida or Tennessee in 2024, teams they have played every year since joining the league in 1992.

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks return to SEC play next Saturday when they host the Vanderbilt Commodores in another SEC Eastern Division matchup. The series has been dominated by South Carolina, as the Gamecocks own a 28-4 all-time lead in a series that dates back to 1961. The Gamecocks hold a 13-2 advantage when the game has been played in Columbia. Carolina has won 14-straight in the series, including a 38-27 win in Nashville last November. Vandy's last win came in 2008.

LOOKING FURTHER AHEAD: The Gamecocks will host LSU, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M at Williams-Brice Stadium in 2024, and will travel to Alabama, Kentucky, Oklahoma and Vanderbilt. Dates and kick times will be announced at a later date. The non-conference portion of the 2024 slate includes home games against Old Dominion (Aug. 31), Akron (Sept. 21) and Wofford (Nov. 23) and a road game at Clemson (Nov. 30).

Offense

NEW LOOK OFFENSE: Dowell Loggains is in his first season as the Gamecocks' offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. Loggains spent the past two seasons as the tight end coach at Arkansas. Previously, he logged 16 years in the NFL with six different organizations, including seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Behind the outstanding performance of quarterback **Spencer Rattler**, the Gamecocks rank fifth in the SEC and 27th in the country in passing offense at 283.4 yards per game. Carolina has not averaged over 300 yards passing per game since the 1995 season when they finished at 306.6 passing yards per contest behind the efforts of Steve Taneyhill.

QB1: Spencer Rattler is the unquestioned leader of the team. The senior QB completed 66.2 percent of his passes a year ago for 3,026 yards with 18 touchdowns and 12 picks. He got hot late in the season, completing 68.9 percent of his passes for 1,044 yards (348.0 per game) with 10 TDs and three INTs over the final three contests. He hasn't missed a beat this year, completing 185-of-266 passes (69,5 pct.) for 2,117 yards and 12 touchdowns with five picks. Four of his five interceptions have come late in the fourth quarter with the Gamecocks trailing and he was "just trying to make a play." Rattler, a transfer from Oklahoma, is 25-13 in 38 career starts including a 10-11 mark in 21 starts at Carolina

PLAYING HIS BEST BALL: Despite playing some of the best teams in the country including seven ranked opponents in his last 11 contests, **Spencer Rattler** has been on fire since the end of the 2022 season:

THE 300 MARK: Spencer Rattler has thrown for more than 300 yards three times this season and in five of his last 11 games overall. The 353-yard effort against North Carolina was the third-highest season-opening game posted in school history. With six career 300-yard passing games, he is tied with Stephen Garcia for third on the school's all-time list. The record is 10, held by Todd Ellis, while Steve Taneyhill is second on the list with eight.

NEARLY PERFECT: Spencer Rattler completed 25-of-27 passes against Furman, a 92.6 percent completion rate. That figures as one of the best single-game marks in school history. Connor Shaw completed 20-consecutive passes in going 20-for-21, 95.2 percent, against Missouri in 2012, while Gordon Beckham was 16-of-17, 94.1 percent,

against North Carolina in 1981. Rattler was also 18-of-20 against Mississippi State.

HOT FROM THE START: Spencer Rattler has come out on fire in every game this season. In the first quarter of the eight games played, he has completed 51-of-59 passes (86.4 pct.) for 559 yards and three touchdowns. He completed his last four first-quarter passes against North Carolina, then went 10-for-10 in the first quarter against both Furman and Georgia and was 5-for-5 versus Mississippi State, extending his first quarter streak to 29-consecutive completions, before missing on his first attempt at Tennessee. He competed his first 15 passes against Furman, his first 10 at Georgia, his first 17 versus Mississippi State and his first 10 against Florida.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: Spencer Rattler was one of the five permanent team captains for the 2022 season and is the only one who returned in 2023. The Gamecocks select game captains each week and Rattler has been selected to represent Carolina at the coin toss in six of the first eight games.

DOUBLE DUTY DOTY: Luke Doty, who is listed as the No. 2 QB on the depth chart, has been used more as a slot receiver this season. He has responded with 11 catches for 109 yards and a touchdown, including the first three catches of his career in the season-opener against North Carolina and a 36-yard touchdown reception against Furman. He also completed 2-of-4 passes for 17 yards against the Paladins, his only pass attempts since Sept. 29, 2022 against SC State.

WHO'S GOT NEXT?: LaNorris Sellers gave Carolina fans a glimpse into the future when he saw action in his first collegiate game in the 47-21 win over Furman. The true freshman completed all four of his passes for 86 yards and two touchdowns, including an eye-popping 50-yard scoring missile late in the third quarter. He also connected on a 7-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter.

SUPER MARIO: Mario Anderson was a First-Team Division II All-American last season at Newberry where he rushed for over 1,500 yards with 19 touchdowns. Through the first three games this season he logged just eight carries for 41 yards. Over the last five games he has 84 carries for 427 yards and two scores, rushing 26 times for 88 yards and his first FBS touchdown against Mississippi State, then going for 101 on just 10 carries at Tennessee, including a 75-yard scoring burst before rushing 20 times for 98 yards against Florida, a dozen times for 68 at Mizzou and 16 for 72 yards at Texas A&M. H's averaging 5.1 yards per carry.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: Mario Anderson rushed for 101 yards in his first start at Tennessee, becoming the first Gamecock to rush for 100 yards in a game since MarShawn Lloyd went for 169 against Charlotte in Game 4 last season. His 75-yard run from scrimmage was the longest rush since Kevin Harris scampered 88 yards against Vanderbilt in 2020.

JOYNER JOINS THE RB ROOM: Versatile performer Dakereon Joyner moved to the running backs room for his final campaign and earned the starting role in the first four games. Joyner began his career as a quarterback, then spent the bulk of his time at wide receiver before making the transition to running back in the spring. He has rushed 46 times for 112 yards this season and owns five of

the team's 11 rushing TDs. He is also third on the squad with 21 receptions and has returned four kicks for 64 yards.

ALL THE RIGHT MOVES: Dakereon Joyner has pledged to donate money to a non-profit organization or a charity for every touchdown he scores this season. He hopes to use his platform to give back, inspire others and make a difference in people's lives. He leads the team and is tied for seventh in the SEC with five rushing touchdowns.

TRIPLE THREAT: Dakereon Joyner has thrown for 430 yards and two touchdowns on 29-of-42 passing, rushed for 437 yards and nine scores on 110 carries and has caught 66 passes for 559 yards and three TDs in his career. He has completed his last 12 pass attempts for 261 yards and two scores.

X MARKS THE SPOT: The light has come on for senior wide receiver Xavier Legette. Legette came up big in the 2022 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl with a sevencatch, 78-yard, two-touchdown game. He has followed that up with a nine-catch, 178-yard effort against North Carolina, a six-catch, 118-yard, one touchdown performance against Furman, a five-catch, 189-yard, two touchdown effort against Mississippi State and a five-catch, 110-yard effort versus Florida. The 178 receiving yards vs. UNC was the top performance in the country in Week 1 and surpassed his 2022 season total. He had 35 career receptions for 345 yards and three touchdowns through his first 40 games but has 48 catches for 834 yards and five scores in his last nine contests.

X GETTING NOTICED: Xavier Legette was named to the 2023 Reese's Senior Bowl Midseason All-America Team, was selected to the Pro Football Focus (PFF) Midseason College Football All-Prospect Team and was named a Midseason Second-Team All-American by the Associated Press.

RECORDS ARE MEANT TO BE BROKEN: Xavier Legette caught five passes for 189 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Mississippi State, scoring from 75 and 76 yards out. 136 of his 189 yards came after the catch. He averaged 37.8 yards per catch, setting a school single-game record (minimum of four catches), surpassing **Alshon Jefery's** 37.0 average (4-for-148) in an MVP performance against Nebraska in the 2012 Capital One Bowl. Ironically, Legette broke Jeffery's mark on the night that Jeffery had his jersey retired.

MORE TO COME?: Xavier Legette has 756 receiving yards in eight games. He is on pace for 1,134 yards, which would place him fourth on the school's single-season list behind only Alshon Jeffery's 2010 mark of 1,517, Sidney Rice's 2005 total of 1,143, and Pharoh Cooper's mark of 1,136 in 2014. Legette also has four 100-yard receiving games this season. Only six players have recorded five or more, including Alshon Jeffery, who had a school record eight in 2010.



DĖJÀ VU: Spencer Rattler and Xavier Legette connected on a pair of touchdown passes from 75 and 76 yards against Mississippi State. It was just the second time in school history the Gamecocks had two 75+-yard pass plays in the same game. Ironically, both have come against Mississippi State, as Anthony Wright teamed up with Marcus Robinson for a 75-yard completion and with Corey Bridges on a 77-yard TD on Sept. 28, 1996.

JUST THROW ME THE BALL: Since his arrival in Columbia in 2019, Xavier Legette has caught passes from seven different players including Ryan Hilinski, Collin Hill, Luke Doty, Zeb Noland, Jason Brown, Spencer Rattler and Kai Kroeger.

THE FREAK: True freshman Nyck Harbor landed the No. 1 spot on Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks List." Feldman wrote, "In two decades of doing this, I don't think I've ever had a true freshman No. 1, but this player is different. What makes Harbor 'different' is the combination of his large size and unadulterated speed. He stands at 6-foot-5, 241 pounds. Add onto that the five-star signee's 10.2-second 100m time and you get freakish." Harbor caught his first pass against Furman, a seven-yard touchdown reception, hauled in a 45yard reception against Florida and had a pair of receptions for 50 yards, along with a nine-yard rush at Missouri. He was targeted a game-high eight times, recording six receptions for a season-high 59 yards at Texas A&M last Saturday.

SCHOOL OF HARD KNOX: Graduate transfer **Trey Knox** has become more of a focal point in the Carolina offense of late. The Arkansas transfer who played for Dowell Loggains with the Razorbacks, is second on the squad with 32 receptions for 277 yards and a touchdown. He has 26 receptions for 217 yards in the last five contests after logging just six catches for 60 yards through three contests. He has led the team in receptions in three of the last four games.

ELI'S COMING: The offensive line has been bolstered by the addition of Yale graduate **Nick Gargiulo**. Gargiulo has shown why he was the lone captain of Team 149 at Yale, as his leadership and toughness quickly made him a leader up front. He is the only O-lineman to start every game in 2023.

IF A TREE STARTS ON THE LINE: True freshman left tackle Tree Babalade has taken over at the left tackle position, protecting the quarterback's blind side. He made his first start at Georgia and more than held his own. He finished the afternoon with a 90 PFF pass-blocking grade in 61 snaps, which was the fourth-best grade among all college football offensive tackles in Week 3. Babalade did not allow a sack and only surrendered a single pressure. He was named 247Sports' True Freshman of the Week for Week 3.

Defense

SANDERS IS FINGER-LICKIN' GOOD: Defensive tackle **T.J. Sanders** has been impressive this season. He leads the team with 4.5 sacks (10th in the SEC) and a team-high 8.5 tackles for loss among his 31 stops along with three pass breakups. He had a career-high nine tackles at Georgia with a pair of tackles for loss and a sack, earning co-SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week accolades.

ALEX HUNTS THEM DOWN: Alex Huntley has a pair of sacks among his 20 stops this season from his defensive tackle position. Both sacks came in the Gamecocks' win over Mississippi State, earning him SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week accolades. Huntley is known for his leadership, having served as his high school's student body president.

STRETCH THE DEFENSE: Jordan Strachan handles the EDGE rush position after missing most of last season with a torn ACL. Known as "Stretch," Strachan led the nation with 10.5 sacks in 2020 while playing at Georgia State. He had a pair of tackles for loss and a huge fourth quarter quarterback strip that helped secure the win against Mississippi State. He has 4.0 tackles for loss with a pair of sacks among his 14 stops in 2023.

DEBO IF YOU DO: If you have the name Debo and you're playing at Carolina, you better be good. **Debo Williams** has been that this season. He leads the squad with 70 tackles including 8.0 tackles for loss. He collected a career-best 14 stops against North Carolina, the most recorded in Week 1 in the SEC, and 14 again at Missouri. He added 11 stops both at Georgia and at Texas A&M, and is fourth in the SEC at 8.75 tackles per game.

SODA CITY SECONDARY: The Gamecock secondary has a local feel to it as **Nick Emmanwori** and **DQ Smith** are Columbia products from Irmo and Spring Valley High Schools respectively. Reserve safety **King-Demenian Ford** is from the metro area as well (Blythewood), while cornerback **O'Donnell Fortune** is from nearby Sumter.

DBU ON SPEED DIAL: Senior cornerback **Marcellas Dial** is next in line to follow in the footsteps of some great former Carolina and current NFL defensive backs that includes Stephon Gilmore, Jaycee Horn, Israel Mukuamu, Cam Smith and Darius Rush. Dial picked off three passes and recorded a dozen pass breakups a year ago. He leads the team and is tied for seventh in the league with seven pass breakups this season, including two last week at Texas A&M, and also recorded his first career sack against the Aggies.

NICK AT NITE: Sophomore safety **Nick Emmanwori** had just about as good of a freshman campaign as you can have a year ago. He earned first-team Freshman All-America honors from several media outlets and was the co-Joe Morrison Award winner as the MVP of the defense after leading the team with 85 tackles. He suffered a hamstring injury on his first play from scrimmage against North Carolina and did not play against Furman but has rebounded with 40 tackles over the last six contests and ranks 27th in the SEC with 5.86 tackles per game, including a season-high 10 stops at Georgia.

NEXT MAN UP: True freshman **Jalon Kilgore** was pressed into early action when Nick Emmanwori went down early in Game 1 and has remained in the starting lineup. He is second on the team with 64 tackles, including a dozen stops against North Carolina, a season-high 15 stops at Tennessee, along with his first career interception and 11 more stops against Florida. He ranks fifth in the SEC and tied for 51st in the country with 8.0 tackles per game which is also third in the FBS among freshmen.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted 15 passes in both 2021 and 2022. They have six in 2023.

Special Teams

BEAMER BALL 2.0: The Gamecocks have blocked 13 kicks in the last three years, including six in 2022, after logging eight over the previous five years (2016-20) combined. They got their first of the season against Florida when Tyreek Johnson blocked a field goal attempt and added two at Texas A&M, as Joshua Simon partially blocked a punt and Alex Huntley deflected a field goal try.

KAI CAN KICK: Junior Kai Kroeger has punted 36 times for a 44.6-yard average with a long of 60 this season. Eleven of the punts have been downed inside the 20 with six traveling 50 yards or more. Opponents have returned nine punts for just 48 yards, a 5.3-yard average.

KAI CAN PASS: Kai Kroeger completed a 32-yard pass in punt formation at Tennessee. He was 4-for-4 passing the ball in 2022, two on fake punts (vs. Georgia and at Florida) and two on fake field goals (vs. Vanderbilt and Notre Dame). In his career, Kroeger is a perfect 7-for-7 passing for 205 yards and three touchdowns and a gaudy 487.4 career quarterback rating.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: Kai Kroeger boomed the nation's fourth-longest punt in 2022, a careerlong 79-yarder versus Georgia State. It was the third 70-plus yard punt for Kroeger in his career. He owns three of the Gamecocks' 10 punts of 70-yards or more since 1979.

HE'S MADE A CAREER OF IT: Kai Kroeger has handled the punting duties since his arrival in Columbia. He has booted 192 punts for 8,484 yards, an average of 44.2-yards per punt. Of his 192 punts, 45 (23.4 pct) have traveled 50+ yards, while 71 (37 pct.) have been marked inside the 20 with just 12 touchbacks.

RESPECT FOR JETER: Mitch Jeter came into 2022 following in the footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two attempts. He is the only player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. He finished the 2022 season 11-for-11 in field goal tries. He connected on a career-high four fields at Missouri including a season-long 51-yarder. He is 10-for-12 this season with both misses coming from 50 or beyond, and is 21-for-23 (91.3 pct.) in his career.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: Mitch Jeter is 21-for-23 in field goal attempts. Dating back to 2021 when Parker White handled the field goal duties, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 37 of their last 40 field goal attempts (92.5 pct.). The only misses in that stretch were a 38-yarder against Vanderbilt in 2021, and a 50-yarder against Furman and a 51-yarder at Missouri in 2023.

DON'T RUN IT BACK: Mitch Jeter handles the kickoffs for South Carolina and was a preseason firstteam All-SEC selection in that role. He has kicked off 42 times in 2023 with 28 touchbacks and just seven returned for 124 yards (17.7 per return). He also perfectly executed an onside kick that he recovered to open the second half vs North Carolina.

SHANE BEAMER

HEAD COACH

(Virginia Tech, 1999) Third Year at South Carolina



A rising star in the head coaching ranks, Shane Beamer begins his third season leading the South Carolina program. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020. In his first two seasons he has defeated three coaches who have won national championships - Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP Top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country.

With a 15-11 mark, Beamer matched Joe Morrison, Steve Spurrier and Will Muschamp for the most wins by a head football coach in his first two seasons at Carolina.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bull-dogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children - two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Heisman Trophy hopeful Drake Maye threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns, North Carolina's upstart defense had nine sacks and the 21st-ranked Tar Heels beat border rival South Carolina 31-17 on Saturday night in a neutral-site game.

British Brooks ran for 103 yards and Omarion Hampton added two short TD runs for the Tar Heels.

Maye, who grew up in the Charlotte suburb of Huntersville, led scoring drives on five of North Carolina's first six possessions, excluding a kneel down at the end of the first half.

The redshirt sophomore made NFL-type throws — back-shoulder fades, deep outs and sidearm tosses under pressure — while repeatedly keeping alive plays with this feet. He wasn't perfect, with two interceptions in the game's final 18 minutes as the Tar Heels were trying to put the game away.

But Maye didn't need to be perfect on this day.

The Tar Heels got an unexpected lift from Gene Chizik's defense, which struggled most of last season. The Tar Heels had just 17 sacks all of 2022 and surrendered 30.8 points and 436.5 yards per game.

North Carolina moved the ball at will in the first half.

Maye hit Kobe Paysour in stride with a 34-yard touchdown strike along the right sideline to give the Tar Heels a 17-14 lead just before at halftime. North Carolina could have scored more had it not been for two drive-killing drops by wide receiver Gavin Blackwell in South Carolina territory, including one on fourth down.

Blackwell was pressed into a bigger role with starting wideouts Devontez Walker (ineligible) and Nate McCollum (lower body injury).

The Gamecocks appeared to gain momentum when they pulled one out of the Sean Payton playbook and recovered an onside kick to start the second half. But UNC smothered the drive before it began, forcing the Gamecocks to turn the ball over on downs.

The Tar Heels capitalized with Blackwell redeeming himself with a sliding 37-yard catch at the South Carolina 1 to set up Hampton's second touchdown. Maye then connected on an 18-yard completion with tight end John Copenhaver, who made a one-handed grab in the end zone to put the Tar Heels up 31-14.

THE TAKEAWAY

North Carolina: It was expected that Maye would play well, but UNC's defensive pressure turned some heads with Amari Gainer recording two sacks and Cedric Gray and Beau Atkinson combining for three. The Tar Heels made quality stops at key times, particularly in the second half.

South Carolina: The offensive line is going to need some big time help if the Gamecocks are to make some noise in the SEC. They gave up nine sacks to a defense that wasn't very good season and didn't give QB Spencer Rattler enough of a chance to make plays. Rattler threw for 353 yards on 30-of-39 passing.



South Carolina 47 Furman 21





COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina quarterback Spencer Ratter completed 25 of 27 passes for 345 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another TD to lead the Gamecocks to a 47-21 win over Furman on Saturday night.

Ratter, who returned to South Carolina (1-1) after an up-and-down 2022, is reminding people why he was a Heisman contender at Oklahoma before imploding, being benched and transferring.

Rattler hit long bombs, short slants and throws where he had to patiently find a third or fourth choice. He's averaging 348 yards passing in his past five games after throwing for just 198 yards a game in his first 10 outings for the Gamecocks.

Perhaps most important, Ratter was not sacked Saturday a week after North Carolina sacked him nine times.

There were still some concerns for South Carolina against the Football Championship Subdivision Paladins (1-1). The Gamecocks ran for just less than 3 yards a play behind an inexperienced and banged up offensive line. Both their two-point attempts failed.

Furman, ranked sixth in FCS, had a couple of long touchdown drives. Tyler Huff was 14-of-25 passing for 129 yards, while Joshua Harris caught six passes for 73 yards.

When South Carolina needed something, Rattler and Xavier Legette delivered. The game turned late in the second quarter when Furman punted with 23 seconds left and the Gamecocks up 20-14.

Rattler only needed 20 seconds to drive the Gamecocks 75 yards for a touchdown, the big play a 53-yard strike to Legette, who caught six passes for 118 yards.

The backups got some work too. LaNorris Sellers completed all four of his passes for 86 yards and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks, including a 50-yard pin-point TD to Tyshawn Russell.

THE TAKEAWAY

Furman: The Paladins take \$500,000 back to Greenville. The Huff-to-Harris passing combination proved it can work even against the likely best team on Furman's schedule.

South Carolina: Just getting a win was critical for a South Carolina team who lost its opener to North Carolina and still has No. 1 Georgia and No. 9 Tennessee later in September with Mississippi State in between.

ATHENS, GA. (AP) — Carson Beck passed for 269 yards, Daijun Edwards, Dillon Bell and Cash Jones ran for second-half touchdowns, and No. 1 Georgia rallied from 11 points down to beat South Carolina 24-14 on Saturday.

The two-time reigning national champion Bulldogs won their 20th consecutive game in uncharacteristic fashion, trotting off to a smattering of boos from their home fans and facing their biggest halftime deficit in nearly three years.

But Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) played like a champ after the teams returned to the field on a soggy, gloomy day between the hedges.

The defense totally shut down Spencer Rattler and the Gamecocks (1-2, 0-1), who couldn't build on their 14-3 lead at the break. They managed just 129 yards over the final two quarters, with Rattler held to 6 of 24 passing for 104 yards with two interceptions. The Beck-led offense came out from the break nearly perfect, scoring touchdowns on three of its first four possessions — the only blip being a drive that ended with a missed field goal. Beck finished 27 of 35 passing.

Edwards, who missed the first two games with a lingering knee injury, rushed for 118 yards on 20 carries.

Georgia took the second-half kickoff and quickly drove 75 yards in six plays, scoring its first TD of the day on Edwards' 7-yard touchdown.

After South Carolina went three-and-out, the Bulldogs ripped off a 49-yard drive that ended with Bell, a receiver who has been getting extended time at running back, taking it in from the 3 to give Georgia its first lead of the game before the third quarter was halfway done.

Finally, Georgia finished off the Gamecocks when Cash sauntered in from 13 yards out with just over 9 minutes remaining.

The first half was a stunner, as Rattler carved up the Bulldogs by completing 16 of 18 for 152 yards, including a 17-yard touchdown to Antwane Wells Jr. on a third-and-16 screen.

It was the first time Georgia has trailed since last year's playoff semifinal victory over Ohio State in the Peach Bowl.

The Bulldogs answered with Peyton Woodring's 31-yard field goal, but the Gamecocks tacked on another TD with just a minute left in the half after Woodring missed a chip shot from 28 yards.

Rattler guided South Carolina on a five-play, 80-yard drive that was capped by Dakereon Joyner powering in from the 2 off a direct snap to push the margin to double-digits.

Rattler completed two passes for 53 yards and scrambled twice for 20 yards on the lightning-quick possession, which was helped along by a 15-yard facemask penalty on Georgia's Warren Brinson.

The final play of the half summed it up for the Bulldogs: Beck was sacked near midfield as the clock ran out with Georgia facing its largest halftime deficit since the Bulldogs trailed Florida 38-21 in the Cocktail Party rivalry on Nov. 7, 2020.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have shown a lot of promise under coach Shane Beamer, and their performance over the first two quarters against the nation's top-ranked team was certainly impressive. But the second-half meltdown demonstrated they're not quite ready for prime time in the SEC.

Georgia: The Bulldogs' running game got a big boost from the return of Edwards, who provided the sort of explosiveness they'd been missing. But Georgia appears to have a problem in its kicking game, which has traditionally been one of its strongest areas. Woodring is just 3 of 6 on the year, including two misses from inside of 30 yards. He also was wide right on a 43-yarder against the Gamecocks.

South Carolina 37 Mississippi State 30

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler went 18-of-20 passing for 288 yards and three touchdowns to lead South Carolina to a 37-30 win over Mississippi State on Saturday night.

Rattler's favorite target, Xavier Legette, caught five passes for 189 yards, including touchdowns of 76 and 75 yards for the Gamecocks (2-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference).

South Carolina tried to establish the ground game — the Gamecocks attempted 47 rushes — but when they needed something, they turned to Rattler, the Oklahoma transfer who in his past seven games has finally shown why he was once one of the Sooners most highly touted recruits.

Rattler also ran eight times for 43 yards. Mario Anderson was the Gamecocks' leading rusher with 88 yards on 26 carries,

After three weeks of pounding the ball on the ground with inconsistent results, Mississippi State (2-2, 0-2) returned to the kind of Air Raid passing attack the Bulldogs used under coach Mike Leach, who died in December.

Will Rogers threw for a career best 487 yards on 30-of-48 passing with a touchdown and an interception. The senior vaulted from sixth to third on the SEC all-time passing list with 11,668 yards, passing Peyton Manning of Tennessee, Chris Leak of Florida and David Greene of Georgia.

Lideatrick Griffin set a school record with 256 yards receiving on seven catches.

But Rogers had an interception in the red zone and a fumble in a game where both defenses struggled to get stops. South Carolina had 99- and a 98-yard touchdown drives to open the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

Mississippi State: The loss put the Bulldogs in a hole in the SEC. They will need to find two SEC wins somewhere to continue their streak of 13 straight seasons going to a bowl. Maybe getting back to passing is the answer? Mississippi State gained 519 yards, by far their best against a Football Bowl Subdivision team this season.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks needed a win in a tough September and got it. With Clemson left on the non-conference schedule, South Carolina could need four SEC wins to get to a bowl. And if Rattler continues to play at this high of a level, that is well in reach.

KNOXVILLE, TENN. (AP) — The mission for No. 21 Tennessee on Saturday night against South Carolina was to dictate the game from the trenches.

The domination ultimately paved the way, with Joe Milton throwing for 239 yards and Tennessee sacking Spencer Rattler six times in a 41-20 victory.

Jaylen Wright ran for 123 yards and a touchdown for the Volunteers (4-1, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) in their first game against the Gamecocks (2-3, 1-2) since a meltdown last season that cost them a spot in the College Football Playoffs.

"This was a line of scrimmage game," Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said. "We challenged (the players on offense and defense) all week. They had to own it."

Vols defensive lineman James Pearce Jr. had two sacks.

"We had to play together and play relentless," Pearce said. "(Heupel) was preaching all week that we've got to take over the game."

South Carolina struggled on third down (2 of 14) and fourth down (2 of 5).

"When you (struggle on third and fourth down) you make it tough on yourself," Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said.

Kamal Hadden returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown to give Tennessee a 24-10 lead at halftime.

"I trust Spencer in that situation," Beamer said.

Rattler threw for 164 yards and Mario Anderson ran for 101 yards, with a 75-yarder for a score.

"We just didn't find a rhythm all night," Rattler said. "We're 2-3, but it doesn't feel like 2-3. It's their Super Bowl. Congrats to them."

Milton targeted slot receiver Squirrel White nine times and he caught all nine for 104 yards, including an amazing 50-yarder that set up a touchdown.

"I didn't even see the ball," White said about the pass that came with a defender draped in front of his face. "I felt the ball hit my hands and just held onto it.

ODDS & ENDS

Tennessee's Cooper Mays, generally regarded as one of the top centers in the SEC, saw his first action of the seasont. Midway through preseason camp, Mays underwent an unspecified medical procedure. At the time, he was expected to be ready for the start of the season. Five weeks later, he finally made his debut. ... A special guest of the Vols was former quarterback Hendon Hooker. Now a rookie with the Detroit Lions, Hooker was able to visit because the Lions played Thursday night. It was the South Carolina game last year when Hooker suffered a torn ACL, which derailed his Heisman Trophy campaign. ... Vols receiver Bru McCoy, a redshirt senior transfer from Southern California, was taken from the field on a stretcher after a right leg injury midway through the second quarter.

POLL IMPLICATIONS

Still smarting from a frustrating loss to Florida a couple weeks ago, Tennessee is slowly climbing its way back up the ladder. The victory over the Gamecocks added a bit more credibility than the conquest of UTSA, but the Vols' next couple opponents — Texas A&M and Alabama — would be very impressive.



COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Graham Mertz threw for a career-best 423 yards and three touchdowns, the last a 21-yard throw to Ricky Pearsall with 47 seconds left, and Florida rallied from 10 points down in the fourth quarter to beat South Carolina 41-39 on Saturday.

The Gators (5-2, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) looked finished when Spencer Rattler connected for his fourth TD to Joshua Simon for a 37-27 lead with 9:11 to play.

But Mertz followed with a pair of 75-yard touchdown drives to pull off the comeback. He hit tight end Arlis Broadingham on a 4-yard scoring pass to cut the lead to 37-34 with 4:40 left.

The Gators forced a punt on South Carolina's next series and Mertz was off to the races once more. Pearsall caught a 26-yard pass on fourth-and-10, then Eugene Wilson III collected a pass that bounced off a teammate's hand to reach the Gamecocks' 16.

Mertz gave a shoulder fake on the game-winning throw and Pearsall was wide open for the catch.

Safety Miguel Mitchell picked off Rattler on South Carolina's final possession. The Gators took a safety with 4 seconds left for their second straight SEC win.

The comeback ruined a brilliant performance by South Carolina's Rattler, who passed for 313 yards and four touchdowns.

The Gamecocks (2-4, 1-3) have lost two straight and three of their last four.

The Gamecocks trailed 27-24 on the last of four Trey Smack field goals midway through the third quarter. Two series later, Rattler led the go-ahead drive that included his 27-yard run into Florida territory and a 20-yard scoring toss to Trey Knox for a 31-27 lead.

Rattler was at it again the next time he got the ball, finishing a 70-yard drive with a 33-yard scoring toss to tight end Joshua Simon.

The first half was a classic shootout with the teams trading long drives and big plays. The teams combined for 521 yards and 26 first downs in a half where neither defense could make a stop.

Florida scored on four of its five first-half possessions and Smack's fourth field goal, from 28 yards, sent the team into halftime ahead 24-21.

Rattler connected with four different receivers on his touchdowns, including a 20-yard toss to tailback Mario Anderson where the Division II transfer leaped over safety Miguel Mitchell to reach the end zone.

THE TAKEAWAY

Florida: The Gators pulled off the comeback behind Mertz, who came into the game second in the nation in pass completion percentage (80 percent). They shook off a lackluster first 20 minutes of the second half and got hot when it counted most.

South Carolina: During their bye week, the Gamecocks had hoped they could fix what went wrong in a 41-20 loss at Tennessee two weeks ago. It looked they had solved some problems before their pass rush got caught flat-footed at the end and let Mertz and the Gators pull off an unexpected rally.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Cody Schrader ran for 159 yards and two touchdowns and No. 20 Missouri sacked Spencer Rattler six times in a 34-12 victory over South Carolina on Saturday.

Missouri (7-1, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) has seven victories in its first eight games for the first time since 2013.

Brady Cook completed 15 of 25 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score, and Luther Burden III caught five passes for 97 yards and a TD.

Rattler completed 23 of 40 passes for 217 yards, and South Carolina kicker Mitch Jeter converted four of five field goals.

After South Carolina (2-5, 1-4) cut it to 24-12 with 10:31 left on Jeter's goal, Schrader sealed it with an 11-yard touchdown run with 2:46 to go.

Cook capped an 87-yard drive with a 17-yard rushing touchdown, and Harrison Mevis hit a 21-yard field goal in the second quarter to give Missouri a 24-0 lead. Jeter spoiled the shutout with a 51-yard field goal with 31 seconds left in the half.

Schrader had 10-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 46 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Missouri took a 7-0 lead when Cook threaded a 42-yard touchdown pass to Burden through double coverage with 6:31 remaining in the first.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Needs to win four of its last five games to become bowl eligible, but it is not slated to face any opponents currently in the Top 25 after facing ranked foes in four of its first seven contests.

Missouri: The Tigers did not allow a touchdown for the first time since beating Vanderbilt 41-0 on Nov. 28, 2020.

TROPHY STAYING PUT

Missouri is keeping the Mayor's Cup trophy given to the winner of the matchup between the two schools in cities named Columbia.

POLL IMPLICATIONS

Missouri is poised to rise at least a spot or two and will likely have its highest ranking since being ranked 14th at the 2014 season.



COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (AP) — Max Johnson threw for 249 yards and a touchdown and Texas A&M snapped a two-game skid with a 30-17 win over South Carolina Saturday.

The game was tied late in the second quarter before the Aggies (5-3, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) scored two touchdowns in less than a minute to take a 21-7 lead into halftime.

The Gamecocks cut it to 21-10 on a 49-yard field goal early in the third quarter.

Spencer Rattler threw a 23-yard pass to Nyck Harbor on third-and-9 before a 29-yard run by Mario Anderson got South Carolina to the 2. Rattler then found Joshua Simon in the back of the end zone for a touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter that cut the lead to 24-17.

But South Carolina (2-6, 1-5) couldn't get anything done on offense after that as the team lost a fourth straight game.

Texas A&M extended the lead to 27-17 on a 24-yard field goal with 11 minutes remaining.

South Carolina went for it on fourth-and-1 on the next drive and Rattler fumbled a low snap. He recovered it but was tackled for a loss of 2 on the play to give the Aggies the ball back.

They added a 52-yard field goal to extend the lead to 30-17 with about $7\frac{1}{2}$ minutes to go.

Rattler entered the game averaging 277 yards passing a game but managed just 176 yards and a touchdown Saturday against Texas A&M's tough defense. The Aggies hurried and harassed Rattler all day, and he was called for three intentional grounding on consecutive drives in the second quarter while trying to escape the rush.

Ainias Smith had 118 yards receiving and a 42-yard touchdown reception for his second 100-yard game this season to help the Aggies to the win.

Dakeron Joyner took a direct snap and ran 1-yard for a touchdown that put South Carolina up 7-0 with about two minutes left in the first quarter.

The Aggies tied it when Rueben Owens got great blocking and ran 14 yards for a touchdown with nine minutes remaining in the second.

A 1-yard touchdown run by Amari Daniels put Texas A&M up 14-7 less than two minutes before halftime. Johnson kept that drive going with a sneak on fourth-and-1 before a 26-yard reception by Smith on third-and-5 set up the score.

Rattler had his third intentional grounding penalty of the quarter on South Carolina's next drive and was sacked on the next play to force a punt.

Texas A&M needed just one play to extend the lead as Smith evaded multiple defenders on his 42-yard catch-and-run TD that made it 21-7 with 52 seconds to go in the half.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Rattler will have to limit his mistakes and more efficiently move the offense if South Carolina hopes to finish the season on a high note

Texas A&M: The Aggies played well at times but will need to play more consistently if they hope to continue to win in SEC play with tougher opponents coming in the next few weeks.
