### GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- Dawn Staley begins her 24th season as a head coach and 16th at South Carolina with a completely new starting lineup. The Gamecocks lost all five starters from last season, and five of their 11 players are new to the program this season.
- While the names may have changed, the talent is still there with eight McDonald's All-Americans on the roster, including 2023 SEC Sixth Woman of the Year Kamilla Cardoso and SEC All-Freshman selection Raven Johnson.
- The Gamecocks are more guard dominant this season with five dynamic backcourt players. All have the ability to score at all three levels and can distribute the ball as well.
- Three-point shooting, often seen as an Achilles heel of the Gamecocks, will be a weapon this season, as evidenced by the exhibition game. South Carolina shot 46.2 percent (6-13) from the arc in the first half against Rutgers and finished the game with 10 3s.
- Those guards still have access to the power and athleticism of South Carolina's post players, who will maintain the Staley pillars of rebounding and defense in the paint.
- Expect the Gamecocks to play fast and aggressive offensively this season. South Carolina scored 100 points in its exhibition game against Rutgers, including a 31-point fourth quarter that saw mostly newcomers play a bulk of the minutes.
- South Carolina's exhibition against Rutgers came about via a waiver from the NCAA to play a Div. I team in honor of the late Nikki McCray-Penson, who was not only a pillar in the game of women's basketball but served as an assistant coach on both staves.
- South Carolina is 9-5 all-time in games not played on U.S. soil, including an 8-2 mark in the Staley era – 5-0 in the Bahamas, 2-0 in Mexico, 1-2 in Canada.

## A Perennial Power

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 12 seasons, including six 30-win seasons in the last nine campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four five times in the last eight NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 and 2022 National Championships. They have been ranked in every AP Poll since Dec. 10, 2012, including a top-10 spot every week since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Gamecocks have amassed 63 AP No. 1 rankings all-time, the fourth-most by a program in the history of that poll.

Under head coach Dawn Staley's leadership, nine Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 19 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. In the last nine seasons, 14 Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 10 first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks in the last six years. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year and one is a two-time WNBA MVP and two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year.

## The Notre Dame Series

The Gamecocks and Fighting Irish have met five times ahead of tonight's game with at least one team ranked every time. Notre Dame leads the series 3-2.

While the series began with a pair of Gamecock wins in a home-and-home series in the 1980-81 and 1981-82 seasons, the other three meetings have been on a neutral court in South Carolina's Dawn Staley era with all three going to the Irish.

Most recently, then-No. 6 Notre Dame eked out an 85-92 win over then-No. 3 South Carolina on Nov. 26, 2017, in the title game of the Gulf Coast Showcase. It was also the Irish who ended the Gamecocks' first Final Four run with a last-second 66-65 win on Nov. 5, 2015.

## Season Openers

South Carolina is 13-2 in season openers under head coach Dawn Staley with the two losses coming in her first three seasons at the helm. Four of those 15 season openers were against ranked opponents with two on the road.

In the first on Nov. 12, 2010, the unranked Gamecocks lost to #5 Xavier 84-65 in Columbia. The next two came against Ohio State – at home #2 South Carolina defeated the #6 Buckeyes 88-80 on Nov. 13, 2015, then a year later the #4 Gamecocks topped #7 Ohio State in Columbus 92-80 on Nov. 14, 2016. In the most recent, #1 South Carolina traveled to #5 NC State on Nov. 9, 2021, and brought home a 66-57 victory.

## Neutral Stance

The Gamecocks are 160-96 (.625) all-time on a neutral court. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is 77-27 in games played at neutral sites (.740), including a 28-10 (.737) record in regular-season outings on neutral courts.

## TEAM THEME: LOVE

As with most seasons, the LOVE theme has many meanings, all of which are rooted in loving the game of women's basketball. Staley often notes that "if you love the game, it will love you back" – and her career as a player and now a coach is evidence of that.

For her team, loving basketball is more than loving the wins and the trophies and the cheers from fans. That's just one side of the relationship. The pursuit of those means also loving the commitment and the sacrifice and the discipline required to get better every day, and it even means loving the doubt and criticism of others.

For the FAMS – the program's loyal fanbase – loving basketball means investing their time and money, it means saving their vacation days to come to games, and it means pouring their energy into the program's success. In return, Gamecock FAMS are part of a community that puts aside all other differences to share their love of the game and of being such an integral part of Staley's program.



## Ranked Readings

Against ranked teams, South Carolina is 106-67 (.613) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 91-28 (.765) against ranked teams.

## Ranking Review

For the first time since the end of the 2020-21 season, the Gamecocks are not ranked atop either national poll. South Carolina instead opens the season at No. 6 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll and holds the No. 4 spot in the preseason USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll.

The Gamecocks have been in the AP Top 10 every week since the 2019-20 preseason poll, and their 207 straight appearances in the AP Poll, dating back to Dec. 10, 2012, marks the third-longest active streak in the nation and the 12th longest all-time (trailing just Long Beach State 209 and La. Tech 214 to make it into the top 10).

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll.

## The Staley File

In her 24th season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .755 (574-186) winning percentage, which ranks 11th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 15 seasons of experience and ninth among those with at least 20 years in the position. The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year and a Naismith Coach of the Year and the first Black head coach to win multiple national championships in men's or women's basketball. She has been named national coach of the year by at least one organization four times, including three times in the last four seasons.

In her 16th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (402) with a program-record 12 postseason appearances (11 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for all five of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023) and the first NCAA National Championships in program history (2017, 2022).

After claiming seven SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 183 SEC games, the most among active

league coaches and third all-time – trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her 12.2 SEC wins average per season is the best in league history among coaches with more than two years in the league, and her .769 SEC winning percentage (183-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history.

## The 2023-24 Gamecocks

The Gamecocks return six members of their 2023 NCAA Final Four squad, including 2023 SEC Sixth Woman of the Year Cardoso and SEC All-Freshman selection and team assist leader Raven Johnson. Juniors Sania Feagin and Bree Hall as well as sophomores Chloe Kitts and Ashlyn Watkins round out the returning group. Staley added senior transfers Te-Hina Paopao and Sakima Walker, and the group of veterans have welcomed three freshmen who, along with early enrollee Kitts, comprised the No. 2 signing class in the nation – 13th-ranked Malaysia Fulwiley, 25th-ranked Tessa Johnson and 40th-ranked Sahnya Jah.

## It Starts Here

South Carolina's six returning players have combined for just three career starts in a Gamecock uniform. Including games at another NCAA Div. I institution, that number rises to all of 26.

## Watch It!

Senior center Kamilla Cardoso has gotten the lion's share of the preseason awards attention, but senior transfer Te-Hina Paopao and junior Sania Feagin have seen some accolades as well.

Cardoso earned spots on the preseason watch lists for the Wade Trophy and the Lisa Leslie Center of the Year Award. She was a Preseason All-SEC First-Team selection by both the media and coaches as well.

Paopao picked up her first SEC recognition when the coaches tabbed her for Preseason All-

SEC Second-Team honors. She also was one of 20 named to the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Award watch list.

For the third season in a row, Feagin was named to the Katrina McClain Power Forward of the Year Award watch list.

## Opponent Files

South Carolina's regular-season schedule includes 11 games against teams ranked in at least one of the two national polls. Five of those games come in the first five weeks of the season, including the first two out of the gate against #10/10 Notre Dame and #14/11 Maryland.

Five of the games against preseason ranked teams are at home – #14/11 Maryland (Nov. 12), #25/rv Mississippi State (Jan. 7), #12/16 Ole Miss (Feb. 4), #2/2 UConn (Feb. 11), #11/12 Tennessee (Mar. 3).

Five others are true road games – at #16/17 North Carolina (Nov. 30), at #rv/19 Duke (Dec. 3), at #1/1 LSU (Jan. 25), at #11/12 Tennessee (Feb. 15). Another two are at neutral sites – #10/10 Notre Dame (Nov. 6) and #5/7 Utah (Dec. 10).

**Serious Scheduling**

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has never been afraid to challenge her team to prepare it for the rigors of March and April. Over the last 10 seasons, the Gamecocks have played an average of 9.7 regular-season games against ranked opponents.

Three teams hit the high-water mark of 12 – 2019-20 (11-1), 2017-18 (6-6), 2015-16 (11-1). Each of those years four of the 12 games were non-conference matchups. The 2021-22 edition of the Gamecocks went a perfect 11-0 against its regular-season ranked opponents, including six such non-conference wins.

Last season's team actually faced the fewest regular-season ranked games, playing just five games such games – three against top-five foes.. Just one of the five games was against an SEC rival.

**Vamos Kamilla!**

From ACC Freshman of the Year in 2021 to SEC Sixth Woman of the Year in 2023, South Carolina senior Kamilla Cardoso can be a dominant player on both ends of the court and is ready to stand firmly in that spotlight this season.

On the Wade Trophy and Lisa Leslie Award watch lists, Cardoso is the Gamecocks' top returning scorer (9.8 ppg) and rebounder (8.5 rpg). Playing just 18.8 minutes per game, she was third in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (.208) and seventh in total rebounding percentage (.232). Cardoso was 21st in the nation (2nd in the SEC) with 3.72 offensive rebounds per game and third in the SEC in rebounding per game. Defensively her 1.94 blocks per game were 28th in the nation and fourth in the league.

The 6-foot-7 Brazilian scored on 42.2 percent of her offensive rebounds, and 32.0 percent of her points came on putbacks (3.1 ppg).

**That's So Raven**

SEC All-Freshman point guard Raven Johnson is a dynamic change of speed off the bench whose competitive fire and court vision affect the game on both sides of the ball. Staley lauds Johnson's instincts, court vision and ability to handle the big stage.

A big reason the Gamecocks were 22nd in the nation in assists per game, Johnson's 3.4 assists per game were ninth in the SEC.. More importantly, her 2.37 assist-to-

turnover ratio was 17th in the nation (2nd in the SEC). That mark was also the fifth best in program history and the best of all-time among Gamecock freshmen.

Johnson handed out five or more assists 12 times last season, and her turnovers out-numbered her assists just six times last season and never by more than one.

In the postseason, Johnson kicked it up another notch, handing out 4.1 assists per game while keeping her scoring steady at 4.1 points per game.

**Transfer Transactions**

South Carolina added a pair of transfers this summer in guard Te-Hina Paopao and center Sakima Walker. Both come in as seniors but have the option of taking an additional COVID year.

Paopao is a three-time All-Pac-12 selection, including two first-team selections, who averaged 12.5 points and 3.6 assists over her three seasons at Oregon. She capped her time there with career highs of 42.4 percent 3-point shooting, 2.3 made 3s per game (2nd in the Pac-12) and 3.3 assists per outing.

Walker arrives in Columbia with an NJCAA National Championship and Player of the Year trophy. At 6-foot-5, she can score, rebound and project the rim. Walker averaged 16.7 points and 8.2 rebounds per game with 13 double-doubles in 32 games.

**Great Gamecock Fans**

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last nine seasons and announced a 16-for-16 campaign to secure 16,000 season tickets to honor Staley's 16th season in Columbia.

The Gamecocks have had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for seven straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season) dating back to the first ever sellout of 18,000 on Feb. 8, 2016.

Excluding the COVID limited-attendance season of 2020-21, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans 111 consecutive regular-season games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.

**Everybody's All-American**

The Gamecocks' 11-woman roster includes eight McDonald's All-Americans – Kamilla Cardoso, Sania Feagin, MiLaysia Fulwiley, Bree Hall, Raven Johnson, Tessa Johnson, Te-Hina Paopao and Ashlyn Watkins.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 23 McDonald's All-Americans, including 18 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen.

**Staffing Boost**

For the first time since 2018, head coach Dawn Staley had changes to her staff this offseason, including a boost in numbers thanks to a change in the NCAA rules governing the number of assistant coaches.

Associate head coach Lisa Boyer and assistant coach Jolette Law remain the heart of the staff. Long-time assistant Fred Chmiel left the Gamecocks for his first NCAA Div. I head coaching position, making room for Winston Gandy who brought six years of NCAA coaching experience and three seasons of NBA player development to Columbia.

The new NCAA legislation allowed Staley to elevate Mary Wooley into an assistant coach role. Wooley was previously the recruiting coordinator on Staley's staff for several seasons but also had 10 seasons of experience as an assistant coach with four different teams. Staley also brought former Gamecock Khadijah Sessions to her staff this summer after the 2016 grad spent the last few seasons coaching at the high school level.

**WNBA Pipeline**

With 10 alumnae playing in the WNBA in 2023, South Carolina had the third-most players in the league of any college program.

Since the first Staley-trained Gamecock was drafted in 2015 (Aleighsa Welch), a total of 14 South Carolina players have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Ten of those went in the first round, including two No. 1 overall picks.

With five players taken in the 2023 WNBA Draft, South Carolina joined Notre Dame (2019) and Tennessee (2008, 1999) as the only programs to have at least that many players taken in a single draft. Three of those five picks were in the first round, making South Carolina one of just seven programs to hit that benchmark.

In proof Staley sends players to the league ready, five Gamecocks have earned All-Rookie Team honors, including three WNBA Rookies of the Year – Allisha Gray (2017), Aja Wilson (2018), Aliyah Boston (2023).

Gamecock alum Aja Wilson has risen to become the face of the WNBA. The two-time league MVP (2020, 2022), two-time Defensive Player of the Year (2022, 2023) and five-time All-Star led her Las Vegas Aces to back-to-back WNBA Championships (2022, 2023). Wilson's former AAU and South Carolina teammate Alaina Coates joined her on the 2023 title team.

# DAWN STALEY Head Coach

16th Season at South Carolina • 24th Season in Career

Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight when she was hired in May 2008, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have reached many firsts – National Championships, NCAA Final Fours, No. 1 rankings, SEC regular-season and tournament titles, SEC Players of the Year, National Players of the Year, WNBA No. 1 Draft picks, an undefeated regular season, and No. 1 recruiting classes – to name the most notable.

In Staley's 15 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks, highlights include:

- Two National Championships (2017, 2022)
- Five NCAA Final Fours in the last eight tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023)
- Ranking in the AP Top 25 every week since Dec. 10, 2012, the third-longest active streak in the nation (207)
- Six 30-win seasons, including a program-record 36 wins in 2022-23
- Seven SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2020, 2022, 2023)
- Seven SEC Tournament titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020, 2021, 2023)
- Three top-two recruiting classes (#1 in 2021, #1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- Nine NCAA Attendance titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012.

In 23 seasons as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 13 25-win seasons, a total of 19 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 197 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 63 in the No. 1 spot – the fourth most times in the top spot in the history of that poll. Her .755 winning percentage (574-186) ranks 10th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and 13th all-time.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to gold in the 2018 FIBA World Cup, and the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals and served as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 15 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year four times with her 2020 unanimous selection making her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award. She is a six-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the only Gamecock basketball coach – men's or women's – to amass 300 victories at South Carolina and became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau. She is the program's all-time winningest coach (402) with a program-record 12 postseason appearances and is the only black head coach in men's or women's basketball to win multiple national championships.

In the vaunted SEC, Staley's 183 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her .769 SEC winning percentage (183-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark in 2015-16, 2019-20 and 2022-23.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped 10 Gamecocks collect 25 All-America selections, three to pick up seven SEC Player of the Year honors, three to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of seven times, two to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 18 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 37 times, including 20 first-team selections. In the last nine years, 14 Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 10 first-rounders, highlighted by two overall No. 1 picks. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year.
