QUICKLY: The South Carolina Gamecocks (3-6, 1-5 SEC) return to Southeastern Conference action this week when they host the Vanderbilt Commodores (2-8, 0-6 SEC) in an SEC Eastern Division matchup on Saturday, Nov. 11. Game time has been set for noon ET and the contest will be televised on the SEC Network. South Carolina is looking to put together back-to-back wins for the first time this season and keep its bowl hopes alive, while Vanderbilt enters the contest looking to snap an eight-game losing streak and a 14-game losing skid to the Gamecocks.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's contest will be televised on the SEC Network. Taylor Zarzour will provide the play-by play while Matt Stinchcomb adds the color commentary. Taylor Davis will handle the sideline duties. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Great quarterbacks in Todd Ellis (32nd season) and Tommy Suggs (51st season) in the booth. Chet Tucker is in his first season as the sideline reporter.

SALUTE THE TROOPS: Gamecock Athletics will host its annual "Salute the Troops" game this week. Prior to the game, fans will be able to explore various military vehicles in Gamecock Village presented by Farm Bureau Insurance. During the game multiple veterans who have made an impact in the community will be recognized and halftime will feature the annual Salute the Troops show recognizing all those who are currently serving or who have served in the armed forces.

GAMECOCK REWIND: The Gamecocks are 3-6 in 2023 including a 1-5 mark in SEC play. Four of their six losses have come to teams ranked in the AP Top-25 while five of the six losses have come away from Williams-Brice Stadium. The nine teams that Carolina has played have a combined 59-23 record, a .720 winning percentage. South Carolina opened the season with a 31-17 loss to No. 21 North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Classic in Charlotte, before posting a convincing 47-21 win over FCS nationally-ranked Furman. The Gamecocks opened SEC play at two-time defending national champion Georgia in Week 3, falling by a 24-14 count. Carolina rebounded with a 37-30 win over Mississippi State to even its record at 2-2. The Gamecocks lost their next four, all conference games, falling at No. 21 Tennessee by a 41-20 count, surrendering a 10-point fourth quarter lead in a 41-39 home loss to Florida, then dropping a 34-12 decision at No. 20 Missouri before coming up short at Texas A&M, 30-17. Carolina snapped the skid last week with a 38-28 non-conference win over Jacksonville State. The Gamecocks have been led all season by quarterback **Spencer Rattler** and wide receiver **Xavier Legette**. Rattler has completed 212-of-304 passes for 2,516 yards with 14 touchdowns and six interceptions. He ranks third in the SEC and 16th in the nation with 279.6 passing yards per game and is fourth in the SEC and 12th in the country with a 69.7 percent completion rate. Legette has caught 50 passes for 973 yards, averaging 108.1 yards per game and 19.5 yards per catch with five touchdowns. He ranks second in the league and sixth among all FBS players in receiving yards per game and is third in the SEC and 14th in the country in yards per reception.

THEY COME TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY: The Gamecocks have played in front of a sold-out stadium six times this season. Carolina has sold out three of its four home games, drawing 78,281 in the home opener against Furman, 78,311 in the SEC home opener versus Mississippi State, and a season-high 79,247 against Florida for Homecoming. The Gamecocks rank 16th in the country in average home attendance at 77,797 and have announced a sellout in 10 of its last 12 home games. The Gamecocks also played in front of sold-out crowds of 92,746 at Georgia, 101,915 at Tennessee and 62,621 at Missouri this season. The second-largest attended game of 95,297 at Texas A&M was not a sellout.

CAROLINA VS. VANDY: This is the 33rd all-time meeting between South Carolina and Vanderbilt. The Gamecocks hold a commanding 28-4 advantage, including a 13-2 mark when the teams have met in Columbia and a 15-2 record when the games have been played in Nashville. The teams met just once (1961) before they became SEC Eastern Division rivals in 1992 and have met every year since.

IN DOMINATING FASHION: The Gamecocks have won each of the last 14 games between the two squads, their longest winning streak in the series, and 21 of the last 23 meetings between these two SEC Eastern Division rivals. Of the Division I FBS opponents against whom the Gamecocks have at least 10 all-time meetings, Carolina has its best winning percentage against Vanderbilt at .875. In the previous 32 outings, Vanderbilt has tallied more than 17 points just eight times (24 in 2003, 28 in 2005, 24 in 2008, 25 in 2013, a record-high 34 in 2014, 27 in 2017, 20 in 2021 and 27 in 2022).

THE OUTLIERS: Vanderbilt's four wins in the series have come in back-to-back fashion on two occasions - first in 1998 and '99, then again in 2007 and '08. Those four wins have been by a combined total of 22 points (17-14, 11-10, 17-6 and 24-17).

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: South Carolina put up 17 first-quarter points, had a season-high 31 points in the first half, and never looked back in a 38-27 win at Vanderbilt on Nov. 5, 2021, in Nashville. Quarterback **Spencer Rattler** had a solid performance, completing 18-of-26 passes for 200 yards and three touchdowns. **Antwane "Juice" Wells Jr.** caught four passes for 110 yards and two scores in the win. He had a 17-yard TD reception from **Dakereon Joyner**. **Kai Kroeger** booted five punts for a 53.6-yard average, including kicks of 69 and 66 yards, with two of his punts downed inside the 20, earning co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. In addition, Kroeger, who was also the holder on placements, completed a 16-yard pass on a fake field goal for a first down.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: Former graduate assistant **Zeb Noland** came off the bench to engineer a 75-yard touchdown drive, connecting with **Xavier Legette** on a 9-yard scoring pass with 37 seconds left to lift South Carolina to a 21-20 win over Vanderbilt in Williams-Brice Stadium on Oct. 16, 2021. South Carolina jumped out to a 13-3 first quarter advantage, but Vandy scored the next 17 points to take a lead before Noland's heroics. Carolina rolled up 429 yards of offense but turned the ball over four times in the contest.

IT'S NEVER TOO LATE: With this year's game scheduled for Nov. 11, it will mark the third-latest date in the year that the two teams have met. The only later dates were a 23-7 Carolina win in the first meeting between the two schools on Nov. 25, 1961, in Nashville, then they met again on Nov. 21, 1995, in Columbia, a Gamecock 52-14 victory.

DROPPING THE ANCHOR: Vanderbilt has recorded at least two wins over every SEC Eastern Division team since its last win over South Carolina in 2008. They have topped Kentucky six times (2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2022), Tennessee five times (2012, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2018), Missouri three times (2012, 2015, 2019), Florida twice (2013, 2022) and Georgia twice (2013, 2016) in that span.

A South Carolina win over Vanderbilt would...

- ◆ Keep the Gamecocks' hopes alive for a bowl game.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks' winning streak over Vanderbilt to 15-straight games.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks back-to-back wins for the first time since defeating Tennessee and Clemson to end the 2022 regular season.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2023 marks the 130th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 117th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 632-612-44, a .508 winning pct. Since the start of the 21st century, Carolina is 166-130, a .561 mark.

SCHEDULING QUIRK: South Carolina played its final road game of the regular season in the last week of October at Texas A&M. The Gamecocks' final four games are all scheduled for Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia during the month of November. South Carolina is the only school in the FBS to have each of its final four games of the 2023 regular season at home. The Gamecocks host Jacksonville State, Vanderbilt, Kentucky and Clemson in the month of November.

BATTLE TESTED: South Carolina has had the toughest schedule in the nation, including playing four ranked teams in nine weeks. The Gamecocks opened the 2023 season with a loss to No. 21 North Carolina before falling at top-ranked Georgia two weeks later. The gauntlet continued with a loss at No. 21 Tennessee to close out September. They also lost at No. 20 Missouri. The nine opponents that Carolina has played are a combined 59-23. Removing games involving FCS teams, South Carolina's opponents played are 53-20, a .726 winning percentage, the top mark in the FBS. Ten of its 12 regular season opponents currently own a record of .500 or better. Mississippi State and Vanderbilt are the only opponents on the slate with a losing mark. Going back to last season, seven of South Carolina's last 12 opponents were ranked in the AP Top-25 at the time of the game.

THE LAST TIME OUT: Spencer Rattler threw for 399 yards and two touchdowns and Xavier Legette matched his career-high with nine receptions for a career-high 217 yards and two scores, but it took a Stone Blanton 88-yard "Pick-Six" in the waning minutes to secure South Carolina's 38-28 win over Jacksonville State in a battle of Gamecocks last Saturday afternoon in Columbia. The two offenses combined for 909 yards, but Carolina won the decisive turnover battle 4-1 in earning the win.

XAVIER IS LEGIT: Xavier Legette logged a career-high 217 receiving yards in the win over Jax State. He scored on TD passes of 5 and 65 yards and added receptions of 52- and 44-yards. The 217 receiving yards were the second-highest total in school history, behind only Pharoah Cooper's mark of 233, set in 2014, and just the fifth 200-yard receiving game in school history. It was Legette's fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season, tying for third in the Carolina record books.

YOU CAN'T RATTLE SPENCER: Spencer Rattler threw for a season-high 399 yards in the win over Jacksonville State. It was the eighth-highest single-game mark in school history and his second-highest total as a Gamecock.

STONE TO THE HOUSE: With the game in the balance and just two minutes remaining on the clock, Stone Blanton stepped in front of a Jacksonville State pass for his first career interception and returned it 88 yards to paydirt to seal the South Carolina win. Blanton's 88-yard return was the ninth-longest interception return in school history.

FAST STARTS: The Gamecocks have tallied 73 first-quarter points, the most of any quarter this season. They have scored a first-quarter touchdown in eight of nine games after doing so in just six of 13 games in 2022. Carolina has held a lead in 11 of their last 12 games, the lone exception being the loss earlier this season at Missouri.

REVOLVING DOOR: The Gamecocks have used a different starting five along the offensive line in every game this season. Carolina is the only team in the country to start nine different offensive lines this season. Nick Gargiulo is the only offensive lineman to start every game. He has made five starts at left guard and the last four at center. The Gamecocks have started three left tackles, three left guards, two centers, two right guards and four right tackles this season. START ME UP: Eighteen players, including five true freshmen, have made their first start as a Gamecock this season:

North Carolina (6): OT Sidney Fugar, OG Nick Gargiulo, OT Cason Henry, TE Trey Knox, DE Bryan Thomas Jr. and LB Stone Blanton.

Furman (2): TE Joshua Simon and S Jalon Kilgore.

Georgia (2): OL Tree Babalade and DE Drew Tuazama.

Mississippi State (2): WR O'Mega Blake and DT T.J. Sanders.

Tennessee (3): OG Trovon Baugh, RB Mario Anderson and DE Tyreek Johnson.

Florida (1): DE Elijah Davis.

Texas A&M (2): WR Nyck Harbor, CB Judge Collier.

ON THE JOB TRAINING: The Gamecocks have started five true freshmen this season. Defensive back **Jalon Kilgore** was the first member of the 2023 recruiting class to earn a start when he moved into the starting lineup in Week 2. Left tackle **Tree Babalade** has made six starts, while right guard **Trovon Baugh** has made five-straight starts on the offensive line. Only five schools have more freshmen starts along the offensive line than Carolina. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** and CB **Judge Collier** made their initial starts at Texas A&M.

THE FINAL COUNTDOWN: The Gamecocks list 10 players whose eligibility would have expired had not the NCAA allowed the 2020 COVID-19 season to be a "free" year. Those "Super" seniors are WR **Ahmarean Brown**, OL **Nick Gargiulo**, DB **DeAngelo Gibbs**, WR **Dakereon Joyner**, TE **Trey Knox**, WR **Xavier Legette**, WR **Eddie Lewis**, OL **Jaylen Nichols**, EDGE **Jordan Strachan** and RB **D.J. Twitty**. Nichols, who has been sidelined all season with a knee injury, could return in 2024.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: Twenty-two Gamecocks had their degrees in hand when the 2023 season began. Sixteen have earned a diploma from the University of South Carolina, including **Ahmarean Brown**, **Terrell Dawkins**, **Marcellas Dial**, **B.J. Gibson**, **Alex Herrera**, **Tyreek Johnson**, **Trai Jones**, **Dakereon Joyner**, **Xavier Legette**, **Bam Martin-Scott**, **Jakai Moore**, **Jaylen Nichols**, **David Spaulding**, **Jordan Strachan**, **D.J. Twitty** and **Tyshawn Wannamaker**. **Nick Gargiulo** (Yale), **DeAngelo Gibbs** (Tennessee), **Trey Knox** (Arkansas), **Eddie Lewis** (Memphis), **Joshua Simon** (Western Kentucky) and **Drew Tuazama** (UAB) have degrees from other four-year institutions.

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks wrap up their 2023 SEC slate next Saturday when they host the Kentucky Wildcats. The Gamecocks lead the all-time series by a 19-14-1 count, including a 9-6-1 advantage when playing in Columbia. South Carolina won last year's contest in Lexington by a 24-14 score.

LOOKING FURTHER AHEAD: The Gamecocks will host LSU, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M at Williams-Brice Stadium in 2024, and will travel to Alabama, Kentucky, Oklahoma and Vanderbilt. Dates and kick times will be announced at a later date. The non-conference portion of the 2024 slate includes home games against Old Dominion (Aug. 31), Akron (Sept. 21) and Wofford (Nov. 23) and a road game at Clemson (Nov. 30).

Offense

NEW LOOK OFFENSE: **Dowell Loggains** is in his first season as the Gamecocks' offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. Loggains spent the past two seasons as the tight end coach at Arkansas. Previously, he logged 16 years in the NFL with six different organizations, including seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Behind the outstanding performance of quarterback **Spencer Rattler**, the Gamecocks rank fourth in the SEC and 17th in the country in passing offense at 296.2 yards per game. Carolina has not averaged over 300 yards passing per game since the 1995 season when they finished at 306.6 passing yards per contest behind the efforts of Steve Taneyhill.

QB1: Spencer Rattler is the unquestioned leader of the team. The senior QB has completed 212-of-304 passes (69.7 pct.) for 2,516 yards and 14 touchdowns with six picks. Four of his six interceptions have come late in the fourth quarter with the Gamecocks trailing and he was "just trying to make a play." Rattler, a transfer from Oklahoma, is 26-13 in 39 career starts including an 11-11 mark in 22 starts at Carolina.

GOOD HOME COOKIN': Spencer Rattler has been outstanding in the friendly confines of Williams-Brice Stadium this season. In four home games he has completed 93-of-115 passes, 80.9 percent, for 1,345 yards (336.25 per game) with 12 touchdowns and two interceptions.

PLAYING HIS BEST BALL: Despite playing some of the best teams in the country including seven ranked opponents in his last 12 contests, **Spencer Rattler** has been on fire for a year now:

WHERE HE RANKS: Despite being pressured a ton this season (the Gamecocks are 13th in the SEC and 124th in the country in sacks allowed) **Spencer Rattler** continues to play at a high level. He ranks fifth in the SEC and 24th in the country in total offense per game (286.6), third in the SEC and 16th in the nation in passing yards per game (279.6), seventh in the SEC and 38th overall in passing efficiency (150.5) and fourth in the SEC and 12th in the country in completion pct. (69.7).

THE 300 MARK: **Spencer Rattler** has thrown for more than 300 yards four times this season and in six of his last 12 games overall. The 353-yard effort against North Carolina was the third-highest season-opening game posted in school history, while the 399-yard performance against Jacksonville State was the eight-best single-game mark in

Carolina history. With seven career 300-yard passing games, he is third on the school's all-time list. The record is 10, held by Todd Ellis, while Steve Taneyhill is second on the list with eight.

NEARLY PERFECT: **Spencer Rattler** completed 25-of-27 passes against Furman, a 92.6 percent completion rate. That figures as one of the best single-game marks in school history. Connor Shaw completed 20-consecutive passes in going 20-for-21, 95.2 percent, against Missouri in 2012, while Gordon Beckham was 16-of-17, 94.1 percent, against North Carolina in 1981. Rattler was also 18-of-20 against Mississippi State.

HOT FROM THE START: **Spencer Rattler** has come out on fire in every game this season. In the first quarter of the nine games played, he has completed 58-of-67 passes (86.6 pct.) for 677 yards and three touchdowns. He completed his last four first-quarter passes against North Carolina, then went 10-for-10 in the first quarter against both Furman and Georgia and was 5-for-5 versus Mississippi State, extending his first quarter streak to 29-consecutive completions, before missing on his first attempt at Tennessee. He completed his first 15 passes against Furman, his first 10 at Georgia, his first 17 versus Mississippi State and his first 10 against Florida. He was 7-for-8 for 118 yards in the first quarter versus Jacksonville State.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: **Spencer Rattler** was one of the five permanent team captains for the 2022 season and is the only one who returned in 2023. The Gamecocks select game captains each week and Rattler has been selected to represent Carolina at the coin toss in six of the nine games.

DOUBLE DUTY DOTY: **Luke Doty**, who is listed as the No. 2 QB on the depth chart, has been used more as a slot receiver this season. He has responded with 11 catches for 109 yards and a touchdown, including the first three catches of his career in the season-opener against North Carolina and a 36-yard touchdown reception against Furman. He also completed 2-of-4 passes for 17 yards against the Paladins, his only pass attempts since Sept. 29, 2022 against SC State.

SUPER MARIO: **Mario Anderson** was a First-Team Division II All-American last season at Newberry where he rushed for over 1,500 yards with 19 touchdowns. Through the first three games this season he logged just eight carries for 41 yards. Over the last six games he has 100 carries for 502 yards and two scores, rushing 26 times for 88 yards and his first FBS touchdown against Mississippi State, then going for 101 on just 10 carries at Tennessee, including a 75-yard scoring burst. He rushed for 98 yards against Florida, 68 at Mizzou, 72 at Texas A&M, and 75 against Jacksonville State. He's averaging 5.0 yards per carry. He is the Gamecocks' nomination for the Bursworth Award, given to a player who started his career as a walk-on.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: **Mario Anderson** rushed for 101 yards in his first start at Tennessee, becoming the first Gamecock to rush for 100 yards in a game since MarShawn Lloyd went for 169 against Charlotte in Game 4 last season. His 75-yard run from scrimmage was the longest rush since Kevin Harris scampered 88 yards against Vanderbilt in 2020.

TAKING ONE FOR THE TEAM: Versatile performer **Dakereon Joyner** moved to the running backs

room for his final campaign and earned the starting role in the first four games. Joyner began his career as a quarterback, then spent the bulk of his time at wide receiver before making the transition to running back in the spring. He has rushed 49 times for 115 yards this season and owns five of the team's 13 rushing TDs. He is also third on the squad with 21 receptions and has returned four kickoffs for 64 yards.

ALL THE RIGHT MOVES: **Dakereon Joyner** has pledged to donate money to a non-profit organization or a charity for every touchdown he scores this season. He hopes to use his platform to give back, inspire others and make a difference in people's lives. He leads the team and is tied for ninth in the SEC with five rushing touchdowns.

TRIPLE THREAT: **Dakereon Joyner** has thrown for 430 yards and two touchdowns on 29-of-42 passing, rushed for 440 yards and nine scores on 113 carries and has caught 66 passes for 559 yards and three TDs in his career. He has completed his last 12 pass attempts for 261 yards and two scores.

X MARKS THE SPOT: Senior wide receiver **Xavier Legette** has been outstanding since having a breakthrough game in the 2022 TaxSlayer Bowl. This season he has five 100-yard receiving games, including a career-high 217-yard, 2-touchdown effort against Jacksonville State. He began the year with a nine-catch, 178-yard outing against North Carolina, the top performance in the country in Week 1. He has also gone over the 100-yard mark against Furman (118), Mississippi State (189) and Florida (110). He had 35 career receptions for 345 yards and three touchdowns through his first 40 games but has 57 catches for 1,051 yards and seven scores in his last 10 contests.

AWARD WORTHY: Senior wide receiver **Xavier Legette** was recently added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List and was named a Midseason Second-Team All-American by the Associated Press. Legette ranks second in the SEC and sixth in the country in receiving yards per game at 108.1, sixth in the league and 38th in the nation with 5.6 catches per game, third in the conference and 14th in the land in yards per catch at 19.5 and is second in the SEC and 16th in the country with 126.0 all-purpose yards per game.

THE FREAK: True freshman **Nyck Harbor** landed the No. 1 spot on Bruce Feldman's annual "Freaks List." Feldman wrote, "In two decades of doing this, I don't think I've ever had a true freshman No. 1, but this player is different. What makes Harbor 'different' is the combination of his large size and unadulterated speed. He stands at 6-foot-5, 241 pounds. Add onto that the five-star signee's 10.2-second 100m time and you get freakish." Harbor caught his first pass against Furman, a seven-yard touchdown reception, hauled in a 45-yard reception against Florida and had a pair of receptions for 50 yards, along with a nine-yard rush at Missouri. He was targeted a game-high eight times, recording six receptions for a season-high 59 yards at Texas A&M.

SCHOOL OF HARD KNOX: Graduate transfer **Trey Knox** has become more of a focal point in the Carolina offense. The Arkansas transfer who

played for Dowell Loggains with the Razorbacks, is second on the squad with 32 receptions for 277 yards and a touchdown. He has 26 receptions for 217 yards in his last five contests after logging just six catches for 60 yards through three contests. He has led the team in receptions in three of the last five games but sat out last week with an injury.

SIMON SEZ: With Trey Knox sidelined with an injury, **Joshua Simon** made his presence felt against Jacksonville State. The grad transfer tight end was targeted 11 times and caught seven passes for 64 yards against Jacksonville State. He entered the game with just a dozen receptions for 97 yards through the first eight contests.

ELI'S COMING: The offensive line has been bolstered by the addition of Yale graduate **Nick Gargiulo**. Gargiulo has shown why he was the lone captain of Team 149 at Yale, as his leadership and toughness quickly made him a leader up front. He is the only O-lineman to start every game in 2023.

IF A TREE STARTS ON THE LINE: True freshman left tackle **Tree Babalade** has taken over at the left tackle position. He made his first start at Georgia and more than held his own. He finished the afternoon with a 90 PFF pass-blocking grade in 61 snaps, which was the fourth-best grade among all college football offensive tackles in Week 3. Babalade did not allow a sack and only surrendered a single pressure. He was named 247Sports' True Freshman of the Week for Week 3.

DEBO IF YOU DO: If you have the name Debo and you're playing at Carolina, you better be good. **Debo Williams** has been that this season. He leads the squad with 83 tackles including 8.0 tackles for loss. He collected a career-best 14 stops against North Carolina, the most recorded in Week 1 in the SEC, and 14 again at Missouri. He has been in double figures in tackles five times and ranks third in the SEC at 9.22 tackles per game.

SODA CITY SECONDARY: The Gamecock secondary has a local feel to it as **Nick Emmanwori** and **DQ Smith** are Columbia products from Irmo and Spring Valley High Schools respectively. Reserve safety **King-Demenian Ford** is from the metro area as well (Blythewood), while cornerback **O'Donnell Fortune** is from nearby Sumter.

DBU ON SPEED DIAL: Senior cornerback **Marcellas Dial** is next in line to follow in the footsteps of some great former Carolina and current NFL defensive backs that includes Stephon Gilmore, Jaycee Horn, Israel Mukuamu, Cam Smith and Darius Rush. Dial picked off three passes and recorded a dozen pass breakups a year ago. He leads the team and is tied for fifth in the league with nine passes defended this season, including two in each of the last two games. He also recorded his first career sack at Texas A&M.

HAVING GOOD FORTUNE: Cornerback **O'Donnell Fortune** logged his second interception of the season in the final minutes against Jacksonville State. The Sumter, S.C. product is tied for the team lead with four career interceptions.

NICK AT NITE: Sophomore safety **Nick Emmanwori** had just about as good of a freshman campaign as you can have a year ago. He earned first-team Freshman All-America honors from several media outlets and was the co-Joe Morrison Award winner as the MVP of the defense after leading the team with 85 tackles. He suffered a hamstring injury on his first play from scrimmage against North Carolina and did not play against Furman but has come back with 50 tackles over the last seven contests and ranks tied for 20th in the SEC with 6.4 tackles per game, including a season-high 10 stops at Georgia and again versus Jacksonville State.

NEXT MAN UP: True freshman **Jalon Kilgore** was pressed into early action when Nick Emmanwori went down early in Game 1 and has remained in the starting lineup. He is second on the team with 67 tackles, including a dozen stops against North Carolina, a season-high 15 stops at Tennessee, along with his first career interception and 11 more stops against Florida. He ranks tied for sixth in the SEC with 7.4 tackles per game which is also sixth in the FBS among all freshmen.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks intercepted 15 passes in both 2021 and 2022. They have eight in 2023. O'Donnell Fortune leads the way with two in 2023 and four in his career.

Defense

SANDERS IS FINGER-LICKIN' GOOD: Defensive tackle **T.J. Sanders** leads the team with 4.5 sacks and a team-high 8.5 tackles for loss among his 36 stops along with three pass breakups. He had a career-high nine tackles at Georgia with a pair of tackles for loss and a sack, earning co-SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week accolades.

ALEX HUNTS THEM DOWN: **Alex Huntley** has a pair of sacks among his 26 stops this season from his defensive tackle position. Both sacks came in the Gamecocks' win over Mississippi State, earning him SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week accolades. Huntley is known for his leadership, having served as his high school's student body president.

TWO-WAY HEMINGWAY: **Tonka Hemingway** came up big on both sides of the ball against Jacksonville State. He scored on a two-yard run on offense and recovered a fumble on defense that led to a South Carolina touchdown. He has 4.5 tackles for loss and a team-high five quarterback hurries with 1.5 sacks among his 25 stops this season.

Special Teams

BEAMER BALL 2.0: The Gamecocks have blocked 13 kicks in the last three years, three this season and six in 2022, after logging eight blocks over the previous five years (2016-20) combined. They got their first of the season against Florida when **Tyreek Johnson** blocked a field goal attempt and added two at Texas A&M, as **Joshua Simon** partially blocked a punt and **Alex Huntley** deflected a field goal try.

KAI CAN KICK: Junior **Kai Kroeger** has punted 43 times for a 43.5-yard average with a long of 60 this season. Fourteen of the punts have been downed inside the 20 with seven traveling 50 yards or more. Opponents have returned nine punts for just 48 yards, a 5.3-yard average.

KAI CAN PASS: **Kai Kroeger** tossed the first incomplete pass of his career against Jacksonville State on a fake punt attempt and is now 1-for-2 on the season for 32 yards. He was 4-for-4 passing the ball in 2022, two on fake punts (vs. Georgia and at Florida) and two on fake field goals (vs. Vanderbilt and Notre Dame). In his career, Kroeger is 7-for-8 passing for 205 yards and three touchdowns and a gaudy 426.5 career quarterback rating.

HE'S MADE A CAREER OF IT: **Kai Kroeger** has handled the punting duties since his arrival in Columbia. He has booted 199 punts for 8,769 yards, an average of 44.1-yards per punt, second in school history. Of his 199 punts, 46 (23.1 pct) have traveled 50+ yards, while 74 (37.2 pct.) have been marked inside the 20 with just 13 touchbacks.

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: **Kai Kroeger** boomed the nation's fourth-longest punt in 2022, a career-long 79-yarder versus Georgia State. It was the third 70-plus yard punt for Kroeger in his career. He owns three of the Gamecocks' 10 punts of 70-yards or more since 1979.

RESPECT FOR JETER: **Mitch Jeter** came into 2022 following in the footsteps left by Parker White, the school's all-time leading scorer. Jeter responded with 53- and 51-yard field goals on his first two attempts. He is the only player in school history to boom a pair of 50-yard field goals in the same game. He finished the 2022 season 11-for-11 in field goal tries. He is 11-for-13 this season with both misses coming from 50 or beyond. He connected on a career-high four field goals at Missouri earlier this season, including a season-long 51-yarder. He is 22-for-24 (91.7 pct.) in his career.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: **Mitch Jeter** is 22-for-24 in field goal attempts. Dating back to 2021 when Parker White handled the field goal duties, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 38 of their last 41 field goal attempts (92.7 pct.). The only misses in that stretch were a 38-yarder against Vanderbilt in 2021, and a 50-yarder against Furman and a 51-yarder at Missouri in 2023.

DON'T RUN IT BACK: **Mitch Jeter** handles the kick-offs for South Carolina and was a preseason first-team All-SEC selection in that role. He has kicked off 49 times in 2023 with 33 touchbacks and just seven returned for 124 yards (17.7 per return). He also perfectly executed an onside kick that he recovered to open the second half vs North Carolina.

THIRD YEAR AT SOUTH CAROLINA



A rising star in the head coaching ranks, Shane Beamer begins his third season leading the South Carolina program. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020. In his first two seasons he has defeated three coaches who have won national championships - Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP Top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country.

With a 15-11 mark, Beamer matched Joe Morrison, Steve Spurrier and Will Muschamp for the most wins by a head football coach in his first two seasons at Carolina.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Heisman Trophy hopeful Drake Maye threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns, North Carolina's upstart defense had nine sacks and the 21st-ranked Tar Heels beat border rival South Carolina 31-17 on Saturday night in a neutral-site game.

British Brooks ran for 103 yards and Omarion Hampton added two short TD runs for the Tar Heels.

Maye, who grew up in the Charlotte suburb of Huntersville, led scoring drives on five of North Carolina's first six possessions, excluding a kneel down at the end of the first half.

The redshirt sophomore made NFL-type throws — back-shoulder fades, deep outs and sidearm tosses under pressure — while repeatedly keeping alive plays with his feet. He wasn't perfect, with two interceptions in the game's final 18 minutes as the Tar Heels were trying to put the game away.

But Maye didn't need to be perfect on this day.

The Tar Heels got an unexpected lift from Gene Chizik's defense, which struggled most of last season. The Tar Heels had just 17 sacks all of 2022 and surrendered 30.8 points and 436.5 yards per game.

North Carolina moved the ball at will in the first half.

Maye hit Kobe Paysour in stride with a 34-yard touchdown strike along the right sideline to give the Tar Heels a 17-14 lead just before at halftime. North Carolina could have scored more had it not been for two drive-killing drops by wide receiver Gavin Blackwell in South Carolina territory, including one on fourth down.

Blackwell was pressed into a bigger role with starting wideouts Devontez Walker (ineligible) and Nate McCollum (lower body injury).

The Gamecocks appeared to gain momentum when they pulled one out of the Sean Payton playbook and recovered an onside kick to start the second half. But UNC smothered the drive before it began, forcing the Gamecocks to turn the ball over on downs.

The Tar Heels capitalized with Blackwell redeeming himself with a sliding 37-yard catch at the South Carolina 1 to set up Hampton's second touchdown. Maye then connected on an 18-yard completion with tight end John Copenhaver, who made a one-handed grab in the end zone to put the Tar Heels up 31-14.

THE TAKEAWAY

North Carolina: It was expected that Maye would play well, but UNC's defensive pressure turned some heads with Amari Gainer recording two sacks and Cedric Gray and Beau Atkinson combining for three. The Tar Heels made quality stops at key times, particularly in the second half.

South Carolina: The offensive line is going to need some big time help if the Gamecocks are to make some noise in the SEC. They gave up nine sacks to a defense that wasn't very good season and didn't give QB Spencer Rattler enough of a chance to make plays. Rattler threw for 353 yards on 30-of-39 passing.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina quarterback Spencer Ratter completed 25 of 27 passes for 345 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another TD to lead the Gamecocks to a 47-21 win over Furman on Saturday night.

Ratter, who returned to South Carolina (1-1) after an up-and-down 2022, is reminding people why he was a Heisman contender at Oklahoma before imploding, being benched and transferring.

Rattler hit long bombs, short slants and throws where he had to patiently find a third or fourth choice. He's averaging 348 yards passing in his past five games after throwing for just 198 yards a game in his first 10 outings for the Gamecocks.

Perhaps most important, Ratter was not sacked Saturday a week after North Carolina sacked him nine times.

There were still some concerns for South Carolina against the Football Championship Subdivision Paladins (1-1). The Gamecocks ran for just less than 3 yards a play behind an inexperienced and banged up offensive line. Both their two-point attempts failed.

Furman, ranked sixth in FCS, had a couple of long touchdown drives. Tyler Huff was 14-of-25 passing for 129 yards, while Joshua Harris caught six passes for 73 yards.

When South Carolina needed something, Rattler and Xavier Legette delivered. The game turned late in the second quarter when Furman punted with 23 seconds left and the Gamecocks up 20-14.

Rattler only needed 20 seconds to drive the Gamecocks 75 yards for a touchdown, the big play a 53-yard strike to Legette, who caught six passes for 118 yards.

The backups got some work too. LaNorris Sellers completed all four of his passes for 86 yards and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks, including a 50-yard pin-point TD to Tyshawn Russell.

THE TAKEAWAY

Furman: The Paladins take \$500,000 back to Greenville. The Huff-to-Harris passing combination proved it can work even against the likely best team on Furman's schedule.

South Carolina: Just getting a win was critical for a South Carolina team who lost its opener to North Carolina and still has No. 1 Georgia and No. 9 Tennessee later in September with Mississippi State in between.

ATHENS, GA. (AP) — Carson Beck passed for 269 yards, Daijun Edwards, Dillon Bell and Cash Jones ran for second-half touchdowns, and No. 1 Georgia rallied from 11 points down to beat South Carolina 24-14 on Saturday.

The two-time reigning national champion Bulldogs won their 20th consecutive game in uncharacteristic fashion, trotting off to a smattering of boos from their home fans and facing their biggest halftime deficit in nearly three years.

But Georgia (3-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) played like a champ after the teams returned to the field on a soggy, gloomy day between the hedges.

The defense totally shut down Spencer Rattler and the Gamecocks (1-2, 0-1), who couldn't build on their 14-3 lead at the break. They managed just 129 yards over the final two quarters, with Rattler held to 6 of 24 passing for 104 yards with two interceptions. The Beck-led offense came out from the break nearly perfect, scoring touchdowns on three of its first four possessions — the only blip being a drive that ended with a missed field goal. Beck finished 27 of 35 passing.

Edwards, who missed the first two games with a lingering knee injury, rushed for 118 yards on 20 carries.

Georgia took the second-half kickoff and quickly drove 75 yards in six plays, scoring its first TD of the day on Edwards' 7-yard touchdown.

After South Carolina went three-and-out, the Bulldogs ripped off a 49-yard drive that ended with Bell, a receiver who has been getting extended time at running back, taking it in from the 3 to give Georgia its first lead of the game before the third quarter was halfway done.

Finally, Georgia finished off the Gamecocks when Cash sauntered in from 13 yards out with just over 9 minutes remaining.

The first half was a stunner, as Rattler carved up the Bulldogs by completing 16 of 18 for 152 yards, including a 17-yard touchdown to Antwane Wells Jr. on a third-and-16 screen.

It was the first time Georgia has trailed since last year's playoff semifinal victory over Ohio State in the Peach Bowl.

The Bulldogs answered with Peyton Woodring's 31-yard field goal, but the Gamecocks tacked on another TD with just a minute left in the half after Woodring missed a chip shot from 28 yards.

Rattler guided South Carolina on a five-play, 80-yard drive that was capped by Dakereon Joyner powering in from the 2 off a direct snap to push the margin to double-digits.

Rattler completed two passes for 53 yards and scrambled twice for 20 yards on the lightning-quick possession, which was helped along by a 15-yard facemask penalty on Georgia's Warren Brinson.

The final play of the half summed it up for the Bulldogs: Beck was sacked near midfield as the clock ran out with Georgia facing its largest halftime deficit since the Bulldogs trailed Florida 38-21 in the Cocktail Party rivalry on Nov. 7, 2020.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have shown a lot of promise under coach Shane Beamer, and their performance over the first two quarters against the nation's top-ranked team was certainly impressive. But the second-half meltdown demonstrated they're not quite ready for prime time in the SEC.

Georgia: The Bulldogs' running game got a big boost from the return of Edwards, who provided the sort of explosiveness they'd been missing. But Georgia appears to have a problem in its kicking game, which has traditionally been one of its strongest areas. Woodring is just 3 of 6 on the year, including two misses from inside of 30 yards. He also was wide right on a 43-yarder against the Gamecocks.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Spencer Rattler went 18-of-20 passing for 288 yards and three touchdowns to lead South Carolina to a 37-30 win over Mississippi State on Saturday night.

Rattler's favorite target, Xavier Legette, caught five passes for 189 yards, including touchdowns of 76 and 75 yards for the Gamecocks (2-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference).

South Carolina tried to establish the ground game — the Gamecocks attempted 47 rushes — but when they needed something, they turned to Rattler, the Oklahoma transfer who in his past seven games has finally shown why he was once one of the Sooners most highly touted recruits.

Rattler also ran eight times for 43 yards. Mario Anderson was the Gamecocks' leading rusher with 88 yards on 26 carries.

After three weeks of pounding the ball on the ground with inconsistent results, Mississippi State (2-2, 0-2) returned to the kind of Air Raid passing attack the Bulldogs used under coach Mike Leach, who died in December.

Will Rogers threw for a career best 487 yards on 30-of-48 passing with a touchdown and an interception. The senior vaulted from sixth to third on the SEC all-time passing list with 11,668 yards, passing Peyton Manning of Tennessee, Chris Leak of Florida and David Greene of Georgia.

Lideatrick Griffin set a school record with 256 yards receiving on seven catches.

But Rogers had an interception in the red zone and a fumble in a game where both defenses struggled to get stops. South Carolina had 99- and a 98-yard touchdown drives to open the game.

THE TAKEAWAY

Mississippi State: The loss put the Bulldogs in a hole in the SEC. They will need to find two SEC wins somewhere to continue their streak of 13 straight seasons going to a bowl. Maybe getting back to passing is the answer? Mississippi State gained 519 yards, by far their best against a Football Bowl Subdivision team this season.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks needed a win in a tough September and got it. With Clemson left on the non-conference schedule, South Carolina could need four SEC wins to get to a bowl. And if Rattler continues to play at this high of a level, that is well in reach.

KNOXVILLE, TENN. (AP) — The mission for No. 21 Tennessee on Saturday night against South Carolina was to dictate the game from the trenches.

The domination ultimately paved the way, with Joe Milton throwing for 239 yards and Tennessee sacking Spencer Rattler six times in a 41-20 victory.

Jaylen Wright ran for 123 yards and a touchdown for the Volunteers (4-1, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) in their first game against the Gamecocks (2-3, 1-2) since a meltdown last season that cost them a spot in the College Football Playoffs.

“This was a line of scrimmage game,” Tennessee coach Josh Heupel said. “We challenged (the players on offense and defense) all week. They had to own it.”

Vols defensive lineman James Pearce Jr. had two sacks.

“We had to play together and play relentless,” Pearce said. “(Heupel) was preaching all week that we’ve got to take over the game.”

South Carolina struggled on third down (2 of 14) and fourth down (2 of 5).

“When you (struggle on third and fourth down) you make it tough on yourself,” Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said.

Kamal Hadden returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown to give Tennessee a 24-10 lead at halftime.

“I trust Spencer in that situation,” Beamer said.

Rattler threw for 164 yards and Mario Anderson ran for 101 yards, with a 75-yarder for a score.

“We just didn’t find a rhythm all night,” Rattler said. “We’re 2-3, but it doesn’t feel like 2-3. It’s their Super Bowl. Congrats to them.”

Milton targeted slot receiver Squirrel White nine times and he caught all nine for 104 yards, including an amazing 50-yarder that set up a touchdown.

“I didn’t even see the ball,” White said about the pass that came with a defender draped in front of his face. “I felt the ball hit my hands and just held onto it.

ODDS & ENDS

Tennessee’s Cooper Mays, generally regarded as one of the top centers in the SEC, saw his first action of the season. Midway through preseason camp, Mays underwent an unspecified medical procedure. At the time, he was expected to be ready for the start of the season. Five weeks later, he finally made his debut. ... A special guest of the Vols was former quarterback Hendon Hooker. Now a rookie with the Detroit Lions, Hooker was able to visit because the Lions played Thursday night. It was the South Carolina game last year when Hooker suffered a torn ACL, which derailed his Heisman Trophy campaign. ... Vols receiver Bru McCoy, a red-shirt senior transfer from Southern California, was taken from the field on a stretcher after a right leg injury midway through the second quarter.

POLL IMPLICATIONS

Still smarting from a frustrating loss to Florida a couple weeks ago, Tennessee is slowly climbing its way back up the ladder. The victory over the Gamecocks added a bit more credibility than the conquest of UTSA, but the Vols’ next couple opponents — Texas A&M and Alabama — would be very impressive.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Graham Mertz threw for a career-best 423 yards and three touchdowns, the last a 21-yard throw to Ricky Pearsall with 47 seconds left, and Florida rallied from 10 points down in the fourth quarter to beat South Carolina 41-39 on Saturday.

The Gators (5-2, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) looked finished when Spencer Rattler connected for his fourth TD to Joshua Simon for a 37-27 lead with 9:11 to play.

But Mertz followed with a pair of 75-yard touchdown drives to pull off the comeback. He hit tight end Arlis Boardingham on a 4-yard scoring pass to cut the lead to 37-34 with 4:40 left.

The Gators forced a punt on South Carolina's next series and Mertz was off to the races once more. Pearsall caught a 26-yard pass on fourth-and-10, then Eugene Wilson III collected a pass that bounced off a teammate's hand to reach the Gamecocks' 16.

Mertz gave a shoulder fake on the game-winning throw and Pearsall was wide open for the catch.

Safety Miguel Mitchell picked off Rattler on South Carolina's final possession. The Gators took a safety with 4 seconds left for their second straight SEC win.

The comeback ruined a brilliant performance by South Carolina's Rattler, who passed for 313 yards and four touchdowns.

The Gamecocks (2-4, 1-3) have lost two straight and three of their last four.

The Gamecocks trailed 27-24 on the last of four Trey Smack field goals midway through the third quarter. Two series later, Rattler led the go-ahead drive that included his 27-yard run into Florida territory and a 20-yard scoring toss to Trey Knox for a 31-27 lead.

Rattler was at it again the next time he got the ball, finishing a 70-yard drive with a 33-yard scoring toss to tight end Joshua Simon.

The first half was a classic shootout with the teams trading long drives and big plays. The teams combined for 521 yards and 26 first downs in a half where neither defense could make a stop.

Florida scored on four of its five first-half possessions and Smack's fourth field goal, from 28 yards, sent the team into halftime ahead 24-21.

Rattler connected with four different receivers on his touchdowns, including a 20-yard toss to tailback Mario Anderson where the Division II transfer leaped over safety Miguel Mitchell to reach the end zone.

THE TAKEAWAY

Florida: The Gators pulled off the comeback behind Mertz, who came into the game second in the nation in pass completion percentage (80 percent). They shook off a lackluster first 20 minutes of the second half and got hot when it counted most.

South Carolina: During their bye week, the Gamecocks had hoped they could fix what went wrong in a 41-20 loss at Tennessee two weeks ago. It looked they had solved some problems before their pass rush got caught flat-footed at the end and let Mertz and the Gators pull off an unexpected rally.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Cody Schrader ran for 159 yards and two touchdowns and No. 20 Missouri sacked Spencer Rattler six times in a 34-12 victory over South Carolina on Saturday.

Missouri (7-1, 3-1 Southeastern Conference) has seven victories in its first eight games for the first time since 2013.

Brady Cook completed 15 of 25 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score, and Luther Burden III caught five passes for 97 yards and a TD.

Rattler completed 23 of 40 passes for 217 yards, and South Carolina kicker Mitch Jeter converted four of five field goals.

After South Carolina (2-5, 1-4) cut it to 24-12 with 10:31 left on Jeter's goal, Schrader sealed it with an 11-yard touchdown run with 2:46 to go.

Cook capped an 87-yard drive with a 17-yard rushing touchdown, and Harrison Mevis hit a 21-yard field goal in the second quarter to give Missouri a 24-0 lead. Jeter spoiled the shutout with a 51-yard field goal with 31 seconds left in the half.

Schrader had 10-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 46 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Missouri took a 7-0 lead when Cook threaded a 42-yard touchdown pass to Burden through double coverage with 6:31 remaining in the first.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Needs to win four of its last five games to become bowl eligible, but it is not slated to face any opponents currently in the Top 25 after facing ranked foes in four of its first seven contests.

Missouri: The Tigers did not allow a touchdown for the first time since beating Vanderbilt 41-0 on Nov. 28, 2020.

TROPHY STAYING PUT

Missouri is keeping the Mayor's Cup trophy given to the winner of the matchup between the two schools in cities named Columbia.

POLL IMPLICATIONS

Missouri is poised to rise at least a spot or two and will likely have its highest ranking since being ranked 14th at the 2014 season.

COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (AP) — Max Johnson threw for 249 yards and a touchdown and Texas A&M snapped a two-game skid with a 30-17 win over South Carolina Saturday.

The game was tied late in the second quarter before the Aggies (5-3, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) scored two touchdowns in less than a minute to take a 21-7 lead into halftime.

The Gamecocks cut it to 21-10 on a 49-yard field goal early in the third quarter.

Spencer Rattler threw a 23-yard pass to Nyck Harbor on third-and-9 before a 29-yard run by Mario Anderson got South Carolina to the 2. Rattler then found Joshua Simon in the back of the end zone for a touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter that cut the lead to 24-17.

But South Carolina (2-6, 1-5) couldn't get anything done on offense after that as the team lost a fourth straight game.

Texas A&M extended the lead to 27-17 on a 24-yard field goal with 11 minutes remaining.

South Carolina went for it on fourth-and-1 on the next drive and Rattler fumbled a low snap. He recovered it but was tackled for a loss of 2 on the play to give the Aggies the ball back.

They added a 52-yard field goal to extend the lead to 30-17 with about 7 1/2 minutes to go.

Rattler entered the game averaging 277 yards passing a game but managed just 176 yards and a touchdown Saturday against Texas A&M's tough defense. The Aggies hurried and harassed Rattler all day, and he was called for three intentional grounding on consecutive drives in the second quarter while trying to escape the rush.

Ainias Smith had 118 yards receiving and a 42-yard touchdown reception for his second 100-yard game this season to help the Aggies to the win.

Dakeron Joyner took a direct snap and ran 1-yard for a touchdown that put South Carolina up 7-0 with about two minutes left in the first quarter.

The Aggies tied it when Rueben Owens got great blocking and ran 14 yards for a touchdown with nine minutes remaining in the second.

A 1-yard touchdown run by Amari Daniels put Texas A&M up 14-7 less than two minutes before halftime. Johnson kept that drive going with a sneak on fourth-and-1 before a 26-yard reception by Smith on third-and-5 set up the score.

Rattler had his third intentional grounding penalty of the quarter on South Carolina's next drive and was sacked on the next play to force a punt.

Texas A&M needed just one play to extend the lead as Smith evaded multiple defenders on his 42-yard catch-and-run TD that made it 21-7 with 52 seconds to go in the half.

THE TAKEAWAY

South Carolina: Rattler will have to limit his mistakes and more efficiently move the offense if South Carolina hopes to finish the season on a high note.

Texas A&M: The Aggies played well at times but will need to play more consistently if they hope to continue to win in SEC play with tougher opponents coming in the next few weeks.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Xavier Legette caught nine passes for 217 yards and two touchdowns to lead South Carolina to a 38-28 win Saturday over Jacksonville State.

Spencer Rattler was 27-of-38 passing for 399 yards but outside of the two best players on the field, the game didn't increase hopes for fans of South Carolina (3-6, 1-5 Southeastern Conference) that the team can win three more in a row and make a bowl.

Jacksonville State (7-3, 5-1 Conference USA) committed four turnovers and the biggest mistake — a pass that South Carolina's Stone Blanton stepped in front of and ran back 88 yards for a touchdown with 2:02 left — finally did in their hopes for a first win over a SEC school since beating Ole Miss in 2010.

A Ron Wiggins fumble early in the fourth quarter led to South Carolina breaking a 28-all tie and Logan Smothers lost a fumble on a snap with 53 seconds left in the second quarter. Two completions to Leggette later, South Carolina took a 21-14 lead into the locker room.

Jacksonville State's last hope ended with a O'Donnell Fortune interception with 1:42 left in the game.

South Carolina came into the game averaging 86.1 yards a game rushing, fifth-worse in the country. They gained 89 yards on 38 carries Saturday, 40 of that on Mario Anderson's first carry of the game.

The only rushing TD came when 6-foot-3, 285-pound defensive lineman Tonka Hemingway rumbled over right end with his first-ever carry for a 2-yard score.

The offense load fell mostly to Rattler and Legette, who came into Saturday averaging 94.5 yards a game, the 11th-best total in the country.

Jacksonville State is in its final season transitioning from FCS to FBS and can play in a bowl game if not enough teams get the six wins needed to fill 82 spots. They failed to eliminate South Carolina from contention Saturday.

THE TAKEAWAY

Jacksonville State: It had plenty of chances to pick up a program defining win, but the mistakes were killers. Jacksonville State ran for 225 yards, the 27th straight game the team has gained over 100 yards.

South Carolina: A win is a win, especially when about to teeter out of bowl eligibility, but the lack of a running game, and the insistence to keep trying even when it fails, raises questions. South Carolina threw the ball 39 times for 399 yards and ran it 38 times for 89 yards on Saturday.
