Wide receiver who was also used in the return game... played five years of collegiate football including three at South Carolina... began his career at Georgia Tech... appeared in 54 career games making 27 starts... logged 92 career receptions for 1,136 yards and nine touchdowns... also rushed for one touchdown, returned a blocked punt for a score, and threw for another TD.

2023 (Super Senior)

Used a fifth-year of eligibility due to the COVID year of 2020... started seven of nine games in which he appeared... finished fourth on the squad with 26 receptions and third with 265 receiving yards... scored one touchdown... rushed twice for no yards and had one punt return for three yards... recorded a catch in every game he played in and had three or more receptions in six games... posted a six-catch, 42-yard effort against Furman... logged a season-high 47 receiving yards at Tennessee including a season-long 44-yard reception... first touchdown as a Gamecock came in the win over Vanderbilt, a 24-yard strike.

2022 (Senior)

Played in all 13 games, earning a pair of starts versus Charlotte and Tennessee... hauled in 23 passes for 188 yards, rushed five times for 50 yards and returned four punts for 55 yards and a score... returned a blocked punt 10 yards for a touchdown in the season-opener against Georgia State... caught a pass in 12 of 13 games... caught a season-high four passes for 22 yards in the Gator Bowl against Notre Dame... had a three-catch, 55-yard outing against Charlotte that included a season-long 26-yard reception... best rushing game was a three-carry, 39-yard effort versus Tennessee... returned a punt 37 yards at Clemson... tabbed a co-winner of the Most Improved award for the offense during spring drills... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

2021 (Junior)

Transfer from Georgia Tech who joined the team in January... saw action in all 13 games, making one start... caught 11 passes for 104 yards... logged two receptions for 15 yards in the season opener against Eastern Illinois... also had two catches against Troy... had his best game of the season in the Duke's Mayo Bowl win over North Carolina when he caught four passes for 61 yards, including a season-long 33-yard reception... recorded one carry for no yards and two punt returns for four yards... named to the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll.

2020 (Sophomore)

Started each of the first seven games for Georgia Tech before missing the final three games with an injury... caught 11 passes for 183 yards, 16.6 yards per catch, with one touchdown... also had two rushes with a touchdown and one punt return... best game came against Boston College when he matched his career-high with four receptions for a career-best 75 yards and a touchdown... also had a two-yard TD run in that contest... had a 40-yard reception at Syracuse... completed a nine-yard pass for a touchdown against Louisville.

2019 (Freshman)

Enrolled at Georgia Tech in January... appeared in all 12 games, making 10 starts for the Yellow Jackets... turned in an historic season, tying Calvin Johnson for most receiving touchdowns by a freshman at Tech with seven... posted a team-leading 396 yards on 21 receptions, 18.9 yards per catch... returned

three kicks for 59 yards, including a 33-yarder against NC State... also took back 10 punts for 34 yards with a long of 23 against USF... hauled in seven catches for more than 25 yards... began his career with a 28-yard touchdown reception at Clemson... logged a season-best 64 receiving yards, including a 42-yard

catch, at Temple... hauled in a 32-yard TD against North Carolina and had a 59-yard TD reception at Virginia... caught a TD pass in three-straight games against Miami, Pitt and Virginia... had a season-high four catches for 61 yards, including a 51-yarder vs. Pitt... caught a career-high two TDs versus NC State.

HIGH SCHOOL

Graduated from Jefferson High in Tampa, Fla. in Dec. 2018... logged 74 receptions for 1,348 yards and 13 touchdowns and ran for a pair of scores over his final two seasons, including 38 catches for 726 yards and seven scores as a senior in 2018... coached by Joe Midulla... placed fourth at the 2017 Florida 2A state track championships in the 100m... high honor roll student.

2023 Overcoming Adversity Award

Veteran defensive back who is the latest in a long line of standout Gamecock cornerbacks... former junior college defensive back who spent three years in Columbia... appeared in 38 games with 29 career starts for the Gamecocks, accounting for 114 tackles, three interceptions and 28 pass breakups... invited to the 2024 NFL Combine in Indianapolis.

2023 (Redshirt Senior)

Started all 12 games at cornerback... credited with 36 tackles including 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack... logged a team-high 10 pass breakups, tying for 10th in the SEC with 0.83 passes defended per game... posted a season high eight tackles against Georgia, one shy of his career high... broke up two passes in four different contests... had an eight-yard sack against Texas A&M, the first of his career, and a tackle for loss versus Clemson... selected by the coaches for the Overcoming Adversity Award at the postseason Senior Banquet.

2022 (Redshirt Junior)

Played in all 13 games, starting 10 at cornerback... registered 45 tackles with a team-leading three interceptions and a team-high 12 pass breakups... his three interceptions and his 15 passes defended were the third-highest totals in the SEC... his 1.2 passes defended per game tied for 24th in the country... totaled three tackles, a career-high three pass breakups and his first collegiate interception in the season-opener against Georgia State... picked off his second pass of the season against South Carolina State... credited with a career-high nine tackles in the win over Tennessee... earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his efforts against the Clemson when he finished with two tackles, one interception and tied his career high with three pass breakups (3)... allowed just one catch for 11 yards while being targeted 11 times in the contest.

2021 (Redshirt Sophomore)

Enrolled at South Carolina in January after transferring from Georgia Military College... played in all 13 games, making seven starts at cornerback... recorded 33 tackles including 25 solo stops... credited with six pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery... collected four tackles five times.

2020 (Sophomore)

Spent his second fall at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville... the Bulldogs did not play a fall season... rated as the seventh-best JUCO cornerback and No. 51 overall by 247Sports Composite.

2019 (Freshman)

Began his collegiate career as a defensive back at Georgia Military College... played for coach Bert Williams... recorded 10 tackles and an interception.



Defensive tackle who took advantage of the extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA to become a "Super Senior" in 2021... team leader on and off the field... named a permanent team captain for the 2021 season... played in 35 games in his Gamecock career over four seasons including 22 starts... owns 81 career tackles including 8.5 tackles for loss... signed with the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent and played professionally in the CFL in 2022.

2022 (Pro)

Signed by the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent... was released in late July prior to the start of the season... signed by Montreal of the CFL... appeared in the final two games of the regular season for the Alouettes... credited with a pair of tackles... also blocked a punt against Toronto and recovered it for a game-winning touchdown.

2021 (Super Senior)

Started all 13 games as a defensive tackle... selected by his teammates at one of five Rex Enright permanent team captains... recorded 41 tackles including 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks... credited with a pair of fumble recoveries, including a "scoop and score" in the win over Florida, and four quarterback hurries... notched a season-high six tackles in the win over Troy... served as a game captain for contests against Troy, Texas A&M and Clemson.

2020 (Redshirt Senior)

Fifth-year senior... played in all 10 games, making eight starts along the defensive line... started at defensive tackle in seven contests and at defensive end against Georgia... did not start against either LSU or Kentucky... credited with 27 tackles including 3.0 tackles for loss... 10 of his 27 tackles came at Ole Miss... previous high in a game was three tackles.

2019 (Redshirt Junior)

Appeared in eight games as a redshirt junior... credited with seven tackles including six solo stops... also had one pass breakup... started the season finale against Clemson, his first career start, and responded with a career-high four tackles... played more snaps in that contest (59) than in the other seven games combined (54)... also registered two tackles against Texas A&M.

2018 (Junior)

Redshirted in his first season at South Carolina... played in four contests, seeing action in the first two and the last two games of the season... credited with six tackles including 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack... four of his six stops, including his lone sack, came in the Belk Bowl vs. Virginia.

2017 (Sophomore)

Finished his sophomore season at Georgia Military College in Milledgeville, Ga... credited with 22 tackles, including 9.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks... the Bulldogs posted an 8-2 record under head coach Bert Williams... considered the 13th best JUCO defensive tackle in the country and No. 47 overall... named to the *PrepStar* All-Atlantic Region team.

2016 (Freshman)

Logged 14 tackles including 4.0 TFL's and a sack for Georgia Military.

Graduate transfer from Yale University in New Haven, Conn., who played one season with the Gamecocks... versatile performer who played all along the offensive line... tremendous leader who was selected as a team captain at both Yale in 2022 and South Carolina in 2023... played in 37 collegiate games, 25 with the Bulldogs and 12 with the Gamecocks... invited to the 2024 NFL Combine in Indianapolis.

2023 (Grad)

Joined the team in January as a grad transfer and went through spring drills... shared the Gamecock Toughness Award for the offense in the spring with Josh Simon... earned a starting spot on the offensive line and started all 12 games in his only season in Columbia... was the only offensive lineman to

start in every game... started at left guard for the first five contests and at center for the final seven games... recognized as a Rex Enright Team Captain and Nutrition Award winner at the postseason Senior Banquet... named Third-Team All-SEC by College Football Network.

2022 (Senior)

Selected as the lone captain of Team 149 at Yale, a tradition that dates to the 19th century... shifted from tackle to the center position where he played in all 10 games... coached by Tony Reno... the Bulldogs went 8-2 overall, including a 6-1 mark in the FCS lvy League.

2021 (Junior)

Appeared in four games for the Bulldogs at left tackle... suffered a broken right ankle/fibula, which required surgery and caused him to miss the remainder of the season... Yale posted a 5-5 mark, going 4-3 in the lvy League.

2020 (Junior)

No season due to COVID-19.

2019 (Sophomore)

Starting left tackle in all 10 games for the Bulldogs... helped lead the top offense in the Ivy League... Yale went 9-1 overall including a 6-1 conference slate.

2018 (Freshman)


Served role as backup offensive tackle... Saw action in one game.






