FOR STARTERS

- South Carolina starts a seven-game home-stand this weekend, hosting No. 2 Arkansas for a three-game series at Founders Park.
- Friday night's game begins at 7 p.m., with Saturday and Sunday's contests at 3 and 1:30 p.m., respectively.
- All three games will be streamed on SEC Network Plus with Dave Weinstein and Kip Bouknight on the call.
- All three games also will be on the Gamecock Sports Network presented by Learfield with Derek Scott, Stuart Lake and Cade Crenshaw on the call.

SCOUTING ARKANSAS

- The Razorbacks are coming off a pair of one-run wins over Texas Tech in the midweek. Arkansas won in come-from-behind fashion, 9-8, on Tuesday and picked up a 5-4 win on Wednesday.
- Arkansas is 12-3 in the SEC, good for the lead in the SEC West and second overall. The Razorbacks have won 24 straight games at home and have a 32-5 overall record.
- Hagen Smith, who leads the SEC with a 1.53 ERA, is 7-0 with 89 strikeouts in 47 innings pitched. Smith will get the ball on Friday night.
- Peyton Stovall leads the Razorbacks with a .327 average while Wehiwa Aloy has nine home runs and 36 RBI.
- Dave Van Horn is in his 22nd season as the head coach at Arkansas. He has led the Razorbacks to seven College World Series appearances and has won SEC Coach of the Year three times.

SERIES VS. ARKANSAS

- Arkansas leads the all-time series 45-35 heading into this weekend's series.
- The Gamecocks are 17-16 against the Razorbacks in Columbia.
- The two teams played in Fayetteville last season as Carolina won the Saturday contest, 3-1, as Jack Mahoney pitched seven shutout innings and Braylen Wimmer had two hits and an RBI.
- Carolina and Arkansas met in Columbia in 2021 as the Gamecocks won the middle game, 6-2, as Andrew Peters earned the win by pitching three shutout innings and Brett Kerry had three strikeouts to earn the save.

GAMECOCKS EARN SERIES WIN AT FLORIDA

- The Gamecocks earned a series win at Florida for the first time since the 2011 season with wins on Friday (10-3) and Saturday (9-8).
- Cole Messina had three hits while Parker Noland, Talmadge LeCroy and Will Tippett all homered in Friday's win.
- Ethan Petry had two home runs and six RBI in the series.
- Tyler Pitzer picked up his first save in his career by pitching a perfect ninth on Saturday.
- Carolina snapped Florida's 15-series home winning dating back to April of the 2022 season.

REEVES PROVIDES JOLT IN GAMECOCK LINEUP

- Fifth-year senior Dalton Reeves homered on

Saturday and Sunday in the Florida series.

- In the three-game series, Reeves was 4-for-8 with a double, two home runs, five RBI, three runs scored and two walks.
- His two-run home run on Saturday in the seventh inning gave Carolina an 8-3 lead.
- On the season, Reeves is hitting .345 with four home runs and 13 RBI.

ELI SPINS A GEM AT FLORIDA

- Junior Eli Jones pitched six innings on Friday in a 10-3 win over Florida.
- He struck out six and allowed five hits and one run with a pair of walks, earning his third win of the year.
- Jones had 1-2-3 innings in the first, second and fourth frames.
- On the season, Jones is 3-1 with a 3.57 ERA and 38 strikeouts in 45.1 innings pitched.

GAMECOCKS WIN CAROLINA BATTLE

- Carolina picked up a 2-1 win over No. 13 North Carolina on April 9 in Charlotte.
- The Gamecocks scored runs in the third and eighth frames and held UNC to six hits on the night.
- Dylan Brewer, who was 3-for-4 on the night, had a big RBI double in the eighth inning that scored Talmadge LeCroy and put Carolina up for good.
- Roman Kimball and Connor McCreery struck out five Tar Heels apiece in relief. McCreery earned the win, going the last 2.1 innings, allowing just one hit.

GAMECOCKS LEAD THE NATION IN WALKS

- Carolina has drawn 263 walks in 37 games this season, which leads the country in free passes. The Gamecocks lead second place Texas A&M by 11 walks.
- Ethan Petry leads the team with 35 walks, which is tied for third in the SEC.
- The Gamecocks walked 18 times in the 22-6 win over Longwood on March 10. It's the most dating back to 2005 (first year of game-by-game stats available).
- Carolina is averaging 7.11 walks per game.

PETRY: 30 FOR 3(8)

- Sophomore Ethan Petry hit a home run in the 11-9 loss to Florida on April 14, his 38th career home run as a Gamecock.
- Petry is now in a tie for 12th place on Carolina's all-time home runs list and is the 29th Gamecock to hit 30 or more home runs in a career.
- The last player to achieve that feat was Braylen Wimmer (2020-23), who had 32 career home runs. Wes Clarke (2019-21) also had 32 home runs in his Gamecock career.
- Petry is tied with Eric Stanton (1996-98) for the 12th spot. He needs three more to pull into a tie for ninth with James Darnell (2006-08), Tripp Kelly (1998-2001) and Charlie Aldrich (1985-87).

MILESTONE CENTRAL

- Head Coach Mark Kingston earned his 200th win at South Carolina in the Presbyterian game on March 26. Kingston now has 206 wins at Carolina and 479 wins overall.
- Ethan Petry recorded his 100th career RBI in the Presbyterian win. Petry now has 113 RBI in only 100 career games.
- Cole Messina recorded his 100th career hit

at Carolina March 26 vs. Presbyterian. Messina now has 114 hits, joining Talmadge LeCroy (110) and Ethan Petry (125) in the 100-hit club at Carolina.

- Ty Good recorded his 300th career strikeout March 30 at Alabama. Good has 313 strikeouts between the College of Charleston and Carolina.
- Kennedy Jones and Parker Noland both are in the 200-hit club in college. Jones has 211 hits between UNC Greensboro and Carolina while Noland has 223 hits between Vanderbilt and Carolina.

GAMECOCKS SWEEP VANDY

- South Carolina swept Vanderbilt in a three-game SEC series on March 23-24.
- Carolina outscored Vandy 26-9 and hit seven home runs to Vanderbilt's one.
- The pitching held the Commodores to a 2.00 ERA with 28 strikeouts in 27 innings pitched.
- Ethan Petry was 4-for-8 with two home runs, six RBI and five walks in the three wins.
- Garrett Gainey earned save in both ends of a doubleheader on Saturday, striking out four in 2.2 innings.
- Tyler Pitzer struck out nine and allowed just three hits in 6.1 innings in Sunday's win. He earned SEC Freshman of the Week after that contest.
- Eli Jones retired the first 18 hitters in a no decision in game one on Saturday.
- Carolina neutralized the Vanderbilt running game, allowing only two stolen bases in three games, while stealing five bases, two from Dylan Brewer and Blake Jackson.

GAMECOCKS IN THE SHOW

- Carolina currently has four players on Major League Baseball rosters.
- Christian Walker and Jordan Montgomery both are on the Arizona Diamondbacks roster.
- Clarke Schmidt is in the New York Yankees rotation while Whit Merrifield is on the Philadelphia Phillies.

GAMECOCKS NO HIT REDHAWKS

- Five different Gamecock pitchers combined for a seven-inning no-hitter in a 14-0 win Carolina win over Miami (Ohio) on Feb. 18.
- Roman Kimball, Ty Good, Tyler Pitzer, Parker Marlatt and Tyler Dean did not allow a hit while striking out a combined nine batters in seven innings of work.
- The no-hitter is the eighth in school history and the first since Feb. 24, 2013, when Colby Holmes, Forrest Koumas and Josh Knab no-hit Albany.
- This is also the second no-hitter for the Gamecocks in the 21st century. The last before 2013 came on Mar. 26, 1975, when Ray Lavigne tossed a no-hitter against George Mason.
- Kimball made his first appearance since Tommy John surgery in the win and struck out five in two innings of work.
- All five pitchers made their first appearance in a Gamecock uniform in the no-hitter.

PETRY, MESSINA EARN PRESEASON HONORS

- Sophomore outfielder Ethan Petry and junior catcher Cole Messina were named to several Preseason All-America teams.
- Petry was named to the first team by D1Baseball, Perfect Game and the NCBWA while being named to Baseball America's third team.
- Messina was selected to D1Baseball's first team. He also was on the NCBWA and Perfect Game's third team.
- Petry hit .376 with 23 home runs and 75 RBI for the Gamecocks in 2023 as he broke Carolina's freshman record in both categories.
- Messina hit .307 with 18 doubles, 17 home runs and 65 RBI with eight stolen bases as a sophomore.
- Both Petry and Messina were named to the Preseason All-SEC first team, announced on Feb. 8.
- The duo was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List, awarded to the best player in amateur baseball.
- Carolina is one of three SEC schools (Florida, Arkansas) to have more than one honoree on the Preseason All-SEC first team.

WILLIAMS, HOLCOMB ADDED TO COACHING STAFF

- Carolina welcomes in two new assistant coaches to the 2024 staff in pitching coach Matt Williams and assistant recruiting and hitting coach Joey Holcomb.
- Williams comes to Columbia after spending four seasons at Liberty University, where he helped the Flames to an NCAA Regional appearance

- Williams also spent time at UNC Wilmington, Spartanburg Methodist and the San Diego Padres.
- Holcomb comes to the Gamecocks from Campbell, where he spent two seasons with the Camels, helping them to a Big South championship and a regional appearance in 2023.
- Holcomb also spent two years at NC State and seven seasons at UNC Greensboro.
- The Gamecocks also welcome back LT Tolbert as a student assistant. Tolbert was on the Gamecocks from 2016-18 and was on the NCAA Greenville Regional All-Tournament team in 2018.

IMPACT TRANSFERS

- South Carolina had four players in D1Baseball.com's Top 130 Impact Transfer list.
- Kennedy Jones topped the list at No. 26. Jones spent two seasons at UNC Greensboro and was a First Team All-SoCon selection in 2023.
- Austin Brinling came in at No. 63. Brinling's most recent stop was at North Florida, where he was a First Team All-A-SUN honoree last year.
- Fifth-year senior Ty Good is at No. 107. Good spent four years at the College of Charleston, where he was the 2023 CAA Pitcher of the Year and enters the SEC with the most career wins (26), innings pitched (250.2) and strikeouts (276).
- Parker Noland rounds out the list at No. 109. Noland spent four seasons at Vanderbilt, appearing in 192 games with 119 RBI.
- Carolina brought in 12 transfers in 2024, including outfielder Blake Jackson (from Charlotte) and infielder Tyler Causey (from North Carolina).

REMEMBERING TOMMY

- The Carolina baseball program will honor and remember Tommy Moody throughout the 2024 season.
- Moody was the analyst on the Gamecock Sports Network for baseball for 23 seasons before passing away in October.
- Moody was the chairman of the USC Athletics Hall of Fame and was a past president of the USC Association of Lettermen in 1992.
- He played under head coach Bobby Richardson on the Gamecock baseball team from 1970-72.
- This season, the Gamecocks will wear a MOODY sticker on their helmets as well as honoring him pre-game on Opening Day.

STOUT SCHEDULE FOR THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina will face eight teams ranked in D1Baseball.com's Preseason Top-25 this season.
- This includes six of the top-10 teams in the country, starting with a three-game series against No. 6 Clemson on March 1-3.
- Carolina has three-game series against No. 2 Arkansas (April 19-21) No. 13 Vanderbilt (March 22-24), No. 1 Texas A&M (April 5-7), No. 3 Kentucky (April 26-28) and No. 4 Tennessee (May 16-18).
- The Gamecocks also have a single-game against No. 11 North Carolina on April 9 in Charlotte and a three-game set at No. 18 Alabama on March 28-30. Carolina ends the regular-season home schedule May 9-11 against No. 24 Georgia.

PALMETTO STATE PRIDE

- Carolina opens 2024 with 15 South Carolina natives on its roster.
- The Gamecocks brought in four transfers from the Palmetto State - Tyler Causey (Fort Mill), Ty Good (Rock Hill), Garrett Gainey (Hartsville) and Dalton Reeves (Lexington).
- Carolina also brought in three freshmen from in state - Jake McCoy (Fort Mill), Reese Marcum (Lexington) and Xavier Pelzer (Cayce).
- The Gamecocks' starting catcher (Cole Messina, Summerville) and third baseman (Talmadge LeCroy, Belton) are Sandlappers while Carolina has a pair of pitchers from Chapin (Matthew Becker, Chris Veach).

7TH SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 15TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH NORTH CAROLINA (1995)

Mark Kingston was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 30, 2017. He became the 30th head coach in the history of Gamecock Baseball.

Kingston's first team at Carolina (2018) advanced to the Super Regionals in Arkansas after going 3-0 in the Greenville Regional at East Carolina. The Gamecocks won each of their last five SEC series in 2018, as Carolina swept LSU and won series against Vanderbilt, Ole Miss, Missouri and Texas A&M on its way to a third place finish in the SEC East (17-13) and fifth-place overall conference finish. Carolina handed Arkansas its only postseason loss until the College World Series championship series, defeating the Razorbacks 8-5 in game two of the super regional. The Carolina team finished seventh in the country in fielding percentage (.980) and 12th in home runs (79). Kingston coached 10 players that were picked in the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft and had 12 players selected to the Spring SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The 2019 team saw five players picked in the MLB First-Year Player Draft, including TJ Hopkins in the ninth round. The Gamecocks earned a Palmetto Point, winning 2-of-3 games against Clemson in early March. Success against the ACC continued with wins over N.C. State and North Carolina in Charlotte. South Carolina earned a trip to Hoover on the final day of the regular season, defeating College World Series participant Mississippi State in Starkville. Kingston coached Brett Kerry, who was named to the SEC All-Freshman team and was named a Freshman All-American by three different organizations.

The 2020 season was cut short after 16 games due to the coronavirus, but Kingston's squad was 12-4 that included a pair of weekend sweeps and a win over Clemson in Segra Park, had a pitching staff that had a 2.81 ERA and 184 strikeouts in 144 innings pitched and had Wes Clarke, who led the SEC with eight home runs. Kingston coached Carmen Mlodzinski, who was selected by the Pittsburgh Pirates with the 31st pick in the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Carolina also had a team grade-point-average of 3.399, the highest in program history, in the spring and had 17 student-athletes on the SEC Spring Honor Roll.

In 2021, the Gamecocks hosted the NCAA Columbia Regional, winning 34 games, including a 16-14 record in SEC play. That included a sweep of Florida and series wins at Georgia and LSU. Kingston guided the Gamecocks to a series win against Clemson, winning back-to-back games on walk-off hits from Andrew Eyster. The Carolina pitching staff had a 3.80 ERA, fourth in the SEC, and struck out 624 batters in 507 innings pitched. The Gamecocks had eight players picked in the 2021 MLB Draft, which tied for third for the most players picked from a Division I school. Carolina also earned the Team Academic Award from the ACBA and had 23 players on either the SEC Honor Roll or the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.

Series wins over No. 1 Texas, No. 4 Vanderbilt and national champion Ole Miss highlighted the 2022 season. The Gamecocks had five players picked in the First-Year Player Draft and had a pair of SEC honors as Brandt Belk was a Second Team selection and Michael Braswell an All-Freshman team honoree. Cade Austin was named a Freshman All-American on the mound and Will Sanders earned seven wins on the bump. The Gamecocks had 18 student-athletes make the SEC Spring Honor Roll.

The 2023 team hosted and won the NCAA Columbia Regional, defeating Central Connecticut State, N.C. State and Campbell, and advanced to the Gainesville Super Regional. The Gamecocks were ranked as high as No. 3 in the D1Baseball.com weekly polls, ended the 2023 season No. 8 in the RPI with a No. 3 strength of schedule. Carolina won the Clemson series with victories in the final two games, defeated No. 1 LSU in the series opener and swept No. 3 Florida in April. Kingston coached freshman Ethan Petry, who earned NCBWA First Team All-American honors and was named to the All-SEC First Team. Petry broke Carolina's freshman home run (23) and RBI (75) records. He also coached Cole Messina, who was an All-SEC first team selection and an NCBWA Second Team All-American. Carolina was in the top 10 in the country in both home runs (117) and ERA (4.19).

Kingston came to Carolina following a three-year stint as the head coach at USF. He compiled a 100-78-1 record while in Tampa, helping the Bulls to a pair of NCAA Regional appearances. Kingston owns a career mark of 479-321-1 in 14 seasons as a head coach, including five at Illinois State, with four NCAA appearances in that nine-year span.

Kingston has helped lead 13 teams to NCAA Tournament berths as an assistant and head coach – with six of those teams appearing in the NCAA Super Regionals, two participating in the College World Series and one winning a national championship. As a player at the University of North Carolina, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped UNC win the ACC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Regionals in 1990. As an assistant coach, Kingston helped the Miami Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. His 21-year collegiate coaching career also includes stops at Tulane, where he helped guide the Green Wave to the 2005 College World Series, and Purdue.

Kingston guided USF to a 42-19 mark in 2017, the first time since 1996 that the team had reached the 40-win mark. Under Kingston's leadership, the Bulls earned their second trip to the NCAA Tournament in three years. USF won 19-straight games from Feb. 19 - March 22, the second-longest streak in program history. During that streak, USF defeated then No. 3 Florida State in Tallahassee, its first victory against FSU since 1989. On May 9, the Bulls defeated then-No. 5 Florida in Gainesville. It marked the first time in program history that the Bulls beat both FSU and Florida on the road in the same season. The victories were just USF's second and third wins over top-five teams in program history. Kingston reached the 100-win mark at the helm of the program in the Gainesville Regional opener with a 9-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, making him the second-fastest coach in program history to reach 100 victories.

Kingston's Bulls dominated on the mound in 2017, posting a 3.24 team ERA and allowing 7.64 hits per nine innings, both in the top-10 nationally. The pitchers led the country with 10.1 strikeouts per nine innings and set a program record with 620 strikeouts. Offensively, shortstop Kevin Merrell set an American Athletic Conference record with a .384 average, the third-straight year he led the Bulls in hitting. Merrell was named an All-American by four separate publications and was named to the AAC First Team for a second-straight year. He was one of five Bulls named to All-American Athletic Conference teams, the most since 2009. Merrell was drafted by the Oakland Athletics with the 33rd overall pick in the MLB Amateur Draft, becoming the third-highest drafted player in program history. Overall, four USF players were selected in the draft, as Phoenix Sanders went in the 10th round to the Tampa Bay Rays, Joe Cavallaro was taken in the 24th round by the New York Mets and Ryan Valdes was selected in the 33rd round by the Pittsburgh Pirates.

In 2016, the Bulls recorded 517 strikeouts, logging back-to-back seasons of over 500 strikeouts for the first time in school history. Merrell posted a team-high .320 batting average and a first-team all-conference selection in the AAC. Pitcher Brandon Lawson also notched over 100 strikeouts on his way to a second-team all-conference honor. The Bulls won two series against ranked teams (No. 25 Michigan State, at No. 22 East Carolina), and had three players drafted - pitcher Tommy Eveld (ninth round, Arizona), pitcher Brandon Lawson (13th round, Tampa Bay), and outfielder Luke Maglich (34th round, Philadelphia).

Kingston made an immediate impact at USF in 2015, leading the Bulls to an NCAA Regional for the first time since 2002. Kingston

and his staff increased the Bulls' 2014 win total by seven and earned the team's first NCAA Tournament win in 13 years. Coach Kingston's guidance helped produce four players who were drafted by Major League Baseball clubs, including pitcher Jimmy Herget (sixth round, Cincinnati), pitcher Tommy Peterson (12th round, Washington), infielder Kyle Teaf (30th round, Tampa Bay), and pitcher Casey Mulholland (37th round, Dodgers). Merrell was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and catcher Levi Borders was named to the Johnny Bench Watch list and was a unanimous selection on The American's First Team. Herget was also named to The American's First Team, and Peterson earned second-team honors. Merrell, first baseman Buddy Putnum, and Teaf were also named to the NCAA Gainesville Regional All-Tournament team.

Kingston came to USF with a long track record as a top-level recruiter and a producer of offensively explosive teams. He spent 2010-2014 as the head coach at Illinois State University, where he led the Redbirds to two MVC regular season championships and one conference tournament title while twice breaking the program's season wins record. He won more than 30 games in each of his five seasons at ISU, a program-record string that included a season-record 39 wins in 2013. He reached the MVC Tournament championship game three times and compiled an overall record of 173-102 (.629 winning percentage). Kingston was twice named a "Rising College Coach" by Kendall Rogers of Perfect Game USA during a five-year tenure at Illinois State (2010-2014) in which he earned MVC Coach of the Year honors in 2010 and 2013 and helped 18 Redbirds earn First-Team all-MVC honors. Two of his players were named MVC Player or Pitcher of the Year and eight were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Kingston led ISU to rapid success, as the Redbirds ranked second in conference wins (64) from 2010-14 while posting two first-place finishes and no worse than a fourth-place conclusion in the MVC. His overall winning percentage of .629 and average of 35 wins per season were a strong improvement over previous seasons. ISU's average RPI rating of 69.50 from 2010-13 ranked fifth among all northern Division I programs and Kingston's recruiting classes contained 15 players ranked in the Top-20 in the state of Illinois by Prep Baseball Report, more than any other university.

He took over the ISU program after serving one season as the team's associate head coach and promptly posted the most successful first-year head coaching stint in program history. Kingston led the 2010 Redbirds to their first-ever share of the MVC regular-season title, their first MVC Tournament title since 1994 and their first NCAA Tournament victory since 1976. ISU's 32-24 record was the most wins for the Redbirds since 1999.

In 2011, Kingston guided the team to a then-record season win total (36-18), including a marquee victory at Miami (Fla.), and placed seven players on the All-MVC team. The following year (2012) ISU went 33-19 and posted a 10-game win-streak, the program's longest since 1984. Closer Kenny Long was selected by the Houston Astros in the 22nd round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft, marking three-consecutive seasons in which a Redbird was selected in the MLB draft.

In 2013, Kingston guided ISU to a program-best 39 wins (39-19), posted a school-record 12-game winning streak, won the MVC outright for the first time in school history and set a Valley-record with eight first-team All-MVC selections. Offensively, ISU paced the MVC in batting average, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and home runs and the pitching staff fired a program-record 13 complete games, including 10 shutouts.

Prior to his stint at ISU, Kingston was part of 500 wins (500-279-2) in 13 seasons as an assistant coach and was widely respected as one of the top assistants in the nation. He spent the previous seven years at Tulane University, serving as recruiting coordinator throughout his tenure and as associate head coach the final five seasons with the responsibility of overseeing recruiting, coaching hitters and developing catchers and infielders.

At Tulane, Kingston's recruiting and coaching efforts helped the Green Wave to six postseason appearances, two NCAA Super Regionals and a berth in the 2005 College World Series. The 2005 Green Wave team was seeded as the top team overall while also receiving the top academic honor in Omaha. Tulane averaged nearly 42 wins per season with Kingston on staff. Kingston recruited or coached seven players who became All-Americans at Tulane, including James Jurries (2002) and Michael Aubrey (2003). The Green Wave sluggers became the first hitters in 18 years to hit .400 for the season and both earned Conference USA Player of the Year recognition. Aubrey was selected by the Cleveland Indians 11th overall in 2003, the highest Tulane player ever taken in the draft.

Prior to Tulane, Kingston spent two years at Miami (Fla.), where he helped the Hurricanes capture the 2001 College World Series as the No. 1 overall seed. While at Miami, the Hurricanes finished with top-five school single-season marks in batting average, runs scored and slugging percentage, and led the nation with 228 stolen bases in 2001. In the run to the 2001 national title, the 'Canes had an NCAA-best 17-0 run to end the season and set a College World Series record with 12.3 runs per game while hitting .373 as a team in Omaha.

Kingston spent one year as an assistant at Illinois State, helping the 1999 Redbirds set then-school records for wins in a season (35), runs scored, RBI, doubles, hits and walks, while finishing second in school history in home runs, total bases and batting average. Kingston began his coaching career with two seasons at Purdue, helping the Boilermakers post three of the top-seven batting averages in school history and place five position players on the All-Big Ten team after not posting any the year before his arrival.

A 1995 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in communications, Kingston was part of the 1989 Tar Heels squad that won an Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title and advanced to the College World Series. He also helped the team win the ACC Tournament and advance to NCAA Regionals in 1990 as a sophomore. Kingston received the Trippe Bourne "Most Dedicated Player" Award for his outstanding work ethic and leadership during his junior campaign, and was named a team captain his senior season.

Drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of North Carolina in 1992, the Northern Virginia native played professionally for five seasons with Milwaukee and the Chicago Cubs organizations.

Kingston attended Potomac High School (Virginia), where he developed into a Collegiate Baseball Top-50 Prospect and was drafted by the New York Yankees after leading his team to the 1988 state championship. In 2006, Kingston was inducted into the Potomac Hall of Fame.

In 2019, Kingston was named as an assistant coach to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, which played in tournaments in Taiwan and Japan.

Kingston and his wife, the former Letitia Kelly, have three children, Kailyn Grace, Cameron James and Kathryn Patricia. He also wrote and produced two instructional videos for Championship Productions, "Keys to Consistent Hitting" and "Catching Drills and Fundamentals." He also was the only assistant coach chosen to write a chapter in "The Baseball Drill Book" produced by the American Baseball Coaches Association.
