GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- This marks the second straight season South Carolina has participated in an exhibition game for a cause against another NCAA Div. I opponent. Last season, the Gamecocks hosted Rutgers for a game to celebrate the life of Nikki McCray-Penson, who was a member of both coaching staffs during her career and passed away in Summer 2023. The two teams competed to honor her and to raise money and awareness for the fight against breast cancer.
- Tonight's game marks the unofficial start of South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley's 17th season in Columbia and her 25th season as a head coach. The Naismith Hall of Fame player is building a hall of fame coaching resume as well, guiding the Gamecocks to six NCAA Final Fours and three National Championships in the last nine tournaments. Her .767 winning percentage is the 11th-best in NCAA women's basketball history.
- Over the past five seasons, the Gamecocks are 167-9 (.949), including last season's undefeated National Championship run that made South Carolina just the fifth program in NCAA history to achieve that.
- South Carolina's undefeated season was built on its unpredictability. With so many ways to win games, the Gamecocks kept opponents off balance. Seven players averaged at least 8.0 points; four averaged at least 5.0 rebounds, four averaged at least 2.0 assists per game, and all but every player on the roster at the end of the season shot at least 43.0 percent from the field.
- Nine letterwinners from last season's undefeated National Championship team return this season, including All-American Te-Hina Paopao and her fellow All-SEC selections Raven Johnson and Ashlyn Watkins.
- The Gamecocks return 83.9 percent of their scoring from last season, 78.0 percent of their rebounding, 89.0 percent of their assists, 72.1 percent of their blocked shots and 98.4 percent of their 3-pointers.
- This season's team added the No. 2 recruiting class (ESPN) with three top-30 signees as well as Arkansas transfer Maryam Dauda.
- In a poll of SEC and national media, South Carolina – for the fourth time in the last five seasons – was voted to repeat as SEC champion in the new expanded league. Senior Te-Hina Paopao was tapped with Preseason All-SEC First-Team honors. Fellow guards Milaysia Fulwiley and Raven Johnson collected second-team recognition.

A Perennial Power

South Carolina women's basketball had been a national power for more than a decade under head coach Dawn Staley, including seven 30-win seasons in the last 10 campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in six Final Fours in the last nine NCAA Tournaments, including the last four, with National Championships in 2017, 2022 and 2024. They have been ranked in every AP Poll since Dec. 10, 2012, including a top-10 spot every week since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Gamecocks have amassed 83 AP No. 1 rankings all-time, tied for the third-most by a program in the history of that poll (2nd is Tennessee, 112).

Under head coach Dawn Staley's leadership, 11 Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 22 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once.

In the last nine seasons, 14 Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 10 first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks in the last six years. In the 2024 season, 12 Gamecocks were on a WNBA roster, the second most of any program in the country. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year and one is a three-time WNBA MVP and two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year.

The Memphis Series

The Gamecocks hold a 17-5 edge over the Tigers in the all-time series, including winning the last 10 meetings, but the teams have met just once since the turn of the century.

Memphis traveled to Columbia in the 2022-23 season with the then-No. 1/1 Gamecocks claiming a 79-54 victory (Dec. 3). Four current Gamecocks played in that game, led by Sania Feagin's 11 points and four rebounds.

Exhibition Exception

Exhibitions between two NCAA Div. I teams are courtesy of an exception to the usual rule, which allows teams to play if raising money for a cause.

Today's St. Jude® Tip Off Classic was organized by Complete Sports Management (CSM) and brought together basketball powerhouses in support of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital®. All four teams promoted donations to St. Jude® and proceeds from ticket sales go directly to support the life saving mission of the hospital, where no family receives a bill for treatment, travel, housing or food.

Road Ready

The Gamecocks are 311-260 (.545) all-time in road games (some records prior to 1976-77 did not include location of games), including a 136-46 mark (.747) under head coach Dawn Staley, giving her the best road winning percentage in program history.

Ranked Readings

Against ranked teams, South Carolina is 117-67 (.636) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 102-28 (.784) against ranked teams, including a 32-1 mark since the start of the 2021-22 season.

Ranking Review

South Carolina ended last season atop both national polls. It marked the 83rd time the Gamecocks were No. 1 in the AP Poll – tied for the third-most of any program in that poll's history (2nd is Tennessee, 112).

The Gamecocks have the longest active streak of weeks in the AP Top 10 at 96, beginning with the 2019-20 preseason poll. Their 227 straight appearances in the AP Poll, dating back to Dec. 10, 2012, marks the second-longest active streak in the nation and the ninth longest all-time (8th place, Notre Dame, 234).

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll.

The Staley File

In her 25th season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .767 (612-186) winning percentage, which ranks ninth in the nation among active head coaches and 11th all-time.

The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, Staley became the first person to win both Naismith Player of the Year and a Naismith Coach of the Year. In 2024, she became the first men's or women's coach to earn Naismith Coach of the Year in three straight seasons. Staley is also the first

TEAM THEME: UNCOMMON

South Carolina women's basketball has been UNCOMMON since Staley's arrival as she brought her reputation as an elite international player and coach to a program that had been mired in the highly competitive SEC. From day one, her approach to everything from team meals and travel to building the fan base through one-on-one interactions had not been seen before in Columbia.

Today, South Carolina women's basketball is the benchmark for the sport with three National Championships, including two in the last three seasons, and Staley is widely considered the voice and vision for her sport. But, what makes the program UNCOMMON goes beyond the tangible measures of success.

Staley has built a program based on players trusting the process, sacrificing for the good of the team and understanding that commitment will lead them to realize their individual dreams as well as the team's goals. Those actions come from the feeling, the culture of a program based on love and embracing the joy of being part of it.

As always, the FAMS are a key part of this season's theme. They are UNCOMMON in their commitment to supporting the program from Columbia to Paris and every stop in between, building their vacation plans and days off work around the Gamecocks' schedule.

Black head coach to win multiple national championships in men's or women's basketball. She has been named national coach of the year by at least one organization five times, including four of the last five years.

In her 16 seasons with the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (440) with a program-record 13 postseason appearances. She accounts for all six of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) and the only NCAA National Championships in program history (2017, 2022, 2024).

Staley won her 600th career game as a head coach with a 72-44 win over Alabama (Feb. 22, 2024), needing just 104 games to go from her 500th win (vs. Mercer, Mar. 21, 2021) to the 600th.

Staley's eight SEC regular-season championships trail only Pat Summitt's 16 in league history, and her seven SEC Coach of the Year awards trails Summitt's league record by just one. Staley's 199 SEC regular-season wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time – behind just Summitt (Tennessee, 306) and Andy Landers (Georgia, 273). Her 12.4 SEC wins per season is the best in league history among coaches with more than three years in the league, and her .783 SEC winning percentage (199-55) is second only to Summitt (.874).

Serious Scheduling

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has never been afraid to challenge her team to prepare it for the rigors of March and April. This season is no different.

The Gamecocks' 30-game regular-season schedule includes 12 games against teams in the ESPN Way-Too-Early Top 25, including four against teams in the top five and four others against top-10 foes. Five of those 12 games are against non-conference opponents that are all in the top 10.

Over the last 10 seasons, South Carolina has played an average of 9.6 regular-season games against ranked foes.

Three teams matched this season for the high-water mark of 12 – 2019-20 (11-1), 2017-18 (6-6), 2015-16 (11-1). Each of those years four of the 12 games were non-conference matchups. The 2021-22 Gamecocks

went a perfect 11-0 against their regular-season ranked opponents, including six such non-conference wins.

Newcomer News

South Carolina added four newcomers to this season's roster, including redshirt-freshman Adhel Tac who was part of the Class of 2024 but enrolled in January while recovering from a season-ending injury. The trio of freshmen made up the No. 2 signing class in the nation according to ESPN, led by the class' No. 3 player Joyce Edwards.

Everybody's All-American

The Gamecocks' 13-woman roster includes 10 McDonald's All-Americans – Maryam Dauda, Joyce Edwards, Sania Feagin, MiLaysia Fulwiley, Bree Hall, Raven Johnson, Tessa Johnson, Maddy McDaniel, Te-Hina Paopao and Ashlyn Watkins.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 26 McDonald's All-Americans, including 20 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen.

WNBA Pipeline

With 12 alumnae playing in the WNBA in 2024, South Carolina had the second-most players in the league of any college program.

Since the first Staley-trained Gamecock was drafted in 2015 (Aleighsa Welch), a total of 15 South Carolina players have been taken in the WNBA Draft with 11 of those going in the first round, including two No. 1 overall picks.

In proof Staley sends players to the league ready, six Gamecocks have earned All-Rookie Team honors, including three WNBA Rookies of the Year – Allisha Gray (2017), Aja Wilson (2018), Aliyah Boston (2023).

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last 10 seasons with an eye on tying Tennessee for the NCAA-record streak of 11 seasons after selling out of season tickets for the first time in program history – 13,046.

DAWN STALEY Head Coach

17th Season at South Carolina • 25th Season in Career

Since thrusting South Carolina into the national spotlight when she was hired in May 2008, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee as a player is angling for another induction as a coach with her standing as one of five head coaches with at least three women's basketball National Championships and the only Black basketball head coach with multiple national titles, one of five head coaches to lead an undefeated team to a National Championship, and the first Black head coach of the USA Basketball Senior National Team.

In Staley's 16 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks, highlights include:

- Three National Championships and six NCAA Final Fours in the last nine tournaments
- Ranking in every AP Top 25 since Dec. 10, 2012 (second-longest active streak and ninth-longest all-time (227)
- 38 straight weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, just the third program to go wire-to-wire in that poll in back-to-back seasons
- 83 total weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, the third-most in the history of that poll
- Eight SEC regular-season championships and eight SEC Tournament titles
- SEC-record 47 consecutive league regular-season victories (10th in NCAA history for conference win streaks)
- Four top-two recruiting classes (#2 in 2024, #1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- 10 NCAA Attendance titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012.

In 24 seasons as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 14 25-win seasons, a total of 20 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 218 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 83 in the No. 1 spot – the third most times in the top spot in the history of that poll. Her .767 winning percentage (612-186) ranks ninth in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 years of experience and 11th all-time.

At the helm of the Gamecocks for the last 16 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year five times (2014, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024). Her 2020 unanimous selection made her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award, and she became the first men's or women's coach to claim the award in three straight seasons 2022-24. She is a seven-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the only Gamecock basketball coach – men's or women's – to amass 300 victories at South Carolina and became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau. She is the program's all-time winningest coach with 440 wins, a .806 (440-106) winning percentage and a program-record 13 postseason appearances.

In the vaunted SEC, Staley's 199 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her .783 SEC winning percentage (199-55) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark four times (2015-16, 2019-20, 2022-23, 2023-24). Staley's back-to-back SEC undefeated seasons helped the Gamecocks to a current 47-game win streak in league play, which is an SEC record and ranks 10th in NCAA history for conference win streaks.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year, two National Defensive Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped 11 Gamecocks collect 26 All-America selections, three to pick up seven SEC Player of the Year honors, four to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of eight times, two to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 21 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 41 times, including 21 first-team selections. In the last 10 seasons, 15 Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 11 first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks in the last seven years. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year.
