QUICKLY: It's Homecoming Week on the University of South Carolina campus as the South Carolina Gamecocks (4-3, 2-3 SEC) host the SEC-leading and No. 10/11 Texas A&M Aggies (7-1, 5-0 SEC) in an SEC matchup on Saturday, Nov. 2. Game time is set for 7:30 ET at Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) in Columbia.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's contest will be televised nationally on ABC. Sean McDonough will handle the play-by-play with Greg McElroy providing the color commentary. Molly McGrath will patrol the sidelines. This is South Carolina's fourth national appearance on ABC this year. As a comparison, they were on CBS three times total from 2018-2023. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Great quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (33rd season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (52nd season). Chet Tucker returns for his second year as the sideline reporter.

HALL OF FAME WEEKEND: Nine former University of South Carolina standout student-athletes will be inducted into the USC Lettermen's Association Hall of Fame as the Class of 2024 on Friday, Nov. 1, and will be recognized on the field on Saturday, Nov. 2. The nine newest members include **Pharoh Cooper** (football), **Dana (Fulmer) Garfield** (softball), **Melvin Ingram** (football), **Bob Kaczka** (men's track and field/cross country), **Tiffany Mitchell** (women's basketball), **Tommy Moody** (baseball/contributions to the Athletics Department), **Jocelyn Penn** (women's basketball), **Jason Richardson** (men's track and field) and **Shalonda Solomon Nurudeen** (women's track and field).

HOW WE GOT THIS FAR: The Gamecocks have reached November with a 4-3 record overall and a 2-3 mark in SEC play. All three of South Carolina's losses have come to ranked opponents with two of setbacks not decided until the game's final play. They opened the campaign with a hard-fought 23-19 win over Old Dominion, then dominated Kentucky in the SEC opener, winning by a 31-6 count in Lexington. The Gamecocks were unable to hold onto a 17-0 first half lead in a heartbreaking 36-33 setback to No. 16/17 LSU, then bounced back with a convincing 50-7 rout of Akron to improve to 3-1. The Gamecocks dropped their next two contests to highly-ranked opponents, coming up on the short end of a 27-3 decision to No. 12/11 Ole Miss in Columbia, then suffering another gut wrenching defeat in a 27-25 loss at No. 7/7 Alabama in Tuscaloosa. They responded with a convincing 35-9 dismantling of Oklahoma in Norman before enjoying their second bye week of the season last weekend.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2024 marks year four of the Shane Beamer Era and the 131st season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 118th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 638-616-44, a .508 winning percentage. Since the start of the 21st century, the Gamecocks are 172-134, a .562 winning clip. In four seasons under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 24-21, a .533 winning percentage.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2024 season is South Carolina's 33rd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 111-151-1 (.424) all-time in SEC regular season play but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19. Under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 12-17 in SEC play, a .414 winning clip.

THE SERIES: This is the 11th gridiron meeting between South Carolina and Texas A&M. The Aggies lead the all-time series 9-1, including a 4-1 advantage when playing in Columbia in a series that began in 2014, but the Gamecocks are looking for their second-straight home win over A&M. Four of the 10 games in the series have been decided by seven points or less and four have been blowouts of 24 points or more.

TROPHY HUNTING: Amateur historian Richard Peterson, a USC Broadcasting Journalism graduate and previous resident of Alamo Heights in San Antonio, Texas, recommended "The Governor's Trophy" to be named after James Butler Bonham, Hero of the Alamo and himself an Alum of The University of South Carolina. Peterson and Katon Dawson took the idea to then Texas Gov. Rick Perry and Gov. Nikki Haley of South Carolina and a new tradition was born. "The Bonham Trophy" is exchanged between the Governors of South Carolina and Texas with the winner taking possession of the Bonham Trophy of "Western Artwork," created by renowned Texas sculptor Jeff Gottfried, and displayed at the victorious State Capital, University or any location the Governor may choose. Two weeks after the game, The Bonham Trophy is returned for "permanent display" at The Alamo until the next South Carolina - Texas A&M football game, although upon a site visit during this past summer, no one at The Alamo could identify its current whereabouts.



THE LAST TIME THEY MET: A banged-up Carolina squad battled but fell short in a 30-17 setback at Texas A&M in College Station on Oct. 28, 2023. After spotting the Gamecocks an early 7-0 lead, the Aggies scored 21 second quarter points and never looked back. Carolina trimmed the deficit to 24-17 early in the fourth quarter but could get no closer. A&M held a 354-209 advantage in total yards and possessed the ball for 13 minutes more than Carolina.

CAROLINA'S LONE WIN: South Carolina extended its winning streak to four and captured the Bonham Trophy for the first time in nine tries with a 30-24 win over Texas A&M at a sold-out Williams-Brice Stadium on Oct. 22, 2022. The Gamecocks exploded for 17 points in the first 5:09 of the game, using a **Xavier Legette** kickoff return for a touchdown and cashing in on turnovers on each of the Aggies' first two possessions to build an insurmountable cushion. A&M cut the lead to 24-21 heading into the final period, but the Gamecocks put together an eight-play, 80-yard drive, using 5:13 of the clock to seal the win. **Darius Rush** logged a game-high eight tackles, returned an interception 59 yards setting up a score and forced a fumble, earning SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS: Carolina is 4-13 all-time against teams from the Lone Star State, going 1-0 against Texas, 1-2 versus both Baylor and Houston, and 1-9 against Texas A&M.

Wide receiver **Davelon Campbell** is from Missouri City (Fort Bend Marshall), quarterback **Jimmy Francis** is from Dallas (St. Mark's School of Texas), tight end **Reid Mikeska** is from Cypress (Bridgeland) and defensive back **Peyton Williams** is from Heath (Rockwall-Heath).

ALL MY EXES: **Christian Ellsworth** is an offensive analyst for the Aggies. He was on the Carolina staff in 2022 as a graduate assistant for the offense. His brother, Preston, works in the Gamecock football offices. **Kyle Hoke** is a defensive analyst for TAMU. Kyle spent two seasons on the Carolina staff as a GA. His father, Jon, was the Gamecocks' defensive coordinator in 2015. **Gavin Spurrier** is an offensive GA for Texas A&M He is the son of Steve Spurrier Jr. and the grandson of the HBC, Steve Spurrier. The two elder Spurriers coached in Columbia from 2005-15.

A South Carolina win over Texas A&M would...

- ◆ Be the second in the series for the Gamecocks and its second-straight win over A&M in Columbia.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their third SEC win of the season, matching last year's total, with two conference games to play.
- ◆ Snap the Gamecocks' eight-game losing streak against ranked opponents.

CHALLENGE ACCEPTED: With Texas A&M coming into this week's contest ranked 10th in the Associated Press poll, South Carolina will be playing its fourth ranked team of the year and its 16th in four years under head coach Shane Beamer. The Gamecocks are 3-12 against ranked opponents since the start of the 2021 season with wins against No. 13 Kentucky, No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson, all in the 2022 season. South Carolina came in unranked in all but one (Notre Dame in 2022) of those 15 contests. They are winless in three tries against ranked opponents this season, losing to No. 16 LSU (36-33), No. 12 Ole Miss (27-3) and No. 7 Alabama (27-25). The Gamecocks have dropped eight-straight contests to ranked opponents.

THEY REMEMBER NOVEMBER: The Gamecocks are beginning a five-game stretch in November that will wrap up their regular season. They went into November last season with a 2-6 record, but played their best ball down the stretch, winning three of their final four games. Under Shane Beamer, the Gamecocks are 8-4 in the month of November, their most successful month.

THE LAST TIME OUT: South Carolina traveled to Norman for the first time in school history and left with a convincing 35-9 rout of the Oklahoma Sooners. Buoyed by three Sooner turnovers on their first three possessions, including a pair of defensive scores (a 36-yard fumble return by **Tonka Hemingway** and a 65-yard interception return by **Nick Emmanwori**), the Gamecocks scored 21 points in the first 5:20 of the contest, essentially putting the game on ice.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS: The South Carolina defense was relentless against Oklahoma, collecting a school record nine sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss in the contest. They also forced six fumbles and logged four turnovers while allowing just 291 yards of offense. The nine sacks are the third-most recorded in a single game in FBS play this season. Amazingly, nine different players recorded one sack each for the Gamecocks.

THEY CAN SCORE, TOO: The Carolina defense outscored Oklahoma by a 14-9 count. The Gamecocks got a 36-yard scoop and score from **Tonka Hemingway** and a 65-yard pick-six from **Nick Emmanwori** against the Sooners. The last time Carolina had multiple defensive scores in a game came in 2017 against Arkansas when they scored three times. For Emmanwori, it was his second pick-six of the season (also at Kentucky). Carolina is tied for sixth in the nation with three defensive scores.

TO THE VICTORS: **Nick Emmanwori** was named the SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week and the Reese's Senior Bowl co-Defensive Player of the Week. **Tonka Hemingway** was the SEC co-Defensive Lineman of the Week and punter **Kai Kroeger** was one of "Ray's 8" for their efforts against Oklahoma. Emmanwori had 11 tackles and a pair of interceptions, Hemingway had a sack to go with his fumble return for a TD and Kroeger averaged 51.6 yards on a season-high eight punts.

HOT AND READY: Carolina linebacker **Debo Williams** talks about getting "doughnuts" or shutting out an opponent. The Gamecocks have been close on three occasions, holding Kentucky (6), Akron (7) and Oklahoma (9) to under 10 points. The last Carolina team to do that was the 2012 squad that limited UAB (6), Georgia (7) and Wofford (7) to single digits. The Gamecocks are 22nd in the country in scoring defense, allowing just 18.7 points per game, down nearly eight points per game from last season (26.3) and their best mark since 2012 (18.2).

GETTING IN THE SACK: The Gamecocks logged a school-record nine sacks against Oklahoma and have 28 sacks along with 23 quarterback hurries through seven games. The 4.0 sacks per game ranks second in the SEC and tied for third in the country. The Gamecocks recorded just 21 sacks in 12 games in 2023, ranking 101st in the country. **Kyle Kennard** has 8.5 sacks. His 1.21 sacks per game ranks first in the SEC and third in the country. He is just one-half sack away from breaking into South Carolina's single-season top-10 list.

THAT'S OUR BALL: The Gamecocks have forced 16 turnovers this season, the SEC's third-highest total and tied for the nation's 12th-best mark. They have forced multiple turnovers in five of the seven games this season and have created at least one turnover in every game. They have forced a turnover in 11-straight games and have 80 turnovers since the start of the 2021 season, tops in the SEC during that span. The last team to not have a turnover against South Carolina? Texas A&M.

PUNCH IT OUT: The Gamecocks forced six fumbles at Oklahoma, recovering two. For the season, they have forced 15 fumbles, over two per game, recovering six. Five different players have a pair of forced fumbles. The Gamecocks forced eight fumbles during the entire 2023 season.

HAVING A SENIOR MOMENT: The Gamecocks list 37 fourth-, fifth-, or sixth-year seniors on the roster, 18 on the offensive side of the ball, 15 on defense and four special teamers. Among FBS teams, only Eastern Michigan (39) had more seniors on its roster when the season began.

THE DANDY DOZEN: Twelve players have been on the Gamecocks' roster since head coach Shane Beamer's arrival in Columbia in December of 2020. The dozen includes **Luke Doty**, **Bradley Dunn**, **O'Donnell Fortune**, **Tonka Hemingway**, **Alex Herrera**, **Alex Huntley**, **Mohamed Kaba**, **Kai Kroeger**, **Vershon Lee**, **Payton Mangrum**, **Jakai Moore** and **Hunter Rogers**.

JUST CAN'T GET ENOUGH: Eleven Gamecocks began their collegiate careers in 2019. **Oscar Adaway III**, **Kamaar Bell**, **Davis Beville**, **Dalevon Campbell**, **Alex Herrera**, **DeAndre Jules**, **Demetrius Knight Jr.**, **Bam Martin-Scott**, **Jakai Moore**, **Joshua Simon** and **David Spaulding** all were 2019 high school graduates. Herrera and Moore are the only ones who began their college careers in Columbia.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features 20 players who were on other team's rosters last fall. Of the 20 transfers, 10 are coming from Power-5 conferences, including five from the ACC, three from the SEC and two from the Big 12.

FREAKING OUT: In 20 years of Bruce Feldman's annual Freaks List, sophomore wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** is the first back-to-back No. 1 player. According to Feldman, Harbor, who is listed at 6-5 and 235 pounds and has posted times of 10.11 in the 100m and 20.20 in the 200m, "looks like a video game creation, which was backed up by EA Sports giving him the rare 99 speed and 99 acceleration rating." Harbor wasn't the only Gamecock to make Feldman's 2024 list. Junior safety **Nick Emmanwori** checks in at No. 11. At 6-3 and 227 pounds, Emmanwori broad-jumped 11-4, vertical-jumped 42 inches, did 24 reps of 225 pounds on the bench press and squatted 565 pounds.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 3-4 in games decided in overtime since the rule was added in 1996. Here are those contests:

YOUR MONEY'S NO GOOD HERE: Running back **Bradley Dunn** and linebacker **Ronnie Porter** were placed on scholarship during fall camp. The two special teams performers are both local private school products, with Dunn attending Hammond School and Porter prepping at Heathwood Hall. A third walk-on, **Maurice Brown II**, was rewarded with a scholarship after the Kentucky game.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have 28 players who have earned their degrees, the most in the SEC. Eighteen of the 28 own degrees from the University of South Carolina. The list of graduates includes **Oscar Adaway III, Kamaar Bell, Davise Beville, Dalevon Campbell, Luke Doty, Bradley Dunn, Nick Elksnis, King-Demenian Ford, O'Donnell Fortune, Tonka Hemingway, Alex Herrera, Brady Hunt, Alex Huntley, William Joyce, DeAndre Jules, Mohamed Kaba, Demetrius Knight Jr., Kai Kroeger, Vershon Lee, Buddy Mack III, Payton Mangrum, Bam Martin-Scott, Jakai Moore, Hunter Rogers, Raheim Sanders, Joshua Simon, David Spaulding** and **Debo Williams**.

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks play their final conference road game of the season next week when they travel to Nashville to take on the suddenly surging Vanderbilt Commodores. The Gamecocks have won 15-straight games against Vandy and lead the all-time series by a 29-4 count. The Gamecocks have not lost to the 'Dores since a 24-17 setback in Nashville in 2008.

Offense

OFFENSE LOGS IN: Second-year offensive coordinator **Dowell Loggains** has a much different offense to direct than he had a year ago. Gone are quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette, both of whom are now in the NFL, with Legette being a first-round pick by the Carolina Panthers and Rattler starting for the New

Orleans Saints. Loggains handed the quarterback reins over to redshirt freshman **LaNorris Sellers**. Sellers has an All-SEC running back behind him in Arkansas transfer **Raheim "Rocket" Sanders**. With a mostly new receiving corps, the Gamecocks have shifted to more of a run-first attack in 2024 than the passing offense they displayed in 2023.

GROUND CONTROL: The Gamecocks are averaging 160.9 rushing yards per game this season, nearly double their 85.1-yard average from 2023. With 1,126 yards rushing this season, they have already surpassed last year's 12-game total of 1,021.

POUND THE ROCK: The Gamecocks have had some prolific games running the ball this season. They rolled up 243 yards on 41 carries against LSU, an average of 5.9 yards per rush, then bettered that with a 273-yard, four-touchdown effort on 53 carries against Akron, averaging 5.2-yards per tote. Those are the sixth- and fourth-best single-game rushing totals, respectively, in the Shane Beamer Era. The Gamecocks are 17-6 when they rush for 100 or more yards since 2021.

QB1: Redshirt freshman **LaNorris Sellers** is QB1. The 6-3, 242-pounder saw limited action in three games in 2023 playing behind Spencer Rattler. Sellers, who is blessed with excellent size, speed and arm strength, is 88-for-140 passing (62.9 pct.) for 968 yards with five touchdowns in 2024. He has also rushed 84 times for 247 yards and three scores. He sat out the second half of the LSU game and all of the Akron contest with an ankle injury.

YOUNG GUN: **LaNorris Sellers** became the first freshman (true or redshirt) quarterback to start for the Gamecocks since **Luke Doty** started the final two games of the 2020 season as a true freshman. The last freshman (true or redshirt) QB to start a season opener for South Carolina was **Chris Smelliey**, who was a redshirt freshman when he got the nod versus Louisiana-Lafayette to open the 2007 season. Sellers completed 10-of-23 passes for 114 yards and rushed 22 times for 68 yards and a TD in his starting debut against Old Dominion. The 22 carries were the most by a Gamecock QB since Connor Shaw had 22 in 2013.

GROWING UP BEFORE OUR EYES: **LaNorris Sellers'** numbers continue to improve as he gains more experience and confidence. He is 59-for-87 (67.9 pct.) for 575 yards in his last three outings after going 29-for-53 (54.7 pct.) for 393 yards in his first three contests.

SELLERS BEWARE: **LaNorris Sellers** established career bests with 22 carries against ODU, with 88 yards rushing versus LSU, and with 23 completions and 238 yards passing against Alabama. His 75-yard TD run against LSU was the longest by a South Carolina quarterback in school history.

QB2: When **LaNorris Sellers** was sidelined with an ankle injury, redshirt senior **Robby Ashford** was inserted into the lineup for the second half of the LSU contest and as a starter versus Akron. In his first start for the Gamecocks against the Zips, the former Oregon and Auburn signal-caller responded with 376 yards of total offense and three touchdowns, rushing 16 times for 133 yards and a score and completing 15-of-21 passes for 243 yards and two TDs. The 133 rushing yards was the fifth-highest single-game total by a South Carolina quarterback in school history.

THE QB CAN RUN: Robby Ashford rushed for a career-high 133 yards in the win over Akron. It was the most rushing yards for a Gamecock quarterback since Ronnie "Sunshine" Bass of "Remember the Titans" fame rambled for 211 against North Carolina in 1974. Here are the top single-game rushing marks by a Gamecock quarterback:

ROCKET LAUNCH: Raheim "Rocket" Sanders, a 6-0, 230-pound senior transfer from Arkansas, was a first-team All-SEC selection in 2022 after rushing for 1,443 yards and 10 touchdowns as a Razorback. To put that in perspective, the Gamecocks rushed for 1,021 yards as a team in 2023. Sanders logged 142 yards and two scores through the first two games, but broke loose against LSU, rushing 19 times for 143 yards and two scores, including a 66-yard TD run. He suffered an ankle injury after just one carry against Akron and was limited to just eight carries against Ole Miss. For the season, he leads the team with 96 attempts for 426 yards, averaging 4.4 yards per carry, with a team-high six touchdowns. Dakereon Joyner paced the squad with five rushing TDs a year ago. Sanders has been Carolina's leading rusher in five of seven games.

HE'S BAAAACK: Raheim Sanders looked like the Rocket of 2022 when he rushed for over 1,400 yards at Arkansas, as he carried 19 times for 143 yards and two touchdowns against LSU. He scored on touchdown runs of 10 and 66 yards. Rocket's 143 yards rushing was the most for a Gamecock against an SEC opponent since Kevin Harris logged 210 yards vs Kentucky in 2020.

LEADERS OF THE PACK: South Carolina boasts a pair of wide receivers who led their team in receiving yards a year ago. Dalevon Campbell caught 31 passes for 594 yards for Nevada, while Gage Larvadain was Miami (Ohio)'s top receiver with 42 receptions for 679 yards and six scores. In addition, Jared Brown, who had better numbers than both Campbell and Larvadain, was Coastal Carolina's second-leading receiver with 58 catches for 740 yards and four TDs.

NOT PLAYING FAVORITES: The Gamecocks are averaging 16 pass receptions per game with 16 players having at least one catch. Eight players have at least eight receptions. Tight end Josh Simon has the most catches with 20, while true freshman Mazeo Bennett Jr. leads the way with 270 receiving yards and three touchdowns. Eight of the top 10 receivers were not on the squad a year ago.

TWO-SPORT STAR: Gamecocks wide receiver Nyck Harbor is one of the fastest players in college football. The two-sport star posted a 20.87 clocking in the 200 meters and 6.73 in the 60 meters during the indoor season. He earned All-America honors during the outdoor season after logging personal bests of 10.11 in the 100m and 20.30 in the 200. He caught his first touchdown pass of the season in the final minute of the game at Alabama, a season-long 31-yard reception.

SIMON SEZ: Sixth-year tight end Joshua Simon is the Gamecocks' top returning receiver, having 28 receptions for 256 yards and two TDs a season ago. In fact, Carolina's top two tight ends, Trey Knox and Simon, were the team's second- and third-leading receivers, respectively in 2023. Simon has picked up right where he left off with a team-high 20 receptions for 185 yards and two scores this season. He has become an integral part of the offense recently, hauling in 14 passes for 102 yards and a TD over the last three games.

EXPERIENCED O-LINE: South Carolina's offensive line entered the 2024 season with a combined 149 career collegiate starts, the sixth-highest total in Division I Football. Torricelli Simpkins III (35 games/35 starts), Kamaar Bell (33/29), Jakai

Moore (44/28) and Vershon Lee (38/27) led the way. The Gamecocks' offensive line's 220 combined games played ranked 11th in the country heading into the 2024 campaign.

SAME LINE, DIFFERENT DAY: The Gamecocks have started the same offensive line in every game this season, with Josiah Thompson, Kamaar Bell, Vershon Lee, Torricelli Simpkins III and Cason Henry working from left to right. That quintet has taken nearly every meaningful snap, but Henry was injured at Alabama and Jatavius Shivers garnered significant playing time. That is a complete 180 from last year when Carolina started nine different front fives in the first nine games. Eight schools have started the same O-line in every game this season: Indiana, Kansas, South Carolina, Syracuse, Texas, Texas State, Tulane and Wisconsin.

Defense

FLEX-NICKEL: Fourth-year defensive coordinator Clayton White uses a "Flex-Nickel" defense, which allows the Gamecocks to mix a four-man and a three-man front, with five defensive backs on the field. With eight returning starters and several experienced transfers, it's a veteran group led by all-SEC linebacker Debo Williams, a trio of defensive tackles in Alex Huntley, Tonka Hemingway and T.J. Sanders, and safety Nick Emmanwori. With more depth at all three levels, White has built this defense into the best in Columbia in years.

STINGY D: The Gamecock defense is holding its opponents to just 18.7 points, 22nd in the country, and 298.3 yards of total offense per game, 13th in the nation. They have not held their opponents to under 24.0 points per game since 2017 (20.7) and under 350.0 yards per game since 2012 (315.5). Carolina ranks in the top-40 in the country in nearly every defensive category. They played their best ball in October, holding Ole Miss, Alabama and Oklahoma all to about 12 points below their season scoring average.

HEY TURN ME OVER: The Carolina defense has been opportunistic under the Beamer/White regime. The Gamecocks have forced 16 turnovers this season, including a single-game high of four against both ODU and Oklahoma. The 16 turnovers gained is third in the SEC (although both Alabama-18 and Texas-17 have played eight games) and for 12th in the country. The Gamecocks have forced 80 turnovers over the past four seasons, tops in the SEC during that span.

MIDSEASON ACCOLADES: Kyle Kennard was named to the Sporting News midseason All-America team and was named the nation's 14th-best player by ESPN. He was a midseason third-team All-American according to College Football Network. He was also added to the Bednarik Award and Lombardi Award midseason watch lists.

SACK ATTACK: With Kyle Kennard (8.5) leading the way, the Gamecocks have recorded 28 sacks through seven games. Their 4.0 sacks per game ranks second in the SEC and tied for third in the country. Last season, Carolina recorded 21 sacks in 12 games. Kennard ranks tied for 12th among active FBS players with 21 career sacks.

HE'S JUST A FRESHMAN: It didn't take long for true freshman Dylan Stewart to make his presence felt. The highly-recruited EDGE rusher was the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Player of the Week and the SEC co-Defensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts versus Old Dominion in the season opener. He has logged 6.5 tackles for loss including 4.5 sacks and four quarterback hurries. He has added a pair of forced fumbles and has a fumble recovery as well. His 4.5 sacks are tops among all FBS freshmen. As a comparison, Jadeveon Clowney logged 8.0 sacks and 12.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman at South Carolina.

THE UNSUNG HEROES: The trio of defensive tackles in T.J. Sanders, Alex Huntley and Tonka Hemingway have put together excellent seasons. The threesome has combined for 6.5 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks and are a big reason why Carolina is allowing just 101.9 rushing yards per game, 16th in the nation, and 2.8 yards per rush, seventh in the country.

THE NEIGHBORHOOD BULLY: Linebacker Debo Williams earned first-team All-SEC honors and was tabbed the Joe Morrison MVP for the defense in 2023 after he tallied a team-leading 113 tackles, the third-highest total in the SEC and the most by a Gamecock since Jonathan Martin in 2002. He is second on the squad with 40 tackles, including 24 solo stops and 3.0 tackles for loss this season.

ONE-TWO PUNCH: Bam Martin-Scott and Demetrius Knight Jr. have been splitting time at the

MIKE linebacker position. The duo is tied for third on the squad in tackles with 36 each, combining for 72 stops including 10.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and four forced fumbles.

NICK AT NIGHT: Nick Emmanwori is the leader in the secondary. The junior safety leads the SEC and is tied for fifth in the country with four interceptions and is one of three players in the country with a pair of pick-sixes - at Kentucky and at Oklahoma. He is the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2024 with 49 stops including 33 solo tackles. His 7.0 tackles per game ranks 12th in the SEC. Emmanwori was named one of 16 quarterfinalist for the prestigious Lott IMPACT Award.

MORE FROM KILGORE: Sophomore Nickel Jalon Kilgore is second on the squad with three interceptions. He also has been credited with a trio of pass breakups. A Freshman All-American a season ago, Kilgore's three interceptions tie him for the second in the SEC and for 23rd in the country.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks have 10 interceptions this season, fourth in the SEC and tied for 16th in the country. Here are the interception numbers for the 2024 Gamecocks:

BROTHERLY LOVE: The Gamecocks have two sets of brothers on their roster, all four of whom play on defense. Jalon Kilgore was a Freshman All-American in 2023, while his older brother, Gerald Kilgore, joined the team in the spring after two seasons at Tennessee Tech. Both play in the secondary. Linebacker Ronnie Porter, who was placed on scholarship during fall camp, begins his fourth season in the program. This year he is joined by his younger brother, walk-on Rondarius Porter, who plays defensive tackle.

Special Teams

BEAMER BALL 2.0: "Beamer Ball" is alive and well in Columbia. The Gamecocks became known for their outstanding special teams over the past three seasons under guru Pete Lembo. Coach Lembo is now the head coach at Buffalo, while veteran NFL special teams savant Joe DeCamillis takes over in that role at Carolina. He is blessed to have two All-Americans to work with - punter Kai Kroeger and long snapper Hunter Rogers.

BLOCK THAT KICK: The Gamecocks have been among the leaders in blocked kicks since 2021, topping the Southeastern Conference with 16 during that time, including a pair this season. With two blocks in 2024, the Gamecocks are tied for first in the SEC and tied for 16th in the country.

HIP, HIP HERRERA: The placekicking duties were wide open heading into fall camp. Alex Herrera, a sixth-year senior emerged as the winner. He has responded by converting 10-of-14 field goal attempts with a long of 46 yards and all 20 extra point tries. He leads the team with 50 points.

SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMER: Walk-on linebacker **Colin Bryant** is making a name for himself on special teams. He was named a Midseason Second-Team All-American by College Football Network. Bryant has six tackles including four solo stops on special teams and recovered the onside kick at Alabama.

HE'S MADE A CAREER OF IT: Kai Kroeger has been the Gamecocks' punter for five seasons. He has booted 250 punts for 11,137 yards (both tops among current Division I punters), an average of 44.5-yards per punt, second in school history and ninth among active D-1 punters. Of his 250 punts, 63 have traveled 50+ yards, 92 have been marked inside the 20 with just 18 touchbacks. He is the school record-holder in punting yards and is nearing Chris Norman's career school-leading number of punts. He is one of just 16 punters in SEC history to eclipse the 10,000-yard mark.

THE ALL-AMERICAN: Fifth-year punter **Kai Kroeger** has broken out his 2022 self. He has averaged over 51-yards per punt in four of the seven games this season. In the win at Kentucky, the '22 All-American punted five times for a 51.6-yard average, with four of his five punts covering more than 50 yards while spotting two punts inside the 20, earning SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for the fifth time in his career. He was a "Ray's 8" selection after his performance against Akron when he netted 53.2 yards on four punts, including a season-best 75-yarder, tying for the third-longest punt in FBS this season. He owns four of the Gamecocks' 11 70-plus yard punts since 1979. He was a "Ray's 8" again for his performance at Oklahoma when six of his season-high eight punts traveled more than 50 yards, pinning the Sooners inside their 20 on four occasions. The Gamecocks rank 10th in the nation in net punting.

KAI IS SKY HIGH: Kai Kroeger leads the SEC and ranks second in the nation in punting average this season, posting a 48.8-yard average on 32 punts. Only Florida State's Alex Mastromanno (49.6) is averaging more yards per punt than Kroeger.

KAI CAN PASS: Kai Kroeger is 7-for-9 passing for 205 yards and three touchdowns during his career with a gaudy 379.1 career QB rating.

OH SNAP: Hunter Rogers handles the snapping duties on both punts and placements. He was recognized as a second-team All-SEC performer by the league's coaches for his efforts in 2022 and earned first-team All-SEC honors in 2023. He was a preseason first-team All-SEC pick by the coaches in 2024 and is a candidate for All-America honors.

Shane Beamer is in his fourth season leading the South Carolina program in 2024. He was named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020. Coach Beamer logged a 20-18 mark through his first three seasons in Columbia. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown.

Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award, presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP Top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark, including a 3-5 ledger in the SEC. The squad was led all season by senior quarterback Spencer Rattler and senior wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 71 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven Football Bowl Subdivision schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He has coached all three phases of the game – offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native, served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under head coach Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009 at South Carolina, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for the eighth-highest total in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked third in the SEC and 15th in the country in total defense, and second in the league and eighth in the country in passing defense.

As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has been a part of building programs throughout his career. He has been on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer came to Carolina from Oklahoma, where he served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs for three highly-successful seasons. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring (43.0), 11th in total offense (494.7) and 14th in passing offense (315.0). In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play (8.0) and ranked third in total offense (537.6) and fourth in passing efficiency rating (187.0). Oklahoma led the nation in total offense (570.3), scoring offense (48.4) and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating (194.9) in 2018.

Prior to his arrival in Norman, Beamer spent two seasons on the staff at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart. The Bulldogs posted a 21-7 combined record with Beamer on staff. In 2017, the Bulldogs won the SEC Championship and finished second in the nation, falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting (41.7), and 20th in kickoff returns (23.5) while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach, Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record and was named All-American and ACC Player of the Year and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection by the New York Giants. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position was at Mississippi State, joining the Bulldogs in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in December 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina recovered two fumbles inside the 10 leading to its only two touchdowns and the Gamecocks used the Old Dominion miscues to beat the Monarchs 23-19 on Saturday night.

South Carolina freshman quarterback LaNorris Sellers ran for a 3-yard touchdown with 6:11 to go to finally push the Gamecocks (1-0) past the Monarchs (0-1), picked to finish sixth in the seven-team Sun Belt Conference East Division.

Sellers did not have a stellar debut. He completed just 10 of 23 passes for 114 yards and carried the ball 22 times for 68 yards.

“The biggest thing is just let’s not beat ourselves and I thought we had too much of that tonight,” South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said, ticking off poor perimeter blocking, dropped passes, costly penalties and players not being in the right places.

Old Dominion quarterback Grant Wilson struggled too. He had both fumbles deep in his own territory, threw a second quarter interception in the end zone and ended the Monarchs last chance with another interception with 1:29 left in the game.

“I didn’t have the ball secured like I should have,” Grant said about his last fumble that led to South Carolina’s winning touchdown. “I’m going to work extremely hard so it doesn’t happen again.”

Beamer called South Carolina’s play unacceptable, starting with his coaching, but said he will never keep his team from celebrating a win.

SOUTH CAROLINA DEBUTS

The Gamecocks had a couple of highly anticipated debuts on offense. One went well and the other is a work in progress.

Raheim Sanders, the all-SEC running back at Arkansas, ran 24 times for 88 yards and a touchdown in his first game.

The Gamecocks didn’t appear to open the playbook much for Sellers, a raw talent who won a state title in high school two years ago. He overthrew several passes and took four sacks. Sellers ran the ball 22 times, and they weren’t all designed or wanted.

“It’s not as easy as you might think it is,” Sellers said. “I need to get better. I’d say just being more patient and being myself.”

Old Dominion coach Ricky Rhane said he was impressed with the beating Norris took and his ability to not make bad decisions. Beamer said his receivers have to help the freshman.

“We don’t want him to run 22 times a game like we did tonight. We got to continue to be better around him. We got to be able to throw the ball,” Beamer said.

LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) — LaNorris Sellers threw two touchdown passes, Nick Emmanwori returned one of South Carolina's two interceptions for another score and the Gamecocks held Kentucky to just 183 yards for a 31-6 victory to open Southeastern Conference play on Saturday.

Raheim Sanders rushed for a 6-yard touchdown late in the third quarter to help break the game open for South Carolina (2-0) in the SEC's lone head-to-head matchup. For one week, the Gamecocks sit atop the expanded 16-team league and can thank their opportunistic defense for helping make it possible in the nationally televised game.

"The way we practiced this week, I felt like a lot of guys did pretty good and the pass rush, one-on-ones and a lot of that stuff you see translates to the game really well," defensive tackle T.J. Sanders said. "It's nothing special. It's just about preparing for that moment."

Emmanwori's 24-yard pick-6 to start the fourth quarter effectively sealed their third consecutive win over the Wildcats (1-1). Jalon Kilgore followed with an interception of backup Gavin Wimsatt, giving the Gamecocks four through two games.

Alex Raynor kicked field goals of 32 and 39 just before halftime for Kentucky. A week after jumping on Southern Miss quickly for a lightning-shortened 31-0 rout, the Wildcats showed none of that intensity and failed to score a touchdown for the first time since being shut out 21-0 by Iowa in the 2022 Music City Bowl.

"We've been beaten pretty badly by some really good football teams, but I felt like our team always fought back," coach Mark Stoops said. "Today, it didn't look like we were a very well-coached team and it didn't look like a team that, that really, wanted to respond."

South Carolina also rang up five sacks, capping a defensive performance that held Kentucky to just 44 yards passing. The overall yardage allowed was the Gamecocks' lowest since holding Eastern Illinois to 109 in 2021.

"What a team win for our football program," Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer said. "The offense, defense, special teams. You talk about gritty. You talk about tough. You talk about competitive. We showed it all today."

South Carolina led throughout thanks to Sellers, who threw TD passes of 24 yards to wide-open Mazeo Bennett Jr. in the first quarter and 16 to Joshua Simon in the third to make 17-6. Sellers completed 11 of 15 for 159 yards with an interception to lead an offense that gained just 252 yards but did what it had to.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

South Carolina continued its fierce defensive play with a backfield presence that harassed Brock Vandagriff early and often and blew up other plays before they could develop. That helped Sellers' early touchdown stand long enough for the Gamecocks to add another TD coming out of the break.

Kentucky struggled in most every phase and has a lot to correct before facing Georgia. Even before losing left guard Jager Burton and right tackle Gerald Mincey to injuries, the offensive line struggled to protect Vandagriff and never got the passing game going. Demie Sumo-Karngbaye rushed 17 times for 70 of the Wildcats' 139 yards, but the Wildcats couldn't reach the end zone. The Wildcats were 3 of 14 on third down and failed on both fourth-down chances.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — LSU's Josh Williams scored on a 2-yard run with 1:12 left and No.16 LSU rallied to beat South Carolina 36-33 to open Southeastern Conference play on Saturday in Columbia.

Taking advantage of an uncharacteristic start from the ranked Tigers, South Carolina set the standard early, scoring the game's first 17 points behind rushing touchdowns from quarterback LaNorris Sellers and running back Raheim Sanders.

In the second quarter, Quarterback Garrett Nussmeier and his Tiger offense strung together two consecutive drives to make the score a more competitive 17-10.

Before the half was over, Sellers punched in his second rushing touchdown of the day in a 75-yard burst that was the longest by a quarterback in South Carolina history.

The Tigers grabbed six more points before heading into the locker room trailing 24-16.

South Carolina's half ended with Sellers, who ran for 88 yards and threw for 113, coming out of the final drive with an ankle injury. He would return for one three-and-out series in the third quarter before spending the rest of the game on the sidelines.

South Carolina returned to the second half with backup quarterback Robby Ashford in its opening drive and going three and out setting up good field position for the Tigers. LSU capped the following drive with Caden Durham's second score of the game.

LSU found its first lead of the game less than a minute into the fourth quarter on a 2-yard touchdown from Mason Taylor.

Quickly after, Sanders, the Arkansas transfer, had a 66-yard touchdown that put the Gamecocks back on top. Sanders completed the day with 143 yards and two scores.

Nussmeier threw an interception on fourth down on the goal line that looked like it might end his team's chances. But, the Tigers got a final chance with less than four minutes left. Nussmeier found Kyren Lacy for a 29-yard catch that took it to the South Carolina 4. Two plays later, Williams sped in for the touchdown.

South Carolina had one final chance to tie things, driving to the LSU 31 with :05 to play. Kicker Alex Herrera, however, missed his long field goal attempt and LSU players ran to the sideline to celebrate.

Head coach Shane Beamer, unable to pull off a ranked win to mark themselves as SEC contenders, said the third quarter had a big effect on the defense as the team tried to close out the game with a win.

"We led going into the fourth quarter, we led at halftime, and we scored first," said Beamer. "We just couldn't finish. That third quarter was big. Field position-wise and taking momentum back a little bit there."

THE TAKEAWAY

LSU: It was an inconsistent performance by the Tigers, but it was a much needed victory after the grumbling from losing to Southern Cal 27-20 in the opener two weeks ago.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks, picked 13th in the 16-team SEC, missed a golden opportunity to mark themselves as SEC contenders.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Backup Robby Ashford, starting when LaNorris Sellers injured his right ankle in a loss to LSU last week, threw for two touchdowns and ran for a third as South Carolina topped Akron 50-7 on Saturday night.

The Gamecocks opened 3-1 for the first time since 2017 as they bounced back from squandering a 17-0 lead over No. 16 LSU last week to lose 36-33 in the final two minutes.

“Obviously, this was a tough week, coming off last week,” South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. “We certainly had a bitter disappointment last week, but our guys responded the right way.”

Particularly Ashford, who started 10 games over two seasons at Auburn before transferring, making good on Beamer’s vow that multiple Gamecock quarterbacks could win games if given the chance.

“Been through a lot of ups and downs in my career and it’s taught me a lot,” Ashford said. “None of this would have been possible without my teammates. They let me know from the jump, ‘Hey, we got confidence in you.’”

Ashford finished with 243 yards passing, including scoring throws of 30 yards to Mazeo Bennett and 12 yards to JuJu McDowell. Ashford also ran for a game-high 133 yards with a scoring run of 36 yards.

Oscar Adaway, playing when starting tailback Raheim Sanders left the game early with an injury, had a pair of two-yard scoring runs.

Ashford was 15-of-21 passing. With many in the stadium and watching from home expecting the Gamecocks (3-1) to make their living on the ground, Ashford instead was able to unsheathe the Gamecocks’ previously anonymous receiving game.

“I’m beyond proud of him. His number was called and he went out there and did what he was supposed to do,” Bennett said of Ashford.

Bennett, a freshman receiver, had five catches for 71 yards.

Akron (1-3) was led by 110 passing yards from Ben Finley, who threw for one TD but also had an interception. The Gamecocks’ defense held the Zips to 154 yards.

“These are the games where dominant teams be dominant,” South Carolina defensive end Kyle Kennard said. “If you claim to be the kind of defense we claim to be, these are the games where there’s no question.”

The Gamecocks also finished with zero turnovers, which was a concern over their first three games.

Akron posted its lone score just before halftime, running six plays for 70 yards and Adrian Norton finishing with a 42-yard pass for a touchdown. Ashford couldn’t handle a snap on fourth-and-short on the ensuing drive to squelch an opportunity, and with the Zips getting the ball first in the second half, a 22-7 lead could have been further whittled.

But the Gamecocks forced a punt, then forced another before Adaway collected his second touchdown. Third-string QB Davis Beville threw his first South Carolina touchdown to backup tight end Connor Cox while S.C. State transfer Jawarn Howell had a 23-yard rushing TD.

THE TAKEAWAY

Akron: It was a game needed for the ledger. The Zips pocketed \$1.5 million from South Carolina to come to Columbia. The Mid-American Conference schedule will decide the season.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks were able to find another dimension with their offense, even with a top part of it mostly sidelined. The next two weeks of recovery will be key to how they prepare for their next opponent, Top-10 Ole Miss.

Able to gain a quick lead off early gambles from the Gamecocks, the Rebels took advantage of a fake punt on fourth-and-1 at South Carolina's 36 as Maurice Brown II was stuffed short. Just five plays later, Ole Miss punched in a Henry Parrish Jr. rushing touchdown to take the early lead.

Mistakes continued to plague the next series when South Carolina lined up with both quarterbacks Robby Ashford and LaNorris Sellers on the field. Ashford took the snap and fumbled allowing Ole Miss to recover and march down the field on the subsequent drive for the first of two JJ Pegues touchdowns.

When asked about the risky play calling, Beamer said he thought they had good plays, something they had repped a lot, Ole Miss just did a good job defending them.

"We certainly wanted to be aggressive," said Beamer. "When you go into a game that you know the other team's offense is explosive. You got to be smart."

In the second quarter, South Carolina scrapped its only points of the day after a drive starting on the Rebel's 47-yard line resulted in a field goal. The drive began after Jalon Kilgore stopped an Ole Miss run on a 4th-and-2 on the Rebel side of the field.

Right before halftime, Pegues was at it again. This time, he found an open lane into the end zone as Ole Miss went up 24-3. It was his fifth career offensive score, four of those coming on the ground this season. He also had a TD catch in 2022.

The South Carolina defense was able to slow the Rebels' momentum in the second half of the game. However, the Gamecocks were not able to come up with a key turnover to avenge their early mistakes, something Beamer said was disappointing. Beamer reiterated that "[they] knew "the turnover margin was going to be critical in this game."

TJ Sanders led the defense with a team-best nine tackles while Judge Collier had three pass breakups.

As for the offense, they were unable to get anything going again as the Ole Miss defense held South Carolina without a touchdown for the first time since losing 34-12 with four field goals at Missouri last October.

In the end, Carolina ran for 151 yards and threw for 162 yards as Sellers had 20 completions, five each to Gage Larvadian and Joshua Simon. Sellers led Carolina with 55 rushing yards on 15 attempts.

Jaxson Dart completed 14 of 27 passes for 285 yards for Ole Miss, while Henry Parrish Jr. carried 21 times for a game-high 81 yards.

TUSCALOOSA, ALA. (AP) — Alabama was pushed to the brink of a second straight Southeastern Conference upset loss.

This time the Crimson Tide survived, if only barely. No. 7 Alabama (5-1, 2-1) botched the recovery of an onside kick to give South Carolina one last chance, but Domani Jackson intercepted LaNorris Sellers as time expired and the Tide escaped with a 27-25 win.

It was Alabama's third straight game that went down to the very end, having beaten then-No. 2 Georgia 41-34 a week before losing 40-35 to Vanderbilt.

"Another game down to the wire," Tide coach Kalen DeBoer said. "We're kind of getting accustomed to those. There's some things that we can do to make sure it doesn't get to that point. But we always talk about finding a way to win. As many times as it looked like we weren't, we did."

With 43 seconds remaining, Sellers hit Nyck Harbor for a 31-yard touchdown, but the Gamecocks (3-2, 1-3) failed to convert on their two-point attempt. They recovered the ensuing onside kick, but Sellers' desperation heave toward the end zone with 13 seconds remaining was intercepted at the goal line by Jackson.

"We expected to win this game," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Nobody was coming in here at halftime doing cartwheels because we were in a tight game with Alabama. We expected that, because we have a good football team. Life in this conference is really hard."

Jalen Milroe rushed for a 7-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter and then hit Germie Bernard for a late 34-yard score to help Alabama survive the scare. It wasn't quite the emphatic rebound win they were hoping to produce.

Milroe delivered when he had to in a game where he was intercepted twice and flagged for intentional grounding on a sack in the end zone for a safety. Facing third-and-10, he found Bernard downfield without a defender anywhere in the vicinity with 1:54 left to cap a 10-play drive.

Milroe was 16-of-23 passing for 209 yards with a touchdown and two rushing scores. Sellers was 23 of 31 for 238 yards with two TDs and the final pick.

The Gamecocks entered the fourth quarter with a lead and had a chance to retake it. But Alex Herrera's 51-yard field goal attempt, which would have been a career long, was short.

Milroe had taken advantage of a Sellers fumble with his 7-yard touchdown run with 10:42 left but the two-point pass failed, leaving it 20-19.

He was relegated to cheerleader at the end with the defense on the field, just like against Vandy and Georgia.

"When we talk about team, that's a great example of just finding a way as a group to just cheer on whoever's on the field and everyone just buying in," Milroe said.

Alabama's 14-0 lead was whittled down to two over the final 1:37 before halftime amid a series of South Carolina's big plays and Tide snafus. It included the safety, turnovers from each team and Sellers' fourth-and-9 pass to a wide-open Mazeo Bennett Jr. for a 36-yard score.

"There was some crazy stuff but our guys just kept hanging in there," Beamer said.

NORMAN, OKLA. (AP) — LaNorris Sellers passed for 175 yards and South Carolina scored two defensive touchdowns in the first quarter to set the tone in a 35-9 rout of Oklahoma on Saturday.

South Carolina had nine sacks and 13 tackles for loss and held the Sooners to 291 total yards.

The Gamecocks (4-3, 2-3 Southeastern Conference) got a win for their coach, former Oklahoma assistant Shane Beamer. He said returning was important, but the recovery after a 27-25 loss at then-No. 7 Alabama a week earlier was even more satisfying.

“Just so happy for our players,” Beamer said. “To come off the heart-break of last week and respond like we did today was really freaking awesome to watch. I think there was very much a mentality with our players after last week of enough’s enough, and we know what kind of team we can be. We’ve been banging on the door. It’s time to kick the door down. And we certainly kicked the door down today.”

The Gamecocks scored 22 points off four Oklahoma turnovers without committing a turnover.

“We said going into the game that one of our keys to victory was — every week, it’s to win the turnover battle, but this week we actually used the word dominate the turnover battle, and they absolutely did,” Beamer said. “What a start.”

Jackson Arnold passed for 225 yards and a touchdown for Oklahoma after replacing Michael Hawkins Jr. in the first quarter. Jacob Jordan added six catches for 86 yards for the Sooners (4-3, 1-3). This marks the second time since 1999 that Oklahoma has lost consecutive home games.

“What we put out there today as a football team is nothing remotely close to the standard here at the University of Oklahoma, certainly not what we planned for today,” Oklahoma coach Brent Venables said. “My job as a head coach is to evaluate everything and figure it out and find a way to put us in a better position to be successful.”

Oklahoma got behind early after three quick turnovers that got Hawkins benched. He threw an interception on Oklahoma’s first offensive play, and the Gamecocks scored a touchdown on the possession. On Oklahoma’s next possession, Hawkins fumbled while being sacked by Demetrius Knight Jr, and Tonka Hemingway returned it 64 yards for a touchdown.

On Oklahoma’s third possession, Hawkins was hit as he threw, and Nick Emmanwori intercepted the errant throw and returned it 65 yards for a score to make it 21-0 just over five minutes into the game. Hawkins turned the ball over on three of his nine plays before he was replaced.

South Carolina led 32-3 at halftime after holding the Sooners to 109 yards.

The defense closed it out in the second half, giving the Gamecocks a confidence boost.

“We can go toe-to-toe with anybody in this country,” Beamer said. “I mean, if you’re one of the better teams in the SEC, you’re one of the better teams in the entire nation. And our record may not say it. And we know that every week is a grind in this league. But we’ve shown that we can go toe-to-toe with the best in this league.”
