- Tonight's game marks the first time South Carolina has played two exhibition games in a season. This is the Gamecocks' first exhibition game against Clayton State and the third time they've played an exhibition against a team from Georgia.
- Since 2009-10, South Carolina is 16-0 in exhibition games against colleges, winning those games by an average of 54.3 points.
- South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is entering her 25th season as a head coach and her 17th leading the Gamecocks. She has led South Carolina to seven 30-win seasons since 2015-16, including the last three seasons capped by the 2023-24 undefeated run to the National Championship. The Gamecocks are 109-3 over the last three seasons.
- The Gamecocks shot 52.6 percent from the field in their exhibition game, including 64.3 percent in the third quarter (9-of-14). Chloe Kitts and Joyce Edwards each posted a double-double in the game with Edwards' 19 points leading the offense.
- South Carolina's 2024-25 schedule includes 12 games against teams ranked in the preseason national polls. Five of those games are in non-conference action against teams in the top 11.
- SEC coaches and media picked the Gamecocks to repeat as league champions this season. It marks the fourth time
 in the last five years South Carolina was predicted to claim the SEC title. Both groups voted Te-Hina Paopao on the
 Preseason All-SEC First Team and MiLaysia Fulwiley and Raven Johnson the second team.
- South Carolina Athletics announced last week that it will retire the jersey of A'ja Wilson on Feb. 2 prior to the
 Gamecocks' game against Auburn. It will be the second women's basketball jersey retirement in the last two seasons
 and will bring the program's total number of retired jerseys to five #13 Martha Parker, #14 Shannon Johnson, #25
 Tiffany Mitchell, #53 Sheila Foster.
- The Gamecocks' first SEC Player of the Year Tiffany Mitchell, who had her jersey retired last fall, will be inducted into the South Carolina Letterman's Association Hall of Fame this Friday (Nov. 1). Jocelyn Penn, who played basketball for the Gamecocks 1999-2003 and was part of the program's first NCAA Elite Eight team, will also be inducted.

A Perennial Power

South Carolina women's basketball had been a national power for more than a decade under head coach Dawn Staley, including seven 30-win seasons in the last 10 campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in six Final Fours in the last nine NCAA Tournaments, including the last four, with National Championships in 2017, 2022 and 2024. They have been ranked in every AP Poll since Dec. 10, 2012, including a top-10 spot every week since the start of the 2019-20 season. The Gamecocks have amassed 84 AP No. 1 rankings all-time, the third-most by a program in the history of that poll (2nd is Tenn., 112).

Under head coach Dawn Staley's leadership, 11 Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 22 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once.

In the last nine seasons, 14 Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 10 first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks in the last six years. In the 2024 season, 12 Gamecocks were on a WNBA roster, the second most of any program in the country. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year and one is a three-time WNBA MVP and two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year.

Looking Back at Memphis

South Carolina traveled to Memphis, Tenn., to play in the inaugural Hoops for St. Jude® Tip Off Classic on Oct. 15, and came away with a 106-63 win over the hometown Memphis Tigers.

The Gamecocks established their lead in the first quarter (25-11) with a solid defensive effort, allowing just 27.3 percent shooting, and stretched in the third (32-18) behind 64.3 percent shooting from the field and 93.3 percent accuracy from the free throw line in the period.

Freshman Joyce Edwards had a 10-point, 10-rebound double-double by halftime in just 11 minutes on the court. She finished the game shooting 6-of-11 (.545) and grabbing six offensive boards as part of her 19-point, 12-rebound effort.

Junior Chloe Kitts also delivered a double-double with 15 points and 13 boards in just under 20 minutes of play.

As importantly, South Carolina fans donated over \$15,000 for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital® as part of the event.

Exhibition Action

Since the rule change to allow exhibition games between colleges went into effect for the 2009-10 season, South Carolina is 16-0 in exhibition games, including two against NCAA Div. I opponents.

Gamecocks' first exhibition game on the road. And, this is the first time South Carolina has played two exhibition games in a season.

Preseason Predictions

As the reigning national champion, the Gamecocks are atop both preseason polls by a near unanimous decision, claiming 27 No. 1 votes in both the Associated Press Poll (30 voters) and the USA Today Coaches Poll (31 voters).

The Gamecocks were also selected to repeat as SEC Regular-Season Champions by both the media and league coaches in preseason voting. Both groups tapped senior guard Te-Hina Paopao with Preseason First-Team All-SEC honors and gave second-team recognition to guards Raven Johnson the MiLaysia Fulwiley.

Ranking Review

South Carolina opens this season atop both national polls. It marked the 84th time the Gamecocks were No. 1 in the AP Poll – the third-most of any program in that poll's history (2nd is Tennessee, 112).

The Gamecocks have the longest active streak of weeks in the AP Top 10 at 97, beginning with the 2019-20 preseason poll. Their 228 straight appearances in the AP Poll, dating back to Dec. 10, 2012, marks the second-longest active streak in the nation and the ninth longest all-time (8th place, Notre Dame, 234).

TEAM THEME: UNCOMMON

South Carolina women's basketball has been UNCOMMON since Staley's arrival as she brought her reputation as an elite international player and coach to a program that had been mired in the highly competitive SEC. From day one, her approach to everything from team meals and travel to building the fan base through one-on-one interactions had not been seen before in Columbia.

Today, South Carolina women's basketball is the benchmark for the sport with three National Championships, including two in the last three seasons, and Staley is widely considered the voice and vision for her sport. But, what makes the program UNCOMMON goes beyond the tangible measures of success.

Staley has built a program based on players trusting the process, sacrificing for the good of the team and understanding that commitment will lead them to realize their individual dreams as well as the team's goals. Those actions come from the feeling, the culture of a program based on love and embracing the joy of being part of it.

As always, the FAMS are a key part of this season's theme. They are UNCOMMON in their commitment to supporting the program from Columbia to Paris and every stop in between, building their vacation plans and days off work around the Gamecocks' schedule.

has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll.

The Staley File

In her 25th season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .767 (612-186) winning percentage, which ranks ninth in the nation among active head coaches and 11th all-time.

The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, Staley became the first person to win both Naismith Player of the Year and a Naismith Coach of the Year. In 2024, she became the first men's or women's coach to earn Naismith Coach of the Year in three straight seasons. Staley is also the first Black head coach to win multiple national championships in men's or women's basketball. She has been named national coach of the year by at least one organization five times, including four of the last five years.

In her 16 seasons with the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (440) with a program-record 13 postseason appearances. She accounts for all six of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) and the only NCAA National Championships in program history (2017, 2022, 2024)

Staley won her 600th career game as a head coach with a 72-44 win over Alabama (Feb. 22, 2024), needing just 104 games to go from her 500th win (vs. Mercer, Mar. 21, 2021) to the 600th.

Staley's eight SEC regular-season championships trail only Pat Summitt's 16 in league history, and her seven SEC Coach of the Year awards trails Summitt's league record by just one. Staley's 199 SEC regular-season wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time – behind just Summitt (Tennessee, 306) and Andy Landers (Georgia, 273). Her 12.4 SEC wins per season is the best in league history among coaches with more than three years in the league, and her .783 SEC winning percentage (199-55) is second only to Summitt (.874).

Serious Scheduling

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has never been afraid to challenge her team to prepare it for the rigors of March and April. This season is no different.

The Gamecocks' 30-game regular-season schedule includes 12 games against teams in the Preseason Top 25, including four against teams in the top five and four others against top-10 foes. Five of those 12 games are against non-conference opponents that are all in the top 11.

Over the last 10 seasons, South Carolina has played an average of 9.6 regular-season games against ranked foes.

Three teams matched this season for the high-water mark of 12 – 2019-20 (11-1), 2017-18 (6-6), 2015-16 (11-1). Each of those years four of the 12 games were non-conference matchups. The 2021-22 Gamecocks went a perfect 11-0 against their regular-season ranked opponents, including six such non-conference wins.

Newcomer News

South Carolina added four newcomers to this season's roster, including redshirt-freshman Adhel Tac who was part of the Class of 2024 but enrolled in January while recovering from a season-ending injury. The trio of freshmen made up the No. 2 signing class in the nation according to ESPN, led by the class' No. 3 player Joyce Edwards

Three of the four played in the Memphis exhibition game. In addition to Joyce Edwards' impressive double-double, Maryam Dauda added nine points in her 14 minutes on the court, and Adhel Tac went 3-of-6 from the field for six points to do with five rebounds in less than eight minutes of play.

Everybody's All-American

The Gamecocks' 13-woman roster includes 10 McDonald's All-Americans – Maryam Dauda, Joyce Edwards, Sania Feagin, MiLaysia Fulwiley, Bree Hall, Raven Johnson, Tessa Johnson, Maddy McDaniel, Te-Hina Paopao and Ashlyn Watkins.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 26 McDonald's All-Americans, including 20 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen

WNBA Pipeline

With 12 alumnae playing in the WNBA in 2024, South Carolina had the second-most players in the league of any college program.

Since the first Staley-trained Gamecock was drafted in 2015 (Aleighsa Welch), a total of 15 South Carolina players have been taken in the WNBA Draft with 11 of those going in the first round, including two No. 1 overall picks.

In proof Staley sends players to the league ready, six Gamecocks have earned All-Rookie Team honors, including three WNBA Rookies of the Year – Allisha Gray (2017), A'ja Wilson (2018), Aliyah Boston (2023).

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last 10 seasons with an eye on tying Tennessee for the NCAA-record streak of 11 seasons after selling out of season tickets for the first time in program history – 13,046.

The Gamecocks have had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for eight straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season) dating back to the first ever sellout of 18,000 on Feb. 8, 2016. Last season's five sellouts are the most in a single season in program history.

Excluding the COVID limited season of 2020-21, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans 126 consecutive regular-season games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.
