## TIPOFF NOTABLES

> **A New Chapter** of Gamecock Men's Basketball is underway again this season with third-year head coach Lamont Paris at the helm. Paris, who has been a part of nine NCAA Division I Tournaments and 18 twenty-win seasons as a college head and assistant coach, was named the University of South Carolina's 33rd head coach by Director of Athletics Ray Tanner on Thursday, March 24, 2022.

> Paris, the 2024 SEC Coach of the Year and one of four finalists for the Naismith National Coach of the Year, helped engineer the greatest single-season turnaround in program history in 2023-24 as the team improved its win total by 15 games. The Gamecocks 26 wins in 2023-24 tied for the most single-season victories in program history with the 2016-17 Final Four team.

**+15** - The Gamecocks **15-win** turnaround in 2023-24 was the greatest single season turnaround in program history, surpassing the 11-win improvement from 2002-03 to 2003-04 under Dave Odom.  
**8** - **EIGHT** South Carolina natives are on the roster this season, the most the team has had since **EIGHT** Palmetto State products were on the roster in Odom's first season in 2001-02.

## A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- Improve head coach Lamont Paris to 6-2 all-time in season openers in his eight seasons as a head coach. He would move to 3-0 in season openers in Columbia.
- Improve the Gamecocks to 87-30 all-time in season openers.

### **MURRAY-BOYLES PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

> Rising sophomore Collin Murray-Boyles was tabbed a Third Team Preseason All-SEC selection by both the media and the league's head coaches. He's the first Gamecock to earn preseason All-SEC recognition since AJ Lawson in 2020-21 when he was selected to the second team. Murray-Boyles is coming off a solid freshman campaign in which he saw action in 28 games, starting the final 19 for the Gamecocks. He averaged 10.4 points, 5.7 rebounds (led team), 1.8 assists, 1.0 blocks and 1.0 steals per game en route to earning SEC All-Freshman honors. He shined down the stretch in league play a season ago, highlighted by a 31-point outing in a double-digit win over Vanderbilt (2/10/24) and a 24-point performance against Arkansas (3/14/24) in the second of round of the SEC Tournament that helped Carolina to its first win in the conference tournament since 2018. He shot 59.7 percent (117-196) from the floor to lead the team and also had a team-high 21 dunks. Murray-Boyles scored in double-figures in 10 of the team's final 13 games last season.

### **WOOSTER WIN**

> South Carolina defeated Wooster, 86-60, in an exhibition at Colonial Life Arena on Wednesday, Oct. 30, in a matchup against head coach Lamont Paris' alma mater. Sophomore forward Collin Murray-Boyles led the way with 19 points and 11 rebounds for Carolina. Redshirt freshman Arden Conyers and true freshman Cam Scott, both local products, provided key sparks for the Gamecocks off the bench tonight with 16 points each. Conyers was 6-of-7 from the floor and 4-of-5 from downtown and scored buckets on three consecutive possessions at a key point in the second half. Scott was 3-for-4 from downtown. Senior Jacobi Wright added 10 points and a team-high five assists off the bench.

### **ORDER ON THE COURT**

> The Honorable L. Casey Manning enters his 32nd season as an analyst for men's basketball games on the Gamecock Radio Network. He joined the broadcast team for the 1993-94 season and worked alongside legendary South Carolina play-by-play man Bob Fulton. Manning has worked alongside current play-by-play man Derek Scott since 2016-17. The Gamecocks advanced to the school's first ever Final Four their first year working together. Manning, a Dillon, S.C. native, played for the Gamecocks from 1970-73 and made history as the first African-American scholarship player in program history. He graduated from the South Carolina School of Law in 1977 and has served as Circuit Court Judge for the Fifth Judicial Court since 1994. Manning retired on Dec. 31, 2022.

> On Dec. 8, 2022, at a retirement function at the USC Alumni Center, Manning received the Order of the Palmetto from Gov. Henry McMaster, the highest civilian honor granted in the state of South Carolina.

> Two streets were also named after him, one in downtown Columbia near the courthouse he worked in and the other in his hometown of Dillon, S.C.

> On May 7, 2022, Manning received an honorary doctor of laws degree from the Board of Trustees at commencement. It is the highest degree you can receive from the university.

> He joins Dave Kellum (35th season as Ole Miss ppx) as the only members of the 30-year club on radio broadcast in the SEC.





















Lamont Paris, who has been a part of nine NCAA Division I Tournaments and 18 twenty-win seasons as a college head and assistant coach, was named the University of South Carolina's 33rd head coach by Director of Athletics Ray Tanner on Thursday, March 24, 2022.

Paris, 49, is the first African-American head coach in the history of the Gamecock men's basketball program. The 2024 SEC Coach of the Year enters his third season leading the program in 2024-25.

In year two (2023-24), Paris and his staff helped orchestrate the greatest single-season turnaround in program history as South Carolina went 26-8 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017. The 26 victories tied the 2016-17 Final Four team for the most single-season wins in program history. Carolina's 15-win improvement was tied for the second-best mark in the nation. The team's 25 regular season wins were a new program record. The Gamecocks went 13-5 in SEC play, good for a T-2nd finish in the league. The 13 SEC wins tied the 1997 SEC title team for the most SEC wins in program history (Carolina joined the league in 1991-92). Paris was named SEC Coach of the Year by the league's coaches and the AP (first coach in program history to be named SEC Coach of the Year by the media). He was one of four finalists for the 2024 Naismith National Coach of the Year. Paris was also a finalist for Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year and the Ben Jobe Award.

The Gamecocks won seven SEC games on the road in 2023-24, tying the 1996-97 team for the most SEC victories away from home in a single season. Carolina finished the year with a 12-5 record in true road and neutral site games. The Gamecocks were one of just 18 teams in the country with multiple top-10 wins and one of five teams in the nation with a top-five true road win. Carolina had a seven-game SEC win streak, which included beating No. 6/6 Kentucky 79-62 at home on Jan. 23 and No. 5/5 Tennessee, 63-59, in Knoxville on Jan. 30. Per Elias Sports Bureau, it was the first time the Gamecocks had defeated a pair of top-10 teams in a three-game stretch since 1968. Carolina's win over the Vols was the team's first AP Top-Five road victory since defeating No. 3 Kentucky, 72-66, on March 2, 1997. The Gamecocks returned to the top-25 for the first time since 2017 back in Week 14 on Feb. 5 and remained there the last seven weeks of the season. The team finished the year ranked No. 23 in the final USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the final AP Top-25, marking the first time Carolina was ranked in the final AP poll since 1998. The Gamecocks were ranked as high as No. 11 in both major polls.

Carolina allowed just 66.4 points per game during the regular season in 2023-24, which led the SEC. The Gamecocks held 25 opponents below 70 points, which T-7th best mark in the nation. Carolina was one of just four teams in the SEC to rank in the top-50 of adjusted

efficiency on offense and defense via KenPom.

In his first season (2022-23), South Carolina had an overhauled roster with eight new players, including just 14.9 percent of the team's scoring and 18.4 percent of the minutes played returning from the season prior. The Gamecocks defeated Clemson at home, 60-58, for the first time since Dec. 19, 2014. Chico Carter Jr. hit the game-winning bucket with 0.9 seconds remaining. Paris became the first Gamecock head coach since Dave Odom in 2001 to defeat the in-state Tigers in his first season. The conference slate was highlighted by road wins at Kentucky, at Ole Miss and at LSU. The Gamecocks wire-to-wire victory at Rupp Arena on Jan. 10 was the team's first there since 2009 and just the program's third all-time win in Lexington since joining the SEC (1992). Ohio State transfer Meechie Johnson made six 3s and scored a career-high 26 points to lead the Gamecocks. Paris joined Eddie Fogler (1997) and Darrin Horn (2009) as the only Gamecock head coaches all-time to win in the historic building.

Paris came to Carolina after five seasons as the head coach at University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, coaching the Mocs to an 87-72 overall record (.547), including a 65-29 mark his last three seasons.

In his 17 seasons as a collegiate assistant coach prior to becoming head coach at Chattanooga, teams associated with Paris were 497-217 (.696) with five conference titles and 12 NCAA Tournament appearances (Division I and II), reaching two Final Fours.

Paris spent seven seasons as an assistant at Wisconsin from 2010-17 working for Bo Ryan and Greg Gard. The Badgers went to the NCAA Tournament every year with four Sweet 16 appearances and back-to-back trips to the Final Four in 2014 and 2015. Wisconsin played for the National Championship in 2015 after going 36-4 and winning both the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles. The Badgers took down No. 1 overall seed Kentucky in the National Semifinal, ending the Wildcats' previously undefeated season.
