FOR STARTERS

- Carolina wraps up its seven-game homestand this weekend, hosting SEC newcomer Oklahoma to start conference play.
- Friday's game will start at 7 p.m. with Saturday's game at 4 p.m. Sunday's contest is at 1:30 p.m.
- All three games will be streamed on SEC Network Plus.
- All three games also will be on the Gamecock Sports Network presented by Learfield with Derek Scott and Stuart Lake on the call.

SCOUTING OKLAHOMA

- The Sooners are coming off an 9-5 win over Louisiana Tech on Wednesday night. Jaxon Willits had three hits and three runs scored while Sam Christiansen hit a two-run home run.
- Kyle Branch leads Oklahoma with a .357 batting average while Easton Carmichael had a team-best 17 RBI.
- On the mound, Friday starter Kyson Witherspoon is 4-0 with a 1.17 ERA and 40 strikeouts in 23 innings pitched.
- Oklahoma's big non-conference wins happened in the Round Rock Classic as the Sooners beat Oregon State (8-4) and Virginia (5-4 in 12 innings)
- Skip Johnson is in his eighth season as head coach at Oklahoma. He guided the Sooners to a runner-up College World Series appearance in 2022.

SERIES VS. OKLAHOMA

- Carolina holds a 4-1 series advantage on Oklahoma heading into Friday's game.
- Four of the five contests occurred in postseason play. The first ever game between the two teams was a 13-2 Carolina win on Feb. 9, 2007 in Wilmington, N.C.
- The Gamecocks played Oklahoma twice in Omaha in 2010. The Sooners won the first meeting, 4-3, on June 20 before Carolina won 3-2 in 12 innings on Brady Thomas' game winning RBI single.
- Carolina and Oklahoma also played in the 2012 Columbia Super Regional. The Gamecocks won both games by scores of 5-0 and 5-1 to advance to its third-straight College World Series appearance.
- The three wins over the Sooners in postseason play were part of a record 22 consecutive NCAA postseason wins between 2010-12.

PITCHING STANDS OUT IN OPENING STRETCH

- The South Carolina pitching staff holds a 3.17 ERA with 207 strikeouts in 156 innings pitched after 18 games this season.
- Ten different Gamecocks have a win on the mound while Carolina has five saves in 18 games in 2025.
- Jake McCoy struck out 12 batters in six innings of work against Clemson on March 1.
 McCoy was named the Tom Price Award winner, handed out to the MVP of the Clemson series.
- Dylan Eskew allowed just one run on three hits in six innings on Sunday against the Tigers. Eskew now has a 1.69 ERA with 19 strikeouts in 16 innings pitched.
- Brandon Stone came in relief on Friday against Morehead State and struck out nine in a season best 5.2 innings pitched.
- Jarvis Evans threw a team-best seven in-

nings, striking out six batters in a 9-1 win over The Citadel.

BEAU KNOWS

- Freshman Beau Hollins has played in 10 of Carolina's 18 games this season and has 10 hits (.333 batting average), a double and four RBI.
- Hollins had three hits in the 9-1 win over The Citadel on March 5. He reached base four times in the win.
- He then collected a pair of hits in Saturday's 16-11 win over Morehead State, including a big RBI in the 7th inning.

STONES BIG IN MSU SWEEP

- Brandon Stone struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings of relief in helping Carolina to an 11-7 win over Morehead State on Friday, March 7.
- Stone came into a bases-loaded situation in the second and got a strikeout to end the threat.
- He then scattered six hits and allowed two earned runs in his long relief appearance.
- Stone is now 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA and a .186 opponent's batting average.
- Evan Stone connected on his first career grand slam in Saturday's 16-11 win over the Eagles.
- Stone's home run was part of a five-run second inning. Carolina went on to score seven runs in the third frame.
- Stone now has two home runs and seven RBI in 12 games played.

PETRY SHOOTS UP CAREER HOME RUN LIST

- Junior Ethan Petry will enter the Georgia State game with 49 home runs at Carolina, which has him in second place on the alltime home run list.
- The Land O' Lakes, Fla., native had 23 home runs in his freshman season in 2023, then followed that up with 21 his sophomore season
- Petry has been named to the preseason All-America second team by both D1 Baseball and Perfect Game, the third team by the NCBWA, was named to the Preseason All-SEC first team and is on the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- Last season, Petry hit .306 with 21 home runs and 53 RBI while leading the team with 51 walks. He was named to the All-Raleigh Regional team.
- Petry is 13 home runs away from tying Justin Smoak (2006-08) for the all-time mark.
- Petry had a three-run home run, part of a five-run eighth inning, in an 11-7 win over Morehead State on March 7.
- The junior is hitting .359 with six doubles, a triple, five home runs and leads the team with 20 RBI.

MILESTONE CENTRAL

Head Coach Paul Mainieri heads into the Morehead State series with the most career wins of any active head coach in Division I baseball. Mainieri has 1,520 career wins in his

- stops at St. Thomas, Air Force, Notre Dame and LSU.
- Ethan Petry is second in career home runs at Carolina with 49, but he also has 148 career RBI in 142 games played. He needs 20 RBI to be in a tie for 10th in Carolina history.
- Matthew Becker now has 223 career strikeouts after the Morehead State outing. Currently, he has 223 punchouts in 162 innings pitched.
- Kennedy Jones enters 2025 with 35 career home runs, 44 career doubles and 250 career hits between his time at UNC Greensboro and Carolina.
- Talmadge LeCroy now has 103 runs scored as a Gamecock. He also has 84 career RBI.
- Blake Jackson has 27 doubles and 11 home runs to go along with 117 hits between Charlotte and Carolina.

MAINIERI ERA STARTS IN 2025

- Head Coach Paul Mainieri started his South Carolina tenure on Feb. 14, 2025
- Mainieri is the 31st head coach in Gamecock history and is starting his 40th season as a head coach.
- Mainieri is the active leader in head coaching wins with 1,520.
- Mainieri most recently was the head coach at LSU for 15 seasons, guiding the Tigers to a national championship in 2009, a runner-up finish in 2017 and five CWS appearances.
- In 11 of 14 full seasons at LSU, Mainieri led the Tigers to at least one team championship.
- In his 40-year career, Mainieri has made six College World Series appearances (5 with LSU, 1 with Notre Dame), four SEC championships, six SEC Tournament championships and 10 NCAA Regional championships.
- Mainieri moved to sixth place on the all-time wins list for head coaches after the Winthrop win on Feb. 18, passing Larry Hays (1971-2008), who coached at Texas Tech and Lubbock Christian.
- Mainieri is a two-time SEC Coach of the Year and four-time National Coach of the Year.

A WELL ROUNDED STAFF

- Head Coach Paul Mainieri hired his coaching staff over the summer, retaining one coach and hiring two others.
- Associate head coach Monte Lee returns for his third consecutive season and ninth overall at Carolina. Lee is the hitting coach to go along with the associate head coach title.
- Lee has helped the Gamecocks to back-to-back 100-plus home run seasons with an over .400 on-base percentage.
- Terry Rooney will begin his first season with the Gamecocks as the pitching coach/recruiting coordinator.
- Rooney was at LSU last year as the Associate Director of Program Development. He has been Mainieri's pitching coach for two years at LSU (2007-08) and three years at Notre Dame (2004-06).
- John Hendry starts his first season as an assistant coach with Carolina. Hendry was at Virginia for the last three seasons as the program's Director of Player Development.
- Chris Gordon (Director of Ops/Player Development) and Caleb Westfall (Graduate Assistant) round out the staff.

GAMECOCKS IN THE SHOW

- Carolina currently has five players on Major League Baseball rosters.
- Christian Walker changed teams this offseason, heading to the Houston Astros after playing in Arizona for the last eight seasons. Walker will start at first base for the Astros in 2025.
- Clarke Schmidt should be in the New York Yankees rotation while Carmen Mlodzinski will be on the pitching staff for the Pittsburgh Pirates.
- Jonah Bride will head into his second season with the Miami Marlins.
 Whit Merrifield ended the 2024 season with the Atlanta Braves and is a free agent heading into spring training.

RAY TANNER FIELD AT FOUNDERS PARK

Two-time National Championship Baseball Coach and Athletics Director

- Ray Tanner will have his name on the baseball field at Founders Park during a pre-game ceremony on Feb. 15 before the Sacred Heart game.
- The Gamecock baseball field will now be "Ray Tanner Field."
- Ray Tanner Field is the first USC athletics competition surface to carry the name of a former coach or student-athlete.
- In 16 seasons as the Gamecock head coach, Tanner compiled a 738-316 (.700) record with six College World Series appearances, winning the 2010 and 2011 NCAA Championships and national runners-up finishes in 2002 and 2012.
- Carolina made 14 NCAA tournament appearances under Tanner, advancing to 10 Super Regionals. USC won three SEC regular season championships (2000, 2002 and 2011), the 2004 SEC Tournament and six SEC East titles (1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2011, 2012).
- Under Tanner's leadership, the Carolina baseball program set an NCAA record for consecutive NCAA Tournament wins (22) and CWS wins (12) between 2010-12, as the Gamecocks became just the sixth and last school to win back-to-back baseball national titles.

STOUT SCHEDULE FOR THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina will face 10 teams ranked in D1Baseball.com's Top-25 this season.
- This includes four of the top-5 teams in the country, with three-game series against No. 1 LSU, No. 2 Tennessee and No. 3 Arkansas to go along with a single game against No. 5 North Carolina.
- Carolina also has a three-game series against No. 7 Florida, No. 10 Clemson, No. 12 Oklahoma, No. 13 Ole Miss, No. 19 Texas A&M and No. 25 Auburn

2024 REWIND

- The Gamecocks finished the 2024 season with a 37-25 overall record and a 13-17 SEC record.
- Carolina advanced to its 35th NCAA Tournament in program history as it was extended an invitation to the NCAA Raleigh Regional, going 1-2.
- Carolina had three wins (Alabama, Arkansas, Kentucky) in the SEC Tournament with catcher Cole Messina earning All-Tournament honors.
- Messina led USC with a .326 batting average to go along with 21 home runs and 71 RBI. He was drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the third round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Ethan Petry matched Messina with 21 home runs while hitting .306 on the year.
- Carolina hit 101 home runs and walked 382 times for a .411 on-base percentage.
- On the mound, Dylan Eskew had three wins and a .240 opponent's batting average while Garrett Gainey had six saves and 68 strikeouts in 54 innings pitched.

IMPACT TRANSFERS

- Carolina brings in eight transfers from Division I schools as well as six junior college transfers in 2025.
- Shortstop Henry Kaczmar comes to Columbia after two seasons at Ohio State, where he hit .307 with 20 doubles and 14 home runs. Kaczmar was named the No. 24 Impact Transfer by D1 Baseball.
- USC has a pair of Clemson transfers in Nathan Hall and Nolan Nawrocki.
 Hall will start in center field while Nawrocki will see time at second base.
- Jarvis Evans (Georgia), Max Kaufer (Texas A&M), Caleb Jones (Winthrop), Ashton Crowther (Mlami) and Wyatt Evans (Tennessee) also will be on the Gamecocks after transferring from a Division I school.
- Cayden Gaskin (No. 11 player) and Brandon Stone (No. 27 pitcher) were on D1 Baseball's Top JUCO transfers in the country.
- Brandon Sweeney, Aydin Palmer, Jase Woita and Jackson Soucie all come to Columbia from the junior college ranks.

SEC LEADERS

- Tyler Pitzer is tied for the SEC lead with eight appearances on the mound this season. Parker Marlatt is tied for sixth with seven appearances.
- Brendan Sweeney is tied for second in the league with four saves.
- Jake McCoy is third in the SEC with 38 strikeouts.
- Nathan Hall is tied for second with 27 hits.

UP NEXT

- Carolina heads across town to Segra Park, home of the Columbia Fireflies, for a Tuesday night (March 18) game against College of Charleston.
- First pitch is at 6:30 p.m., and the game will be streamed on SEC Network Plus.



PAUL MAINIERI

HEAD COACH 1ST SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 40TH SEASON AS A HEAD COACH FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL (1980)

Paul Mainieri has been named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina, Athletics Director Ray Tanner announced today (Tuesday, June 11). He becomes the 31st head coach in the history of Gamecock baseball.

Mainieri, who is the active leader in career wins in Division I (1,505), guided LSU to a 2009 national championship and a 2017 runner-up finish. He has made six College World Series appearances, five with LSU and one with Notre Dame, four SEC championships, six SEC Tournament championships and 10 NCAA regional championships. Mainieri is a two-time SEC Coach of the Year and a four-time National Coach of the Year (2000, '08, '09 and '15).

Mainieri spent 15 seasons at LSU, guiding the Tigers to the 2009 College World Series national championship and five CWS appearances. During Mainieri's tenure, LSU captured a remarkable 31 team championships, including the 2009 NCAA title, nine NCAA Regional championships, five NCAA Super Regional championships, four Southeastern Conference championships, six SEC Tournament titles and six SEC Western Division crowns.

In 11 of his 14 full seasons at LSU – the 2020 season was canceled after only 17 games due to COVID-19 – Mainieri led the Tigers to at least one team championship.

Mainieri posts a 1,520-780-8 (.660) record in 40 seasons of collegiate coaching at St. Thomas University (1984-88), Air Force (1989-94), Notre Dame (1995-2006) and LSU (2007-21). Mainieri is No. 7 in all-time NCAA Division I Baseball wins, and he is one of only five Division I coaches in NCAA history to have won over 1,500 games and a national championship.

He has guided his teams to 46 team championships – 31 at LSU and 15 at Notre Dame. As head coach at Notre Dame from 1995-2006, Mainieri directed the Irish to an NCAA Super Regional title and an NCAA Regional championship, eight regular-season conference championships and five league tournament titles.

Mainieri recorded a 641-285-3 (.692) mark at LSU, and he has the fourth-highest winning percentage in SEC history, trailing only former LSU coach Skip Bertman, who was 870-330-3 (.724) from 1984-2001, current Tennessee head coach Tony Vitello, who has a 295-112 (.725) record from 2018-current and former South Carolina coach Ray Tanner, who posted a 738-316 (.700) mark from 1997-2012.

Under Mainieri, the Tigers earned an NCAA Tournament National Seed in six consecutive seasons (2012-17), making LSU and Stanford (1999-2004) the only schools in NCAA history to capture six straight National Seeds. Beginning in 2008, LSU earned nine NCAA Tournament National Seeds, the second-best mark in the country over the past 14 full seasons.

Mainieri's LSU players earned First-Team All-America recognition on 13 occasions, and 25 of his former Tigers have played Major League Baseball. LSU players were chosen in the MLB Draft on 90 occasions during Mainieri's tenure, including a first-round selection in seven of the past 13 seasons.

He served as the head coach of the United States Collegiate National Team for its 2018 summer tour, and he led Team USA to a 12-3 record that included series victories over Chinese Taipei, Japan and Cuba.

His sincere commitment to everyday excellence was recognized in a substantial way on January 3, 2014, in Dallas when he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Mainieri, a four-time National Coach of the Year, joined in the Hall of Fame his father, Demie Mainieri, who coached Miami-Dade North Community College to 1,012 wins and a national title in his 30-year career. Demie and Paul Mainieri are the only father-son combination in the ABCA Hall of Fame.

Mainieri's commitment to academic achievement was illustrated by the Tigers' performance in the classroom, as 103 LSU baseball players earned their degrees during his tenure. Twenty-five of the graduates were players who signed professional contracts before completing their college eligibility and returned to LSU to finish their degree requirements. In addition, LSU players received SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition on 151 occasions during Mainieri's tenure.

He established an active community service function within the baseball program, as the Tigers regularly visit hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area. The team also participated in events like the in the ALS Walk — promoting awareness of the treatment of Lou Gehrig's Disease — and in the Buddy Walk, which is designed to encourage acceptance and inclusion of people with Down Syndrome.

Mainieri is personally involved in several philanthropic causes, including Cancer Services of Baton Rouge, the ALS Association, the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center, the Knock Knock Children's Museum, Prostate Cancer Awareness and the Kelli Leigh Richmond Ovarian Cancer Foundation.

A four-year letterwinner in college, Mainieri played one season at LSU, one season for his father – legendary JUCO coach Demie Mainieri – at Miami-Dade North Community College, and two seasons at the University of New Orleans. The second baseman helped the Privateers win two Sun Belt Conference titles and advance to the 1979 NCAA Tournament during his senior season.

After completing his undergraduate degree requirements at Florida International (1980), Mainieri played two minor-league seasons before earning a master's in sports administration from St. Thomas in 1982.

Mainieri's coaching career began at his alma mater, Columbus High School in Miami, where he served as assistant baseball and football coach for three years before taking over as the head coach at St. Thomas in the fall of 1982. He also spent the final three years at St. Thomas as director of athletics. Mainieri was inducted into the Columbus High School Sports Hall of Fame in October 2009. He is a member of the St. Thomas Athletics Hall of Fame, and the St. Thomas baseball facility in March 2013 was named Paul Demie Mainieri Field in his honor.

Born August 29, 1957, in Morgantown, W.Va., Mainieri and his wife, Karen, have four children – Nicholas, Alexandra, Samantha and Thomas – and four grandchildren – Holden, Jonathan, Wren and Rocco.


