>>> SOUTH CAROLINA NOTES

- Attendance at Williams-Brice Stadium was 79.266
- South Carolina's captains for the game were Brandon Cisse, Vandrevius Jacobs, LaNorris Sellers and Bryan Thomas Jr.
- Ćarolina has a 22-14-1 series advantage on Kentucky
- South Carolina is now 646-619-44 all-time.
- Shane Beamer is now 32-24 as a head coach at South Carolina.
- Kentucky won the coin toss to start and elected to receive.
- OL Tree Babalade made his first start of the season
- Carolina reached their team high of six non-offensive touchdowns scored in a season, tying the high in a season (achieved in 2012, 2011, and 2010).
- Carolina had two shutout quarters, the second quarter going 21-0, accumulating two interceptions and forcing four Kentucky turnovers, and the fourth quarter 7-0.
- South Carolina did not commit a turnover all game.

>>> SOUTH CAROLINA OFFENSE NOTES

- LaNorris Sellers was the leading passer and rusher for the Gamecocks with 11-for-14 passing for 153 yards, and 81 yards rushing on 14 attempts.
- Rahsul Faison led offensively with two rushing touchdowns, finding the endzone with 5:48 left in the first quarter and 1:07 before the half.
- RS Freshman Matthew Fuller scored his first career touchdown with 12:14 left in the fourth quarter, extending the Gamecocks lead 35-13.
- Vandrevius Jacobs was the leading receiver for the Gamecocks, accumulating five receptions for 108 yards, his second straight 100-yard plus game.

>>> SOUTH CAROLINA DEFENSE NOTES

- Jatius Geer had his first fumble recovery and rushed 41-yards to score a touchdown with 11:27 left in the second quarter after Dylan Stewart sacked Kentucky QB Cutter Boley for a loss of 13 yards.
- Gerald Kilgore secured a second defensive touchdown with a pick-six interception on second-and-10 with 10:42 left. It was Kilgore's second straight interception in as many games.
- The Gamecock defense recorded six sacks, a season high. Bryan Thomas Jr. led with two of those sacks, his career high, as well as one each from Nick Barrett, Dylan Stewart, Jatius Geer, and Devonte Miles.
- Carolina held the Wildcats 341 in total yards and 178 yards rushing. In the second half alone, Carolina allowed 36 yards.
- The defense had a season high of 39 yards for loss stemming from sacks.

- William Joyce had 5/5 PATs, 3 kickoffs for 61.3 avg, and 184 total yards.
- Mason Love punted three times for a 37-yard average.
