QUICKLY: The South Carolina Gamecocks (3-5, 1-5 SEC) are back on the road looking to snap a three-game losing streak as they travel to Oxford, Miss. for a Saturday, Nov. 1, date with the No. 7/8 Ole Miss Rebels (7-1, 4-1 SEC). Game time is set for 7 pm ET (6 pm CT) at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (64,038). This week's game marks the fourth-straight contest in which Carolina has faced a top-15 opponent.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's game will be televised nationally on ESPN. Bob Wischusen will handle the play-by-play with Louis Riddick providing the color commentary. Kris Budden will work the sidelines for the mothership. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Hall of Fame quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (34th season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (53rd season). Chet Tucker is back for his third year as the sideline reporter.

HOW WE GOT HERE: The Gamecocks enter this week's contest with a 3-5 mark overall including a 1-5 record in SEC play. Carolina opened the season with a 24-11 non-conference win over Virginia Tech in Atlanta, then rolled past South Carolina State by a 38-10 margin in the home opener. The Gamecocks had their eight-game regular season winning streak and their 16-game winning streak against Vanderbilt snapped in a 31-7 decision in the SEC lid-lifter, then fell by a 29-20 count at Missouri before bouncing back with a convincing 35-13 win over Kentucky. After a bye week, the Gamecocks went to Baton Rouge and came up on the short end of a 20-10 decision to the 11th-ranked LSU Tigers, then dropped back-to-back home decisions to No. 14/13 Oklahoma (26-7) and No. 4/4 Alabama (29-22).

THEY REMEMBER NOVEMBER: Now that the calendar has flipped from Cocktober, the Gamecocks are ready to embark on another "November to Remember." Shane Beamer's teams have historically played their best ball in November, posting a 13-4 record in the month since Coach Beamer took over in 2021, including a perfect 6-0 record against ranked opponents. In the seven years prior to Beamer's arrival (2014-2020), the Gamecocks were 0-12 against ranked opponents in the month of November. The Gamecocks were 2-2 in November of 2021. They went 3-1 in November of 2022 including wins over No. 5 Tennessee and at No. 7 Clemson. After opening the 2023 season with a 2-6 mark, the Gamecocks went 3-1 in November. Last season, the Gamecocks were a perfect 5-0 in November with ranked wins over No. 10 Texas A&M, No. 24 Vanderbilt, No. 24 Missouri and at No. 12 Clemson.

NOT ALL SCHEDULES ARE CREATED EQUAL: South Carolina is in a stretch in which they will face five top-15 teams in a row, something that has never happened in school history. They played at No. 11 LSU and hosted No. 14 Oklahoma before last week's game versus No. 4 Alabama. After playing at No. 7 Ole Miss and an off week, the Gamecocks will travel to College Station to face No. 3 Texas A&M. Including this week's game, Carolina will have faced 13 ranked opponents over a 20-game stretch.

CAROLINA VS. OLE MISS: This is the 19th meeting between the Gamecocks and Rebels. Ole Miss has won back-to-back games, snapping a three-game losing streak to the Gamecocks, to take a 10-8 lead in the all-time series. Ole Miss holds a slim 4-3 advantage in Oxford. After Ole Miss posted shutout wins in each of the first two meetings (1947 and 1972), the Gamecocks won five of the next six games from 1974-79. The Rebels countered with five-straight wins from 1981-2004, before Carolina turned the tables again with three-straight victories from 2008-2018. The Rebels won here in 2020 and in Columbia last season.

IT FIGURES TO BE CLOSE: Thirteen of the last 16 meetings between the two teams have been decided by seven points or less, including six decided by a field goal or less. The Gamecocks have won eight of the 18 games in the series, but never by more than seven points.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Jaxson Dart threw for 285 yards, the Rebel defense held South Carolina out of the end zone and Ole Miss overcame a plethora of in-game injuries to post a 27-3 win in Columbia on Oct. 5, 2024. **LaNorris Sellers** set then-career highs with 20 completions and 32 attempts for 162 yards and rushed 15 times for 55 more, but was sacked six times in the loss.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: The Gamecocks traveled to Oxford, Miss. on Nov. 14, 2020, and came out on the short end of a 59-42 shootout. The Gamecocks logged a season-high 548 yards of offense, including 318 on the ground, but could not stop the Ole Miss attack that recorded 708 total yards, including 513 through the air. The following day, Carolina AD Ray Tanner informed Will Muschamp that he was being relieved of his head coaching duties. Mike Bobo was named the interim head coach for the remainder of the season.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: The Gamecocks and Rebels combined for 101 points and 1,256 yards of offense in that 2020 contest. The 101 points scored is the second-most combined points in a Carolina game in school history, topped only by the 65-39 win at Mississippi State in 1995.

HUGE DAY FOR HARRIS: Kevin Harris had the best day of his career as a Gamecock at Ole Miss in 2020. The sophomore running back matched his career-high with 25 carries for a career-high 243 yards and a school record five touchdowns. He averaged 9.7 yards per carry. The 243 yards rushing remains the fifth-highest single-game total in school history and the most against an SEC opponent.

THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN: Jake Bentley passed for two scores and tallied the game-winning touchdown on a 4-yard run with 5:50 left to lift South Carolina to a 48-44 comeback win over Ole Miss on Nov. 3, 2018, in Oxford. The Gamecocks covered 47 and 73 yards in fourth-quarter scoring drives to erase a 44-34 deficit. Bentley finished 22-of-32 passing for 363 yards as the Gamecocks had 510 total yards. The South Carolina defense, after giving up eight scores in 10 possessions, closed with four consecutive scoreless series to preserve the win. The Rebels had 616 yards of total offense. **Deebo Samuel** opened the game with a 90-yard kickoff return for the Gamecocks.

- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' their best road win since defeating seventh-ranked Clemson in 2022.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks' their first win over Ole Miss since the 2018 season.
- ◆ Give Shane Beamer his 250th career collegiate win in a career that dates back to 1995. Beamer was part of 47 wins as a player at Virginia Tech; 38 as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech and Tennessee; 132 as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, South Carolina, Virginia Tech, Georgia and Oklahoma; and has 32 wins as a head coach at South Carolina.

TOP ROAD WINS: Ole Miss enters this week's game ranked seventh in the Associated Press poll. South Carolina has five road wins over teams ranked in the top-10 in the AP poll in its history. Here are the Gamecocks' best road wins based on the opponents' AP ranking:

BEAMER AGAINST THE BEST: Shane Beamer is in his fifth year as the Gamecocks' head coach. He has seven wins over ranked opponents, including three over top-10 teams, the most by any coach in South Carolina history in their first five campaigns. Carolina is 0-4 against Top-25 teams this season after logging a 4-4 mark against ranked teams a year ago. IT'S NOT OFFENSIVE: The Gamecocks have an NCAA-leading six non-offensive touchdowns this season. **Vicari Swain** has returned an NCAA-leading three punts for touchdowns, and the Gamecock defense has produced two fumble returns and an interception return for scores. With six non-offensive touchdowns, the Gamecocks have matched their single-season high-water mark since joining the SEC in 1992. They also had six non-offensive touchdowns in 2010, 2011 and, most recently, 2012.

IT'S A SHANESTORM IN COLUMBIA: If Beamer Ball is attributed to his father, the legendary Frank Beamer, Shane Beamer is making a name for himself with defense and special teams:

- The Gamecocks have scored six non-offensive touchdowns this season - three on punt returns, two fumble recoveries for scores and one pick-6.
- Since his arrival in Columbia in 2021, the Game-

cocks have scored 20 non-offensive touchdowns - 1 kickoff return; 6 punt returns; 4 fumble returns; and 9 interception returns.

● **Vicari Swain** leads the country with three punt returns for touchdowns. Swain is third in the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation, averaging 18.6-yards per punt return.

● **Mason Love** is the nation's second-leading freshman punter, averaging 45.2-yards per punt. Carolina is ninth in the country in net punting at 43.7 yards per punt.

● Under Shane Beamer, Carolina has blocked 17 kicks/punts since 2021, tied with Old Dominion for second in the country behind Notre Dame (18).

IT'S BETTER TO TAKE THAN TO GIVE: The Gamecocks have played turnover-free football in four games this season. They had just one game a year ago (Oklahoma) in which they had no turnovers. The Gamecock defense has forced at least one turnover in seven of eight games. They are plus-4 in the turnover battle this season, forcing 14 (eight interceptions and six fumbles) while committing 10 (six interceptions and four fumbles).

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: With 14 turnovers forced on the season, the Gamecocks, under head coach Shane Beamer and defensive coordinator Clayton White, have recorded 102 turnovers since the 2021 season. Only eight schools have reached the century mark in turnovers forced in that span. Here are the NCAA leaders since 2021:

THE LAST TIME OUT: The Gamecocks dominated much of the game against fourth-ranked Alabama, but a couple costly mistakes helped the Crimson Tide escape Columbia with a 29-22 win last Saturday night. Alabama had just one first down on its first three possessions yet held the lead thanks to a "pick-6." The Gamecocks rallied with 16-straight points to overcome a 14-6 halftime deficit and held the eight-point lead late in the contest, but Alabama scored a touchdown and a game-tying two-point conversion with 2:16 left in regulation, then recovered a fumble, setting up the winning score with just 34 ticks on the clock.

CONTROL THE CLOCK: Carolina was able to control the clock against the high-octane Tide, holding the ball for a season-high 33:02. Included were two first-half scoring drives which consumed 7:22 and 7:13 of the clock. The 15-play drive that opened the game was the fifth-longest scoring drive by time under Shane Beamer.

LOVE ME TWO: For the second time this season, **Mason Love** was selected as one of Ray Guy's "Ray's 8" for his performance against Alabama. Love booted four punts for a 47.0-yard average with a net of 48.2 yards.

WON'T SOMEONE MISS?: The Gamecocks have been unlucky in their field goal defense as their opponents have connected on all 13 attempts this season. Included are three kicks of 50+ yards - 56 by Virginia Tech, 51 by Vanderbilt and 55 by Oklahoma. Overall, Carolina opponents have hit 31 of its last 33 field goal attempts.

Offense

SHULA STEERS THE SHIP: Mike Shula, who spent the 2024 season as the Gamecocks' senior offensive assistant coach, is in his first season directing the Carolina offense. He was promoted to OC/quarterbacks coach after Dowell Loggains was named the head coach at Appalachian State. Shula, who served as Alabama's head coach from 2003-06, was the NFL Offensive Coordinator of the Year in 2015 after helping Cam Newton win NFL MVP honors as Carolina reached the Super Bowl. He also worked with Josh Allen in Buffalo and David Gerrard in Jacksonville, among others.

COACHING CHANGE: On Oct. 12, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer announced that he had relieved offensive line coach **Lonnie Teasley** of his duties effective immediately. Run game coordinator/tight ends coach **Shawn Elliott** assumed the offensive line coaching responsibilities. Elliott previously worked as the Gamecocks' offensive line coach under head coach Steve Spurrier from 2010-15, and under Will Muschamp in 2016. In addition, he served as the Gamecocks' interim head coach over the final six games of the 2015 season. Elliott also was the offensive line coach at Appalachian State from 2001-09. He returned to Columbia in 2024 after a seven-year stint at the head coach at Georgia State. **Ben Burress**, who had been working as a pass game specialist, is now assisting with the tight ends.

QB1: LaNorris Sellers, a 6-3, 240-pound redshirt sophomore from Florence, S.C., is the unquestioned leader of the squad. Sellers, who was a pre-season Heisman Trophy candidate, was the 2024 National Freshman Offensive Player of the Year as selected by the FWAA. He was also a 2024 Freshman All-American and an SEC All-Freshman selection. He threw for 2,534 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 65.6 percent of his passes and added 674 yards and seven touchdowns rushing in his first season as a starting signal-caller. He was the SEC media's choice as the 2025 preseason first-team all-league selection after earning third-team honors a year ago behind Jaxson Dart and Quinn Ewers.

SELL HIGH: Heading into Week 5, **LaNorris Sellers** emerged from the pack as the top quarterback for the 2026 NFL Draft, according to an ESPN poll of 25 NFL scouts and executives. Draft expert Mel Kiper agreed saying, "For me, I would go to Sellers. By the way, Sellers will only be 20 years of age at the draft next year." But it's not just No. 16's age that intrigues the veteran draft analyst. "Sellers looks the part. I think he's going to play some outstanding football this year for South Carolina."

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE LATELY?: **LaNorris Sellers** has completed 108-of-171 passes (63.2 pct.) for 1,356 yards and six TDs with three interceptions in 2025. In the opener against Virginia Tech, he completed a career-long 64-yard TD pass to Nyck Harbor. Against No. 23 Missouri, he threw for 302 yards and two scores, the third 300-yard passing game of his career. He rushed for a season-high 81 yards against Kentucky and tied his career high with 22 carries at LSU. He matched his career high with 32 pass attempts against Alabama, set last year against Ole Miss. Sellers is 11-9 as a starting quarterback. He has led three fourth-quarter game-winning drives in his career ODU-'24; Missouri-'24; Clemson-'24.

300 FOR SELLERS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback **LaNorris Sellers** had his best statistical game of the season against Missouri, completing 18-of-28 passes for a season-high 302 yards and two touchdowns with no turnovers. His TD passes went for 49 yards to **Vandrevius Jacobs** and for 24 yards to **Brian Rowe Jr.** It was the third 300-yard passing game of Sellers's career and his second against Missouri. Sellers is tied for eighth in school history with Ryan Hilinski, Connor Shaw and Tommy Suggs with three career 300-yard passing games.

I'LL TELL YOU WHEN IT'S OVER: The Gamecocks feature two running backs who are in their seventh season of college football. Both **Oscar Adaway III** and **Rahsul Faison** finished up their high school ball in 2018. Adaway III turned 25 years old on Oct. 17, while Faison turned 25 in February.

WAITING WAS THE HARDEST PART: Transfer running back **Rahsul Faison** was in limbo while the NCAA determined whether he was eligible for another season of college football. He was given a waiver to practice with the team while awaiting the green light to participate in games, which finally came on Aug. 25, just six days before the season opener. Faison had his best game as a Gamecock against Vanderbilt, rushing for a game- and season-high 74 yards with a touchdown on 15 carries. For the season, he is Carolina's top rusher with 69 carries for 298 yards and three touchdowns. He has added 15 catches for 88 yards.

RUN THE BALL: Buoyed by a back-to-back games in which they rushed for 178 yards against Kentucky then posted a season-high 193 yards at LSU, the Carolina running game has shown signs of life after a tough start. Here are the improved numbers from the first four contests to the last four:

FREAKING OUT: The Gamecocks had a pair of players on Bruce Feldman's preseason "Freaks" List. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** checked in at No. 3 after back-to-back years at the top of the list, while **LaNorris Sellers** was ranked 33rd on the list.

ANY HARBOR IN A STORM: World-class sprinter **Nyck Harbor** gave up his love of running track this spring to focus on football. The junior wide receiver

er has all the measurables to be WR1. He showed why everyone is excited about his future, as he caught three passes for 99 yards in the opener against Virginia Tech, including a career-long 64-yard TD pass. Always a big play threat, he hauled in a 54-yard TD catch against Alabama. He is second on the team with 18 catches for 332 yards, an 18.4-yard average, with a team-high three TDs.

DRE'S DAYS: Vandrevius Jacobs put together back-to-back 100-yard receiving games against Missouri and Kentucky to make a case for WR1. He had the best game of his career at Mizzou when he was targeted eight times and caught seven passes for 128 yards, setting career bests in both recep-

tions and receiving yards. Included was a 49-yard TD. The seven catches were the most in a game for a Gamecock this season and the 128 receiving yards were the most for a Gamecock wide receiver since Xavier Legette logged 217 yards against Jacksonville State in 2023. He followed that up with a five-catch, 108-yard effort against Kentucky including a season-long 59-yard reception. They were the first back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for a Gamecock since Legette in 2023. Jacobs is the team's leading receiver with 21 catches for 343 yards (16.3 per catch). He has scored two touchdowns.

THE NEXT WAVE: Wide receivers coach Mike Furrey brought in six talented scholarship freshman wide receivers this year - **Malik Clark**, **Lex Cyrus**, **Jordon Gidron**, **Donovan Murph**, **Brian Rowe Jr.** and **Jayden Sellers** - arguably the best wide receiver class on paper in school history. Murph, who was the last to arrive on campus, was the first to see game action. He has made a three starts and has 10 catches for 139 yards. Rowe Jr. has seen the most action. He has 10 catches for 89 yards and a touchdown while making three starts. Sellers caught six passes for 57 yards against Oklahoma in his first meaningful action and added three more for 38 yards against Alabama in his first career start to give him nine receptions for 95 yards on the season.

THE SELLERS CONNECTION: Freshman wide receiver **Jayden "Pup" Sellers** saw his first significant playing time of the season against Oklahoma. He was targeted six times in the game, four by his brother, **LaNorris Sellers**. He caught all six passes for 57 yards. It's believed to be the first time in Carolina history that a Gamecock has completed a pass to his brother.

THROW IT TO THE TIGHT END: South Carolina rotates three tight ends. **Brady Hunt** has made five starts while **Jordan Dingle** has two. **Maurice Brown II** got the nod in the opener against Virginia Tech. The tight ends have combined for 27 receptions. Hunt leads the way with 16 catches for 144 yards after catching just two passes for 22 yards in 2024. Brown II is also a special teams standout.

IT ALL STARTS UPFRONT: The Gamecocks have started five different offensive lines this season, including three different starters at center and three at left guard. The Gamecocks have started nine offensive linemen overall, the high-water mark in the country. The only constant for all eight games has been left tackle **Josiah Thompson**, who has manned that position since his arrival last year when he earned Freshman All-America accolades. He has started 20 of the past 21 games. True freshman left guard **Shedrick Sarratt Jr.** has started six games, missing two due to injury. Sarratt Jr. is one of 37 players on Shaun Alexander's Freshman of the Year watch list. **Boaz Stanley**, **Nolan Hay** and **Rodney Newsom Jr.** have all made starts at center. Stanley leads the way with five starts. **Trovon Baugh** has started seven of the eight games at right guard. **Cason Henry** started all 13 games a season ago and the first four at right tackle this season but was injured on the first play of the Missouri contest. He has not played since and will miss the remainder of the season. **Tree Babalade**, who was the starting left tackle two years ago, has replaced Henry in the lineup.

Defense

MOLDING THE CLAY: Despite losing five players who went in the first four rounds of the 2025 NFL Draft, fifth-year defensive coordinator **Clayton White** has had the Carolina defense playing at a high level for much of the season. The Gamecocks are allowing 21.1 points per game, just three points above their 18.1 average from a season ago.

MISSING YOU: Defensive line coach **Travian Robertson** was injured in a serious car accident on Aug. 22. He continues to recover after a two-week stay in the hospital where he underwent numerous surgeries. **Jordan Dove** is filling in as the D-line coach in Robertson's absence.

THAT'S OUR BALL: The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic under **Clayton White**. The Gamecocks forced 88 turnovers over the last four seasons (2021-24), tops in the SEC. Carolina has forced 14 turnovers in 2025, including eight interceptions and six fumbles, three of which has been returned for touchdowns. Only Louisiana Tech (5), Tennessee (5), Maryland (4), San Diego State (4) and Troy (4) have more defensive TDs than Carolina in 2025. The Gamecocks have scored 13 defensive touchdowns under Coach White's watch.

THE ALL-AMERICAN: Sophomore edge rusher **Dylan Stewart**, a 6-5, 245-pounder from Washington, D.C., earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors last season after recording 10.5 tackles for loss including 6.5 sacks. He was a finalist for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year award and was a member of the SEC All-Freshman team in 2024.

HE'S ONLY GETTING BETTER: **Dylan Stewart** hasn't missed a beat. Despite being double-teamed regularly, he owns 28 tackles, more than he had for the entire 2024 season, and leads the squad with 10.0 tackles for loss (fourth in the SEC) and has 3.5 sacks. He also has recorded eight quarterback hurries and has forced a pair of fumbles. He has notched 20.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 sacks in his first 21 games. He collected a career-high seven tackles in the season opener against Virginia Tech.

REPLACING KENNARD: Kyle Kennard won the Nagurski Award last season while playing the opposite end from **Dylan Stewart**. Senior edge rusher **Bryan Thomas Jr.** has taken advantage of that role this season. He has 25 tackles including 7.0 tackles for loss. He leads the team and ranks seventh in the SEC with 5.0 sacks, and has added a team-high nine QB hurries. He was named the SEC's co-Defensive Lineman of the Week after his efforts against Kentucky when he was credited with a game- and career-high seven tackles, including five solo stops. He also set a career high by registering 2.0 of the Gamecocks' six sacks against the Wildcats and added one quarterback hurry.

CHANGES IN THE MIDDLE: The Gamecocks lost their top four interior defensive linemen from 2024 to graduation. **Nick Barrett**, who redshirted last year, returned for his fifth season. He has started every game and leads the group with 29 tackles including 4.0 TFLs and his first two career sacks. **Monkell Goodwine** has started all but one contest. Transfers **Gabriel Brownlow-Dindy** (Texas A&M), **Devonte Miles** (Bowling Green) and **Troy Pikes** (Georgia Southern) all see regular time.



SACK ATTACK: Led by Nagurski Award winner Kyle Kennard and Freshman All-American **Dylan Stewart**, the Gamecocks recorded 41 sacks a season ago, second in the SEC and sixth in the nation. Carolina has 17 sacks this season including six against Kentucky. Here are the sack numbers:

REMEMBER THE NAME: Fred "JayR" Johnson has all the makings of the next great linebacker at South Carolina. The sophomore saw limited action a season ago playing behind veterans Debo Williams, Demetrius Knight Jr. and Bam Martin-Scott. He recorded a game-high 10 tackles and an interception in the opener against Virginia Tech, earning SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades. He is tied for third on the team with 36 tackles and logged his first career sack at Missouri.

WE'LL TAKE THEM: Linebackers **Shawn Murphy** (Alabama/Florida State) and **Justin Okoronkwo**

(Alabama) transferred to South Carolina this season. They have split time with Okoronkwo collecting 37 tackles and Murphy with 25. Murphy started the first three games and Okoronkwo has started the last five.

THE GRIZZLED VET: DQ Smith quarterbacks the defense from his safety position. Smith has started 41 games, the most of any current player. He owns five career INTs and two career TDs, one on an interception return and one after a blocked punt. He leads the team with 43 tackles despite missing the Missouri contest with an injury.

KILGORE WAS HERE: Junior **Jalon Kilgore** is in his third season as a starter at the Nickel position. He was a preseason second-team AP All-America selection after tying for the SEC lead and for fourth in the country with five interceptions, tying Jaylan Foster's 2021 total for the most by a Gamecock in the last 20 years. Kilgore was hampered with a hamstring injury early in the season but logged 10 tackles at Missouri and is tied for third on the squad with 36 tackles and has a team-high four breakups.

CORNERING THE MARKET: The Gamecocks are blessed with four veteran cornerbacks. **Judge Collier** started every game last season and was credited with eight PBUs but missed three games after being injured in the opener. **Brandon Cisse** has started every game and has been among the top-ranked cornerbacks in the SEC, according to PFF, and has an interception and three breakups. **Vicari Swain** saw more action with Collier sidelined and was credited with a career-high 10 tackles at Missouri and leads the corners with 20 stops. **Myles Norwood**, a transfer from Ball State, has 18 tackles, one behind Cisse.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks have eight interceptions in 2025 after picking off 14 passes in 2024. Here are the numbers:

Special Teams

WHAT'S NEW?: Everything. Second-year special teams coordinator **Joe DeCamillis** has a completely different group to work with this season, as the Gamecocks have a new player in every special teams role.

MAKING A POINT: **William Joyce** won the place-kicking chores during fall camp. A fifth-year senior, he had never attempted a kick in a game prior to this season. He has connected on 8-of-11 field goal attempts with a long of 49 yards. He has also converted all 19 of his extra points attempts for a team-leading 43 points. He made a career-high three field goals against Alabama.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: Dating back to 2021, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 62 of their last 75 field goal attempts (82.7 pct.). From 2021-24, Carolina posted the second-best field goal percentage in the SEC, trailing only Georgia.

LOVE IS THE ANSWER: **Mason Love** is trying to make Gamecock fans forget about All-American punter Kai Kroeger, now with the New Orleans Saints. Kroeger took every punt for Carolina from 2000-04. Love is the nation's second-leading freshman punter with a 45.2-yard average on 33 punts. He has 10 punts that have traveled 50+ yards with a long of 57 yards. Twelve of his punts have pinned the opponents inside the 20 with just two touchbacks. He has a net punting average of 43.7 yards, ninth in the country. He has been recognized as a Ray Guy "Ray's 8" Award winner twice this season, at LSU and vs. Alabama.

THERE GOES THAT MAN AGAIN: **Vicari Swain** has put himself in contention for SEC Special Teams Player of the Year consideration. A second-team mid-season All-American according to Sports Illustrated, Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a score against Virginia Tech, then took back-to-back punts to the house from 65- and from 42-yards out against South Carolina State. He was recognized as the SEC co-Special Teams Player of the Week after both contests. For the season, Swain ranks sixth in the nation with an 18.6-yard average.

- Swain became the first Gamecock in history to return two punts (or kicks of any kind) for touchdowns in a game.

- Swain has three punt returns for touchdowns this season, tying the single-season school record, set by Dick Harris in 1971.

- Swain has tied Ace Sanders (2010-12) for second on the school's career mark for most punt returns for touchdowns with three, one behind Harris (1969-71).

RETURN TO SENDER: With 298 punt return yards on the season, **Vicari Swain** already has the most punt return yards by a Gamecock in a season since Ace Sanders had a school-record 429 yards on punt returns in 2012.

FOR THE HISTORY BUFFS: 2025 marks the 132nd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 119th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 646-622-44, a .509 winning percentage. Since the start of the 21st century, the Gamecocks have posted a 180-140 mark, a .563 winning percentage. Under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 32-27, a .542 winning clip.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2025 season marks South Carolina's 34th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in 2010. The Gamecocks are 115-156-1 (.425) all-time in SEC regular season play but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19. They are 16-22 (.421) under head coach Shane Beamer.



EARLY RETURNS: The Gamecocks feature a pair of wide receivers who could still be playing high school ball but elected to graduate a year early to enroll at Carolina. **Donovan Murph** just turned 18 years old on Oct. 1, while **Jordon Gidron** turns 18 on Oct. 30. Both are local products, with Murph graduating from Irmo High School and Gidron

from Columbia's Ridge View High. All told, the Gamecocks had 19 freshmen who graduated from high school early and enrolled in January,

FAMILY TIES: The Gamecocks have three sets of brothers on the roster. **Jalon Kilgore** is in his third year in the program while his older brother, **Gerald Kilgore** is in his second after two seasons at Tennessee Tech. Both play in the secondary. **LaNorris Sellers** has a new target to throw to in younger brother **Jayden**, a true freshman. Junior defensive back **Brandon Cisse** transferred in the spring from NC State. He was joined in the summer by his younger brother, **Cedric Cisse**, a walk-on DB. Edge rusher **Demon Clowney** is the cousin of Gamecock Great Jadeveon Clowney and Edge rusher **Bryan Thomas Jr.** is the son of Bryan Thomas who spent 11 years with the New York Jets.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 3-4 in games decided in overtime since the rule was added in 1996.

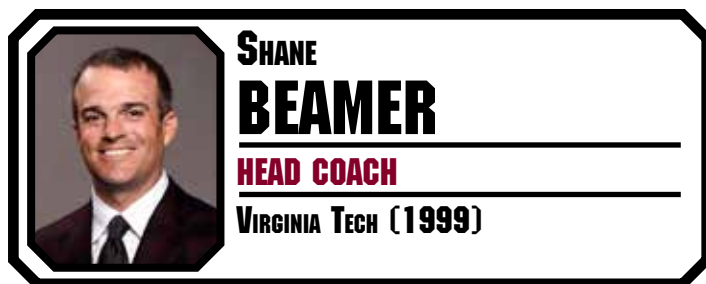

Shane Beamer begins his fifth season in Columbia leading the South Carolina Football program in 2025, a program that is on the upswing following a very successful 2024 campaign.

Beamer, who owns a 32-27 record, won more games through his first four seasons at Carolina (29) than any other coach, one more than Steve Spurrier, the school's all-time winningest coach. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown, and has led the Gamecocks to three bowl appearances in four years.

Beamer's 2024 squad was his most successful to date. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 9-4 record including a 5-3 mark in the SEC, posting nine wins in a season for just the eighth time in school history. The Gamecocks recorded a school-record four wins against ranked opponents, including three in consecutive weeks as part of a regular season-ending six-game winning streak. Carolina finished the season ranked 19th in both the final Associated Press and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2013 and its second top-25 ranking in the past three seasons.

Beamer was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the third time in his career following the Gamecocks' upset win over Texas A&M and earned SEC Coach of the Year accolades from the AP, USA TODAY, Bear Bryant and College Football Nation. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, the Bobby Dodd, and the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year.

Individually, edge rusher Kyle Kennard was the school's first Bronko Nagurski Award winner as the nation's top defensive player and was the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year. Kennard, along with safety Nick Emmanwori, earned first-team All-America honors, while punter Kai Kroeger was a second-team selection. Quarterback LaNorris Sellers was selected as the SEC's Freshman of the Year. Sellers, offensive tackle Josiah Thompson and Edge rusher Dylan Stewart earned Freshman All-America honors, giving the Gamecocks six All-Americans as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the most of any FBS school in 2024. In addition, Kennard and Raheim Sanders were named first-team Academic All-America.

Named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020, Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award,

presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Coach Beamer was a two-time Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week recipient after wins over Kentucky and Tennessee. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS and in a season mired by numerous injuries, decimating the offensive line most notably, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark. The squad was led by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 17 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He coached all three phases of the game – offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for eighth in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked 15th in the country in total defense, and eighth in the nation in passing defense.





As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has helped build several programs during his career. He was on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs at Oklahoma from 2018-20. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring, 11th in total offense and 14th in passing offense. In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play, ranked third in total offense and fourth in passing efficiency rating. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense, scoring offense and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating in 2018.

Beamer spent two seasons (2016-17) at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart, helping the Bulldogs to a 21-7 combined record. In 2017, UGA won the SEC Championship before falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting and 20th in kickoff returns while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record, was named All-America and ACC Player of the Year, and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position came at Mississippi State in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in Dec. 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

ATLANTA, GA. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown to break open a close game, LaNorris Sellers threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Nyck Harbor, and No. 13 South Carolina beat Virginia Tech 24-11 on Sunday in the opener for both teams.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer used his brand of "Beamerball" to pull away from the school where his dad, Frank Beamer, originated the style of play that emphasizes turnovers and big plays on special teams. The elder Beamer was in attendance at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, wearing South Carolina black.

"Thought you'd like a special teams touchdown," Shane Beamer told his dad as they shared a postgame hug.

South Carolina intercepted two passes by Virginia Tech's Kyrn Drones. Fred Johnson made a pick in the red zone to halt a first-quarter drive, and Peyton Williams' interception in the fourth quarter helped seal the win.

The Gamecocks led 10-8 early in the fourth when Swain fielded a punt by Nick Veltsistas, turned upfield and made several would-be tacklers miss on the way to the end zone. After a Virginia Tech field goal, Sellers found Harbor wide open on a deep post route to restore South Carolina's two-score advantage.

Swain muffed a punt earlier in the game and narrowly avoided disaster by recovering the ball. Beamer comforted the sophomore on the sideline after that play.

"Coach Beamer was like, 'This is going to happen,'" Swain said. "'It's your first time being out there, just make sure on the next one, just take it to the house.' So I took it to the house, and my thought process was like, I messed up the first time, can't mess up again. This is my only shot."

Beamer's faith in Swain, a defensive back and part-time return man, was rewarded.

"So proud of Vicari Swain," Beamer said. "He's a weapon, and it was really neat for him to do that and how fitting that is playing Virginia Tech with their history, my dad's history at special teams."

Sellers scored South Carolina's first touchdown on a 15-yard rush and was 12 of 19 passing for 209 yards and the TD to Harbor, who had three catches for 99 yards. Harbor had another potential touchdown taken away by a replay review.

Virginia Tech's offense was held without a touchdown. John Love kicked three field goals, including a 56-yarder, and the Hokies' defense contributed a safety in the first quarter when Kelvin Gilliam Jr. and Kody Huisman took down Sellers in the end zone.

Drones went 15 of 35 for 221 yards and two interceptions.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned two punts for touchdowns to rescue a struggling offense for No. 10 South Carolina as the Gamecocks beat South Carolina State 38-10 early Sunday.

The kickoff was delayed more than two hours because of lightning in the area.

South Carolina (2-0) scored more from its special teams and defense than its offense as Jaron Willis also returned a fumble for a score and LaNorris Sellers couldn't get the offense going for a second week.

South Carolina looked like it was up past its bedtime, trailing 3-0 before Swain eluded a tackler right on top of him and then ran 64 yards for a touchdown. His second TD was a 42-yard return after he picked up a partially blocked punt just before it stopped rolling.

With his 80-yard punt return TD in last week's opener against Virginia Tech, Swain is now tied for the school's single-season record. The sophomore defensive back is the first FBS player with two punt returns scores in a game since Penn State's Daequan Hardy did it against UMass in October 2023.

Sellers threw six incompletions in his first eight attempts and finished the game with 128 yards passing and 23 yards rushing.

The Takeaway

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs will take \$500,000 back to Orangeburg, which is a lot of help for an athletic program that takes in about \$13 million a year.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have to figure out how to get their offense going, gaining just 253 yards against the Bulldogs. And South Carolina may not last long in the top 10 with a tepid performance against a FCS school compared to No. 11 Illinois 45-19 drubbing of Duke.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Diego Pavia completed 18 of 25 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, Jamezell Lassiter ran for a 44-yard score and Vanderbilt defeated No. 11 South Carolina 31-7 at Williams-Brice Stadium Saturday night (Sept. 13).

The Commodores hadn't beat South Carolina since 2008, but forced four turnovers for their first 3-0 start since 2017.

South Carolina quarterback and Heisman Trophy candidate LaNorris Sellers was knocked out of the game in the second quarter after taking a helmet-to-helmet hit from Vanderbilt linebacker Langston Patterson, who was ejected for targeting.

Sellers did not return, and finished 6 of 7 passing for 94 yards with one interception in the red zone with the score tied at 7. He was replaced by Luke Doty.

The Commodores held nearly a 12-minute edge in time of possession.

Pavia led Vanderbilt on a nine-play, 73-yard drive to open the game, capped with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Sedrick Alexander. Pavia later tossed a 5-yard TD pass to Junior Sherrill in the second quarter giving the Commodores a 14-7 lead at the break.

Lassiter's scamper around right end stretched Vanderbilt's lead to 21-7 early in the third quarter and the Commodores began to sense an upset brewing. Brock Taylor's 51-yard field goal with 9:27 left made it a three-possession game.

Alexander added his second TD on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Rahsul Faison ran for 74 yards and a touchdown for South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Ahmad Hardy had 138 yards rushing and a touchdown, Beau Pribula led No. 23 Missouri downfield for a go-ahead score in the fourth quarter and the Tigers beat South Carolina 29-20 on Saturday night.

Pribula threw for 171 yards with a touchdown pass, and Jamal Roberts had a touchdown of his own with 9:32 left to give the Tigers the lead, ultimately helping them to their 14th consecutive home win.

LaNorris Sellers had 302 yards passing and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks South Carolina twice went three-and-out down the stretch, giving the Missouri ground game the chance to close out the win.

The Tigers finished with 285 yards rushing. South Carolina had minus-9 on the ground.

The Tigers struck first with a 99-yard drive — their third full-field march of the season — before Sellers answered with a 49-yard touchdown throw to Vandrevius Jacobs to give the Gamecocks a 7-6 lead.

Sellers hit Brian Rowe Jr. with his second touchdown throw later in the half, and South Carolina led 14-12 at the break.

Hardy carried the Tigers in the second half. The highlight may have been his TD run, when it looked as if he was stood up at the line of scrimmage, spun off the pile and scored to give Missouri an 18-16 lead.

But it always felt as if the game was destined to be decided in the fourth quarter, just like last November, when Sellers capped a 353-yard, five-touchdown performance by rallying the Gamecocks for a 34-30 win in the Palmetto State.

This time, South Carolina had regained the lead when Pribula led the Tigers downfield in the fourth quarter. And after Hardy had checked out for a breather, Roberts had a 16-yard sprint to the pylon for a touchdown; Pribula added the 2-point conversion to give Missouri a 26-20 lead with 9:36 to go.

Then it was the Tigers defense that stepped up, forcing South Carolina into a pair of three-and-outs before Robert Meyer kicked a clinching 40-yard field goal with 1:34 left on the clock.

BATON ROUGE, LA. (AP) — Garrett Nussmeier passed for 254 yards and two touchdowns, LSU's defense contained South Carolina's LaNorris Sellers, and the 11th-ranked Tigers overcame three turnovers to defeat the Gamecocks 20-10 on Saturday night.

"We found a way to win, even though we had some mistakes out there that could at some time be catastrophic," LSU coach Brian Kelly said. "The bottom line is: against an SEC opponent, we held them to 10 points and really, except for our own mistakes, we controlled the flow of the game."

The victory arguably should have been easier for LSU (5-1, 2-1 SEC), which twice lost the ball right at the South Carolina goal line on a fumble and an interception. The first of Nussmeier's two interceptions also occurred on the Gamecocks' side of the field.

LSU tight end Trey'Dez Green, a 6-foot-7 former college basketball player, caught eight passes for 119 yards and a touchdown.

"Clearly he is a mismatch," Kelly said. "He is a unique talent and we need to continue to feature him in our offense."

Green, who received a game ball, said he has largely recovered from a knee injury that occurred during LSU's home opener on Sept. 6.

"The ball came my way tonight a lot," he said. "I wasn't going to waste that opportunity."

Kyle Parker had five catches for 75 yards, highlighted by his 43-yard score on which he snagged a short slant pass in stride and ran away from everyone.

LSU also rushed for a season-high 166 yards, led by Caden Durham's 70 yards on 15 carries.

Damian Ramos' second field goal of the game all but sealed it with 1:46 left, capping a drive that started after LSU cornerback Mansoor Delane had broken up Sellers' fourth-down pass with 5:43 left.

Sellers passed for 124 yards, took five sacks and was intercepted once by LSU safety Tamaricus Cooley.

"Sellers is a difficult guy to corral," Kelly said. "I'm proud of the way our guys attacked him. ... He will leave here feeling the game against LSU."

South Carolina (3-3, 1-3) drove into Tigers territory six times, but four of those possessions produced no points. One fruitless drive ended with a missed field goal, two ended with punts and the last with a turnover on downs.

"I'm sick to my stomach that we didn't win that football game," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said, noting the Gamecocks finished with 193 yards rushing. "When we ran the ball, when we won the turnover battle, win time of possession — when you do all that, you should win the game."

LSU was on the brink of taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter as running back Ju'Juan Johnson fought through tacklers to try to reach the goal line. But defensive tackle Monkell Goodwine dislodged the ball and the Gamecocks recovered in the end zone.

Three plays later Matt Fuller, who entered the game with 71 yards rushing this season, broke loose for a 72-yard touchdown run to give the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead.

The Tigers responded quickly, driving 72 yards in six plays for Green's leaping 6-yard touchdown catch on a fade pass.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — It was a long, disappointing week for Oklahoma quarterback John Mateer, the Washington State transfer who shouldered much of the blame for the Sooners' 23-6 defeat at Texas last week.

Mateer and the 14th-ranked Sooners' defense made sure to put that loss behind them in a 26-7 win over South Carolina on Saturday.

Mateer threw for 150 yards and a touchdown while the defense sacked Gamecocks quarterback LaNorris Sellers six times, had a interception and a safety to get back to their winning ways.

"I expected better than that," Mateer said of his three interception showing against the Longhorns. "Today, whether I was feeling good or not, I was going to play. I got myself to a good point, the team was in a good spot and, yeah, played well."

Oklahoma (6-1, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) recovered with a steady, mistake-free offense and a best-in-the-nation defense to beat the Gamecocks (3-4, 1-4).

Mateer led touchdown drives of 75 and 92 yards and the Sooners held on fourth-and-goal from their own 5 for a 14-0 lead.

Tory Blaylock had an 18-yard touchdown run to open the scoring and Xavier Robinson bullied his way into the end zone from 10 yards out to take a two-touchdown lead.

Oklahoma coach Brent Venables appreciated his team's courage and toughness in dismissing outside noise and focusing on South Carolina.

"Whenever anybody questioned our team from a week ago, our guys had the ability to block it out," Venables said.

Oklahoma came in leading the nation in yards allowed at 193 and kept the pressure up against the Gamecocks. Defensive end Taylor Wein sniffed out a fake punt pass by South Carolina's Mason Love and got the interception. Five plays later, Mateer found Isaiah Sategna III for a 20-yard TD and a 24-7 lead.

Then again, Oklahoma coach Brent Venables knows how to lock down South Carolina at home. He went 4-1 at Williams-Brice Stadium as Clemson's defensive coordinator, and his group held the Gamecocks to an average of 285 yards and four points in Venables' last three times in the building.

Sellers, a projected NFL first-round draft pick, finished with 124 yards passing. As a parting shot, Oklahoma defensive tackle Markus Strong tackled tailback Matt Fuller in the end zone for a safety with about four minutes left.

Blaylock ran for 101 yards and Oklahoma kicker Tate Sandell matched his career long with a 55-yard field goal.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Germie Bernard scored two touchdowns in the final 2 1/2 minutes, and No. 4 Alabama rallied to beat South Carolina 29-22 at Williams-Brice Stadium for its seventh straight win.

Ty Simpson threw for 253 yards and two touchdowns and De-Shawn Jones returned an interception 18 yards for a score for the Crimson Tide (7-1, 5-0 Southeastern Conference).

"We knew that this was going to be a dogfight coming in, right?" Simpson said. "... But there was not one ounce of nonbelief, right? We knew what we had to do and we made sure that we were going to be unbreakable with everything that we had — and that's what we did."

LaNorris Sellers threw for 222 yards and a touchdown and ran for 67 yards and another score for South Carolina (3-5, 1-5), but had a costly fumble late which led to the winning score.

The Tide trailed 22-14 late in the fourth quarter, but drove 79 yards on 14 plays with Simpson finding Bernard for a 4-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone with 2:16 to play. Simpson then connected with Josh Cuevas, who caught a TD pass earlier in the game, for the 2-point conversion to tie the game.

On the ensuing drive, linebacker Deontae Lawson stripped Sellers, giving Simpson and the offense the ball at the South Carolina 38.

"I had two hands on it because I knew they were trying to strip it," Sellers said. "I was thinking the ref was going to blow the whistle and that is when I started to fall down. When I was going to catch myself that's when I took my other hand off it and I guess that is when he got under the ball."

On a third-and-10 play, Bernard took a direct snap and raced around right end and stayed inbounds for a 25-yard touchdown with 34 seconds left.

South Carolina tried to let Bernard score after he'd picked up the first down.

Bernard could have slid down near the goal line and let the clock run down to set up the go-ahead field goal.

Instead, he happily took the six points.

"Coach gave me the green light to go ahead and score, so that's what I did," Bernard said.

Alabama took a 7-3 lead in the second quarter after Sellers' pass in the flat bounced off the hands of running back Raheem Faison and into the arms of Jones, who raced down the left sideline for a score.

Mistakes haunted the Gamecocks in the first half.

Along with the mishandled catch by Faison, a holding penalty negated a 15-yard TD run by Sellers. Another holding call ended a potential touchdown drive and the Gamecocks also missed a field goal.

Despite the errors, South Carolina only trailed 14-6 at halftime.

The Gamecocks scored the next 16 points.

Nyck Harbor got behind the defense and hauled in a 54-yard touchdown strike, William Joyce connected on a 47-yard field goal and Sellers scored on a 10-yard run after the Gamecocks recovered a punt deep in Alabama territory after it hit a Tide player in the back of the leg.

Down by 8 on the road, Alabama never flinched.

For South Carolina, which started the season ranked No. 13, it was yet another agonizing defeat.

"It's hard. As the coach, I feel like I'm letting a lot of people down," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "I know today let a lot of people down. I wish I had something to say to make it better."
