South Carolina Gamecocks (3-3, 1-3 SEC)

QUICKLY: The South Carolina Gamecocks (3-3, 1-3 SEC) begin the second half of the 2025 regular season by welcoming the No. 14/13 Oklahoma Sooners (5-1, 1-1 SEC) to Columbia and Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) for the first time ever on Saturday, Oct. 18. Game time is set for 12:45 pm ET in Columbia.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's game will be televised on the SEC Network with Taylor Zarzour handling the play-by-play, Matt Stinchcomb providing the color commentary and South Carolina's own Alyssa Lang working the sidelines. For the second week in a row, ESPN Radio has a national broadcast with Marc Kestecher and Kelly Stouffer in the booth and Ian Fitzsimmons on the sidelines. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Hall of Fame quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (34th season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (53rd season). Chet Tucker returns for his third year as the sideline reporter.

HOW WE GOT HERE: The Gamecocks have reached the halfway point of the 2025 regular season with a 3-3 mark including a 1-3 record in SEC play. Carolina opened the season with a 24-11 non-conference win over Virginia Tech in Atlanta, then rolled past South Carolina State by a 38-10 margin in the 2025 home opener. The Gamecocks had their eight-game regular season winning streak and their 16-game winning streak against Vanderbilt snapped in a 31-7 decision in the SEC opener, then fell by a 29-20 count at Missouri before bouncing back with a convincing 35-13 win over Kentucky in Columbia. After a bye week, the Gamecocks went to Baton Rouge last Saturday night and dropped a 20-10 decision to the 11th-ranked LSU Tigers.

DÉJÀ VU ALL OVER AGAIN: The Gamecocks were in a similar situation at this time last year, sitting at 3-3 overall and 1-3 in the SEC halfway through the season after a road loss at No. 7 Alabama and facing Oklahoma. They went into Norman and rolled to a 35-9 win, the first of six-straight wins including four wins over ranked opponents.

COACHING CHANGE: On Sunday, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer announced that he has relieved offensive line coach Lonnie Teasley of his duties effective immediately. Run game coordinator/ tight ends coach Shawn Elliott assumes the offensive line coaching responsibilities. Elliott previously worked as the Gamecocks' offensive line coach under head coach Steve Spurrier from 2010-15, and under Will Muschamp in 2016. In addition, he served as the Gamecocks' interim head coach over the final six games of the 2015 season. Elliott also was the offensive line coach at Appalachian State from 2001-09. He returned to Columbia in 2024 after a seven-year stint at the head coach at Georgia State. Ben Burress, who had been working as a pass game specialist, will assist with the tight ends.

NOT ALL SCHEDULES ARE CREATED EQUAL: South Carolina is in a stretch in which they could play five ranked teams in a row, something that has never happened in school history. They played at No. 11/11 LSU last week and have No. 6/6 Alabama, No. 5/5 Ole Miss and No. 4/4 Texas A&M on the docket after this week's game against No. 14/13 Oklahoma. Including the Sooners this week, South Carolina will have faced 11 ranked opponents over an 18-game stretch.

WELCOME TO COLUMBIA: The South Carolina Gamecocks and Oklahoma Sooners are meeting for the first time ever in Columbia. The teams met for the first time last season in Norman, with South Carolina cruising to a 35-9 win.

WELL, WE'VE NEVER BEEN TO SPAIN: But we've been to Oklahoma. South Carolina traveled to Norman for the first time in school history on Oct. 19, 2024, and left with a convincing 35-9 rout of the Sooners. Buoyed by three Sooner turnovers on their first three possessions, including a pair of defensive scores (a 36-yard fumble return by Tonka Hemingway and a 65-yard interception return by Nick Emmanwori), the Gamecocks scored 21 points in the first 5:20 of the contest, essentially putting the game on ice.

THE DEFENSE NEVER RESTS: The South Carolina defense was relentless against Oklahoma last season, collecting a school record nine sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss in the contest. They also forced six fumbles and logged four turnovers while allowing just 291 yards of offense. Amazingly, nine different players recorded one sack each for Carolina.

TO THE VICTORS: Nick Emmanwori was named the SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week and the Reese's Senior Bowl co-Defensive Player of the Week, Tonka Hemingway was the SEC co-Defensive Lineman of the Week and punter Kai Kroeger was one of "Ray's 8" for their efforts against Oklahoma last season. Emmanwori had 11 tackles and a pair of interceptions, Hemingway had a sack to go with his fumble return for a TD and Kroeger averaged 51.6 yards on eight punts.

SHANE, COME BACK!: South Carolina head coach **Shane Beamer** served as the assistant head coach/tight ends and H-backs coach on Lincoln Riley's staff at OU from 2018-2020. The Sooners went 33-6 during that three-year stint, including back-to-back 12-2 campaigns and appearances in

the College Football Playoffs in 2018 and '19.

SPENCER FOR HIRE: It's notable that former OU and South Carolina quarterback Spencer Rattler recently earned his first NFL win as the starter for the New Orleans Saints against the New York Giants. Rattler finished his Gamecock career ranked fifth all-time in passing with 6,212 career yards. He also ranked first in Carolina history in career completion percentage (67.5), fifth in career completions (523) and ninth in career passing touchdowns (37) despite playing just two seasons in the Garnet & Black. A two-time team captain and Steve Wadiak Team MVP recipient, Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9) in 2023. He became just the third Gamecock to post an NFL win as a starting quarterback, joining Bill Troup and Anthony Wright.

A South Carolina win over Oklahoma would...

- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their second-straight win over the Sooners and keep OU winless against the Gamecocks.
- ◆ Give Shane Beamer his 250th career collegiate win in a career that dates back to 1995. Beamer was part of 47 wins as a player at Virginia Tech; 38 as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech and Tennessee; 132 as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, South Carolina, Virgina Tech, Georgia and Oklahoma; and has 32 wins as a head coach at South Carolina.

BEAMER BEATS THE BEST: Shane Beamer is in his fifth year as the Gamecocks' head coach. He has seven wins over ranked opponents, including three over top-10 teams, the most by any coach in South Carolina history in their first five campaigns. Carolina is 0-2 against Top-25 teams this season after logging a 4-4 mark against ranked teams a year ago. Here's how the coaches have fared in their first five seasons against ranked opponents:

IT'S NOT OFFENSIVE: The Gamecocks have scored in all three phases of the game this season. Carolina has an NCAA-leading six non-offensive touchdowns this season. Vicari Swain has returned an NCAA-leading three punts for touchdowns, and the Gamecock defense has produced two fumble returns and an interception return for scores. With six non-offensive touchdowns, the Gamecocks have already matched their single-season highwater mark since joining the SEC in 1992. They also had six non-offensive touchdowns in 2010, 2011 and, most recently, 2012.

IT'S A SHANESTORM IN COLUMBIA: If Beamer Ball is attributed to his father, the legendary Frank Beamer, Shane Beamer is making a name for himself with defense and special teams:

- The Gamecocks have scored six non-offensive touchdowns this season three on punt returns, two fumble recoveries for scores and one pick-6.
- Since his arrival in Columbia in 2021, the Gamecocks have scored 20 non-offensive touchdowns 1 kickoff return; 6 punt returns; 4 fumble returns; and 9 interception returns.
- Vicari Swain leads the country with three punt returns for touchdowns. Swain is second in the SEC and ranks fourth in the nation, averaging 20.5-yards per punt return.
- Mason Love is the nation's second-ranked freshman punter, averaging 44.8-yards per punt. Carolina is 18th in the country in net punting at 43.0 yards per punt.
- Under Shane Beamer, Carolina has blocked 17 kicks/punts since 2021, tied with Old Dominion for second in the country behind Notre Dame (18).

IT'S BETTER TO TAKE THAN TO GIVE: The Game-cocks have played turnover-free football in four of their first six games this season. They had just one game a year ago (Oklahoma) in which they had no turnovers, committing a total of 21 turnovers in 13 games. They are plus-6 in the turnover battle this season, forcing 12 (eight interceptions and four fumbles) while committing six - four in the loss to Vanderbilt and two in the loss at LSU.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: With three turnovers forced at LSU and 12 on the season, the Gamecocks, under head coach Shane Beamer and defensive coordinator Clayton White, have recorded 100 turnovers since the 2021 season. Only six schools have reached the century mark in turnovers forced in that span. Here are the NCAA leaders during that stretch:

THE LAST TIME OUT: South Carolina won the turnover battle and rushed for a season-best 193 yards, including a season-high 72-yard touchdown burst from Matt Fuller, but still came out on the short end of a 20-10 decision at LSU last Saturday night. The Gamecocks lost for just the third time in 26 games in which they held their opponents to 20 or fewer points and are now 15-5 when rushing for 150 or more yards in the Beamer Era.

RUN THE BALL: Behind the career-high 83-yard effort from **Matt Fuller** and a 68-yard performance from **Rahsul Faison**, and despite losing 55 yards in sacks, the Gamecocks rushed for a season-high 193 yards at LSU. That comes on the heels of a 178-yard rushing game against Kentucky. Here's how the Carolina running game has improved from the first four games to the last two:

ALL THE LOVE: Redshirt freshman punter **Mason Love** was selected as one of Ray's "Great 8" by the Ray Guy Award for his efforts at LSU. Love averaged 41.8 yards on four punts at LSU, with all four pinning the Tigers inside their 20-yard line. The Gamecocks had a net of 43.8-yards per punt.

Offense

SHULA STEERS THE SHIP: Mike Shula, who spent the 2024 season as the Gamecocks' senior offensive assistant coach, is in his first season directing the Carolina offense. He was promoted to OC/ quarterbacks coach after Dowell Loggains was named the head coach at Appalachian State. Shula, who served as Alabama's head coach from 2003-

06, was the NFL Offensive Coordinator of the Year in 2015 after helping Cam Newton win NFL MVP honors as Carolina reached the Super Bowl. He also worked with Josh Allen in Buffalo and David Gerrard in Jacksonville, among others.

QB1: LaNorris Sellers, a 6-3, 240-pound redshirt sophomore from Florence, S.C., is the unquestioned leader of the squad. Sellers, who was a preseason Heisman Trophy candidate, was the 2024 National Freshman Offensive Player of the Year as selected by the FWAA. He was also a 2024 Freshman All-American and an SEC All-Freshman selection. He threw for 2,534 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 65.6 percent of his passes and added 674 yards and seven touchdowns rushing in his first season as a starting signal-caller. He was the SEC media's choice as the 2025 preseason first-team all-league selection after earning third-team honors a year ago behind Jaxson Dart and Quinn Ewers.

SELL HIGH: Heading into Week 5, LaNorris Sellers emerged from the pack as the top quarterback for the 2026 NFL Draft, according to an ESPN poll of 25 NFL scouts and executives. Draft expert Mel Kiper agreed saying, "For me, I would go to Sellers. By the way, Sellers will only be 20 years of age at the draft next year." But it's not just No. 16's age that intrigues the veteran draft analyst. "Sellers looks the part. I think he's going to play some outstanding football this year for South Carolina."

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE LATELY?: LaNorris Sellers has completed 73-of-114 passes (64.0 pct.) for 1,010 yards and four TDs with two interceptions in 2025. In the opener against Virgina Tech, he completed a career-long 64-yard TD pass to Nyck Harbor. Against No. 23 Missouri, he threw for 302 yards and two scores, the third 300-yard passing game of his career. He rushed for a seasonligh 81 yards against Kentucky and tied his career high with 22 carries at LSU. Sellers is now 11-7 as a starting quarterback with wins in nine of his last 13 starts. He has led three fourth-quarter gamewinning drives in his career.

300 FOR SELLERS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback **LaNorris Sellers** had his best statistical game of the season against Missouri, completing 18-of-28 passes for a season-high 302 yards and two touchdowns with no turnovers. His TD passes went for 49 yards to **Vandrevius Jacobs** and for 24 yards to **Brian Rowe Jr.** It was the third 300-yard passing game of Sellers's career and his second against Missouri. Sellers is tied for eighth in school history with Ryan Hilinski, Connor Shaw and Tommy Suggs with three career 300-yard passing games.

I'LL TELL YOU WHEN IT'S OVER: The Gamecocks feature two running backs who are in their seventh season of college football. Both **Oscar Adaway III** and **Rahsul Faison** finished up their high school ball in 2018. Adaway III turns 25 years old on Oct. 17, while Faison turned 25 in February.

WAITING WAS THE HARDEST PART: Transfer running back **Rahsul Faison** was in limbo while the NCAA determined whether he was eligible for

another season of college football. He was given a waiver to practice with the team while awaiting the green light to participate in games, which finally came on Aug. 25, just six days before the season opener. Faison had his best game as a Gamecock against Vanderbilt, rushing for a game- and season-high 74 yards with a touchdown on 15 carries. For the season, he is Carolina's top rusher with 54 carries for 231 yards and three touchdowns.

FULL STEAM AHEAD: Running back Matt Fuller has seen his playing time increase over the last two games. After appearing in just two of the first four games this season and in just four contests in his career, the redshirt freshman carried the rock 19 times against Kentucky, including 13 on the Gamecocks' final drive. He had 48 yards rushing in the contest including his first touchdown after having 15 carries for 48 yards in his previous four appearances. He topped that effort with a careerbest 83-yard performance on just seven carries at LSU. Included was a 72-yard touchdown run. He is now second on the squad in rushing and averages a team-high 4.7-yards per carry. Here's a look at Fuller's career:

FREAKING OUT: The Gamecocks had a pair of players on Bruce Feldman's preseason "Freaks" List. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** checks in at No. 3 after back-to-back years at the top of the list, while **LaNorris Sellers** is ranked 33rd on the list.

ANY HARBOR IN A STORM: World-class sprinter **Nyck Harbor** gave up his love of running track this spring to focus on football. The junior wide receiver has all the measurables to be WR1. He showed why everyone is excited about his future, as he caught three passes for 99 yards in the opener against Virginia Tech, including a career-long 64-yard TD pass. He is second on the team with 13 catches for 256 yards, a 29.7-yard average, with one touchdown.

DRE'S DAYS: Vandrevius Jacobs put together back-to-back 100-yard receiving games against Missouri and Kentucky to make a case for WR1. He had the best game of his career at Mizzou when he was targeted eight times and caught seven passes for 128 yards, setting career bests in both receptions and receiving yards. Included was a 49-yard scoring pass play from LaNorris Sellers. The seven catches were the most in a game for a Gamecock this season and the 128 receiving yards were the most for a Gamecock wide receiver since Xavier Legette logged 217 yards against Jacksonville State in 2023. He followed that up with a fivecatch, 108-yard effort against Kentucky including a season-long 59-yard reception. They were the first back-to-back 100-vard receiving games for a Gamecock since Legette in 2023. Jacobs is the team's leading receiver with 20 catches for 341 yards (17.1 per catch) and two touchdowns.

THE NEXT WAVE: Wide receivers coach Mike Furrey brought in six talented scholarship freshman wide receivers this year - Malik Clark, Lex Cyrus, Jordon Gidron, Donovan Murph, Brian Rowe Jr. and Jayden Sellers - arguably the best wide receiver class on paper in school history. Murph, who was the last to arrive on campus, was the first to see game action. He has made a pair of starts and

has five catches for 94 yards. Rowe Jr. has seen the most action. He is tied for third on the squad with 10 catches for 89 yards and a touchdown while making three starts. He had a three-catch, 50-yard, 1-TD performance at Missouri.

INTERCHANGEABLE PARTS: South Carolina uses three tight ends. Brady Hunt has made three starts while Jordan Dingle has two. Maurice Brown II got the nod in the opener against Virginia Tech. The tight end group has combined for 19 receptions. Hunt leads the way with 10 catches for 89 yards after catching just two passes for 22 yards in 2024. Brown II is also a special teams standout.

IT ALL STARTS UPFRONT: The Gamecocks have started four different five-man offensive lines through the first six games, including three dif-

ferent starters at center. The only constant for all six games has been left tackle Josiah Thompson, who has manned that position almost immediately upon his arrival as a true freshman last year when he earned Freshman All-America accolades. He has started 18 of the past 19 games. True freshman left guard Shedrick Sarratt Jr. was unavailable in the opener but has started every game since. Sarratt Jr. is one of 37 players on Shaun Alexander's Freshman of the Year watch list. Boaz Stanley, Nolan Hay and Rodney Newsom Jr. have all made starts at center. Trovon Baugh has started five times at right guard. Cason Henry, whose 18 starts at Carolina matches Thompson for the most of any lineman, started the first four games at right tackle but was injured on the first play of the Missouri contest and has not played since. Tree Babalade, who was the starting left tackle two years ago, has replaced Henry in the lineup.

Defense

MOLDING THE CLAY: Despite losing five players who went in the first four rounds of the 2025 NFL Draft, fifth-year defensive coordinator **Clayton White** has had the Carolina defense playing at a high level for much of the season. The Gamecocks are allowing just 19.0 points per game, just a hair above their 18.1 average from a season ago. They are allowing just 192.5 yards a game through the air, which would be their second-lowest mark since 2011.

MISSING YOU: Defensive line coach **Travian Robertson** was injured in a serious car accident on Aug. 22. He is recovering at home after a two-week stay in the hospital where he underwent five surgeries. **Jordan Dove** is filling in as the D-line coach in Robertson's absence. Robertson has been able to attend a handful of practices over the past few weeks.

THAT'S OUR BALL: The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic under Clayton White. The Gamecocks forced 24 turnovers in 2024 and forced 88 turnovers over the last four seasons (2021-24), tops in the SEC. Carolina has forced 12 turnovers so far in 2025, including eight interceptions and four fumble recoveries, three of which has been returned for touchdowns. Only Louisiana Tech (5) and Tennessee (4) have more defensive TDs than Carolina in 2025. The Gamecocks have scored 13 defensive touchdowns under Coach White's watch.

THE ALL-AMERICAN: Sophomore edge rusher **Dylan Stewart**, a 6-5, 245-pounder from Washington, D.C., earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors last season after recording 10.5 tackles for loss including 6.5 sacks. He was a finalist for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year award and was a member of the SEC All-Freshman team in 2024.

HE'S ONLY GETTING BETTER: Dylan Stewart hasn't missed a beat. Despite being double-teamed regularly, he is tied for third on the team with 27 tackles. more than he had for the entire 2024 season, and leads the squad with 9.0 tackles for loss, tying for 10th in the country, and with 3.5 sacks. He also has recorded six quarterback hurries and has forced a pair of fumbles. He has notched 19.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 sacks in his first 19 games. He collected a career-high seven tackles in the season opener against Virginia Tech.

REPLACING KENNARD: Kyle Kennard won the Nagurski Award last season while playing the opposite end from **Dylan Stewart**. The Gamecocks have several veteran candidates filling that role, including Bryan Thomas Jr., Jatius Geer, and Desmond Umeozulu and Demon Clowney. Thomas Jr. has started every game. He has 21 tackles including 5.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and a team-high seven QB hurries. He was the SEC's co-Defensive Lineman of the Week against Kentucky when he was credited with a game- and career-high seven tackles, including five solo stops. He also set a career high by registering 2.0 of the Gamecocks' six sacks against the Wildcats and added one quarterback hurry. Geer has a pair of sacks and returned a fumble 41 yards for a score against Kentucky.

SACK ATTACK: Led by Nagurski Award winner Kyle Kennard and Freshman All-American **Dylan Stewart**, the Gamecocks recorded 41 sacks a season ago, second in the SEC and sixth in the nation. Carolina has 14 sacks this season including six against Kentucky. Here are the sack numbers:

CHANGES IN THE MIDDLE: The Gamecocks lost their top four interior defensive linemen from 2024 to graduation. Nick Barrett, who redshirted last year, returned for his fifth season and is the leader. He has started every game while Monkell Goodwine has started five of six. Transfers Gabriel Brownlow-Dindy (Texas A&M), Devonte Miles (Bowling Green) and Troy Pikes (Georgia Southern) all see regular time in the rotation. Barrett leads the way with 21 tackles including 3.0 tackles for loss and his first two career sacks.

REMEMBER THE NAME: Fred "JayR" Johnson has all the makings of the next great linebacker at South Carolina. The sophomore saw limited action a season ago playing behind veterans Debo Williams, Demetrius Knight Jr. and Bam Martin-Scott. He recorded a game-high 10 tackles and an interception in the opener against Virginia Tech, earning SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades. He is second on the team with 28 tackles and logged his first career sack at Missouri.

WE'LL TAKE THEM: Linebackers Shawn Murphy (Alabama/Florida State) and Justin Okoronkwo (Alabama) transferred to South Carolina this season. They have split time with Okoronkwo collecting 26 tackles and Murphy with 18. Murphy started the first three games and Okoronkwo has started the last three.

THE GRIZZLED VET: DQ Smith quarterbacks the defense from his safety position. Smith has started 39 games, the most of any current player. He owns five career INTs and two career TDs, one on an interception return and one after a blocked punt. He leads the team with 32 tackles despite missing the Missouri contest with an injury.



KILGORE WAS HERE: Junior Jalon Kilgore is in his third season as a starter at the Nickel position. He was a preseason second-team AP All-America selection after tying for the SEC lead and for fourth in the country with five interceptions, tying Jaylan Foster's 2021 total for the most by a Gamecock in the last 20 years. Kilgore was hampered with a hamstring injury early in the season but logged 10 tackles at Missouri and is tied for third on the squad with 27 tackles.

AM I MY BROTHER'S KEEPER? While Jalon Kilgore got the much-deserved preseason hype, his older brother, **Gerald Kilgore**, is quickly making a name for himself. Despite not being a starter, Kilgore, who began his collegiate career as a quarterback at Tennessee Tech, is tied for second in the SEC with two interceptions, including a 45-yard picksix against Kentucky.

CORNERING THE MARKET: The Gamecocks are blessed with four veteran cornerbacks. Judge Collier started every game last season and was credited with eight PBUs but missed three games after being injured in the opener. Brandon Cisse has started every game and has been among the top-ranked cornerbacks in the SEC, according to PFF, and has an interception and a team-high three breakups. Vicari Swain saw more action with Collier sidelined and was credited with a career-high 10 tackles at Missouri. Myles Norwood, a transfer from Ball State, has 18 tackles, tying Cisse and Swain for the most among the corners.

Special Teams

WHAT'S NEW?: Everything. Second-year special teams coordinator **Joe DeCamillis** has a completely different group to work with this season, as the Gamecocks have a new player in every special teams role.

MAKING A POINT: William Joyce won the placekicking chores and has been solid so far this season. He has connected on 5-of-7 field goal attempts with a long of 49 yards. He has also converted all 17 of his extra points attempts for a team-leading 32 points.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: Dating back to 2021, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 59 of their last 71 field goal attempts (83.1 pct.). From 2021-24, Carolina posted the second-best field goal percentage in the SEC, trailing only Georgia.

LOVE IS THE ANSWER: Mason Love is trying to make Gamecock fans forget about All-American punter Kai Kroeger, now with the New Orleans Saints. Kroeger took every punt for Carolina from 2000-04. Love is the nation's second-leading freshman punter with a 44.8-yard average on 24 punts. He has eight punts that have traveled 50+ yards with a long of 57 yards. Ten of his punts have pinned the opponents inside the 20 with just two touchbacks. He has a net punting average of 43.0. He was recognized as a Ray Guy "Great 8" Award winner for his efforts at LSU when all four of his punts were downed inside the 20-yard line.

THERE GOES THAT MAN AGAIN: Vicari Swain has put himself in contention for SEC Special Teams Player of the Year. consideration. Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a score against Virginia Tech, then took back-to-back punts to the house from 65- and from 42-yards out against South Carolina State. He was recognized as the SEC co-Special Teams Player of the Week after both contests. For the season, Swain ranks fourth in the nation with a 20.5-yard average.

- Swain became the first Gamecock in history to return two punts (or kicks of any kind) for touchdowns in a game.
- Swain became the first player in Division I to return two punts in a game for touchdowns since Penn State's Daequan Hardy vs. UMass in 2023.
- Swain has three punt returns for touchdowns this season, tying the single-season school record, set by Dick Harris in 1971.
- Swain has tied Ace Sanders (2010-12) for second on the school's career mark for most punt returns for touchdowns with three, one behind Harris (1969-71).
- The three punt returns for TDs marked the most in a season in FBS since Washington's Dante Pettis returned three for scores in 2017.

RETURN TO SENDER: With 226 punt return yards on the season, **Vicari Swain** already has the most punt returns yards by a Gamecock in a season since Ace Sanders had a school-record 429 yards on punt returns in 2012.

Miscellaneous

FOR THE HISTORY BUFFS: 2025 marks the 132nd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 119th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 646-620-44, a .510 winning percentage. Since the start of the 21st century, the Gamecocks have posted a 180-138 mark, a .567 winning percentage. Under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 32-25, a .561 winning clip.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2025 season marks South Carolina's 34th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in 2010. The Gamecocks are 115-153-1 (.429) all-time in SEC regular season play but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19. They

are 16-19 (.457) under head coach Shane Beamer.

ALL ABOARD THE **SHANE TRAIN:** South Carolina head coach **Shane Beamer** owns a 32-25 in his fifth season at the helm. He logged 29 wins from 2021-24, surpassing Steve Spurrier, Carolina's all-time winningest coach, for the most wins in his first four years in Columbia. Coach Spurrier posted a 28-22 from 2005-08 and finished with a school record 86 wins. Spurrier had 35 wins after five seasons leading the Gamecocks.

EARLY RETURNS: The Gamecocks feature a pair of wide receivers who could still be playing high school ball but elected to graduate a year early to enroll at South Carolina. **Donovan Murph** just turned 18 years old on Oct. 1, while **Jordon Gi**



dron will not turn 18 until Oct. 30. Both are local products, with Murph graduating from Irmo High School and Gidron from Columbia's Ridge View High. All told, the Gamecocks had 19 freshmen who graduated from high school early and enrolled in January,

BEAMER **HEAD COACH**

Shane Beamer begins his fifth season in Columbia leading the South Carolina Football program in 2025, a program that is on the upswing following a very successful 2024 campaign.

Beamer, who owns a 32-25 record, won more games through his first four seasons at Carolina (29) than any other coach, one more than Steve Spurrier, the school's all-time winningest coach. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown, and has led the Gamecocks to three bowl appearances in four years.

Beamer's 2024 squad was his most successful to date. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 9-4 record including a 5-3 mark in the SEC, posting nine wins in a season for just the eighth time in school history. The Gamecocks recorded a school-record four wins against ranked opponents, including three in consecutive weeks as part of a regular season-ending six-game winning streak. Carolina finished the season ranked 19th in both the final Associated Press and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2013 and its second top-25 ranking in the past three seasons.

Beamer was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the third time in his career following the Gamecocks' upset win over Texas A&M and earned SEC Coach of the Year accolades from the AP, USA TODAY, Bear Bryant and College Football Nation. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, the Bobby Dodd, and the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year.

Individually, edge rusher Kyle Kennard was the school's first Bronko Nagurski Award winner as the nation's top defensive player and was the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year. Kennard, along with safety Nick Emmanwori, earned first-team All-America honors, while punter Kai Kroeger was a secondteam selection. Quarterback LaNorris Sellers was selected as the SEC's Freshman of the Year. Sellers, offensive tackle Josiah Thompson and Edge rusher Dylan Stewart earned Freshman All-America honors, giving the Gamecocks six All-Americans as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the most of any FBS school in 2024. In addition, Kennard and Raheim Sanders were named first-team Academic All-America.

Named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020. Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award,

presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Coach Beamer was a two-time Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week recipient after wins over Kentucky and Tennessee. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors. leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS and in a season mired by numerous injuries, decimating the offensive line most notably, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark. The squad was led by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 71 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for eighth in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked 15th in the country in total defense, and eighth in the nation in passing defense.





As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has helped build several programs during his career. He was on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs at Oklahoma from 2018-20. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring, 11th in total offense and 14th in passing offense. In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play, ranked third in total offense and fourth in passing efficiency rating. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense, scoring offense and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating in 2018.

Beamer spent two seasons (2016-17) at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart, helping the Bulldogs to a 21-7 combined record. In 2017, UGA won the SEC Championship before falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting and 20th in kickoff returns while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record, was named All-America and ACC Player of the Year, and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in Dec. 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.



ATLANTA, GA. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown to break open a close game, LaNorris Sellers threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Nyck Harbor, and No. 13 South Carolina beat Virginia Tech 24-11 on Sunday in the opener for both teams.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer used his brand of "Beamerball" to pull away from the school where his dad, Frank Beamer, originated the style of play that emphasizes turnovers and big plays on special teams. The elder Beamer was in attendance at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, wearing South Carolina black.

"Thought you'd like a special teams touchdown," Shane Beamer told his dad as they shared a postgame hug.

South Carolina intercepted two passes by Virginia Tech's Kyron Drones. Fred Johnson made a pick in the red zone to halt a first-quarter drive, and Peyton Williams' interception in the fourth quarter helped seal the win.

The Gamecocks led 10-8 early in the fourth when Swain fielded a punt by Nick Veltsistas, turned upfield and made several would-be tacklers miss on the way to the end zone. After a Virginia Tech field goal, Sellers found Harbor wide open on a deep post route to restore South Carolina's two-score advantage.

Swain muffed a punt earlier in the game and narrowly avoided disaster by recovering the ball. Beamer comforted the sophomore on the sideline after that play.

"Coach Beamer was like, 'This is going to happen,'" Swain said. "'It's your first time being out there, just make sure on the next one, just take it to the house.' So I took it to the house, and my thought process was like, I messed up the first time, can't mess up again. This is my only shot."

Beamer's faith in Swain, a defensive back and part-time return man, was rewarded.

"So proud of Vicari Swain," Beamer said. "He's a weapon, and it was really neat for him to do that and how fitting that is playing Virginia Tech with their history, my dad's history at special teams."

Sellers scored South Carolina's first touchdown on a 15-yard rush and was 12 of 19 passing for 209 yards and the TD to Harbor, who had three catches for 99 yards. Harbor had another potential touchdown taken away by a replay review.

Virginia Tech's offense was held without a touchdown. John Love kicked three field goals, including a 56-yarder, and the Hokies' defense contributed a safety in the first quarter when Kelvin Gilliam Jr. and Kody Huisman took down Sellers in the end zone.

Drones went 15 of 35 for 221 yards and two interceptions.

The kickoff was delayed more than two hours because of lightning in the area

South Carolina (2-0) scored more from its special teams and defense than its offense as Jaron Willis also returned a fumble for a score and LaNorris Sellers couldn't get the offense going for a second week

South Carolina looked like it was up past its bedtime, trailing 3-0 before Swain eluded a tackler right on top of him and then ran 64 yards for a touchdown. His second TD was a 42-yard return after he picked up a partially blocked punt just before it stopped rolling.

With his 80-yard punt return TD in last week's opener against Virginia Tech, Swain is now tied for the school's single-season record. The sophomore defensive back is the first FBS player with two punt returns scores in a game since Penn State's Daequan Hardy did it against UMass in October 2023.

Sellers threw six incompletions in his first eight attempts and finished the game with 128 yards passing and 23 yards rushing,

The Takeaway

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs will take \$500,000 back to Orangeburg, which is a lot of help for an athletic program that takes in about \$13 million a year.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have to figure out how to get their offense going, gaining just 253 yards against the Bulldogs. And South Carolina may not last long in the top 10 with a tepid performance against a FCS school compared to No. 11 Illinois 45-19 drubbing of Duke.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Diego Pavia completed 18 of 25 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, Jamezell Lassiter ran for a 44-yard score and Vanderbilt defeated No. 11 South Carolina 31-7 at Williams-Brice Stadium Saturday night (Sept. 13).

The Commodores hadn't beat South Carolina since 2008, but forced four turnovers for their first 3-0 start since 2017.

South Carolina quarterback and Heisman Trophy candidate LaNorris Sellers was knocked out of the game in the second quarter after taking a helmet-to-helmet hit from from Vanderbilt linebacker Langston Patterson, who was ejected for targeting.

Sellers did not return, and finished 6 of 7 passing for 94 yards with one interception in the red zone with the score tied at 7. He was replaced by Luke Doty.

The Commodores held nearly a 12-minute edge in time of possession.

Pavia led Vanderbilt on a nine-play, 73-yard drive to open the game, capped with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Sedrick Alexander. Pavia later tossed a 5-yard TD pass to Junior Sherrill in the second quarter giving the Commodores a 14-7 lead at the break.

Lassiter's scamper around right end stretched Vanderbilt's lead to 21-7 early in the third quarter and the Commodores began to sense an upset brewing. Brock Taylor's 51-yard field goal with 9:27 left made it a three-possession game.

Alexander added his second TD on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter

Rahsul Faison ran for 74 yards and a touchdown for South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Ahmad Hardy had 138 yards rushing and a touchdown, Beau Pribula led No. 23 Missouri downfield for a goahead score in the fourth quarter and the Tigers beat South Carolina 29-20 on Saturday night.

Pribula threw for 171 yards with a touchdown pass, and Jamal Roberts had a touchdown of his own with 9:32 left to give the Tigers the lead, ultimately helping them to their 14th consecutive home win.

LaNorris Sellers had 302 yards passing and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks South Carolina twice went three-and-out down the stretch, giving the Missouri ground game the chance to close out the win

The Tigers finished with 285 yards rushing. South Carolina had minus-9 on the ground.

The Tigers struck first with a 99-yard drive — their third full-field march of the season — before Sellers answered with a 49-yard touchdown throw to Vandrevius Jacobs to give the Gamecocks a 7-6 lead

Sellers hit Brian Rowe Jr. with his second touchdown throw later in the half, and South Carolina led 14-12 at the break.

Hardy carried the Tigers in the second half. The highlight may have been his TD run, when it looked as if he was stood up at the line of scrimmage, spun off the pile and scored to give Missouri an 18-16 lead

But it always felt as if the game was destined to be decided in the fourth quarter, just like last November, when Sellers capped a 353-yard, five-touchdown performance by rallying the Gamecocks for a 34-30 win in the Palmetto State.

This time, South Carolina had regained the lead when Pribula led the Tigers downfield in the fourth quarter. And after Hardy had checked out for a breather, Roberts had a 16-yard sprint to the pylon for a touchdown; Pribula added the 2-point conversion to give Missouri a 26-20 lead with 9:36 to go.

Then it was the Tigers defense that stepped up, forcing South Carolina into a pair of three-and-outs before Robert Meyer kicked a clinching 40-yard field goal with 1:34 left on the clock.



COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's defense returned two turnovers for touchdowns within a span of three plays on Saturday night and the Gamecocks beat Kentucky, 35-13.

The Wildcats (2-2, 0-2 SEC) held a 10-7 lead heading into the second quarter. Quarterback Cutter Boley was sacked by Dylan Stewart, the ball popped loose and defensive lineman Jatius Geer retrieved it, chugging 40 yards for a touchdown.

Two plays later, Boley cast into the secondary but his pass clanged off the hands of Kendrick Law. South Carolina's Gerald Kilgore gobbled the carom and sprinted 45 yards to the end zone.

"Obviously when you score twice on defense, you're going to be really hard to beat," coach Shane Beamer said. "We didn't just want to win the turnover battle, we wanted to dominate it."

Trailing 21-10, the Wildcats tried to get their offense back in gear. Boley again threw deep but was belted by Desmond Umeozulu on the throw.

South Carolina's Brandon Cisse intercepted to start another touchdown drive. The Gamecocks (3-2, 1-2) added another touchdown in the fourth quarter while Kentucky only managed a field goal after its quick 10-0 start.

BATON ROUGE, LA. (AP) — Garrett Nussmeier passed for 254 yards and two touchdowns, LSU's defense contained South Carolina's LaNorris Sellers, and the 11th-ranked Tigers overcame three turnovers to defeat the Gamecocks 20-10 on Saturday night.

"We found a way to win, even though we had some mistakes out there that could at some time be catastrophic," LSU coach Brian Kelly said. "The bottom line is: against an SEC opponent, we held them to 10 points and really, except for our own mistakes, we controlled the flow of the game."

The victory arguably should have been easier for LSU (5-1, 2-1 SEC), which twice lost the ball right at the South Carolina goal line on a fumble and an interception. The first of Nussmeier's two interceptions also occurred on the Gamecocks' side of the field.

LSU tight end Trey'Dez Green, a 6-foot-7 former college basketball player, caught eight passes for 119 yards and a touchdown.

"Clearly he is a mismatch," Kelly said. "He is a unique talent and we need to continue to feature him in our offense."

Green, who received a game ball, said he has largely recovered from a knee injury that occurred during LSU's home opener on Sept. 6.

"The ball came my way tonight a lot," he said. "I wasn't going to waste that opportunity."

Kyle Parker had five catches for 75 yards, highlighted by his 43-yard score on which he snagged a short slant pass in stride and ran away from everyone.

LSU also rushed for a season-high 166 yards, led by Caden Durham's 70 yards on 15 carries.

Damian Ramos' second field goal of the game all but sealed it with 1:46 left, capping a drive that started after LSU cornerback Mansoor Delane had broken up Sellers' fourth-down pass with 5:43 left.

Sellers passed for 124 yards, took five sacks and was intercepted once by LSU safety Tamarcus Cooley.

"Sellers is a difficult guy to corral," Kelly said. "I'm proud of the way our guys attacked him. ... He will leave here feeling the game against LSU."

South Carolina (3-3, 1-3) drove into Tigers territory six times, but four of those possessions produced no points. One fruitless drive ended with a missed field goal, two ended with punts and the last with a turnover on downs.

"I'm sick to my stomach that we didn't win that football game," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said, noting the Gamecocks finished with 193 yards rushing. "When we ran the ball, when we won the turnover battle, win time of possession — when you do all that, you should win the game."

LSU was on the brink of taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter as running back Ju'Juan Johnson fought through tacklers to try to reach the goal line. But defensive tackle Monkell Goodwine dislodged the ball and the Gamecocks recovered in the end zone.

Three plays later Matt Fuller, who entered the game with 71 yards rushing this season, broke loose for a 72-yard touchdown run to give the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead.

The Tigers responded quickly, driving 72 yards in six plays for Green's leaping 6-yard touchdown catch on a fade pass.


