

South Carolina Gamecocks (3-2, 1-2 SEC) **#11/11 LSU Tigers** (4-1, 1-1 SEC)



QUICKLY: Fresh off a bye week, the South Carolina Gamecocks (3-2, 1-2 SEC) look to notch their secondstraight win, their fourth-win of the season and their first win in Baton Rouge since 1994 when they travel to the Bayou on Saturday, Oct. 11 to take on the No. 11/11 LSU Tigers (4-1, 1-1 SEC). Game time is set for 7:45 pm ET (6:45 pm CT) at Tiger Stadium (102,321) in Baton Rouge, La.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: For the third time in the last four games, this week's game will be televised on the SEC Network with Tom Hart handling the play-by-play, Jordan Rodgers providing the color commentary and Cole Cubelic working the sidelines. ESPN Radio has a national broadcast with Marc Kestecher and Kelly Stouffer in the booth and Ian Fitzsimmons on the sidelines. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Hall of Fame quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (34th season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (53rd season). Chet Tucker returns for his third year as the sideline reporter.

HOW WE GOT HERE: The Gamecocks are off to a 3-2 start this season. Carolina opened the season with a 24-11 non-conference win over Virginia Tech in Atlanta, then rolled past South Carolina State by a 38-10 margin in the 2025 home opener. The Gamecocks had their eight-game regular season winning streak and their 16-game winning streak against Vanderbilt snapped in a 31-7 decision in the SEC opener, then fell by a 29-20 count at Missouri before bouncing back with a convincing 35-13 win over Kentucky in Columbia two weeks ago. The Gamecocks enjoyed their first bye week of the season last week and now play four-straight weeks against SEC opponents before their second bye week of the campaign on Nov. 8.

IT'S NOT OFFENSIVE: The Gamecocks have scored in all three phases of the game this season - offense, defense and special teams. Carolina has an NCAA-leading six non-offensive touchdowns this season. Vicari Swain has returned an NCAA-leading three punts for touchdowns, and the Gamecock defense has produced two fumble returns and an interception return for scores. With six non-offensive touchdowns, the Gamecocks have already matched their single-season high-water mark since joining the SEC in 1992. They also had six non-offensive touchdowns in 2010, 2011 and, most recently, 2012.

WHAT THE FUTURE HOLDS: The Southeastern Conference announced its conference games for the next four seasons (2026-2029), with South Carolina's three annual opponents being Georgia, Florida and Kentucky. South Carolina and LSU will next meet in Columbia in 2027, while the Gamecocks' next trip to the Bayou will not come until 2029. Here are the Gamecocks' conference slates for the next four years:

THE SERIES: This is the 24th all-time meeting between South Carolina and LSU, with the Tigers holding a commanding 20-2-1 advantage in the series. The Bayou Bengals own a 13-1 mark when the game is played in Baton Rouge, hold a 6-1-1 lead in games played in Columbia, and won the only neutral site contest, taking the 1987 Gator Bowl in Jacksonville, Fla. LSU has won the last eight meetings, including a 36-33 win in Columbia last season. South Carolina's last win came by an 18-17 margin in Death Valley on Oct. 1, 1994. The Gamecocks only home win over the Tigers was back in 1930 at Melton Field in the first meeting between the two schools, a 7-6 victory.

AS SEC OPPONENTS: South Carolina and LSU have met 10 times on the gridiron as SEC rivals, with six of those games contested in Louisiana. LSU holds an 8-1-1 advantage in the series since Carolina joined the SEC in 1992.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: With the entire country tuning in for a national television broadcast on ABC and ESPN's College GameDay in Columbia, the Gamecocks jumped out to a 17-0 advantage but, after an injury late in the first half that sidelined quarterback LaNorris Sellers, the No. 16/17 LSU Tigers fought back to escape with a 36-33 win in Columbia on Sept. 14, 2024 in front of a sold-out crowd of 79.531 at Williams-Brice Stadium.

PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD: The Gamecocks scored 33 points last year against LSU, the most they've ever scored against the Tigers, surpassing the 29 points tallied in 1973. Carolina had 24 points in the first half, the most it has ever scored in a half against LSU. The 17-point first half advantage was also its largest lead ever against the Bayou Bengals.

POUND THE ROCK: The Gamecocks rolled up 243 yards on the ground on 41 carries against LSU in 2024, an average of 5.9 yards per rush. **Raheim "Rocket" Sanders** led the way with 143 yards on 19 carries, while **LaNorris Sellers** added 88 yards on 10 carries in one half of action, including a 75-yard scoring burst.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: LSU scored in all three phases of the game, including a 45-yard interception return and a 95-yard kickoff return, en route to a 52-24 win over South Carolina on Oct. 24, 2020, in Death Valley. The Gamecocks had 403 yards of offense on just 51 plays, an average of 7.9-yards per play, but were unable to slow down the Tigers. Kevin Harris had a big day, rushing a dozen times for 126 yards and two scores. Keveon Mullins had his best day as a Gamecock, catching two passes for 101 yards. Ernest Jones logged a career-high 19 tackles in the loss.

CAROLINA'S LAST WIN OVER LSU: Under first-year head coach Brad Scott, South Carolina went into the Bayou on Oct. 1, 1994, and escaped with an 18-17 win. The Gamecocks trailed the entire contest until Stanley Pritchett plunged in from the one-yard line with 12:52 remaining in the game for the deciding points. Pritchett finished the day with 18 carries for 90 yards. LSU held a 14-12 lead at the intermission in front of 63,281 rain-soaked fans and built the lead to 17-12 entering the final stanza. Carolina quarterback Steve Taneyhill was 23-for-30 for 157 yards and a touchdown, as the Gamecocks rolled up 262 yards of offense compared to 209 for LSU. It was just the Gamecocks'

A South Carolina win over LSU would...

- ♦ Give the Gamecocks their first win over the Tigers since 1994. After a 20-20 tie in 1995, LSU has won each of the last eight contests between the two SEC schools.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their third win in 24 tries against the Bayou Bengals. LSU leads the all-time series 20-2-1. Only Billy Laval and Brad Scott have coached Carolina to victories over the Tigers.
- ◆ Give Shane Beamer his 250th career collegiate win in a career that dates back to 1995. Beamer was part of 47 wins as a player at Virginia Tech; 38 as a graduate assistant at Georgia Tech and Tennessee; 132 as an assistant coach at Mississippi State, South Carolina, Virgina Tech, Georgia and Oklahoma; and has 32 wins as a head coach at South Carolina.

STATEMENT OPPORTUNITY AWAITS: Beginning this week, Carolina will face five-straight opponents ranked in the top 11 in the country. In order they will play at No. 11 LSU, vs. No. 6 Oklahoma, vs. No. 8 Alabama, at No. 4 Ole Miss and at No. 5 Texas A&M.

BEAMER BEATS THE BEST: Shane Beamer is in his fifth year as the Gamecocks' head coach. He has seven wins over ranked opponents, including three over top-10 teams, the most by any coach in South Carolina history in their first five campaigns. BEAMER BALL ALIVE AND WELL: The Gamecocks have been excellent on special teams in 2025:

- The Gamecocks have scored six non-offensive touchdowns this season three on punt returns, two fumble recoveries for scores and one pick-6.
- Vicari Swain leads the country with three of his eight punt returns going for touchdowns. Swain leads the SEC and ranks second in the nation with an average of 25.8-yards per return.
- South Carolina ranks first in the SEC and fourth in the country in punt return average at 23.9 yards per return.
- Mason Love, the nation's top freshman punter, ranks 24th in the nation in average at 45.5-yards per punt. Carolina is 23rd in the country in net punting at 42.85 yards per punt.
- The Gamecocks have blocked one punt in 2025. Under Shane Beamer, Carolina has blocked 17 kicks/punts since 2021, tied with Old Dominion for second in the country behind Notre Dame (18).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Gamecocks won four true road games in 2024 for just the fourth time in school history, also winning four road games in 1968, 1994 and 2006. They logged a trio of impressive SEC road wins, all by at least three touchdowns, posting a 31-6 victory at Kentucky, winning in a 35-9 rout at Oklahoma and knocking off 24th-ranked Vanderbilt 28-7, holding all three of those opponents to under 10 points. They also won at Clemson, holding the ACC champions to just 14 points. South Carolina recorded three conference road wins in 2024 for the first time since 2011. They are 0-1 in true road games this season, falling at No. 23 Missouri.

IT'S BETTER TO TAKE THAN TO GIVE: The Game-cocks have played turnover-free football in four of their first five games this season. They had just one game a year ago (Oklahoma) in which they had no turnovers, committing a total of 21 turnovers in 13 games. They are plus-5 in the turnover battle this season, forcing nine (six interceptions and three fumbles) while committing four - all coming in the loss to Vanderbilt. Carolina was plus-four in the turnover battle in their last game vs. Kentucky.

THE LAST TIME OUT: The Carolina defense scored two touchdowns - a 41-yard fumble recovery by Jatius Geer and a 45-yard interception return from Gerald Kilgore over a three-play stretch in the second quarter, erasing a 10-7 deficit, and the Gamecocks never looked back in a convincing 35-13 win over Kentucky in Columbia on Sept. 27. After Kentucky scored 10 points while rolling up 141 yards in its first two drives, the Wildcats were held to just 91 yards the rest of the way.

LONG DRIVE CONTEST: The Gamecocks got the ball with 9:51 remaining in the contest. They proceeded to run the ball 16-straight times, collecting four first downs and covering 68 yards while chewing up 9:28 on the clock, turning the ball over on downs with just 23 seconds remaining. Redshirt freshman Matt Fuller carried the ball 13 times on the drive, the longest in time in the Beamer Era.

THOMAS JR. HONORED: Bryan Thomas Jr. had his best game as a Gamecock in the win over Kentucky and was recognized as the SEC's co-Defensive Lineman of the Week. The 6-2, 249-pound senior from Windermere, Fla., was credited with a game- and career-high seven tackles, including five solo stops. He also set a career high by registering 2.0 of the Gamecocks' six sacks against the Wildcats and added one quarterback hurry.

DON'T LET US GET HOT: Working with a lead, the Carolina defense was able to pin their ears back against Kentucky and recorded a season-high six sacks while collecting 10 tackles for loss. It was the most sacks in a game for Carolina since they recorded a school-record nine sacks in the win at Oklahoma in 2024.

Offense

SHULA STEERS THE SHIP: Mike Shula, who spent the 2024 season as the Gamecocks' senior offensive assistant coach, is in his first season directing the Carolina offense. He was promoted to OC/ quarterbacks coach after Dowell Loggains was named the head coach at Appalachian State. Shula, who served as Alabama's head coach from 2003-06, was the NFL Offensive Coordinator of the Year in 2015 after helping Cam Newton win NFL MVP honors as Carolina reached the Super Bowl. He also worked with Josh Allen in Buffalo and David Gerrard in Jacksonville, among others.

QB1: LaNorris Sellers, a 6-3, 240-pound redshirt sophomore from Florence, S.C., is the unquestioned leader of the squad. Sellers, who was a preseason Heisman Trophy candidate, was the 2024 National Freshman Offensive Player of the Year as selected by the FWAA. He was also a 2024 Freshman All-American and an SEC All-Freshman selection. He threw for 2,534 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 65.6 percent of his passes and added 674 yards and seven touchdowns rushing in his first season as a starting signal-caller. He was the SEC media's choice as the 2025 preseason first-team all-league selection after earning third-team honors a year ago behind Jaxson Dart and Quinn Ewers.

SELL HIGH: Heading into Week 5, LaNorris Sellers emerged from the pack as the top quarterback for the 2026 NFL Draft, according to an ESPN poll of 25 NFL scouts and executives. Draft expert Mel Kiper agreed saying, "For me, I would go to Sellers. By the way, Sellers will only be 20 years of age at the draft next year." But it's not just No. 16's age that intrigues the veteran draft analyst. "Sellers looks the part. I think he's going to play some outstanding football this year for South Carolina."

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE LATELY?: LaNorris Sellers has completed 58-of-87 passes (66.7 pct.) for 886 yards and four TDs with just one interception in 2025. In the opener against Virgina Tech, he completed a career-long 64-yard TD pass to Nyck Harbor. Against No. 23 Missouri, he threw for 302 yards and two scores, the third 300-yard passing game of his career. He rushed for a season-high 81 yards in his last outing against Kentucky. Sellers is now 11-6 as a starting quarterback with wins in nine of his last 12 starts. He has led three fourthquarter game-winning drives in his career.

300 FOR SELLERS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback LaNorris Sellers had his best statistical game of the season against Missouri, completing 18-of-28 passes for a season-high 302 yards and two touchdowns with no turnovers. His TD passes went for 49 yards to Vandrevius Jacobs and for 24 yards to Brian Rowe Jr. It was the third 300-yard passing game of Sellers's career and his second against Missouri. Sellers is tied for eighth in school history with Ryan Hilinski, Connor Shaw and Tommy Suggs with three career 300-yard passing games.

BONUS ROUND: The Gamecocks feature two running backs who are in their seventh season of college football. Both **Oscar Adaway III** and **Rahsul Faison** finished up their high school ball in 2018. Adaway III turns 25 years old on Oct. 17, while Faison turned 25 in February.

WAITING WAS THE HARDEST PART: Transfer running back Rahsul Faison was in limbo while the NCAA determined whether he was eligible for another season of college football. He was given a waiver to practice with the team while awaiting the green light to participate in games, which finally came on Aug. 25, just six days before the season opener. Faison had his best game as a Gamecock against Vanderbilt, rushing for a game- and season-high 74 yards with a touchdown on 15 carries.

ONE-TWO PUNCH: The duo of **Oscar Adaway III** and **Rahsul Faison** form a one-two punch for the Gamecocks. They have combined for 73 carries for 282 yards and four touchdowns. Adaway III had 60 yards in the opener against Virginia Tech, while Faison had a 74-yard effort against Vanderbilt.

WE'RE FULL UP: Running back **Matt Fuller** saw his playing time increase in the win over Kentucky. After appearing in just two of the first four games this season and in just four contests in his career, the redshirt freshman carried the rock 19 times against Kentucky, including 13 on the Gamecocks' final drive. He had 48 yards rushing in the contest including his first touchdown after having 15 carries for 48 yards in his previous four appearances.

FREAKING OUT: The Gamecocks had a pair of players on Bruce Feldman's preseason "Freaks" List. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** checks in at No. 3 after back-to-back years at the top of the list, while **LaNorris Sellers** is ranked 33rd on the list.

HARBORING NOT DOUBT: World-class sprinter Nyck Harbor gave up his love of running track this spring to focus on football. The junior wide receiver has all the measurables to be WR1. He showed why everyone is excited about his future, as he caught three passes for 99 yards in the opener against Virginia Tech, including a career-long 64-yard TD pass. He had four catches on four targets for a game-high 66 yards against Vanderbilt and added three catches for 45 yards at Missouri. He is second on the team with 11 catches for 220 yards, a 20.0-yard average, with one touchdown.

DRE'S DAYS: Vandrevius Jacobs has put together back-to-back 100-yard receiving games to make a case for WR1. He had the best game of his career at Missouri when he was targeted eight times and caught seven passes for 128 yards, setting career bests in both receptions and receiving yards. Included was a 49-yard scoring pass play from LaNorris Sellers. The seven catches were the most in a game for a Gamecock this season and the 128 receiving yards were the most for a Gamecock wide receiver since Xavier Legette logged 217 vards against Jacksonville State in 2023. He followed that up with a five-catch, 108-yard effort against Kentucky including a season-long 59-yard reception. They were the first back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for a Gamecock since Legette in 2023. The school record for consecutive 100-yard receiving games is three, accomplished five times, most recently by Deebo Samuel in 2018. Jacobs is now the team's leading receiver with 18 catches for 323 yards and two touchdowns.

THE NEXT WAVE: Wide receivers coach Mike Furrey brought in six talented scholarship freshman wide receivers this year - Malik Clark, Lex Cyrus, Jordon Gidron, Donovan Murph, Brian Rowe Jr. and Jayden Sellers - arguably the best wide receiver class on paper in school history. Murph, who was the last to arrive on campus, was the first to see game action. He has made a pair of starts and has five catches for 94 yards. Rowe Jr. has seen the most action. He is third on the squad with eight catches for 73 yards and a touchdown while making two starts. He had a three-catch, 50-yard, 1-TD performance at Missouri.

INTERCHANGEABLE PARTS: South Carolina has started four different tight ends this season. Brady Hunt and Jordan Dingle each have two starts,

while **Maurice Brown II** got the nod in the opener against Virginia Tech and **Michael Smith** took the first snap against Vanderbilt in a two-tight end formation. The quartet has combined for 14 receptions. Hunt leads the way with six catches for 64 yards after catching just two passes for 22 yards in all of 2024. Brown II is also a special teams standout.

IT ALL STARTS UPFRONT: The Gamecocks have started four different five-man offensive lines through the first five games, including three different starters at center. The only constant for all five games has been left tackle Josiah Thompson, who has manned that position almost immediately upon his arrival as a true freshman last year when he earned Freshman All-America accolades. He has started 17 of the past 18 games. True freshman left guard Shedrick Sarratt Jr. was unavailable in the opener but has started ev-

ery game since. Sarratt Jr. is one of 37 players on Shaun Alexander's Freshman of the Year watch list. **Boaz Stanley, Nolan Hay** and **Rodney Newsom Jr.** have all made starts at center. **Trovon Baugh** has started four of five games at right guard. Right tackle **Cason Henry**, whose 17 starts at Carolina are the most of any offensive player, started the first four games at right tackle but was injured on the first play of the Missouri contest and has not played since. **Tree Babalade**, who was the starting left tackle two years ago, has replaced Henry in the lineup.

Defense

MOLDING THE CLAY: Despite losing five players who went in the first four rounds of the 2025 NFL Draft, fifth-year defensive coordinator Clayton White has had the Carolina defense playing at a high level for much of the season. The Gamecocks are allowing just 18.8 points per game through five contests, just a hair above their 18.1 average from a season ago. They are allowing just 180.2 yards a game through the air, which would be their lowest mark since 2011.

MISSING YOU: Defensive line coach **Travian Robertson** was injured in a serious car accident on Aug. 22. He is recovering at home after a two-week stay in the hospital where he underwent five surgeries. **Jordan Dove** is filling in as the D-line coach in Robertson's absence. Robertson has been able to attend a few practices over the past few weeks.

THAT'S OUR BALL: The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic under Clayton White. The Gamecocks forced 24 turnovers in 2024 and forced 88 turnovers over the last four seasons (2021-24), tops in the SEC. Carolina has forced nine turnovers so far in 2025, including six interceptions and three fumble recoveries, three of which has been returned for touchdowns. Only Louisiana Tech (5) and Tennessee (4) have more defensive TDs than Carolina in 2025. The Gamecocks have scored 13 defensive touchdowns under Coach White's watch.

THE ALL-AMERICAN: Sophomore edge rusher **Dylan Stewart**, a 6-5, 245-pounder from Washington, D.C., earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors last season after recording 10.5 tackles for loss including 6.5 sacks. He was a finalist for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year award and was a member of the SEC All-Freshman team in 2024.

HE'S ONLY GETTING BETTER: Dylan Stewart hasn't missed a beat. Despite being double-teamed regularly, he is fourth on the team with 22 tackles (one shy of his 2024 season total) and leads the squad with 7.0 tackles for loss and with 3.5 sacks. He also has recorded five quarterback hurries and has forced a pair of fumbles. He has notched 17.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 sacks in his first 18 games. He collected a career-high seven tackles in the season opener against Virginia Tech.

REPLACING KENNARD: Kyle Kennard won the Nagurski Award last season while playing the opposite end from **Dylan Stewart**. The Gamecocks have several veteran candidates filling that role, including **Bryan Thomas Jr.**, **Jatius Geer**, and **Desmond Umeozulu** and **Demon Clowney**. Thomas Jr. has been the starter. He has 19 tackles including 5.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and a team-high seven

quarterback hurries. He was the SEC's co-Defensive Lineman of the Week against Kentucky. Geer has a pair of sacks and returned a fumble 41 yards for a score against Kentucky.

SACK ATTACK: Led by Nagurski Award winner Kyle Kennard and Freshman All-American **Dylan Stewart**, the Gamecocks recorded 41 sacks a season ago, second in the SEC and sixth in the nation. Carolina has 14 sacks this season including six against Kentucky. Here are the sack numbers:

CHANGES IN THE MIDDLE: The Gamecocks lost their top four interior defensive linemen from 2024 to graduation. Nick Barrett, who redshirted last year, returned for his fifth season and is the leader. He and Monkell Goodwine have started every game. Transfers Gabriel Brownlow-Dindy (Texas A&M), Devonte Miles (Bowling Green) and Troy Pikes (Georgia Southern) all see regular time in the rotation. Barrett leads the way with 19 tackles including 3.0 tackles for loss and his first two career sacks.

REMEMBER THE NAME: Fred "JayR" Johnson has all the makings of the next great linebacker at South Carolina. The sophomore saw limited action a season ago playing behind veterans Debo Williams, Demetrius Knight Jr. and Bam Martin-Scott. He recorded a game-high 10 tackles and an interception in the opener against Virginia Tech, earning SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades. He leads the team with 25 tackles and was credited with his first career sack at Missouri.

WE'LL TAKE THEM: Linebackers Shawn Murphy (Alabama/Florida State) and Justin Okoronkwo (Alabama) transferred to South Carolina this season. They have split time with Okoronkwo collecting 21 tackles and Murphy close behind with 16. Murphy started the first three games and Okoronkwo has started the last two.

THE GRIZZLED VET: DQ Smith quarterbacks the defense from his safety position. Smith has started 38 games, the most of any current player. He owns four career interceptions and two career touchdowns, one on an interception return and one after a blocked punt. He is second on the team with 24 tackles, including 18 solo stops, despite missing the Missouri contest with an injury.

KILGORE WAS HERE: Junior Jalon Kilgore is in his third season as a starter at the Nickel position. He was a preseason second-team AP All-America selection after tying for the SEC lead and for fourth in the country with five interceptions, tying Jaylan Foster's 2021 total for the most by a Gamecock in the last 20 years. Kilgore was hampered with a hamstring injury early in the season but logged 10 tackles at Missouri and is third on the squad with 23 tackles in four games.



AM I MY BROTHER'S KEEPER? While Jalon Kilgore got the much-deserved preseason hype, his older brother, **Gerald Kilgore**, is quickly making a name for himself. Despite not being a starter, Kilgore, who began his collegiate career as a quarterback at Tennessee Tech, is tied for the SEC lead with two INTs, including a 45-yard pick-six against Kentucky.

CORNERING THE MARKET: The Gamecocks are blessed with four veteran cornerbacks. **Judge Collier** started every game last season and was credited with eight PBUs but missed three games after being injured in the opener. **Brandon Cisse** has been among the top-ranked cornerbacks in the SEC, according to PFF, and has an interception and a team-high three breakups. **Vicari Swain** saw more action with Collier sidelined and was credited with a career-high 10 tackles at Missouri. **Myles Norwood**, a transfer from Ball State, has 18 tackles, most among the corners.

PICK THIS: The Gamecocks have six interceptions in 2025 after picking off 14 passes in 2024 Here are the numbers:

Special Teams

WHAT'S NEW?: Everything. Second-year special teams coordinator **Joe DeCamillis** has a completely different group to work with this season, as the Gamecocks have a new player in every special teams role.

MAKING A POINT: William Joyce won the placekicking chores and has been solid so far this season. He has connected on 4-of-5 field goal attempts with a long of 49 yards. He has also converted all 16 of his extra points attempts for a team-leading 28 points.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: Dating back to 2021, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 58 of their last 69 field goal attempts (84.1 pct.). From 2021-24, Carolina posted the second-best field goal percentage in the SEC, trailing only Georgia.

LOVE IS THE ANSWER: Mason Love is trying to make Gamecock fans forget about All-American punter Kai Kroeger, now with the New Orleans Saints. Kroeger took every punt for Carolina from 2000-04. Love is the nation's second-leading freshman punter with a 45.5-yard average on 20 punts. He has six punts that have traveled 50+ yards with a long of 57 yards. Six of his punts have pinned the opponents inside the 20 with just two touchbacks. He has a net punting average of 42.9 yards.

THERE GOES THAT MAN AGAIN: Vicari Swain has put himself in contention for SEC Special Teams Player of the Year. consideration. Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a score against Virginia Tech, then took back-to-back punts to the house from 65- and from 42-yards out against South Carolina State. He was recognized as the SEC co-Special Teams Player of the Week after both contests. For the season, Swain ranks third in the nation with a 25.8-yard average on seven returns.

- Swain became the first Gamecock in history to return two punts (or kicks of any kind) for touchdowns in a game.
- Swain became the first player in Division I to return two punts in a game for touchdowns since Penn State's Daequan Hardy vs. UMass in 2023.
- Swain has three punt returns for touchdowns this season, tying the single-season school record, set by Dick Harris in 1971.
- Swain has tied Ace Sanders (2010-12) for second on the school's career mark for most punt returns for touchdowns with three, one behind Harris (1969-71).
- The three punt returns for TDs marked the most in a season in FBS since Washington's Dante Pettis returned three for scores in 2017.

RETURN TO SENDER: The Gamecock punt returners have combined for 215 yards on 10 returns. That's the most punt return yardage in a season since 2022 when they had 14 returns for 232 yards. With 206 punt return yards on the season, Vicari Swain already has the most punt returns yards by a Gamecock in a season since Ace Sanders had a school-record 429 yards on punt returns in 2012.

Miscellaneous

FOR THE HISTORY BUFFS: 2025 marks the 132nd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the

119th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 646-619-44, a .510 winning percentage. Since the start of the 21st century, the Gamecocks have posted a 180-137 mark, a .568 winning percentage. Under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 32-24, a .571 winning clip.

IT JUST MEANS MORE: The 2025 season marks South Carolina's 34th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned the SEC Eastern Division title in 2010. The Gamecocks are 115-153-1 (.429) all-time in SEC regular season play but posted a 42-38 (.525) record in conference action from 2010-19. They are 16-19 (.457) under head coach Shane Beamer.

ALL ABOARD THE **SHANE TRAIN:** South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer owns a 32-24 in his fifth season at the helm. He logged 29 wins from 2021-24, surpassing Steve Spurrier, Carolina's all-time winningest coach, for the most wins in his first four years in Columbia. Coach Spurrier posted a 28-22 from 2005-08 and finished with a school record 86 wins. Spurrier had 35 wins after five seasons leading the Gamecocks

ALL-NAME TEAM: The Gamecocks had three players earn a spot on the FanDuel "All Name Team." The trio included **Tree Babalade, Demon Clowney** and **Emazon Littlejohn**.

UTILIZING THE PORTAL: The Gamecocks' roster features 17 scholarship players who were on other team's rosters last fall. Of the 17 transfers, nine are coming from Power-4 conferences, including four from the SEC, four from the ACC and one from the Big Ten.

SIXTH SENSE: In addition to a pair of seventh-year players in Oscar Adaway III and Rahsul Faison, the Gamecock roster features six players who are in their sixth year of college football. That sextet includes Demon Clowney, Luke Doty, Bradley Dunn, Buddy Mack II, Rodney Newsom Jr. and Cole Rasmussen.

EARLY RETURNS: The Gamecocks feature a pair of wide receivers who could still be playing high school ball but elected to graduate a year early to enroll at South Carolina. **Donovan Murph** just



turned 18 years old on Oct. 1, while Jordon Gidron will not turn 18 until Oct. 30. Both are local products, with Murph graduating from Irmo High School and Gidron from Columbia's Ridge View High. All told, the Gamecocks had 19 freshmen who graduated from high school early and enrolled in January,

BEAMER **HEAD COACH**

Shane Beamer begins his fifth season in Columbia leading the South Carolina Football program in 2025, a program that is on the upswing following a very successful 2024 campaign.

Beamer, who owns a 32-24 record, won more games through his first four seasons at Carolina (29) than any other coach, one more than Steve Spurrier, the school's all-time winningest coach. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown, and has led the Gamecocks to three bowl appearances in four years.

Beamer's 2024 squad was his most successful to date. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 9-4 record including a 5-3 mark in the SEC, posting nine wins in a season for just the eighth time in school history. The Gamecocks recorded a school-record four wins against ranked opponents, including three in consecutive weeks as part of a regular season-ending six-game winning streak. Carolina finished the season ranked 19th in both the final Associated Press and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2013 and its second top-25 ranking in the past three seasons.

Beamer was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the third time in his career following the Gamecocks' upset win over Texas A&M and earned SEC Coach of the Year accolades from the AP, USA TODAY, Bear Bryant and College Football Nation. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, the Bobby Dodd, and the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year.

Individually, edge rusher Kyle Kennard was the school's first Bronko Nagurski Award winner as the nation's top defensive player and was the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year. Kennard, along with safety Nick Emmanwori, earned first-team All-America honors, while punter Kai Kroeger was a secondteam selection. Quarterback LaNorris Sellers was selected as the SEC's Freshman of the Year. Sellers, offensive tackle Josiah Thompson and Edge rusher Dylan Stewart earned Freshman All-America honors, giving the Gamecocks six All-Americans as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the most of any FBS school in 2024. In addition, Kennard and Raheim Sanders were named first-team Academic All-America.

Named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020. Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award,

presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Coach Beamer was a two-time Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week recipient after wins over Kentucky and Tennessee. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors. leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS and in a season mired by numerous injuries, decimating the offensive line most notably, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark. The squad was led by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 71 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He coached all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for eighth in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked 15th in the country in total defense, and eighth in the nation in passing defense.





As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has helped build several programs during his career. He was on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs at Oklahoma from 2018-20. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring, 11th in total offense and 14th in passing offense. In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play, ranked third in total offense and fourth in passing efficiency rating. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense, scoring offense and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating in 2018.

Beamer spent two seasons (2016-17) at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart, helping the Bulldogs to a 21-7 combined record. In 2017, UGA won the SEC Championship before falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting and 20th in kickoff returns while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record, was named All-America and ACC Player of the Year, and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position came at Mississippi State in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in Dec. 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.



ATLANTA, GA. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown to break open a close game, LaNorris Sellers threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Nyck Harbor, and No. 13 South Carolina beat Virginia Tech 24-11 on Sunday in the opener for both teams.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer used his brand of "Beamerball" to pull away from the school where his dad, Frank Beamer, originated the style of play that emphasizes turnovers and big plays on special teams. The elder Beamer was in attendance at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, wearing South Carolina black.

"Thought you'd like a special teams touchdown," Shane Beamer told his dad as they shared a postgame hug.

South Carolina intercepted two passes by Virginia Tech's Kyron Drones. Fred Johnson made a pick in the red zone to halt a first-quarter drive, and Peyton Williams' interception in the fourth quarter helped seal the win.

The Gamecocks led 10-8 early in the fourth when Swain fielded a punt by Nick Veltsistas, turned upfield and made several would-be tacklers miss on the way to the end zone. After a Virginia Tech field goal, Sellers found Harbor wide open on a deep post route to restore South Carolina's two-score advantage.

Swain muffed a punt earlier in the game and narrowly avoided disaster by recovering the ball. Beamer comforted the sophomore on the sideline after that play.

"Coach Beamer was like, 'This is going to happen,'" Swain said. "'It's your first time being out there, just make sure on the next one, just take it to the house.' So I took it to the house, and my thought process was like, I messed up the first time, can't mess up again. This is my only shot."

Beamer's faith in Swain, a defensive back and part-time return man, was rewarded.

"So proud of Vicari Swain," Beamer said. "He's a weapon, and it was really neat for him to do that and how fitting that is playing Virginia Tech with their history, my dad's history at special teams."

Sellers scored South Carolina's first touchdown on a 15-yard rush and was 12 of 19 passing for 209 yards and the TD to Harbor, who had three catches for 99 yards. Harbor had another potential touchdown taken away by a replay review.

Virginia Tech's offense was held without a touchdown. John Love kicked three field goals, including a 56-yarder, and the Hokies' defense contributed a safety in the first quarter when Kelvin Gilliam Jr. and Kody Huisman took down Sellers in the end zone.

Drones went 15 of 35 for 221 yards and two interceptions.

South Carolina (2-0) scored more from its special teams and defense than its offense as Jaron Willis also returned a fumble for a score and LaNorris Sellers couldn't get the offense going for a second week

South Carolina looked like it was up past its bedtime, trailing 3-0 before Swain eluded a tackler right on top of him and then ran 64 yards for a touchdown. His second TD was a 42-yard return after he picked up a partially blocked punt just before it stopped rolling.

With his 80-yard punt return TD in last week's opener against Virginia Tech, Swain is now tied for the school's single-season record. The sophomore defensive back is the first FBS player with two punt returns scores in a game since Penn State's Daequan Hardy did it against UMass in October 2023.

Sellers threw six incompletions in his first eight attempts and finished the game with 128 yards passing and 23 yards rushing,

The Takeaway

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs will take \$500,000 back to Orangeburg, which is a lot of help for an athletic program that takes in about \$13 million a year.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have to figure out how to get their offense going, gaining just 253 yards against the Bulldogs. And South Carolina may not last long in the top 10 with a tepid performance against a FCS school compared to No. 11 Illinois 45-19 drubbing of Duke.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Diego Pavia completed 18 of 25 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, Jamezell Lassiter ran for a 44-yard score and Vanderbilt defeated No. 11 South Carolina 31-7 at Williams-Brice Stadium Saturday night (Sept. 13).

The Commodores hadn't beat South Carolina since 2008, but forced four turnovers for their first 3-0 start since 2017.

South Carolina quarterback and Heisman Trophy candidate LaNorris Sellers was knocked out of the game in the second quarter after taking a helmet-to-helmet hit from from Vanderbilt linebacker Langston Patterson, who was ejected for targeting.

Sellers did not return, and finished 6 of 7 passing for 94 yards with one interception in the red zone with the score tied at 7. He was replaced by Luke Doty.

The Commodores held nearly a 12-minute edge in time of possession.

Pavia led Vanderbilt on a nine-play, 73-yard drive to open the game, capped with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Sedrick Alexander. Pavia later tossed a 5-yard TD pass to Junior Sherrill in the second quarter giving the Commodores a 14-7 lead at the break.

Lassiter's scamper around right end stretched Vanderbilt's lead to 21-7 early in the third quarter and the Commodores began to sense an upset brewing. Brock Taylor's 51-yard field goal with 9:27 left made it a three-possession game.

Alexander added his second TD on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter

Rahsul Faison ran for 74 yards and a touchdown for South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Ahmad Hardy had 138 yards rushing and a touchdown, Beau Pribula led No. 23 Missouri downfield for a goahead score in the fourth quarter and the Tigers beat South Carolina 29-20 on Saturday night.

Pribula threw for 171 yards with a touchdown pass, and Jamal Roberts had a touchdown of his own with 9:32 left to give the Tigers the lead, ultimately helping them to their 14th consecutive home win.

LaNorris Sellers had 302 yards passing and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks South Carolina twice went three-and-out down the stretch, giving the Missouri ground game the chance to close out the win

The Tigers finished with 285 yards rushing. South Carolina had minus-9 on the ground.

The Tigers struck first with a 99-yard drive — their third full-field march of the season — before Sellers answered with a 49-yard touchdown throw to Vandrevius Jacobs to give the Gamecocks a 7-6 lead

Sellers hit Brian Rowe Jr. with his second touchdown throw later in the half, and South Carolina led 14-12 at the break.

Hardy carried the Tigers in the second half. The highlight may have been his TD run, when it looked as if he was stood up at the line of scrimmage, spun off the pile and scored to give Missouri an 18-16 lead

But it always felt as if the game was destined to be decided in the fourth quarter, just like last November, when Sellers capped a 353-yard, five-touchdown performance by rallying the Gamecocks for a 34-30 win in the Palmetto State.

This time, South Carolina had regained the lead when Pribula led the Tigers downfield in the fourth quarter. And after Hardy had checked out for a breather, Roberts had a 16-yard sprint to the pylon for a touchdown; Pribula added the 2-point conversion to give Missouri a 26-20 lead with 9:36 to go.

Then it was the Tigers defense that stepped up, forcing South Carolina into a pair of three-and-outs before Robert Meyer kicked a clinching 40-yard field goal with 1:34 left on the clock.



COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — South Carolina's defense returned two turnovers for touchdowns within a span of three plays on Saturday night and the Gamecocks beat Kentucky, 35-13.

The Wildcats (2-2, 0-2 SEC) held a 10-7 lead heading into the second quarter. Quarterback Cutter Boley was sacked by Dylan Stewart, the ball popped loose and defensive lineman Jatius Geer retrieved it, chugging 40 yards for a touchdown.

Two plays later, Boley cast into the secondary but his pass clanged off the hands of Kendrick Law. South Carolina's Gerald Kilgore gobbled the carom and sprinted 45 yards to the end zone.

"Obviously when you score twice on defense, you're going to be really hard to beat," coach Shane Beamer said. "We didn't just want to win the turnover battle, we wanted to dominate it."

Trailing 21-10, the Wildcats tried to get their offense back in gear. Boley again threw deep but was belted by Desmond Umeozulu on the throw.

South Carolina's Brandon Cisse intercepted to start another touchdown drive. The Gamecocks (3-2, 1-2) added another touchdown in the fourth quarter while Kentucky only managed a field goal after its quick 10-0 start.
