

GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- Even ranking fourth in the nation in field goal percentage (.545), South Carolina is 13th in the country in secondchance points with 18.4 per game. The Gamecocks are eighth in the NCAA in offensive rebounding percentage, pulling down 47.3 percent of their missed shots.
- The Gamecock defense has allowed just one team to score more than 55 points this season, ranking 14th in the nation in scoring defense (49.2) and third in field goal percentage defense (.279).
- South Carolina's rebounding effort has ramped up since the season opener with the Gamecocks averaging 50.8 rebounds over the last four games with a +22.8 rebounding margin in that time. For the season, South Carolina is fifth in the nation in rebounding margin (+19.6) and 12th in rebounds per game (48.2).
- The Gamecocks' unanimous national player of the year candidates Joyce Edwards and Ta'Niya Latson are atop the
 team scoring chart with Edwards' 18.8 points per game ranking fourth in the SEC and Latson delivering a 17.0 scoring
 average. Each has a pair of 20-point games this season, and both are scoring efficiently with Edwards eighth in the SEC
 with a .580 field goal percentage and Latson 12th at .556.
- Junior Tessa Johnson is making her pitch to join her teammates on various watch lists with her 13.8 points per game
 to start to the season. She is third in the SEC in 3-point percentage (.462) and 15th in overall field goal percentage at
 .510. Both numbers are career highs. Praise has come from her coaches not just in her offensive production but in
 her steady, high-IQ play throughout each game.
- Senior Madina Okot has been dominant on the glass and is finding her strength offensively as well. With double-digit
 rebounds in each of the last four games she is third in the SEC and 24th in the nation with 10.6 boards per game,
 including 3.8 on the offensive end to rank fourth in the league. She is becoming more of a focal point in the offense
 as well, averaging 11.0 field goal attempts per game over the last three outings and handing out a career-high three
 assists in her last outing (Winthrop, Nov. 19).
- Senior Raven Johnson is third in the SEC in assists per game (6.8, 10th in NCAA) and assist-to-turnover ratio (4.3).



Perennial Power

Under Dawn Staley, South Carolina women's basketball had been a perennial national power since winning its first SEC title in 2013-14. A few highlights from that

- 5 straight NCAA Final Four appearances (2021-2025) is the longest active streak and the secondlongest streak in tournament history.
- 3 National Championships are third most by a single program in tournament history.
- 10th undefeated National Championship season in NCAA history (2023-24)
- 84 AP No. 1 rankings are third-most by a program in the poll's history.
- 120 straight AP Top-10 rankings is the longest active streak – more than three times the next program
- 11 Gamecocks have earned All-America status at least once in their careers

The Queens Series

The Gamecocks and Royals have played once before in women's basketball, back in the AIAW days when the Charlotte-based university was known as Queens College. South Carolina won that meeting 103-55 on Jan. 27, 1979, in Raleigh.

Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are 550-168 (.766) in home games (some records prior to 1976-77 did not include location of games). Current head coach Dawn Staley is 238-35 at home for a program-best .872 winning percentage.

Playing in its 24th season at Colonial Life Arena, South Carolina boasts a 301-68 (.816) record in the building, including four undefeated seasons since 2013-14. Staley's share of that record is 235-35 (.870).

Ranked Readings

Against ranked teams, South Carolina is 133-71 (.652) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 118-32 (.787) against ranked teams, including a 48-5 (.906) mark since the start of the 2021-22 season.

This season, South Carolina won their first game against a ranked foe 69-52 vs. #8/10 Southern Cal.

The non-conference schedule is highlighted by four ranked matchups – vs. #8/10 Southern Cal (W, 69-52), vs. #3/4 UCLA or #4/3 Texas (Nov. 27) and at #21/21 Louisville (Dec. 4).

Ranking Review

South Carolina is currently ranked No. 2 in both the AP Poll and the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll.

It marks the Gamecocks' 120th consecutive entry in the AP top 10, beginning with the 2019-20 preseason poll. It is the longest active streak and the eighth longest in the history of that poll (7th is 137, Baylor). Their 251 straight appearances in the AP Poll, dating back to Dec. 10, 2012, marks the second-longest active streak in the nation and is the tied for the sixth longest all-time (5th, Duke/Stanford 312)

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll.

Staley's Standard

In her 26th season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .774 (652-190) winning percentage, which ranks ninth in the nation among active head coaches and 10th all-time. With three national championships, she ranks fourth among head coaches all-time in NCAA titles.

Staley is one of just two women's basketball coaches to lead their teams to multiple 40-game win streaks in NCAA history with the Gamecocks' program-record 43-game streak (2023-24) ranking seventh longest in NCAA history. She is one of just 11 men's or women's basketball coaches to win at least three NCAA National Championships and the first Black head coach to win multiple titles She is one of seven coaches to lead a team to at least four NCAA National Championship games.

Now in her 18th season with the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (480) with a program-record 14 postseason appearances. She accounts for all seven of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances and the only NCAA National Championships in program history. Her leadership on the court and in the community resulted in the City of Columbia

commissioning a statue of Staley, which stands a short distance from the Gamecocks' home Colonial Life Arena.

Staley's nine SEC regular-season championships trail only Pat Summitt's 16 in league history, and her seven SEC Coach of the Year awards trail Summitt's league record by just one. Staley's 214 SEC regular-season wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time – behind just Summitt (Tennessee, 306) and Andy Landers (Georgia, 273). She was the second-fastest to the 200-win mark in league history with her 255 games trailing Summitt's mark of 229. Staley's .793 SEC winning percentage (214-56) is second only to Summitt (.874) among coaches in the league at least five seasons. She owns the SEC record for consecutive regular-season conference victories with a 57-game streak that began in the 2021-22 season and ended in 2024-25.

Glass Shattering

South Carolina's rebounding started slowly but has skyrocketed since the second week of the season. The Gamecocks are 12th in the country with 48.2 rebounds per game and fifth in rebounding margin (+19.6). They have corralled 47.3 percent of their missed shots for an offensive rebounding percentage that ranks eighth in the country.

Senior Madina Okot leads the way with 10.6 boards per game to rank third in the SEC and 24th in the nation, and her 3.8 offensive rebounds per game are fourth in the SEC. She has been the team leader in the category four times through the first five games. Sophomore Joyce Edwards is next in line at 6.4 rebounds per game, including 3.0 offensive boards, which ranks 12th in the league. Senior guard Raven Johnson has pulled down 5.8 rebounds per game, including a season-high 11 against #8/10 Southern Cal (Nov. 15).

Efficiency Report

The Gamecocks are among the nation's most efficient teams on both sides of the ball. South Carolina is third in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.279) and fourth in field goal percentage (.545). From 3-point range, the Gamecocks are fourth in shooting percentage (.420) and 13th in percentage defense (.203).

Individually, four Gamecock starters are among the SEC's top 15 in field goal percentage – Madina Okot (6th, .596), Joyce Edwards (8th, .580), Ta'Niya Latson (12th, .556) and Tessa Johnson (15th, .510). Johnson's percentage includes 46.2 percent shooting from 3-point range, which ranks third in the league.

Paint Production

South Carolina has long controlled the paint, and this season looks to be no different.

With 57.1 percent of their points coming in the paint, the Gamecocks are fifth in the nation with 51.2 paint points per game and are out-scoring opponents in that space by an average of 30.8 points. They are shooting 64.6 percent in the paint compared to opponents' 36.2 percent accuracy.

The paint production has been spread across the roster with guards accounting for 20.8 paint points per game – 40.6 percent of the total scoring in that space.

Block Party

The Gamecocks have been a premier shot blocking program since their first national championship in 2017. They ranked in the top 15 in blocks per game that season and have only climbed higher in the eight subsequent

seasons, including four years leading the nation in the stat and twice coming in second. Beyond the number of blocks, the team's block percentage has led the nation three seasons.

So far this season, South Carolina has blocked 20.3 percent of its opponents' two-point attempts, which ranks fifth in the nation according to Her Hoop Stats. The Gamecocks' 8.2 blocks per game rank third in the nation, and eight of the 10 players have at least three blocks.

Madina Okot tops the individual list with 2.0 blocks per game to rank 36th in the nation and fourth in the SEC. Joyce Edwards is not far behind at 1.8 per game (7th SEC).

First Watch

Gamecocks have dominated the many national award watch lists that are announced each preseason.

South Carolina is one of three schools with a player on each of the Naismith Hall of Fame Women's Starting Five watch lists. And one of two programs with five entires on the Wooden Award Top 50 Preseason Watchlist.

Three Gamecocks – Joyce Edwards, Raven Johnson, Ta'Niya Latson – are on the watch lists for the Naismith Trophy, the Wooden Award and the USBWA's Ann Meyers Drysdale Player of the Year award. South Carolina is one of two schools with three players on all three lists.

Edwards and Latson are also among the 20 players on the Wade Trophy Watch List, which is the WBCA's national player of the year award.

Latson drew preseason All-America honors from both the Associated Press and USA Today. Edward earned a spot on the USA Today Preseason All-America Second Team.

The pair was also ranked on ESPN's list of the top 25 players in the NCAA this season. Latson came in at #7 with Edwards close behind at #11, making South Carolina one of two programs with multiple players in the first 11 places.

Agot Makeer is on the list for the Tamika Catchings Award, the USBWA's National Freshman of the Year. and on the Wooden Award watch list, which also recognized senior Chloe Kitts despite her season-ending injury.

That's So Raven

Senior point guard Raven Johnson has been at the tip of the spear for the Gamecocks on both sides of the ball and has led the team to nothing but winning.

In Johnson's fourth full season, South Carolina is 112-5 with her in the lineup (missed one game each in the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons), including a 35-3 mark

against ranked teams. That stretch features three trips to the Final Four, including a National Championship (2024) and runner-up finish (2025), three SEC Regular-Season titles and three SEC Tournament championships in the three full seasons of her career.

Johnson is eighth in program history in career assists (444) and fifth in the category for SEC play (166). She owns three of the top seven single-season assist-to-turnover ratios in program history, including a program-record 3.33 mark in SEC play in 2024-25. Her current career 2.81 A:TO (444:158) is well ahead of the current program record of 2.55 by WNBA veteran Tyasha Harris (2017-20).

The powerful guard makes her presence felt on the glass as well, averaging 4.1 rebounds for her career, and she has been the team's top rebounder in 11 games, including this season's opener against Grand Canyon (Nov. 3).

This season, Johnson is third in the SEC and 10th in the nation in assists per game (6.8), including a pair of double-digit assist games. She is also third in the league with a 4.3 assist-to-turnover ratio. Her stat stuffing includes 8.2 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.2 steals per game. She is shooting 47.1 percent from the field, including 46.2 percent form 3-point range – both career-best numbers.

Johnson has a pair of double-doubles already this season in two different ways - 11 points, 11 assists vs. Bowling Green; 14 points, 11 rebounds vs. #8/10 Southern Cal.

Let Us Re-Joyce

Sophomore forward Joyce Edwards announced her presence on the college stage last season as the Gamecocks' top scorer (12.7 ppg) with a team-high 16 games leading the team in points and five 20-point outings.

The production made her just the third freshman in program history to earn First-Team All-SEC honors, and she was an All-America honorable mention selection. Her 11.5 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in the Final Four yielded a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

This season, Edwards is on the watch lists for every national player of the year award and the Katrina McClain Power Forward of the Year list as well. She is living up to the predictions as her team-high 18.8 points per game rank fourth in the SEC and have come on 58.0 percent field goal shooting, which is eighth-best in the league. Her 91.7 percent (11-of-12) accuracy against Bowling Green (Nov. 7) was the fourth-best shooting performance in Gamecock history and the best since Aliyah Boston's perfect 13-of-13 outing in Nov. 2021.

Edwards was named SEC Player of the Week (11/11-17) in the season's second week after leading the Gamecocks to a pair of wins, including her double-double in a win over #8/10 Southern Cal (Nov. 15).

Johnson's 13.8 points per game are third on the team, and she is among the league's top 15 in field goal percentage (15th, .510), 3-point percentage (3rd, .462), and made 3s per game (8th, 2.4).

Johnson turned in career-high numbers last season with 8.4 points and 1.5 assists per game. That production came after a freshman year that saw her shine in the most crucial moments of the team's undefeated run to the 2024 National Championship. She averaged 14.0 points on 58.8 percent shooting in the final weekend of the season, including a team-best 19 points in the title game to earn a spot on the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team.

Transfer of Power

Dawn Staley added two elite senior transfers and both earned starting spots at the start of the season.

Guard Ta'Niya Latson (Florida State) was the nation's top scorer last season (25.2 ppg), choosing to join the Gamecocks to test herself, to push herself to expand areas of her game she was not able to hone in the team circumstances of her first three seasons. The challenge has not cooled her offense as she averages 17.0 points, which ranks 12th in the SEC, on an efficient 55.6 percent shooting (12th in SEC). She is second on the team with 3.4 assists per game.

Last season, Madina Okot was the SEC's top percentage shooter (.649) and fourth in rebounding at Mississippi State. The 6-foot-6 center has drawn praise from her head coach on her strength and agility and a challenge to show her dominance every time she steps on the court. Okot has been the team's top rebounder every game since an average season-opening performance, including three double-doubles, which ranks fifth in the nation. Her 10.6 rebounds per game are third in the SEC and 24th in the nation. She is also among the league leaders in field goal percentage (3rd, .596), blocks per game (4th, 2.0) and offensive rebounds per game (4th, 3.8).

Freshman Findings

South Carolina freshman guards Agot Makeer (#6 in the 2025 Class) and Ayla McDowell (#15 in the 2025 Class) are both McDonald's All-Americans who represented their home countries in international competition this summer.

After leading Montverde Academy to a runner-up finish at the Chipotle High School National Championships, Makeer, suited up for Canada at the FIBA U19 World Cup, helping it to a fourth-place finish with 10.3 points, including 46.2 percent 3-point shooting, and 4.9 rebounds per game.

The long, lithe Makeer is adapting well to college, averaging 7.8 points on 51.7 percent shooting to go along with 4.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game. She is on preseason watch lists for the USBWA Tamika Catchings Awards (freshman of the year) and the Wooden Award.

McDowell amassed over 2,700 career points in high school before donning a Brazil jersey at the FIBA AmeriCup and the FIBA U19 World Cup over the summer. For the U19 team, she was the top scorer with a 16.8 scoring average while averaging 4.5 rebounds and 2.7 steals.

That experience and versatility has translated to her college game with McDowell averaging 5.4 points on 60.0 percent shooting and drawing praise from her coaches about her competitive fire and the way she consistently makes the right play.

Everybody's All-American

The Gamecocks' 11-woman roster includes eight McDonald's All-Americans – Maryam Dauda, Joyce Edwards, Raven Johnson, Tessa Johnson, Ta'Niya Latson, Agot Makeer, Maddy McDaniel and Ayla McDowell,

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 29 McDonald's All-Americans, including 22 who signed as freshmen.

What's Next

Just as the 2025-26 season began, event organizers were already releasing plans for the Gamecocks' 2026-27 season. South Carolina will be making its second appearance at all four events.

The Gamecocks will return to Paris for Oui Play 2026, facing Maryland in the season opener on Nov. 2. The return game of the Sprouts Farmers Market The Real SC game is set for Bon Secours Wellness Arena in Greenville, S.C., on Nov. 15. The Gamecocks are slated to take on UConn in the 2026 Basketball Hall of Fame Women's Showcase on Nov. 24. And the Charlotte Sports Foundation announced South Carolina's three-year commitment to the Ally Tipoff with games against North Carolina (2026), UConn (2027) and NC State (2028).

Who's Next

Head coach Dawn Staley signed a pair of top-20 players in the early signing period in forwards Kelsi Andrews and Kaeli Wynn. Both are on the Naismith Trophy Girls' High School Player of the Year watch list, released in November.

The 6-foot-3 Andrews is the #18 player in the Class of 2026 after helping lead IMG Academy to a high school national championship in 2025 with a 12-point, 13-rebound performance in the title game. She has also helped the U.S. to gold medals in the 2024 FIBA U17 World Cup and the 2023 FIBA U16 Americas Championship.

Wynn is the #17 player in the 2026 Class, standing 6-foot-2 and coming from basketball coach parents. She was a first-team all-state selection as a junior, averaging 17 points, 7.1 rebounds and 2.7 assists at Mater Dei High School, which was ranked No. 1 in the nation throughout the season.

WNBA Pipeline

Dawn Staley's status as a dream merchant is most evident by the steady stream of Gamecocks being drafted into and enjoying lengthy careers in the WNBA. Since her first Gamecock was drafted in 2015, she has seen 18 have their name called on draft night – the second-most by a program in that time.

Staley's numbers have skyrocketed since 2020 with an NCAA-best 12 draft picks since then, including a best-in-the-nation six first-round selections in that time.

In proof Staley sends players to the league ready, six Gamecocks have earned All-Rookie Team honors, including three WNBA Rookies of the Year – Allisha Gray (2017), A'ja Wilson (2018), Aliyah Boston (2023).

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance for the last 11 seasons, although the NCAA does not officially recognize the COVID-limited attendance in the 2020-21 season. The Gamecocks are on track to continue that streak after selling out of season tickets for the second time in as many seasons and opening the 2025-26 slate by hosting the four highest-attended games of the season so far.

The Gamecocks have had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for eight straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season) dating back to the first ever sellout of 18,000 on Feb. 8, 2016. There have been at least five sellouts in each of the last two seasons.

South Carolina's attendance average of 16,437 in 2024-25 is the second-highest in the history of the NCAA, narrowly trailing Tennessee's 1998-99 average of 16,565. That mark included a program-record seven selllouts.

SEASON THEME: BEYOND MEASURE

Each year Dawn Staley chooses a theme for the team and fans to center their season around, and it often reflects not just the state of South Carolina women's basketball, but that of the game overall.

The Gamecocks' 2025-26 season theme is Beyond Measure, which centers on the value of the whole person or group beyond the commonly measured scale. A player's value to the team is not measured solely by her statline but also by a myriad of other ways she elevates her team. Championships and awards are not valued because they yield a trophy but also because they lift up a university, a city, a state. The value of the FAMS who support the team around the country is more than the value of ticket sales, but it is in the way they form a united community that supersedes all their difference.

More broadly, Beyond Measure is a reminder that the ceiling of the team and its players – and that of women's basketball as a sport – will always shatter any limitations others may place on it.

In women's basketball, Colonial Life Arena has become one of the most feared places to play as enormous crowds fill the building with passion for the Gamecocks.

The state of South Carolina has rallied around head coach Dawn Staley's program in unprecedented numbers as the Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last 10 seasons and boast 21 sellouts (18,000) in the last 10 seasons of full capacity arenas.

Colonial Life Arena is more than just the home of South Carolina men's and women's basketball, though. It is also a thriving entertainment venue that the city of Columbia and its surrounding metropolitan area are able to enjoy throughout the year.

Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10th-largest on-campus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.

In Summer 2017, a 12-display center-hung video board and ribbon boards were added to the arena bowl at a cost of \$4.2 million. The center-hung board features four convex-curved main displays that measure approximately 12' x 20' and can show any combination of live video, instant replays, statistics and game information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Paul McCartney, country superstars Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift, WWE Wrestling, Kanye West and numerous other acts.

The largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet, the Arena has an intimate double-deck design that puts every seat close to the action. The cantilever of the upper deck over the lower deck extends further than any other arena of its size with great sight lines.

Two spacious locker rooms for Gamecock men's and women's basketball include team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and an athletic training room.

18th Season at South Carolina 26th Season in Career

Since thrusting South Carolina into the national spotlight when she was hired in May 2008, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee as a player is angling for another induction as a coach with her standing as one of five head coaches with at least three women's basketball National Championships and the only Black basketball head coach with multiple national titles, one of five head coaches to lead an undefeated team to a National Championship, and the first Black head coach of the USA Basketball Senior National Team.

In Staley's 17 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks, highlights include:

- Seven NCAA Final Fours in the last 10 tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025)

- 38 straight weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, just the third program to go wire-to-wire in back-to-back seasons
- 86 total weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, the third-most in the history of that poll
- Eight 30-win seasons, including a program-record 38 wins in 2023-24
- Nine SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012, and she was part of the FIBA Hall of Fame Class of 2025.

In her 26th season as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 15 25-win seasons, a total of 21 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 211 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 86 in the No. 1 spot – the third most times in the top spot in the history of that poll. Her .774 winning percentage (651-190) ranks seventh in the nation among active head coaches with at least 15 years of experience and ninth all-time.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to 2018 FIBA World Cup gold to earn USAB National Coach of the Year honors that year, adding gold medals at the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, for which she again earned Coach of the Year honors. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals – 2015 FIBA U19 World Championships, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship, 2007 Pan Am Games – and served as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

In her 19th season at the helm of the Gamecocks, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year five times (2014, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024). Her 2020 unanimous selection made her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award, and she became the first men's or women's coach to claim the award in three straight seasons 2022-24. She is a seven-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the only Gamecock basketball coach – men's or women's – to amass 300 victories at South Carolina and became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau. She is the program's all-time winningest coach with 479 wins, a .813 (479-110) winning percentage and a program-record 14 postseason appearances.

In the vaunted SEC, Staley's 214 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). She was the second fastest to 200 league wins (255 games), trailing only Summitt at 229. Her .793 SEC winning percentage (214-56) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark four times (2015-16, 2019-20, 2022-23, 2023-24). Staley's back-to-back SEC undefeated seasons helped the Gamecocks to an SEC-record 57-game win streak in league play, which ranks sixth in NCAA history for conference win streaks.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year, two National Defensive Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped 13 Gamecocks collect 29 All-America selections, three to pick up seven SEC Player of the Year honors, four to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of eight times, three to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 23 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 44 times, including 22 first-team selections. Since her first Gamecock was selected in the 2015 WNBA Draft, a total of 18 South Carolina have been chosen, which is the second-most of any program in that timeframe. Of those 18, 11 have been first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks since 2018. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year and have amassed 13 All-Star selections. A'ja Wilson went on to become a three-time WNBA MVP and two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year.
