

GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- Head coach Dawn Staley has built South Carolina into a national powerhouse, taking the Gamecocks to the NCAA Final Four each of the last five seasons and winning two of their three trips to the national championship game in that time. The Gamecocks have finished the season ranked in the top three in the nation five times in the last six seasons, and their current run of 121 consecutive entries in the AP top 10 is the longest active streak in the nation.
- South Carolina went 5-2 against the other three teams in the Players Era Championship field in last season alone and are a combined 17-3 against them in the Staley era (since 2008-09).
- Defense has long been the Gamecocks' calling card, and this season is no different with no opponent reaching the 60-point mark to put them 11th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 49.2 points per game. Low scoring comes from creating inefficiency as South Carolina leads the nation in field goal percentage defense at .270.
- With three 100-point games this season, the Gamecocks are fifth in the country with 94.8 points per game and second in the nation in field goal percentage at .565. Thanks to a steady defensive effort, South Carolina can also win low-scoring outings with two victories this season coming after scoring in the 60s.
- South Carolina is third in the country with a +20.7 rebounding average. Over the last three games, including a win over #8/10 Southern Cal, that number jumps to +24.0. For the season, the Gamecocks' 48.7 rebounds per game are 11th-best in the country.
- National player of the year candidate Joyce Edwards has been dominant in just her sophomore season, ranking 31st in the nation and third in the SEC with 19.8 points per game, which she is scoring on 61.3 percent shooting, which
- AP Preseason All-American and national player of the year candidate Ta'Niya Latson has become a more efficient scorer with the Gamecocks, ranking 36th in the nation with a .600 field goal percentage, which has yielded 18.2 points per game to rank her sixth in the SEC. She was named a USBWA National Player of the Week after averaging 24.0 points on 77.3 percent shooting, including 4-of-6 from 3-point range, last week.
- Senior Madina Okot is beginning to be comfortable anchoring the paint for South Carolina, averaging 18.5 points and 11.5 rebounds in last week's wins. She is second in the nation with four double-doubles and her 10.8 rebounds per game on the season are 15th in the country.



Four different Gamecocks have at least one double-double this season.

South Carolina has scored 56.6 percent of its points this season in the paint.

The Gamecocks have won 90.6 percent of their games against ranked opponents in the last five seasons (48-5).

Perennial Power

Under Dawn Staley, South Carolina women's basketball had been a perennial national power since winning its first SEC title in 2013-14. A few highlights from that stretch.

- 5 straight NCAA Final Four appearances (2021-2025) is the longest active streak and the second-longest streak in tournament history.
- 3 National Championships are third most by a single program in tournament history.
- 10th undefeated National Championship season in NCAA history (2023-24)
- 84 AP No. 1 rankings are third-most by a program in the poll's history.
- 121 straight AP Top-10 rankings is the longest active streak – more than three times the next program
- 11 Gamecocks have earned All-America status at least once in their careers

Against the Field

South Carolina has a lot of recent history with the three other teams in this year's Players Era Championship, including a combined 5-2 record against Duke, Texas and UCLA in the 2024-25 season alone.

The Gamecocks are 9-2 overall against Duke, including an 8-1 mark in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09). The two teams met twice last season with the Gamecocks winning the regular-season meeting in Columbia 81-70 (Dec. 5) and later advancing to the NCAA Final Four with a 54-50 win over the Blue Devils in Birmingham (Mar. 30).

South Carolina is 5-3 all-time against Texas, including a 5-1 mark in the Staley era. In the Longhorns' first season in the SEC, the two teams had a rare four meetings with the Gamecocks winning three times. The teams split the regular-season series with each winning on its home court. After tying for the SEC regular-season title, the two squared off in the SEC Tournament title game. The Gamecock defense blew the game open with a 21-6 second quarter to claim South Carolina's ninth SEC Tournament title in the last 11 seasons with a 64-45 victory (Mar. 9). Less than a month later, the Gamecocks and Longhorns squared off again in the NCAA Final Four (Apr. 4) in Tampa. After a tight first half, South Carolina locked down defensively in the third, winning the period 20-9 to cruise to a 74-57 victory and a spot in the national championship game for the second-straight season and the third time in four seasons.

Against UCLA, the Gamecocks are 4-2 overall and 4-1 in the Staley era. The lone loss in that stretch came last

Ranked Readings

Against ranked teams, South Carolina is 133-71 (.652) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 118-32 (.787) against ranked teams, including a 48-5 (.906) mark since the start of the 2021-22 season.

This season, South Carolina won their first game against a ranked foe 69-52 vs. #8/10 Southern Cal.

Schedule Sketch

South Carolina's schedule continues to challenge and prepare the team for the postseason. This year's slate features nine games against teams ranked in the current top 25 – four home, three road and two neutral sites. Four of the nine games are against teams in the top 10.

The non-conference schedule is highlighted by four ranked matchups – vs. #8/10 Southern Cal (W, 69-52), vs. #3/3 UCLA or #4/4 Texas (Nov. 27) and at #23/19 Louisville (Dec. 4).

Ranking Review

South Carolina is currently ranked No. 2 in both the AP Poll and the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll.

It marks the Gamecocks' 121st consecutive entry in the AP top 10, beginning with the 2019-20 preseason poll. It is the longest active streak and the eighth longest in the history of that poll (7th is 137, Baylor). Their 252 straight appearances in the AP Poll, dating back to Dec. 10, 2012, mark the second-longest active streak in the nation and is the tied for the sixth longest all-time (5th, Duke/Stanford, 312).

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll.

Staley's Standard

In her 26th season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .775 (653-190) winning percentage, which ranks ninth in

the nation among active head coaches and 10th all-time. With three national championships, she ranks fourth among head coaches all-time in NCAA titles.

Staley is one of just two women's basketball coaches to lead their teams to multiple 40-game win streaks in NCAA history with the Gamecocks' program-record 43-game streak (2023-24) ranking seventh longest in NCAA history. She is one of just 11 men's or women's basketball coaches to win at least three NCAA National Championships and the first Black head coach to win multiple titles She is one of seven coaches to lead a team to at least four NCAA National Championship games.

Now in her 18th season with the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (481) with a program-record 14 postseason appearances. She accounts for all seven of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances and the only NCAA National Championships in program history. Her leadership on the court and in the community resulted in the City of Columbia commissioning a statue of Staley, which stands a short distance from the Gamecocks' home Colonial Life Arena.

Staley's nine SEC regular-season championships trail only Pat Summitt's 16 in league history, and her seven SEC Coach of the Year awards trail Summitt's league record by just one. Staley's 214 SEC regular-season wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time – behind just Summitt (Tennessee, 306) and Andy Landers (Georgia, 273). She was the second-fastest to the 200-win mark in league history with her 255 games trailing Summitt's mark of 229. Staley's .793 SEC winning percentage (214-56) is second only to Summitt (.874) among coaches in the league at least five seasons. She owns the SEC record for consecutive regular-season conference victories with a 57-game streak that began in the 2021-22 season and ended in 2024-25.

Glass Shattering

South Carolina's rebounding started slowly but has skyrocketed since the second week of the season. The Gamecocks are 11th in the country with 48.7 rebounds per game and third in rebounding margin (+20.7). They have corralled 46.8 percent of their missed shots for an offensive rebounding percentage that ranks sixth in the country.

Senior Madina Okot leads the way with 10.8 boards per game to rank third in the SEC and 15th in the nation, and her 3.5 offensive rebounds per game are fifth in the SEC. She has been the team leader in the category five times through the first six games.

Sophomore Joyce Edwards is next in line at 6.0 rebounds per game, including 2.8 offensive boards, which ranks 15th in the league. Senior guard Raven Johnson has pulled down 5.2 rebounds per game, including a seasonhigh 11 against #8/10 Southern Cal (Nov. 15).

Efficiency Report

The Gamecocks are among the nation's most efficient teams on both sides of the ball. They lead the nation in field goal percentage defense (.270) and are second in field goal percentage (.565). From 3-point range, the Gamecocks are fifth in shooting percentage (.420).

Individually, three Gamecock starters are among the SEC's top 10 in field goal percentage – Joyce Edwards (5th, .613), Ta'Niya Latson (6th, .600) and Madina Okot (6th, .600). Only two Gamecocks are shooting under 50.0 percent for the season.

Tessa Johnson is among the SEC's best 3-point percentage shooters, hitting 48.4 percent from beyond the arc and making 2.5 3s per game to rank fourth and fifth in the league, respectively.

Paint Production

South Carolina has long controlled the paint, and this season is no different, even with a guard-dominated roster.

With 56.6 percent of the Gamecocks' points coming in the paint, the Gamecocks are fourth in the nation with 53.7 paint points per game and are out-scoring opponents in that space by an average of 34.7 points, including a +16 edge against #8/10 Southern Cal. They are shooting 67.9 percent in the paint compared to opponents' 35.0 percent accuracy.

Block Party

The Gamecocks have been a premier shot blocking program since their first national championship in 2017. They ranked in the top 15 in blocks per game that season and have only climbed higher in the eight subsequent seasons, including four years leading the nation in the stat and twice coming in second. Beyond the number of blocks, the team's block percentage has led the nation three seasons.

So far this season, South Carolina has blocked 21.7 percent of its opponents' two-point attempts, which ranks third in the nation according to Her Hoop Stats. The Gamecocks' 8.8 blocks per game rank second in the nation, and five players have at least five blocks.

Madina Okot tops the individual list with 2.0 blocks per game to rank 30th in the nation and fourth in the SEC. Joyce Edwards is not far behind at 1.8 per game (7th SEC).

Quarter Breakdown

South Carolina has been quick out of the gate so far this season, outscoring its opponents in by 14.7 points per first quarter. The Gamecocks have shot 61.5 percent in the opening 10 minutes while holding opponents to just 25.5 percent in that stretch.

Individually, three Gamecocks have scored double digits in a single quarter – Joyce Edwards (1), Tessa Johnson (1), Madina Okot (1). The top single-quarter individual scoring this season is 12 points by Edwards in the second quarter and Okot in the first quarter both against Winthrop.

First Watch

Gamecocks have dominated the many national award watch lists that are announced each preseason.

South Carolina is one of three schools with a player on each of the Naismith Hall of Fame Women's Starting Five watch lists. And one of two programs with five entires on the Wooden Award Top 50 Preseason Watchlist.

Three Gamecocks – Joyce Edwards, Raven Johnson, Ta'Niya Latson – are on the watch lists for the Naismith Trophy, the Wooden Award and the USBWA's Ann Meyers Drysdale Player of the Year award. South Carolina is one of two schools with three players on all three lists.

Edwards and Latson are also among the 20 players on the Wade Trophy Watch List, which is the WBCA's national player of the year award.

Latson drew preseason All-America honors from both the Associated Press and USA Today. Edward earned a spot on the USA Today Preseason All-America Second Team.

The pair was also ranked on ESPN's list of the top 25 players in the NCAA this season. Latson came in at #7 with Edwards close behind at #11, making South Carolina one of two programs with multiple players in the first 11 places.

Agot Makeer is on the list for the Tamika Catchings Award, the USBWA's National Freshman of the Year. and on the Wooden Award watch list, which also recognized senior Chloe Kitts despite her season-ending injury.

Senior point guard Raven Johnson has been at the tip of the spear for the Gamecocks on both sides of the ball and has led the team to nothing but winning.

In Johnson's fourth full season, South Carolina is 113-5 with her in the lineup (missed one game each in the 2022-23 and 2023-24 seasons), including a 35-3 mark against ranked teams. That stretch features three trips to the Final Four, including a National Championship (2024) and runner-up finish (2025), three SEC Regular-Season titles and three SEC Tournament championships in the three full seasons of her career.

Johnson is eighth in program history in career assists (451) and fifth in the category for SEC play (166). She owns three of the top seven single-season assist-to-

turnover ratios in program history, including a programrecord 3.33 mark in SEC play in 2024-25. Her current career 2.81 A:TO (451:160) is well ahead of the current program record of 2.55 by WNBA veteran Tyasha Harris (2017-20).

The powerful guard makes her presence felt on the glass as well, averaging 4.1 rebounds for her career, and she has been the team's top rebounder in 11 games, including this season's opener against Grand Canyon (Nov. 3).

This season, Johnson is fourth in the SEC and 11th in the nation in assists per game (6.8), including a pair of double-digit assist games. She is third in the league with a 4.1 assist-to-turnover ratio. Her stat stuffing includes

The production made her just the third freshman in program history to earn First-Team All-SEC honors, and she was an All-America honorable mention selection. Her 11.5 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in the Final Four yielded a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

This season, Edwards is on the watch lists for every national player of the year award and the Katrina McClain Power Forward of the Year list as well. She is living up to the predictions as her team-high 19.8 points per game rank third in the SEC and 31st in the nation, including a team-best three 20-point outings. Her scoring has come on 61.3 percent field goal shooting, which is fifth-best in the league and 29th in the nation. Her 91.7 percent (11-of-12) accuracy against Bowling Green (Nov. 7) was the fourth-best shooting performance in Gamecock history and the best since Aliyah Boston's perfect 13-of-13 outing in Nov. 2021.

Edwards was named SEC Player of the Week (11/11-17) in the season's second week after leading the Gamecocks to a pair of wins, including her double-double in a win over #8/10 Southern Cal (Nov. 15).

Edwards' success this season comes after a summer of representing the United States in both 3x3 and 5-on-5 competitions. After claiming a title at the FIBA 3x3 Nations League Americas Conference 2 event, she went on to average 9.9 points at the FIBA AmeriCup to rank among the top 15 scorers in the tournament and help the Americans to a gold medal.

It's T-Time

Junior guard Tessa Johnson is shaking off her "Tournament Tessa" moniker to bring "Trusted Tessa" out every time she steps on the court and on both sides of the ball while adapting to a starting role for the first time in her career.

The coaching staff praises Johnson for playing the right way, looking for teammates with a higher percentage shot and locking into the defensive game plan. After an offseason focused on her physical conditioning and how nutrition multiplies that effort, Johnson is logging a teamhigh 30.3 minutes per game (10th in SEC) and seeing her scoring and efficiency rise to career-best levels.

Johnson's 13.7 points per game are third on the team, and she is among the league's top five in 3-point percentage (4th, .484), and made 3s per game (5th, 2.5). Johnson has scored in double figures in all but one game. She is also handing out 3.3 assists per game.

Johnson turned in career-high numbers last season with 8.4 points and 1.5 assists per game. That production came after a freshman year that saw her shine in the most crucial moments of the team's undefeated run to the 2024 National Championship. She averaged 14.0 points on 58.8 percent shooting in the final weekend of the season, including a team-best 19 points in the title game to earn a spot on the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team..

Changes in Lat-itude

The top scorer in the nation last season, senior guard Ta'Niya Latson decided to join South Carolina for her final college season because she knew head coach Dawn Staley and the Gamecocks had what she needed to challenge herself to expand areas of her game she was not able to hone at Florida State.

Without the pressure of being the sole focal point on offense, Latson's efficiency is skyrocketing and her defensive skills are steadily expanding.

Latson, who was named an AP Preseason All-American and to the watch list of every national player of the year award, is sixth in the SEC both in scoring at 18.2 points per game and field goal percentage, hitting 60.0 percent from the field, including 54.5 percent from 3-point range. Her 3.7 assists per game (13th in SEC) are adding another 8.8 points per game, meaning she has her hands on 28.5 percent of the Gamecocks' total offense.

MO-mentum

Still early in her basketball career, 6-foot-6 center Madina Okot was the SEC's top percentage shooter (.649) and fourth in rebounding last season at Mississippi State. With a year of eligibility remaining, she chose to come to South Carolina with the mindset to be the next step in the Gamecocks' legacy of dominant post players.

The quiet Okot has drawn praise from her head coach on her strength and agility and been challenged to show her dominance every time she steps on the court.

After an average season opener, Okot has been rising to that challenge, and both her production and her comfort level have been growing exponentially.

Okot is second in the nation with four double-doubles through just six games this season. Her 10.8 rebounds per game are 15th in the nation and third in the SEC. Shooting 60.0 percent from the field, including a pair of 80.0 percent shooting games, she is sixth in the SEC in that category. Her 2.2 blocks per game are fourth in the SEC, and her 3.5 offensive boards per game are fifth.

Agot Send

Freshman guard Agot Makeer was ranked sixth in the Class of 2025 and drew McDonald's All-America and honorable mention Naismith All-America honors out of Montverde Academy (FL). She opened her college career on the USWBA Tamika Catchings Freshman of the Year and the Wooden Award watch lists.

After leading Montverde o a runner-up finish at the Chipotle High School National Championships, Makeer, suited up for Canada at the FIBA U19 World Cup, helping it to a fourth-place finish with 10.3 points, including 46.2 percent 3-point shooting, and 4.9 rebounds per game.

The long, lithe Makeer is adapting well to college, averaging 7.2 points to go along with 3.8 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game.

Ay-ay Captain

The #15 player in the 2025 Class, freshman guard Ayla McDowell is a McDonald's All-American and a three-time district MVP out of Cypress, Texas, who's international experience with Brazil's national team has helped smooth her transition to college basketball.

McDowell amassed over 2,700 career points in high school before donning a Brazil jersey at the FIBA AmeriCup and the FIBA U19 World Cup over the summer. For the U19 team, she was the top scorer with a 16.8 scoring average while averaging 4.5 rebounds and 2.7 steals.

SEASON THEME: BEYOND MEASURE

Each year Dawn Staley chooses a theme for the team and fans to center their season around, and it often reflects not just the state of South Carolina women's basketball, but that of the game overall.

The Gamecocks' 2025-26 season theme is Beyond Measure, which centers on the value of the whole person or group beyond the commonly measured scale. A player's value to the team is not measured solely by her statline but also by a myriad of other ways she elevates her team. Championships and awards are not valued because they yield a trophy but also because they lift up a university, a city, a state. The value of the FAMS who support the team around the country is more than the value of ticket sales, but it is in the way they form a united community that supersedes all their difference.

More broadly, Beyond Measure is a reminder that the ceiling of the team and its players – and that of women's basketball as a sport – will always shatter any limitations others may place on it.

Coaches have praised her competitive fire and her predictability, meaning she is trusted to make the right play, especially on the defensive end where she is making the biggest impression early on.

Despite a tough shooting night in the most recent game, McDowell is scoring 5.7 points per game on 52.6 percent shooting, and she is hitting 84.6 percent from the free throw line.

Everybody's All-American

The Gamecocks' 11-woman roster includes eight McDonald's All-Americans – Maryam Dauda, Joyce Edwards, Raven Johnson, Tessa Johnson, Ta'Niya Latson, Agot Makeer, Maddy McDaniel and Ayla McDowell.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 29 McDonald's All-Americans, including 22 who signed as freshmen.

What's Next

Just as the 2025-26 season began, event organizers were already releasing plans for the Gamecocks' 2026-27 season. South Carolina will be making its second appearance at all four events.

The Gamecocks will return to Paris for Oui Play 2026, facing Maryland in the season opener on Nov. 2. The return game of the Sprouts Farmers Market The Real SC game is set for Bon Secours Wellness Arena in Greenville, S.C., on Nov. 15. The Gamecocks are slated to take on UConn in the 2026 Basketball Hall of Fame Women's Showcase on Nov. 24. And the Charlotte Sports Foundation announced South Carolina's three-year commitment to the Ally Tipoff with games against North Carolina (2026), UConn (2027) and NC State (2028).

Who's Next

Head coach Dawn Staley signed a pair of top-20 players in the early signing period in forwards Kelsi Andrews and Kaeli Wynn. Both are on the Naismith Trophy Girls' High School Player of the Year watch list, released in November.

The 6-foot-3 Andrews is the #18 player in the Class of 2026 after helping lead IMG Academy to a high school national championship in 2025 with a 12-point, 13-rebound performance in the title game. She has also helped the U.S. to gold medals in the 2024 FIBA U17 World Cup and the 2023 FIBA U16 Americas Championship.

Wynn is the #17 player in the 2026 Class, standing 6-foot-2 and coming from basketball coach parents. She was a first-team all-state selection as a junior, averaging 17 points, 7.1 rebounds and 2.7 assists at Mater Dei High School, which was ranked No. 1 in the nation throughout the season.

WNBA Pipeline

Dawn Staley's status as a dream merchant is most evident by the steady stream of Gamecocks being drafted into and enjoying lengthy careers in the WNBA. Since her first Gamecock was drafted in 2015, she has seen 18 have their name called on draft night – the second-most by a program in that time.

Staley's numbers have skyrocketed since 2020 with an NCAA-best 12 draft picks since then, including a best-in-the-nation six first-round selections in that time.

In proof Staley sends players to the league ready, six Gamecocks have earned All-Rookie Team honors, including three WNBA Rookies of the Year – Allisha Gray (2017), A'ja Wilson (2018), Aliyah Boston (2023).

Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance for the last 11 seasons, although the NCAA does not officially recognize the COVID-limited attendance in the 2020-21 season. The Gamecocks are on track to continue that streak after selling out of season tickets for the second time in as many seasons and opening the 2025-26 slate by hosting the five highest-attended games of the season to average 15,976 fans per game.

The Gamecocks have had at least one sellout of their 18,000-seat Colonial Life Arena for eight straight seasons (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season) dating back to the first ever sellout of 18,000 on Feb. 8, 2016. There have been at least five sellouts in each of the last two seasons.

South Carolina's 2024-25 attendance average of 16,437 is the second-highest in the history of the NCAA, narrowly trailing Tennessee's 1998-99 average of 16,565. That mark included a program-record seven selllouts.

In women's basketball, Colonial Life Arena has become one of the most feared places to play as enormous crowds fill the building with passion for the Gamecocks.

The state of South Carolina has rallied around head coach Dawn Staley's program in unprecedented numbers as the Gamecocks have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last 10 seasons and boast 21 sellouts (18,000) in the last 10 seasons of full capacity arenas.

Colonial Life Arena is more than just the home of South Carolina men's and women's basketball, though. It is also a thriving entertainment venue that the city of Columbia and its surrounding metropolitan area are able to enjoy throughout the year.

Colonial Life Arena is the largest arena in the state of South Carolina with 18,000 seats, and the 10th-largest oncampus basketball facility in the nation. Located on the beautiful University of South Carolina campus, this one-of-a-kind facility features 41 suites, four entertainment suites, and the Frank McGuire Club, a full-service hospitality room that has a capacity of 300. The state-of-the-art facility also features plush seating, a technologically advanced sound system and a one-of-a-kind selection of unique concession foods that will delight fans of all ages.

In Summer 2017, a 12-display center-hung video board and ribbon boards were added to the arena bowl at a cost of \$4.2 million. The center-hung board features four convex-curved main displays that measure approximately 12' x 20' and can show any combination of live video, instant replays, statistics and game information, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

The Arena has hosted numerous sold out shows, including Barnum and Bailey Circus, Paul McCartney, country superstars Kenny Chesney and Taylor Swift, WWE Wrestling, Kanye West and numerous other acts.

The largest building ever constructed at the University of South Carolina at 342,000 square feet, the Arena has an intimate double-deck design that puts every seat close to the action. The cantilever of the upper deck over the lower deck extends further than any other arena of its size with great sight lines.

Two spacious locker rooms for Gamecock men's and women's basketball include team meeting rooms, recruiting rooms, coaches locker rooms and an athletic training room.

18th Season at South Carolina 26th Season in Career

Since thrusting South Carolina into the national spotlight when she was hired in May 2008, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee as a player is angling for another induction as a coach with her standing as one of five head coaches with at least three women's basketball National Championships and the only Black basketball head coach with multiple national titles, one of five head coaches to lead an undefeated team to a National Championship, and the first Black head coach of the USA Basketball Senior National Team.

In Staley's 17 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks, highlights include:

- Seven NCAA Final Fours in the last 10 tournaments (2015, 2017, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025)
- Ranking in the AP Top 25 every week since Dec. 10, 2012, the second-longest active streak in the nation and seventh-longest all-time (251)
- 38 straight weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, just the third program to go wire-to-wire in back-to-back seasons
- 86 total weeks at No. 1 in the AP Poll, the third-most in the history of that poll
- Eight 30-win seasons, including a program-record 38 wins in 2023-24
- Nine SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012, and she was part of the FIBA Hall of Fame Class of 2025.

In her 26th season as a head coach, Staley has led her college teams to 15 25-win seasons, a total of 21 postseason appearances (two WNIT) and 212 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including 86 in the No. 1 spot – the third most times in the top spot in the history of that poll. Her .775 winning percentage (653-190) ranks seventh in the nation among active head coaches with at least 15 years of experience and ninth all-time.

Also a force in USA Basketball, Staley was named the U.S. Women's National Team head coach for 2017-21, leading the U.S. to 2018 FIBA World Cup gold to earn USAB National Coach of the Year honors that year, adding gold medals at the 2019 and 2021 FIBA AmeriCups and stretching the U.S. Olympic gold medal streak to seven straight at the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games, for which she again earned Coach of the Year honors. Prior to that appointment, Staley led three other U.S. teams to gold medals – 2015 FIBA U19 World Championships, 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship, 2007 Pan Am Games – and served as an assistant on the Senior National Team 2006-08 and again 2014-16, during which the U.S. claimed gold in the 2014 FIBA World Championship and the 2008 and 2016 Olympics.

In her 19th season at the helm of the Gamecocks, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year five times (2014, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024). Her 2020 unanimous selection made her the first former Naismith Player of the Year to earn the Naismith Coach of the Year award, and she became the first men's or women's coach to claim the award in three straight seasons 2022-24. She is a seven-time SEC Coach of the Year and was the 2012 BCA Female Coach of the Year. She is the only Gamecock basketball coach – men's or women's – to amass 300 victories at South Carolina and became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau. She is the program's all-time winningest coach with 481 wins, a .814 (481-110) winning percentage and a program-record 14 postseason appearances.

In the vaunted SEC, Staley's 214 league wins are the most among active league coaches and third all-time, trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). She was the second fastest to 200 league wins (255 games), trailing only Summitt at 229. Her .793 SEC winning percentage (214-56) is second only to Summitt (.874) in league history. Her Gamecocks are the only SEC program with multiple 16-0 seasons in league history, hitting that mark four times (2015-16, 2019-20, 2022-23, 2023-24). Staley's back-to-back SEC undefeated seasons helped the Gamecocks to an SEC-record 57-game win streak in league play, which ranks sixth in NCAA history for conference win streaks.

In addition to coaching two National Players of the Year, two National Defensive Players of the Year and a National Freshman of the Year, Staley has helped 13 Gamecocks collect 29 All-America selections, three to pick up seven SEC Player of the Year honors, four to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of eight times, three to SEC 6th Player of the Year honors and six to capture SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 23 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 44 times, including 22 first-team selections. Since her first Gamecock was selected in the 2015 WNBA Draft, a total of 18 South Carolina have been chosen, which is the second-most of any program in that timeframe. Of those 18, 11 have been first-round picks, highlighted by two No. 1 overall picks since 2018. Three Gamecocks have been named WNBA Rookie of the Year and have amassed 13 All-Star selections. A'ja Wilson went on to become a three-time WNBA MVP and two-time WNBA Defensive Player of the Year.
