4th Year at LSU • 11th Year as a Head Coach

LSU Coach Matt McMahon has built his program around five core values that define his approach both on and off the court: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

Those values were among the first principles he shared when introduced as the 25th head coach in program history on March 22, 2022, and they continue to guide every aspect of LSU Basketball today.

Now entering his fourth season at the helm, Coach McMahon leads a Tigers team energized by a strong recruiting class that blends proven transfers with talented freshmen. The 2025-26 squad is poised to build on the foundation laid in recent years, with an emphasis on chemistry, relentless effort, and steady progress.

This current group thrives on its chemistry, playing for each other with toughness, accountability, and an unselfish spirit. Their joy for the game is evident every time they take the floor, uniting players, coaches, and fans alike.

Guided by those five core principles, the Tigers have continued to strengthen the program's foundation, setting the stage for growth in 2025-26. With added talent and depth at all positions, this year's roster is built to take the next step forward.

Player development remains a cornerstone in the Matt McMahon LSU basketball program.

Robert Miller III enters his sophomore season ready to build on flashes of promise from his freshman year. Over the summer, Miller has committed himself to individual skill development and strength training to add both power and polish his game.

Jalen Reed returns for his redshirt junior season after an early December ACL injury cut short what had been a breakout year. Known for his drive and work ethic, Reed attacked his rehab this summer showing steady progress toward a full return.

The summer has given new players valuable time to work closely with the coaching staff and strength and conditioning coach Mike Chatman, focusing on improving their skills and physical readiness for the long season ahead.

The program has already shown it can take measurable steps forward under Matt McMahon's leadership. In 2024, LSU advanced to postseason play after back-to-back wins over No. 11 South Carolina, 64-63, in Columbia and then a 75-74 win over No. 17 Kentucky in BR.

Last season, LSU showed what it was capable of, beating Florida State in its SEC/ACC Challenge game, winning a triple-overtime win at the Greenbrier over UCF, a road victory at Kansas State, and an amazing rally in the final minute to win at Oklahoma.

McMahon's track record of building winning cultures was firmly established during his seven seasons at Murray State. Coach McMahon led the Racers to a record of 154-67 (.697) including: 93 OVC regular season wins, winning 75 percent of league games.

During his tenure, he has also coached multiple all-Americans and all-conference players. The most notable was Ja Morant, who went on to become the 2020 NBA Rookie of the Year.

Under McMahon the Racers won regular season league titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, 2019 and 2022.

In his final season at Murray State in 2021-22, McMahon coached OVC Player of the Year KJ Williams and two other first-teamers (Tevin Brown, Justice Hill). In addition, McMahon was named the league's Coach of the Year.

McMahon's Racers, in 2021-22, were just the sixth team in league history to go undefeated. Murray State then won the league tournament to advance to the NCAA Tournament where the Racers defeated San Francisco in the opening round.

The 2021-22 team was one of seven teams to win 30 or more games that season and led the nation in win percentage at 91.2 percent.

The 2018-19 team won 28 games and made its mark in the NCAA Tournament when the 12th-seeded Racers won their fourth all-time tourney game over No. 5 seed Marquette.

Morant that year was named the OVC POY, leading Division I in assists and earning first-team All-America honors. In the NCAA Tournament win over Marquette, Morant posted a triple double of 17 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists as he became the eighth player to record a triple double in the tournament.

He was drafted second overall in the 2019 NBA draft by the Memphis Grizzlies.

Prior to being named head coach, he was a key part of Coach Steve Prohm's staff as assistant at Murray State as the Racers won a pair of Ohio Valley Conference championships, a Collegelnsider.

com Tournament championship and an appearance in the NIT. He was part of a staff that won 104 games from 2011-15.

PRIOR TO MURRAY STATE

Coach McMahon has had success in college basketball since his days as a player at

Appalachian State.

Known as an excellent shooter and tough competitor, he played on three Southern Conference regular season title teams in 1998, 1999 and 2000. He earned All-Tournament honors in 1999. The Mountaineers won the SoCon Tournament in 2000 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

He played in 117 career games under coach Buzz Peterson and made 135 three-pointers, graduating in 2000.

His coaching career began immediately at Appalachian State as assistant under Houston Fancher in 2000-01. He would rejoin Peterson's staff as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee before returning to ASU in 2002 as assistant and later associate head coach, where he stayed until the end of the 2009-10 season. A year at UNC Wilmington (2010-11) as assistant coach set the stage for his journey to Murray State, starting first as an assistant in the 2011-12 season and then as head coach prior to the 2015-16 season.

Coach McMahon and his wife Mary, a former standout for the Furman women's basketball team, have three children – Maris, Mason and Mabry.

NOTABLES

* LSU is 30-0 under Coach McMahon when four or more different players score in double figures. LSU has had at least four in double figures in nine games this year, including three of the last five. In the win over Prairie View (12/22), LSU put six players in double figures.

* At A&M (1/3), a couple of back-to-backs with Mike Nwoko scoring 20-plus in back-to-back games for the first time in his career (22 and 21), while Pablo Tamba has back-to-back double figure rebounds (15 and 11).

* For LSU it was their first loss when leading after 35 minutes in 12 games (11-1) ... LSU is 50-5 in the Matt McMahon era when LSU was leading after 35 minutes. It also was the first time LSU lost after outshooting the opponent this season (11-1, 49-10 in the Coach McMahon era at LSU).

* Against SMU (12/13), Tigers had three with double doubles – Marquel Sutton and Pablo Tamba with points-rebound doubles, while DJ Thomas Jr., had a points-assist double. It marked the first time an LSU team recorded three players with doubles since the first round of the NCAA championship on March 20, 2021 against St. Bonaventure.

* Dedan (DJ) Thomas Jr., upped his career high in assists to 12 against SMU, the first LSU player to record 12 assists in a game since Dec. 7, 2002 when Torris Bright had 12 for the Tigers against McNeese. He equaled that with a 22-12 points-assist double against USM (12/29).

* For Matt McMahon the overtime win at BC (12/3) made the Tigers 3-0 in OT under his watch. Sixth straight OT win for LSU, dating back to 2020-21 season.

* The Tigers were 32-of-62 from the field against USM (12/29) for 51.6 percent. It was the eighth time this season LSU was over 50 percent from the field, including three over 60.0 percent.

* DJ Thomas' 22 point-12 assists game vs. USM was the first time an LSU guard had a 20 pts-10 ast. game since Feb. 10, 2021 when Javonte Smart had 22 points, 11 assists in a 94-80 road win by the Tigers over Mississippi State.

* One of those games over 60 percent in the championship game of the Emerald Coast Classic (68.6 percent, 35-51). It was the second-best shooting percentage ever in a game away from Baton Rouge dating back to 1956-57 topped only by the 71.4 percent vs. Clemson on Dec. 20, 1969. LSU shot its all-time best percentage of 71.7 percent in the opener against Tarleton State (11/5).

* The Tigers set a school record with 43 free throws made against PV (12/22). Ironically, the record they broke was also made on Dec. 22, but in 1979 against Tulane when LSU made 41 free throws. The 49 attempts tied for the seventh most in a game.

* After 13 games, the Tigers changed the starting lineup at Texas A&M (1/3) with the injury to DJ Thomas. Freshman point guard Jalen Reece moved in and had a season high of seven assists.

* Tigers for the eighth time since the start of the 1999-2000 season able to get through the non-conference months of November and December undefeated or with one loss.

SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES

LSU and South Carolina have played 40 times with each team scoring 20 in a series dating back to 1974 for one game before the teams starting playing league games in 1992.

LSU has won 5-of-the-last-7 since the start of 2019 with LSU winning in 2024 (64-63 in Columbia) and 81-67 in 2025 in Baton Rouge. South Carolina scored wins in 2022 and 2023.

This will be the first time the teams have played twice in a season since 2013 when the teams played home-and-away that year.

LSU has a 10-7 lead in games played in Baton Rouge.

SOUTH CAROLINA UPDATE

The Gamecocks lost to No. 11 Vanderbilt in their opening SEC game, 83-71, at the Colonial Life Center in Columbia.

Elijah Strong had 17 points with Myles Stute 14 and Mike Sharavjamts 13 for the Gamecocks. Carolina shot 43.1 percent for the game (25-of-58) with seven three-pointers and 14-of-18 from the free throw line. South Carolina was out rebounds 37-25, but the Gamecocks had a very impressive just four turnovers.

For the season, Meechie Johnson is the leading average scorer at 13.6 points a contest, with Sharavjamts at 11.9, Strong 10.3 and Eli Ellis at 10.1 points. The Gamecocks average 80.3 points a game.

Lamont Paris is in his fourth season as the head coach at South Carolina after five seasons at Chattanooga.

PETE MARAVICH ASSEMBLY CENTER

The Tigers went undefeated at home in non-conference play for the second straight year in this their 55th season of play in the building. LSU finished 8-0 in the Maravich Center in non-conference play this season after going 9-0 in the building in 24-25.

Overall, LSU is 646-222 in the Maravich Center and 355-49 (89.4 percent) in non-conference games. LSU is 291-173 (62.7%) in league games. The Tigers are 10-17 in home games in the Matt McMahon era.

The building was originally known as the LSU Assembly Center from its opening in late 1971 until August 1988 when the building was renamed by government legislation following the untimely death of star LSU player, "Pistol" Pete Maravich.

The Maravich Center is the fourth oldest continuous use basketball arena in the league having hosted its first game in January 1972. Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt opened in 1952, Stegeman Coliseum at UGA in 1964 and Coleman Coliseum at Alabama opened in 1968.

STARTING LINEUPS

It took an injury to DJ Thomas Jr., to break up one of the longest start to seasons run of a starting lineup for the Tigers. For every game of 13 non-conference contests is was Thomas and Mackinnon at guards, Sutton and Tamba at forwards and Nwoko in the middle.

It's the first time since the 2021-22 season that there has been this kind of consistency in lineup when Xavier Pinson, Brandon Murray, Mwani Wilkinson, Darrius Days and Efton Reid started the first 12 games. The lineup would change in game 13 that year, but that quintet would start 24 games that entire season.

Marquel Sutton has started 113 games in his career – all three years at Omaha and his first 14 games at LSU.

DJ Thomas Jr., has started all 73 games of his college career to date, which includes his first two years at UNLV before coming to Baton Rouge. That streak remains intact since he did not dress at A&M.

THE NOVEMBER-DECEMBER RECORD

LSU finished the November-December non-conference portion of the season at 12-1, giving the Tigers eight times since the start of the 1999-2000 season to finish November-December non-conference play with no more than one loss in that portion of the season. The previous November-December non-conference games with 0 or 1 loss entering January:

SHOOTING FROM THE FIELD

The Tigers have now had three games shooting over 60 percent so far this season:

71.7 pct – vs. Tarleton St., 11/5/25; 68.6 pct – vs. DePaul, 11/29/25; 62.1 pct – vs. SMU, 12/13/25

The 71.7 percent game against Tarleton State is now the all-time best field goal percentage in LSU history, topping a 71.4 percentage against Clemson on Dec. 20, 1969. LSU was 33-of-46 in the contest, sparked by the 16-of-21 in the first half of the game.

It marked the third time that an LSU basketball team has shot 70 percent or better in a basketball game:

71.7% -- Tarleton St. (BR) – 2025; 71.4% -- Clemson (Charlotte) – 1969; 70.3% -- Centenary (BR) – 2003

The game also set a record for best two-point field goal percentage (making 25-of-28), topping the mark of a game just the previous season:

89.3% -- vs. Tarleton State (in Baton Rouge) – 11/5/25

87.2% -- vs. Mississippi Valley (in Baton Rouge) – 12/29/24

75.8% – vs. Memphis (in Lake Buena Vista, Florida) – 11/29/13

LSU has also had five other games shooting over 50 percent overall, giving LSU eight-of-its-first 14 games over 50 percent for the game, all LSU wins.

The Tigers are 35-2 in the last 37 games in which LSU has shot at least 50 percent from the floor.

LSU is third in the league (one of three shooting over 50 percent in the conference) and 20th NCAA in overall field goal percentage at 51.1 percent (420-of-822). LSU has made 71 more field goals than opponents this season on 41 less field goal attempts.

LSU is 30th in NCAA in effective field goal percentage at 57.0 percent. LSU was at 51.1 percent in effective field goal percentage last season.

THREE POINT SHOOTING

After two games of shooting less than 17 percent from the arc against BC (12/3) and Texas Tech (12/7), the tables have turned better for the Tigers in the last four games as the three-point shooting went back the other way.

Against SMU in the Smoothie King Center in New Orleans, the Tigers were 7-of-15 for 46.7 percent. Max Mackinnon hit 6-of-7 from deep in that game. Against Southeastern (12/19), LSU was 9-of-22 for 40.9 percent with Marquel Sutton and Mackinnon combining to go 6-of-9 from distance.

LSU was just 7-of-43 in the combined games at BC and against Texas Tech.

What was more amazing was what LSU faced in the Prairie View game (12/22) when the Panthers made 10-of-13 three-pointers in the first half and finished 12-of-20 for 60.0 percent. It was tied for the fourth best three-point percentage by an opponent in the Maravich Center and it was the most field goal attempts for any percentage 60 or above for a visitor in the building.

For the first 14 games, LSU is at 97-of-292 (33.2 percent) with opponents having made 16 more (113-of-340, 33.2 percent).

LSU is not the three-point shooting team it has been in years past, making an average of 6.9 a game compared to 7.8 a year ago. The Tigers made the third most three-pointers in school history (250), while shooting just 30 percent from the field in 2024-25.

In the conference opener, LSU was 6-of-19 (31.6 percent).

PAINT BY NUMBERS

When LSU has had its most success early, the Tigers have been able to score plenty of points in the paint. This season, LSU has had at least 40 points in the paint in 10 total games, including four over 50 points in the paint. LSU is averaging 41.6 points in the paint over 14 games.

LSU is presently T24 in the NCAA in points in the paint.

LSU's four 50-point games for Points in the Paint this season:

58 – vs. Alcorn State, 11/18/25

54 – vs. DePaul, 11/29/25

50 – vs. SMU, 12/13/25

50 – vs. FIU, 11/13/25

The best in recent times came last year when LSU had 60 points in the paint on Dec. 29, 2024. LSU had four 50-points in the paint games in 2021-22, but the last team to have more than four such games came in the 2019-20 season when the Tigers had five 50 points in the paint games.

SHOOTING WELL INSIDE THE ARC

LSU's two-point percentage for the season remains good at 60.9 percent.

LSU is 323-of-530 inside the arc and that percentage is 12th in the NCAA. LSU is 5.7 percentage points better than last season when LSU was at 55.2 percent inside the arc.

Mike Nwoko is 20th in the NCAA, according to Teamrankings.com, at 72.8 percent inside the arc. That is the third best two-point percentage in the SEC.

FREE THROWS GOOD

It was a school record night for LSU at the free throw line against Prairie View (12/22), making 43-of-49 free throw attempts. The 43 makes set a school record, topping the 41 made against Tulane on Dec. 22, 1979. The 49 attempts were T7 in free throw attempts in a single LSU game.

The Tigers have been very good at the line for the most part this season, making 78.1 percent (292-of-374). That free throw percentage is second in the SEC. This game will match the top two free throw shooting teams in the league as South Carolina is presently first in the SEC.

LSU's free throw percentage is 13th in the NCAA.

LSU's free throws made per game of 20.9 is third in the league and sixth in the NCAA.

LSU's free throw attempts per game of 26.7 is sixth in the league and 18th in the NCAA.

LSU is at the moment is handling things at the line much better than a year ago when the Tigers shot 71.6 percent at the line.

Max Mackinnon is 38-of-42 at the line or 90.5 percent, fourth in the league and 35th in the NCAA. Three other Tiger regulars come in over 80 percent at the line with DJ Thomas Jr., at 83.8 percent (62-of-74), Marquel Sutton at 83.3 percent (45-of-54) and Rashad King at 81.3 percent (13-of-16).

As a team, LSU has made 105 more free throws than opponents and its 292 makes is 15 more than the 277 opponent attempts.

BETTER REBOUNDING

LSU is better on the boards this season so far at 39.4 per game, well above last year's rebound average of 35.7 a game. The Tigers are only eighth in the league in rebound average, but fifth in the league and 25th in the NCAA in defensive rebounds at 28.71 a game.

Marquel Sutton is second in the league and 27th in NCAA at 9.3 a game. Pablo Tamba is fifth in the league after his back-to-back double figure rebound games, upping his average to 8.2 a game.

LSU's rebound margin is +6.9, sixth in the league. LSU opponents are averaging 32.4 a game.

DOUBLE DOUBLES GALORE

The Tigers had three players with double doubles against SMU (12/13):

Marquel Sutton – 23 points, 12 rebounds

Pablo Tamba – 14 points, 10 rebounds

Dedan Thomas Jr. – 16 points, 12 assists

Against Prairie View, Sutton was in double double territory for the sixth time this year and 18th in his career with 21 points and 13 rebounds.

The SMU doubles were the second for both Tamba (third career) and Thomas (also third career). Tamba just missed his third against PV (12/22) with 10 points and nine rebounds.

Thomas added his third double double of the year against USM (12/29) with 22 points and 12 assists becoming the first point guard at LSU to post a 20-10 points-assists double double since Javonte Smart at Mississippi State on Feb. 10, 2021 when he had 22 points and 11 assists.

The last time LSU had three players with double doubles in the same game was against St. Bonaventure in the first round of the 2021 NCAA Tournament in Bloomington, Indiana:

Trendon Watford – 11 points, 11 rebounds

Darius Days – 13 points, 11 rebounds

Aundre Hyatt – 13 points, 10 rebounds

TURNOVERS

The Tigers had their fifth single digit turnover game of the season against USM (12/29) with a season low of six miscues. LSU has had single digit turnovers in five games this season.

However, the turnovers crept up, especially near the end of the conference opener at Texas A&M (1/3) and LSU finished with 16 miscues, equally the season high from the opener against Tarleton State back in November.

LSU has improved its turnover numbers for the full season by over two full points from last season – 10.9 in 14 games to 13.1 for the 2024-25 season. Last season, LSU turned the ball over 419 times compared to 409 assists. The Tigers were 14th in turnover margin at -1.47 and 15th in assist-to-turnover ratio at 0.98.

So far LSU has a positive assist-to-turnover mark of 1.45 (222-153). LSU is eighth in the SEC in turnovers per game.

POINT GUARD DJ THOMAS JR., PILING UP ASSISTS AND POINTS

For the first 13 games, DJ Thomas was leading this LSU team with his solid way of running the offense. In the final two conference games, he was also providing the offensive scoring spark.

His status remains day-to-day as of Sunday, after suffering a lower left leg injury prior to the team's game at Texas A&M (1/3) this past Saturday.

For the third time this season, Thomas posted double digits assists with his career equaling 12 assists against Southern Miss (12/29). He also had 12 assists in the win over SMU (12/13).

In his last two appearances, Thomas has been piling up the points, scoring 21 against Prairie View (12/22) and then 22 in the game against USM. In those two games, Thomas was 13-of-20 from the field, 2-of-3 from distance and 15-of-17 from the free throw line.

The other double figure assist game came against Omaha (11/21) when he posted 11 assists.

So far this season, Thomas has 92 assists (7.08 a game). Only in the loss to Texas Tech and the SLU game (12/19) has Thomas had less than five assists in a contest.

Thomas has scored in double figures in 12-of-13 games he has played, including the last 11, dating back to the third game of the year.

Highlighting that was the game at Boston College (12/3) when he scored 23 points, including the last two baskets in the final minute that got LSU even and forced overtime, and then the first four points (bucket and two free throws) that got LSU off to a good start in winning the game, 78-69.

MIKE NWOKO FIRST SEC; THIRD NCAA IN SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Mike Nwoko has had a shining season so far for the LSU Tigers and against A&M on Saturday, he did something he hasn't done in his career – post 20-point games in back-to-back outings.

Nwoko scored 22 versus Southern Miss (12/29) and 21 at Texas A&M (1/3). In those two games, Nwoko was 17-of-23 from the field and 9-of-14 from the free throw line.

In the last four games, Nwoko has been in double figures in all four games, averaging 19.5 points. His scoring average has gone from 15.2 to 16.4 over the last four contests.

College Basketball Analytics Sunday had Nwoko fourth in Division I in scoring average change from 2024-25 to 2025-26 based on "the players with the biggest increase in PPG from last season to this season; Scored at least 5.0 PPG last season and from high major conferences.

Nwoko is +10.3 averaging 6.1 a year ago and 16.4 at the moment.

Nwoko is shooting 71.1 percent (91-of-128) which is best in the conference and third in the NCAA. No other league player is shooting over 56 percent.

Nwoko has scored in double figures 13 times and is 16.4 points per game average is 12th in the league.

He has already scored 153 points better than he did in his freshman year at Miami (77) and has now scored 21 points more than the 209 points Nwoko scored at Mississippi State a year ago when he started 32-of-34 games.

His 13 games in double figures at LSU gives him 20 for his career.

He is also averaging 5.5 rebounds and after a career high five blocks versus Southern Miss, he has 17 blocks (12th in the league at 1.21 a game).

Against Alcorn (11/18), he came very close to a double double with nine rebounds (six offensive). The 12 field goals made against Alcorn still remains tied for league best.

MARQUEL SUTTON

Marquel Sutton had his game going against SMU (12/13), scoring a season high 23 points with 12 boards against the Mustangs.

Sutton made 8-of-15 field goal attempts, including a trey and 6-of-6 at the line on a night when foul trouble to Mike Nwoko and Robert Miller III pushed him back down to the 4-5 with Pablo Tamba in a setup that they hadn't practiced much of this season.

He followed that up against Prairie View (12/22) with his sixth double double of 21 points, 13 rebounds, three assists and no turnovers.

However, in the last two games, Sutton tallied just 12 combined points against Southern Miss (12/29) and at A&M (1/3). In the last three games, Sutton has failed to convert a three-pointer in nine attempts.

Sutton is now averaging 13.4 points a game and 9.3 rebounds.

Sutton has posted nine double figure scoring games this season and seven games in double figure rebounds.

Three of his six double double came in consecutive November games and it had been since February-March of 2016 that an LSU player posted three consecutive double doubles (Ben Simmons).

Sutton is shooting 63-of-130 from the field (48.5 percent). He has 17 three-pointers.

PABLO TAMBA

The UC-Davis transfer has proven to be a little bit of everything for the Tigers, especially when it comes to rebounding, and he was especially important defensively with five steals against A&M (1/3), the most single game steals by any player on the 16 teams opening conference play Saturday.

His 11 rebounds against the Aggies made him one of six players to have a double figure rebound night to open SEC play.

He has posted four double figure scoring games and five double figure rebound games, including the last two with a career high 15 against Southern Miss (12/29) and the 11 at Texas A&M (1/3).

Pablo Tamba proved his versatility against SMU (12/13) with having to play out of position because of inside foul trouble for the Tigers and he responded with 14 points and 10 rebounds for his second double double of the season.

The UC-Davis transfer has started all 14 games and is averaging 6.8 points and now 8.2 rebounds. His rebound average has gone up almost one full point in the last three games. He is fifth in the league in rebound average.

Against DePaul in the ECC championship game, he was 4-of-4 from the field and 6-of-6 from the line to score 14 points with seven rebounds. He is making 35-of-51 from the field (68.6 percent).

JALEN REECE

Jalen Reece, the freshman point guard from Orlando, has become a very reliable backup point guard for the Tigers.

Now with the situation with DJ Thomas and his injury, it was Reece who became the primary point guard for the A&M game (1/3). He played 36 minutes (his most prior was 23 minutes), with four points and a season best seven assists in the contest.

In the three previous games before conference play began, Reece was off the bench at times in a two-point guard set with Thomas.

He had three turnovers against the Aggies full court pressure, his first turnovers since Dec. 7.

Against Prairie View (12/22), he played 23 minutes, scoring a couple of three-pointers with eight points, two assists and no turnovers. It was the third time this season he has scored at least eight points in a game for LSU.

He is averaging 14.6 minutes a game, 3.4 points, 2.2 assists per game and he has a 31-9 assist-to-turnover ratio (3.44).

Against DePaul (11/29), Reece was given the keys for 20 minutes and he responded with a 6-of-6 night from the field with an additional free throw to score 13 points. More impressively, he posted a game-high six assists with no turnovers.

Reed had eight points against Alcorn (11/18), hitting 3-of-5 from the field with a three-pointer.

MAX MACKINNON

Max McKinnon had one of those night against Texas Tech in Fort Worth when he scored just two points in the Tigers loss after going 0-of-9 from the field and 0-of-5 from three-point range.

Since then in the last five games he has made 6, 3, 2, 3, and 4 three-pointers, making a combined 18-of-36 three-point attempts (50.0 percent).

The six three-pointers came in the next game in New Orleans against SMU (12/13).

Mackinnon was 6-of-7 from deep, as part of an 8-of-9 game shooting as he scored 22 points with two assists. It was his second 22-point game of the season to go with his 6-of-8 three-point shooting against Omaha (11/21).

Mackinnon also chipped in with some of the playmaking work with Thomas out against Texas A&M (1/3) with five assists and two steals in the game to go with his third 20-point game of the season.

He is 33-of-75 from distance for 44.0 percent. Mackinnon has double figures in 11 games this season, including the last five.

Mackinnon, who transferred to LSU after two years at Elon and a season at Portland, is also 38-of-42 from the free throw line (90.5 percent). That is fourth best in the league and 35th in the NCAA.

The six three pointers are one off his career mark of seven, last season for Portland against San Diego on Jan. 23, 2025.

Only once in the Matt McMahon era has someone made more three-pointers in a single game and that was seven by K. J. Williams against Wake Forest on Dec. 10, 2022.

Mackinnon has an assist average of 2.5 a contest and he is averaging 13.5 points and 2.7 rebounds.

ROBERT MILLER III MAKING CONTRIBUTIONS AGAIN FOR TIGERS

Sophomore Robert Miller III, now the lone active returnee on the team after the injury to Jalen Reed, has been asked to do a little more with the absence of Reed and he responded with a 28-minute performance against BC (12/3) as he scored eight points on 4-of-5 shooting with five boards.

Off the bench, he is averaging 18.1 minutes a game, 5.7 points and 3.0 rebounds a contest.

Miller had eight points on 4-of-4 shooting with a couple of important second half points against Texas A&M (1/3) to go with three blocks.

Miller had 12 points in the ECC finals against DePaul (11/29) where he was 3-of-3 from the field and 6-of-7 from the free throw line. It was his sixth double figure scoring game of his career.

He has made 23-of-32 field goals (71.9 percent), but he has also found himself getting to the free throw

line, making 34-of-45 so far (75.6 percent). For the entire season a year ago, Miller made 21-of-33 free throw attempts.

Miller is averaging 1.1 a game.

JALEN REED OUT FOR SEASON AGAIN

Jalen Reed left the Drake game in Niceville, Florida (11/28) just before the eight-minute second half media timeout with what turned out to be a season-ending left Achilles tendon injury. He had surgery on Dec. 2. He was with the Tigers for a game for the first time since Nov. 29 in New Orleans when the Tigers faced SMU.

Ironically, the injury came just under a year from Dec. 3, 2024 in the opening minutes of the ACC/SEC Challenge game against Florida State when Reed injured his right ACL and his subsequent surgery ended his 2024-25 season after eight games.

He averaged 9.5 points per game, 5.7 rebounds a game in 18.0 minutes per game.

PJ CARTER

PJ Carter, a fifth-year senior transfer from Memphis, found his shooting touch against Omaha (11/21) as he hit 4-of-7 three-pointers in nine minutes of play as he finished with 12 points in the contest.

Carter is averaging 2.9 points a game and he is 11-of-31 from distance this season (35.5%).

RASHAD KING

The senior transfer from Northeastern has seen his minutes go up with double figure minutes in five of the last six contests.

King had his third double figure game of the season in 18 minutes against Texas A&M (1/3) with 10 points on 3-of-6 shooting, including two three pointers. He was the only player with a positive +/- for LSU in the game at +6.

King had his second double figure scoring game as a Tiger, scoring 13 points in 20 minutes against Prairie View (12/20), hitting 5-of-9 field goals, including two treys in a 13 points effort that featured three blocked and a +/- of +15.

The senior transfer from Northeastern had his first Tiger double figure game scoring 11 points with three assists in 26 minutes against DePaul (12/29).

King is averaging 14.7 minutes a game with 10 made treys. He is at 4.8 points and 2.0 boards a contest.

RON ZIPPER

The freshman from Israel played the last six minutes of the game against Texas Tech (12/7), his sixth appearance of the season, and he helped LSU's shooting percentage, making 2-of-4 from distance. That makes him 5-of-12 from three in the 32 total minutes he has played this season.

In nine games, he is averaging 2.2 points a game.

MAZI MOSLEY

LSU Coach Matt McMahon inserted Mosley into the game with 3.7 left to add to the long-range shooting opportunities for the Tigers, down three. Mosley had a good look at a three-pointer but his shot came off the rim and was no good.

Mosley, a freshman, has played in eight games this year, averaging 1.4 points a game.

ALMOST ANOTHER GAME HOLDING A TEAM UNDER 30 PERCENT

LSU just missed a fourth time holding opponents under 30 percent field goal percentage in Matt McMahon's tenure at LSU as Southern Miss (12/29) shot just 30.6 percent (19-of-62) and just 25 percent (8-of-32) in the second half.

LSU's defensive ability was on display against New Orleans (11/10) as the Tigers held UNO to just 29.9 percent from the field (20-of-67). LSU is 30-6 in the McMahon era when opponents shoot under 40 percent.

LSU GETS WITHIN SITE OF THREE-POINT RECORD AGAINST OMAHA

The Tigers for the second time this season, hit double digits from distance against Omaha (11/21) and this time they were within distance of the school mark.

The Tigers were 15-of-33 from the three-point arc, making nine in the first half and six in the second half. The 15 makes were tied for the fourth most in a single game in LSU history.

Ronald Dupree -- General Manager -- a first time position for LSU basketball ... Dupree, recently inducted to the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, was an 11-year pro and longtime NBA scout, executive with the Milwaukee Bucks ... Played at LSU (1999-03), member Sweet 16 team in 2000 and is ninth in career scoring (1,726 points) ... Scouting work contributed to 2021 Bucks NBA title.

Jalen Courtney-Williams -- Assistant Coach -- Second year on LSU staff ... Three-year letterman at LSU (2010-13); played in 61 games ... Came to LSU from Creighton where he served for three seasons, including a Sweet 16 year in 2024 ... Hosts the popular podcast "No Timeouts" on LSU+ and various podcast locations.

Tasmin Mitchell -- Assistant Coach/Director of Personnel -- In his ninth year as member of the LSU staff; second stint as Assistant Coach beginning in 2025-26 season ... One of the most popular former LSU Basketball stars; member of 2006 NCAA Final Four team ... Third all-time in scoring at LSU with 1,989 points (14.5 ppg average); sixth in rebounds (950), school record 4,692 minutes; 136 career starts ... One of three Tigers with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals.

Keith Hornsby and Marcus Thornton -- The two support staff members are also former Tiger stars. Hornsby's made three at the buzzer of the regular season finale at Arkansas in 2015 solidified the Tigers NCAA berth that year. Thornton, after two JC years, came in and helped LSU to the 2009 SEC regular season title and an

David Patrick, the Associate Head Coach, is also familiar to Tiger fans in the second year of his second stint in the program. He served as Assistant/Associate Coach from 2012-16 during the Johnny Jones head coaching tenure. **Vince Walden**, who was at Texas A&M last year, and fourth year assistant, **Casey Long**, completes the on floor coaching staff. Long, who has been with Coach McMahon for nine years at Murray State and LSU, is originally from Leesville, Louisiana

IMPORTANT WORDS

Coach Matt McMahon has had his five core value words since he arrived at LSU: hard work, unselfishness, toughness, accountability and joy.

All five of those are a vital part of this program's DNA, but this year the players as a team have picked out three words that they want to be the standard for the LSU program. Those words are on a lot of the team shooting shirts and coaching shirts the team wears. Those words are:

WHAT MAKES THIS YEAR'S TEAM DIFFERENT?

Entering SEC play, there are three factors that offer the potential for this year's team to be a different LSU team in 2025-26:

AGE, MATURITY – In 2023-24, the average age of the players was just over 19 ... In 2025-26, the average age is right around 22. In fact, as Coach McMahon said, he had never celebrated a player's 24th birthday before. The roster has four freshmen (three from high school, one from the Israeli pro league), one sophomore, three juniors, two seniors, three 5th year seniors and a grad student.

ROSTER MANAGEMENT – The Tigers put together the players that it feels will help them make the necessary strikes during this season. A larger, more physical front-court, wings that can shoot the three and a point guard that can be trusted to run the team, score the ball and distribute the basketball.

CONNECTIVITY AND CHEMISTRY – This group of players that were good at their respective schools has blended together and understood the mission. Do what is necessary to make LSU relevant again in the SEC. They've accepted that mission that they have to work together and the chemistry shown is something that coaches and attendees at practice have noticed quite quickly.

COUPLE OF NUMBER NOTES TO CONSIDER

Against Texas Tech (12/7), DJ Thomas Jr. went over the 1,000 career points with his 13 for the game and he now has 1,079 for his two years at UNLV and his 13 games at LSU.

Thomas is now 12 assists away from 400 career total.

Marquel Sutton's seven points against Texas Tech (12/7) pushed him past the 1,500 career points mark and he is now at 1,576, 24 shy of 1,600 points. He is currently on a 113-game streak as a starter, dating back to three years at Omaha and 14 games at LSU.

Rashad King needs one point for his 1,000th career point.

TIGER SIGHNEE NOW PART OF LSU TEAM

Forward November signee Marcus Vaughns from Australia is in Baton Rouge and has joined the program, having enrolled for the spring semester. He will not be expected to play during the 2025-26 season according to Coach Matt McMahon as this will serve as his redshirt season.

The 6-8 Vaughns is from Melbourne, Australia. He was part of the NBA Global Academy and took part in Basketball Without Borders during the NBA All-Star Weekend. He attended and played for the Centre of Excellence in Australia.

Vaughns, who participated in the G-League Showcase in 2024 and was named the MVP of the 2024 NIKE All-Asian camp, is the son of Brian Vaughns, who was a fifth-round pick of the Milwaukee Bucks in the 1987 NBA Draft. In the early part of the NBL1 East Men's Conference in 2025, Marcus Vaughns averaged 8.4 points, 5.4 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 1.2 steals.

The four-star recruit was ranked No. 92 in the 247sports.com recruiting rankings at the time of his signing in November.

"He'll be able to join our scout team, the one-on-one time in the gym, the five extra months he'll get to spend with (Strength and Conditioning Coach Mike) Chatman in the weight room along with just the overall acclimation to college ..." said Coach McMahon. "He's played on the international circuit, so he's been away from home, but still, I think, having this semester head start will really benefit him with his transition here to LSU. So I think there's only positives to take from it."

TIGERS BACK ON THE ROAD SATURDAY

The Tigers go back on the road Saturday for a Noon CT game at Memorial Gym at Vanderbilt. The game will be the opening Saturday game on the SEC Network and broadcast on the LSU Sports Radio Network.

LSU will be at home the following week for both games – Jan. 14 against Kentucky and Jan. 17 against Missouri.
