LEADING OFF

- The 2026 season is the 53rd season for the Carolina Softball team.
- This week in the polls the Gamecocks are ranked No. 13 by the NFCA, No. 19 by D1Softball and Softball America, and No. 22 by USA Softball/ESPN.
- This is the second time Carolina has played in the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic. In 2015 the Gamecocks went 3-2, defeating LIU Brooklyn, Stanford, and #21 Cal. They dropped games to #9 Florida State in 10 innings and Northwestern.
- As a team, South Carolina ranks among the Top-10 in the nation in four categories.
- Walks and on-base percentage (4th) and scoring and batting average (9th).
- They also rank in the Top-20 in five other categories: total runs (15), hit by pitch (17), RBIs per game (18), shutouts (18), and doubles per game (20).
- Quincee Lilio and Arianna Rodi currently rank tied for 5th in the nation with 1.33 walks per game.
- Lilio also ranks 15th in the nation in on-base percentage at .657.
- Karley Shelton went 4-for-4 against Kennesaw State, becoming the first Gamecock since Denver Bryant on May 8, 2024.
- The Gamecocks scored 18 runs against Winthrop on Feb. 8, it was the most runs in a game since also scoring 18 against UC San Diego on Feb. 17, 2024.

Ashley Woodard was named the 11th head coach on June 11, 2024.

In her first season at Carolina, Woodard took the program one win away from the World Series. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 44-17 overall record, earned the No. 8 National Seed, won the Columbia Regional, and hosted a Super Regional for the first time in program history. For her efforts, she was named the D1Softball Coach of the Year.

She returned to South Carolina after serving as head coach for the Charlotte 49ers for five seasons, where she led her teams to a 154-96 overall record (61.6 percent), a 65-32 conference mark (67.0 percent) and two NCAA post-season berths.

She is one of 38 Division I coaches who transitioned from player to coach at their alma mater. Of those players who are now coaches, Woodard is the lone representative in the SEC. Among the Power 5 schools, she is one of 13 former players to lead their alma mater.

In 2024, Charlotte had a 39-18 overall mark, a 21-6 record in the American Athletic Conference and the program's first conference tournament championship, advancing to the NCAA Regionals for the second year in a row. The 49ers reached as high as 15th in the NCAA RPI.

In 2023, she led the Niners to 35 wins and the program's first-ever outright regular season conference championship. The 49ers also earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history. Charlotte won two games at the Durham Regional and made an appearance in the regional final. The Niners had four players named First Team All-Conference USA in addition to Newcomer of the Year Award. She led them to three wins over ranked opponents, beating #10 Georgia, #11 Virginia Tech, and #23 Arizona State, with all three wins coming on the road.

In 2022, the Niners finished with a 35-23 record, and their first-ever national ranking in school history. She guided Charlotte to its biggest win in school history when they beat #6 Virginia Tech 5-2 on March 2. She was critical in the development of Bailey Vannoy, who won back-to-back C-USA Player of the Year honors and was named an NFCA Second Team All-American in 2022. Four total Niners collected All-Conference honors, while two Charlotte players threw no-hitters on the season.

She previously spent two seasons at Ole Miss, helping the team advance to the NCAA Super Regionals in 2019 with a 41-20 record, with a 2.29 team ERA. She was named the 2019 Softball America Pitching Coach of the Year. In 2018 Ole Miss advanced to the NCAA Regionals. The Rebels posted 24 shutouts over her two seasons. In 2019, the Rebels had the fifth-lowest ERA and third-most strikeouts in the SEC. Her staff included Molly Jacobsen, who earned Second Team All-SEC and Second Team NFCA All-South Region honors. In 2018, Kaitlin Lee, became the second Rebel ever selected in the NPF Draft.

She was an assistant pitching coach for one season at Michigan State, helping the Spartans to a 34-24 overall record and a run to the Big Ten Tournament semifinals and the National Invitational Softball Championships. The Michigan State pitching staff lowered its team ERA by nearly a run and a half.

In three seasons as the pitching coach for the College of Charleston, she helped the Cougars to a 99-68 record. She produced four All-Conference players and three NFCA All-Region stars in her three years.

She pitched for three seasons for the Gamecocks and finished 11th in career relief appearances for the Gamecocks. She led the team in starts, innings pitched, and ERA during her junior season. She was a three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. She served as a graduate assistant coach following her playing career. In 2012-13 she served as the pitching coach for the German National Team.

A 2011 graduate of South Carolina with a bachelor's degree in history, she earned her master's degree in secondary education from Carolina in 2012. Her husband Robert is the head baseball coach at Charlotte.

THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina has made 25 trips to the NCAA postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached three super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- The Gamecocks also made five AIAW College World Series appearances prior to the NCAA sanctioning softball as a sponsored sport in 1982.
- They have made the tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons.
- Carolina in the postseason season holds a 54-54 record all-time.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sunday in the postseason. Carolina reached the regional final four-straight years (2016-19) and again in the last three seasons (2023-25). The Gamecocks are 4-5 in those past eight Sunday games.
- Since 1982, the Gamecocks are 3-14 against host schools. On the flip side, South Carolina is 22-13 at home in the postseason.

CAROLINA HOSTING NCAA REGIONAL'S

- Last season South Carolina hosted the first NCAA Super Regional in program history at Carolina Softball Stadium. The Gamecocks fell to UCLA 2-1.
- It was the second time the Gamecocks hosted an NCAA Regional at the Carolina Softball Stadium since it was built in 2013. The Gamecocks swept the Regional, defeating Furman and then North Florida, twice.
- The Gamecocks hosted the 2018 Columbia Regional, which they won, coming back to defeat Liberty twice on Sunday.
- South Carolina previously hosted three Regional Tournaments at Beckham Field (1997-2012) 1997, 2002, and 2007.
- The Gamecocks won the 1997 and 2007 Regional's, but fell to No. 1 UCLA 1-0 in the championship game of the 2002 tournament.
- Carolina also hosted NCAA Regional tournaments in 1982, 1983, 1994, and 1995.
- The Gamecocks won the best-of-three series over Central Michigan in 1983.
- They fell to Creighton in a best-of-three series in 1982, while UCLA claimed the 1994 and 1995 (later vacated) Regionals

CAROLINA FEELS LIKE HOME FOR DAVIS

Tate Davis was raised less than an hour from Clemson, but the sophomore infielder transfer always wanted to wear garnet and black.

"I grew up in Tiger town, but I grew up a Carolina fan," said Davis, who is from Greer, S.C. and came to Columbia after one season at Ole Miss. "I can say that confidently. My parents went to law school here, and my brother played baseball for (South Carolina alumnus) Landon Powell at North Greenville University. I had a lot of connections to bring me back."

Another one of those connections was South Carolina associate head coach Katie Browder, who had recruited her to play at Ole Miss while an assistant for the Rebels.

"When I entered the portal, I wanted to come home because I knew the type of culture they had here," said Davis, who committed before she visited campus and is studying sports media. "I really do believe that the coaches care deeply about us. I just believed that this is where God wanted me to be."

"The campus and all of that didn't matter as much to me. I had a list of questions when I was entering the portal. Coach Katie was my first call about one minute after I entered portal, and before I could really ask anything, she had answered all of my questions. Everything I wanted to know, they told me. I just knew!"

Whether it's a love of Harry Potter movies or practicing her faith with many of her teammates, Davis found a lot of common ground with her new team.

"I'm a huge Harry Potter nerd," Davis said. "So, is my roommate JAM (Jamie Mackay), who transferred with me from Ole Miss. My dog is named Dobby after the house elf."

"My faith is very important to me, too. We have bible study as a team. The girls make it so you don't feel obligated to do anything. It's player-led. We just say, if you want to come to bible study, that's great. If you don't, that's fine too. Our teammates know that we love each other unconditionally, and that means that no matter who you are or what you believe in, I love you just the same. I love playing softball with you, and first and foremost we are teammates, and we're a family. There's no judgement ever passed. Everybody is just so welcoming. I've grown in my faith so much since I've been here. I thank God every day that I have the opportunity to play softball and wake up and get to live out my dreams. We have the freedom to be who we are."

Davis grew up in an athletic family, with her mother (Joy) being a four time All-American at Ohio for swimming and her father (Dodd) ran track and Furman. The youngest of four, her two older brothers played baseball, and she always wanted to be just like them.

THE GAMECOCKS

- Carolina comes into the 2026 season looking to fight back after falling to UCLA in the Columbia Super Regional.
- The Gamecocks advanced to the Super Regionals for the third time in program history and were one win away from the WCWS.
- The 2026 squad will look to build on that momentum, as they'll have just nine underclassmen (five sophomores and four freshmen).
- The Gamecocks welcome four freshmen to the program (Ansley Bennett, Kai Byars, KG Favors, Dakota Potter).
- Carolina will have five left-handed batters available in the lineup. It had four in 2025, seven in 2024, 2023 and 2022, nine in 2021, five in 2020, and seven in 2019. Of the five left-handed batters, none are listed as a slap hitter.
- Six South Carolina and five California natives help make up the Gamecock roster. They're the most from any single state.

THAT'S...INTERESTING!

- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete from the state of California for the 31st-consecutive year dating back to 1994. The Gamecocks have freshmen and California native Dakota Potter, ensuring the tradition continues for years to come.
- The Gamecocks have two players on the roster who have a twin sibling in Sage Scarmardo and Jori Heard. Sage and her identical twin sister Summer played together at Purdue. This will be Sage's first season not playing on the same team as her sister since starting softball at 4 years old. Sage will wear No. 12 this season, the number her sister used to wear. Jori's fraternal twin brother Gavin was a multi-time state champion swimmer as a senior in high school at the Illinois High School Athletes With Disabilities State Meet. He won the 200 freestyle, 50 freestyle, 100 freestyle, and 100 breaststroke.
- Quincee Lilio (43) and Julie Kelley (55) are the first players in program history to wear their respective numbers.
- Lilio is a second cousin once removed of former Gamecocks Hannah (2020-22) and Alyssa Kumiyama (2018-21). Their grandparents are cousins.
- Karley Shelton (33) wears the same number as head coach Ashley Woodard did as a player at Carolina.
- Karley Shelton is the fifth member of her immediate family to play softball or baseball in college. She joins her father and mother who both played at Charlotte, her older brother Colby played at Florida and was drafted by the Chicago White Sox last season, and older sister Kiley is at Florida Atlantic.
- Arianna Rodi doesn't just fly in her softball cleats, she can also fly on ice skates. Rodi was a dual-sport athlete in high school, winning three state championships in ice hockey as a defenseman. Her father, brother, and sister all played hockey, but Ari decided to forge her own path on the softball diamond.
- Associate head coach Katie Browder (Rietkovich) isn't the first Gamecock in her family. Browder's South Carolina roots run deep, as her father and sister have also donned the garnet and black. Her dad Ty Rietkovich played tight end for the Gamecocks from 1980-83 and worked on the football staff from 1984-86. Her sister Caroline (Rietkovich) Coleman was a cheerleader and is currently on the football staff as the coordinator of football operations.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

- It's technically the sixth time in the last seven seasons, and the third straight, they have opened the year at home, however the 2022 the tournament was cancelled due to weather.
- For the sixth straight season, South Carolina will play over 30 home games.
- Carolina will host 33 home contests, including the Gamecock Invitational, Garnet & Black Invitational, and Carolina Classic.
- Outside of tournaments they will also host a three-game series against Boston College, along with four mid-week games.
- They will play just four true non-conference road games (Clemson, Coastal Carolina, North Carolina, and Winthrop). The schedule also includes 12 road SEC games.

MACKAY ALSO CHASING BASEBALL DREAMS

Jamie Mackay recently started collecting baseball cards. Maybe someday, South Carolina softball's senior catcher/outfielder will have one of herself. Mackay has played with the United States Women's National Baseball Team as a pitcher and catcher and has aspirations of working for a Major League Baseball organization.

"I always loved baseball," said Mackay, who transferred to South Carolina after three years at Ole Miss. "My dad (Dana) played in college. I remember the very first time I picked up a bat. From then on, I was hooked. I started playing when I was 4 years old. I grew up in an environment where nobody pressured me to switch to softball. My dad never missed a game."

"I didn't even know we had a women's national team until they asked me to try out! Women's baseball is never at the forefront."

Mackay tried out for Team USA in 2019 and competed as a pitcher in the Pan Am Games in Mexico, where she was named the relief pitcher of the tournament. She had been asked back to several Team USA camps and events after that, but some of her other coaches didn't want her to miss time with her team. This past fall she was able to go back with the blessing of Gamecock head coach Ashley Chastain Woodard.

"I didn't know how she was going to feel about it because it was in the middle of our fall practice in October, and I'd be gone for a week," Mackay said. "Without missing a beat, she told me to go. That really showed me how much she cares about my interests outside of softball. I'm really happy that she allowed me to do it because the Women's Professional Baseball League is going to start this year, and I want to be in that. The people running the draft were going to be watching, so I think that helped my draft stock a little bit. I don't know what the competition level will look like, but I'm really excited about it."

"I love my country. I was very honored to be able to wear that uniform and understand the gravity behind it. Anytime I get to suit up with those three letters across my chest, I'm incredibly grateful. The meaning of it is not lost on me."

Mackay was drafted in the second round of the Women's Professional Baseball League in November by Los Angeles.

She started catching when she was ten, and she admits, initially it was because she liked the gear. She had been a pitcher prior to that.

"It was easy for me to be a good pitcher early on because girls mature faster than boys, so I was throwing harder than the guys and throwing accurately," Mackay said. "Around eighth grade, I got out there, and the guys were throwing in the eighties, and I realized I was going to have to make catching my primary position."

COMING THROUGH THE PORTAL

- The Gamecocks hit the transfer portal in the offseason, bringing in 10 players that played the 2025 season at the Division I level.
- Six of them came from rival SEC programs (Precious Bross, Georgia; Tate Davis and Jamie Mackay, Ole Miss; Alyssa Hovermale, Florida; Josey Marron, Mississippi State; and Julie Kelley, Kentucky).
- Two came from other Power 4 programs (Tori Ensley, N.C. State; Sage Scarmardo, Purdue), while two (Emma Friedel and Lexie Shaver) joined from Kennesaw State.
- Amongst the group are three seniors, four juniors, and three sophomores.
- Bross is a sophomore utility player from nearby Irmo and can play infield and outfield. She spent her first season at Georgia where she played in 32 games. She had five at-bats for the Bulldogs with nine runs scored. In high school, she earned back-to-back 4A All-State first team honors.
- Ensley started all 54 games in the outfield for the Wolfpack last season. She finished the season batting .294 with 13 doubles, which was fourth in NC State history. She also led the team with 12 stolen bases. In two seasons she has started and played in 104 games with a .283 batting average. She has 46 runs scored, 35 RBIs, 21 stolen bases, 16 doubles, and four home runs. She was named an Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar-Athlete the last two seasons and was named to the 2024 Academic All-ACC.
- Shaver played last season at KSU after two seasons at Salt Lake Community College. Last season she played in 53 games and earned 52 starts. She led the team with 25 runs score, eight stolen bases and five hit by pitches. She also tied for the team lead with four home runs. She batted .278 with 26 RBIs, 17 walks, and 13 doubles.
- Shaver and Emma Friedel were teammates at KSU, where Friedel served as the Owls No. 1 arm, leading the team in every pitching category. She finished the season with a 3.42 ERA, 1.39 WHIP, seven wins, four shutouts, and 132 strikeouts in 127 innings pitched. She threw nine complete games in 31 appearances and 17 starts. She struck out a career-high 15 batters against New Mexico State in 13 innings pitched. For her career she has a 10-21 record with a 3.47 ERA in 50 appearances and 21 starts. She has tallied 165 strikeouts over 173 1-3 innings against 110 walks. She's thrown five complete game shutouts and 10 total complete games.
- Julie Kelley made 24 appearances and 10 starts in the circle for the Wildcats as a freshman. She finished the season with a 5-5 record and a 4.83 ERA on 62 1-3 innings. She struck out 32 batters while walking 28. She threw two shutouts and three complete games. Kelley struck out a season-high five batters against No. 9 Oklahoma State.
- Alyssa Hovermale spent the last two seasons at Florida where she played in 18 games and made two starts. She has a career .263 batting average but suffered a season-ending injury two games into the 2025 season.
- Tate Davis (Ole Miss) had 11 at-bats and appeared in 15 games as a freshman infielder for the Rebels. She earned her first collegiate hit in a win over Wisconsin. She launched her first collegiate home run to drive in two runs against North Dakota State. Coming out of high school she was ranked No. 46 by Extra Inning Softball in the class of 2024.
- Josey Marron spent three seasons at Mississippi State where she made 73 appearances and 40 starts. Over 244 career innings, she has a 3.90 ERA with a 19-18 record and three saves. She has struck out 219 batters and walked 85. She's thrown 11 complete games and five shutouts.
- In three seasons at Purdue, Sage Scarmardo played in 115 games and made 98 starts, mostly at third base. She has a career .290 batting average with 53 runs, 31 RBIs, and nine doubles. Her career on-base percentage is .410.
- Jamie Mackay was a three-year starter at Ole Miss behind the plate where she appeared in the Women's College World Series last season. In three seasons, she has played in 120 games and earned 92 starts. She's a career .259 hitter with 37 RBIs, 26 runs, 16 doubles and six home runs. She's committed only five errors over her three seasons and thrown out six base stealers.



MORE ON THE COACHING STAFF

- Associate head coach Katie (Rietkovich) Browder is in her second season with the Gamecocks. She serves as the offense coordinator along with working with the infielders and is the third base coach. She has spent the last 11 years in the college coaching. She spent the 2024 season on Woodard's staff at Charlotte, while also making stops at Ole Miss (2016-18, 2021-23), Minnesota (2019-20), and Savannah State (2015). She played at Georgia from 2010-11, where she was a part of its run to a third-place finish at the 2010 Women's College World Series.
- Browder's South Carolina roots run deep, as her father and sister have also donned the garnet and black. Ty Rietkovich played tight end for the Gamecocks from 1980-83 and worked on the football staff from 1984-86. Her sister Caroline (Rietkovich) Coleman was a cheerleader and is currently on Shane Beamer's staff as the coordinator of football operations.
- Jody Davidson begins his second season at Carolina, where he works with the outfielder's and catchers, along with being the recruiting coordinator and coaches first base. Before coming to Carolina, spent five years on staff as Charlotte, three as an assistant coach and two years as a volunteer assistant coach. He primarily works with the outfielders. His coaching was key in Bailey Vannoy being named a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year and an NFCA Second Team All-American. In 2024, he guided outfielder Abigail Knight earn NFCA All-Region Third Team honors.
- Davidson is no stranger to SEC as he was the director of softball operations at Ole Miss for four years (2016-19) and a manager for two years (2014-15). At Ole Miss, Davidson oversaw all the administrative and video coordination operations for the Rebels, where he worked alongside Chastain. He was with the Rebels for a pair of NCAA Super Regionals (2017 and 2019) and their 2017 SEC Tournament Championship.
- Zack Parsons serves as the pitching coach for the second season. Prior to Carolina was on the coaching staff at Murray State for four seasons. Under Parsons, the Murray State pitching staff reached unprecedented heights. Over four seasons, his pitchers recorded the four lowest ERA's in program history. The team set multiple program records during the 2022 season, most notably a program record 1.46 ERA, which also ranked second in Division I that season. MSU also posted a program-best .194 opponent batting average, 1.22 walks per seven innings, and strikeouts per seven innings with 6.37. Parsons was instrumental in Hannah James being named the Ohio Valley Conference Pitcher of the Year in 2022. Under his coaching, James would go on to earn National Fastpitch Coaches Association First Team All-Region honors in 2023, in addition to All-Missouri Valley Conference First Team and MVC All-Tournament Team honors. She was also named to the NFCA All-Region Second Team in 2022.
- Prior to MSU, Parsons began his collegiate coaching journey at Asbury University where he was named the interim head coach for the 2019 season before having the interim tag removed for the 2020 season. Before Asbury, he was an assistant coach in 2018 at East Jessamine High School in Nicholasville, Kentucky, where he helped the Lady Jaguars finish as the 12th Region runner-up and the 46th District champions with a 28-3 record.
- Kassidy Krupit begins her second season as the director of player development and analytics. She is a former Gamecock who was on Woodard's staff at Charlotte in 2024 as a graduate assistant. She was a Gamecock from 2020-22 after transferring from Baylor. She graduated in May of 2022 Magna Cum Laude with her bachelor's degree in sport and entertainment management. She transferred to Charlotte for the 2023 season as a graduate student and earned First Team All-Conference USA and NFCA First Team All-Region honors.
- Lexi Wagner is in her first season as the director of player engagement. She spent the 2025 season as an assistant coach and working with the offense at Abilene Christian where they reached. The conference tournament for the first time in three years. She was a GA on Woodard's staff at Charlotte in 2024. She played at Oregon for three seasons before playing two seasons at Charlotte.

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- South Carolina is 285-112 (.718) at Carolina Softball Stadium since being built in 2013. That includes a 7-1 record at home while hosting an NCAA Regional and a 1-2 record hosting Super Regionals at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- Prior to 2021, South Carolina had not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more eight of the past nine seasons.
- Since 2016, South Carolina has consistently ranked among the nation's leaders in attendance. Since that time, excluding the 2021 COVID season, they have never finished lower than 15th in average or cumulative attendance.
- In 2025, Carolina ranked 15th in the nation in total attendance and 28th in average attendance. They were 7th and 14th in 2024, 9th and 11th in 2023, 7th and 13th in 2022, 7th and 11th in 2020, 10th and 13th in 2019, 11th and 13th in 2018, 10th and 11th in 2017, 12th and 15th in 2016.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 308-80 (.794) over the past nine years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Clemson, Duke, Texas Tech, Boston U, Utah, Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra, Liberty, and UCF.
- Carolina will play 28 non-conference games in 2026, 21 of which will be played at Carolina Softball Stadium.

CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 51-8 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to weather.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs 17 times. On the flip side, 17 games have ended as shutouts.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge, the Gamecocks are 101-11 in their past 112 home tournament games.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 190-418-1 (.313) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 91-153 (.373) at home, 49-191 (.204) on the road and 50-74-1 (.404) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2025 the Gamecocks were 16-14 against ranked opponents.
- In 2024, the Gamecocks went 9-20 against ranked opponents.

SOUTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL RECORD

- South Carolina has played 2,706 games in its softball history, going 1,745-955-7 (.646) in its 53 years of history.
- Carolina has posted 30 or more wins in 10 of the past 12 full seasons.
- Carolina has protected home well, also, with 17 or more victories coming in friendly confines each of the past 11 full years.

CAROLINA RUNS THIS STATE

- Since 2011 Carolina owns an 95-15 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal Carolina snapped the streak in 2017.
- South Carolina went 7-2 last season against in-state foes.

WHAT WILL THEY WEAR TODAY?

- South Carolina has worn more than 30 different uniform combinations during the past several years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Talking just jersey, pants and socks/stirrups the Gamecocks have **245** different combinations they could use this season!
- When you add in visors and belts, Carolina has **2,205** different looks at its disposal. With those two accessories thrown into the equation, South Carolina could go more than **40** seasons without wearing the exact same look!!
- South Carolina will have three student-athletes wearing the SEC graduate patch this season: Lexi Winters, Josey Marron, and Sage Scarmardo.

WHAT EXACTLY IS A 'CPA'

- You may hear a coach or player talk about having a 'CPA'.
- A 'CPA' is a *competitive plate appearance*. The more CPA's in a game, the more likely the Gamecocks are to have a chance to win.
- CPA's are tracked in the dugout for every at-bat. As a team, South Carolina strives to have 65% CPA's as a team after each game.
- Players have a goal to maintain 60% throughout the season
- There are eight ways a batter can earn a CPA:
 - Hit
 - Walk
 - HBP
 - Hard hit ball over 65mph
 - Advance runner into scoring position with less than 2 outs
 - Execute action play (like a hit and run, SAC bunt)
 - RBI
 - 7+ Pitch at-bat

STANDIN' IN THE HALL OF FAME

- The South Carolina athletics Hall of Fame features nine players or coaches from the softball program to be inducted into the Hall of Fame, which includes her former coach Joyce Compton. She is joined by players Kim Pietro, Trinity Johnson, Darlene Lowery, Megan Matthews, Tricia Popowski, Karen Sanchelli, Tiffany Tootle, and Dana Fulmer.

SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- **Trinity Johnson:** 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired in 2019).
- **Tiffany Tootle:** Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- **Dr. Megan Matthews Buning:** 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award.
- **Darleen Lowery:** was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted over 160 All-Americans, over 230 All-Conference selections, more than 30 different national honors, 10 national championships, 14 Conference Championships, eight conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 52 different times and reached the postseason 65 times (11 teams).
- The past six years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, six national championships, 13 conference championships, six conference tournament championships, finished ranked 42 times and reached the postseason 49 times.

THE BRAND

- Since 1892, the colors garnet and black have been associated with the University of South Carolina's athletics teams. Carolina has a pair of primary logos you'll see in use with the softball program (the Block C and SC Logo).
- South Carolina softball represents the brand with garnet, black and white options for jerseys, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Carolina or Gamecocks can be found across the front of each jersey with the SEC patch on the right and Under Armour logo on the left.
- Starting with the 2007 football season, Carolina partnered with Under Armour, Inc., as the official outfitter of the University's athletics department. South Carolina was previously with Russell Athletics. The 2026 season will be Carolina's final season with UA before switching to Nike on July 1.
- South Carolina is the only SEC schools wearing Under Armour apparel.


