FOR STARTERS

- Carolina hosts Queens to continue its six-game homestand on Wednesday night (Feb. 25).
- First pitch is set for 6:30 p.m.
- Wednesday's game will be streamed on SEC Network Plus with Dave Weinstein and Grayson Greiner on the call.
- Wednesday's game also will be broadcast on the Gamecock Sports Network presented by Learfield with Cade Crenshaw and Stuart Lake on the call.

SCOUTING QUEENS

- The Royals are off to a 3-4 start, winning the middle game of the series against Navy and taking a pair of games against Southern Illinois this past week.
- Bradley Brown is off to a good start for Queens, hitting .381 with four doubles and a home run. He also has scored six runs on the year.
- On the mound, Matthew Eagan is 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA in two starts.
- The Gamecocks will see Adrian Quezada on Wednesday. He has one start and five strikeouts in five innings pitched.
- Jake Hendrick is in his third season as head coach at Queens. Hendrick was at Austin Peay for a season and was the head coach at Northeastern State from 2016-22.

SERIES VS. QUEENS

- Carolina has a 3-0 all-time series record against Queens, winning each of the last three seasons.
- The Gamecocks defeated the Royals, 7-2, last year on Feb. 19 that saw a first pitch temperature of 36 degrees.
- Nathan Hall was 4-for-5 and Ethan Petry added three hits in the victory.

CRADDOCK NAMED SEC FROSH OF THE WEEK

- Freshman infielder Will Craddock was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Week on Monday, Feb. 23 after his debut in a Carolina uniform.
- Craddock went 8-for-15 with nine runs scored, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, two walks and six RBI to help lead the Gamecocks to four wins last week.
- He was a perfect 3-for-3 and reached base safely in all five of his plate appearance in the Gardner-Webb win on Wednesday.
- In the win over Navy on Saturday, he opened the first with a leadoff home run and added a two-run double. Craddock had four RBI in the game.
- Then on Sunday in the win over Air Force, Craddock once again led off the Carolina first with a home run. He also added a double in the 4-2 win.
- Craddock becomes the first Gamecock to win Freshman of the Week honors since Tyler Pitzer in 2024.

LECROY RETURNS FOR FIFTH SEASON

- Catcher Talmadge LeCroy returns for his fifth year at Carolina in 2026 after missing the second half of last season due to injury.
- LeCroy has played in 181 games in his Carolina career with 164 starts. If he plays in 24 games this season, LeCroy will become one of 17 Gamecocks to play in 200 games or more and the first to do it since Adam Mat-

thews (2009-12).

- LeCroy also is 15 walks away from cracking Carolina's top-10 list in base on balls.
- The Belton, S.C., native has 150 hits, 29 doubles, two triples, nine home runs and 94 RBI in the Garnet and Black, helping Carolina to a Super Regional berth in 2023.
- LeCroy is hitting .467 with two home runs and seven RBI this season.
- This past week, LeCroy had multi-hit games in all five Carolina contests, including going 3-for-4 in the win over Gardner-Webb.

KJ MOVING TO SHORT FOR 2026

- Sophomore KJ Scobey manned the hot corner last year, starting at third in 56 of Carolina's 57 games in 2025.
- Scobey will now move to shortstop this season, a position he played at Team USA training camp this summer and all through fall ball.
- Scobey had 34 runs scored, seven doubles, eight home runs and 27 RBI in his freshman season.
- Scobey had a walk-off double in Carolina's 3-2 win over North Florida on April 22 and had a home run to lead off the ninth in the Gamecocks' 6-5 win over No. 1 LSU on May 15.
- Scobey spent the summer of 2025 in the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team training camp in Cary, N.C. He had two hits in the Stars and Stripes exhibition on June 30.
- In the second game of the 2026 season, Scobey hit a walk-off solo home run to start the bottom of the ninth, lifting Carolina to a 6-5 win.
- Scobey is hitting .333 with two home runs and seven RBI this year.

PHILLIPS "AMP"ED AFTER SHUTOUT WIN

- Junior righthanded pitcher Amp Phillips started Carolina's first shutout of 2026, going six innings and allowing just one hit with three strikeouts in the 8-0 win over Navy.
- Phillips faced the minimum in four of his six innings and used just 79 pitches in his frames.
- Phillips has a 1.86 ERA and 10 strikeouts in 9.2 innings this season.
- It was Phillips' first win in a Gamecock uniform after transferring from USC Upstate this past season.

EVANS STARTS A DOUBLES PARADE

- Junior infielder Patrick Evans had five doubles in four games this week (Feb. 17-22) for the Gamecocks.
- He had a pair in the Gardner-Webb game, one against Army on Friday and two more in the Air Force win on Sunday.
- Evans is hitting .350 with six runs scored and four RBI this season and his .750 slugging percentage is second on the team behind Talmadge LeCroy's .767.

BE MY VALENTIN

- Junior lefthanded pitcher Alex Valentin has made three solid appearances for the Gamecocks to start the 2026 season.
- Valentin has two saves and nine strikeouts in 7.1 innings pitched, allowing just three hits and two walks and a .120 opponent's batting average.
- In the 4-2 win over Air Force, Valentin picked up the save, pitching the final three innings

and allowing just one hit with three strikeouts.

- He also earned the save in the season opener vs. Northern Kentucky, getting the final out of the game.

MILESTONE CENTRAL

- Head Coach Paul Mainieri heads into the 2026 season with the most career wins of any active head coach in Division I baseball. Mainieri has 1,539 career wins in his stops at St. Thomas, Air Force, Notre Dame and LSU.
- Talmadge LeCroy is 19 games played away from becoming the 17th Gamecock to play in 200 career games. LeCroy also needs 15 walks from breaking in the top-10 in career walks as a Gamecock.
- LeCroy needs six RBI to garner 100 runs-batted-in for his Gamecock career.

IT'S BEAU TIME

- Beau Hollins returns for his second season in Columbia after playing in 46 games with 42 starts for the Gamecocks as a freshman in 2025.
- Hollins hit .308 with 28 runs scored, nine doubles, a triple, six home runs and 24 RBI.
- All six of Hollins' home runs came in SEC games and the Lexington, S.C., native had four hits in a game three times, all conference tilts (Tennessee, March 29; Mississippi State, April 4; Auburn, May 9).
- Hollins was a stalwart defensively, committing just four errors at first base for a .989 fielding percentage.
- Hollins had two hits and an RBI in the 4-2 win over Air Force on Feb. 22.

SUTTER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- Fifth-year senior Logan Sutter was named a Preseason All-American by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA), it was announced Feb. 6.
- Sutter was named a fourth team second baseman by the writers.
- Sutter joins the Gamecocks after spending two seasons at Purdue, where he had 38 doubles, 23 home runs and 99 RBI for the Boilermakers.
- Sutter was named to the All-Big Ten second team last season, hitting .367 with 22 doubles, 15 home runs and 62 RBI.
- Sutter's first career home run at Carolina came on Feb. 18 as his two-run blast walked off Gardner-Webb in eight innings. He then went 3-for-3 in the 8-0 win over Navy on Feb. 21.

MAINIERI STARTS YEAR TWO IN COLUMBIA

- Head Coach Paul Mainieri starts his second season as the head coach of the Gamecocks.
- Mainieri is the 31st head coach in Gamecock history and is starting his 41st season as a head coach.
- Mainieri is the active leader in head coaching wins with 1,539.
- Mainieri most recently was the head coach at LSU for 15 seasons, guiding the Tigers to a national championship in 2009, a runner-up finish in 2017 and five CWS appearances.
- In 11 of 14 full seasons at LSU, Mainieri led the Tigers to at least one team championship.
- In his 41-year career, Mainieri has made six College World Series appearances (5 with LSU, 1 with Notre Dame), four SEC championships, six SEC Tournament championships and 10 NCAA Regional championships.
- Mainieri moved to sixth place on the all-time wins list for head coaches after the Winthrop win on Feb. 18, 2025, passing Larry Hays (1971-2008), who coached at Texas Tech and Lubbock Christian.
- Mainieri is a two-time SEC Coach of the Year and four-time National Coach of the Year.

A WELL ROUNDED STAFF

- Associate head coach Monte Lee returns for his fourth consecutive season and 10th overall at Carolina. Lee is the hitting coach to go along with the associate head coach title.

- Lee has helped the Gamecocks to back-to-back 100-plus home run seasons with an over .400 on-base percentage in 2023 and 2024.
- Terry Rooney will begin his second season with the Gamecocks as the pitching coach/recruiting coordinator.
- Rooney was at LSU last year as the Associate Director of Program Development. He has been Mainieri's pitching coach for two years at LSU (2007-08) and three years at Notre Dame (2004-06).
- John Hendry starts his second season as an assistant coach with Carolina. Hendry was at Virginia for three seasons as the program's Director of Player Development.
- Chris Gordon (Director of Player Development) and Caleb Westfall (Graduate Assistant) round out the staff.

TANNER, BOUKNIGHT GET THE CALL TO THE HALL

- Ray Tanner and Kip Bouknight are two of 21 standouts who will be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame on February 12, 2026, in Overland Park, Kan.
- Tanner is one of three coaches in the class to win a national championship, joining Ray Fisher (Michigan) and Clint Evans (California).
- Bouknight is one of five Golden Spikes Award winners in this year's class, joining Mike Loynd (Florida State), Phil Nevin (Cal State Fullerton), David Price (Vanderbilt) and Stephen Strasburg (San Diego State).
- Tanner was the head coach of the Gamecocks for 16 years, leading to program to back-to-back national championships in 2010 and 2011 as well as a pair of runner-up finishes in 2002 and 2012. Carolina made six College World Series appearances during his time as head coach and won three SEC Championships, an SEC Tournament title in 2004, 10 Super Regional appearances and 14 NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Bouknight is the winningest pitcher in South Carolina baseball history (45 wins) while holding school records for strikeouts (457) and decisions. Bouknight won the Golden Spikes Award in 2000 and was a consensus All-American that season.

IMPACT TRANSFERS

- Carolina brings in 18 transfers from Division I schools as well as six junior college transfers in 2026.
- Carolina's transfer class was ranked No. 3 in the country by 643 Charts, No. 4 by 64 Analytics and No. 8 by D1Baseball.com.
- Three of Carolina's transfer pitchers were ranked as top portal pickups in the country by D1Baseball.com. Amp Phillips (USC Upstate) was No. 15, while Josh Gunther (Wake Forest) was No. 25 and Alex Philpott (Florida) was No. 35.
- Logan Sutter (Purdue) had 38 doubles in his last two seasons with the Boilermakers. He was an All-Big Ten second team honoree in 2025.
- Ethan Lizama (Western Kentucky) was named the Conference USA Tournament Most Valuable Player after helping the Hilltoppers to a tournament title and an NCAA Oxford Regional berth.
- Reese Moore (Iowa) was an All-Big Ten first team selection in 2025 after his 16 doubles and 45 RBI with the Hawkeyes.
- Amp Phillips (USC Upstate) was the Big South Newcomer of the Year and an All-Big South first team honoree, helping the Spartans to a Clemson Regional appearance.

ACTIVE SEC LEADERS

- Heading into the 2026 season, several Gamecocks are among the active SEC career leaders, which includes stats from a previous non-SEC school.
- Talmadge LeCroy is fourth in the SEC in games played (181), fourth in walks (105) and tied for fifth in hit by pitch (34).
- Logan Sutter is fifth with 39 doubles, while Ethan Lizama is tied for ninth in doubles (35) and tied for fifth in triples (7).
- Josh Gunther is tied for 10th in appearances (56) and tied for ninth in saves (7), while Elijah Foster is 10th with 158 strikeouts.

- Carolina faces in-state rival Clemson in a three-game series starting Friday night (Feb. 27).
- Friday's game will take place at Founders Park with first pitch at 7 p.m. The game will be streamed on SEC Network Plus.
- Saturday's game is at Segra Park, home of the Columbia Fireflies, and will start at 3 p.m. The game will be streamed on ACC Network Extra.
- The series will conclude at Clemson on Sunday afternoon (March 1) at 3 p.m. The game will be streamed on ACC Network Extra.

PAUL MAINIERI

HEAD COACH

2ND SEASON AT SOUTH CAROLINA - 41ST SEASON AS A HEAD COACH

FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL (1980)

Paul Mainieri was named the head baseball coach at the University of South Carolina on June 11, 2024. He became the 31st head coach in the history of Gamecock baseball.

Mainieri, who is the active leader in career wins in Division I (1,539), guided LSU to a 2009 national championship and a 2017 runner-up finish. He has made six College World Series appearances, five with LSU and one with Notre Dame, four SEC championships, six SEC Tournament championships and 10 NCAA regional championships. Mainieri is a two-time SEC Coach of the Year and a four-time National Coach of the Year (2000, '08, '09 and '15).

Mainieri spent 15 seasons at LSU, guiding the Tigers to the 2009 College World Series national championship and five CWS appearances. During Mainieri's tenure, LSU captured a remarkable 31 team championships, including the 2009 NCAA title, nine NCAA Regional championships, five NCAA Super Regional championships, four Southeastern Conference championships, six SEC Tournament titles and six SEC Western Division crowns.

In 11 of his 14 full seasons at LSU – the 2020 season was canceled after only 17 games due to COVID-19 – Mainieri led the Tigers to at least one team championship.

Mainieri posts a 1,539-808-8 (.655) record in 40 seasons of collegiate coaching at St. Thomas University (1984-88), Air Force (1989-94), Notre Dame (1995-2006), LSU (2007-21) and South Carolina (2025-present). Mainieri is No. 6 in all-time NCAA Division I Baseball wins, and he is one of only five Division I coaches in NCAA history to have won over 1,500 games and a national championship.

He has guided his teams to 46 team championships – 31 at LSU and 15 at Notre Dame. As head coach at Notre Dame from 1995-2006, Mainieri directed the Irish to an NCAA Super Regional title and an NCAA Regional championship, eight regular-season conference championships and five league tournament titles.

Mainieri recorded a 669-314-3 (.680) mark at LSU and South Carolina, and he has the fourth-highest winning percentage in SEC history, trailing only former LSU coach Skip Bertman, who was 870-330-3 (.724) from 1984-2001, former Tennessee head coach Tony Vitello, who has a 341-131 (.722) record from 2018-25 and former South Carolina coach Ray Tanner, who posted a 738-316 (.700) mark from 1997-2012.

Under Mainieri, the Tigers earned an NCAA Tournament National Seed in six consecutive seasons (2012-17), making LSU and Stanford (1999-2004) the only schools in NCAA history to capture six straight National Seeds. Beginning in 2008, LSU earned nine NCAA Tournament National Seeds, the second-best mark in the country over the past 14 full seasons.

Mainieri's LSU players earned First-Team All-America recognition on 13 occasions, and 30 of his former Tigers have played Major League Baseball. LSU players were chosen in the MLB Draft on 90 occasions during Mainieri's tenure, including a first-round selection in seven of the past 13 seasons.

He served as the head coach of the United States Collegiate National Team for its 2018 summer tour, and he led Team USA to a 12-3 record that included series victories over Chinese Taipei, Japan and Cuba.

His sincere commitment to everyday excellence was recognized in a substantial way on January 3, 2014, in Dallas when he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Mainieri, a four-time National Coach of the Year, joined in the Hall of Fame his father, Demie Mainieri, who coached Miami-Dade North Community College to 1,012 wins and a national title in his 30-year career. Demie and Paul Mainieri are the only father-son combination in the ABCA Hall of Fame.

Mainieri's commitment to academic achievement was illustrated by the Tigers' performance in the classroom, as 103 LSU baseball players earned their degrees during his tenure. Twenty-five of the graduates were players who signed professional contracts before completing their college eligibility and returned to LSU to finish their degree requirements. In addition, LSU players received SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition on 151 occasions during Mainieri's tenure.

He established an active community service function within the baseball program, as the Tigers regularly visit hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area. The team also participated in events like the in the ALS Walk — promoting awareness of the treatment of Lou Gehrig's Disease — and in the Buddy Walk, which is designed to encourage acceptance and inclusion of people with Down Syndrome.

Mainieri is personally involved in several philanthropic causes, including Cancer Services of Baton Rouge, the ALS Association, the Baton Rouge Children's Advocacy Center, the Knock Knock Children's Museum, Prostate Cancer Awareness and the Kelli Leigh Richmond Ovarian Cancer Foundation.

A four-year letterwinner in college, Mainieri played one season at LSU, one season for his father – legendary JUCO coach Demie Mainieri – at Miami-Dade North Community College, and two seasons at the University of New Orleans. The second baseman helped the Privateers win two Sun Belt Conference titles and advance to the 1979 NCAA Tournament during his senior season.

After completing his undergraduate degree requirements at Florida International (1980), Mainieri played two minor-league seasons before earning a master's in sports administration from St. Thomas in 1982.

Mainieri's coaching career began at his alma mater, Columbus High School in Miami, where he served as assistant baseball and football coach for three years before taking over as the head coach at St. Thomas in the fall of 1982. He also spent the final three years at St. Thomas as director of athletics. Mainieri was inducted into the Columbus High School Sports Hall of Fame in October 2009. He is a member of the St. Thomas Athletics Hall of Fame, and the St. Thomas baseball facility in March 2013 was named Paul Demie Mainieri Field in his honor.

Born August 29, 1957, in Morgantown, W.Va., Mainieri and his wife, Karen, have four children – Nicholas, Alexandra, Samantha and Thomas – and five grandchildren – Holden, Jonathan, Wren, Rocco and Anthony.
