SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

UNCG went 17-12 overall last season with a 9-7 conference record. The Spartans made it to the second round of the 2025 Southern Conference (SoCon) tournament after defeating Chattanooga 3-1, ultimately falling 3-1 to No. 1 seed ETSU. In the 2026 SoCon Preseason Coaches' Poll, UNCG was selected to finish fourth. UNCG returns its top kill leader Allie Sweet, who accumulated 501 last season, averaging 4.43 per set. Sweet was named SoCon Offensive Player of the Week twice and concluded the 2025 season with a selection to the All-SoCon First Team. She was named to the SoCon Preseason All-Conference Team heading into this season. The Spartans also return their top setter from last season, Gabby Seeds, who passed out a total of 969 assists, averaging 9.69 per set. Seeds earned three SoCon Setter of the Week accolades and reached a career-best 60 assists against The Citadel.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

Northeastern went 9-16 overall and 5-11 in conference last season. The Huskies did not qualify for the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) Championship, ending their season with a 3-1 loss to Hofstra. The team returns top kill leader Emma Rowell, who tallied 278 kills last season. Sofia King, the team's assist leader (442) last season, returns as well. On the defensive side, the team lost its top libero Nadia Koanui who notched 421 digs last season, but return Beatrice Gennari who reached a team-leading 97 blocks last season. Two players earned CAA preseason honors with Rowell being named to the Preseason All-CAA Team and Gennari earning an honorable mention recognition.

WELCOME HOME

Head coach Sarah Rumely Noble returns for her second season alongside Connor Zimmick who was promoted to associate head coach over the summer, Chanelle Hargreaves who added recruiting coordinator to her assistant coach title and assistant coach Christian Rupert who rounds out this year's staff. The 2026 squad is made up of five transfers, eight returners and five freshmen. The Gamecocks are coming off of a 10-16 record for the 2025 season which included two upsets of No. 25 teams.

RETURNERS

The 2026 returners include Sydney Davis (redshirt freshman middle blocker), Sydney Floyd (senior setter), Ava Leahy (senior middle blocker), Anne Bradley Bing (sophomore libero), Claire Payne (sophomore middle blocker), Elise Marchal (junior right side), Kaia Pixler (sophomore setter) and Elizabeth McElveen (senior libero).

FROM THE PORTAL

The new Gamecocks picked from the transfer portal for the 2026 season include Ceci Vance (sophomore outside hitter from Arizona State), Ally Cavanaugh (redshirt junior right side from USF), Lilly Gillespie (junior libero from Cincinnati), Kiana Dinn (redshirt sophomore from Pittsburgh) and Olivia Borgman (sophomore outside hitter from Georgia).

ROOKIE ROLE CALL

Wrapping up the introductions with the true freshman:

- **Maggie Penn** (Libero - Creedmoor, North Carolina) played club volleyball for NC Academy. A standout prep player, she won the 2025 North Carolina High School 1A State Championship after leading her team to a runner-up finish in 2023. A three-time All-Conference selection, she was named the 2025 Conference Defensive Player of the Year and earned All-Region honors. Penn was also selected to the 2025 North Carolina High School Senior All-Star Game and received multiple club accolades, including Prep Volleyball Triple Crown 17 Open All-Tournament Team honors and recognition on the JVA Watchlist.
- **Madisyn Crnjac** (Outside Hitter - Mesa, Arizona) played club volleyball for Arizona Storm. A two-time Arizona High School First Team All-State and First Team All-Region selection, she was named the 2024 Arizona High School Region Player of the Year. She earned Arizona High School All-Academic Team honors and was ranked as Prep Dig's No. 1 outside hitter in Arizona for the Class of 2026. At the club level, she was a two-time Prep Volleyball All-American, helped Arizona Storm capture three Arizona Club Region titles, and earned USA Volleyball GJNC 16 Open All-Tournament Team honors after a third-place finish in 2023.
- **Ella Grivna** (Middle Blocker - Louisville, Kentucky) played club volleyball for KIVA. She earned First Team All-State honors in 2025 after being named the Kentucky High

School Region 7 Player of the Year and the Courier Journal Louisville Preseason Player of the Year. A three-time All-District selection, she also collected All-Region honors in 2024 and was an All-State Honorable Mention that season. Grivna helped lead her team to the 2025 JCIVT Championship and the 2024 District 28 title while earning multiple Courier Journal Louisville Player of the Week honors.

- **Norunn Westersjo** (Outside Hitter - Norway) played club volleyball for KFUM Stavanger and attended ToppVolley Norge. She is a three-time Norwegian Championship medalist, earning bronze in 2024 and 2025 before claiming silver in 2026.
- **Jill Bohannon** (Setter - Louisville, Kentucky) played club volleyball for KIVA. A three-time Kentucky High School State Champion and three-time Region Champion, she earned First Team All-State and All-State Tournament Team honors in 2025 while being named the State Tournament MVP. She was also recognized as the 2025 Metro Area Volleyball Fall Athlete of the Year, earned MaxPreps All-America honors, was named to the JVA Girls' All-National Team and JVA Watchlist, and surpassed 1,000 career assists.

MIDDLE PRESENCE

The Gamecocks have a mix of new and returning faces at the net for the 2026 middles. Ava Leahy returns for her senior year after contributing heavily to the offense last year - averaging .72 blocks per set which ranked second highest on the team. She led the team in blocks at seven matches, tying her career high of 9 against Georgia. In total she notched 126 kills and 69 blocks across the 96 sets she played. Additionally, Leahy started in every match.

Sydney Davis and Ella Grivna will be the newcomers - Davis, who redshirted her freshman year due to injury will compete in her first collegiate season along with true freshman Grivna. Davis had a strong high school/club career where she set a school record for blocks during the 2021 season, hit .474 with 211 kills her senior season and helped her team finish second at the 2021 AAU Nationals. Grivna, along with her high school/club experience mentioned earlier, stands at 6'6 as the tallest player on this year's squad, bringing some valuable height at the net. Both Gamecocks had prominent roles in the preseason exhibition matches and are eager to contribute this season.

RIGHT-SIDE PRESSURE

A wealth of experience makes up this year's right sides, who consist of Elise Marchal and Ally Cavanaugh. Marchal, who was named 2024 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year at her previous school App State, emerged as one of the top hitters last year, contributing significantly in a few areas. Marchal recorded 10 or more kills at five different matches, reached a career high hitting percentage (.409) and led the team offensively to a top-25 win against Florida, and totaled 131 kills over 87 sets

played. She added some assistance to the defensive side, earning at least one dig for all but two matches and reaching her season high of six against Ole Miss.

Ally Cavanaugh spent her past two seasons at USF where she had a breakout first year, tallying 270 kills and 296 points for the Bulls after playing in all 29 matches. Cavanaugh set career highs in hitting percentage (.588 against Georgia) and kills (19 against Ohio State) and had 11 additional matches where she notched 10 or more kills. She faced the Gamecocks once before transferring, earning 12 kills with a .478 hitting percentage last season in Tampa.

THE OUTSIDE REBOOT

The Gamecocks' outsides went through a complete makeover this season as the group is entirely made up of newcomers. Two transfers, Ceci Vance and Olivia Borgman, make up the non-freshmen of the crew. Vance comes from Arizona State where she played in two matches for her freshman season. During the preseason exhibition matches, she made some noise as the top kill leader on her team for the Garnet & Black intrasquad.

Borgman comes from SEC foe Georgia where she appeared in 12 matches and 23 sets for her freshman debut. The South Carolina native concluded her first season with a total of 40 kills, 34 digs and 10 blocks, reaching a collegiate career high of 8 kills and a .500 hitting percentage against Alabama State. Borgman arrived to Columbia this past spring and was able to train in Rumely Noble's system.

The remaining two outside hitters for the Gamecocks are freshman, Madi Crnjac and Norunn Westersjo.

DIGGING DEEP

The 2026 liberos are a mix of fresh faces and veterans. Elizabeth McElveen returns for her senior year after recording a season high nine digs and career high four aces last year. Anne Bradley Bing enters her sophomore year after appearing in six matches for her freshman season.

The Gamecocks will look to lean on Cincinnati transfer Lilly Gillespie who played in 192 sets during her time with the Bearcats, dishing out 537 digs across two seasons. She played in 28 matches both years and reached a collegiate career high 32 digs against Kansas during her sophomore campaign. Gillespie was the starting libero all of last season for the Bearcats and looks to make an impact during her first season as a Gamecock.

Freshman Maggie Penn rounds out this year's liberos, making a few appearances during the preseason exhibitions.

SETTING UP SUCCESS

Like the liberos, the 2026 setters are also a mix of Gamecock

veterans and newcomers. Sydney Floyd enters her senior year, coming off a solid junior season where she put up season highs in assists (22), aces (3) and digs (9). Kaia Pixler returns for her sophomore year after a strong collegiate debut where she had a couple breakout performances. Pixler led the team in assists against Georgia with a career high 23 and passed out 20 or more in four additional matches.

Kiana Dinn comes from Pitt, where she took a medical redshirt her freshman year before returning the following season to play in five matches. She recorded her first collegiate career dig and ace against Ohio and first assist against Duke. Freshman Jill Bohannon rounds out this year's setter crew. All four Gamecocks made positive contributions to the team during the preseason exhibitions.

THE CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS

The SEC Volleyball Championship returned last fall for the first time since 2005, ending a 20-year hiatus and marking the addition of a championship event in every sport in the conference. The event was previously held from 1979–2005 at both campus sites and neutral locations. Past champions include Florida (12 titles), Kentucky (5), LSU and Tennessee (4 each), and Arkansas and Georgia (1 each). Kentucky won the 2025 SEC Championship, defeating Texas 3-2 in a reverse sweep. The 2026 championship will again be hosted at Enmarket Arena in Savannah, Ga., November 20–24.

STATUS QUO IN THE CLASSROOM

The program extended its streak to 17 consecutive seasons earning the AVCA Team Academic Award, announced July 23, after posting team GPAs above 3.50 in both the fall and spring semesters. Only 14 of the 353 Division I programs hold a longer streak.

AROUND THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

Kentucky, the defending SEC and SEC Tournament Champion, was selected as the preseason favorite for the 2026 SEC volleyball season, according to the SEC Preseason Coaches' Poll.

The Wildcats received nine of the 16 first-place votes and 218 total points to capture the top spot in the preseason poll. Texas obtained six first-place votes and 216 points to earn second place in the poll, and Texas A&M, the defending National Champion, secured one first-place vote and 191 points to place third.

Florida took fourth place with 187 points, and Tennessee placed fifth with 166 points. Georgia took sixth place with 144 points, while Auburn received 142 points to finish in seventh place. LSU came in at eighth place with 116 points, followed by Missouri (111), Oklahoma and Vanderbilt (95), Ole Miss (67), Mississippi State (65), South Carolina (45), Alabama (37) and Arkansas (25) to round out the poll.

SARAH RUMELY NOBLE | HEAD COACH

- Won 50 games in three seasons as head coach at App State; the program had won just 21 games total the three seasons prior.
- Was a four-time All-SEC setter and two-time AVCA All-American at Kentucky from 2006-09.
- Won SEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006 and SEC Player of the Year honors in 2008 as a Wildcat.
- Worked in the SEC as an assistant coach for seven years, spending five seasons at LSU and two at Arkansas
- Helped LSU bring in three nationally ranked classes in 2019 (13th), 2020 (22nd) and 2022 (17th), including nine top-100 players.

Sarah Rumely Noble, a former SEC Player of the Year and all-American, was named the University of South Carolina's 12th head volleyball coach on March 31. Rumely Noble comes to Columbia after three seasons as head coach of Appalachian State volleyball and previously spent seven seasons as an assistant coach in the SEC following a hall of fame playing career at Kentucky.

The Mountaineers went from averaging seven wins per season in the three years prior to her arrival, to averaging 17 wins over her first three seasons at the helm. In her first year in Boone, Rumely Noble led the Mountaineers to an 18-10 record, highlighted by a season-ending stretch of 11 wins in the final 12 matches. In the most recent fall campaign, App State went 18-10 and earned a spot in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship (NIVC), with four individuals making all-conference.

Rumely Noble joined the Mountaineers from LSU, where she worked as an assistant for five seasons, including as the Tigers' associate head coach in 2021. Serving as LSU's recruiting coordinator, Rumely Noble helped the Tigers bring in three nationally ranked classes in 2019 (13th), 2020 (22nd) and 2022 (17th). In her last four recruiting classes at LSU, Rumely Noble helped sign nine top-100 players, including the top-ranked player from South Carolina in the 2023 freshman class.

Over five seasons on the court, the Tigers posted 67 victories with a berth in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, while she helped implement a faster offensive system and worked primarily with the setters, her position group earned SEC Setter of the Week six times, and two made the SEC All-Freshman Team. Prior to LSU, Rumely Noble spent two seasons at Arkansas, where she ran the defense in 2016 and directed the offense in 2015. She also coached at Wake Forest from 2013-15, recruiting three players that earned All-ACC honors and working primarily with the team's setters. She began coaching at North Texas for two seasons (2010-11) where she helped the team to 43 wins.

Rumely Noble was a four-time All-SEC setter and two-time AVCA All-American at Kentucky from 2006-09, where she earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors in 2006 and SEC Player of the Year honors in 2008. She also was named a third-team Academic All-American in 2009, after making the honorable mention team in 2008. She led the Wildcats to four NCAA Tournament appearances and is still the program's all-time leader in both career and single season assists and service aces. She was inducted into the Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017, was named an SEC Women's Legend in 2019, and made the school's "Title IX Top 50" team, honoring the 50 greatest Wildcat women's athletes of the Title IX era, in 2022.

She graduated from Kentucky in the spring of 2010 with a degree in education-kinesiology. Following graduation, she played overseas in the top professional division in France, Ligue A, where she was the starting setter for Nantes Volley Feminin from 2010-11.

We are thrilled to welcome Sarah to South Carolina. She is a rising star in the coaching circles and is a great fit for us as her values are aligned with ours here at the University. Having been a player and assistant coach in the SEC, she knows what it takes to be successful in our league. She will be a great leader for our volleyball student-athletes and we look forward to her taking our program to greater heights.

- Zimmick worked under Sarah Rumely Noble since the 2022 season with Appalachian State. Zimmick oversaw the middles and will continue in the same capacity at South Carolina along with primary scouting duties.
- Most recently, he helped guide App State to its first Sun Belt divisional title and a berth in the NIVC Tournament in 2024. The Mountaineers finished with an 18-10 overall mark, reaching 50 wins for the three seasons under Rumely Noble.
- Through Zimmick's work with the team's middles, junior Maya Winterhoff became the seventh Mountaineer in program history to earn AVCA All-Region honors as well as a spot on First Team All-Sun Belt Conference in 2024.
- The Mountaineers as a team recorded the three highest blocking totals over the program's last decade in Zimmick's three seasons.
- Zimmick joined App State after two seasons as an assistant coach for Butler. His first coaching position out of school came as a graduate assistant at Kentucky for the 2018 and 2019 seasons, seeing the Wildcats advance to the NCAA Regional Semifinals both years.
- Zimmick graduated from Wisconsin in 2018.



CHANELLE HARGREAVES | ASSISTANT COACH

- Hargreaves worked under Rumely Noble since the 2022 season with Appalachian State and will work with the team's defensive specialists and liberos.
- Hargreaves is no stranger to the Carolina Volleyball Center. She spent her collegiate career at Florida from 2016-19, an era where the Gators collected three SEC titles and made the national title match in 2017.
- The Mountaineers' defensive specialists/libero units averaged over 14 digs per set in each of her three seasons on staff, while also helping improve the defense's serve receiving numbers. The passing quality carried over to the App State offense, which posted two of its highest team hitting percentage totals over the last 10 seasons.
- She earned her degree in sociology from Florida in May 2020 and received her Master's degree in sports management from Florida in May 2022.
- While working towards her postgraduate degree, she worked with the Florida football program in recruiting and student-athlete development.
