Goodfellows registered families Nov. 14-18. Approved families receive vouchers for clothing. Parents will redeem the vouchers at Meijer from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Dec. 4-8. Recipients are assigned a specific day to shop with the number of shoppers each session based on the

total number approved for assistance. Last year, about 60 families shopped each night.

CK Goodfellows normally worked in teams of two. The teams bag recipient clothes or use hand-held scanners and calculators to total dollar amounts before applicants go through Meijer's cash register lines.

Goodfellows total purchases at the request of recipients. Goodfellows wants recipients to use all the money available on the voucher. Once recipients go through the cash register lanes, they are not allowed to receive the voucher back even if they have not used all the allowable money.

Goodfellows has contributed thousands of dollars to Club Kokomo's Coyote Kids program, and for sev-

eral years CK members have returned the favor by becoming Goodfellows and assisting the all-volunteer group in bringing smiles to needy children's faces during the Christmas season.

Goodfellows also receives individual and corporate donations. Money from these sources not spent on the Christmas program is used for scholarships and other youth programs. As it has for several years, Goodfellows donated \$2,500 to Club Kokomo's Coyote Kids this year.

At 106 years old, Goodfellows is the oldest Christmas gift program in Howard County. It was started by Kokomo Tribune employees in 1911. The program now is a notfor-profit organization that is directed by a community-based volunteer board of directors. UAW 1166 members manage the Goodfellows' Christmas program.

CKRR CONSTITUTION—VOLUNTEER DISCUSSION - AT DEC MEETING

Below is what the CK Constitution currently says:

- 7. Volunteers at Club Kokomo races.
- (1) Club Kokomo members shall receive 20 points in lieu of running the race, no points for fun runs.
- (2) Can receive the 20 points only once during the point year.
- (3) The "volunteer race" shall count towards the number of races needed for the point awards. However a volunteer race is not required for point awards or any award given by Club Kokomo.
- (4) The race director must submit a list of his volunteers immediately after the race to the editor.
- (5) This amendment is retroactive to December 1, 1997.

Proposed the following:

- 7. Volunteers at Club Kokomo organized and owned races
- (1) Club Kokomo members shall receive points instead of running the race (i.e. A member cannot receive volunteer points and participating points at the same race; if a member participates in the race, they will not receive volunteer points.)
 - (a) The race director of a Club Kokomo organized and owned race shall receive 30 points.
 - (b) Other volunteers at the Club Kokomo organized and owned race shall receive 20 points.
- (c) No points shall be given for fun runs or kids track meets such as the Club Kokomo/Haynes-Apperson Kids Track meet and the Club Kokomo Coyote Kids running program.
- (2) Club Kokomo members can receive volunteer points twice in a points year.
- (3) The "volunteer race" shall count towards the number of races needed for the point awards. However a volunteer race is not required for point awards or any award given by Club Kokomo.
- (4) The race director must submit a list of his volunteers immediately after the race to the editor. Drop part 5
- (5) This amendment is retroactive to December 1, 1997.

Attached is the December update. Please know how grateful we are for your prayers and your support of the work in Liberia. It will continue no worries about that. We would have never wanted this part of the journey, no one wants the refining fire but through these trials and tribulations we grow. "We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters loved by God, that he has chosen you, because His gospel came to you not simply with words but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction." 1 Thessalonians 1:3-5.

We serve an amazing God and in Him we find our courage and strength, we have learned as difficult as it is, to let go and just be held by the Father. We cannot praise the Lord enough for the good health and condition that Travis's body is in, in spite of this strange and seemly hidden infection.
