### Minutes of CQG November 13,2018, Monthly General Meeting

Meeting called to order by President Nancy Snow.

Minutes from the October meeting accepted as posted.

Secretary: Unable to attend meeting. Betsy Lawrence volunteered to record the meeting minutes. Treasurer: Wendy Bookhultz reported opening balance as \$12,659.02, incoming funds at \$62.00, outgoing funds at \$382.65 and closing balance as \$12,338.77.

Vice President: Kathy Miller reported 53 members present and 2 guests. Door prize won by Karen Stiles. Community Service Chairperson: Susan Truby stated that the next community service days will be February 23 when the guild will make walker bags and June 15 will be a workday for children's quilts. Community service will be accepting 5" squares and fabrics for borders and sashing for the children's quilt project.

Sunshine and Shadows: Jane Merkel reported that cards were sent to Margo Blitz, Meg Ferry, MaryAnn Dutkin and Boots Horwath. Jane presented the November birthday card.

Library: Kathy Lopez: Winner of the 50/50 library drawing was Richele Voice. Amount was \$16.50 and \$16.50 went into the guild treasury. Kim Diehl's "Simple Whatnots: A Batch of Satisfying Scrappy Little Quilts" book was placed in the guild library in memory of Tedde Anderson. # **TEA TIME PLACEMATS (OR WALL HANGING)**

Advanced Paper-Piecing By Carol Sue Moll



Date: Saturday, January 12, 2019, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
(In the event of cancellation due to bad weather, the program will be rescheduled as soon as weather permits)
Location: Holy Cross Evangelical Lutheran Church, 2700 Jacksonville Road, Bethlehem, PA
Cost: Class instruction - \$25; pattern - \$22, plus fabric. Pattern MUST BE ORDERED in advance. Pay Carol or purchase your own.

Supply List:

- Pattern: Tea Time Placemats by Judy Niemeyer
- Fabric requirements: See back of pattern package. MARK YOUR FABRIC WHEN YOU BUY IT AS TO WHICH SECTION IT'S FOR C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, C-5 on back of pattern

Equipment List (Supply list in pattern suggests a few items that I find unnecessary, such as 18" Add-A-Quarter Ruler and Purple Thang, etc. I recommend those below):

- Sewing machine (check your instruction manual before class if you're not sure how to change your stitch length we'll use a shorter than usual length)
- Rotary cutter, small and large cutting mat, 6" x 24" ruler
- 12" Add-a-Quarter Ruler
- Straight edge 3"x 12" made of template plastic or postcard weight paper
- Box of small paper clips and three 1-gallon Ziplock bags
- Glue pen/stick (I prefer this rather than Roxanne's Basting Glue)
- Seam roller or small iron
- Sewing thread to coordinate with your fabric.
- Paper scissors, pins, seam ripper, etc. that you normally use when sewing

PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF YOUR CLASSMATES - BE FAMILIAR WITH YOUR SEWING MACHINE AND BE ON TIME SO YOU ARE PREPARED TO START THE PROJECT WHEN CLASS BEGINS!
