On March 16 will be the “Invisible Appliqué Workshop” - we hope you’ll consider joining us. To date, 5 members are signed up; maximum 14. \$45 per person. During the March 12 meeting, prior to Sue’s presentation, the Program Committee will take a few moments to update you regarding plans for April’s meeting: “All Mixed Up Squares.” Also we’ll have sign up sheets for both Sue’s and Karen Eckmeier’s June 12 Workshop, “Happy Villages.”

**WORKSHOP  
MARCH 16**

This 6-hour class will teach you a method of machine applique that is quick and truly invisible: no raw edges, no need for tiresome and challenging satin stitching. Students will learn to create an appliquéd piece on the sewing machine that emulates fine hand appliqué.

The first part of the session will cover fabric selection and preparation of the pieces; the second will cover the application of the pieces by machine. Personal tips will be shared with lots of individual attention. Your project can become an instant heirloom wall hanging or can be used as a pillow cover.

The class covers accurate straight-line applique, soft curves and circles, as well as inside corners and outside points.

The technique is not difficult, but patience and attention to detail are required.

It's fun to see the "ta-da" look as the pattern takes on its own life in each student's particular choice of fabrics.





Explore the freedom of fabric collage! No seams to piece or match, no lines to trace....just free form cutting of step and window shapes. Step by step your little village will magically come to life. A layer of tulle and machine stitching will complete your fabric collage project. Finished size: 16½" square.

### Fabric – BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!!

Cut a 6½" square and a 6½" x 2" rectangle from each of the ten colors

- 10 Colors\*\*\* (look for 'textures' or 'solid-like'/ NO large scale prints)
 


1. Dark Purple	6. Red
2. Lavender	7. Yellow
3. Dark Blue	8. Orange
4. Medium Blue	9. Deep Pink
5. Light Blue	10. Medium Green

\*\*\*OR TEN COLORS THAT YOU LOVE, AS LONG AS THERE IS A RANGE OF VALUES. STRIPES AND "SHINGLE" PRINT FABRICS ARE GREAT FOR ROOFTOPS

*PLEASE BRING EXTRA FABRICS TO INCLUDE OPTIONAL SKY, TREES, WATER, ETC... (fabric requirements for a Seaside Village, a Fairytale Village, a Halloween Village, etc... are in the book "Happy Villages")*

### Supplies

- Sewing Machine OPTIONAL for 6 hour workshop (for LATE afternoon with walking foot and/or free-motion foot and thread) If you want to work slowly leave your machine at home. If on the other hand you work quickly bring your machine to quilt your piece during the last 1-2 hours of class.) (Sewing Machine NOT NEEDED for the 3 hour workshop)
- Rotary Cutter and mat
- Rotary Cutter with wave/pinking/scallop blades (optional: but you'll love playing with these!)
- Ruler (6½" x 24" or long ruler to square piece)
- Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It™ or fabric/tacky glue with applicator tip
- Large and small fabric scissors
- Long Pins for basting (bring basting thread and needle if you will be finishing by hand)
- 16½" x 16½" square of 100% Cotton Batting (**BRING PRE-CUT TO WORKSHOP!!!!**)
- Tweezers with a long handle
- Marking pencil or chalk
- ½ yard tulle (bring a couple different colors to 'audition'...black works surprisingly well!)
- ½ yard Backing Fabric OR 20" x 20" Black Felt
- 2 yards Multi-color Yarn (optional)
- *Happy Villages: Expanded & Updated Edition* - \$22 (highly recommended – but not required)
