

2012 We went to 10 snack providers per month (up from 8).

A donation of \$354.00 was collected from Guild members along with an orchid quilt which was made by Anna Mae Temos and given to our custodian Jim Steiner and his wife, who had a house fire.

November – two new irons, ironing board covers and two big boards were purchased.

You are now to sew your own label on your Oncology Quilts - "Made and Donated by Colonial Quilters Guild" and the year it was made. You may also attach your own label to the Hospice and Wounded Soldiers quilts, using your name if desired.

A new item to make for community service is a cat – making 4, just like we do with the teddy bears. Betsy Lawrence and Cathy Kemmerer volunteered to co-chair the 2014 Quilt Show.

We now have a storage unit at Budget Rental on Industrial Drive in Bethlehem. The unit is clean and secure and will be used to store any items that are guild property, which will be organized and a list compiled as to what is in the storage unit.

June 11th was our 30th year anniversary. We had 106 guild members present. We celebrated at Green Pond Country Club, Bethlehem, PA, Starting at 6:30pm we had family-style dinner – fruit cup, tossed salad, roast turkey, beef tips, corn, broccoli-cauliflower-carrot mix, whipped potatoes, ice cream parfaits, coffee, tea & cold beverage. During our meal we had a nice slide presentation of past members and events, presented by Ellen Inghrim and Debbie Kriebel.

2013 The name of our Quilt Show (12th show) for 2014 will be called Quiltfest 2014 and will be held on May 3rd (10am-5pm) & on May 4th (10-4) at the Chrin Center in Easton, Pa. The charity that will benefit from our show will be the Children's Hospital of Lehigh Valley Hospital. The theme of the show is Civil War Quilts.

Nov. 19: a Community Service Sewing Day was held where 25 members attended and completed 101 Mastectomy Bags and Pillows! The bags were taken to Lehigh Valley Hospital.

2014 - At the March meeting, a member asked about getting a certificate for a tax-deductible donation to our show. Our non-profit status as a 401 (c) 4 does not permit tax-deductible donations. We are organized principally as a social organization with charitable efforts as a secondary function. A group organized as principally for charitable endeavors a 501 (c) 3 may accept tax deductible donations.

Sunshine and Shadows: The purpose of Sunshine and Shadows for our guild is to share with members in a compassionate or congratulatory manner when life hands us challenges or accolades. 
