WORKSHOP POLICY - adopted by the Board on 2/5/2018

Workshops will be outlined in the CQG newsletter, including the copy on the website, and on the CQG Facebook page.

Workshop space will be reserved on a first-come, first served basis with payment.

The workshop will be opened to the public 6 weeks prior to the date. It will be announced on MyGrove.

The fee for each workshop will be calculated thus: the requested fee will be divided by 15 potential participants. Therefore, the workshop fee may be different for each workshop.

If the workshop does not have 15 people signed up and paid by 3 weeks prior to the date, it will may be canceled.

Maximum number of workshop participants is usually 20, set by the presenter. If there is still available space after the number of participants reaches 15, walk-ins are welcome.

The workshop fee does not include pattern, rulers, or any other supplies needed unless specified. When a workshop is held, paying participants' checks (or cash) will be put in a container and one person's payment will be drawn out of the container. That person will receive back her check/cash.

In this playful workshop, you'll create artful weavings of fabric strips and ribbons, audition sequences and arrange blocks in a row to make a Skinny quilt/table runner, wall hanging, album cover, pillow top, or project of any size. Along the way, Eleanor will help you develop a sense of design and composition, value and color, movement and shape, balance and rhythm to kick your artistry up several notches. She will also share lots of materials and tips on quick and easy ways to sandwich, quilt, and finish the edges of your tapestry after you get home.

Class Supply List:



First, choose a color palette for your creation to match the décor where it will go. Make sure you have similar and complementary colors in light, medium, and dark values.

*2 yards of any old fabric for a portable work surface (this could become your backing)
 *1 yard of paper-backed, heavy-duty fusible web, 17" wide (I recommend heavy-duty Wonder-Under)
 *Scraps and/or fat eighths of fabrics in your chosen colors—at least 6 different ones
 *12" lengths of ribbons, lace, rickrack, and/or braided trims in colors to match and contrast; satin ribbons

are great for shine, while metallics such as gold and silver are great for zing!

(*Optional, which you'll need at home: thin batting or flannel for a filler)

Tools: *Basic rotary cutting supplies, *Pins and pin cushion, *Fabric-cutting scissors *Teflon presser sheet if possible

In order to encourage more participation in the FQ exchange, we are providing you with a list of the monthly themes of the year so that you can plan ahead when you go fabric shopping! March - greens, Irish prints Apr - polka dots, stripes May- flowers June - banquet - *no FQ exchange*

NEW PROJECT - monthly "stashing for charity"

"Charm Squares/5" squares" project: each month, bring in at least a dozen 5" squares. These can be cut from the stash you want to use up; however, we are particularly interested in fussy-cut children's fabrics or solids that will coordinate. Blocks will be used at a charity sewing day in June to make preemie & children's cancer quilts. We need backings donated, too, although these can be taken home to finish off a quilt.

QUILT SHOW NEWS FROM LILLIAN BEHRENS

**DISPLAYS - as in past shows, we are looking for items to enhance the quilt displays. Some of the items we have used in past shows include small tables, quilt racks, wooden ironing boards, old irons, old sewing machines, sewing related items, teddy bears, cradles, baskets, benches, plant stands, etc.. Please look around your home to see what you may have that will add interest to our show. Kathy Lopez is in charge of displays and has suggested that you may have an accessory item that would compliment the quilt you have entered in the show. That item would be displayed by your quilt.

**Kathy will be taking geranium orders starting at the March meeting. The geraniums will be ready for you to pick up at the end of the show.

**BOUTIQUE - The boutique will accept any new handmade craft item, quilt tops, finished quilts, antique quilts, quilt blocks, table runners, place mats, etc. Since we do not want to compete with our vendors, the boutique will not accept patterns, fabric or other quilting supplies. You will price your own items and the guild will receive a 10% commission. The



boutique will be happy to receive donations of acceptable items. / The guild will keep the proceeds of <u>donated</u> items. Any donated items that do not sell will be returned to you. Please see Mary Misiura at the March meeting to pick up your inventory consignment form and tags. Partial proceeds from the boutique will benefit our charity, Meals on Wheels.

QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE : Reuse, Recycle and Repurpose = Reborn From Susan Truby: a reminder of the rules for the challenge item for quiltfest:

- The quilt can be any size; also ALLOWED are quilted items not just quilts clothing, purses
 The front of the quilt must have at least 50% recycled fabric; any type of fiber from silk, brocade, satin and cotton just to name a few can be used, including polyester!
- 3. You can embellish any way you like: buttons, beads, embroidery.
- Write a brief description of the Reused, Recycled and Repurposed Fabrics used, where you obtained them and why you used them.

FOUNDING MEMBERS by Sue Nelson

Since the Colonial Quilters Guild is celebrating 35 years of fellowship and quilting, the quild has been highlighting a founding member in the newsletter each month. There is no member for this month.

PIECES OF THE PAST - THE COLONIAL QUILTERS GUILD by Bev Repsher, Historian

2002-2003 No record of what was done during this year. I guess they were getting ready for the next year's quilt show.

2003-2004

7th Quilt show was held at Moravian College, Johnson Hall, Bethlehem on June 5 & 6, 2004. \$5 for 1 day & \$7 for 2-days. Speakers were: Jeannie Minchak and Diane Phalen. Our charity for the show was Hospice of the VNA of Easton PA. They received 50% of the show's net profit & 100% of the Tricky Trays amount.

Challenge Quilt theme was called "America, the Melting Pot" (depicting your particular family heritage). We held our first Quilt-A-Thon on October 24 & 25, 2003; the Quilt-A-Thon benefitted pediatric oncology.

We capped our membership to 136 members (the max we can have according to the fire codes of the church). Any member (80 years of age) and who had been a member for 15 years will no longer be required to pay dues. (This rule is no longer in effect because some members were in the guild much longer than 15 years and were not near the age of 80 so they would still have to pay dues till they are 80 years of age.)

A light weight quilt display (\$200) was purchased and the President is the designated person to keep the stand. (It is actually stored in the large closet at the church.)

We voted on the correct punctuation of "Quilters". It was voted on to be: "Colonial Quilter's Guild."

We went to 6 bakers for each meeting & we had 500 cookbooks made up of our favorite recipes from guild members:

Sunshine & Shadow Policy was created:


When a member is ill or has had an operation, a get-well card is sent.

When a member loses an immediate family member, a floral arrangement is sent.

When a guild member passes away, in remembrance a book on guilting is purchased for the library of the hometown of the deceased.

Because this committee is called Sunshine as well as Shadow, a birthday greeting card will be sent to each member on her special day (and also on special anniversaries if we are notified).
