## Colonial Quilters Guild General Meeting Nov. 14, 2017 - MINUTES

Nancy Weston introduced the speaker, Barbara Schulman, who presented her show about fiber art, with the theme of RECYCLE, RENEW, REUSE.

The meeting was called to order by President Nancy Snow at 8:08 P.M.

The president stressed the need for a new Program Committee for 2018-2019.

Charlene Weiss reported that books will be accepted starting now and Larry Weiss will be at the meetings to collect them. Donated magazines will be sold at the quilt meetings starting in January.

The secretary read the thank-you notes from Turning Point and Ellen Inghrim.

The motion to accept the October meeting minutes was made by Mary Henning and seconded by Susan Mangina.

The treasurer gave the following report: beginning Balance: \$14,519.31; incoming: \$146.50; outgoing expenses: for speaker costs, supplies, and fabrics: \$916.47. The report will be placed on file for audit.

Betsy Lawrence reported 78 members in attendance. Barry Durie was a guest. The door prize was won by Judy Smullen.

Bev Repsher introduced the founding member, Mary Ann Dutkin.

Susan Truby reported the community service sewing day in February 2018 will be decided; there is another one on June 16. She announced that the Quilt Show Challenge requirements have been changed to accept other items besides quilts.

Wendy Bookhultz went over Dec., Jan, and Feb. programs and said details would be explained further in the December newsletter. The December Pot Luck list will be in the newsletter. Nancy Weston stated that the Saturday Sewcial on Nov. 18 would be canceled unless enough members come forward and reserve spots by paying at tonight's meeting.

Jane Merkel won the November birthday raffle. Fat quarters lottery winners were Cathy Mouer, Barb Hulett. Betsy Lawrence, Quilt Show Chairperson reported:

1) Member sign up sheets for quilt show jobs will be available in March 2) Lisa Zinkler and Michele Glynn have volunteered to be Cafe co-chairs. 3) There will not be turkey BBQ. 4) Donations will be taken for door prizes. 5) Lois Walters has 25 quilts registered and many more were received at the meeting. Register by the December meeting and receive 2 Vendor Bucks. 6) Mary Misiura reported that the procedure for selling member items at the quilt show boutique will be the same as last year. The inventory sheet and tickets will be available at the Dec. meeting.

Newsletter articles are due 11/20/2017. A reminder was given that members with mailed copies will receive theirs later than the emailed ones.

Next Board meeting: Monday, December 4, 2017 at 6:45pm.

New Business: A member stated that the Show&Tell was too fast. It will be reviewed.

The meeting was adjourned by Boots Horwath and seconded by Jane Wismer.

**THINK AHEAD! Programs for January and February 2018 FABRICS YOU WILL NEED**

At the **January meeting**, we will have an RLC (Right, Left and Center ) game using 10" Squares. Remember we have done this in the past with 2 1/2" strips. Each person will be asked to bring twelve 10" squares in polka dots, stripes, or solids and they must be BRIGHT COLORS (Red, Orange, Yellow, Blue, Green , Purple, Pink, Turquoise, etc). You can cut your own 10" squares or purchase a pre-cut layer cake and ask a few members to share in the cost and divide up the fabric.

At the **February meeting** we will be making folded fabric stars to sell in the boutique at Quiltfest in May. You will need to bring 4 prepared fabric strips cut to 3 1/4 x 13". Strips can be different fabrics or 4 of the same. Please use holiday prints or solids including a variety of colors (think Red, Green, Blue, Purple, etc.)(Note: fabric with gold, silver threads don't work well.) Bring extras if you choose because at the meeting you can exchange strips with others if you like. Each completed star uses 4 strips. The hangers are made from black embroidery floss, which we will have available. Bring a small pair of scissors if possible, and a needle with an eye that can take a few strands of embroidery floss.



**TO PREPARE FABRIC STRIPS - Make 4**

1. Press each strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together to create a center fold. Open up.
2. Fold in each long side again lengthwise in to center fold and press
3. Fold again lengthwise in half and press. Your strip should look like double fold bias tape.

**WORKSHOP PARTICIPATION - We have 1 remaining workshop (4/11, 9am-4pm) this guild year.**

The workshop by Eleanor Levie is "**Trash Stash Quilting**" - Play hooky away from your quilting fabrics. Combine tea-bag packaging, coffee bags, and other foil-lined packaging along with felt, buttons, and bottle caps, to create little works of folk art. Last chance to get ideas for the QuiltFest challenge! **The fee will be \$35 prepaid by March 13th at the meeting or the 20th by mail, if there are not 15 people signed up, the workshop will be canceled.**

New twist on workshops! If you pay and attend, your check (or cash) will be put in a container at the workshop on the workshop day, and one person's fee will be drawn out of the container. That person will receive back her check/cash!

**QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE : Reuse,Recycle and Repurpose = Reborn**



From Susan Truby: Quilters have always found a way to get the fabric that they needed to make quilts to keep loved ones warm. From the humble scrap bag with bits of fabric saved from making clothing to saving feed sacks to make quilts, quilters have worked their magic to create beautiful quilts for their families and friends. We as quilters have also recycled and repurposed ties and men's shirts to honor loved ones. We make t- shirt quilts for our kids. We save baby clothes to put into their quilts for their wedding day. We save jeans to make quilts for our kids to play on, take naps on and take to college. We take bits and pieces of scraps given to us from dear friends to make string quilts. We repurpose vintage blocks, orphan blocks, embroidered pillowcases and handkerchiefs and old quilt tops made long ago, and we breathe new life into them. This challenge is a celebration of taking a recycled fabric and giving it new life. I hope that you join me on this adventure!

The rules are simple -

1. The quilt can be any size; **also ALLOWED are quilted items - not just quilts - clothing, purses etc**
2. The front of the quilt must have at least 50% recycled fabric; any type of fiber from silk, brocade, satin and cotton - just to name a few - can be used, including polyester!
3. You can embellish any way you like: buttons, beads,embroidery.
4. Write a brief description of the Reused,Recycled and Repurposed Fabrics used, where you obtained them and why you used them.

**Remember that the challenge quilt submission forms go to Susan Truby, not Lois Walters**

From Darlene - **Bob DeCarli** is a speaker who came to the guild a few years ago. He sent the following message: “I finally finished the **Baroque Tapestry quilt book**. I converted 12 Baroque needlepoint designs, from the seventeenth century, into quilts. The quilts are easy to construct using strip sets, just as in the Remarkable Rectangles book. Her tip for the guild members: Persevere! You have to finish it!

**October 1993** A revision was made to the bylaws stating that the 25-cent penalty for not wearing your name tag would go up to 50 cents.

**6/14/94** we gave quilts to the boys at the Children's Home of Easton.

**1994/95** We had our 3<sup>rd</sup> Quilt Show on March 18, 1995 at Northampton Community College. Profit from the quilt show was \$1,213.79 plus \$1,000.00 from the guild account totaling \$2,213.79. We gave a donation of \$1,000.00 to American Cancer Society.

We got a post office box number for the guild, PO Box 4543.

For sympathy gifts, it was decided to donate books to the library instead of sending flowers.

**1995/96** We gave 14 quilts for the girls of the Easton Children's Home and we also gave 2 wall hangings to Ronald McDonald House of Hershey.

**1996 /97** Our 4th Quilt Show was 3/22-23/97 at the Hotel Bethlehem. A donation from quilt show of \$1,000.00 was given to Benevolent Treasury of Emmanuel E.C. Church of Bethlehem. Profit from show was \$3,793.15.

Our new guild mailing address was PO Box 4033, Bethlehem, Pa.

It was the 6th year in making quilts for the Children's Home of Easton.

We started to do Block of the Month and also started making pillows for the American Cancer Society for the Reach to Recovery Program.

Our first quilt challenge "A Bethlehem Christmas" was under the leadership of Susan Truby
