## Colonial Quilters Guild General Meeting Oct. 10, 2017 - MINUTES

Laura Lyman presented her program about color selection.

The meeting was called to order at 8:20 P.M.

The following points were brought up by President Nancy Snow: committee chairperson signs and a new seating arrangement. She stressed the need for a new Program Committee for 2018-2019 and Quilt Show Chairs for Book Nook, Boutique & Cafe.

Sue Nelson reported: we received a thank-you email from Meals-on-Wheels; the Sept. minutes have been revised; Turning Point donations were made.

Charlene Weiss: ending balance of \$14,610.40; the report will be placed on file for audit.

Kathy Kemmerer: 86 members in attendance; new member Louise Fehnel; guest Joyce Farley.

Meeting cancellations will be made by noon; people with no email will be called.

Nancy Snow shared a trick about cutting batting.

Kathy Lopez will take requests for the library books. Money raffles of \$19.50 each were won by Cathy Mouer and Pat Roof. Darlene Dreisbach won the door prize. Fat-quarter winners were Yvonne Moor, Eugenia Emert, and Barb Hulett.

Betsy Lawrence reported on the May 5-6, 2018 quilt show. Committee members are Lois Walters, Charlene Weiss, Beth Swain, and Deb Shupe. The guild's raffle quilt was made by Darlene Repash and Richele Voice and quilted by Lois Walters; it was chosen to be on the front cover of the 2018 Quilt Shop Navigator; we will have an ad in it. Cathy Palmer did the advertising and all the artwork for the quilt show. The Boutique chairpersons are Mary Misiura and Karen LeyFert. Charlene is in charge of Tricky Tray and is accepting donations. There will be no door prize committee. Lois Walters and Nancy Echenberg are quilt registration co-chairpersons. Lois Walters: All quilts must be registered by the March meeting. Lois explained the Vendor Bucks program for early submissions. Registration can be done by computer. If a picture is needed, one can be taken during show and tell. Beth Swain explained the challenge quilt requirements and showed a denim example. Deb Shupe is in charge of the quilt raffle tickets, which were given out at the meeting. Ticket stubs and money are to be returned in a sealed envelope with your name on it.

Jane Merkel reported that Ellen Inghrim's husband, Ed, passed away on 9/29. A monetary donation was sent to Ellen's chosen charity. Wendy Harwick received a retirement card. Kathy Miller won the October Birthday Raffle.

## November Meeting: Barbara Schulman, Fiber Artist - "A Textile Artist Inspires Us to Reuse, Recycle, and Renew"

Barbara will show some of her work, in which she uses paint, fire, razor blades, bandaids, credit card pieces etc., when working the surface of a quilt. She will also present visuals of quilts by artists who use innovative materials and techniques, with the goal of inspiring you to create your own Reuse, Recycle, Renew Quiltfest challenge quilt.

## THINK AHEAD! Programs for January and February 2018 FABRICS YOU WILL NEED

At the **January meeting**, we will having an RLC (Right, Left and Center ) game using 10" Squares. Remember we have done this in the past with 2 1/2" strips. Each person will be asked to bring twelve 10" squares in polka dots, stripes, or solids and they must be BRIGHT COLORS (Red, Orange, Yellow, Bue, Green, Purple, Pink, Turquoise, etc). You can cut your own 10" squares or purchase a pre-cut layer cake and ask a few members to share in the cost and divide up the fabric. **IMPORTANT!!!! At the **February meeting** we will be making folded fabric stars to sell in the boutique at Quiltfest in May. You will need to bring 4 prepared fabric strips cut to 3 1/4 x 13". Strips can be different fabrics or 4 of the same. Please use holiday prints or solids including a variety of colors (think Red, Green, Blue, Silver, Gold, Purple, etc.) Bring extras if you choose because at the meeting you can exchange strips with others if you like. Each completed star uses 4 strips. The hangers are made from black embroidery floss - please bring some if you can.



## TO PREPARE FABRIC STRIPS - Make 4

1. Press each strip in half lengthwise, wrong sides together to create a center fold. Open up. 2. Fold in each long side again lengthwise in to center fold and press 3. Fold again lengthwise in half and press. Your strip should look like double fold bias tape.

**WORKSHOP PARTICIPATION** - New twist on workshops! We have 3 workshops this guild year. For each one that you pay for and attend, your check (or cash) will be put in a container at the workshop on the workshop day, and one person's fee will be drawn out of the container. That person will receive back her check/cash!

## QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE: Reuse, Recycle and Repurpose = Reborn

From Susan Truby: Quilters have always found a way to get the fabric that they needed to make quilts to keep loved ones warm. From the humble scrap bag with bits of fabric saved from making clothing to saving feed sacks to make quilts, quilters have worked their magic to create beautiful quilts for their families and friends. We as quilters have also recycled and repurposed ties and men's shirts to honor loved ones. We make t- shirt quilts for our kids. We save baby clothes to put into their quilts for their wedding day. We save jeans to make quilts for our kids to play on, take naps on and take to college. We

take bits and pieces of scraps given to us from dear friends to make string quilts. We repurpose vintage blocks, orphan blocks, embroidered pillowcases and handkerchiefs and old quilt tops made long ago, and we breathe new life into them. This challenge is a celebration of taking a recycled fabric and giving it new life. I hope that you join me on this adventure!

- 1. The guilt can be any size.
- 2. The front of the quilt must have at least 50% recycled fabric; any type of fiber from silk, brocade, satin and cotton just to name a few can be used, including polyester!
- 3. You can embellish any way you like: buttons, beads, embroidery.
- 4. Write a brief description of the Reused, Recycled and Repurposed Fabrics used, where you obtained them and why you used them.

## **Founding Member: Mary Ann Dutkin**



How did the Colonial Quilters Guild get started 35 years ago? Mary Ann Dutkin owned a quilt shop in Nazareth, PA. She and others decided to form a guild. She is "the" founding member. She put a notice in the Easton Express about starting the guild. One hundred people attended the first meeting. The dues were \$5.00. The guild made quilts for the Ronald McDonald House and the Children's Home in Easton. This was the start of the community service project.

Mary Ann has three grown children in Colorado, New York, and Georgia, and 9 grandchildren.

Mary Ann has never been president of the guild, but she has done programs, taught quilting and presented workshops.

She likes everything about the quilting process. She is always trying something new and using new techniques. Appliqué is her least favorite quilt process. She enjoys working with vibrant colors. She has 3 scrapbooks full of pictures of the quilts and other projects she has made. She especially likes the Hoffman Challenge quilt projects which she has entered 10 times. Two of her quilts have traveled the U.S.A. and received awards.

Mary Ann's advice to the new quilters: continue to experiment; to the experienced quilters: stay challenged. Thanks to Mary Ann for the initiative in forming the Colonial Quilters Guild.

## PIECES OF THE PAST - THE COLONIAL QUILTERS GUILD

1991 - We gave \$100.00 and also made quilts for junior boys aged 10-13 of the Children's Home of Easton, Easton, Pa.

The Penny Jar - Each month we were to bring in our extra pennies (or change) and place them in the jar. This change would go into the treasury for programs.

1992 a proclamation was declared: National Quilting Day by Mayor Joseph Daddona of Allentown, Mayor Kenneth Smith of Bethlehem, and Mayor Thomas Goldsmith of Easton.

July 25th we had a covered dish picnic at the Nazareth Park, Nazareth, Pa.

We made a raffle quilt for the Weller Center in Easton, PA where they made \$3,000.00 on it.

August 1992 we purchased a camera; it would be stored in the cabinet at the church.

September 1992/1993 We had our 2<sup>nd</sup> Quilt Show at NCC on March 20, 1993. Profit was \$2943.00 We gave New Bethany Ministries \$1,450 from the quilt raffle.

June 1993 was our 10th Anniversary

September 1993/1994: it was decided that guild would send flowers of sympathy whenever there was a death of a spouse or of a child still living with a guild member.

An insurance policy was purchased to cover the guild.

Dues went to \$15.00 a year (9/93)

We made quilts for girls (aged 12-17) of The Children's Home of Easton, Easton, Pa.

After this year, membership duties were added to the duties of the V.P.

AIDS Quilts were made and delivered to children in the Lehigh Valley hospitals.


