PIECES OF THE PAST - THE COLONIAL QUILTERS GUILD by Bev Repsher, Historian

1985 - - - January meetings were held at Leader 11 Nursing & Rehab.Center, Bethlehem, PA. We made a guilt for the Kurtz

Training Center, called "I am Blue" under the direction of Debbie Heeps. It was a nine-patch design and the border was applied by Margo Billetz and was quilted by members of the Colonial Quilters' Guild. We made our 2nd Ronald McDonald House quilt. It was the fan pattern. We made a banner with our logo on it and it was designed by Judy Thompson's husband. Those who worked on the banner were Judy Thompson, Mildred Harleman, Margo Billetz and Debbie Heeps.Debbie Heeps designed and made a star design wall hanging for the Leader Home, to be hung at the entrance of the building.

On April 20 we showed our quilts at the Nazareth YMCA and on May 10 & 11we showed our quilts at the Moravian Church

October: The guild started paying for supplies of coffee, cups, etc because the monies placed in the can as a token donation did not cover the cost. **1986**

April: We joined National Quilters Association and Logo pins were made. In June, some of our Colonial Quilters helped the Keystone Quilters with an NQA show which was held at Lafatyette College in Easton.

1987

June 24-28: the 1st Hoffman Challenge started.

In August we made a raffle quilt, Log Cabin pattern, for the Heart Fund at the Leader House in Bethlehem. We started a block exchange where those who wanted to participate would pick a pattern of their choice and when their name was pulled we would all make that person a square of her choice.

Mary Jo Gonsiorowski introduced the guest speaker, Jody Beck. Jody presented the program, Jody's Jem's Journey. There will be a workshop on Wednesday, September 13, 2017.

The June minutes were accepted by Cathy Palmer and Darlene Repash.

Charlene Weiss gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance is \$16,273.99, and the ending balance is \$15,249.97. Bills were paid for ½ the room rent, community service fabric and insurance. The report will be placed on file for audit.

Kathy Kemmerer, the vice president, reported there were 74 members present. There were no guests. The door prize was won by Mary Ellen Martin. Membership cards were given out during the meeting registration.

Newsletter articles are due September 22, 2017. Nancy Snow told the club to start to use the Facebook page. It is a closed group for quilting only posts or shares. NEW PROJECT - monthly "stashing for charity"

For several years we did the block-of-the-month as a monthly guild project. Last year we did the Mystery Quilt. This year we are doing a "Charm Squares/5" squares" project. Each month, bring in at least a dozen 5" squares. These can be cut from the stash you want to use up; however, we are particularly interested in fussy-cut children's fabrics or solids that will coordinate. For every month you contribute, your name will be put in a lottery. At the last meeting, names will be drawn for a free year's membership. Blocks will be used at a charity sew.

QUILT SHOW CHALLENGE : Reuse, Recycle and Repurpose = Reborn



From Susan Truby: Quilters have always found a way to get the fabric that they needed to make quilts to keep loved ones warm. From the humble scrap bag with bits of fabric saved from making clothing to saving feed sacks to make quilts, quilters have worked their magic to create beautiful quilts for their families and friends. We as quilters have also recycled and repurposed ties and men's shirts to honor loved ones. We make t- shirt quilts for our kids. We save baby clothes to put into their quilts for their wedding day. We save jeans to make quilts for our kids to play on, take naps on and take to college. We take bits and pieces of scraps given to us from dear

friends to make string quilts. We repurpose vintage blocks, orphan blocks, embroidered pillowcases and handkerchiefs and old quilt tops made long ago, and we breathe new life into them. This challenge is a celebration of taking a recycled fabric and giving it new life. I hope that you join me on this adventure! The rules are simple -

1. The quilt can be any size.

2. The front of the quilt must have at least 50% recycled fabric; any type of fiber from silk, brocade, satin and cotton -

just to name a few - can be used, including polyester!

3. You can embellish any way you like: buttons, beads, embroidery. 4. Write a brief description of the Reused, Recycled and Repurposed Fabrics used, where you obtained them and why you used them.

WORKSHOP – Laura Lyman will be doing the regular meeting-night program (a presentation and demo) on October 10th. <u>On Saturday October 14th she will do a workshop, COLOR PLAY, based on her presentation</u>. Laura recommends that you do not buy your fabrics until after the lecture because you will get information at the lecture on how to choose fabrics. Laura will bring for sale at the lecture as well as at the workshop, ample supplies of her hand-dyed fabrics for members to choose from, so you will not need to worry about having the right fabrics. What you can do in advance: *start separating out solid and tone-on-tone fabrics- NO multi-colored prints - to bring to the presentation for the demo.*

Color Play Workshop Supplies/Preparation

Using 1 3/4 yards black solid or tone-on-tone, cut the following and place in labelled bags: (2) strips 2 1/2" x 40 1/2" (2) strips 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" (24) 2 1/2" x 10" strips (36) 3" squares (36) 2 1/2" squares



Batting- 46" x 46" Backing- 46" x 46"

You can also start collecting any solid or tone-on-tone scraps in a variety of colors. You will pick your other fabrics after the lecture. You will be able to share and trade fabrics as you work on your blocks.

You also need to bring a sewing machine in good working order with your manual (be sure to pack cord and pedal!), 1/4" foot and/or seam guide, extra needles, thread, 3 bobbins full of a neutral thread, basic sewing supplies. The following can be shared: cutting mat, rotary cutter, rulers. **Bring lunch or go out.**
