Colonial Quilter Guild Minutes — General Meeting — March 8, 2016

Call to Order – Meeting was called to order at 7:00 by President Eugenia Emert.

Minutes and Correspondence – The minutes of the January meeting were approved as presented in the newsletter, motion made by Kathy Boushell and seconded by Sherry Seip. The minutes will be placed on file.

Treasurer's Report – Betsy Lawrence gave the Treasurer's Report. Beginning balance for the month of February was \$14,234.76, \$95.50 was received, \$636.38 was disbursed, for a closing balance of \$13,693.88. There was no change in the month of March. The Treasurer's Report will be placed on file for audit.

New Members/Guests – Linda Kleppinger reported that 87 members were present, and no guests. Members who have not yet met the membership requirement for 2015-16 have been sent a reminder. Please contact Linda if you feel there is a discrepancy about your attendance. Sue Nelson won the drawing. Membership renewal forms will be available at the next meeting and will be due by June 30. Dues will remain at \$25.




Fat Quarter Lottery
