
January : Debbie Kalenty will be presenting her program during our January meeting, and the Lemoyne Star workshop is rescheduled for January 13.

BABY BANK

Over \$70 was collected at the last 2 meetings, plus a number of items. There is a current need for small sizes of diapers.

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small items that babies need to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote and teach positive health and attachment behaviors between the mother and her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.




DECEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH



Take a background triangle and a light color triangle, and sew them together. Sew this unit to the dark triangle unit.



You are now ready to assemble your block, following the diagram below.



Your finished block should be 12 1/2 inches.
