Colonial Quilter Guild Minutes — General Meeting — May 10, 2016

- Call to Order Meeting was called to order at 7:00 by President Eugenia Emert. Members were asked to complete a survey by next meeting, providing input on the guild and its activities. The raffle quilt from this year's show was presented to the winner, Lorraine Hare, Manager of American Ribbon Fabrics in Stroudsburg. Awards from this year's quilt show were presented.
- Bethanne Nemesh presented her program "Walk a Creative Path."
- Minutes and Correspondence The minutes of the April meeting were approved as presented in the newsletter, motion made by Mary Misiura and seconded by Evelyn Weidl. The minutes will be placed on file.
- Treasurer's Report Betsy Lawrence gave the Treasurer's Report. Beginning balance for the month of April was \$13,434.43, \$46.50 was received, \$1,670.65 was disbursed, for a closing balance of \$11,810.28. The Treasurer's Report will be placed on file for audit.
- New Members/Guests Linda Kleppinger reported that 94 members were present, and 7 guests. Jane Wismer won the door prize.
- Nomination Committee Darlene Repash gave the committee's report. Kathy Kemmerer
 was nominated for Vice President and Charlene as Treasurer. There were no other
 nominations. Kathy and Charlene were elected to serve a two-year term. The secretary
 has resigned; volunteers were asked to contact Eugenia Emert concerning filling this
 position for the remainder of the term (one year).
- Community Service Charlene Weiss thanked members for their donations. The guild has had a good year, and donated items have been much appreciated by the recipients.
- Hospitality Members were invited to take food packages left from the quilt show. Recipes for the chocolate peanut butter cupcakes and the chocolate lollipops will be provided for the newsletter.
- Sunshine and Shadows Pat Conklin and Lillian Ward, former members, have passed away. Gail Kromer had surgery and has gone home. Joan asked that members provide her with complete information on names, etc. when informing her of issues with members.
- Newsletter Please have information for the newsletter to Sue Nelson and Nancy Weston by 5/22/16.
- Quilt Show Betsy Lawrence gave a report on the quilt show (to be provided separately) and thanked everyone for their help. Final numbers are not yet available but will be provided at next month's meeting.
- Library Lottery drawing of \$49.25 was won by Joan Bellis.
- Fat Quarter Exchange Winners of this month's fat quarters were Cathy Mouer, Dolores Bartek and Sue Jones.

Programs – Pat Knoechel (Eleanor Burns' sister) is coming Thursday, June 9 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. There is no charge; guests are welcome. Program for the June meeting is Ann Holte speaking on the Lancaster Diamond Sampler Quilt. A new program committee has been formed for next year, consisting of Nancy Weston, Wendy Bookhultz, Mary Jo Gonsiorowski, Joanne McCarthy, Carolyn Marrazzo, and Sue Mangina. They have contacted Jessica Skultety concerning a program in October on machine quilting. Lecture will be given at the regular guild meeting, with a workshop on Saturday, October 15. Members were asked for input in level of interest in the proposed workshops – morning session to be beginning free-motion quilting and afternoon to be intermediate level. Proposed cost is \$25 for each session, with a discount if a member takes both (\$45). Sufficient members expressed interest, and the committee will proceed with their plans.

• Winners of the Vendors' Choice awards from the quilt show displayed their quilts. The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.



CAKE POPS Recipe For those of you who wanted the cake pop recipe: it is in CAKE POPS by Bakerella. You need: 18-25oz box yellow cake mix, 9x13" cake pan, nuts or sprinkles-whatever your preference, 16oz container ready-made frosting (vanilla cream cheese), 32oz(2lbs) ghiradelli chocolate wafers (found in Wilton section of a store), 48 lollipop sticks(Wilton section),microwave bowl,2 baking sheets,parchment paper.

MAKE: bake cake in 9x13 pan as directed on box,cool completely,wait a couple of hours once cake is cool to crumble,roll shape and decorate 4 doz balls. first crumble cake in bowl-no large pieces. cut cake in 4 rectangles and crumble by hand (mixer does not work well). add 3/4 of container of frosting(do not add more-too gushy), with the back of a spoon. roll into 48, 1.5" balls and lay on cookie sheet on parchment paper, cover loosely and put in fridge overnight.

THE NEXT DAY: melt small amount chocolate in double boiler, dip lollipop stick tip in same and insert 1/2 way into balls, return to fridge just for 1hr to solidify chocolate on sticks. melt rest of chocolate and dip balls and spoon chocolate over base of ball, immediately roll in crushed peanuts/sprinkles. pops can be stored in fridge in sealed container for several days. So much more can be done to decorate — look on YouTube or buy the book.

This is my last newsletter post as program chair. I enjoyed the three years I spent planning our programs, meeting the speakers and getting to know more of our guild members. I hope you enjoyed it, too. Here's what I have planned for our last meeting:

June 14 - June makes me think of strawberries, so come and enjoy a strawberry dessert before we start our program! Ann Holte will present a lecture and trunk show called "Friends and Family: The Lancaster Diamond Sampler Quilt". Many of you may have seen her beautiful quilts on display in her booth at our quilt show. She will have books and patterns for sale at our meeting, as well.

June 9 - 7:00pm - Once again, Pat Knoechel, Eleanor Burns' sister, is coming to visit the Colonial Quilters. She will be showing quilts from the newest book called "Quilts from El's Attic," as well as some new modern and classic quilt patterns. This is not a regular meeting, just a demonstration, as well as a sale of quilting items. Bring your friends. Everyone is welcome.

ADVANCE NOTICE (because you need to sign up and pay!)

Jessica Skultety, who did our Modern Quilting presentation and was the speaker at the quilt show, will be doing our October guild meeting presentation on Free-Motion Quilting, AND she will be conducting TWO 3-hour WORKSHOPS ON SATURDAY OCT. 15:

<u>Beginner Free Motion Quilting Workshop:</u> Dive into FMQ on your domestic machine! We'll discuss work space setup and general techniques. Then, we'll jump right in by drawing and practicing stipples and lines. You'll leave inspired to keep practicing! *Students should have working knowledge of their domestic machine and be able to change sewing feet with ease. Must have a darning/hopping/free motion foot for machine.

Intermediate Free Motion Workshop: In this class, you will learn and practice quilting loops, spirals, pebbles, and boxes. We'll draw first, practice on quilt sandwiches, and discuss how these motifs can impact your quilts. Come join the fun and further your addiction to free motion quilting! *Students should have already taken a beginner free motion class plus at home practice, OR free motioned an entire quilt on their own. Must be comfortable with stippling and your own machine. Must have a darning/hopping/free motion foot for machine.

THERE WILL BE A SIGNUP SHEET at the June meeting. The workshops are first paid, first served, so bring your checkbooks to sign up (checks made payable to Colonial Quilters Guild). Each workshop is \$25, but if you feel you qualify to take both, there is a discount so that you would pay \$45 for the two workshops.



SEWING - Charity

Over the summer you might want to work on your charity sewing. There is a need for walker bags and it was suggested that making some in a "masculine" fabric (plaids, sporting themes, etc) would be most welcome because there are also men who need the walker bags. Another suggestion is to make the bags from theme fabrics: 4th of July, Halloween, Christmas, etc.
