
Our February meeting should be lots of fun. Don't forget your strips an your good luck!

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small baby needs to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote & teach positive health & attachment behaviors between the mother & her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.

PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

We made it through two meetings with no snow. Let's hope our luck continues. We've got a lot of fun stuff planned for the next few months, so I hope you all come out to join us. My son, daughter in law and their two big dogs just left for home after a five week visit. I miss them already, but I'm looking forward to getting back into my sewing room and hopefully finish some of the many projects I started.

February: Fabric Strip Poker - our fabric theme is patriotic, so bring along 12 - 2 1/2" x wof strips of any red, white (including shades of tan) and blue fabric. You can bring any combination of those colors, or even all of the same color, as long as the fabrics are quality 100% cotton. If you have any questions, give me a call. 610-442-3768

April - Program and workshop. AQS author Robert DeCarli will present Remarkable Rectangles.Robert DeCarli's first life was as a math professor at a Catholic girls' college in Buffalo. He moved on to function as an engineer at Lockheed Martin in Valley Forge, all the while continuing to teach math at local colleges. In 1992 his wife asked for help in making a quilt for their daughter's wedding. She showed him how to make a four-patch and he was hooked. As a mathematician, the seemingly endless number of patterns fascinated him. He has designed blocks and quilts since 1993, receiving a ribbon at the Vermont Quilt Festival and a blue ribbon at the Pennsylvania Quilt Extravaganza for "Butterfly" (designed in EQ5). His primary interest, besides teaching, is designing various size, interlocking log cabins and converting weaving patterns to quilts. In each area, the number of possibilities is seemingly endless, but he pursues them one at a time. I'm very excited to have Bob presenting this program and workshop. Sign-ups and more workshop info will be available at the February meeting.



Shamrock 12 1/2" Unfinished Block

Cut:

12 - 3 1/2" Green Squares

1 - 6 1/2" Green Square 9 - 2 3/8" Muslin Squares


2 - 5 1/2" Muslin Squares 1 - 4 1/2" Muslin Squares

Assembly:

Take 9 of the 3 1/2" squares and 9 of the 2 3/8" muslin squares. Place the muslin square on the green square and sew diagnal through the

muslin square and iron out to create a snowball effect on one corner of the green square. Do this to all 9 green squares.

Next assembly 3 four patch blocks as shown in the photo above using 1 plain green square and 3 snowball/green squares you just made in each four patch.



Stem assembly: Using the 6 1/2" green square lay one 5 1/2" muslin square on right corner top side of the green square and sew diagnal from the upper left corner to lower right corner. Iron it out to create a snowball effect. Then take the next muslin square and lay it in the lower left bottom corner of the same green square and sew from the upper left corner to the lower right corner of the muslin square and fold out. This creates the stem. Then take the 4 1/2" muslin and place it in the lower corner of the squre bottom to help shorten the stem and sew diagnal from right to left to create another snowball effect and iron out towards bottom of shamrock.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each member supports that commitment in one of the following ways, annually:

- one children's oncology quilt (42" by 44" or 42" by 54") to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg
- two preemie quilts (18" by 25") -to be donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital NICU
- two mastectomy pillows and bags to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats to be donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.qov.org) to be sent by yourself

Lois Walters has a longarm quilter and will help choose the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine, To reach her check our members directory on the Member's Only section on our website

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two pillowcases- can be for hospice at Lehigh Valley or St Lukes, or a child's theme pillowcase for peds oncology at Lehigh Valley hospital
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make — one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting — can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and wahoo you're done!



Please sew your own label on your Oncology and wounded warrior quilts and hospice quilts and nightgowns.

CHICKEN MUSHROOM BARLEY SOUP

In dutch oven saute diced onion, celery, 1 tsp minced garlic and mushrooms until tender in a small amount of olive oil. Remove from pan add a small amount of olive oil and saute boneless chicken breast until cooked. Remove from pan and add back in onion mixture.

Pour in 2 quarts of chicken broth, scraping bottom of pan as you add broth. At this point I add carrots, tomatoes or any other vegetable if you desire(good time to clean out the frig)!!. You can add more broth if you want a greater amount of soup or I add water and chicken soup base mix to extend the soup. Rinse one cup of medium barley(or more if you like) in water and rinse, then add to broth. Bring to a boil then reduce to a simmer until barley is tender. Shred chicken and add to soup. Right before serving I cut up baby spinach and add to soup (as much as you like.)
