Hello Everyone,


This will be my last president's note for the newsletter. Sometimes I have lots to say and other times I can't seem to think of anything that may be of interest to our members. This month is not one of those months.

#### PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

A big THANK YOU to all of our members that provided the delicious food for our pot luck dinner in May, as well as your help in making the beautiful quilts that we donated to hospice. I think everyone had an enjoyable time and I'm sure the quilts will be greatly appreciated.

Now...this is what's happening in June!

I hope those of you that attended the Remarkable Rectangles workshop will be able to finish your quilt blocks for our June meeting. Bring them along and we'll share them during show and tell!

June 9 : Suzi Parron of Stone Mountain, Georgia.

**Suzi Parron** discovered barn quilts on a trip through Kentucky in 2008. She documented over one thousand barn quilts in the process of writing her 2012 book, "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement." A former high school English teacher, Suzi now travels full time by RV with her husband, Glen, and their dog, Gracie, visiting with quilt guilds and civic groups along the way.

In her talk, Suzi will take us on a journey along the quilt trail, beginning with the very first barn quilt, which stemmed from Donna Sue Groves and her wish to honor her mother's quilting art. Suzi's hour-long presentation features over one hundred stunning photographs of barn quilts, some of which rival cloth quilts in their intricacy. You will hear stories of some of the individuals who have painted quilt blocks to honor loved ones or their local culture, along with a few humorous anecdotes.

The program is both informative and entertaining, as Suzi explores the way in which our quilting heritage takes on new meaning as this movement continues to expand.

Suzi will have books on hand for sale and signing. Her second book, "Following the Barn Quilt Trail," is due in early 2016.

June 10 from 9:00 - 12:00 noon\_ Barn quilt painting workshop (the workshop is full) Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail.

- 1. 1 We will spend 3-4 hours together; once painting begins, you may work at your own pace.
- 2 Depending on your design, you will leave with a finished quilt block or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home. Ready for show and tell at your next meeting! The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings. After the workshop, you will have the knowledge and skills to paint blocks of any size.
  - 1. Supplies provided:
  - 2. o Pre-primed 2 by 2 foot board
    - o Suggested patterns (you may also use one of your choice) o Colored pencils o Paint
      - o Foam brushes
      - You will need to bring:
      - o Painter's tape (several people can share one roll)
      - o Yardstick or 24-inch Ruler and pencil

June 18 - 7:00 Pat Knoechel will present a program featuring Eleanor Burns newest book...All Star Quilts. She'll also feature some new patterns. Bring your friends and have fun

I hope everyone enjoyed the programs this past year and you're looking forward to another year of fun and informative programs starting in September with a BIG show and tell. That's right! # Walker Tote

### **Cutting instructions**

Upholstery fabric 14 X 54 inches or Cotton fabric 15 X 45 inches 15 X 45 inches fusible fleece 2-15 X 45 inches lining fabric Velcro Cut four 3 inch pieces (2 sets) of Velcro

#### Assembly

#### 45 inch fabric cotton fabric


Fuse fleece to main fabric according to manufacturer's directions. With right sides together, sew main fabric and lining fabric with a 1/2 inch seam, leaving an opening for turning. Trim corners and turn. Press. Topstitch 1/4 inch from edge, closing opening with stitching. The Walker Tote will measure 14 X 44 inches. Mark center.

#### **Upholstery** Fabric

Place right side down. Mark center.

#### Velcro


On wrong or lining side, sew Velcro 1 1/2 inches from the sides and 5 inches from the center.



#### Pockets

For upholstery fabric, fold on solid lines and bring to broken lines (which are 3 inches from center line) forming pockets. Topstitch fold.

For 45 inch cotton tote, bring topstitched ends to broken lines.





# DIRECTIONS FOR MAKING A POCKET SHAWL

Please read the following set of directions and see the diagram below for the making of a pocket shawl. The finished size of the shawl will be:

22 inches x 72 inches with a 10 inch x 10 inch pocket or 12 inch x 12 inch pocket on each end of the shawl.

 use 4 yards of Fabric: This will make: One (1) top and One (1) bottom panel and also Two (2) 10 or 12 inch pockets.
This will allow for seams and oopsies.


2. Light weight fusible batting: to fit your shawl of 22in x 72 inches

3. usual quilt sandwich...top-batting-bottom

4. Quilt as desired, bind as desired

5. see Laurel Eime for any questions, she is our talented designer

Thank you for a great year! Next year we will be trying something new using black as our background fabric. We have chosen to use Kona Cotton Black (better quality) as our fabric so after you initially receive your first 1/2 yard free in September, it will be \$3 for each piece after that. We will still offer the muslin as an alternative for those who are not interested in the black. When we draw for the winner of the blocks, those that chose black will be entered in the drawing for the black and those that chose muslin will have a separate drawing. #### **RECIPE FROM DEB SHUPE**

Peanut Butter Cookie Lasagna

#### Ingredients

- 1 box Nutter Butter Cookies
- · Cool Whip or whip your own fresh whipped cream (1 cup cream plus a drop of sugar for sweetness)
- · peanut butter cups
- · ½ cup peanut butter, melted in microwave
- · 1 box instant or regular vanilla pudding, prepared according to package

#### Instructions

- 1. Line the bottom of an 8x8 pan with Nutter Butter Cookies.
- 2. Top with a drizzle of the melted peanut butter.
- 3. Add 1/2 the pudding.
- 4. Add half the cream. (I like to use a pastry bag so it is pretty but you can spread it if you prefer.)
- 5. Top with chopped peanut butter cups.
- 6. Repeat the layering!
- 7. Decorate the top with crushed nutter butter cookies, peanut butter cups and a drizzle more of peanut butter.
- 8. This must be chilled overnight for the cookies to soften! We are talking 24 hours or more-a little tip to speed the softening up....halve the cookies lengthwise (don't worry about the cream) and layer them halved. Or you could even chop the cookies and use chopped cookies in the layers! Either way you choose will be delicious!!!
