

PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS


I hope everyone had a great time playing fabric strip poker at our last meeting. I heard a lot of laughter and saw a lot of strip winners. Now it's time to start sewing those strips together!

March 10: We're going to spend the evening socializing with our fellow quilters while we brush up on our hand piecing skills (for a good cause). Please bring along a needle, neutral color thread and a small scissors. We'll supply the fabric.

March 20-21: We will have our annual "Non - Sleepover" Quilt Weekend. The times are Friday from 3 - 9 and Saturday from 9 - 3. The cost is \$5/day. Bring your sewing machine, UFO's, handwork or whatever you'd like. Come one day or two. This is another great time to socialize with fellow guild members while working on your quilt projects. We'll provide pizza and snacks on Friday and lunch and snacks on Saturday. Please sign up and pay at the March meeting. I hope you'll join us!

April 14-15: Program and workshop. AQS author Robert DeCarli will present Remarkable Rectangles. His primary interest, besides teaching, is designing various size, interlocking log cabins and converting weaving patterns to quilts. In each area, the number of possibilities is seemingly endless, but he pursues them one at a time. I'm very excited to have Bob presenting this program and workshop. There are a few spots open for the April 15 (9:00-3:00) workshop. The cost is \$25 and the fabric requirements are listed below. Sign-up and pay for the workshop at the March meeting.

Supplies: Sewing machine, bobbins, thread (gray), ruler, cutting mat, rotary cutter, scissors, pins, pencil and paper

Materials: one yard of the dark and one yard of the light.

Cutting

Dark: three 3/4" strips; seven 1" strips; three 1 1/2" strips.

Light: three 3/4" strips; three 1" strips; one 1 1/4" strip; one 1 3/4" strip; three 2" strips; one 2 1/4" strip; two 3" strips; one 3 1/4" strip and one 3 1/2" strip.

The book: Remarkable Rectangles – Martingale 2014.

May: TBD

June 9-10: Suzi Parron of Stone Mountain, Georgia is the author of "Barn Quilts and the American Trail Movement". She will present our program and then offer a workshop where you can paint your own quilt block. Sign ups for the workshop will begin at the March meeting. The cost is \$35 for the workshop. Most materials will be supplied.

Barn Quilt Painting Workshop

with Suzi Parron, author of "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement"

Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail.

- 1 We will spend 3-4 hours together; once painting begins, you may work at your own pace.
- Depending on your design, you will leave with a finished quilt block or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home. Ready for show and tell at your next meeting!

 The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings. After the workshop, you will have the knowledge and skills to paint blocks of any size.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each member supports that commitment in one of the following ways, annually:

- one children's oncology quilt (42" by 44" or 42" by 54") to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg
- two preemie quilts (18" by 25") -to be donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital NICU
- two mastectomy pillows and bags to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats to be donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.qov.org) to be sent by yourself

Lois Walters has a longarm quilter and will help choose the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine, To reach her check our members directory on the Member's Only section on our website

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two pillowcases- can be for hospice at Lehigh Valley or St Lukes, or a child's theme pillowcase for peds oncology at Lehigh Valley hospital
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make — one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting — can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and wahoo you're done!





BABY BANK

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small baby needs to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote & teach positive health & attachment behaviors between the mother & her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.




BLOCK OF THE MONTH - BUTTERCUP
