I think spring may have actually arrived! We went to our grandson's first baseball game and did not need a jacket! I know showers are in the forecast but that is to be expected, it is April.



Barn Quilt Painting Workshop

with Suzi Parron, author of "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement" Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail.

 We will spend 3-4 hours together; once painting begins, you may work at your own pace.
Depending on your design, you will leave with a finished quilt block or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home. Ready for show and tell at your next meeting! The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings. After the workshop, you will have the knowledge and skills to paint blocks of any size.



** Let's Get to the Sewing **




Place a Color 1 small square right sides together aligned with the left end of a Color 2 rectangle. Mark the diagonal on the back of the red square, and sew ON this marked line. Cut off excess seam allowance and press the remainder towards the corner triangle. Sew another red square on the other end using the same method. Make four of these...on to Page 2



Traditional Block

Sew each of the units we just made to a Color 3 rectangle along the bottom edge, using a 1/4" seam, pressing seam allowance towards the darker fabric. Make four of these...



Piece the block by first sewing rows, and then sewing the rows together, being sure to alternate pressing directions!
