BABY BANK

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small baby needs to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote & teach positive health & attachment behaviors between the mother & her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.



You can help " make a difference" by donating small items for the babies. Some ideas are wipes, diaper rash cream, diapers (any size), sippee cups, onesies ,baby socks etc. Also, a bank is available for monetary donations for me to shop.

In June we collected \$ 15.00 for the baby bank. The needs from NFP were for sunscreen, wipes & diaper rash ointment. I was able to deliver some of each. Background: While working as Director of Education for Eleanor Burns at Quilt in a Day in San Marcos, CA, I received a call from JoAnn Stores asking if I could provide 1000 quilts for samples in their stores nationwide. I gathered together a work force of 35 people working from their homes and we filled that first contract, winning out over other competitors for the privilege of future JoAnn Stores business. Six years and over 15,000 quilts later the economy was such that JoAnn Stores decided to discontinue having quilt samples in their stores and revert to pictures. I moved to New Jersey where Mr. Benardette from Benartex contacted me to sew quilt samples using his line of fabrics. When he retired a year later that business stopped. I still have over 300 yards of fabrics, mostly Benartex, and quilting supplies available. I've decided to move to a much smaller house so I need to sell most of what I have. Help me out; come buy fabrics and supplies at bargain prices for yourself and your friends.


COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each member supports that commitment in one of the following ways, annually:

- one children's oncology guilt (42" by 44" or 42" by 54") to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg
- two preemie quilts (18" by 25") -to be donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital NICU
- two mastectomy pillows and bags to be donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats to be donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.gov.org) to be sent by yourself

Lois Walters has a longarm quilter and will help choose the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine, To reach her check our members directory on the Member's Only section on our website

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two pillowcases- can be for hospice at Lehigh Valley or St Lukes, or a child's theme pillowcase for peds oncology at Lehigh Valley hospital
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)





Please sew your own label on your Oncology and wounded warrior quilts and hospice quilts and nightgowns.

There is a GREAT need for the mastectomy bags and pillows-1 in 3 women are diagnosed with breast cancer. On that note: Please bring any material from your stash that you can donate for mastectomy bags and pillows to the September and October guild meetings.

We, Charlene and Laurel, your new community service coordinators, plan a **Saturday sewing day on October 18, 2014** to make mastectomy bags and pillows. The material will be precut. Stuffing and thread will be provided. All you need are your machines and whatever sewing supplies you like to bring for your personal use.

The hours will be from 9am to 3pm. Please come for whatever amount of time you can give. Bring your own lunch but we will provide breakfast goodies and dessert for after lunch. Water and iced tea will be available.


BLOCK OF THE MONTH


