MARCH 26, 2014 QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Betsy Lawrence and Kathy Kemmerer.

Admissions: Betsy noted that there will be 4 people at the admissions table with two collecting money and two stamping hands.

Door prizes: Betsy asked for suggestions for letting visitors know that they are the winner of a door prize. Jane Merkel suggested putting a sheet of paper into the program announcing "You are a winner". Viewer's choice ballot will also be put into programs.

Show Layout: Betsy and Sue Sos have met to discuss the show layout. Every spot on the outer perimeter of the gym is filled. Book Nook will be moved to a different location from the last show while

Boutique, Tricky Tray, and Appraisals will all be in the same spot as the last show. The white glove table will probably be in the hallway near the admissions table and will be used as the location for members to check in.

Setup: Gym will not be available until 12 noon on the day of set up. Poles will be delivered at 10:30 am. Jane Merkel questioned if the kitchen will be available prior to noon. Nancy Simons questioned time that members can bring in display items. The admissions tables in the hallway will be used to accept quilts from members starting at 2:00 pm.

Quilt Registration: Lois Walters asked for suggestions from committee as to where to place the quilt number on the tag affixed to

each quilt. Members suggested that the number be large enough for visitors to determine the quilt number since this number will be used for voting.

Viewer's Choice Ballot:
Committee discussed wording for ballot. Betsy Golden suggested wording should be clear so that visitors will know how to vote.
Darlene Repash will include where to place completed ballot on the ballot form. Information will also be included indicating that all challenge quilts are located in a specific area.

Door Prizes: Marilyn has received many door prizes. She distributed to various committees items that could not be used as door prizes but could be used in other areas. She questioned if we still have fabric Door Prizes sign. Since

many items are in the storage area and it is not accessible because of snow, Betsy and Kathy will be checking storage unit for all quilt show items. Marilyn also indicated that she will need someone to pick up the door prize donated by the Burkholder's Store.

Vendors Passports: Committee decided not to pursue this.

Raffle and Tricky Tray Prizes: Winners are responsible for picking up their prize. The prize must be picked up in 30 days. If a winner cannot pick up the prize, they will be responsible for any shipping cost. If someone does not claim a prize, a drawing will be held at a guild meeting for that prize. Tricky Tray drawing will be held at 3:00 pm on the Sunday of the show. The raffle prize drawing will be held at the end of the show.

Tricky Tray: Barbara Kelly questioned if we are accepting checks at the show. It was decided that cash only would be accepted.

Quilt Sales: If an individual purchasing quilt does not have full amount of sale in cash at the show, a deposit could be accepted and arrangements made to pick the quilt up at a later date.

Face book page: Sue Reeps will be developing a face book page.

Name Tags: Betsy questioned if members are to wear name tags at the show. Committee decided that members should wear name tags. Lois Walters volunteered to make up new tags and Mary Henning volunteered to place name tags in plastic holders.

Quilt Appraisals: Betsy Golden noted that at this time only one quilt has been signed up for appraisal. Sue Reeps will be sending information to all area guilds regarding quilt appraisals. The information will include the guild email address.

Sign Up Sheets: The May guild newsletter will contain a listing of members indicating the times and show duties they have signed up for.

Storage Unit: Betsy questioned how to remove items from the storage unit. Decision will be made at a later date.

Program: Michele McLaughlin has asked for members to help at the program. The program will be held on Saturday at I:00 p.m. No cameras, recorders or food will be allowed.

Advertising: Betsy noted that Sue Reeps has put out a great deal of publicity and the show is very well publicized.

Quilt Sales: Carolyn Meinhart has developed a quilt sale form. Committee suggested changes to the form. The form will be available for members at guild meetings and will not be available on the website.

Quilt Displays: Nancy Simons will be requesting military pictures from members. There will also be uniforms on display at the show. Kathy Harding, Shirley deVries and Pat Barnes will be in remembered at the show.

Betsy announced that there are some members who cannot help at the show. She asked that any committee in need of help prior to the show to notify her so that those members can fulfill their quilt show obligation.

Treasurer's Report: Balance \$3639.71 To date no receipts for raffle quilt. Deposits from vendors total \$1675.00.

Expenses: \$60 for meeting room; \$155 Chrin Deposit, \$330.24 fabric (Challenge \$196.76 and \$133.48 Raffle quilt).

Printing of flyers and raffle tickets \$431.95; postage \$58.10.

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QUILT SHOW - QUILTFEST 2014

Quilt Show News:

Quiltfest 2014 is almost here! May 3 and 4 are just around the corner and just think most likely there will be no SNOW! Show will be held at the Charles Chrin Community Center, 4100 Green Pond Rd. Palmer, PA 18045.

The Quilt Show Chair for Signs needs a someone who would be willing to place the larger signs the day of the show. The signs are placed at various locations close to the show venue to help direct guests to the Chrin Center.

There still are a good number of spots to be filled to work before, during and after the Quilt Show. The guild needs your help to make the show a success. Sign-up sheets will be available at the April guild meeting.

Quilt members are asked to work at least 4 hours during the show.

There are a number of different types of jobs that will need to be filled to make our show a success. We could use help from husbands, fathers, sons & daughters for set up on Friday and tear down on Sunday. Large ladders (5 ft. to 6 ft.) are needed to help with the hanging of poles and large quilts. If you have one, please bring it to the set up on Friday.

Set up starts at noon on Friday, May 2 and continues until all the quilts are hung. Over the years we have become very efficient and in previous years we completed the set up by 6PM. If is hard work but also a lot of fun seeing the gym transform into the best quilt show in this area. Great way to meet quild members.

If you are not able to commit time to help during the set up or show do to prior commitments or work schedules, there may be some committees that need help prior to the show. See Betsy Lawrence or Kathy Kemmerer for more details.

GUILD MEMBERS YOU CAN SELL YOU QUILTED ITEMS THROUGH 3 DIFFERENT SOURCES:

New quilts that will be entered in the show for the first time and you intend to sell that quilt will need to be registered using the **registration form available on the guild website**. You will follow normal registration guild lines for these quilts. Quilt will be displayed amongst the show quilts. If a show guest would like to purchase the quilt they will go to the Show Quilt Sale Booth to pay for the quilt. Quilts will be marked with a distinctive tag with the sell price. Payment must be made at the time of interest and pick-up of those quilts will be at the end of the show on Sunday. **Registration was due by the March guild meeting**. See Lois Walters if you have any questions.

The boutique will handle small to medium wall hangings (approximately 36 X 36 or smaller), table runners, unfinished tops, quilted clothing & purses. **Registration forms & instructions for the boutique items are available on the guild website**. Registration is due by the April guild meeting. See Susie Metz & Ruth O'Connell for have any questions.

Previous shown quilts or quilts you do not intend to have in the show but would like to sell will be sold through the Show Quilt Sale Booth. Size of the quilts will start at large wall hangings, baby quilts, lap size to bed size quilts. Hot pink registration forms will be available at the March & April guild meetings only. Do not use the registration forms on the guild website for these items. Quilts will be displayed in a manner that can be easily viewed by show guests and potential buyers. Items that are purchased can be taken at the time payment is made. There is no need to take a picture of you quilt to include with the registration form. Registration is due by the April guild meeting. See Carolyn Meinhart if you have any questions. No matter where the guild member intends to sell their quilts, the guild will receive 10% of the sale price. Please price your items accordingly.

Why have a Quilt Appraised?

Quilt Appraisals will be available at our Quilt Show in May this year.

When you have a quilt appraised, you learn it's value, which can be used for insurance purposes. It is also necessary to know value when you mail a quilt, or enter one in a quilt competition. You will be surprised at the value of your own work!

There are a lot of other things you will learn through an appraisal, especially if you bring in an old quilt. You will learn about the pattern and the fabrics, and an approximate date for your quilt. We will discuss whether your quilt is unusual, or typical of a particular area or time period. We have even seen quilts or tops which were designed by a local artist, and have been able to make connections with other quilts made by the same person. It is always interesting to see how the story that accompanies a quilt is supported (or not) by the evidence of the fabric, materials and workmanship of your quilt.

Another real benefit of a written appraisal is that you will have a written document which can be kept with your quilt, and will tell your family and future generations about the quilt so they can value it appropriately. For many collectors, this alone is worth the price of the appraisal.

Some people want appraisals because they want to know how to price a quilt for sale. It's important to remember that an appraisal generally gives you an insurance- or replacement- value. This is a retail price, what a dealer would sell it for, not what they would pay to purchase it. That being said, we do have some tips available if you are going to sell an old quilt, and you will have the advantage of being informed about the real value of your quilt in the process.

The Guild receives \$5 for each quilt that is appraised at the show

NICU covers are easy to make — one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting — can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and it is done!



Please sew your own label on your Oncology Quilts - "Made and Donated by Colonial Quilters Guild 2013". You may also attach your own label to the Hospice and Wounded Soldiers quilts, using your name if desired. Thank you.

Also... please note we do not send or deliver Soldier's Quilts but you can get credit for them if you show them or a picture to us.

Remember to finish your projects. If you are attending the non-sleepover in March that would be a great time to work on them.

VANILLA CHIP COOKIE - BY CAROLYN MEINHART

2 1/4 cup Flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 cup soft butter-room temp

1/4 cup sugar

3/4 cup brown sugar

1 teaspoon of coconut flavoring

1 pack of instant coconut pudding (DRY)

2 eaas

12 oz package of vanilla chips

1 cup crushed walnuts

Mix flour and baking soda together. Set aside. Combine butter, sugars, coconut flavoring and **DRY** pudding in large bowl. Beat in egg. Gradually add flour mixture. Stir in chips and nuts. Place on ungreased cookie sheet and bake 350 degrees for 8 to 10 mins. Check in 6 to 7 mins.

1/4 lb. butter


1/4 lb.Margarine\
