COMMUNITY SERVICE

Our guild is committed to community service and asks that each member supports that commitment in one of the following ways, annually:

- one children's oncology quilt (42" by 44" or 42" by 54") donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg
- two preemie guilts (18" by 25") donated to Sacred Heart Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital
- two mastectomy pillows and bags donated to Lehigh Valley Hospital Cedar Crest
- four teddy bears or cats donated to St. Luke's Hospital Emergency Department
- one wounded soldier quilt (55" by 65"minimum donated to Quilts of Valor Foundation (http://www.qov.org)

Looking for a longarm quilter? Lois Walters, President of Colonial Quilters, will provide the batting and quilt your Quilt of Valor on her longarm machine. Check the first page of the newsletter for her contact information.

- one Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) of St. Luke's Hospice quilt (63" x 93")
- two VNA of St. Luke's Hospice pillowcases
- one VNA of St. Luke's Hospice nightgown
- NICU covers for incubators (48" x 55" finished size)

NICU covers are easy to make -- one children's panel with a contrasting border to create the right size, or you can use 1-1/4 yard of a children's print and add borders to create the needed size. PLease use a light color fabric for the back. Simple quilting -- can use diagonal quilting one or both ways. Add a binding and it is done!



Please sew your own label on your Oncology Quilts - "Made and Donated by Colonial Quilters Guild 2013". You may also attach your own label to the Hospice and Wounded Soldiers quilts, using your name if desired. Thank you.

There were no additions or corrections to the June minutes.

Vice President—Cindy Fantasia—89 members were present

Treasurer's report—Charlene Weisbalance is \$16123.67

Lois discussed the proposed budget that was sent in the September newsletter for all members to see and discuss. There was no discussion. A motion to approve the budget was made BY Eugenia Emert and seconded by Mary Henning. All present voted in favor of the budget for the upcoming year. There were no nays.

Community service—Sally Viglione-The guild received a thank you from St. Luke's for the stuffed toys, preemie blankets and mastectomy bags. There are 17 people signed up for Community Service Day on October 19th from 9-3 pm. Everything will be supplied to sew mastectomy bags and stuff pillows. The Community Service group is not accepting Wounded Soldiers quilts anymore. You can still make one to receive credit for your community service but you must send it on your own.

Saturday Sewcials—Wendy Harwick—Saturday November 16 from 9- 3 pm a class called Spinning Stars will be taught by Margo Billetz. Cost is \$5. You will need to prepurchase Easy Tri Rec Tools for the class. Sign up at the October meeting.

Bus Trips—there will be a Lancaster shopping trip on October 26. Cost is \$27; we need 35 people to go. Sign up at Oct. meeting

Hospitality—please remember to check the list for your turn to bring refreshments.

Sunshine and Shadows—Lois Milheim had a knee replacement 9/9/13.

Quilt Show—Betsy Lawrence/Kathy Kemmerer Dates are May 3rd and 4th. Children's Hospital (CHOP) Muhlenberg is our charity. Our quilt show will be advertised on their website. 36 guild members have volunteered so far for chairs or co-chairs. Marilyn Hansen graciously volunteered to chair the last opening for door prizes—Thanks!

The speaker program will be presented by Michelle McLaughlin and Betsy Golden.

There will be quilt appraisals and a special booth will be at the show to purchase quilts.

Challenge —Mary Henning-All the challenge fabric has been sold. As a reminder, you will not need to put a sleeve on the back of your quilt for the show.

Boutique—Susie Metz—Susie has Quilt guild tote bags for sale for \$1. The Boutique will be accepting handmade items for sale, the guild receives 10% of the sale, and the rest is yours. You will set your own prices. If you want to sell large pieces, there will be a separate area for them so they can be viewed better. We will once again have the Recyclables—used kits, UFO's, sewing related items, fabric, etc. We may start collecting in January.

Tricky Tray—Barb Kelly—we will put a list of ideas in the newsletter for baskets. We will also offer a shopping service if you would like to donate but don't want to shop.

Quilt Registration—Lois Walters—you will need one form for every quilt that you enter in the show; there will be a form in the newsletter and at the meetings. Deadline is March 13th. This year we will also be accepting wearables, tablerunners, etc. That form

will follow shortly.

Book Nook—we are starting to collect books now.

BABY BANK

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small baby needs to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote & teach positive health & attachment behaviors between the mother & her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.

You can help " make a difference" by donating small items for the babies. Some ideas are wipes, diaper rash cream, diapers (any size), sippee cups, onesies ,baby socks etc. Also, a bank is available for monetary donations for me to shop. We collected \$28.00 in September. I always contact NFP to inform me of their needs at that time.

NOVEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - BIRDS IN THE AIR

Birds in the Air



Fabric Key for Birds in the Air


We will make a 12 inch block. Measurements are included for 2 other sizes in the chart.


Light (A) is Bleached muslin (White)


Medium (B) is a coordinating color

Dark(C) is a Fall batik print

Cut 3 Squares of white and the coordinating print each 5 inches. Draw a line in the center and stitch on either side. Cut in half and square to 4 ½". The extra WHITE triangles can be cut from 2 - 47/8" squares. The large square is a 127/8" square that is cut in half. You will have a spare.

2014 QUILT SHOW

Quilt Show Committee Meeting August 26, 2013

The meeting was called to order by Betsy Lawrence and Kathy Kemmerer. Action Items:

- 1. Betsy Lawrence reported the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia is reviewing quilt show flyers. Review of flyers is a matter of formality. CHOP will list the quilt show as an event on their web site.
- 2. Kathy Kemmerer reported that the cost of using the additional room at the Chrin Center for the lecture will be \$55.00. The use of the room has been arranged.
- 3. Wrist bands have been ordered to be used in the place of the hand stamp.
- 4. Chairperson for door prizes position still open.
- 5. New committee has been formed for quilt sales. Carolyn Meinhart will chair this committee.

Committee Reports:

<u>Vendors</u>: Cindy Fantasia reported that packets that were mailed to prospective vendors did not reach them. Cindy will follow up with the post office and, if needed, resend all information.

<u>Tricky Tray:</u> Barbara Kelly will be meeting with past chairmen of this committee. She will explain tricky tray at the next guild meeting for the benefit of new guild members. Barbara has approximately 10 baskets that she will make available for guild members to use. She will also offer a shopping service for members who are unable to shop.

Quilt Sales: Carolyn Meinhart chair person. Some discussion was held on possible ways to display quilts for sale. Several categories of possible quilts for sale were discussed. Categories would include quilts that are being shown during the quilt show and are also for sale and quilts that have been previously shown but now are for sale. Decisions on the display of quilts for sale will be made after more consideration.

<u>Set Up and Take Down:</u> Sue Sos reported that because of relocation of the lecture area, new space may be available for additional vendor. Sue will present ideas for room set up at the next quilt show meeting.

Registration: Lois Walters reported that she will have hard copies of registration and instruction forms at the September guild meeting. Registration and instruction forms will also be available on the guild website for members to download and print. She reported that at the 2012 quilt show 202 quilts from 60 guild members were shown. She hopes to encourage all members of the guild to enter a quilt for the 2014 show.

Raffle Quilt: Betsy reported that raffle tickets will be distributed at the October quild meeting.

Quilt Challenge: Mary Henning reported that all of the challenge fabric has been distributed or sold. She will ask members to put notice in newsletter if they have additional fabric for members to use.

Café: Jane Merkel and Doris Woodring reported that the café will be called "Colonial Café".

A simple menu will be offered and many ideas have been explored. They were happy to report that they have heard from members willing to bake and help at the show.

<u>Boutique</u>: Ruth O'Connell and Susie Metz will request additional tables for the show. Recycled items will be kept separate from true boutique items. Recycled items will be limited to sewing items. Recycled items will be accepted starting in January of 2014. They will encourage anyone who is interested in selling quilts to display them in the show. Discussion of how to display quilts for sale followed.

Book Nook: Susan Truby reported that she will start to accept items from members at the September meeting. She will offer to pick up items from the homes of members if requested.

Block of the Month: Eugenia Emert and Kathy Kemmerer reported that a member who won blocks at a monthly meeting had donated them and they will make a quilt using the blocks. They suggested displaying the finished quilt in the block of the month area but having the quilt as a Tricky Tray item.

Art Work and Publicity: Sue Reeps reported that in 2012 show approximately 3000 flyers were printed. Sue distributed to committee possible printing layouts and committee selected 3 flyers per page. Two hundred copies of full page color copies will be ordered for distribution to quilt shops, stores, libraries, etc. Advertising is also possible on line and in print. She asked that anyone who knows of any sites or possible advertising venues to contact her.

<u>Admissions</u>: Evelyn Weidel and Annette Mihalow will have additional information at later meeting. Wrist bands will be used in place of hand stamps for show admittance.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 pm.
