SURVEY CONCERNS ADDRESSED

Last spring about 40 members shared their concerns and suggestions about our Guild in a survey. Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond and we hope you continue to share your concerns with us.

First, one question was, "Who is the executive Board"? As indicated on Article IX, Section 1, The Executive Board shall consist of elected officers and chairmen of the standing and special committees. All members are always welcome to attend the board meeting which is usually held on the first Monday of the month with exception of weeks when the board meeting is the day before the general meeting. Our next board meeting is September 30, 2013 at 6:45 in the Sunday school room at the end of the hallway where refreshments are served during general meetings. The list on the right column of the first page, of the newsletter lists the Officers and Chairmen.

A concern of almost all responding was to **shorten the meeting**. Recognizing that the meeting consists of the program, usually an hour, the drawings (block of the month, 50/50, door prize, fat quarter exchange), show and tell, and the business meeting the following suggestions will be implemented. The meeting will continue to begin promptly at 7:00PM and we will make every effort to adjourn the meeting by 9:00PM. We would like to have all members stay for the entire meeting but recognize that we are all adults and have other responsibilities and obligations.

Please have refreshments prior to the meeting because unless the speaker needs to remove items used during the presentation, we will **eliminate the break between the program and the rest of the meeting**. If we do need a break it will very short. If the business meeting is very short we may have it prior to the program.

The winners of the drawings will be announced during the meeting, but the winners can pick up the prizes at the close of the meeting.

The business meeting will be shorter because only those officers or chairpersons who need to speak will come forward. If we know that a business meeting will be longer, we will announce it in the newsletter. The business meeting in September will include the presentation on the 2013-2014 proposed budget. **We will be using the newsletter to keep you informed about upcoming programs and other announcements. Please read it carefully.** This year there will also be updates on the quilt show during most business meetings.

There were questions regarding the **Guild Budget**, by presenting the proposed budget in the newsletter we hope you will be able to have a better idea how our money is being allocated. As you will see the main yearly source of income is the Membership Dues. This is determined by the number of active dues paying members. We are very fortunate to have a balance with unallocated funds. This balance has been acquired because of our successful Quilt Show every two years.

The suggestions and recommendations about programs have been passed to our new program chairpersons. Several members said they really liked to see what our members are making. Our September program is the first opportunity to showcase our members' talents. Please bring something to share.

Of overwhelming concern from many members were the "rules". The rules are actually **the Bylaws, Article IV, Section 1 – Members**. This section was intended to encourage members to actively participate in activities and programs and contribute to community service projects There was a suggestion was to review the bylaws yearly. At this time we are not changing the bylaws because they were voted and approved on May 22, 2012.

The board will revisit this important concern and the method it is addressed. Again, we welcome your opinions and suggestions.

We have not, as yet, discussed all concerns but we will try to address them as we move through the year. I want to let you know that there were also **some very positive comments** included on your surveys. Some of the activities that many of you enjoy are; spending an evening with people with similar interests, show and tell, and programs introducing new ideas. Many of you enjoyed Bonnie Hunter's presentations. Also several of you mentioned how much you enjoy Saturday Sewcials and Bus Trips. They are a good way to get to know other members. The newsletter received many compliments. We are going to try and include more information and announcements in the newsletter and on the website as well as reminders by email.

As we move through this year please let us know your concerns and share your suggestions. I am looking forward to an interesting and enjoyable year.


COMMUNITY SERVICE

November: NY Beauty Simplified (lecture and workshop) by Linda Hahn. Sign-ups



BABY BANK

A "baby bank" was started a few years ago to help provide small baby needs to the Nurse Family Partnership of the Visiting Nurse Assoc. at St. Luke's. NFP is a program that pairs a specially trained registered nurse with a first time, low income mom. The nurse will provide home visits throughout the pregnancy until the child is 2 years of age. The goal is to promote & teach positive health & attachment behaviors between the mother & her baby. Currently, 250 families are being served by NFP.

You can help " make a difference" by donating small items <u>for the babies.</u> Some ideas are wipes, diaper rash cream, diapers (any size), sippee cups, onesies ,baby socks etc. Also, a bank is available for monetary donations for me to shop. OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - BABY BASKET **Baby Basket** October Block of the Month **Breast Cancer Awareness Month** Block should be made in Pink and white Makes one 12 ½ inch block White muslin A - Cut three 3- 1/2" squares C - Cut two 4" squares, then cut diagonally to make 4 triangles E - Cut two 3 1/2" rectangles F - Cut one 7 inch square, then cut diagonally to make 2 triangles. One is extra. Pink B - Cut three 4" squares, then cut diagonally to make 6 triangles D - Cut two 3-1/2" squares Assemble according to chart above.

2014 QUILT SHOW

Quilt Show Committee Meeting July 29, 2013

The meeting was called to order by Betsy Lawrence and Kathy Kemmerer at 6:35 p.m.

Copies of the 2012 quilt show Financial and Expense Report was distributed to the committee by Meg Ferry to be used as a guideline for expenses for the 2014 quilt show. Betsy Lawrence explained the expense reimbursement process.

Betsy Lawrence reported that flyers for the 2014 show were delivered to the Hershey Quilt Show held 7/25 – 7/28.

<u>Charity</u>: Betsy Lawrence has been in contact with the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, the charity chosen for the 2014 show, and is finalizing arrangements with them. CHOP will post the quilt show as an event on their website.

Betsy Golden presented a proposal that the sale of antique quilts or tops by non-members be allowed at the show. Discussion followed. The proposal will be tabled until the next committee meeting at which time Betsy will provide additional information.

<u>Vendors</u>: Cindy Fantasia reported that letters have been sent to vendors regarding the upcoming show. <u>Advertising</u>: Brittany Fantasia reported that emails have been sent to magazines with show information. She has been in touch with printing company who will match or offer lower price for printing. Discussion followed about number of flyers to be printed, size of materials, color or black and white and format. Brittany will get quotes from printer for various options.

<u>Speaker</u>: Michelle McLaughlin and Betsy Golden reported that they are in process of doing research for the quilt show program "Money, Myth and Madder".

<u>Challenge</u>: Mary Henning reported great interest in the quilt show challenge. Only a small amount of the challenge fabric is left for interested members.

Discussion about using an additional room at the Chrin Center was held. Betsy Lawrence will inquire about availability and cost.

Jane Merkel asked if the committee would consider the use of wrist bands instead of hand stamp for show admittance.

The meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m. The next meeting scheduled for August 26, 2013 may be changed to August 19, 2013 if the meeting room at the church is available.
